The two sides met for the first time in Season 2010-11, both games coming at the back end of the season. On 29th March 2011 Binfield won 3-1 at Rylands Way. "FORMATION OF A FOOTBALL CLUB – Thanks to the energetic efforts of Messrs Clark and Hearn, who convened a meeting for this purpose at the Royal Oak Hotel last week, a club has been started, and play has already commenced in good earnest. A good number have already joined, and considerable support is promised, and there appears every prospect of

the club having an enjoyable and, we hope, a successful season. The game will be played upon the rules of the Football Association. Mr Clark is the captain, and Mr Hearn secretary."

Turner defends old team against Roberts' comments

Friday 6th December 2013

DAVE Turner has launched a robust defence of Craig Bowden and his Wootton Bassett team of 2012/13 following comments by Jeff Roberts last week. Shrivenham boss Turner, manager of Bassett for five years until the summer when he was succeeded by Roberts, is expected to complete a move for Bassett full-back Bowden ahead of this weekend's Hellenic League Premier Division trip to Ardley.

The prospective signing comes off the back of comments by Roberts stating that Bowden's game had been lacking of late and that Bassett had less quality on the bench last season than this term. However, Turner hit back on both counts. "I'm very disappointed in the way he (Roberts) spoke about the team. I found it disrespectful." said Turner.

"He said Craig was playing last season as there was a lack of quality on the bench, but I found that very disrespectful to that group of players.

"I didn't get promotion twice with 11 players, I did it with 16 or 17 players and the reason Craig played so many games under me wasn't because of a lack of strength in depth, it's because he's pound-for-pound the best defender I've worked with for a long time.

"He's conscientious and I can count the number of training sessions he missed on one hand. I've had one or two texts from current Bassett players saying they can't believe Craig has been allowed to leave, so that tells you about the measure of the man.

"I look at John Fisher, Dave Webb and Mark Collier and I don't ever remember them singling out players, so I think we can all learn a bit from that.

"I don't want to get involved in a slanging match, but I make no apology for being protective towards that group of players."

However, Roberts responded by saying his comments about strength in depth were based on opinions passed on to him by others at Bassett and he denied he had singled out Bowden for criticism. "What I was told was that last year Bassett sometimes only had one or two players on the bench." he said.

"I didn't single Craig out, what I said was that in certain areas his game needed to improve. He did very well for us in preseason but his head has gone down in the last few games and he's not the only

"I know being on the bench the last couple of weeks hurt him a little bit, but if players aren't playing well, they will get dropped.

"I didn't want Craig to go and I told him there was a place for him, but he wanted to be guaranteed football and I don't think any club at this level can quarantee that."

Bassett are at home to Bemerton in the second round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup this weekend and keeper Steve Allison is unavailable so 17-year-old Curtis Meare will deputise. Jason Milhench and Levi Cox are available but Lee Stevens and Ryan Stanners are missing.

Bassett's Half Term Report Friday 29th December 2013

"It seems strange to be penning a half season review at the end of November, but with games coming thick and fast in the Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division, after the visit of Highmoor Ibis. Wootton Bassett Town have now completed 19 of their 38 matches." Writes Bassett's Stuart Smedley

"While results of those have left Bassett lying in 16th, Jeff Roberts' team are still within touching distance of rivals currently sitting in what is a crowded middle of the table, and can take confidence from frustrating a number of the division's top teams. Many sitting towards the division's summit have been pushed extremely close by Bassett, who have drawn six and suffered seven defeats by a single qoal."

After a rude welcome back to life at step five with losses against Bracknell Town and Highworth Town, Bassett bounced back, taking 14 points from their next eight games. Six of those were earned from four tough away trips, and during that run Flackwell Heath, Highmoor Ibis, Ascot United and Reading Town were all held to draws, the latter in a spellbinding eight goal thriller.

However, an agonising slump followed with just five points gained from the next ten games. Six of those matches were lost by a single goal, including five in a row, with late strikes determining the outcome in the return fixture with Reading and against Ardley United and Binfield. A certain amount of revenge was then exacted against Ardley as a late Sam Collier penalty secured an excellent away point before Highmoor's five game winning streak was brought to an end with a 2-2 draw on Wednesday.

With a number of newcomers and a squad that has seen a fair few changes since opening day, it has admittedly

taken time for players to gel, which has undoubtedly impacted results so far. Nevertheless, there are plenty of reasons to feel upbeat about the group of players new boss Roberts has fused together. With a solid defensive unit and the recent addition of frontman Sam Collier, there should be much hope that the team can work their way back up the table.

The play of midfielders Jordan Roberts and Ryan Stanners – both brought in during the summer – has been especially strong. The former has chipped in with six goals, four of which have come in the league and include winners against Brimscombe and Kidlington. Stanners, devilishly tricky to defend against, has meanwhile come on strongly in recent weeks and has provided numerous assists.

Central midfielder Sam Ockwell and joint-leading league goalscorer Jason Milhench have both been pleasant surprises too after making the jump up from Wiltshire League football.

One thing Bassett will need to do in order to climb the table is cut down on the enforced absences through suspension that have certainly hurt the team in recent weeks. So far their disciplinary record is the third worst in the division with cautions for dissent already more than double the number recorded for the same offence in 2012/13.

By overcoming these disciplinary issues and ensuring Roberts can field his strongest players week in and week out, Bassett should be capable of causing greater trouble."

Jeff Roberts says tomorrow's Bluefin Sport Supplementary Cup trip to One West Old Woodstock Town could prove a vital confidence booster.

Bassett face Remerton in the Wiltshire Senior Cup second round in eight days' time - a competition that Roberts was keen to win at the start of the season and he wants his players to go into that fixture on a high. "We will go for it in the Supplementary Cup because we're trying to build a little bit of confidence." said Roberts. "We're starting to steady the ship and it would be nice to get a win in the cup before we play Bemerton. I'd like us to score some goals and keep a clean sheet and I might change some things to give a couple of players a runout." Sam Packer is available following a three-game suspension, while Roberts has promised full-back Craig Bowden that he will get his chance soon despite finding his opportunities limited of late "It was different for him (Bowden) last year as Bassett probably didn't have the quality on the bench and players knew they'd be playing every week," said Roberts, "His distribution has been a bit poor but the opportunity will come up and when it does he's got to take it."

Opponents - History

Binfield FC • Club History

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.



During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground. In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972, Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house we see today. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In the following season we reached the final of the Berks and Bucks Intermediate Cup for the first time but unfortunately lost in extra time. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt, and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign. A Cup Final appearance in the Reading Senior Cup also ended in disappointment as we lost by the odd goal in three to Peppard. In 1995 we reached the final of the Reading Senior Cup only to lose to Mortimer on penalties and in 96 we won the Chiltonian League again.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the membership, with over 20 teams playing every weekend this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013. We're also in our second season of a partnership scheme with Reading FC where some of our younger players have the opportunity to train with Reading FC. In 2003 we added an Allied Counties Youth team which is now providing a steady stream of talented young players ready for Senior football for the Reserves and 1st Team. Our reserves side are a vital and successful part of our club, providing progression from our youth team into senior football and regularly providing players for the 1st team squad, whilst also being successful in winning Uhlsport Hellenic Division 2 East in 2012, runners up in 2013 and coming runners up in the Reserves Challenge Cup in both seasons. Half a dozen players last season progressed from our Youth team into our Reserves and four of those went on to make 1st team appearances this season two of those 'home-grown' players are in the starting 1st team squad. Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. We've continued to improve our facilities with the car park and changes to the club house. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team and Veterans. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 Uhlsport Hellenic Premier Division and 3rd in 2012/13. August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup. Ultimately the step up to the next tier of English non league football is our aim.



WBTFC History On One Page

Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.



Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II.After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.



Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One West on a ground grading technicality, despite an appeal to the FA against the decision. In the circumstances manager Dave Turner did well to steer his side to 5th place the following season after such heartbreak, Last season Wootton Bassett were never out of the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing in 2nd place. In addition they had a fantastic run in the FA Cup reaching the 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time where they put up a spirited performance against Conference South side Dorchester Town. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided he had taken the team as far as he could and left after a successful 5 years in charge. In his place have come the former Calne Town management duo of Jeff Roberts and former Bassett player Drew Youngsam.

As Bassett enter their 3rd period in the Premier the new management team will be looking to consolidate in the top division at a time when the Club has to play games at Cirencester Town whilst the new ground is built at Ballards Ash.

Wiltshire Senior Cup



The Wiltshire Senior Cup was first competed for back in 1896-97 when Swindon Town were the winners. The Town have gone on to win the competition nine times, including the first six years of the competition. With their progress in the professional game it is a long time since Swindon Town have competed in the Cup. Wootton Bassett Town's first success in the competition was to come at the turn of the century when they made the final in 1902-03, losing to Warminster Town. Wootton Bassett made the final again the following season doing down to Swindon Town Reserves in the final. It would be 84 years before Wootton Bassett would grace the final of the competition again when in 1987-88 they made the final to this time lose against near neighbours Purton. Wootton Bassett Town finally won the cup in 1998-99 when they defeated Pewsey Vale in the final. This success was repeated two seasons later with a win over Shrewton United. Since this win the best the Bassett faithful have had is a couple of semi-final appearances. Last season Wootton Bassett Town went out in the Second Round, losing 3-0 away at Westbury United. The competition was won by Melksham Town, despite having been knocked out in the guarter final only to be re-instated due to their opponents Bradford Town playing an ineligible player. Melksham made the most of their second chance.

In the final the game ended 0-0 after 90 minutes against Downton but two extra time goals gave Melksham the cup for the 6th time.

Stirring comeback stifles form team Highmoor

A pair of dramatic late goals helped Wootton Bassett Town overcome a two goal deficit to earn a valuable point against Hellenic League Premier Division form team Highmoor Ibis.

With just three appearances beyond the second round in their last eleven participations, Wootton Bassett Town were hoping this would be the year they finally saw their Wiltshire Senior Cup fortunes reverse. However, Bemerton Heath Harlequins put paid to any dreams of a possible tilt at County Cup glory, winning 3-2 after extra time in their second round clash with Bassett.

Bemerton won the game with a 115th minute goal, despite having to play the extra half hour with just ten men after a handball on the line had allowed Sam Collier (pictured below) to dramatically equalise in second half stoppage time.



On an eventful afternoon, that extra time hammer blow came an age after the game's first goal, which Levi Cox supplied for Bassett in the fourth minute. Half Time Score **Boards**



Long before the internet came along and every one could get instant scores on their mobile phones, supporters at the ground had to make do with a manual score board which was used to give out the half time scores across the country. Each and every ground had their own version.

Today where there are advertising hoardings you would have seen the letters of the alphabet with a space for two numbers (a bit like those used for a cricket score board) to be inserted. Some clubs would have the full range from A to Z whilst others would just have enough for the division they were in.

The programme would then include a de-coder which told you that, for example, Game A was Arsenal v Everton and if at half time two number 1's were inserted in the space after the letter you knew the score at half time was 1-1.

You only tended to be given the score at half time, very rarely was the system used for the final full time scores and you had to then wait until Sports Report at 5pm on your transistor radio to get the full time scores or watch

(bit difficult if you are at a game). If you could not get



The score board was also available as a Subbuteo accessory (see Totton & Eling programme). It fitted into the standard pitch surround and came with the numbers to insert those half time scores from your own Subbuteo league.



At Highbury Arsenal had two sets of A to Z lettering - one in the north east corner and one in the south west. Towards the end of half time someone would creep through the tunnel behind the letters and insert the numbers for the scores. There were groans and cheers according to the results as they went up.

For one of the celebrations (75 years at Highbury maybe) the process was reintroduced and people could apply for the right to insert the numbers for a game or two.



As electronic scoreboards came along in the bigger grounds, the old fashioned half time scoreboard became a thing of the past and of course nowadays the top clubs have super-duper computer screens with instant replays and all sorts. A long iourney from wooden letters and plastic numbers.

At Loftus Road these days they put the half time scores on both the big screen and onto electronic boards halfway up the stand at each end.



No longer do you need to worry about St Johns or stewards standing in front of letter G and that big Man Utd v Man City game.

Whilst today's technology is clearly better there is something nostalgic about the old manual system. Perhaps Wootton Bassett Town could introduce one of these at their new ground which contains the half time scores from around the Uhlsport Hellenic League, sourcing scores from the modern technology that is Twitter. I am sure Steve Matthews could knock one of the core boards out for us on his lathe. Time to fill in a capex request to Andv and H.





Fine Prove Again

Margins Costly

Hill Farm lane, 11th November 2013

After a painstaking fortnight which has seen Wootton Bassett Town suffer four consecutive defeats by the narrowest of margins, Jeff Roberts' side will be well versed in the mantra that it takes just one moment for a game to be changed.

The latest in that string of losses came at a Binfield side, who entered the game in a rut of their own. Tipped by many to be title contenders, they instead found themselves just two places above their visitors in the bottom half. How glad they were then that they were able to sneak a 1-0 victory.

Although they looked dangerous coming forward, with winger Dan Ralpey in particular a menace, a sterling performance from Bassett's defence made it appear as though a clean sheet was in the offing for Bassett

That was until the visitors gifted their hosts a goal with seventeen minutes remaining. Against Reading Town and Ardley United, it was Bassett's inability to defend free kicks which ultimately dashed their hopes of a point. Against Binfield the decisive goal again stemmed from a set piece, though this time it came from a corner at the opposite end of the pitch.

Seeing their set piece cleared comfortably, those who had come forward to try stick it in the back of the Binfield net were slow to react, creating a sense of panic in those who had stayed behind.

It should really have been the job of Ryan Stanners, designated to sit on the edge of the box, to close the loose ball down. But he had switched off, allowing Binfield to break. And a ball over the top caught out Sam Ockwell, who slipped. Jemel Johnson then raced on unopposed, coolly slotting beneath Steve Allison.

It was an opportunity Johnson could not pass up on an evening when he and strike partner James Suarez were otherwise stifled. Despite an early scare in the first minute when an unmarked Johnson swept straight into the arms of Allison, there was little that bothered the Bassett stopper, with centre halves Lee Stevens and Shaun Carter in fine form.

Bassett too struggled to create as Sam Collier, alone up front, was left isolated. Instead, the visitors were forced to settle for a number of half chances, the first of which fell to Sam Packer on six minutes as he sent a skidding 20-yard effort wide of the near post after being allowed to run at full back Ben Sturgess.

Shortly before half time Danny Wing's intricate footwork allowed the winger to work his way from the left wing into the box, before he squared for Johnson only to see Craig Bowden's sliding challenge prevent any hope of a shot.

Following the restart the pattern of the first half continued. Both sides would play some neat football in the midfield before seeing moves smothered thanks to sharp defending.

For Bassett, Packer's deflected long range shot was collected easily by Shaun Coker before Jordan Roberts headed wide a Sam Ockwell free kirk

The only save of note came from Allison on 67 minutes as he fisted a rising Adam Cornell thunderbolt around the post.

He could do little though to prevent Johnson as he raced clear.

As Bassett chased the game they were disadvantaged when creative force Roberts was scythed down by Rapley and forced to leave the field on a stretcher. That tackle, coming minutes after Adam Corcoran was felled by a late, cynical Carl Davies foul, had been coming in a contest that threatened at times to brew over as niggly fouls, bickering and an eagerness to confront opponents from both sides put a downer on an otherwise interesting affair.

And with a fourth loss in a row, that sense of disappointment will be greater for Bassett. They played well. It's just they made one critical mistake and were made to suffer, again.

Man of the Match: Shaun Carter – demonstrated why his manager was right to bring him back into the team with a commanding performance at centre half.



Rating: 6/10 – Bassett were a match for their opponents, keeping their lively strike force at bay while playing some flowing football going forward. Their performance was worthy of a point, but one error made sure that did not occur.

Player Profile

Lee Stevens Defence or Striker



Few players in the Hellenic League can claim to have captained their country at youth level or played at Wembley, yet Stevens, a strong defender capable of also playing in midfield, can claim to have done both.

A composed, intelligent player, Stevens, who joins from Calne, has had a peripatetic career that has seen him gain experience at numerous levels.

While at Cirencester Academy. Stevens represented the English Schools Football Association, and he was a key part of the AFC Totton team which reached the final of the 2006/07 FA Vase final. He scored a dramatic extra time winner in Totton's quarter final against Wimborne Town before netting in the semi-final second leg away at Billingham Synthonia, a strike which helped take the tie to penalties. In the final at Wembley he came off the bench with thirty minutes to go as his side fell to a 3-1 defeat against Truro City.

Initially he started his senior career with Cirencester Academy, and after leaving he featured for Team Bath, Devizes Town, Supermarine, Fairford Town, Salisbury City. Corsham Town and Highworth Town as well as Totton. In 2008 he played a season for Californian side Ventura County Fusion in the Premier Development League, the third tier of football in the USA. With the Fusion, Stevens played in front of crowds averaging more than 1,200. In total he appeared in 13 of the team's 16

league games, scoring twice as his team narrowly missed out on qualifying for the end of season playoffs, finishing third in the Southwest Division.


Upon returning to the UK, he initially joined Southern League Cirencester Town, appearing 21 times for the Centurions in the 2009/10 season before switching to Thatcham Town. After a season and a half with the Kingfishers, he joined Jeff Roberts at Calne for the 2011/12 season. That year he played 39 times, scoring three goals before appearing 26 times last season and scoring once.

Point per game record – current Hellenic League opponents

The above graphic shows Bassett's record in Hellenic League fixtures against our current Premier Division rivals. The circles represent Bassett's points per game record against individual opponents, while the bars show goals for and goals against in those games.

Given that Bassett have played just six teams twelve times or more, it's difficult in the majority of cases to draw conclusions regarding who, historically, has the upper hand over the other. Nevertheless, a number of interesting observations can be made. First and foremost, Bassett's record against Ardley United, Wantage Town and Abingdon United has been miserable. In a combined 49 games against those teams, Bassett have won just eight and drawn eleven. Although the recent draw against Ardley was extremely satisfying, Bassett's last win against them came in October 1998. Since winning the first two contests against Abingdon in the 2000/01 season (both 2-1 victories), Bassett have drawn four and lost six. In 17 matches against Wantage, Bassett have won just four, conceded an average of 3.5 goals and have scored 24 fewer than the Alfredians. This fixture, meanwhile, has never produced a league draw. That fact also applies to matches against local rivals Highworth Town, with no games finishing all square after ninety minutes in 25 meetings – an astonishing feat, especially so given 38 Hellenic League games against our other big rival Purton have produced 10 ties.

Of Bassett's 'regular' opponents, against only one – Cheltenham Saracens – do they have a winning record, with 17 wins, 8 draws and 13 losses in 38 games. Interestingly though, the Saracens have scored 57 in these contests, compared with 52 goals for Bassett. Goals are also not as frequent in this fixture as others, with an average 2.89 per game; that is borne out by the last four meetings producing just six goals.

Kidlington – who hold the upper hand with 12 wins compared to Bassett's 9 in 27 games – and Bassett have been relatively evenly matched opponents. After winning four of their opening six games against the Oxfordshire side, Bassett then recorded just two victories in the next 14. Recently though the pendulum has swung back in Bassett's favour, with three wins – including the 3-1 away victory earlier this season - and two draws in the last seven contests.

Despite having played only a few games against both, Bassett's matchups with Brimscombe and Thrupp and Oxford City Nomads have also been closely fought. However, games against Brimscombe have generally been cagey affairs with an average of just two goals per game, while those against the Nomads average over four.

On the Edge

At this time of the year a referees decision making can become as much off-field as well as on-field with the Wintery conditions upon us, and playing a major role. I mention off-field simply because the higher the status of the game it is important to remember that it is a spectator sport and the welfare of the fans, in respect to terrace conditions, must be considered. Not suggesting for one moment that lower leagues can be dismissed from acknowledging these problems, safety no matter the game is the 'key' word. It goes without saying the playing area is the main concern and as much as snow, ice and frost are the contributory factors the aftermath of these conditions, thawing etc, can cause the referee further headaches.

Let's go from the very beginning and make an effort to get a weather forecast that would stretch to kick-off and beyond to the final whistle. This can be a good guide to your ultimate decision, a practise I always made sure of. Looking at the Field of Play upon arrival the first consideration must be the safety of the players and indeed the officials, taking into account the state of the touchlines, is the playing surface flat or rutted from a previous game that may cause injury and are you, as referee, taking a definitive risk if you go ahead with the game, and could your control suffer the consequences. From my own experience, through all levels of football, if there is sufficient doubt then take the sensible step and call the game off. There is always another day to play the game. It is important, as referee, to show an interest to all present and not just stand on the playing area digging the heel of your shoe into the ground, it would take no time at all to put your boots on and prove, not only to yourself, but others who are present, the ground is unplayable or otherwise and as a team of three come to a conclusive and unanimous answer as to the outcome.

To prevent unnecessary travel the services of a local referee of similar grade as to yourself to offer his opinion may be worthwhile, remembering you must collate all information and make your decision if it's on the day of the game. On occasions I have known referees involve both managers and get their thoughts, but remember the referee is the sole judge especially if manager's opinion differs. Of course come kick-off it may appear safe to make a start and hopefully finish, but the climate could change rapidly during the game, so making playing conditions unplayable, that's called 'Sods Law', a Law not spoken for in the Referees Chart. To reiterate always lay on the side of safety and take no risks, a bad injury could end a career and that could mean you as well as a player, is it worth it surely the answer is NO May I wish everyone within the Hellenic League a Very Happy Christmas and successful New Year both on and off the field of play.
