Opponents - History

Ardley United FC • Club History

Ardley United formed in 1945 just as the Second World War was ending. From humble beginnings playing mainly in the Lord Jersey Football League, the club has progressed through the Oxfordshire Senior League to Step 5 of the football pyramid in The Hellenic Football League.

Under the generous patronage of the Chairman, Norman Stacey, Ardley have flourished since gaining Hellenic League status. Proudly providing one of the finest playing surfaces at this level, plus excellent off pitch facilities for both players and supporters. Added to that the club has earned a reputation for being one of the most hospitable clubs to visit.





In the last 25 years Ardley have won the Oxfordshire Senior League Division One title on three occasions as well as the Junior Shield, also on three occasions. Apart from a barren period between 1973 and 1983 the club has won trophies almost every season throughout it's history.

The club were in the "old" Division One of The Hellenic League for six years, winning the league in consecutive season's 1996/7 and 1997/8.

Also winners of the Division One Cup for four consecutive season's between 1994/5 and 1997/8, a record of achievement never previously attained and unlikely to be surpassed with the introduction of the combined Premier and Division One Challenge Cup competition. 1997/8 also saw the Ardley Reserve side as Champions of their league, and promotion to Division One of the Reserves section. League restructuring, and facility, requirements towards the end of the 1990's saw Ardley in the new "First Division".

The club worked hard to improve the facilities, which was rewarded with promotion to the Hellenic Premier League in season 2003/4. The following year the club was rewarded for it's achievements being awarded the Hungerford Cup for the greatest improvement in facilities and playing. Further accolade came in the same season on being awarded the Non League Paper's "National Game Award" for the most improved facilities. Season 2006/7 proved to be one of the best in the club's history finishing third in the Premier Division and also winning the Supplementary Cup. Season 2007/8 provided mixed fortunes, the League position was not as great as recent previous seasons, but further success in Cup competition was rewarded with finalist places in both the Floodlit Cup and Supplementary Cup. The Supplementary Cup Final was the last game in charge for manager Dan Still who had guided the team to three seasons of success.

Following Dan Still's departure, the manager's hotseat was filled by Kevin Brock for the start of the 2008/9 season. The ex-Oxford Utd, QPR & Newcastle Utd pro brought his experience as manager of both Oxford City and Banbury Utd to the club and this saw them enter arguably their most successful phase in their history. Achieving league positions of 5th and 7th in his first 2 seasons, Kevin then built a side which would challenge strongly for league honours in each of their next 2 seasons only to fall just short each time and end up in third place. In addition, the club also won the Bluefin Insurance League Cup in 2009/10 and narrowly lost in the final the following year. Having come so close to the league title in recent seasons has only spurred on Kevin, and his trusty and vastly experienced assistant Brian 'Robbie' Robinson,to try to improve on those results and no doubt they will be doing their utmost to land that elusive league title that eveyone at the club would love to see.



WBTFC History On One Page

Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35



Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.



Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One West on a ground grading technicality, despite an appeal to the FA against the decision. In the circumstances manager Dave Turner did well to steer his side to 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. Last season Wootton Bassett were never out of the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing in 2nd place. In addition they had a fantastic run in the FA Cup reaching the 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time where they put up a spirited performance against Conference South side Dorchester Town. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided he had taken the team as far as he could and left after a successful 5 years in charge. In his place have come the former Calne Town management duo of Jeff Roberts and former Bassett player Drew Youngsam.

As Bassett enter their 3rd period in the Premier the new management team will be looking to consolidate in the top division at a time when the Club has to play games at Cirencester Town whilst the new ground is built at Ballards Ash.

Wiltshire Senior Cup



The Wiltshire Senior Cup was first competed for back in 1896-97 when Swindon Town were the winners. The Town have gone on to win the competition nine times, including the first six years of the competition. With their progress in the professional game it is a long time since Swindon Town have competed in the Cup. Wootton Bassett Town's first success in the competition was to come at the turn of the century when they made the final in 1902-03, losing to Warminster Town. Wootton Bassett made the final again the following season doing down to Swindon Town Reserves in the final. It would be 84 years before Wootton Bassett would grace the final of the competition again when in 1987-88 they made the final to this time lose against near neighbours Purton. Wootton Bassett Town finally won the cup in 1998-99 when they defeated Pewsey Vale in the final. This success was repeated two seasons later with a win over Shrewton United. Since this win the best the Bassett faithful have had is a couple of semi-final appearances. Last season Wootton Bassett Town went out in the Second Round, losing 3-0 away at Westbury United. The competition was won by Melksham Town, despite having been knocked out in the guarter final only to be re-instated due to their opponents Bradford Town playing an ineligible player. Melksham made the most of their second chance.

In the final the game ended 0-0 after 90 minutes against Downton but two extra time goals gave Melksham the cup for the 6th time.

After matching Hellenic League Premier Division leaders Reading Town for 88 minutes, a controversial free kick and lapse in concentration condemned Wootton Bassett Town to a cruel 2-1 defeat.

On the hour the midfielder was laughably booked for a dive when it was clear to most observers in the ground that he had been caught by a flailing leg after twisting his way between and bursting past two Reading defenders.

Standing on the Terraces



Back in the 1970's and even in the early 1980's you used to be able to stand with your mates at a football ground having all paid on the day. No pre-allocated seat, in fact no seat at all unless you chose to sit down. The atmosphere was great and the humour much better than you experience at grounds today (those who long to experience the old humour of football grounds I can recommend an afternoon on Moaners Corner at Woking - a reasonable standard as it is Conference football and tremendous wit normally directed at the unfortunate old linesman who runs the line that side of the pitch).

I used to stand at Loftus Road just by the tunnel and dugouts in the Paddock. When visiting Swindon used to stand on the side of the ground that is now the Don Rogers Stand and close to the half-way line. Even a visit to that other Club in West London and Ken Bate's electrified fences, barbed wire, outside toilets and machine gun turrets has a nostalgic ring to it (Michael Robinson from the half-way line and all that - see Abingdon Town programme).

The tragedies at Hillsborough and Heysel put paid to the terracing as Lord Justice

Inspired by the fantastic book Taylor decreed that all-seater stadiums were the answer. Whilst I accept football is now Season's new feature looks at a lot safer, was terracing football related matters from really to blame here? In Germany the Bundesliga allows fans to stand at all its games and the atmosphere is ten times better than at English games and there is The prices for match day tickets are much cheaper as a result and the overall fan experience much better. If the Germans can get it to work why can't we do it in this country?

> As the German sides have to have all-seater stadiums when playing in European competitions they have come up with convertible stadiums. For league games the stadiums revert to terracing with flip up seats or seats that fold down. Pictured below are Werder Bremen's seats "locked" for league games.



Other stadiums in Germany similarly use this form of seating known as rail seats (including VFB Stuttgart personally experienced on the opening day of the Bundesliga a couple of seasons ago when they played Schalke) ...



Recently I did have the pleasure of experiencing

standing at a Championship fixture with a trip to Yeovil. Having only just promoted Championship the two ends of the ground are still standing areas, including the open end for away supporters. It was great to sstand at a professional game generally no hint of trouble. in England and the terrace. which that day saw 2.000 away supporters at the game. generated a fantastic atmosphere.

> What are the chances of a return to standing at all grounds in this country? On 19 December 2011, the Scottish Premier League announced that its all-seater requirement was relaxed and that member clubs would be permitted to apply to pilot safe standing areas at their grounds. Scottish TV reported that "The league's chief executive, Neil Doncaster, savs a particular form standing currently used by eight top flight teams in Germany, known as rail seats, will be the permitted form of new-style terracing". Nine out of twelve SPL clubs immediately indicated an interest in safe standing.

> In England and Wales, the safe standing roadshow has been pivotal in gaining support for standing at football matches. As of May 2013, a total of 25 clubs in England and Wales playing in the Premier League and Football League have backed safe-standing. Six of these clubs are currently in the Premier League. The highestranked club with the largest average attendance to be associated with the proposal is Manchester City F.C. who were reported as supporting the initiative in December 2012. Personally I look forward to the day when terracing is once again permitted in English top flight football.





Player Profile

Sam Collier Forward



Powerful, strong in the air and with an eye for goal, Collier re-joins Bassett after two and a quarter seasons away from the club, which he spent with Abingdon United and Cirencester Town in Southern League Division One South and West.

It is fair to say that the first impression Collier gave the Rylands Way faithful back when he first joined the club in 2009/10 wasn't extremely encouraging with a number of so-so performances at full back. Yet, by the end of his first season at Rylands Way there was only one way in which he could be viewed: as the lynchpin of Bassett's promotion campaign. Integral to this was his switch in position to centre forward, which he made in an early season match against Harrow Hill. In this game he was brought on as a substitute forward and went on to score twice. The left-footer went on to score a further twenty goals as he supplied the ammunition for Dave Turner's side's charge to the Hellenic Premier. At his best in the most important games, his stunning winner against Slimbridge and strike against Easington Sports on the final day of the 2009/10 season helped seal Bassett's runners-up finish.

His excellence in front of goal continued in 2010/11. Unfazed despite stepping up a level, he

found the back of the net 26 times in 51 games. Collier scored both Bassett's goals as they upset eventual champions Wantage Town while braces Shrivenham and Witney United helped seal dramatic come from behind victories. He also played a key part in Bassett's run to the FA Cup first qualifying round, netting twice in the extra preliminary round replay with Bradford Town that Bassett eventually won on penalties before scoring the only goal of the game in a tight encounter against Almondsbury UWE.

Although Bassett wound up being demoted following that season. Collier initially stuck with Bassett. though his goalscoring exploits unsurprisingly attracted attentions of teams at a higher level. He started the campaign strongly with five goals in the opening four games, including a hat-trick in a 5-1 thrashing of Tytherington Rocks. which took him past fifty in Bassett colours. Collier would finish the season with six goals, as he netted in a late season victory against Clanfield when making a quest appearance.

Early in the campaign, he departed for Southern League Abingdon United and was a leading light for them as they escaped relegation. In the league he struck 17 times, good enough to give him the fifth best record in Division One South and West.

In the summer of 2012 Collier moved to Cirencester and enjoyed another productive season, finishing as the Centurions' top scorer with 15 goals in 43 games. He began the 2013/14 campaign with three goals in sixteen appearances for CIren before sealing his move back to Bassett.

Amongst his other former clubs he counts Swindon Supermarine, Wantage and Purton.






Uhlsport Hellenic League Insights

Going the extra mile to get a better crowd


After last time looking at the effect of when a game is played on attendance, this article looks at the effect of where a game is played. Included are attendance figures for games this season, set against the distance in miles between grounds (using the quickest route according to Google Maps), while they have also been divided between those played on a Saturday and those played midweek.



Predictably, as travel distances reduce, so attendances increase with this occurring at a slightly greater rate for games played in midweek.

The average distance away teams have to travel in the Hellenic League Premier Division is around 38 miles, at which a game played on a Saturday would have around 65 people in attendance, with a midweek match attracting a crowd of 56. Unfortunately not all games can be local derbies. So the real proof

as to the true impact of the Hellenic League's large footprint on attendances would be to look at the differences between attendances around the league average.




The next graph takes a closer look at games on Saturdays. As shown a game between sides 18 miles apart will only typically attract ten more fans than one between teams almost sixty miles apart. For midweek fixtures, however, the impact of distance travelled is significant.

For games between sides 18 miles apart, you can expect a crowd with 30 more fans than a game between sides situated

about sixty miles apart. According to the Saturday trend line, the attendance at a game played between sides four miles apart would attract thirty more fans than one between teams ninety (90!) miles apart!

Admittedly these figures will change as the season grows and frigid winter Saturdays become less of a pull.

But what does this say for the league? Its extensive footprint is not necessarily the issue many claim it to be. But it becomes an



issue when it comes to games played midweek. Problematically, not all Tuesday or Wednesday night fixtures can be between teams in close proximity to one another. Perhaps then, in order to prevent this, league size needs to be reduced in order to decrease the amount of midweek football played?
