A Warm Welcome to our visitors this afternoon from Bemerton Heath Harlequins for this Wiltshire Senior Cup fixture. The winner of today's fixture will travel to Downton in the next round.

The two sides have met in cup competitions on two previous occasions. The first meeting was in the Wiltshire Premier Shield in Season 2001-2 when a solitary goal from Geoff Swatton (pictured below) was enough to give Wootton Bassett Town passage into the next round.



The last meeting between the two sides was in Season 2003-4 in the FA Vase. It was not a good day for Wootton Bassett as we had two players sent off and went down 4-1, the consolation goal coming from Mark Vaughan. There is a match report on this game from a very young Stuart Smedley in today's programme.

Bemerton are in the Premier Division of the Sydenhams Wessex League and currently sit in 7th place having won 11 of their opening 22 fixtures, drawing 2 and losing 9. Our defence could be busy today as they are averaging over 2.8 goals per game in the league and forwards Joe Sanger and Kane O'Keefe both have 13 goals to their name already.

Recent Results

We are now unbeaten in three games ahead of this Wiltshire Senior Cup fixture. The two draws against Ardley United (now league leaders) and Highmoor Ibis were excellent results and stopped the depressing run of single goal defeats. The Highmoor Ibis game was once again controversial with our visitors picking up 6 yellow cards and a red card. The pleasing thing from our perspective as well as the result was just two yellow cards in a game well controlled by referee Mr Staynings. Thankfully with Highmoor losing in the Supplementary Cup we will not now have to play them again this season.

It was pleasing to record a win in the Supplementary Cup, with Jeff fielding a full strength side at Old Woodstock. The win was much needed and will hopefully boost confidence ahead of this Wiltshire Senior Cup game today. This is a competition we had targeted at the start of the season as one we would look to go all the way. With Cricklade having folded today is our first game in the competition. Bemerton are a top side and other than perhaps Highworth Town and Melksham Town is one we would have wanted to avoid at this stage of the competition. With Highworth and Melksham having drawn each other in the quarter final if we can knock Bemerton out today then the chances of making the final look reasonable. The winner of this game will meet another Wessex

Premier league side in the shape of Downton who are down towards the bottom of the table after a tough start to the season.

Reserves

Last Saturday I had the opportunity to watch the Reserves for the first time this season. It was an enjoyable game with both sides trying to play football on a pitch that is in desperate need of a roll! To be honest Wootton Bassett should have won the game comfortably but the lack of cutting edge up front meant that in the end they had to settle for a point courtesy of a goal from George Drewitt. George was one of a number who for me is good enough to be given the chance with the First Team and I would add Steve Groom, Scott Walduck, Lee Smith and Fraser Joyce from what I saw on Saturday. Hopefully Jeff will give some of these youngsters an opportunity over the busy Christmas period.

Development Side

The Development Side have hit something of a rough patch of late. Last Saturday

Collier is spot on for struggling Wootton Bassett

SAM Collier's last-minute penalty salvaged struggling Wootton Bassett a point against Hellenic League Premier Division title hopefuls Ardley.

Trailing 1-0 going into the closing moments, Bassett were awarded a spot kick for handball and striker Collier slammed home his second goal for the club since rejoining at the end of October.

That effort from 12 yards enabled Bassett to end a run of five consecutive defeats which had seen them slide into the bottom four, but the draw allowed them to jump above local rivals Shrivenham into 16th on goal difference.

And Collier - still registered with Southern League Cirencester - felt it was a point that was fully-deserved.

"The boys did well," he said.

"For the first 10 minutes they battered us but we rode the storm and Lee Stevens and Shaun Carter were superb, and after that I thought we battered them.

"We didn't have a lot of chances or really look like scoring, but we kept the ball well considering where we are in the table."

"Their penalty killed us a bit but the lads kept their heads up.

"Jeff (Roberts, manager) got us in at half-time and told us to keep going, but when a few things didn't fall our way in the second half it looked like it was going to be one of those days. Luckily we got the penalty.

"The least the lads deserved was a point because we had a good old go and on a personal note it was nice to score a goal.

"The table does lie in my opinion. We've got some good lads there and all we need to do is stick together now."

Ardley played up the considerable slope at The Playing Fields in the first half and struck the woodwork on two occasions before the break.

The hosts got the first goal of the game with half-time looming, when Kyle Rigley's foul allowed Callum Convey to beat keeper Steve Allison from the spot.

Following the resumption, Tyler Sheppard came close to levelling when his left-footed shot zipped inches past the upright, before an acrobatic save from Allison kept the deficit to a single goal.

Bassett fired against the woodwork on two occasions themselves, with Ryan Stanners rattling the crossbar and recent signing Dan Lardner finding the inside of the post before the ball was cleared off the goalline.

However, just as it seemed Ardley were going to cling on, a handball in the box presented Collier with the opportunity to grab a draw, which he duly took.

WOOTTON Bassett's run of seven games without a win came to an end as they secured a comfortable 3-0 victory over Old Woodstock in the Supplementary Challenge Cup.

The man of the match redirected Steve Yeardeley's teasing free kick back across goal and Shaun Carter was perfectly-placed to guide the ball into the roof of the net.

Opponents - History



Bemerton Heath Harlequins were formed in may 1989 with the amalgamation of three clubs, Bemerton Athletic, Moon F.C. and Bemerton Boys.

All three clubs were previously very successful in their own right and were a major force in local football.

Bemerton Athletic won the Wiltshire League on three occasions. Moon F.C. consistently won honours in the Salisbury and Andover Leagues and Bemerton Boys won several trophies in the Mid-Wilts League.

The Moon F.C. and Bemerton Athletic were by the end of 1988, looking for a fresh challenge therefore provisional talks of a merger were held with an entry into the Wessex League being the No.1 priority.

This seemed the only logical step due to the close proximity of the grounds and the fact their players played for both clubs on Saturdays and Sundays.

It is history now that the talks were successful, Bemerton Heath Harlequins were formed and now operate from a magnificent clubhouse which was built by self help.

Seven sides are now run, including four boys sides ranging from Under 10 to Under 16, and the Under 18 Youth Team. Since the merger, the men's first XI have established themselves as a major force in the Wessex League.

The Western Way ground continues to be improved, providing the best facilities in the area, without doubt. 1999 saw the opening of the Moon Room with spectacular viewing over the pitch, for Moon Room members and sponsors.

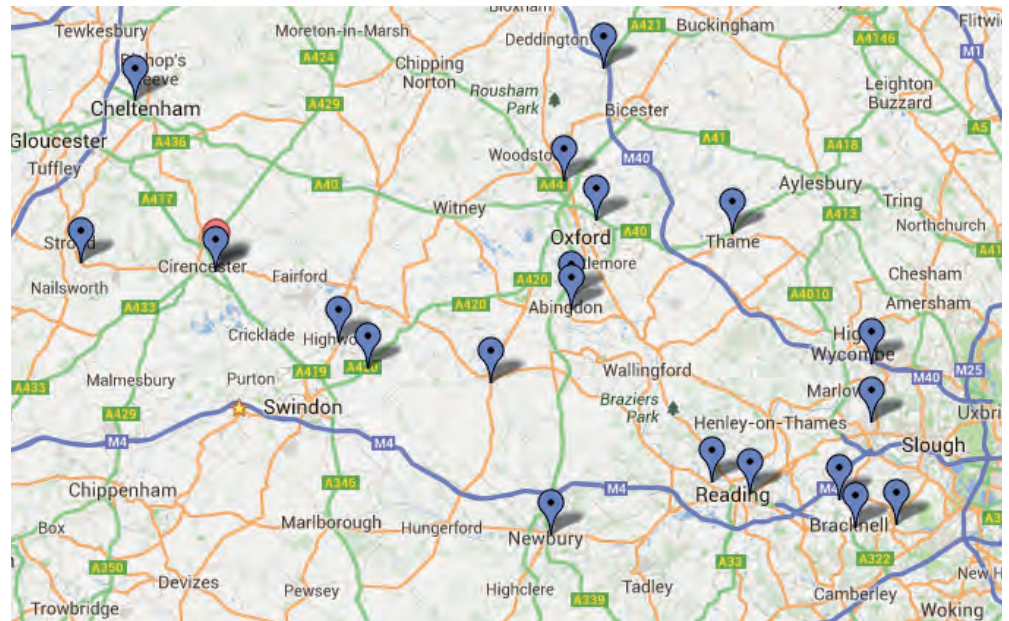
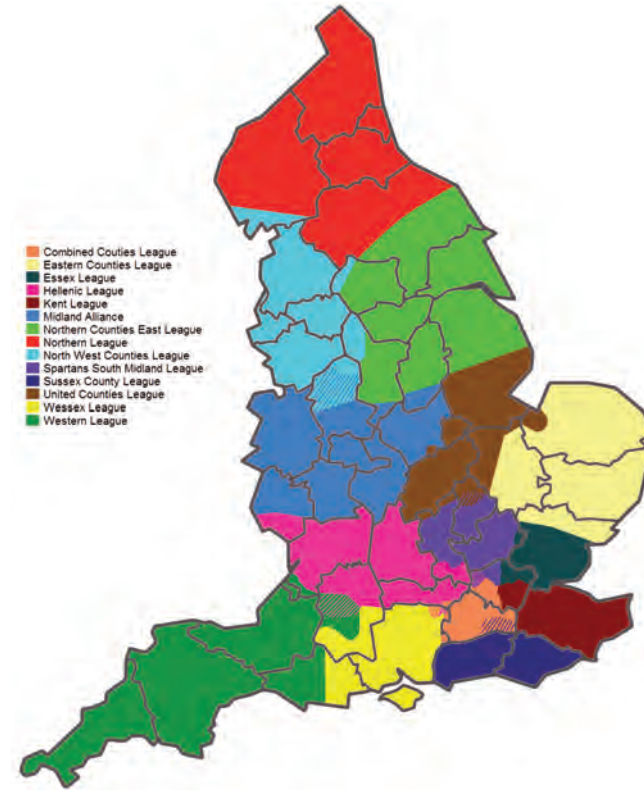

Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.



Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.



Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One West on a ground grading technicality, despite an appeal to the FA against the decision. In the circumstances manager Dave Turner did well to steer his side to 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. Last season Wootton Bassett were never out of the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing in 2nd place. In addition they had a fantastic run in the FA Cup reaching the 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time where they put up a spirited performance against Conference South side Dorchester Town. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided he had taken the team as far as he could and left after a successful 5 years in charge. In his place have come the former Calne Town management duo of Jeff Roberts and former Bassett player Drew Youngsam.

As Bassett enter their 3rd period in the Premier the new management team will be looking to consolidate in the top division at a time when the Club has to play games at Cirencester Town whilst the new ground is built at Ballards Ash.

Wootton Bassett Town are currently at Step 5 in the Football Pyramid

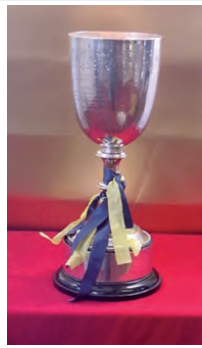

The Wiltshire Senior Cup was first competed for back in 1896-97 when Swindon Town were the winners. The Town have gone on to win the competition nine times, including the first six years of the competition. With their progress in the professional game it is a long time since Swindon Town have competed in the Cup. Wootton Bassett Town's first success in the competition was to come at the turn of the century when they made the final in 1902-03, losing to Warminster Town. Wootton Bassett made the final again the following season doing down to Swindon Town Reserves in the final. It would be 84 years before Wootton Bassett would grace the final of the competition again when in 1987-88 they made the final to this time lose against near neighbours Purton. Wootton Bassett Town finally won the cup in 1998-99 when they defeated Pewsey Vale in the final. This success was repeated two seasons later with a win over Shrewton United. Since this win the best the Bassett faithful have had is a couple of semi-final appearances. Last season Wootton Bassett Town went out in the Second Round, losing 3-0 away at Westbury United. The competition was won by Melksham Town, despite having been knocked out in the quarter final only to be re-instated due to their opponents Bradford Town playing an ineligible player. Melksham made the most of their second chance.

In the final the game ended 0-0 after 90 minutes against Downton but two extra time goals gave Melksham the cup for the 6th time.

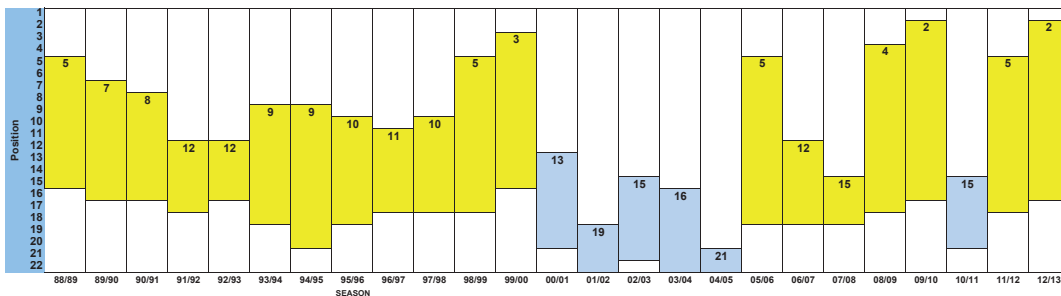

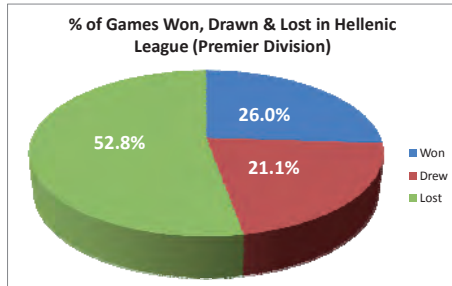
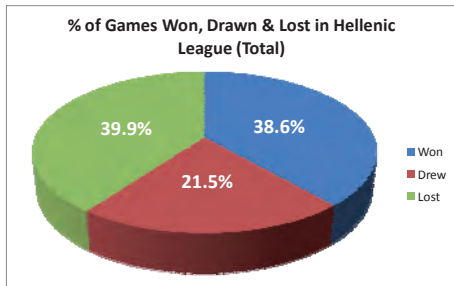

Big Bad Spurs

FOOTBALL takes leave of its senses, case study 12,586: Tottenham Hotspur FC.

In case you were enjoying a package holiday on the moon, Premier League Tottenham had a busy summer.

After a close season of 'will-he, won't he' tedium, Welsh wizard Gareth Bale left to Real Madrid for a cool £85m.



Spurs and their manager, who we are obliged to call AVB, had already been busy re-investing and re-shaping their squad.

By the time they were finished bringing in the likes of Roberto Soldado, Paulinho, Erik Lamela, and Christian Eriksen they'd splashed out a tidy £107m.

Top level football may operate in a totally separate universe where £100,000 -a-week wages are normal and fans will demand their club splash £30m on a player, but we can all agree

we're talking astronomical sums of money.

So, with that background set, let's move onto Wessex League Division One Fleet Spurs FC.

The tiny Hampshire club is just that – tiny. Only within the last few years has a perimeter fence been built around their ground which is essentially at local playing fields.

They've been around since 1948 when they were formed by two Tottenham Hotspur fanatics.

And, in tribute to their favourite club, they've always had a cockerel on their logo. Until now that is.



Fleet Spurs were contacted by the Champions League hopefuls back in August enquiring about their club badge.

After sending a picture from 1952 to show the long-standing emblem they heard no more and assumed the matter closed.

That was until last month when a letter arrived from a big London Law firm ordering them to change their badge and all signage at their ground within a month or face being sued.

Now it is impossible to deny that the cockerel on the badge of Fleet Spurs isn't all but identical to Spurs' copyrighted one.

And Tottenham are probably right to protect their, shudder, brand.

But whatever the legal ins, outs, rights and wrongs they could have approached it completely differently and avoided a PR own goal in the process.

Fleet Spurs say they feel "bullied" and claim changing the signage, headed paper and all

that comes with it will cost in excess of £3,000.

Tottenham say they have tried to approach the situation with common sense and they were careful not to ask them to do anything that would incur costs. They've even said the club don't need to change the badge on their kits until they next renew them.

But they could have come out of this so much better and showed that Premier League clubs can show a bit of awareness and love to the grass-roots game.

Because it's not just about the Fleet Spurs first team that play in English football's tenth tier. They also have 22 boys and girls youth teams that have been providing youngsters in the area with a start on the football ladder. Who knows where they could end up.

Tottenham didn't necessarily have to fork out for the changes. Maybe they could have helped organise a charity Veterans match in the summer.

After all that's what Fleet Spurs wrote to them about earlier this year, before the whole situation came about.

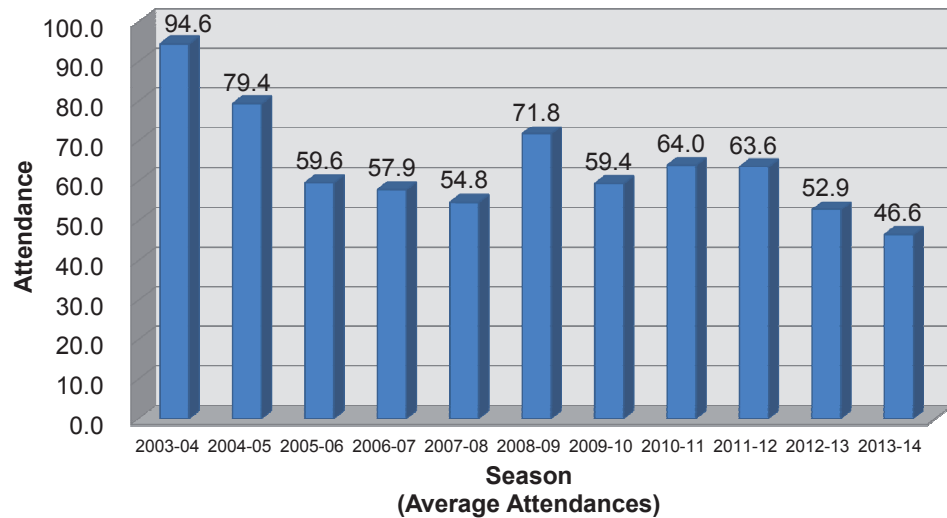

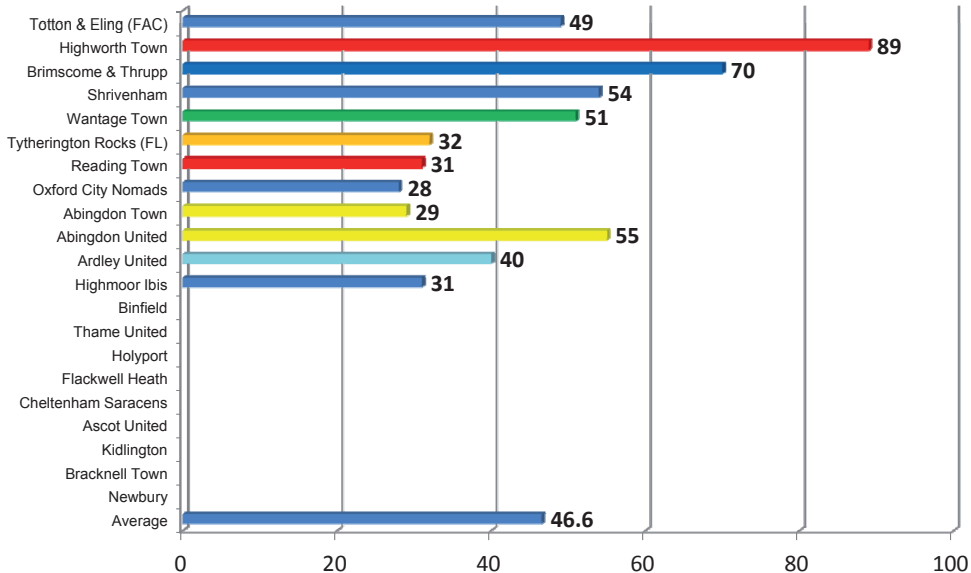

Two Sent Off for Bassett As They Fall Victims of Some Harsh Decisions and Crash Out of Vase Sat 20 September 2003

Steve Yeardley and Rob Hopkins were sent off as some controversial refereeing condemned Bassett to an early exit from the FA Vase as they lost out 4-1 in a "one sided game". Mark Vaughan had put Bassett ahead before Bemerton Heath added four goals – two of which were very dubious – to put Bassett out. Bassett were much the better team in the first half and this showed with the amount of chances they had. Dave Jones came close five minutes into the game when he shot from the edge of the area but Scott Kemmis saved. Five minutes later Bemerton had their first chance when an unmarked Ian Chalk headed wide a Darren Turner cross. Geoff Swatton had another good chance for Bassett as he bicycle kicked over a Carl Taylor corner on fifteen minutes, before hitting just wide a minute later from the edge of the area. Steve Yeardley received the first caution of the game when he was booked for a foul on Andy Chainey. Jones had another chance a minute after the booking when he weaved his way through the Bemerton defence to create an opportunity but he hit a weak shot straight at Kemmis who saved, this after brilliant work by Carl Taylor. Bassett continued to apply pressure and on twenty three minutes a Yeardley ball was connected with by Matty Bennett in the air but the header was saved. Bemerton countered from this and a ball across was played to Turner who ran into the box only for Yeardley to cancel out his chance. A minute later Turner headed wide another switched ball. Bemerton had a player booked eighteen minutes from half time when Paul Palmer was booked for a foul on Paul Patel. On the half hour a mistake by Kemmis fell to Geoff Swatton who had a twenty yard shot saved after brilliant work by Matt Bennett to force the mistake. Paul Davis was then booked for Bassett for a foul a minute later. Bassett took the lead on thirty four minutes when Geoff Swatton played in Mark Vaughan who chipped over Kemmis from ten yards out. Two minutes later Kemmis kept Bennett out after he struck from the edge of the area forcing a cracking save from the Bemerton 'keeper. Bennett and Swatton had two more chances before Bemerton tested Bassett. Two minutes from the break a Adam Nash shot from a free kick laid back to him took a deflection and was saved well by Rich Stevens. Then three minutes later it was 1-1 when a long ball fell at Chalk's feet who got past Paul Davis and put the ball past Stevens. Drama unfolded two minutes later deep into injury time when Steve Yeardley received his marching orders for an off the ball incident which the referee said was obstruction which isn't a book able offence. Bassett went into the break a man down and tied at one all.

The sending off changed the game around in the second half as Bemerton gained momentum and took advantage of being a man up. On fifty minutes Turner and Chalk combined again as the latter had a head saved from Chalk's cross. A minute later and the ref was digging into his pocket again as Geoff Swatton got booked for dissent. On 52 minutes an unmarked Chalk made a run into the box and headed over a Nathan Renyard corner. Two minutes later Geoff Swatton was clean through on goal and the last man Adam Nash dragged him down just outside the box which should have brought out a straight red but Nash only received a yellow. This was to change the game as it should have been 1-1 with ten on each side. In the 61st minute a Mark Vaughan header was deflected wide following a Matty Bennett ball. Seven minutes before Vaughan was booked for tripping. Once again, in the 71st minute, Swatton was clean through on goal and was brought down by the last man but this time there was no free kick. This a minute before Chalk got another goal as Rich Stevens couldn't get hold of the ball, punched it off the line but the ball was deemed by the linesman, who wasn't up with play, to have crossed the line. This brought an argument with the linesman and from this Rob Hopkins was sent off for shouting abusive language – which no one heard – at the linesman involved in the incident. Bassett then brought Neil Bridges on in the 75th minute for Dave Jones to put a bit more speed on the pitch. Five minutes later and Ben Gascoyne replaced Paul Patel. In the 82nd minute Chalk came close again as he headed a Renyard corner over. Bassett made their final change a minute later when Andy Hallett replaced Paul Davis. Bemerton increased their lead in the 84th minute when Carl Jones was found with the ball in a clear offside position but play carried on and Jones slotted past Stevens to make it three. Three minutes from time it was four – one Bemerton as substitute Jason Ahmet scored from a Stu Findley cross after Stevens spilled Ahmet's shot. Stevens denied Ahmet a minute into stoppage time as he tipped a shot from Ahmet wide. Bassett crashed out of the FA Vase at the first hurdle for the second year running but this time it was poor decisions that had allowed Bemerton to win. In a game of two sendings off and five bookings it was hard to recall one single nasty incident and the card count certainly did not reflect the way the game had been played, only the performance of the referee. Scoop made his feelings known by texting 606 on Radio 5 Live but unfortunately the message was not read out on air!

Scoop's Man of the Match: Rich Willis – consistent throughout and made some clinical challenges to deny more goals.

Scoop Rating: 7/10 – Best Bassett have played for a long time, continually threatening Bemerton with the pace upfront.

Jordan Roberts Midfield



Roberts is a supremely talented central midfielder who is capable of dictating a game. With a fantastic passing range, goalscoring ability, great touch and balance, and the willingness to get stuck in, he has proved to be a fantastic addition to the squad.

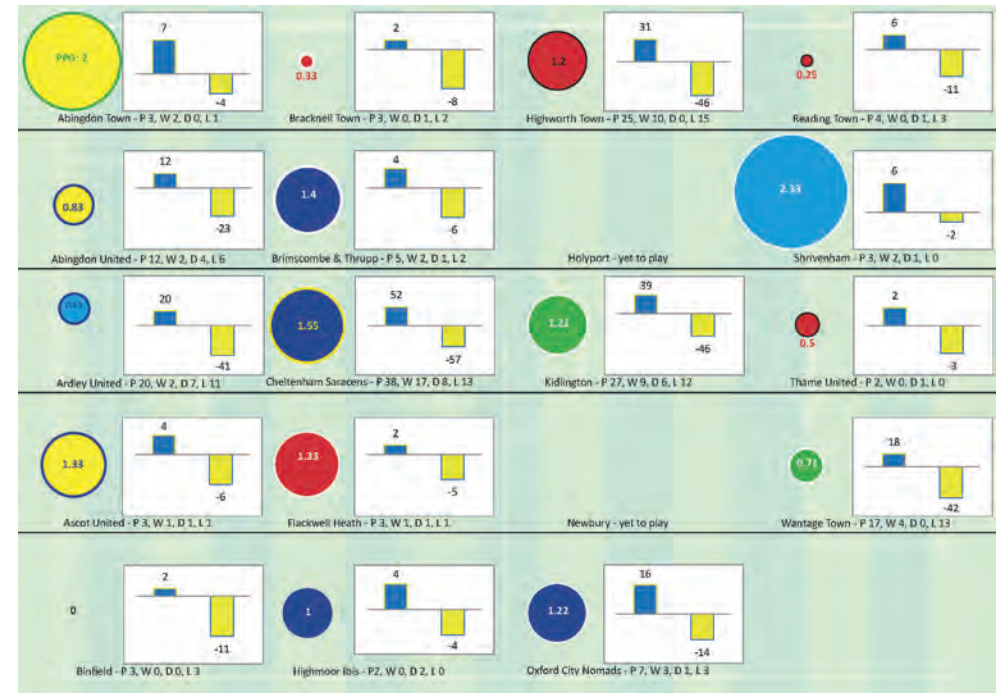
He made his bow in senior football with Calne Town towards the end of the 2008/09 season, and scored once in four appearances. A year later he featured 34 times, scoring three. In the summer of 2010 he signed for Belgian fourth tier outfit R.R.F.C. Montegnee. However, that move fell through due to international clearance rules and he finished the 2010/11 campaign with Calne having also dual-signed with Chippenham Town.

In 2011/12 Roberts played 28 times for Calne, scoring five goals. Last season with the Lilywhites he finished as second top scorer, netting eight times in 28 appearances. That figure would likely have been higher had he not ended the season with Southern League Swindon Supermarine, for who made his debut in January against Hungerford Town. He featured regularly, albeit often as a substitute, as Dave Webb's side came close to securing promotion back to step three. In total he played 14 times for Marine, making four starts and scoring once in the Wiltshire Premier Shield. He figured prominently in their Playoff Semi Final with Merthyr Town and was controversially sent off in the game which Marine eventually lost on penalties.

Point per game record – current Hellenic League opponents

The above graphic shows Bassett's record in Hellenic League fixtures against our current Premier Division rivals. The circles represent Bassett's points per game record against individual opponents, while the bars show goals for and goals against in those games.

Given that Bassett have played just six teams twelve times or more, it's difficult in the majority of cases to draw conclusions regarding who, historically, has the upper hand over the other. Nevertheless, a number of interesting observations can be made. First and foremost, Bassett's record against Ardley United, Wantage Town and Abingdon United has been miserable. In a combined 49 games against those teams, Bassett have won just eight and drawn eleven. Although the recent draw against Ardley was extremely satisfying, Bassett's last win against them came in October 1998. Since winning the first two contests against Abingdon in the 2000/01 season (both 2-1 victories), Bassett have drawn four and lost six. In 17 matches against Wantage, Bassett have won just four, conceded an average of 3.5 goals and have scored 24 fewer than the Alfredians. This fixture, meanwhile, has never produced a league draw. That fact also applies to matches against local rivals Highworth Town, with no games finishing all square after ninety minutes in 25 meetings – an astonishing feat, especially so given 38 Hellenic League games against our other big rival Purton have produced 10 ties.

Of Bassett's 'regular' opponents, against only one – Cheltenham Saracens – do they have a winning record, with 17 wins, 8 draws and 13 losses in 38 games. Interestingly though, the Saracens have scored 57 in these contests, compared with 52 goals for Bassett. Goals are also not as frequent in this fixture as others, with an average 2.89 per game; that is borne out by the last four meetings producing just six goals.

Kidlington – who hold the upper hand with 12 wins compared to Bassett's 9 in 27 games – and Bassett have been relatively evenly matched opponents. After winning four of their opening six games against the Oxfordshire side, Bassett then recorded just two victories in the next 14. Recently though the pendulum has swung back in Bassett's favour, with three wins – including the 3-1 away victory earlier this season - and two draws in the last seven contests.

Despite having played only a few games against both, Bassett's matchups with Brimscombe and Thrupp and Oxford City Nomads have also been closely fought. However, games against Brimscombe have generally been cagey affairs with an average of just two goals per game, while those against the Nomads average over four.
