Editorial & WBTFC News



A Warm Welcome to our visitors this evening from Highmoor Ibis for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture.

The two sides have met on only the one occasion in their history, this was the hard fought two all draw at the beginning of September.

Highmoor Ibis come to the Corinium tonight as the in-form team in the UHlsport Hellenic Premier League with 5 straight wins on the bounce. When this run includes wins over Oxford City Nomads, Ardley United and local rivals Reading Town you can see what fine form Highmoor are currently in. Saturday's 1-0 home win against Reading Town was played in front of a crowd of 98 and clearly shows that Highmoor are up there in the title chasing pack. Highmoor are currently in 6th place but with games in hand over leaders Reading Town and both Ascot United and Highworth Town.

Those that were at the Stadium De Moor back in September will remember that the Highmoor team had a lot of very skilful players throughout the team but, like ourselves this season, tend to spend quite a bit of time arguing with the referee. Hopefully tonight will see the two sides behave impeccably and play an entertaining game that is remembered for the high quality of the football played. Reading Town, Binfield and Abingdon United Away Games

I was finally able to catch a series of games recently watching us lose narrowly at Reading Town, Binfield and Abingdon United. In both the Binfield and Reading Town games we were very unlucky not to come away with at least a point. At Binfield we switched off for a moment and were punished by a side who on the night were very direct and played the game at a very high tempo. At Reading Town once again we were on the wrong end of a decision, something that has happened way too frequently this season by all accounts. Whilst the defeats at Binfield and Reading were tough on us, the defeat at Abingdon was a poor result. We were perhaps unlucky to play Abingdon a week after their manager departed and when we had so many players suspended. New players had joined from Ardley United and AFC Hinksey to strengthen their side but on the day the difference between the two sides was 17 year old Matt Woodley who fired a superb hat-trick to send the Sam Collier fan club home happy (Sam was the subject of songs from the Abingdon faithful all game having played for them in the Southern League). With home fans singing at both the Reading and Abingdon games it seems to me that there is a trend starting in the UHlsport Hellenic League.

Fleet Spurs

Some of you may have read that Wessex League side Fleet Spurs are having some trouble with Premiership Tottenham. If it is not bad enough that Fleet Spurs are struggling at the wrong end of the table in Division One of the Wessex they are currently being bullied by Tottenham over their club logo.



Champions League chasing Spurs threatened to sue the Wessex League club because the cockerel on their badge breaches copyright. They have been given less than a month to comply with the removal of every emblem around their newly-built clubhouse and any documents. The cost of complying with this request is estimated at £3,000. Tottenham only discovered the likeness when the Hampshire side got in touch about the possibility of playing a veterans game between the two clubs. The non-league side had been set up by local Tottenham fans back in 1948. The Club President is an ex Tottenham player and have had the cockerel emblem on the shirts since their formation. They had until yesterday to comply with the request from Tottenham's lawyers to remove the logo. Shame on you Tottenham I say. Ref justice for Wootton Bassett

WOOTTON Bassett manager Jeff Roberts was at loggerheads with a referee for the second time in a week after he felt his side had a point snatched from their grasp.

Roberts, who claimed Bassett were 'robbed' of a draw against Reading nine days ago by the key decisions of the match official, was irritated again following Saturday's 2-1 loss to Hellenic Premier high-flyers Ardley.

The boss felt the decision to award a spot kick 11 minutes from the end when an Ardley player cut across Craig Bowden and crashed to the floor, was harsh.

"We should have got a point, it was a soft penalty," said Roberts.

"We had a bit of an argument with the ref about it because the linesman gave a corner and he was much nearer the play.

"Matey boy went down in the box and once the ref's given it he's never going to change his mind. But the linesman said to us afterwards that it was never a penalty."

Ardley took a 1-0 lead into the break thanks to Ben Thomas, who headed home from close in after a corner was flicked on.

Bassett equalised in the second half when Tyler Sheppard skipped past a couple of challenges and slotted past the keeper.

But Bowden was penalised in the closing stages and the penalty was duly converted to condemn Bassett to their third straight defeat.

"It's just not running our way at the moment and we've got to get our chins up," continued Roberts. "We've brought in so many players and it's about getting them to gel together.

"We need to get some consistency and the ability to grind out results sometimes, but we know we've got thee quality in our side."

The manager is hopeful of bringing in a couple of new recruits in the next week as he made seven-day

approaches for midfielders from Fairford and Corsham on Thursday. Bassett now face a tough run of four away games in the league, which will be split up by a second-round home tie against Bemerton in the second round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup.

The League Management post that I would least like to perform is that of Fixture Coordinator. David Jesson performs this role excellently and implements our League Policy.

Unfortunately there is always a club somewhere that feels disadvantaged in some way.

Some issues that are brought to the League include:-

- Mid-week travel distances/time
- Playing against club 2nd teams when the first team of that club does not have a game
- Playing too many games in mid-week in the first part of the season
- Not playing enough games in mid-week

The weather is another factor. For the last few seasons we have lost many fixtures due to weather problems. Most of these have happened during late Autumn, rain & waterlogged grounds, and in the Winter with Snow & Frozen grounds. This results in a massive re-organisation of fixtures and possible backlog at the end of the season. With this in mind we as a League set out a policy to load as many fixtures as possible into the first half of the season. So far this has worked well, but I see that bad weather is forecast for next week. So fingers crossed that it does not affect our games.

If we look at the post-Christmas fixture list, it would appear a little sparse, at present, but with the onset and progress of Cup Competitions, this situation will change dramatically. Additionally League fixtures that are planned for later in the season will be 'pulled forward' to fill as many 'gaps' as is possible. So please do not look at the post-Christmas fixture list and assume that teams will have opportunities for 'holiday' weeks. However, having said that, we would all be delighted for clubs to have big cup runs. Winning the

League and Cups is why we all play the game. Bringing League fixtures forward will hopefully allow us to complete the season without over congestion.

Roberts unfazed by trip to Ardley

JEFF Roberts says a trip to high-flying Ardley doesn't present him with undue concern as he aims to turn round Wootton Bassett's disappointing run of form.

The Corinium-based side have won only once in their last 10 games and are fourth-bottom of the Hellenic League Premier Division, with a tough journey to third-placed United being next up.

But although Ardley might be right in the hunt for the league title having lost just two of their 17 league games, Roberts insists his troops cannot be intimidated tomorrow.

"We've just got to deal with it, we know that on our day we can compete with the top sides," he said.

"Ardley are quite well-organised and it's going to be hard there, but we gave them a good game at our place (Bassett eventually lost 2-1 at the start of this month).

"In the last month we've played Reading and Ardley and they didn't really dominate us or cause us too many problems, but basic errors cost us.

"The squad is strong enough but morale is a bit low at the moment. We've been a little bit unlucky with the games we've played and have lost a lot of them by a goal.

"If we can get a couple of wins we can get that confidence in everybody. I know the kind of quality we've got and with a couple of wins under our belt, I think we'll be fine."

Midfielder Jordan Roberts is likely to play tomorrow following a knee injury but Levi Cox (ankle) is doubtful, while Steve Yeardeley is unavailable due to work and Shaun Terry is still out. Jason Milhench serves the final game of his suspension while Sam Packer has two matches of his ban left.

Highmoor Ibis FC • Club History

Tracing back over the records, a Highmoor Football Club can be found in existence until just after the war. The present club was formed in 1966, making it one of the older clubs in the Reading League.

Prior to 1990 the club enjoyed little success until the current club secretary, Chris Gallimore took over and recruited the current 1st team assistant manager Martin Law and between them they assembled a strong squad of players and success was to follow.

As a club we now run a men's section consisting of four Saturday teams and two Sunday teams, a youth section with an under 18's and Allied counties team and the junior section which now consists of 10 teams from under 7's through to under 11's based at the superb Rivers sports facility.

The club has now established itself as the number 2 behind Reading and number 1 at Non-league level in Reading. The team 1st have the honour of playing their home game out of the historic and prestigious Palmer Park Stadium

Since 2001 the club has achieved various successes including Reading Senior League, Maidenhead Norfolkian Senior Cup, BTC Senior Cup and Reading Invitation Challenge Cup Senior as well as the A team winning league and cup competitions.

In 2003 Highmoor won the Reading Senior League unbeaten and have just retained their title in 2010 which allowed them to gain promotion to the Hellenic Football League.

In 2011-2012 competing for the first in the clubs history in the Hellenic league, Highmoor secured promotion from Hellenic Division 1 East after finishing runners and also came runners up in the Supplementary Cup Final and Reading Invitation challenge Senior. 2012-2013 the A team gained promotion won Reading Invitation Challenge Cup Jubilee.

Season 2013/14 will see the club reach another historical landmark with their first appearance in the FA Cup. Launching this season will be the Highmoor Academy offering the opportunity for students aged between 16 and 18 years to study a Diploma in Sports Science a first locally for a football club. We have now completed a partnership with Reading University will mean another large amount of talent to choose from.

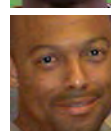

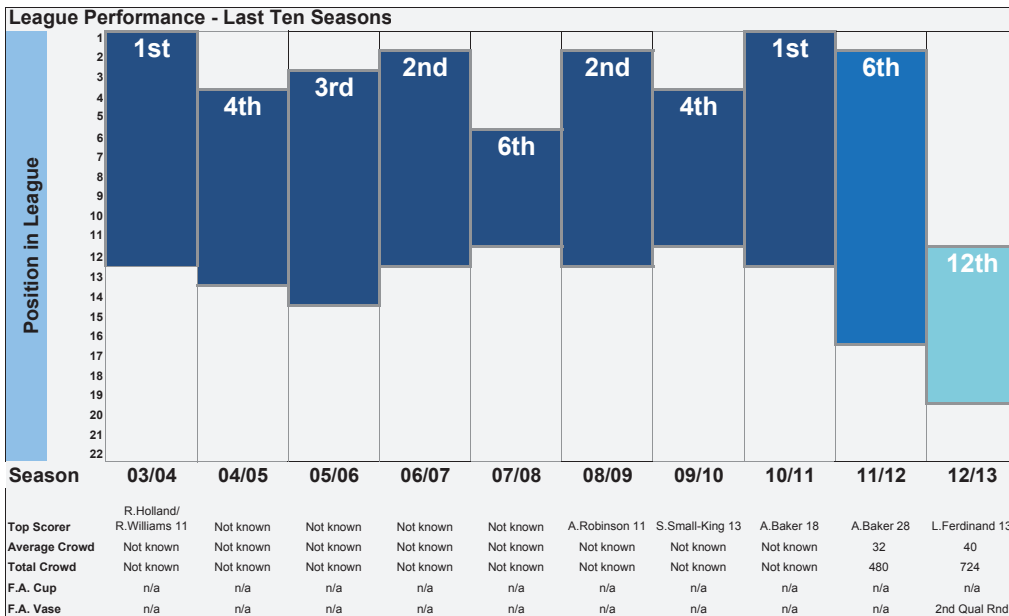

Familiar troubles continue to haunt sliding Bassett Northcourt Road, 16th November 2013

While one goal defeats may elicit feelings more of frustration than of concern, Wootton Bassett Town's fifth consecutive loss by such a margin should come as a reason to worry for Jeff Roberts and his troops. For the second time in a month, they lost to struggling Abingdon United, this time coming out on the wrong end of a frenzied seven goal feast. It was a cracking afternoon's entertainment for the neutral. But for the visitors to Northcourt Road it was a game whose conclusion could not have been any worse.

Six of Abingdon's nine total points this season have come from victories against Bassett, while victory for Shrivenham against Bracknell Town plunged Roberts' team into the bottom four, with just four points acquired from the last available 27.

Mathew Woodley's stunning hat-trick, consisting of two long range screamers and a sublime free kick, proved pivotal come full time. However, Bassett will be ruing decisions that went against them and, more importantly, significant lapses in concentration and missed chances. Arguably the game's turning point came on the stroke of half time when Abingdon levelled the game at 3-3. Adam Doyle pumped an unthreatening free kick forward from deep, which 'keeper Steve Allison, coming way off his line, failed to grasp. His fall to ground came with a slight bump. And, in seeing this, the defenders around him, rather than clearing their lines, stopped in expectation of a free kick being awarded. No whistle was forthcoming though, and an unchallenged Adam Garner was able to stroke home from close range. How costly ignoring that golden rule – playing to the whistle – wound up being.

Bassett had made an excellent start, taking the lead on the quarter hour. After taking a pass from Ryan Stanners, Dan Lardner struck a low shot from 20 yards, which caught a deflection and found its way past a wrong-footed Gareth Tucker. That early lead lasted all of ten minutes though as Woodley equalised in stunning style. Abingdon broke quickly following a failed Bassett attack, and finding himself with too much room thirty yards from goal, the midfielder struck a blistering left-

footed drive that a scrambling Allison could do little to prevent finding the left corner of the goal.

A minute later the hosts should have been ahead. Sam Brown failed to clear, allowing Woodley to race down the left. He crossed for as an unmarked Graham Edney but he headed across the face of goal and inches wide.

The softest of free kick awards as Edney fell to ground far too easily under pressure from Steve Yeardeley helped set up Abingdon's second nine minutes from the break. Directly in front of goal and twenty yards out, Woodley spun his set piece over the wall and into the bottom right corner. Quickly, however, Bassett got back on level terms before taking the lead. Both goals came from an unlikely source – Adam Corcoran, who moved from his typical defensive role to the left wing. His first was an instinctive, poacher's finish, ghosting in at the far post to sweep home after Stanners flicked on a Kyle Rigley cross.

Two minutes later he had a second when he cleverly guided a header from the edge of the box into the opposite corner with the help of the post following an excellent Stanners delivery. Such a response should have provided Bassett the necessary momentum and stung Abingdon going into the break. Yet a disastrous loss of focus after Allison was guilty of spilling Doyle's knock forward meant the hosts would not be forced to chase following the restart.

They were almost made to immediately though as Sam Ockwell rattled the bar with a thunderous long ranger, before a less than confident save from Tucker parried a Corcoran shot to the feet of Sam Collier, who sent the rebound from a tight angle narrowly wide.

A moment of refereeing madness almost altered the game on 52 minutes, but a chat with an assistant led the man in black to his senses. After an Allison punch failed to clear from a corner, the follow up was blasted towards goal and blocked on the line. Abingdon's players excitedly appealed for a handball and the referee seemed to agree, blowing his whistle, pointing to the spot and preparing to administer a red card. However after a lengthy consultation, which heightened confusion amongst the crowd, he thankfully changed his mind.

Spared from being cruelly reduced to ten men, Bassett increasingly began

to impose themselves on Abingdon and should have been ahead on the hour. An instinctive, one-handed save from Tucker kept out Ockwell's close range header following a Kyle Rigley cross. The 'keeper could do little to stop the ball falling perfectly for Corcoran, but he passed up a golden chance to complete his hat-trick, blazing over from 15 yards.

Quarter of an hour later a dangerous Lardner delivery was headed just wide by Collier.

Then, however, disaster struck as Woodley delivered another thirty yard dagger deep into Bassett hearts with just twelve minutes to go. Lardner had his pocket picked inside his own half, and the ball fell to the Abingdon midfielder who, with too much room, swung his left foot with venom and found the bottom left corner.

No effective response was forthcoming - two half chances that fell to Collier being all Bassett could muster – as tired legs nullified the visiting threat. With defeat making it five narrow losses on the bounce, the tendency could be to bemoan decisions that have gone against Bassett in recent weeks or point to the odd spot of misfortune that the team have suffered.

Yet such a sustained losing streak points to faults that need to be corrected within the team. Indiscipline deprived Roberts' team of four key players for the trip to Abingdon; five more yellow cards being collected in this contest will not help on that front.

Fitness too has to be improved. A leggy midfield failing to shut down Woodley allowed him to complete his hat-trick, while conceding late goals has been a feature of many recent games. Similarly lapses in concentration must be eliminated, especially at set pieces, goals from which usually come courtesy of defensive failings rather than clever attacking.

For a team possessing plenty of talent that is now anchored in the bottom four, putting those things right is an imperative.

Man of the match: Ryan Stanners – involved in all three of Bassett's goals and his skill and willingness to run at the Abingdon defence caused trouble all afternoon.

Rating: 4/10 – it was a game Bassett had to get a result from. Instead they are dealing with another avoidable defeat, and an increasingly precarious league position.



Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.



Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One West on a ground grading technicality, despite an appeal to the FA against the decision. In the circumstances manager Dave Turner did well to steer his side to 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. Last season Wootton Bassett were never out of the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing in 2nd place. In addition they had a fantastic run in the FA Cup reaching the 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time where they put up a spirited performance against Conference South side Dorchester Town. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided he had taken the team as far as he could and left after a successful 5 years in charge. In his place have come the former Calne Town management duo of Jeff Roberts and former Bassett player Drew Youngsam.

As Bassett enter their 3rd period in the Premier the new management team will be looking to consolidate in the top division at a time when the Club has to play games at Cirencester Town whilst the new ground is built at Ballards Ash.

The Wiltshire Senior Cup was first competed for back in 1896-97 when Swindon Town were the winners. The Town have gone on to win the competition nine times, including the first six years of the competition. With their progress in the professional game it is a long time since Swindon Town have competed in the Cup. Wootton Bassett Town's first success in the competition was to come at the turn of the century when they made the final in 1902-03, losing to Warminster Town. Wootton Bassett made the final again the following season doing down to Swindon Town Reserves in the final. It would be 84 years before Wootton Bassett would grace the final of the competition again when in 1987-88 they made the final to this time lose against near neighbours Purton. Wootton Bassett Town finally won the cup in 1998-99 when they defeated Pewsey Vale in the final. This success was repeated two seasons later with a win over Shrewton United. Since this win the best the Bassett faithful have had is a couple of semi-final appearances. Last season Wootton Bassett Town went out in the Second Round, losing 3-0 away at Westbury United. The competition was won by Melksham Town, despite having been knocked out in the quarter final only to be re-instated due to their opponents Bradford Town playing an ineligible player. Melksham made the most of their second chance.

In the final the game ended 0-0 after 90 minutes against Downton but two extra time goals gave Melksham the cup for the 6th time.

Match Reports

Late penalty Bassett in a spot of both

Ardley puts

Corinium Stadium, 2nd November 2013

For the second consecutive week Wootton Bassett Town looked set to claim a point from one of the Hellenic League Premier Division's top three teams only for their hopes to be dashed by a late, controversial winner. This time it was Ardley who claimed the spoils, their 78th minute penalty sealing victory by the odd goal in three.

As gut-wrenching as the defeat was following a commendable performance in difficult conditions, Bassett's sense of frustration will be exacerbated by the fact other results mean they now stand just two points above the bottom four.

Defending against an extremely strong wind in the opening period, Jeff Roberts' team defended stoutly. And although they trailed at the break, it can be seen to be an achievement that Ardley - who boast one of the division's most prolific attacks - had been limited to just the one goal.

That came in the 19th minute. It took a fine tip over the bar from Steve Allison (pictured below in action at Highmoor Ibis) - forced to adjust his body quickly as the ball's path was altered by the wind - to divert Dean Smith's right wing cross following a neat one-two with Troy Bryan. Yet from the resulting corner the 'keeper was let down by his teammates' frailties at set pieces.



At the near post Ryan Brooks provided a sublime Ibrahimovic-esque flick to Darren Beckett's low corner, which found the bar and Ben Thomas was quickest to react to the rebound, heading in from ten yards.

Chances remained few and far between as Ardley, enjoying the lion's share of possession, probed forward only to be knocked back by a solid Bassett backline.

A further opening did eventually come a minute before the break, and it should have led to the second goal of the game. Bassett's defence froze as a goal kick was headed on, allowing Brooks a free run at Allison. But despite being presented with what appeared to be the easiest of one-on-ones, the Ardley forward scuffed his shot straight at the Bassett stopper.

After the restart the home side survived an early scare when a Beckett free kick fell for Bryan, whose side foot volley was blocked and scrambled wide.

Thereafter, with the wind now blustering behind Bassett, play switched to the other end. But as much as Bassett looked to create chances, they were frequently let down by a forced pass, such as the eagerness to get on level terms.



They were eventually able to do so though midway through the period and were aided in part by the elements. Jack Harding's goal kick caught the wind, travelling just thirty or so yards and Bassett pressure forced Ardley backwards. The ball then broke for Ryan Stanners on the left and his square ball played in Tyler Sheppard (pictured above) on the opposite wing, and he beat his

man before emphatically firing past Harding.

Buoyed by this, Bassett continued to press. With quarter of an hour to go a Kyle Rigley free kick bounced around the box before falling for Jordan Roberts, whose shot on the turn from a tight angle was deflected wide.

But three minutes later, the hosts' hopes were burst. From deep on the left wing, Tommy Kinch delivered a free kick into the box, which Brooks controlled. With Brooks having gained half a yard, his marker Craig Bowden gave him a slight nudge in the back that sent the forward sprawling.

It was a soft, borderline penalty, which Steve Howkins coolly dispatched to seal the points and inflict more late pain on Bassett.

Man of the Match: Sam Packer - moved inside to centre midfield for this game, Packer produced one of his best performances so far this season, winning a number of challenges and linking up well with those around him.



Rating: 6/10 - though Bassett's play at times caused them problems given the conditions - especially in the first half, they performed well, limiting Ardley to a handful of chances. Defending from set pieces again let them down, but losing late on was a cruel blow on an afternoon when they arguably did enough to gain a point.

World Cups Without England

A real controversial one this week. For those born after 1994, the thought of a World Cup without England is something that probably does not even cross the mind (even if Woy did make a sweat a bit). The last five tournaments have seen England qualify for the main event even though the best we have done in that 20 year period is the quarter finals in both 2002 and 2006.

However, there was a time in the 1970's when England did not qualify and for me the World Cups in Munich and Argentina are probably the two that last in the memory the longest for the quality of football on display. What do these two competitions have in common? Well England were not there and in both 1974 and 1978 we had to make do with supporting Scotland.

Who can forget the 1978 World cup which Scotland were all set to win thanks to Ally's majestic Tarten Army. How did it go, something like.... We're on the march w' Ally's Army, We're all going tae the Argentine, And we'll really shake them up when we win the World Cup, 'cos Scotland is the greatest football team, We're representing Britain, And we're gaunny do or die, England cannae dae it, 'Cos they didnae qualify!

Unfortunately Scotland had under estimated how powerful both Peru and Iran had

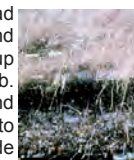
become in world football and after a 3-1 defeat to Peru and a 1-1 draw with Iran that World Cup dream was put on hold for another 4 years. They did have the consolation of cracking the Top 10 of the pop charts with their World Cup song and a wonder goal from Archie Gemmell in a 3-2 win over eventual runners-up Holland.

Back to 1974 and the World Cup finals in Munich. That Polish goalkeeper geezer had put paid to Sir Alf's England team and cost our World Cup winning manager his job. France, Russia, Spain and Hungary all also failed to qualify. Sixteen teams made up the tournament and it included first time qualifiers East Germany, Haiti, Australia and Zaire. In the early fixtures the weather was poor but what I recall is some good matches and some great goals. With England not there, I must say that there was not the usual stress you experience with World Cups. Watching England at a major tournament generally means the big hype beforehand, the disappointing first game, the eventual scrape through the group followed by the defeat on penalties, you know how it goes.

Whilst England did not play in the tournament we did have a say in the final with Jack Taylor as the man in black. Two penalties (one for each side) and a 2-1 win for West Germany over Holland. As people generally don't support the ref, his participation was not as stressful as watching an England side play, even if he did become the first referee to award a penalty in a final and he gave the first one in the first minute.

Four years later and the World Cup made its way to Argentina and again for me I have pleasant memories of

some great games, great goals, particularly from Holland and THAT game between Peru and Argentina that I stayed up late to watch and still believe to this day that there was no naughty business going on with Argentina winning 6-0 to top the group on goal difference from Brazil. There was also the little laugh at Scotland's expense thanks to the mighty Peru and Iran.



This was the World Cup that gave us Ossie Ardiles, Rickey Villa and Mario Kempes.

Again for me the lack of England presence meant that you could just sit back and enjoy the football and all that ticker-tape. Once again Holland were the neutrals favourite throughout the competition, even though Johan had apparently thrown his clogs out of his pram (although he later claimed his absence was due to a kidnap threat during his time at Barcelona). Despite missing their best player Holland still had Krol, Neeskens, Rep and the van der Kerkhof twins. A wonderful tournament and in my view the last real great World Cup potentially aided by England's absence. England missed out again in USA 1994 but this one does not remain in the memory for me. Maybe it is because it was in the US or maybe it was just that I was getting older and the World Cup no longer contained the same magic. Recalling that 1974 World Cup and looking in my old FKS Sticker album, I wonder what happened to Zaire's Ndaye Mulumba after the competition..... a Google search revealed the answer and an interesting tale it was too.

It's no joke for chairman Ian Marfell, however, who said: "It's been regarded as one of the best pitches in the Forest of Dean over the past ten years so to see it churned up is a bit of a pain."

Just a couple of months ago in the FA Cup, Huntingdon Town and Sleaford had their game abandoned with just three minutes left after a mass brawl between the two sides.

On a lighter note, the recent Southern Counties East League game between Canterbury City and Whyteleafe was called off, despite the best efforts of the away side.

Both clubs had exactly the same kit, which was only discovered

after the Leafe arrived at the ground, and even though the Surrey club dashed to get a new strip from nearby Margate, they missed the referee's cut off time of 3.30.

And what about failed floodlights? Or maybe those that don't get the chance to work! Crowborough Athletic were left in a spot of bother at the start of this season, due to overgrown trees!

Their home fixture against Shoreham was abandoned after floodlights failed an FA lux test due to the rebelling shrubbery.

"It's all a bit embarrassing to be honest," admitted chairman Tony Bowen. "We have a bit of a tree problem." Wood you believe it!

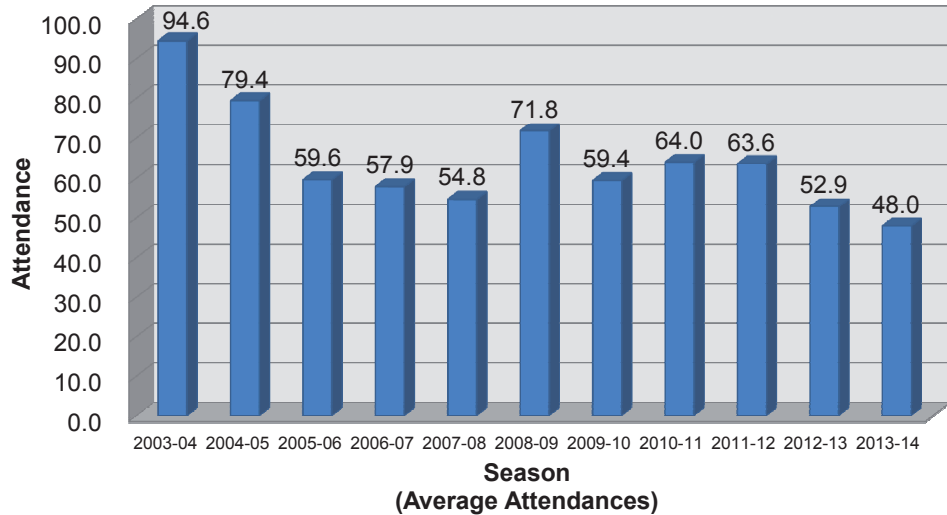

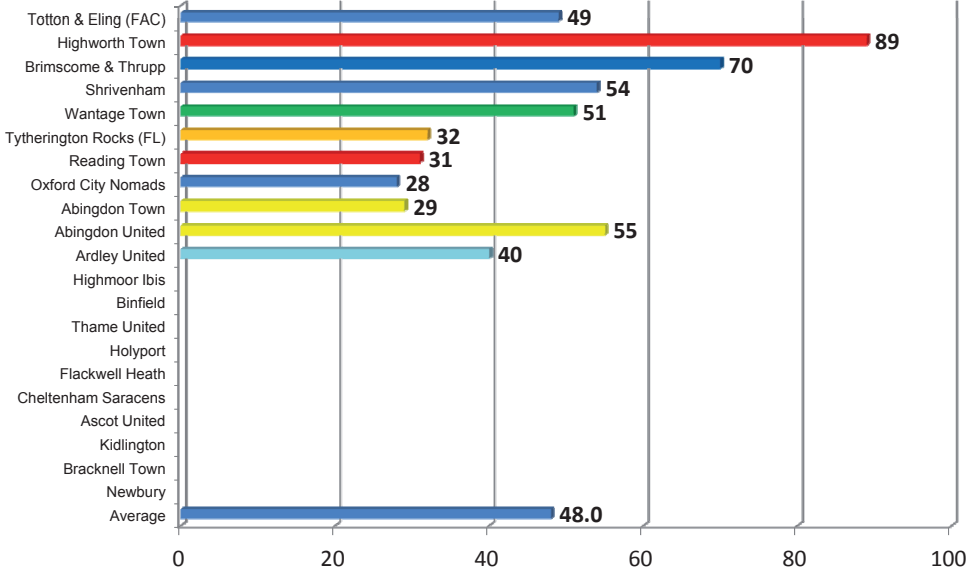

Mixed feelings as another point is picked up

Come the end of the season, Wootton Bassett Town's visit to Highmoor IBIS, which ended in a 2-2 draw, will likely come to be remembered as a missed opportunity. The two soft goals conceded, both of which negated leads, will stick in the craw.

As will the plentiful late fouls, constant bickering and flurry of yellow cards. In total, there were twelve bookings dished out, with Ryan Stanners (pictured below) having the misfortune to be the only player to collect two, the second coming in injury time for failing to retreat ten yards at a free kick.



This, the inaugural meeting between the teams, was no pretty affair.

But it could well have been. For the home side, wide men Jordon Brown and Stephen Peacock were great to watch, if not to defend against. Meanwhile for Bassett, the energetic Lewis Chatwin probed tirelessly up front with Jordan Roberts again pulling the strings in midfield. However, their talents would be overshadowed.

Six cards were issued in the opening stanza, including three in the first twenty minutes. One – for Adam Corcoran – came following a direct Brown run that saw him felled on the edge of the box and led to the game's first chance on goal. Phillip John blazed the resulting free kick just over though.

Brown's dangerous qualities were soon on display again when cut inside from his position on the left wing and drove a stinging effort which Steve Allison required two attempts to successfully collect.

Early on Bassett were struggling to make much headway going forward, but were able to go in front midway through the period. Sam Ockwell lifted a free kick into the box which led to an embarrassing mix-up, the ball headed by a defender and looping over 'keeper Lee Johnson. Gambling, defender Shaun Carter raced in and nodded into the empty net.

Highmoor seemed stunned after going behind and were fortunate not to see Bassett doubled their lead. Chatwin was through on goal just before the half hour when he latched onto an Ockwell slide rule pass. However he lost control as he prepared to shoot thanks to a bobble. Then a long range curler from Roberts required a stunning acrobatic save from Johnson to prevent it finding the top corner.

Unable to take advantage of this pressure, Bassett then allowed their hosts to get back on level terms far too easily. Nine minutes before the break Johnson threw out to Peacock on the right. Never under any pressure, the tricky midfielder drove forward and arrowed a 20-yard shot past Allison at his near post.

Peacock and Brown continued to threaten following the restart, the former finding the side netting from an angle before the latter forced Allison into an uncomfortable save as he drilled a half volley from Ben Lyden's knock down towards goal. Lyden also came close in the opening minutes of the second half and was only denied by a fine saving tackle from Carter.

With their hosts spurning numerous chances, it took just one for Bassett to nose ahead again on 62 minutes. And they did so in style. Catching Highmoor's defence off guard, Roberts took an early free kick, switching play to Sam Packer on the left. Packer, after holding play up briefly, then slid through Chatwin, who had made a darting diagonal run into the box, and he coolly slotted past Johnson.

Now having to chase the game, Highmoor pressed and Brown forced Allison into a fingertip save to prevent his strike finding the opposite left corner after he had darted inside marker Craig Bowden (pictured below).



Eventually Bassett's resistance broke. Yet when Highmoor equalised their goal came all too easily. Dropping off into midfield, John collected a pass from his defence and when he turned upfield found acres of space to move into. He then let fire from thirty yards and rifled past Allison from that distance.

In the closing stages it appeared as though the hosts would steal a winner too. Thanks to their tired legs Bassett conceded set piece after set piece around their own area. And with a minute left they were lucky to see Allison glove the ball away as it crept towards goals after a teasing John free kick bounced around the six yard box.

A point was thus preserved, though with extra due care it could even have been three.

Man of the Match: Lewis Chatwin – impressed in his first start, constantly seeking to get in behind the Highmoor defence while also giving them little time to dwell on the ball. The run that set up his goal was expertly timed and his finish composed.

Rating: 6/10 – the condition of the pitch made things tough, as did Highmoor's physical approach in the first half. Bassett matched their opponents and were worthy of a point, but will be cursing the circumstance of the goals they conceded.

Fair Play and Respect Table

This Bulletin includes the latest Fair Play and Respect League tables. This governs that amount of These tables measure our clubs as the name suggests, in terms of Fair Play and Respect. Premier and Division One clubs are separated into two tables.

Clubs that finish the season at the right end of the table (i.e. have a low number of points per game) receive enhanced financial rewards at the end of the season.

The opposite is true of clubs at the wrong end of this table (i.e. have a high number of points per game).

After Christmas the League Management Team hold meetings with the five clubs at the wrong end of each table. The aim is to understand what the clubs are doing to improve their position in the table and get a larger slice of the

Congratulations to those who are doing well consistently and also to those who have achieved big changes since last season.

In the Premier Division Thame United deserve note as that have moved from the 'wrong end' to the top of the class position. In fact three of the clubs that were in the bottom six at the mid-point of last season are now in the top six. The others are, Highworth Town, and Oxford City Nomads. Ardley United have consistently retained their place in the top five. Division One shows again three (Penn & Tylers Green, Finchampstead, and Letcombe) of the six clubs at the wrong end mid-point last season, now appearing in the top six. So there is plenty of opportunity for clubs to make good financial gains from this scheme.
