On a positive note the facilities at Cirencester are excellent and we have been made most welcome all season by Cirencester. On behalf of the Club I would like to say a big thank you to Cirencester for the loan of their facilities and for the tremendous hospitality shown all season. All at Wootton Bassett hope that you are rewarded with promotion to the Calor League Premier Division and well done on your Development Team in winning Division Two West of the Uhlsport Hellenic League.

#### **Next Season**

Who knows what will happen on the team front next season. Jeff has gone on record as saying that he would like the Club to increase the budget for next season. I am also pleased that we have a Chartered Accountant as Treasurer to ensure that all tax and NI has been properly handled which is always a concern when payments are being made. With the absence of our own bar, raising money is difficult with sponsorship the only real source of funding. Our gate money is not going to go very far if we only get 17 turn up as we did for the last home fixture against Newbury.

All of the money paid to players this year has come through sponsorship obtained by Jeff and these sponsors should be thanked for their support, in particular TJR Electrical and Kellaway.

Relocation update: New site development begins

Wootton Bassett Sports Association's (WBSA) long running relocation project passed a major milestone this Easter when contracts completed on the sale and purchase of land, and works commenced on the development of the new site.

Having significantly outgrown its existing site at Rylands Way, the Association, consisting of the Town's football, tennis, cricket and running clubs, has long aspired to relocate in order to provide the sporting facilities required to support its 650+ members.

The project was delayed by the economic downturn in 2008, but the Association continued to believe in it, and following revisions to facilities and plans, and successful grant applications/awards, works have commenced on the 23 acre site to the North of the Malmesbury Road, opposite Ballards Ash.

Facilities will include 8 tennis courts, 2 cricket pitches, 4 grass football pitches, a full size artificial grass pitch, and a clubhouse including changing and social rooms. All the clubs have strong sport development plans, which include working with local schools and other community groups, and the facilities will support the realising of those.

WBSA Chairman Pete Yeardley commented: "Despite the lack of facilities at our current site making growth a challenge for our clubs, we want to continue to develop and have the plans in place to progress sport further involving even more of our community as both volunteers and players. That's why relocation is so important to us, and I'm delighted work has started and we'll move to the new site in the summer of 2015."

Well this is the last home game of the season and it has been an eventful first season. We came in with high expectations of a finish near the top of the table but have been surprised at the standard of teams in the Uhlsport Hellenic League. When we were in the Western League we had always thought the standard to be higher there but the Hellenic League has proved to be just as tough with some very good sides. On our day we have competed with some of the top sides as our draws against Highmoor Ibis, Ascot United, Ardley United and Highworth Town testify to. We have lacked a bit of consistency and disappointingly lost to a few of the sides at the bottom of the table. We seem to raise our game against the top sides but find it hard to perform to the same level of intensity against some of the lesser sides. ### **Opponents - History**

#### **Kidlington FC • Club History**

Kidlington FC was founded in 1909 and played local village football up to WW2. Success was slow in coming, records show their first trophy was achieved in 1929, the Lord Jersey Cup Final against Fritwell. The Lord Jersey Cup was a competition highly prized among the villages in the Cherwell Valley; rivalry was so keen that players had to prove they were residents of the village for whom they played



In 1945, Kidlington moved from village football to play in the Oxford City Junior League, with a good deal of success in both league and cup. By 1951 the Oxford-shire Senior League was entered, where stronger competition was provided by the likes of Witney Town; Morris Motors; Pressed Steel & Thame United.

1953 The Hellenic League formed, the Oxon Senior League immediately lost some of its stronger clubs to the new league. Kidlington won the Senior League title that next season, joining the new league in 1954. Early days in the Hellenic League showed quite clearly the difference in standard. Kidlington maintained a Premier Division place for a time, but spent most of the 60's in Division One. The 70's started with winning the County Intermediate Cup Final, along with two further County final places in the decade. Both epic battles against a very talented Peppard side, who won on both occasions. A squad of good young players produced Kidlington's best ever run in an FA competition, when in 1976-77. Having played every round but one away from home, Kidlington reached the last 16 in the FA Vase, bowing out to Gosport Borough. The nucleus of this side eventually gained promotion back to the Premier Division in 1979-80.

The 80's saw Kidlington return to Division One, the County Cup produced few consistent performances, other than in 1983-84 when Kidlington were 5 minutes away from a place in the final. The early 90's were steady. Season 94-95 brought silverware at last, Martin Bakers' Reserves side did the League/Cup double. An upturn in the first team fortunes occurred when Karl Grossmann assembled a formidable tough tackling side, finishing in the top 6 of Division One in four successive seasons.

The new millennium brought with it a major overhaul to the committee and a new Chairman in Geoff Talboys. In 2004-05, under the guidance of Kevin Walton the first team finish in third place, with it promotion back into the Hellenic Premier Division. With promotion came a struggle with the considerable difference in the standard of football compared to Division One, losing the first twelve games. The season petered out in frustration as the team finished in a relegation position ... however a national non-league re-structure saved them from the dreaded drop.

In 2007 - 2008, first team silverware arrived at Yarnton Road for the 1st time in over 30 years, winning the Floodlit Trophy under the guidance of manager Paul Lee. With additional honours this year from the Reserves, who won Reserve Division One for a second consecutive season, The Youth winning the Oxfordshire U18 Youth Cup, and to cap the season Kidlington Vet's retained their Veteran League crown. Season 2008-09 was again a good one for all our teams. Our 1st Team finished in a very respectable 9th position in the league and had some good cup runs, the Reserves finished 3rd in their league but unfortunately yet again were runners up in the Oxfordshire Intermediate Cup final. 2009-10 came a new Chairman, Lloyd Wray, and new team management, ex-player Gordon Geary was recruited to look after 1st team affairs and Barry Hiles to run the Reserve team.

Season 2010-11 saw the club, under the same management structure, achieve it's most successful season ever. Our best league finish ever, a superb effort by all saw us play a very strong Oxford United team, at the Kassam Stadium in the final of the Oxfordshire Senior Cup. We did win some silverware though, we beat Purton 3-0 in the final of the Supplementary Cup Abingdon Town. Geary and his assistant Appleton decided to quit, December 2011, stating they had taken the club as far as they could. Players Danny Leggett and Christian Perkins stepped forward to guide the club through till the end of the season. This season was very frustrating but owing to some decent early league results the club maintained its Premier division status. Ex-Oxford United striker Paul Berry was appointed manager for season 2012/13, however he resigned after only three matches to pursue alternative opportunities. Gordon Geary was persuaded to come out of retirement and was re-appointed as manager during the second week of the season. Geary managed to assemble a squad with the ability to avoid the dreaded drop achieving a respectable 13th position.

For season 2013-14 Martin Wilkinson and Chris Peacock take control as Manager and Assistant of the first team. John-Paul Hannaway, Graham Savins and Andy Dyer for the Reserves team management: Matt Elbro and Chris Jones the U18's. U16's Barry Hiles, assisted by Graham Rice and Andy Dyer.



### **WBTFC History On One Page**

#### **Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History**

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.



Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II.After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.



Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One West on a ground grading technicality, despite an appeal to the FA against the decision. In the circumstances manager Dave Turner did well to steer his side to 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. Last season Wootton Bassett were never out of the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing in 2nd place. In addition they had a fantastic run in the FA Cup reaching the 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time where they put up a spirited performance against Conference South side Dorchester Town. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided he had taken the team as far as he could and left after a successful 5 years in charge. In his place have come the former Calne Town management duo of Jeff Roberts and former Bassett player Drew Youngsam.

As Bassett enter their 3rd period in the Premier the new management team will be looking to consolidate in the top division at a time when the Club has to play games at Cirencester Town whilst the new ground is built at Ballards Ash.



### Wiltshire Senior Cup



The Wiltshire Senior Cup was first competed for back in 1896-97 when Swindon Town were the winners. The Town have gone on to win the competition nine times, including the first six years of the competition. With their progress in the professional game it is a long time since Swindon Town have competed in the Cup. Wootton Bassett Town's first success in the competition was to come at the turn of the century when they made the final in 1902-03, losing to Warminster Town. Wootton Bassett made the final again the following season doing down to Swindon Town Reserves in the final. It would be 84 years before Wootton Bassett would grace the final of the competition again when in 1987-88 they made the final to this time lose against near neighbours Purton. Wootton Bassett Town finally won the cup in 1998-99 when they defeated Pewsey Vale in the final. This success was repeated two seasons later with a win over Shrewton United. Since this win the best the Bassett faithful have had is a couple of semi-final appearances. Last season Wootton Bassett Town went out in the Second Round, losing 3-0 away at Westbury United. The competition was won by Melksham Town, despite having been knocked out in the guarter final only to be re-instated due to their opponents Bradford Town playing an ineligible player. Melksham made the most of their second chance.

In the final the game ended 0-0 after 90 minutes against Downton but two extra time goals gave Melksham the cup for the 6<sup>th</sup> time.

Melksham are on to defend the Cup again this season having once again made the final following a 4-0 semifinal win over Purton. Joining the min the final are Bradford Town who won 3-0 against Bemerton Heath Harlequins in the other semi-final tie.

With twenty minutes remaining, progression to the last four became a certainty as Roberts was bundled over in the box and Rigley put away another spot kick.




Bassett now join Brimscombe and Thrupp, Maidenhead United Reserves and either Bracknell Town or Oxford City Nomads in the semi finals.





### Football Was Better in My Day.....

Inspired by the fantastic books "Got, Not Got" and "The Lost World of Football" by Derrick Hammond and Gary Silke this Season's new feature looks at football related matters from the Editor's long lost youth that are no longer with us. Today.......

#### Parklife & Jumpers for Goalposts

As a kid at Lyneham I can remember that we would always be playing football day and night, either down Slessor Road Park or in one of the various grassy areas that was in between the houses in either Trenchard Road or Dickson Road.

Whilst the Park at Slessor Road was a mass expanse of green, also with proper goal posts set up in one area, for some bizarre reason we always preferred playing on what was originally a netball pitch next to the houses and their back gardens. This brought with it one of the occupational hazards of unofficial kids football, kicking the ball into someone's back garden. This was a regular occurrence but as kids we had rules and health and safety procedures for dealing with such a situation (this was good training for adult work life)

The first rule was that whoever

kicked the ball in the garden was responsible for retrieving it. Rule number 2 was if the people looked to be out you jumped over the fence and quickly grabbed the ball and climbed back over. However. before doing that you would consider the first health and safety rule which was if the family were known to have a great big sod-off Alsatian dog climbing the fence was not a good a recommended option. In this situation the safety first option was to go round and knock on the door and say "Please miss can we have our ball back". Another complicating factor which led you to also go for knock on the door option was if the family whose garden the ball had gone into had a hot daughter that we all fancied the knock on the door option was clearly the one to go for. Even as kids we had developed quite sophisticated decision trees

Having made the decision not to use the designated football pitch at Lyneham the first act before a game kicked off would be to put down some goalposts. Generally this was done by using tracksuit tops or sticks with an imaginary crossbar whose height varied

depending on who was in goal at the time. It is funny to reflect that as kids we did not need sophisticated goal line technology or extra referees on the goal line to decide whether a shot was in or not, somehow we all just knew and always came to an agreement that the score was 15-14 not 15-13.

We also had simple rules about how goalkeeping would work. especially where there was not many of you because Jonny and Phil had been grounded by their Mums. Early on a decision would be made as to whether it was "stick" goalies or not. Basically if the rule was stick the goalie could not come out. Another often used rule was that the last man back (the nearest person to the goal line is the keeper). Poor old Andre Marriner would have really struggled to ref one of our games when we were playing last man back s the goalkeeping rule.

In our games there were no complicated rules about player registrations and transfers. Registration took place just prior to kick off with two pickers, who took turns in choosing, from the best players down, until there's just that kid who nobody wanted on their team. Alternatively, it was those who supported London clubs against those that supported other teams e.g. dirty Leeds or Liverpool (you have to remember Man Utd and Man City were crap in those days). Kit sometimes got in the way of registration and shirts were often exchanged before the game to match the registration process. In summer this was avoided by being able to play shirts v skins.

The other important rule of kids football was that you had to be someone. "Who you gonna be" was the key question once teams had been selected. Baggsv I am Charlie George, Russell would say, Graham would want to be Alan Hudson and I would be Stan Bowles or Dave Thomas (with socks rolled down to my ankles to look the part). The general advantage of being a QPR fan was that you usually got to be who you wanted to be. The problem was when your whole team was, say, Tottenham then you had to settle for being Steve Perryman or Alan Mullery for the afternoon. In a World Cup year you could even be a foreigner such as Franz Beckenbauer, Rivelino, Johnny Rep. Gunter Netzer, Johan Cryuff or Gerd Muller.

The duration of our games were never of a set time. The main

reasons why a game would come to an end would be such things as the kid that owned the ball having to go home for tea, the ball bursting, it getting too dark or the ball getting kicked into a garden where the rumour was that the owner of the house owned a gun and had once kidnapped little Stevie Jones for 3 days.

On the subject of the game coming to an end that reminds me of another key rule of kids football which was designed to keep you interested to the very end. When the game has run for a couple of hours and we all knew it was time to go home there would be a shout of "next goal is the winner". The team who were 15 goals down would all of a sudden become competitive again, playing like kids possessed and there would be a couple of frantic minutes of close action before that winning goal goes in, who says you can't win 12-16? You could in our games.

As an alternative to replaying a football league or World Cup game on our main pitch we would play "headers and volleys" or our very own "World Cup". Like real kids football, "headers and volleys" also came with its own set of rules. Wide and you're in. Two points for a header, one for a volley. First player knocked out gets a 'dog's life'. I am sure all my older readers will understand what I am taking about.

"World Cup" had two variants along the lines of tennis with "singles" and "doubles". Basically you would use one goal and whoever scores would progress to the next round until someone was knocked out and then the next round would start. The singles variant was basically every boy for himself (although alliances were still formed to knock out ceratin kids). The doubles variant would see players paired off. The rule about having to be someone carried over into these games so once again you could end up being Steve Perryman.

Fun times but sadly you don't see kids playing football this way anymore. Now it tends to be organised mini-soccer with some miserable adult telling you what to do and not letting you be Gareth Bale or Lionel Messi, and not letting you try the Cryuff turn when playing in defence. Dear FA please remember England won the World Cup when these rules for kids football applied.





#### Bassett Succumb to Quick-Fire Kiddy

Rylands Way, 21st September 2010

Wootton Bassett Town's return to league action was not a happy one after two quick-fire goals midway through the second half proved the difference against Kidlington, who triumphed 3-1 at Rylands Way.

Prior to that funny few minutes, Dave Turner's side had been more than in the game, and it appeared as though at least a point could be snatched against their high-flying, free-scoring opponents. The visitors took the lead on the night early in the opening period when Christian Perkins made no mistake following a mistake from 'keeper Stewart Thompson.

However, Bassett pegged their opponents back in style with half time looming when a stunning strike from Terry Adams (pictured) levelled the



And they were in the ascendancy after the restart until a Jordan Parker strike against the run of play dealt the hosts a hammer blow. Soon after, Thompson once again had to pluck the ball from the back of the net when Parker beat him once more.

After suffering their second league defeat - and only their third in all 13 competitive games played so far this season - Bassett's honeymoon period in the Hellenic Premier Division seems over.

Tough days (and nights) were bound to occur this season, but it is now up to Turner's side to once again demonstrate the character that has served them so well since he took over.

Things don't neccessarily get any easier though with the next three league games coming against three of last season's top five, beginning with a trip to Wantage.

#### Tearle Wonder Goal and Thompson Wonder Save Give Bassett Historical Win

Rylands Way, 4th October 2008

An exquisite chip from Phil Tearle to beat the Kidlington keeper in the second period of extra-time followed by a Stewart Thompson penalty save saw Wootton Bassett Town through to the Second Round Proper of the F.A. Vase for the first time in the Club's history.



It was fitting that, in the week that the move to the new ground came closer to reality, it was a product of the Club's expanding Youth Section who scored the winning goal in this important money spinning match. Tearle has played for the Club since he was an Under 10 and is seen by the many youngsters who currently play for the Club's youth set-up as an inspirational figure who has shown that if you are good enough the door to the First Team is open to you.

In front of a healthy Rylands Way crowd Bassett started the game well and went in front courtesy of a well taken goal from another youngster, Lee Moulton, on 19 minutes. Following a flowing passing move the ball came to Moulton on the left of the box, he cut inside and put the ball into the far corner of the net giving the Kidlington keeper no chance. A cool finish for a youngster who continues to impress down the left hand side of Bassett's midfield.

Bassett extended the lead a minute later when a penalty was awarded for a foul on Ryan Banks. With regular penalty taker Steve Yeardley away running the Great North Run, it fell to top scorer Shaun Terry to take the kick. Memories of the missed penalty in the earlier round at Buckingham came flooding back but this time Terry made no mistake and fired the kick into the net.

Missing match reporter Scoop was duly sent a text advising of the second goal and it took two more such texts to convince him; yes Shaun had scored a penalty! Two-nil to Bassett at the break and in reality Bassett had dominated play with the back three of Chris Oram, Shaun Carter and Luke Sharps giving the Kidlington strikers little opportunity in front of goal and the midfield, particularly Tom Richie and Richie

Carter in the centre, working tirelessly to close down the Kidlington players, including former Wycombe Wanderers and Doncaster Rovers pro Jermaine McSporran.

The second half saw Kidlington come out all guns blazing but despite a lot of possession and neat passing football Bassett held onto the two goal lead. However, a harshly awarded free-kick on the edge of the 18 yard box allowed Morgan Williams to fire a free kick into the back of Stewart Thompson's net to make it 2-1 on 50 minutes. Chris Oram. and Shaun Carter continued to deny the lively Kidlington strikers but Bassett were to suffer a setback on 79 minutes just as they thought they were going to get the win. Bassett were slow to react to a ball down the left which allowed Mark Flanagan to get away and bear down on the Bassett goal and Flanagan fired a powerful low drive past Stewart Thomson to send the game into extra-

Just when thoughts were turning to a replay on Tuesday up stepped substitute Tearle and that cheeky wonder goal. A ball over the top saw Tearle race away from the Kidlington defence and as the Kidlington keeper came out he deftly chipped the ball over him and into the empty net, cue celebrations not seen at Rylands Way for many a year. However, within a minute the euphoria had gone as Shaun Carter handled the hall in the Bassett box and the referee pointed to the spot. Time for the second hero of the day to step forward. Kidlington's striker fired the penalty low to the left of keeper Stewart Thomson, but Thompson had guessed the right way and pulled off a magnificent save.

In the second period of extra time Kidlington pushed forward in search of an equaliser but left themselves vulnerable to the break. One such occasion saw Shaun Terry do the difficult bit of turning his defender on the edge of the box and with the keeper way off his line the opportunity was there to put the result beyond doubt but his curled shot just went the wrong side of the post. Bassett survived a late scare but clung on for the history making win that sends them into the last 128 in this prestigious national competition. The £1.000 prize money will have gone down well in the Committee Room.

Man of the Match: Tom Richie / Richie Carter – tremendous work rate in centre midfield and difficult to pick one out.

Rating (using the famous Scoop scale): 9/10 – a great team effort from start to finish. Bassett dominated first half but in second half it was the visitors led by Jermaine McSporren who put Bassett under pressure in the second half but the work levels never dropped and a deserved win in an excellent game of football.

#### Hellenic League 2013-14: this season's home masters and road warriors

With the season fast reaching its conclusion, every point matters as teams jostle for position. It says something that at the time of writing (prior to the games on Bank Holiday Monday) only bottom side Abingdon Town can be certain of their final league position.

Tonight's visitors Newbury can still extricate themselves from their current 19<sup>th</sup> place, which could potentially be a relegation spot. For Bassett, meanwhile, the recent dip in league form has meant points are still needed to prevent Cheltenham Saracens or Shrivenham snatching our current 14<sup>th</sup> position.

At the top of the table, the title is being fought tooth and nail by Ardley United – polesitters going into Monday - and Wantage Town. As both have received sufficient ground grading to make the step into the Southern League, the last week of the season is perfectly set for a dramatic finish, with a cigarette paper separating the teams. Wantage arguably hold the advantage. Although a point behind, they hold a game in hand over Ardley. Nevertheless the Alfredians still have Ascot United, their conquerors in the Challenge Cup, to come.

With games now almost complete and no team left with a mass of games to catch up on, it's an interesting time to compare home and away form. Have certain teams boosted their position in the table by virtue of establishing a fortress at home? And have others cost themselves by struggling away from home? The following tables reveal all.

Benefiting most from their home record have been Cheltenham Saracens, with their 'home' position five places better than their overall place in the league table.

Ardley and Wantage both possess the same points per game record, with the former still yet to be defeated. However, their four draws – including one against Bassett - could prove to be their undoing.

Thame's record at the ASM Stadium has done them few favours – perhaps because their fantastic pitch offers few problems to those unfamiliar with it. With eleven losses, Brimscombe and Thrupp's performances at home have arguably kept them from battling for a top half finish too.

### **Player Profile**

#### Jordan Roberts Midfield



Roberts is a supremely talented central midfielder who is capable of dictating a game. With a fantastic passing range, goalscoring ability, great touch and balance, and the willingness to get stuck in, he has proved to be a fantastic addition to the squad.

He made his bow in senior football with Calne Town towards the end of the 2008/09 season, and scored once in four appearances. A year later he featured 34 times, scoring three. In the summer of 2010 he signed for Belgian fourth tier outfit R.R.F.C. Montegnee. However, that move fell through due to international clearance rules and he finished the 2010/11 campaign with Calne having also dual-signed with Chippenham Town.

In 2011/12 Roberts played 28 times for Calne, scoring five goals. Last season with the Lilywhites he finished as second top scorer, netting eight times in 28 appearances. That figure would likely have been higher had he not ended the season with Southern League Swindon Supermarine, for who made his debut in January against Hungerford Town. He featured regularly, albeit often as a substitute, as Dave Webb's side came close to securing promotion back to step three. In total he played 14 times for Marine, making four starts and scoring once in the Wiltshire Premier Shield. He figured prominently in their Playoff Semi Final with Merthyr Town and was controversially sent off in the game which Marine eventually lost on penalties.



### **Uhlsport Hellenic League Insights**

Tonight's visitors have been found the going easier in familiar surroundings too. Bassett will be ruing the fact they could only gain a point on their visit to Berkshire though, seeing Newbury snatch a draw despite being 2-0 down.

Bassett's record at home is slightly worse than their last season in the Hellenic Premier. Back in 2010/11 – when opponents still had to deal with the Rylands Way 'bobble' of course – the team averaged 1.43 points per game.

It's safe to say the top half contains some relatively poor travellers. Flackwell turn out to be the worst, averaging 0.90 points more per game at home than away, while Binfield collect 0.67 points more at home. Highworth too have struggled away from The Elms; their goal difference best indicates this with a +17 figure at home and -2 figure away.

On the flip side, Brimscombe take more than half a point more on the road, while in the away table Thame United and Reading Town come out much better off than they do in the overall table.

Far and away the team who suffer most when forced to play away are Cheltenham Saracens, who incidentally are the team with the greatest travel demands. They are 1.2 points per game worse off on their travels than they are at home.

Tonight's visitors haven't excelled when away, collecting a meagre five points and conceding over twice as many as they have scored. Hopefully tonight Bassett can turn that to their advantage.

In the 'away' table, Bassett are overtaken by Shrivenham. However, compared to our local rivals, Bassett have lost five less games and have taken points from almost twice as many trips away (11 games compared to 6). With five of the eight away draws coming at Ardley, Ascot, Highmooor Ibis, Flackwell Heath, Thame and Highworth and a win against Kidlington, our away record against top half teams is played 10, won 1, drew 6 and lost 3 – not bad at all.

### Season 2013-14 Review

to Abingdon United came next as two rare goals from Adam Corcoran were not enough to prevent the home team triumphing 4-3.

Good form eventually returned, Sam Collier's late penalty holding Ardley to a 1-1 draw before Bassett came from behind thanks to goals from Cox and Lee Stevens to frustrate Highmoor. Old Woodstock Town were then easily seen 3-0 in the Supplementary Cup.

#### December - some festive cheer as Bassett hit the right notes

There was to be no progression in the County Cup, however, as Bemerton Heath Harlequins won 3-2 after extra time. That was to be the last loss of 2013 as Bassett began a climb up the table. A lone Collier goal earned three points against Binfield. Cox saw a second half goal quickly cancelled out nu Highworth on a frigid afternoon, but another draw was the result. A dramatic finish to Thame United's visit to the Corinium Stadium then resulted in four goals being shared. 2-2 was again the result just after Christmas against Newbury Town, but this time Bassett threw away what appeared to be a comfortable two goal advantage. But there was to be no stopping the team against Holyport who were thrashed 6-2, a scoreline that could have been more but for two missed penalties!

#### January and February - momentum washed out by the weather

The horrendous winter meant only two games were played in these months. The first saw Cox net a dramatic to complete the double against Shrivenham. After a six week gap the team returned to face the trip to Oxford City. And for the first time in nine league games Bassett tasted defeat, shipping two second half goals.

#### March - drawing to a close

With the weather having wreaked havoc on the fixture list, so began the annual end of season frenzy. It started well. Just after half time, Stevens scored the game's only against Cheltenham Saracens, before a tight affair at Holyport ended in another draw, this time goalless. Bassett were unlucky to fall to a 1-0 loss at Wantage, while hopes of a silverware were kept alive with a comfortable 3-1 victory at the expense of Penn & Tylers Green in the Supplementary Cup.

Back in the league, there was a hope of finishing the season with a flourish. Flackwell could have been defeated, but a Corcoran goal was cancelled out late on by the visitors.

#### April – a final month of contrasts

After a loss to Ascot, a depleted Bassett side then visited Thame and did well to grind out a 0-0 draw – their twelfth of the campaign. A disappointing week followed, with Cheltenham gaining revenge for their loss a month before and Bracknell then taking all the points thanks to a lone penalty. By now Bassett's best hopes were a 14<sup>th</sup> place finish after talks of sneaking into the top half at 2014's outset.

A convincing 3-0 Supplementary Cup quarter final victory against Saracens lifted spirits, while Abingdon Town were thumped 5-0, four goals coming in the first half. Defeat to Brimscombe and Thrupp meant there was to be no Supplementary Cup final appearances. After that disappointment, the team may have been forgiven for taking the foot off the gas as the season wound down with only pride to play for. But to their credit, they battled on, Cox scoring twice in a 3-1 win against Newbury.

Now with today's final home game against Kidlington and Wednesday's trip to Brimscombe, there's a chance to finish with a flourish. Six more points would take Bassett to 48 – four shy of their previous Hellenic Premier Division best – and represent a more than credible haul for the first year back at this level.

### Season 2013-14 Review

#### Wootton Bassett Town: 2013-14 season review

It's been a season of peaks and troughs for Wootton Bassett Town, a streak of positive results being followed by a prolonged lull with this pattern prone to being repeated. Although a number of the league's top teams have been given a stern test, a dozen draws and narrow defeats have prevented the team from scaling the heights.

#### August - from bad to good
