Editorial & WBTFC News

A Warm Welcome to our visitors this afternoon from Holyport for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture.

The two sides have never met before in any competition so today is something of a historic event as the two sides battle it out for the first time.

Holyport currently sit in 16th place in the table, one spot below ourselves, with 6 wins from their opening 21 league fixtures. They have drawn 2 and lost 13. They are 3 points behind us with a game in hand.

Holyport have ensured they have picked up points against all of the fellow strugglers at the wrong end of the table with two wins against both Shrivenham and Abingdon Town plus wins against Newbury and Abingdon United. They have also drawn with Newbury and Bracknell Town. Our record against bottom sides includes two defeats to Abingdon United and we will need to be at our best today if we are to secure 3 vital points towards end of season safety

Thame United

The draw last Saturday was another excellent result against one of the leading sides. We left it late to get the equaliser through Sam Collier but definitely deserved a point on the balance of play. In the first half the performance was not as good as it could have been but the lads came out second half and stepped up a gear, especially after harshly going down to 10 men. There will be few referees wondering а where their Christmas card from Jeff is this year! We are now unbeaten in 5 league games and as I said last week

that is 5 games against top sides in the shape of Ardley United, Highmoor Ibis, Highworth Town, Binfield and Thame United.

Fixtures

The Fixture Secretary on the Hellenic League has taken stick over a number of years for the scheduling of games. Whilst there is still not quite symmetry in the fixture planning the guv deserves a big pat on the back for his scheduling of games so far this season. The decision to bang in regular midweek games from the start of the season has really worked well and all teams are up with their fixtures and should avoid a backlog of games in April even if we have a harsh winter. When I was Fixture Secretary of the North Wilts League my rule of thumb was always to get all clubs to have played half their games by Christmas and the First Team had played 22 games ahead of the Boxing Day trip to Newbury. Assuming the fixture at Newbury went ahead, and also today's game. that would mean just 16 games to play in the New Year. At the moment all of these are scheduled on Saturday's and with plenty of midweek dates to utilise if games fall victim to the weather. The Boxing Day fixture scheduling also saw a large number of local derbies (unlike the Premiership and Championship). For 115 Newbury wasn't that bad given that Shrivenham and Highworth is the logical local derby for those two clubs. So a big well done to the Fixture Secretary this season.

Reserves

The Reserves are once again without a game today having a 3 week break for the Festive period. Again in my view this is sensible fixture planning and means that Jeff has the full Reserve Team squad to call on should he so choose to ensure we have a full bench for our Christmas fixtures. The Reserves have 12 league fixtures to play and again should not have any trouble in getting these games played between now and the end of the season.

Development Side

This Development Side currently occupy 3rd place in the Wiltshire League table. After an excellent start which saw them win their first 8 games on the bounce they have since only won 2 of the next 8.

With just 6 league games to play they will be looking to go on a cup run to extend the season. With just 8 teams in the Division the league has been something of a disappointing competition this season. It was not so long ago that the Wiltshire League had 4 divisions of 18 teams in it.

WOOTTON Bassett boss Jeff Roberts is pleased with his side's recent improvement which has seen a run of defeats turn into an unbeaten spell in the league lasting almost a month, writes CHRIS PANKS.

The Hellenic Premier side last lost in the league to Abingdon United on November 16 and have strung together some impressive results since, despite bowing out of the Wiltshire Senior Cup to Bemerton Heath Harlequins earlier this month

Bassett held local rivals Highworth Town to a 1-1 draw on Saturday, taking the lead through Levi Cox before having to settle for a point against the titlechasers, after enduring a difficult start to the season during which they registered only five wins in their first 21 games.

Bassett's league victory last Wednesday against Binfield was their first since October 9, although they are unbeaten in their last four games, and going into tomorrow's match at home to Thame, Roberts said he is pleased with the improvement his side have made

"We are capable of challenging the top teams and competing with them and beating them," he said.

Rob Hopkins has set New College a two-tier target for the remainder of the season as he aims to push the students on to greater things. College have accrued 15 points so far in 2013/14 and are 11th out of 15 teams in the Uhlsport Hellenic League Division One West table. That is just four points less than the 19 points they managed in the whole of last season but some way off the 40 they totalled in 2011/12.

They are always looking forward to games and that's a good thing."

Opponents - History

Holyport FC • Club History

Holyport Football Club is believed to have been originally formed in the late 1920s and was re-founded after the Second World War in 1956.



Initially they played in the Maidenhead and District League, their home ground was at Windsor Road, Bray. The club slowly progressed and joined the Hayes and Giles League where they played their home games at Braywick Park.

At the beginning of the 2002/2003, after three very successful seasons, Holyport were promoted to the Hellenic League Division 1 East. Two seasons later they moved to their current ground at Summerleaze Village in North Maidenhead. This move signalled the start of a new and exciting era for the club. Having secured the necessary planning permission, as well as funding from the Football Foundation, the new ground has been in a state continuous of improvement. In season 2007/8 the ground was fenced, floodlights installed and since then has seen further improvements to the changing facilities, hard standing on three sides of the ground, the erection of three spectator grandstands and a hospitality room. These changes are the culmination of several years of hard work and the club's Summerleaze Village ground now meets the F.A and League requirements for Holyport to continue to play at their current step five level of football.

These continuous improvements, both of and off the pitch, have all contributed to progressing the Club's ambitions of playing in the F.A. Carling Vase and the FA Cup which they achieved in 2008 and 2010 respectively.

Additionally in 2009/10 season and 2010/11 season the club was jointly awarded the Hungerford Cup (shared with Shortwood United in 2009/10 and then Thame United 2010/11). The cup is awarded to the club who has shown the most development, both on and off the field, throughout the season. The award in particular, recognizes the tremendous amount of hard work that Club Secretary, Graham Broom has put in season after season along with a dedicated committee.

2010/11 Season was a historic season for Holyport. In their first season with the club the new management team of Derek Sweetman, Kevin Carvell and Calvin Maye led the side to the Uhlsport Hellenic 1 Division East title, AM Print and Copy Floodlit Cup and The Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup. In 2009/10 Jamie Handscomb was also recognised by the League winning the Divisional Player of the Year award, the third time a Port player has won this trophy. Along with the Hungerford Cup, four cups in one season will probably be the club's most successful season for a good number of years to come.

The 2011/12 Season saw Holyport finish a very respectable 13th in their debut season and also as Semi Finalists in The Berks and Bucks Senior Cup and League Supplementary Cup. The 2012/13 brought yet more development for Holyport FC as they fielded their first ever Youth side in The Allied Counties League. The first team once again finished a respectable 14th position and are looking to improve on this in 2013/14.








Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.



Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II.After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.



Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One West on a ground grading technicality, despite an appeal to the FA against the decision. In the circumstances manager Dave Turner did well to steer his side to 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. Last season Wootton Bassett were never out of the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing in 2nd place. In addition they had a fantastic run in the FA Cup reaching the 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time where they put up a spirited performance against Conference South side Dorchester Town. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided he had taken the team as far as he could and left after a successful 5 years in charge. In his place have come the former Calne Town management duo of Jeff Roberts and former Bassett player Drew Youngsam.

As Bassett enter their 3rd period in the Premier the new management team will be looking to consolidate in the top division at a time when the Club has to play games at Cirencester Town whilst the new ground is built at Ballards Ash.

The Wiltshire Senior Cup was first competed for back in 1896-97 when Swindon Town were the winners. The Town have gone on to win the competition nine times, including the first six years of the competition. With their progress in the professional game it is a long time since Swindon Town have competed in the Cup. Wootton Bassett Town's first success in the competition was to come at the turn of the century when they made the final in 1902-03, losing to Warminster Town. Wootton Bassett made the final again the following season doing down to Swindon Town Reserves in the final. It would be 84 years before Wootton Bassett would grace the final of the competition again when in 1987-88 they made the final to this time lose against near neighbours Purton. Wootton Bassett Town finally won the cup in 1998-99 when they defeated Pewsey Vale in the final. This success was repeated two seasons later with a win over Shrewton United. Since this win the best the Bassett faithful have had is a couple of semi-final appearances. Last season Wootton Bassett Town went out in the Second Round, losing 3-0 away at Westbury United. The competition was won by Melksham Town, despite having been knocked out in the guarter final only to be re-instated due to their opponents Bradford Town playing an ineligible player. Melksham made the most of their second chance.

In the final the game ended 0-0 after 90 minutes against Downton but two extra time goals gave Melksham the cup for the 6^{th} time.

Artificial Pitches



Nothing winds up fans of Liverpool, Manchester United and Chelsea of a certain age more than telling them that you thought that the plastic pitch at Loftus Road was brilliant!

Installed during the summer of 1981 the artificial pitch of Omniturf was the first such surface to be used in British professional football. Then OPR Manager Terrv Venables had written a book called They Used to Play on Grass" and it was quite apt that he was in charge of the first team to use an artificial pitch. The book dated back to 1970 when Venables was still a QPR player and highlights what a visionary the guy was.

I would like to add my love of the artificial pitch had nothing to do with the fact that during the time that Loftus Road had the Omniturf pitch installed, QPR reached two cup finals and became Second Division champions and spent a sustained period in the top

division of English football! I dispel all those who said it am sure that would have home side Luton won 2-1, OP/a correlation graphics

No my love of the pitch stems from all the bleating and winging that players like Alan Hansen. Mark Lawrenson. Dalglish, Bryan Kenny Robson, Kerry Dixon and David Speedie came out with about playing on the surface. The latter two Chelsea players used it as a poor excuse after being on the end of a 6-0 thrashing. That game and the 5-5 draw against Newcastle United remain two of my all time favourite games at the Loft over the years.

I am also sure it was either Dalglish, Hansen or Lawrenson who claimed that manager Terry Venables would let opposition teams train on the pitch when it was dry and then deliberately dampen the pitch so that the

ball played differently to what they expected at kick off. Any old excuse.

QPR filled their side with players who could play the ball on the deck and who thrived on the surface. Particular favourites for me were Simon Stainrod, Gary Bannister, John Byrne, Ian Stewart and Wayne Fereday. Teams hated playing there and seeing Bruce Bruce Grobbelaar seemingly refuse to dive on the pitch (some people later alleged he also did this on grass pitches around this time as well) was funny. Season 1986 when we defeated Liverpool in the Milk Cup semi-final over two legs was particularly enjoyable, especially the two own goals they scored for us at Anfield in the second leg (blame the pitch I say).

I was there for the first ever league game on the pitch against ironically Luton Town, another side who were to install an artificial pitch. To dispel all those who said it was an advantage to the home side Luton won 2-1, QPR's consolation goal being scored by Andy King, I wonder what happened to him must have gone into management somewhere?



The pitch was outlawed in April 1988 and replaced with grass. QPR remained in what was now the Premiership for 8 more seasons proving again that the pitch was not that much of an advantage, especially given that we had Michael Meaker playing for us. In total there were just three other league stadiums in the whole country with a plastic pitch (Luton, Oldham and Preston) and by 1994 all of these had been ripped up.

These days technology has moved on and the 3G pitches that are now around are a big improvement but then so are the grass pitches used these days in the Premiership. People forget that in the 1970's and 1980's some of the grass pitches resembled a pig farm with just the odd spec of areen showing through the mass of brown (think Derby's Baseball Ground etc). England have now played a World Cup qualifying game on an artificial pitch in Russia and for me it is now time for the artificial pitches to be given a second chance. Bring back astro I say.





Looking back to a game against next opponents Wantage Town from Season 2002-3 follow

Great Team Performance Earns Bassett Three Points At Wantage

Alfredian Park, 21st December 2002

A Danny Clayton goal secured Bassett Town all three points away to Wantage Town in a great team performance which was only marred by Paul Patel being taken off with a shoulder injury following a nasty challenge inside the first twenty minutes.

Wantage were the team who started the game on top, having two corners inside the first five minutes. They also had a couple of dangerous crosses that came to nothing as the Bassett defense started off where they had left off against Hook Norton.

Bassett themselves had their first attack of note in the 8th minute but again nothing came of it. Bassett were forced into an early change when Paul Patel suffered a damaged shoulder in the 13th minute following an ugly challenge from Wantage striker Chris Roche. To the astonishment of the Bassett contingent the referee took no action against the Wantage player for what had been a vicious attack on the Bassett defender. Patel's game was ended by that incident and he was replaced by Stu Hemsley who was returning to the first team having missed a couple of dames.

Both teams created chances in an even first half. As the half wore on Bassett started to gain initiative, earning a number of corner kicks which unfortunately came to nothing.

Bassett continued to attack as the half drew to a close but numerous through balls and crosses were wasted. Mark Simpkins had the best chance for Bassett in the first half when a minute into injury time his

shot was well saved after he dribbled past two defenders following good work by Rob Day.

Bassett went into the break with the score deadlocked but looking the team who were most likely to score. Bassett started off the second half where they had left off and took the lead in the 51st minute when a great Steve Hale kick put Danny Clayton into the clear and Clayton fired home from inside the Wantage area.

A minute later Wantage had Chris Roche, the same player who had fouled Paul Patel, booked for a foul on Stu Hemsley – Patel's replacement.

Bassett had another good chance in the 54th minute when an excellent Mark Vaughan ball put Nick Tooley through clear of the Wantage defence but the Wantage keeper came and collected the ball from under Tooley's feet.

The Wantage 'keeper was again called into action moments later, making a brilliant save from a Gary Ashford shot following another good Mark Vaughan ball.

Allan Pluckrose had a good chance in the 67th minute when he headed just over from a Mark Simpkins free kick. Bassett made their second substitution five minutes later bringing Ben Gascoyne on for Rob Dav.

Danny Clayton had another good chance for Bassett when his shot was again saved by the Wantage keeper, the busiest player on the pitch, following good work by Ben Gascoyne; three minutes later Nick Tooley hit over after taking the ball around four players.

Wantage had another player booked a couple of minutes later for starting a mini scuffle with Bassett's Mark Vaughan, Wantage then made a double substitution to try and salvage a goal.

They nearly got one when Steve Hale parried a good shot and the rebound was blocked and cleared to safety.

Bassett made their final change in the 83rd minute when Dave Jones was brought on for Mark Simpkins. Wantage had a last chance effort a minute from time, but thankfully nothing came of it much to the relief of the Bassett followers as anything less than three points would have been a travesty.

Bassett had gained three vital points just before Christmas and will be looking to make it six points from two games when they travel to Shortwood United on December 28th

Jonny Aitkenhead Defence



A product of Wootton Bassett Town's youth system returning after five years split between Shrivenham and Highworth Town. Aitkenhead is a talented full back with the ability to play on both the left and right hand side. He joined Bassett as an under 10, and made his first team bow, alongside long time youth team teammate Phil Tearle, under Paul Burke in 2007/08. And he was one of the few bright spots in an otherwise disappointing season, making 30 appearances in total, only four of which came from the bench. His debut that year came in September as a substitute in a 1-0 victory against Letcombe before making his first start in a 3-1 home win against Clanfield. From that moment onwards, Aitkenhead made the right back position his own and put perhaps his performance of all in against Winterbourne United in the final home game of the season. With the hosts a goal and a man down, caretaker manager Chris Jones sacrificed a defender in the second half, leaving the defence potentially exposed. But led by Aitkenhead, they held firm and Bassett secured a remarkable 3-2 triumph.

That performance came in front of Dave Turner, who had been announced as the next Bassett manager prior to the game. However, Aitkenhead did not find himself in Turner's plans and duly moved to Hellenic Premier Division


Shrivenham for the 2008/09 campaign. In his two seasons at The Rec. he proved a revelation. winning two Player of the Year awards. Overall he made 82 appearances for Shrivenham before transferring to Highworth in the summer of 2010. During his first season he had to bide his time somewhat, but still featured 39 times with 14 appearances coming from the bench as the Worthians challenged for the title. He also grabbed his first senior goal in a thrashing of Bassett. A place in the starting eleven was nailed down in 2010/11 as Aitkenhead plaved in 41 games including Highworth's Challenge Cup final evisceration of Binfield. Last season was a frustrating one for the defender. Although captaining Highworth in a number of games, he was limited to 23 appearances as a foot injury sidelined him.

Confident on the ball, happy to get forward and not afraid to get stuck in, he is a player who adds quality to the squad as well as plenty of Premier Division experience.

Point per game record - current Hellenic League opponents

The above graphic shows Bassett's record in Hellenic League fixtures against our current Premier Division rivals. The circles represent Bassett's points per game record against individual opponents, while the bars show goals for and goals against in those games.

Given that Bassett have played just six teams twelve times or more, it's difficult in the majority of cases to draw conclusions regarding who, historically, has the upper hand over the other. Nevertheless, a number of interesting observations can be made. First and foremost, Bassett's record against Ardley United, Wantage Town and Abingdon United has been miserable. In a combined 49 games against those teams, Bassett have won just eight and drawn eleven. Although the recent draw against Ardley was extremely satisfying, Bassett's last win against them came in October 1998.Since winning the first two contests against Abingdon in the 2000/01 season (both 2-1 victories), Bassett have drawn four and lost six. In 17 matches against Wantage, Bassett have won just four, conceded an average of 3.5 goals and have scored 24 fewer than the Alfredians. This fixture, meanwhile, has never produced a league draw. That fact also applies to matches against local rivals Highworth Town, with no games finishing all square after ninety minutes in 25 meetings – an astonishing feat, especially so given 38 Hellenic League games against our other big rival Purton have produced 10 ties.

Of Bassett's 'regular' opponents, against only one – Cheltenham Saracens – do they have a winning record, with 17 wins, 8 draws and 13 losses in 38 games. Interestingly though, the Saracens have scored 57 in these contests, compared with 52 goals for Bassett. Goals are also not as frequent in this fixture as others, with an average 2.89 per game; that is borne out by the last four meetings producing just six goals.

Kidlington – who hold the upper hand with 12 wins compared to Bassett's 9 in 27 games – and Bassett have been relatively evenly matched opponents. After winning four of their opening six games against the Oxfordshire side, Bassett then recorded just two victories in the next 14. Recently though the pendulum has swung back in Bassett's favour, with three wins – including the 3-1 away victory earlier this season - and two draws in the last seven contests.

Despite having played only a few games against both, Bassett's matchups with Brimscombe and Thrupp and Oxford City Nomads have also been closely fought. However, games against Brimscombe have generally been cagey affairs with an average of just two goals per game, while those against the Nomads average over four.



Firstly a club update. We set high sponsorship targets this year which have been tough to get near. Since the summer edition of Touchline, I can report that work is expected to commence at the new facility in March - this is great news. Season so far

With the club's relocation kicking into gear, the start of this season was always going to present many challenges. And so it has proven, although it is with great satisfaction that it can be said these have been met rather successfully.

Arguably the most acute tests were (and will continue) to be faced by the senior section during this transition period. The first team, playing home games at Cirencester Town's excellent Corinium Stadium, back in the Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division and under the stewardship of new manager Jeff Roberts, have endured an especially tumultuous start to their campaign. Nevertheless they have performed reasonably.

After a difficult start which saw two league defeats and a disappointing FA Cup loss, they found their form and went on an eight game run that saw them collect thirteen points. What was even more impressive about that stretch was how six of those points were earned away from home.

The heavy FA Vase defeat at Odd Down curtailed momentum though. And with confidence dented, Bassett lost heavily in the league Challenge Cup, and picked up just one win from their next seven games, a run which included a pair of defeats against lowly Abingdon United. But the last four games, which have seen draws against high-flying Ardley United, Highmoor Ibis and Highworth Town and a win against Binfield, have brought some relief. They allow Bassett to enter the always busy stretch over Christmas and New Year with renewed confidence.

Currently they sit 15th in the table, which, although below expectations, has them positioned for a chance to climb into midtable.

For the Ladies, the season began in outstanding fashion with an historic first FA Women's Cup victory against Cheltenham Civil Service.

Their league form has been at times patchy with just 3 wins so far, But they remain in touch with the mid-table teams in Gloucestershire County Women's League Division One, and just three points separate Bassett in seventh from fourth place Cheltenham Spa CS. They also enter their winter break on a high following a fine 4-1 win at the aforementioned Cheltenham Spa CS. With the experience acquired from this early portion of the season, Becky Gammon's young team will look to hit the second half of their Campaign with renewed vigour.

It's been an up and down season so far for the Reserves too, but a good recent run has them well positioned in fourth in Hellenic League Division Two West.

Simon Palsh's side have recorded excellent wins against Oxford City Nomads Development and Wantage Town, who both currently sit in the top three, while the performance which led to a 5-0 triumph against local rivals Beversbrook in October was also noteworthy. With their last home game scheduled for early February in preparation for the Rylands Way pitch being no longer available, they will face a tough test the rest of the way. However the quality is there for them to achieve a third consecutive top five finish.

After eight straight victories to begin their campaign, the Development team have hit something of a rut with five defeats in their last eight games. That has meant they have fallen behind the Date set by Wiltshire League Division One leaders Melksham Town

Much credit is due to the U12 Yellows too, who have fought hard all season and have recently seen their results improve - a win for them will hopefully b around the corner and will be just reward for their efforts.
