Editorial & WBTFC News



A Warm Welcome to our visitors this evening from **Newbury** for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture.

The two sides have met on just one occasion previously and that was in the league fixture at Newbury on Boxing Day when we threw away a 2-0 lead to draw 2-2. The match report from this game is included in tonight's programme.

Newbury are having a tough time of it of late having lost 8 consecutive games and are currently second from bottom in the table. Their last win came at home against Cheltenham Saracens. When we played at Newbury on Boxing Day they were very much a young side. As they demonstrated in that game they were a fit side and kept playing nice football until the end and scored with two late goals to deny us all three points. I expect they will again field a young side that will be fit and cause us problems if we are not at our best. We have certainly lacked a bit of fitness all season and will need to be on our game if we are to make sure of the three points.

Relocation – Yes!

Wootton Bassett Sports Association announced on April 15th that the sale/purchase land contracts had completed, and that the Association now owns 22.8 acres of land. Commenting on the news, relocation manager Paul Harrison said: "We're delighted to announce this news. Finally our relocation ambition can begin to be realised." The relocation will see the Football Club, along with Cricket, Tennis and Running clubs move to a purpose built facility opposite

Ballards Ash. At last the dream is close to becoming a reality.

Recent Results

Our recent run of results has been disappointing with just two wins in our last eight games. The two wins coming at Abingdon Town (5-0) and at Cheltenham (3-0) in the Supplementary Cup. Two comfortable wins and decent performances by all accounts. The two draws against Flackwell Heath and Thame were also good results but the defeats against Ascot, Cheltenham Saracens and Bracknell Town on paper look disappointing. However, it Ascot and Bracknell have both hit a rich vein of form and we probably played them at the wrong time of the season. The Cheltenham result is the most disappointing of the league results but that was put right a few days later in the Supplementary Cup.

On the subject of the Supplementary Cup it was disappointing to go down at the semi-final stage. Having lost two Wiltshire League cup semi-finals when I was manager at Minety I know how disappointing it is to lose at this stage, missing out on the chance of playing in a final and winning some medals. With our opponents down to 10 men we had the opportunity to win the game before we ourselves also had a player sent-off. To then lose to a goal 5 minutes from time was tough on the lads. We now have to lift ourselves for the final three games of the season and see if we can get maximum points from these games to at least end the season on a high note. Given the side we have had we have under achieved in what has not

been a high quality Premier Division this season.

Reserves

These notes are being written ahead of the Reserves semi-final in the President's Cup at Bracknell on Monday. Hopefully they were successful and we can look forward to one final to end the season. On Saturday they had an excellent 3-0 away win at Shrivenham to move level on points with 3rd placed Oxford City Nomads with a game in hand. With the two final games winnable they have a good chance of finishing in 3rd place in the league. This would be a fine achievement for Simon Paish's side who had won 5 league games in a row ahead of the cup semi-final.

Development Side

Another side doing well are the Development Side. They maintained the chase for 2nd place with a win over their rivals for runners-up spot Intel on Saturday. The 3-2 win means a win in the last fixture and Bassett will be guaranteed runners-up. Easier said than done though as the final game is against champions Melksham Town Reserves with the game scheduled for Friday night at Melksham. With Intel meeting bottom of the league Blunston nothing short of a win at Melksham will be needed.

Two title with an emphatic 5-0 victory against Old Town United Blue.

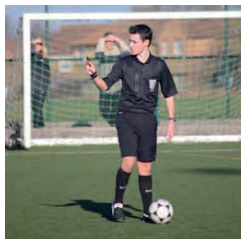
Nothing could prevent Dave Terry and Danny Groom's side from sealing their league crown, not even the thunderous Easter Sunday weather.

Bassett boss to meet club committee in hope of securing extra funds Friday 11th April 2014

WOOTTON Bassett boss Jeff Roberts has said ahead of Saturday's Supplementary Cup quarter-final at Cheltenham Saracens that he might not be at the club next season if there is not sufficient investment in his playing squad.

Roberts and his assistant Drew Youngsam took over at The Corinthian at the beginning of this season having previously been in charge at Calne. Bassett are fairly comfortable in lower mid-table of the Hellenic Premier League, despite their defeat on Thursday against Bracknell stretching their run without a league win to seven games.

Tomorrow's game is rematch of Monday's league defeat at Cheltenham and the Supplementary Cup now represents Roberts' only chance of achieving something tangible from this season.

Lack of goals has been Bassett's downfall recently as they end up drawing too many games. If Roberts is as the club next year he is keen that his attack is brought up to scratch with what he says is the nucleus of a decent squad.

"There is a committee meeting in a couple of weeks where we will discuss next season," Roberts told the Advertiser. "We've lacked strikers, consistent strikers, midfield and defence-wise we're quite strong.

"We've just gone to them and said this is what we need. The nucleus of what we've got is very good, we need to keep them players and bring players in to compete with them and improve with them next season. "If we were to part company it would be because of the financial side and what we can spend on players. Five or six of the players we have are Southern League standard, we want a couple more at that level.

"That's out of my hands, if we (Roberts and Youngsam) want to take it further as management we need a little more behind the scenes money to bring in that quality in."

Roberts was planning to rest a couple of players in the Bracknell game with an eye on tomorrow's cup match. If Bassett are to keep their season alive silverware-wise then they will have to perform better than they did last Monday in their defeat to tomorrow's opposition.

Roberts admits that the Supplementary Cup was not the first prize he had in mind this season but is keen for Bassett to progress.

"It's not the best of cups to go to, but now it's the only realistic chance of silverware. Yesterday (Monday's loss to Cheltenham) was disappointing and we have had a chat in changing room and will go down there to win.

Spot-on Bassett book place in semis Monday 14th April 2014

WOOTTON Bassett boss Jeff Roberts said that his side's win in the quarter-final of the Supplementary Cup gives them something to look forward to in a season when they have little to play for.

Bassett went back down to Cheltenham on Saturday, the stage for their disappointing 2-1 defeat just five days before, and put in a vastly improved performance to win 3-0. They will now face Brimscombe & Thrupp in the semi-finals on Thursday evening.

Saturday's win also maintains the competitive edge for the Corinthian Stadium side's season, as their league season is petering out to a lower midtable finish.

Roberts was pleased with the reaction of the players he sent out yesterday, as they were able to break a run of five games without a win.

"All round we worked harder, I just thought the last two games the players on the pitch didn't give their all but today, especially the first 45 we did and they (Cheltenham) couldn't cope with it," said Roberts.

"It's not one cup we wanted to win, but it gives us something to look forward to, if we lost today our season's over as we're comfortable in the league, it gives us something and hopefully we come away with a bit of silverware."

In the last game against Cheltenham it was the tale of 12 yards, with both side's having two opportunities to score from the spot and Bassett failing to convert one of them.

This time Bassett also got two penalties and, unlike last Monday, converted both of them. The scoring was opened by Jason Milhench, who took down a long free-kick and slotted home early in the first half. Penalty taker Kyle Rigley then took over the scoring, converting the first after a blatant handball and the second after Jordan Roberts was ploughed over in the box, both before the end of the opening period.

This meant the game was effectively over at half-time at 3-0 and, speaking after the game, Roberts thought his side could have had more.

"Last couple of games have been disappointing with the work rate on the pitch," he said.

"We were happy today, we totally deserved it, I'm pleased for the lads, credit to them, they worked hard today and thoroughly deserved it.

"Cheltenham didn't cause us any problems, we could have been three or four up at half-time.

Malmesbury Vics in fight for survival Friday 18th April 2014

Malmesbury Victoria manager Gareth Davies says players have to focus on the remaining three games of the season and not think about the century old club possibly going out of existence.

The Flying Monk Ground side have revealed this week that they only have a £200 float to try and pay off a £500 and £300 electric and water bills respectively. On top of that the club have been struggling to pay the match officials for their last two home matches and have been told by the Hellenic League that they are likely to receive a £250 fine for each game. Having been devastated by winter floods for the past two years, the club, which reformed after the Second World War, is now fighting their biggest battle to date.

"At the moment we just don't know what is going to happen," Davies told the Swindon Advertiser, ahead of tomorrow's trip to Lydney Town in Division One West. "The positive thing is that we are going to play our last three games, on the footballing side of things that has to be our focus. Of course, this is a worry for everyone concerned with the club, it has been going for 100-plus years (the original club formed in 1896 and closed in 1936 before returning in 1947). "The players are asking what is going to happen? The answer is at the moment I don't know."

Club treasurer Julie Exton said the original electric bill was £1,000 and after reaching an agreement with their supplier they managed to split it in two and pay the first half, while the second is due in 12 days time. She added: "All we've got left is the £200 float. I've spoken to the trustees and explained the situation to them but nothing's changed at the moment and I don't know where to turn. The reserve team, youth team and ladies team don't cost anything to run, but we've got things like programmes and physios to pay for, as well as the affiliation fees for the Hellenic League. Looking at it from a treasurer's point of view, I think we could manage if we dropped down a league but from a football point of view, it would leave the reserves with nothing to work towards. I don't know how we can carry on, the club has been around for more than 100 years and we can't let it fold."

Good evening and welcome to the management team, players and supporters of Newbury, who have travelled along the M4 and A419 to the Corinthian Stadium tonight for this Uhisport Hellenic League Premier League fixture. We hope you will join us in the bar after the game.

Well our last chance of winning a trophy has now gone after our disappointing 1-0 defeat in the Supplementary Cup at the hands of Brimscombe & Thrupp. On the night we did not do ourselves justice. We failed to take advantage of the extra man that we had for most of the second half but it was tough to concede the winner so late in the game. If we had managed to keep 11 players on the pitch and taken the game into extra time we would have probably have gone onto win the match. We certainly missed Justin Milhench on the night and his suspensions and those of a number of other key players have cost us a number of games this season. This is one area where we certainly need to improve next season as we have had way too many bookings and the Committee have raised this as an issue that we must deal with.

Having lost the cup semi-final game it is going to be tough to lift the lads for the final three league games but we should be aiming to end the season with three wins as the games against Newbury, Kidlington and Brimscombe are all winnable fixtures. Starting with Newbury tonight we will be looking to win all three of our games to the end of the season. The game at their place saw us fade badly in a game we should have been out of sight before the final quarter of an hour, having created numerous chances to increase our 2 goal lead. Newbury were a very young side on the day and we will be expecting the same tonight. Young sides will always give plenty of effort and hopefully we will see the same from our lads.

Newbury FC • Club History

Originally starting as a Sunday side, the Saturday team was formed in 2002 and entered into the Reading League Division 4, winning it in its debut season. In the next two years, the club had won successive promotions and this culminated in arriving in Division 1 of the Reading League.

With pretty much the same squad, the club then won the Division 1 title and was asked to compete in the Reading Senior league, jumping a division, and having led the league for most of the season, and going 17 games unbeaten, the club finished second in the league on the final day of the season, in an epic game at Cookham Dean in which promotion was secured and Senior football was finally returned to the town of Newbury.

The original members who first set up the Saturday side are still actively involved. After Keith Moss won groundsman of the year last year, he is chairman, manager for the first team, and groundsman this season. Lindsey, his best half, still running around after him and providing match food. Mike Skelly, who used to run the pub for the original side, is treasurer for the club

During our first season returning to senior football the club finished a credible 3rd in the league having pushed the leaders all season. The club were winners of the Hellenic League's Division 1 East in the 2011-2012 season.

Last season saw the introduction of the youth side as under 18's in the Allied Counties Youth League South Division. Not only did they win the division, but this gave birth to some amazing players with great potential. Some of these players played for the reserves in the Reading League Premier Division who were also promoted. The youth development currently continues while waiting for the under 16s.

The club is going from strength to strength, and this season will be interesting.

Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.



Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One West on a ground grading technicality, despite an appeal to the FA against the decision. In the circumstances manager Dave Turner did well to steer his side to 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. Last season Wootton Bassett were never out of the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing in 2nd place. In addition they had a fantastic run in the FA Cup reaching the 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time where they put up a spirited performance against Conference South side Dorchester Town. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided he had taken the team as far as he could and left after a successful 5 years in charge. In his place have come the former Calne Town management duo of Jeff Roberts and former Bassett player Drew Youngsam.

As Bassett enter their 3rd period in the Premier the new management team will be looking to consolidate in the top division at a time when the Club has to play games at Cirencester Town whilst the new ground is built at Ballards Ash.

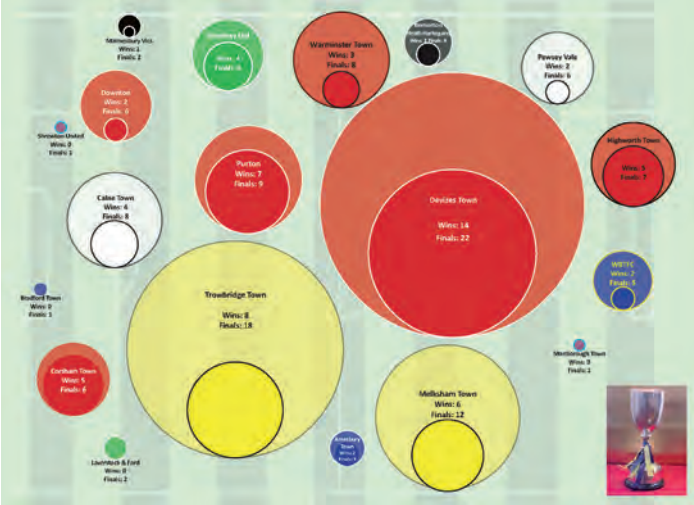

Wiltshire Senior Cup



The Wiltshire Senior Cup was first competed for back in 1896-97 when Swindon Town were the winners. The Town have gone on to win the competition nine times, including the first six years of the competition. With their progress in the professional game it is a long time since Swindon Town have competed in the Cup. Wootton Bassett Town's first success in the competition was to come at the turn of the century when they made the final in 1902-03, losing to Warminster Town. Wootton Bassett made the final again the following season doing down to Swindon Town Reserves in the final. It would be 84 years before Wootton Bassett would grace the final of the competition again when in 1987-88 they made the final to this time lose against near neighbours Purton. Wootton Bassett Town finally won the cup in 1998-99 when they defeated Pewsey Vale in the final. This success was repeated two seasons later with a win over Shrewton United. Since this win the best the Bassett faithful have had is a couple of semi-final appearances. Last season Wootton Bassett Town went out in the Second Round, losing 3-0 away at Westbury United. The competition was won by Melksham Town, despite having been knocked out in the quarter final only to be re-instated due to their opponents Bradford Town playing an ineligible player. Melksham made the most of their second chance.

In the final the game ended 0-0 after 90 minutes against Downton but two extra time goals gave Melksham the cup for the 6th time.

Melksham are on to defend the Cup again this season having once again made the final following a 4-0 semi-final win over Purton. Joining them in the final are Bradford Town who won 3-0 against Bemerton Heath Harlequins in the other semi-final tie.

Saracens sucker Paying the punch condemns penalty again Bassett

It's then back to Cheltenham on Saturday for the Supplementary Cup quarter final with Saracens, when revenge will hopefully be gained.

Inspired by the fantastic books "Got, Not Got" and "The Lost World of Football" by Derrick Hammond and Gary Silke this Season's new feature looks at football related matters from the Editor's long lost youth that are no longer with us. Today.....

Parklife & Jumpers for Goalposts

As a kid at Lyneham I can remember that we would always be playing football day and night, either down Slessor Road Park or in one of the various grassy areas that was in between the houses in either Trenchard Road or Dickson Road.

Whilst the Park at Slessor Road was a mass expanse of green, also with proper goal posts set up in one area, for some bizarre reason we always preferred playing on what was originally a netball pitch next to the houses and their back gardens. This brought with it one of the occupational hazards of unofficial kids football, kicking the ball into someone's back garden. This was a regular occurrence but as kids we had rules and health and safety procedures for dealing with such a situation (this was good training for adult work life).

The first rule was that whoever kicked the ball in the garden was responsible for retrieving it. Rule number 2 was if the people looked to be out you jumped over the fence and quickly grabbed the ball and climbed back over. However, before doing that you would consider the first health and safety rule which was if the family were known to have a great big sod-off Alsatian dog climbing the fence was not a good a recommended option. In this situation the safety first option was to go round and knock on the door and say "Please miss can we have our ball back". Another complicating factor which led you to also go for knock on the door option was if the family whose garden the ball had gone into had a hot daughter that we all fancied the knock on the door option was clearly the one to go for. Even as kids we had developed quite sophisticated decision trees.

Having made the decision not to use the designated football pitch at Lyneham the first act before a game kicked off would be to put down some goalposts. Generally this was done by using tracksuit tops or sticks with an imaginary crossbar whose height varied

depending on who was in goal at the time. It is funny to reflect that as kids we did not need sophisticated goal line technology or extra referees on the goal line to decide whether a shot was in or not, somehow we all just knew and always came to an agreement that the score was 15-14 not 15-13.

We also had simple rules about how goalkeeping would work, especially where there was not many of you because Jonny and Phil had been grounded by their Mums. Early on a decision would be made as to whether it was "stick" goalies or not. Basically if the rule was stick the goalie could not come out. Another often used rule was that the last man back (the nearest person to the goal line is the keeper). Poor old Andre Marriner would have really struggled to ref one of our games when we were playing last man back s the goalkeeping rule.

In our games there were no complicated rules about player registrations and transfers. Registration took place just prior to kick off with two pickers, who took turns in choosing, from the best players down, until there's just that kid who nobody wanted on their team. Alternatively, it was those who supported London clubs against those that supported other teams e.g. dirty Leeds or Liverpool (you have to remember Man Utd and Man City were crap in those days). Kit sometimes got in the way of registration and shirts were often exchanged before the game to match the registration process. In summer this was avoided by being able to play shirts v skins.

The other important rule of kids football was that you had to be someone. "Who you gonna be" was the key question once teams had been selected. Baggsy I am Charlie George, Russell would say, Graham would want to be Alan Hudson and I would be Stan Bowles or Dave Thomas (with socks rolled down to my ankles to look the part). The general advantage of being a QPR fan was that you usually got to be who you wanted to be. The problem was when your whole team was, say, Tottenham then you had to settle for being Steve Perryman or Alan Mullery for the afternoon. In a World Cup year you could even be a foreigner such as Franz Beckenbauer, Rivelino, Johnny Rep, Gunter Netzer, Johan Cruyff or Gerd Muller. The duration of our games were never of a set time. The main

reasons why a game would come to an end would be such things as the kid that owned the ball having to go home for tea, the ball bursting, it getting too dark or the ball getting kicked into a garden where the rumour was that the owner of the house owned a gun and had once kidnapped little Stevie Jones for 3 days.

On the subject of the game coming to an end that reminds me of another key rule of kids football which was designed to keep you interested to the very end. When the game has run for a couple of hours and we all knew it was time to go home there would be a shout of "next goal is the winner". The team who were 15 goals down would all of a sudden become competitive again, playing like kids possessed and there would be a couple of frantic minutes of close action before that winning goal goes in, who says you can't win 12-16? You could in our games.

As an alternative to replaying a football league or World Cup game on our main pitch we would play "headers and volleys" or our very own "World Cup". Like real kids football, "headers and volleys" also came with its own set of rules. Wide and you're in. Two points for a header, one for a volley. First player knocked out gets a 'dog's life'. I am sure all my older readers will understand what I am talking about.

"World Cup" had two variants along the lines of tennis with "singles" and "doubles". Basically you would use one goal and whoever scores would progress to the next round until someone was knocked out and then the next round would start. The singles variant was basically every boy for himself (although alliances were still formed to knock out certain kids). The doubles variant would see players paired off. The rule about having to be someone carried over into these games so once again you could end up being Steve Perryman.

Fun times but sadly you don't see kids playing football this way anymore. Now it tends to be organised mini-soccer with some miserable adult telling you what to do and not letting you be Gareth Bale or Lionel Messi, and not letting you try the Cruyff turn when playing in defence. Dear FA please remember England won the World Cup when these rules for kids football applied.

Play-offs

1st April 2014

THERE'S just a couple of weeks left in the Non-League calendar but for a selected few clubs, their seasons are far from over.

They'll have the play-offs to look forward to. Whether you like them or you don't, you have to acknowledge the great tension and atmosphere the play-offs create.

A whole season can be defined in 90 minutes. Fantastic campaign ending in promotion or yet another stumble at the final hurdle - the margins in football are extremely fine.

You'll often hear the play-offs referred to as 'the end of season of lottery'. I don't know about you but if I could enter a lottery where I had one in four chance of winning, I'd snap your hand off!

As I'm writing this, most teams in the Skril Premier have three games left and but for Cambridge United, the play-off places are still yet to be decided.

I'm not sure you can look past Grimsby and Gateshead. I saw the latter last week against Hereford and Gary Mills' side will be a tough proposition in the play-offs.

They defend well when needed and keep the ball brilliantly, teasing the opposition and waiting like a bird of prey to go in for the kill.

The last spot looks like going to either FC Halifax Town or Braintree which is fantastic for other part-time sides who are constantly told 'you can't compete in the Conference Premier'.

Cambridge can be devastating on their day but history will tell you the team finishing in second struggle to get through the play-offs.

It must be psychological. On paper the second placed team should be the best side in the play-offs but missing out on the title and the added pressure of being best of the rest can take its toll.

The biggest criticism I've heard of the play-offs is that "it's not fair". Every team knows what it's getting itself into at the start of the season. Imagine no play-offs and the top two going up automatically in each Non-League division? I'd be interested to see how many would prefer that route but I doubt it would be many.

Managers and players I've spoken to, including ones that have finished second and not gone up, still say they wouldn't get rid of the play-offs which sounds to me like a ringing endorsement.

In the Skril North it looks like a battle between Boston and Guiseley for the last spot and whoever loses out on the title between North Ferriby and AFC Telford United may struggle to overcome that disappointment.

Havant & Waterlooville have come into contention in Skril South and the play-offs in that division is full of big hitters and promotion could go to any of the four sides.

Similarly, the Evo-Stik NPL looks extremely tight and FC United of Manchester fans won't be looking forward to them considering they've lost three finals in a row!

All eyes will be on Maidstone United to see if they can get into the Ryman Premier play-offs after finally being allowed in but

in form Kingstonian will be fancied if they make it.

And in the Calor Premier, we may end up seeing some high-scoring shoot-outs. Two sides currently in the play-off spots, Chesham and Stourbridge, have scored over 100 goals with Cambridge City and St Albans netting over 80!

So in a couple of weeks' time, if you're lucky enough to be watching your team in the play-offs, just remember that you could be at home twiddling your thumbs. Or even worse, out shopping!

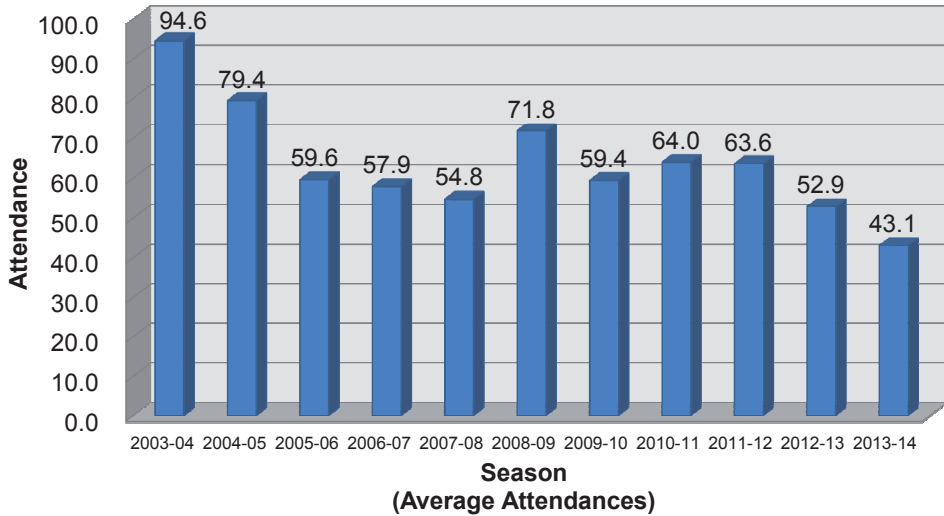

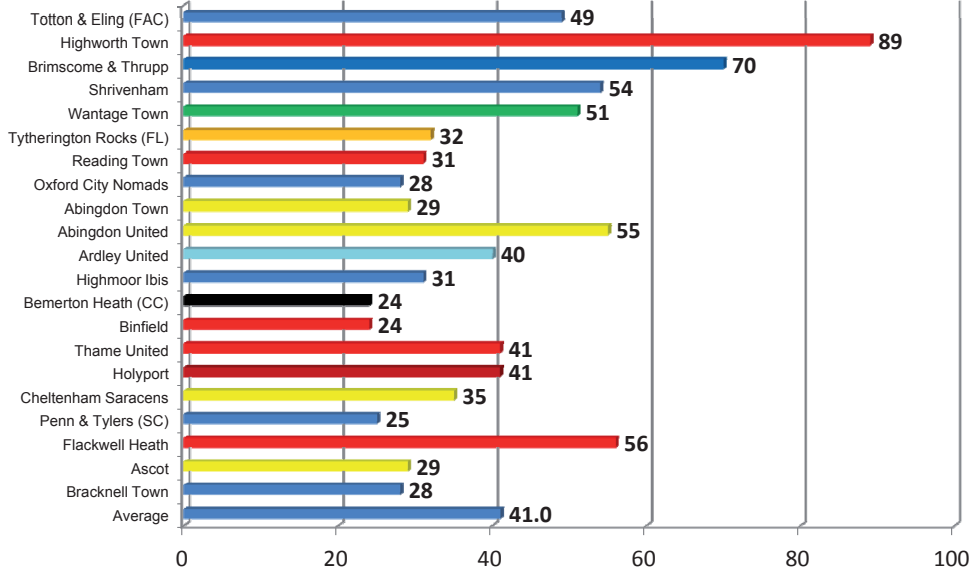
WBTFC Attendances

Throwaway Bassett gift Newbury a point

Faraday Road, 26th December 2013

It may be the season of goodwill, but after gaining a 2-0 first half advantage Wootton Bassett Town should have shown the spirit of Scrooge away at struggling Newbury. Instead though, Jeff Roberts' team gifted their hosts a point as two late goals earned the hosts a point.

Dominant for much of the game, Bassett later took their foot off the gas, with the midfield and forwards failing to press an error prone Newbury defence. That, and the home side switching to a five man midfield, helped push Bassett ever deeper as the match progressed. And the inevitable eventually happened.

With twenty minutes remaining Gary Dredge tucked away as an outstretched Steve Yeardeley could not get enough on the ball to clear from Rob Clare's low cross. Then in injury time, Clare - unmarked eight yards from goal - steered a Danny Langford corner past Steve Allison to equalise.

The match, however, should have been over as a contest an hour in. While Newbury looked dangerous coming forward, they only threatened occasionally in the opening exchanges.

At the other end, meanwhile, their back four could not cope with the pace and movement of Levi Cox and Ryan Stanners. They would have 'keeper Kyle Clough to thank though for ensuring Bassett's lead was not greater than two goals.

The opening three minutes almost brought goals at both ends thanks to some stray passing. Within thirty seconds of the opening whistle, a woeful clearance fell to Jordan Roberts and he played in Fraser Joyce, but the right winger shot tamely at Clough.

Then at the other end, Dennis Sorrenti was guilty of playing across the face of goal, Langford stole possession and rounded Allison

only to see Sam Ockwell clear his shot off the line.

As the game settled down, Bassett gained the upper hand and should have been ahead on the quarter hour when Cox found himself with just Clough to beat. But rather than putting the 'keeper on his backside, the striker sought to curl a shot around him and Clough parried away.

Stanners soon showed how it should be done, racing onto a Cox flick and taking the ball around Clough with ease before easily slotting home.

It seemed easy for the visitors to get in behind the Newbury defence, with Clough often left exposed. And when Joyce raced past full back Jack Young and collected Steve Yeardeley's clipped pass in the 31st minute, he won a penalty as the 'keeper barrelled into him just inside the box.

Bassett's perfect opportunity to double their advantage was squandered though, as Cox went for power over placement and allowed Clough, diving to his right, to fist away. Stanners would make it two seven minutes before the break. Cutting across the defence with an expertly timed diagonal run, he collected Dan Lardner's through ball and, with the outside of his right foot, directed the ball past an onrushing Clough and into the bottom right corner.

With such a command of the game, never should Newbury have been allowed to come close to claiming a point. Despite central midfielder Callum Willmoth's probing passing and Langford's energy up front, they did not create a chance from open play until they halved the deficit.

Up to that point, their only chances on goal had come from Bassett errors. That trend continued on 58 minutes when a Lee Stevens slip allowed Ben Wickens to let fire from range, but Allison was able to comfortably deal with his snap shot.

Moments later 'keeper Clough made another fine save to prevent Bassett going 3-0 up. A surging Jordan Roberts, which run was brought to an abrupt end on the edge of the box, earned the visitors a free kick in prime shooting range. Lardner

curled the ball up and over the wall towards the bottom left corner, but was prevented from celebrating his first Bassett goal as an outstretched glove diverted his effort away from goal.

Momentum then shifted in Newbury's favour. The tactical switch allowed them to outnumber Bassett in midfield, but their life was made easier as the visitors sat deeper and deeper. Newbury's first soon came. Wickens fed Clare, whose cross from the right evaded Yeardeley and Dredge - his run not tracked - snapped up his chance with glee.

Now rattled Bassett were unable to create any further opening of note. Additionally, their now slender lead appeared increasingly vulnerable, and Allison was relieved to see a side foot volley fly over his crossbar with three minutes left after Sorrenti was caught ball watching.

In the final minute Newbury were again inches away from equalising as Shawn Foster beat Allison to the ball and headed Willmoth's corner inches over.

When they again won a corner in stoppage time, they wouldn't be denied. Clare should have been marked. But with nobody around him he was able to steer home. And with that Bassett had seen three points transform into just one. It may have taken them above Bracknell Town into fourteenth, yet the result gets them no nearer to extricating themselves away from the clutches of the Hellenic League Premier Division's lower reaches.

Bassett's unbeaten run got extended to six games too. Yet this draw felt worse than a number of defeats suffered so far this campaign, and with good reason.

Man of the Match: Ryan Stanners - caused significant problems for the Newbury defence and took his two goals supremely well.

Rating: 5/10 - from the commanding position they were in, Bassett should never have allowed Newbury to get back into the game and claim a point. But a failure to finish the game off and yet more poor defending from a set piece turned what would have won been a big three points into just one.

Uhsport Hellenic League Insights

Hellenic League 2013-14: this season's home masters and road warriors

With the season fast reaching its conclusion, every point matters as teams jostle for position. It says something that at the time of writing (prior to the games on Bank Holiday Monday) only bottom side Abingdon Town can be certain of their final league position.

Tonight's visitors Newbury can still extricate themselves from their current 19th place, which could potentially be a relegation spot. For Bassett, meanwhile, the recent dip in league form has meant points are still needed to prevent Cheltenham Saracens or Shrivenham snatching our current 14th position.

At the top of the table, the title is being fought tooth and nail by Ardley United – polesitters going into Monday - and Wantage Town. As both have received sufficient ground grading to make the step into the Southern League, the last week of the season is perfectly set for a dramatic finish, with a cigarette paper separating the teams. Wantage arguably hold the advantage. Although a point behind, they hold a game in hand over Ardley. Nevertheless the Alfredians still have Ascot United, their conquerors in the Challenge Cup, to come.

With games now almost complete and no team left with a mass of games to catch up on, it's an interesting time to compare home and away form. Have certain teams boosted their position in the table by virtue of establishing a fortress at home? And have others cost themselves by struggling away from home? The following tables reveal all.

Benefiting most from their home record have been Cheltenham Saracens, with their 'home' position five places better than their overall place in the league table.

Ardley and Wantage both possess the same points per game record, with the former still yet to be defeated. However, their four draws – including one against Bassett - could prove to be their undoing.

Thame's record at the ASM Stadium has done them few favours – perhaps because their fantastic pitch offers few problems to those unfamiliar with it. With eleven losses, Brimscombe and Thrupp's performances at home have arguably kept them from battling for a top half finish too.

A cultured young midfielder, Stanners joins from former Division One West foes New College where he spent the previous three seasons.

Stanners is an extremely skilful player, hungry for the ball and a great passer – traits typical of those who have come through the New College system.

He began playing for the Collegians in the 2010/11 season and helped guide the team to a third place finish in the Wiltshire League Premier Division, which was enough to secure elevation to the Hellenic League. He was the team's joint-leading league appearance maker a season later as New College finished in a solid eleventh place. In all competitions he played 34 times, scoring once – that goal being his team's first of the season in a loss against Clanfield.

Last year was more of a struggle for the students, but Stanners continued to improve, scoring four goals in his 27 appearances. His performances led to him also playing once for Southern League Swindon Supermarine against Hungerford Town.



Tonight's visitors have been found the going easier in familiar surroundings too. Bassett will be ruing the fact they could only gain a point on their visit to Berkshire though, seeing Newbury snatch a draw despite being 2-0 down.

Bassett's record at home is slightly worse than their last season in the Hellenic Premier. Back in 2010/11 – when opponents still had to deal with the Rylands Way 'bobble' of course – the team averaged 1.43 points per game.

It's safe to say the top half contains some relatively poor travellers. Flackwell turn out to be the worst, averaging 0.90 points more per game at home than away, while Binfield collect 0.67 points more at home. Highworth too have struggled away from The Elms; their goal difference best indicates this with a +17 figure at home and -2 figure away.

On the flip side, Brimscombe take more than half a point more on the road, while in the away table Thame United and Reading Town come out much better off than they do in the overall table.

Far and away the team who suffer most when forced to play away are Cheltenham Saracens, who incidentally are the team with the greatest travel demands. They are 1.2 points per game worse off on their travels than they are at home.

Tonight's visitors haven't excelled when away, collecting a meagre five points and conceding over twice as many as they have scored. Hopefully tonight Bassett can turn that to their advantage.

In the 'away' table, Bassett are overtaken by Shrivenham. However, compared to our local rivals, Bassett have lost five less games and have taken points from almost twice as many trips away (11 games compared to 6). With five of the eight away draws coming at Ardley, Ascot, Highmoor Ibis, Flackwell Heath, Thame and Highworth and a win against Kidlington, our away record against top half teams is played 10, won 1, drew 6 and lost 3 – not bad at all.
