Welcome to Binfield

A warm welcome to our visitors Binfield for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division clash.

Until Saturday, Binfield had inflicted the heaviest defeat of the season on us, having won 6-1 on the opening day of the season. We did not perform well on that opening day and will be looking to give Binfield a much tougher game here tonight.

Binfield currently sit in 5th position in the table, a point behind 3rd placed Ascot United. Binfield have won 13 of their opening 23 fixtures, drawn 4 and lost 6. Of those 6 defeats 4 came against just 2 opponents, Ardley United and high flying Kidlington.

Binfield have had a change of manager since we last played them. Mark Tallentire stepped down at the end of September. Appointed First Team boss at the start of the 2010/11 season, Tallentire guided his side to glory in both the Hellenic Floodlit Cup and Berks and Bucks Senior Trophy, while enjoying countless tilts at the Hellenic Premier Division title and several healthy runs in both the FA Cup and Vase. He has been replaced by his assistant and former Wokingham & Emmbrook Manager Roger Herridge.

We have played Binfield on 5 occasions previously with just one win to our name which came in the corresponding fixture last season here at the Corinium when Sam Collier scored the only goal of the game. Another tough game is in prospect against another of the leading sides in the league.

Thatcham Town and Highmoor Ibis

After the narrow defeat against Thatcham Town a week last Wednesday, we were without a game on the last Saturday of November. Having been given a week and a half off it was hoped that the lads would be fit and raring to go for the game last Saturday but instead, with a host of players missing, we went down to our heaviest defeat of the season at league leaders Highmoor Ibis. Never an easy place to visit our task was made so much harder with so

many players missing. Hopefully a number will be back available for tonight's game. By all accounts we did not get going on Saturday and were well beaten in the end. Having also shipped 6 goals against tonight's opponents earlier in the season I am sure the lads will be looking to make amends for both Saturday's bad day at the office and also that defeat on the opening day of the season.

FA Vase

Congratulations to the 3 sides from the Hellenic League who have made through to the last 32 in the FA Vase. This includes near neighbours Highworth Town as well as Flackwell Heath and Ascot United. These 3 teams are joined in the last 32 by Wiltshire sides Melksham Town and Bradford Town, the latter side being our opponents this coming Saturday in the Wiltshire Senior Cup. Who knows we may all be going to Wembley to watch Jonny Aitkenhead play come May.

Wiltshire Senior Cup

Talking of the Wiltshire Senior Cup, in order to make it through to a first semi-final since 2008/09 we will have to defeat Bradford Town, who put paid to our FA Cup run earlier this season.

We booked our place in the last eight with a 1-0 extra time victory over County League Wroughton following an opening round 3-2 triumph against Malmesbury Victoria in another game that required extra time.

Bradford, runners-up in the competition last season, have had a much more straightforward passage through to the quarter finals. They received a walkover in the first round before thrashing Dorset Premier League Mere Town 5-1.

There has been just one previous meeting between the teams in the county competition. And that came in the opening round back in 1998/99, which resulted in a 4-1 win for Bassett, who would go on to lift the cup for the first time in their history that season.

Contests since then have been limited to clashes in the FA Cup. In the 2010/11 Extra Preliminary Round, Bassett prevailed on penalties in a classic replay at

Rylands Way that saw the teams share six goals in 120 minutes of pulsating football.

Paul Shanley's side exacted revenge for that loss earlier this season though, prevailing 2-1 in a Preliminary Round contest in West Wiltshire; Bradford's run would be ended a round later by Southern League Poole Town.

Currently sitting mid-table in the Western League Premier Division, Bradford have also advanced to the third round of the FA Vase, enjoying comfortable wins Oldland Abbotonians, Andover Town, Malmesbury and Odd Down. The Wiltshire Senior Cup tie will take place this coming Saturday at the Corinium Stadium.

Ladies Team

The Ladies side have had some tough matches of late but became only the 2nd team this season to take points off league leaders Cirencester Town. They earned a point against Gloucestershire County Women's League leaders in dramatic fashion as they overcame a 3-1 deficit to draw 3-3. Top scorer Emily Bogg was their hero as she struck a hat-trick against a Cirencester team who had conceded just four league goals in their opening seven games.

Her first was a cracking volley on the turn that put Bassett in front, but Cirencester hit back with an immediate equaliser before eventually staking out a 3-1 lead.

But Bogg ensured honours would be even come full time with her tenth and eleventh goals of the campaign. On Sunday the Ladies went down to a narrow 1-0 defeat against Longlevens. In what was by all accounts a very competitive game, Bassett hit the bar and also had an effort cleared off the line. Well done to Becky and the ladies for their recent performances and hopefully these close games can be turned into wins in the second half of the season.

Development Side

After a reasonable start to the season, when the Development Side were able to play a number of players from the Reserve team, the Development Side are now struggling in what is a competitive Wiltshire League. They have now

lost 6 games on the bounce and 8 out of the last 10. This included a poor 9-0 defeat away at bottom of the table Westbury United Reserves. With games also having to be called off due to an inability to raise a side one has to question the wisdom of trying to run 3 senior sides, especially when we are currently experiencing a set-up that sees the First Team playing in Cirencester and the Clubhouse being not on the same site that the Reserves and Development Side play.

Whilst it is not really my business I would like to see the Club revert to the 3rd side being the Under 18 Side which plays in the midweek Wiltshire Youth Floodlit League. Whilst the League has historically not been well run it must be easier to field a side in this competition rather than trying to raise 3 adult sides on a Saturday.

Being somewhat controversial, if we were to drop one adult side for me I would keep a 2nd team in the Wiltshire League and drop out of the Hellenic Reserves League. At the moment there are 5 more teams in the Wiltshire League meaning 10 more games and more regular football. I am sure that the number of adult sides that the Club runs will be something that the Committee look at over the summer.

The new ground should also allow the Club to enter a Veterans Side in the Hellenic Veterans League and I am sure we would have no difficulty raising a side for that league.

Archaeology finds on relocation site

Wootton Bassett Sports Association are looking for help in assessing archaeology finds on the relocation site.

The majority of the archaeological features revealed settlement of probable Iron Age and Romano-British date. These consisted of a roundhouse represented by a ring gully, and a pair of rectangular buildings indicated by postholes and cill beam slots.

Adjacent to these buildings were several other pits and postholes, the latter perhaps revealing evidence for further buildings, a pair of wells

and an inhumation burial of a new born child.

To the west of the structures was a field boundary of probable Iron Age origin which was reused in the Romano-British period. Part of the re-use of this boundary showed that it post-dated shallow quarry pits, also of Romano-British date, which may have provided limestone for lime production, although no lime kilns were identified on the site.

The majority of the finds, including coins, a brooch, pottery and animal bones were of Romano-British date and indicate that the remains of this period are of a low status rural settlement of late 1st/early 2nd to 3rd century AD date, with some minor continuation in to the mid-4th century.

Whilst these historical finds were being unearthed it is pleasing to see the green grass appearing on the new pitch and the structure of the Clubhouse starting to take shape.



Whilst the new ground is now clearly starting to take shape the development at the new ground continues at a pace. On a rare visit back to Bassett a fortnight ago I was staggered to see how quickly the houses had gone up on the football pitch. With the cricket still playing there this summer what odds on a few broken windows when 6's are hit over the boundary? On the subject of archaeological finds, unfortunately rumours that remnants of Roger Williamson's perm had been found at the Rylands Way

development site proved to be unfounded and was more likely to be dog hair left by one of the locals from the nearby houses walking their dog on the pitch!

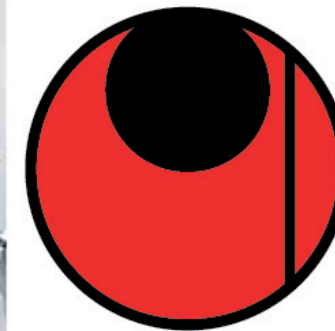

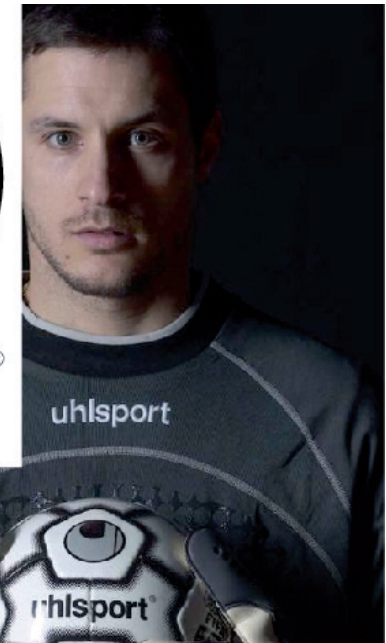

The Rising Star

Mitchell Terry, a 17 year old Level 7 referee from Wootton Bassett is into his third season as a referee and is currently in the stage of promotion to Level 6 this season.

From a very young age I have wanted to become a referee for no reason at the time. I always used to watch my home club Wootton Bassett Town FC's first team games in the Hellenic Football League and watching the 3 officials lead the players out made me dream of doing that one day. Then at 9 years old I became a linesman for local adult charity matches ran by WBTFC and my love grew for officiating from there.



At 14 years old I completed my Basic Training Course in Swindon with 2 FA Tutors named Graham and Kevin Barnes. From the way the course was taught and with real life experiences added I was really excited about becoming a referee. After passing the course the 2011/12 season which was nearing Christmas I was invited by Graham to attend the Wiltshire Referee Academy based at Swindon Town's FC's Academy facility. Here I would be mentored every game and my ability with the whistle and flag had increased dramatically with the support of Graham. I was asked by WBTFC to be the linesman for their Reserve team playing in the Hellenic Division 2 West league on Saturdays which I used to my full advantage and due to playing I only completed a small amount of games in the remainder of the 2011/12 season.

When the 2012/13 season started I quit playing to focus on my refereeing with WBTFC Reserves on a Saturday and the North Wilts Youth and Minor League along with the occasional Academy game on a Sunday. 2012/13 was my first full season as a referee and within the year I was selected to referee the North Wilts Under 13 League Cup Final at the County Ground while being selected as Young Referee of

the Year in the league. I also received 'Club Linesman of the Year' by the Hellenic Football League and none of this would of been achieved without the support and guidance of Graham Barnes and Kevin Barnes at the Wiltshire County FA Refereeing Academy.

In the 2013/14 season I was accepted to become a full time referee on the Hellenic Football League as an assistant referee for the Premier League and also a part time referee for the Division 2 West League at the age 16. To think I dreamt of doing this a few years ago and now this dream was becoming a reality. After completing 2013/14 I was again selected for a North Wilts final and I was also appointed as assistant referee on a Hellenic League final whilst being invited by the Junior Premier League to referee their cup final staged at Cheltenham Town's Stadium.

I have met some incredible people during my time as a referee both on and off the pitch. I attend the Swindon Referee Association's meetings every month with this allowing referee's to get together and talk about what's happened to them and provide tips for each other on how to improve. I have gained a big family since joining the local RA in Swindon and the national RA holds a conference every year. Referees at the highest level attend the event and it gives referees like myself at grassroots level the chance to hear stories. It was great to travel up to Leicester for the conference this year with fellow Wiltshire referees Andrew Lincoln, Josh Ainscow and Ben Williamson giving us a day that was never to forget.

From The Dugout

Thatcham Town (H)

A midweek home game against Thatcham would be a game that we would be looking at taking a point or 3 from. And after the first 15 minutes I was feeling confident we could get something from the game. But as the game went on we didn't take our chances and we started to allow the visitors to take control. A late substitute for Thatcham made the difference as the player came on and within minutes turned our defenders inside out and fired past Ben in goal.

With not long left we tried in vain to chase the game and a change of formation for once didn't help. We were caught on the break and Thatcham wrapped it up with a 2-0 win.

Highmoor Ibis (A)

And that will be coming from myself first of all this evening. A few players might find this a shock this evening but the home truths will be coming out. We need a reaction this evening from Saturday.

Opponents - History

Binfield • Club History

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.



During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground. In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972, Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house we see today. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In the following season we reached the final of the Berks and Bucks Intermediate Cup for the first time but unfortunately lost in extra time. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt, and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign. A Cup Final appearance in the Reading Senior Cup also ended in disappointment as we lost by the odd goal in three to Peppard. In 1995 we reached the final of the Reading Senior Cup only to lose to Mortimer on penalties and in 96 we won the Chiltonian League again.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the membership, with over 20 teams playing every weekend this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013. We're also in our second season of a partnership scheme with Reading FC where some of our younger players have the opportunity to train with Reading FC. In 2003 we added an Allied Counties Youth team which is now providing a steady stream of talented young players ready for Senior football for the Reserves and 1st Team. Our reserves side are a vital and successful part of our club, providing progression from our youth team into senior football and regularly providing players for the 1st team squad, whilst also being successful in winning UHlsport Hellenic Division 2 East in 2012, runners up in 2013 and coming runners up in the Reserves Challenge Cup in both seasons. Half a dozen players last season progressed from our Youth team into our Reserves and four of those went on to make 1st team appearances this season two of those 'home-grown' players are in the starting 1st team squad. Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. We've continued to improve our facilities with the car park and changes to the club house. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team and Veterans. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division and 3rd in 2012/13. August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup. Ultimately the step up to the next tier of English non league football is our aim.

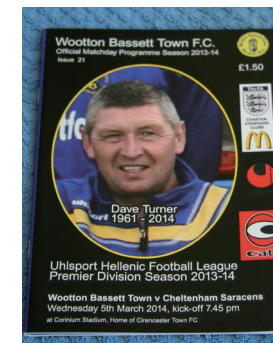
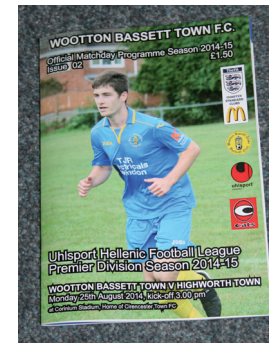

Baptism by fire for new look Bassett as Binfield run rampant

Hill Farm Lane, 9th August 2014

For a number of those Wootton Bassett Town players starting against Binfield this was their first experience of Hellenic League Premier Division football. And after suffering a crushing 6-1 defeat, it's likely to be an afternoon few forget quickly.

This was stark exposure to the quality of opposition at the top end of the division.

Bassett's performance was not as bad as the final score may suggest. Instead they were well beaten from a team who should be expected to challenge for honours at the end of the season.

The type of afternoon that it was going to be became evident early on, the home side having the majority of the play with Bassett pinned deep. And their early pressure eventually led to an opening goal eleven minutes in as Dave Woozley steered in from close range after Carl Withers flicked a header towards goal.

That the opener came from a set piece was testament to some of Bassett's dogged defending, which had seen two chances snuffed out by last ditch tackles, including a fine stop by full back Pete Sykes, prior to the goal.

Sykes soon prevented another goal for the hosts with an acrobatic clearance off the line after Ian Davies had beat Ben Mitchell to the punch and flicked a header that seemed destined to settle in the back of the net.

He could do little to halt the progress of Josh Warren – so effective at finding space throughout – on the half hour mark though as Binfield doubled their advantage. Had the Bassett midfield not stood off Davies, the ball may not have been worked out so easily to Warren on the right.

Sykes was left isolated, allowing to Warren cut inside and he then sent a precise, low 20-yard drive into the right corner beyond the reach of a despairing Mitchell.

With a relatively comfortable advantage, the hosts' concentration wandered briefly as a flowing move involving Lewis Chatwin, James Skinner and Dale Richards (pictured below) resulted in the latter spinning on the edge of the box and toe poking past Dan Weait. An offside flag ruled that goal out though.



Richards was then unfortunate not to earn a penalty on the stroke of half time when his shirt was tugged from behind after the youngster had broken free, yet no decision was forthcoming.

His energy and drive eventually earned the spot kick that allowed Bassett to briefly hold hopes of getting back into the game shortly after the restart. A give-and-go with Nathan Gambling set Richards free again, and as he broke into the box a slight touch sent him tumbling. Gambling then sent Weait the wrong way with an emphatic penalty.

A half chance to equalise soon followed as Richard rose to meet a Dan Bailey corner, but his looping header sailed over.

That was near enough as good as it got for Bassett the rest of the way.

Any rekindled hopes of taking anything from the game were extinguished on 55 minutes as right back Jack Broome sauntered forward, riding three challenges, before cutting back for the prolific Davies to steer in from ten yards.

Shortly after the hour a long ball forward following a stalled Bassett attack fell to an unmarked Adam Dickens, who rifled a scorching long range effort past Mitchell.

It became 5-1 midway through the second period when Seb Bowerman intercepted a pass from centre half Nathan Hawkins intended for Steve Yeardley. Bowerman broke forward with purpose and squared for Davies, who rolled his man and stroked home.

Binfield would have to wait until five minutes into stoppage time for their sixth, which came when Callum Whitty guided a header from Carl Withers' teasing free kick into the top corner.

That completed a rather chastening season opening experience for Bassett. The team's work rate throughout was admirable. However, failing to appreciate possession and adapt properly to a rather slow pitch played into Binfield's hands.

Heads should not go down as a result of this match – the side Braithwaite and assistant Chris Green have fashioned still has plenty of promise. And Tuesday's visit to Newbury offers a quick to opportunity to rebound and demonstrate that.

Man of the Match: Dale Richards – though playing most of preseason at full back, he performed well in a more advanced role and gave Binfield right back Jack Broome something to think about. His surge forward won Bassett their penalty, while he was unfortunate not to be awarded one at the end of the opening period when he was more clearly impeded.

volley five yards out. To Bassett's utmost despair, the Kidlington keeper pulled off a miraculous save. But worse followed when Stoddart put the rebound wide. Bassett laid siege to the Kidlington goal, but their just reward was not to be. In a rare Kidlington attack, Read – who had been a spectator for most of the second half – pulled off a great save from a point blank header. Although disappointed, Bassett could feel that, on this performance, the best side had come second on the day."

With a run of five home games Wootton Bassett Town were confident of turning this good form into points and move up the table but this unfortunately did not prove to be the case. In the first fixture against Cheltenham Saracens goals from Gary Ashford and Simon Green put Wootton Bassett 2-0 up only for the visitors to score three in an entertaining fixture. Manager Dave Warren noted the following in his programme notes for the next home fixture:

"What a game we had last week against Cheltenham Saracens. It was disappointing that we lost 2-3 but it was good entertainment for any neutral. I thought we were excellent in the first half, well in control playing good football and thoroughly deserved our half time lead 1-0 with a superb goal from Gary Ashford. We started the second half in the same vein and added a second with a well taken far post header by Simon "Bilic" Green – his first of the season. We then thought we had done the job and took our foot off the pedal, stopped doing all the good things that had put us in the driving seat, i.e. good shape, tight marking, good concentration and discipline. It seems that our players have to learn the hard way. At this standard of football you cannot give any team a "sniff" to get back into the game which is what happened with Saracens. But I must end on a positive note because over the past two weeks we have played the third and fourth placed team and shown that we can compete with them, played better football on both occasions and have taken them all the way, something that didn't happen last season which goes to show that our confidence is growing. Sure we need to improve in a few areas – we are still a developing team. If we can play a full 90 minutes on a consistent basis like we did for 65 minutes last week then we need fear no one."

The manager's wish was not, however, granted; as the subsequent fixture with Pegasus Juniors on 28th March saw the visitors win 2-0.

The next scheduled fixture should have seen second placed Cirencester Academy visit Rylands Way but the game was postponed. The fixtures did not get any easier as next up were another leading side in the shape of near neighbours Purton. A solitary goal gave Purton all three points and the fourth consecutive defeat for Wootton Bassett. The bad run was finally ended when Milton visited Rylands Way as goals from Paul David and Justin Hyde gave Bassett a 2-0 win. Three days later the re-arranged game with Cirencester Academy was played and again Wootton Bassett lost narrowly to one of the leading sides, again going down to a solitary goal to complete their home fixtures.

Wootton Bassett, having played six home games in a row, then finished the season with four away games. The first saw them share four goals and the points with Cirencester United,

February kicked-off with a tough looking fixture away to league leaders Ardley United and so it proved as Wootton Bassett Town went down to their heaviest defeat of the season, a 5-1 reverse, Darren Cardus scoring what was to be his only goal of the season. In his programme notes for the subsequent fixture with Cheltenham Saracens, Manager Dave Warren noted that the scoreline flatter the league leaders with Bassett missing a number of chances. This defeat was followed by another in Cheltenham against Bishops Cleeve, Lee Stoddart having given Wootton Bassett the lead, only for lapses of concentration to allow the home side to score twice and take the points. The month did, however, end on a positive note with a comfortable 3-0 away win at Letcombe courtesy of two goals from Lee Stoddart and one from Jeremy Newton.

The first week in March saw the re-scheduling of the abandoned game with Milton and justice was done as Wootton Bassett, who had been leading the original game with their opponents already down to ten men when the Milton player attacked the referee, won the re-scheduled fixture by six goals to three. Gary Ashford certainly enjoyed the game as he fired a hat-trick with Justin Hyde, Jeremy Newton and Paul Harper adding the other goals. Prior to the next league fixture Wootton Bassett Town's Barry Giles had the honour of skippering the Hellenic League Division One Representative Side in a fixture at Abingdon United against The Chiltonian League. The Rep game finished 0-0 and was played in atrocious weather with Purton's Mark Collier winning a bottle of champagne for his man of the match performance. Four days later Giles returned to the Wootton Bassett side for the trip to Kidlington. Wootton Bassett went down to a solitary goal but Dave Warren noted in his programme notes that this was the sides best performance of the season to date and could easily have been won 3-1 if Bassett had taken their chances. The Wiltshire Gazette and Herald carried the following report on the match:

"Last Saturday saw Bassett travelling to Oxfordshire for the last of a long line of away games and a tough one at that for Kidlington has not been a favourite ground for the visitors in recent seasons. Bassett started confidently enough passing the ball around well. It was not long before a strong Kidlington side got to grips with the game although Bassett did have a goal disallowed after six minutes when the referee adjudged that Davis had fouled the keeper. After Kidlington's third successive corner, they scrambled home the only goal of the game. Poor defending when the ball should have been easily cleared allowed them to score in the bottom right-hand corner. The Wiltshire squad readjusted the system and slowly worked their way back into the game. In fact, on 21 minutes Stoddart had the chance to bring the scores level but completely missed his shot when only three yards out. And Bassett finished the half the stronger with Giles, Davis and Flavell holding the side together.

Without doubt the second half belonged to Bassett. On 46 minutes Machell flashed a shot just past a post and then, three minutes later, the keeper pulled off a great save from Stoddart. Now Bassett were now on top and causing an opposition, currently fourth in the table, no end of problems. On 66 minutes, came their best move of the game. Newton deliver[ed] a perfect cross from the left to Stoddart who met it on the

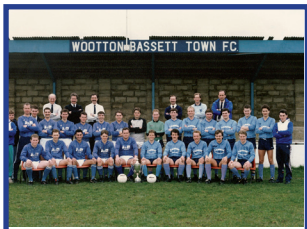

Two goals from Neil Trimbrell and one from Kenny Regan gave Wootton Bassett a winning start to the season, 3-1 the final score. Another home game quickly followed as Kidlington were the visitors to Rylands Way; unfortunately the winning start could not be extended with Wootton Bassett going down by the odd goal in five, Timbrell again on the score sheet with Kevin Bray getting the other Bassett consolation goal. Neil Timbrell maintained his excellent scoring start to the season in the away fixture with Cirencester Academy but once again Wootton Bassett were on the wrong end of a game which saw five goals shared between the two sides, Jeremy Newton bagging the other Wootton Bassett goal. After two narrow defeats it was important for the Wootton Bassett side to get back amongst the points and a useful point was secured in the away fixture at Clanfield, Paul Harrison and Martin Cooper scoring in the 2-2 draw. Wiltshire Senior Cup

The Wiltshire Senior Cup was first competed for back in 1896-97 when Swindon Town were the winners. The Robins have gone on to win the competition nine times, including six straight titles after its inception. With their progress in the professional game it is a long time since Swindon have competed in the competition. Wootton Bassett Town's first success in the competition was to come at the turn of the century when they made the final in 1902-03, losing to Warminster Town. Bassett made the final again the following season going down to Swindon Town Reserves in the final. It would be 84 years before Bassett would again grace the competition's showpiece when in 1987-88 they made the final to this time lose against near neighbours Purton. Finally in 1998-99 Bassett won the cup when they defeated Pewsey Vale in the final after extra time. This success was repeated two seasons later with a win over Shrewton United. Since this win the best the Bassett faithful have had is a couple of semi-final appearances. Last season Bassett went out in the Second Round, losing 2-3 at home against Bemerton Heath Harlequins.

The competition was won by Melksham Town for the second season running, and seventh time overall. This time there was no controversy (in 2012-13 they had won after having been knocked out in an earlier round only to be re-instated due to their opponents playing an ineligible player). In the final, the game ended 3-3 after extra-time against Bradford Town, but Melksham won the cup on penalties.

Melksham will be looking to achieve a hat-trick of wins this season, a feat only previously achieved by Swindon Town (in the late 1880s early 1890s), Devizes Town (in the 1950s and 1960s) and, most recently, Corsham Town (2004-5 to 2006-7).

In the First Round of this season's competition the big shock of the round was Wroughton's 2-1 win over Wessex league side Bemerton Heath Harlequins. In Round 2 Wootton Bassett Town needed extra time to knock-out Wroughton, the solitary goal coming from the penalty spot. There were few surprises as all of the big guns made it through to the last 8 of the competition.

WBTFC History On One Page

Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out of the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away. Last season Bassett were managed by Jeff Roberts. Despite assembling a skilful side on paper and paying players for the first time, the side ended the season in 14th place and with a poor discipline record. Ahead of the move into a new ground at Ballards Ash the Club again has a new manager with former Fairford Town manager Paul Braithwaite taking over the management duties.

MANCHESTER UNITED may finally be getting back to top form under Louis Van Gaal, but there's one former Red Devil who has been on an upward curve for a while – Worcester City's Sean Geddes.



It's true that the national media don't give Non-League the coverage it deserves – that's why we're here, of course!

But Geddes has forced his way into the headlines. He scored twice last month at the Ricoh Arena to shock 1987 FA Cup winners Coventry City.

The fact that his work involved him making parts used by the Mercedes Formula 1 team – whose drivers Lewis Hamilton and Nico Rosberg were fighting for the World Championship – was a fantastic narrative.

City may have returned to the rigours of the Vanarama Conference North, but Geddes, the

former Manchester United trainee who played alongside Danny Welbeck, made it nationwide again after Saturday's 3-0 defeat of Barrow in the FA Trophy.

The midfielder took a lofted pass out of the air with his right foot before turning back onto his left just inside the penalty area. With Barrow defenders thinking they had done their job by halting his progress, Geddes wrapped his right foot around the back of his left leg to chip the keeper Aaran Taylor with a 'Rabona'.

That sort of goal is normally reserved for the likes of Cristiano Ronaldo, Lionel Messi and Tottenham's Erik Lamela - who recently scored one of his own in Spurs' Europa League match against Astera Tripoli.

But Geddes showed his pedigree and reminded the likes of United superstars Falcao, Angel Di Maria and Robin van Persie how it's done!

A short clip of the goal on video sharing site Vine had already been viewed 1.3million times by Tuesday morning. It's just a shame Geddes' second goal against Barrow, a wonderful 25-yard free kick, has all but been forgotten!

The 'Rabona' prompted his club boss Car Heeley to say: "Sean's first goal was probably the best goal I've ever seen. To try that sort of effort, you need to be full of belief and it just shows his confidence."

Of course, Geddes isn't the first Non-League star to go 'viral' on the internet after a piece of sheer brilliance.

The Goal of the Season winner at our National Game Awards in May went to Welling United's Joe Healy for his fantastic scissor kick at Grimsby Town. The goal attracted over 100,000 views on YouTube and was a worthy winner.

Rene Steer, meanwhile, scored a wonder goal for St Neots from 40 yards against Canvey Island that attracted over half a million views.

And then there was the "greatest Non-League goal of all time" by former Premier League star Glen

Little – or at least that's how it was billed!

Veteran Little, then playing for Wealdstone, picked the ball up in his own half before surging up the pitch and eventually chipping the Dulwich Hamlet keeper from the edge of the box. That attracted over 270,000 views.

And of course there's always space for a video nasty, Ebbsfleet United keeper Preston Edwards might not thank me for bringing this up, but his sending off after ten seconds against Farnborough has been watched almost ten million times!

If the amount of attention these videos have attracted only tells you one thing, it's that Non-League's definitely got talent!

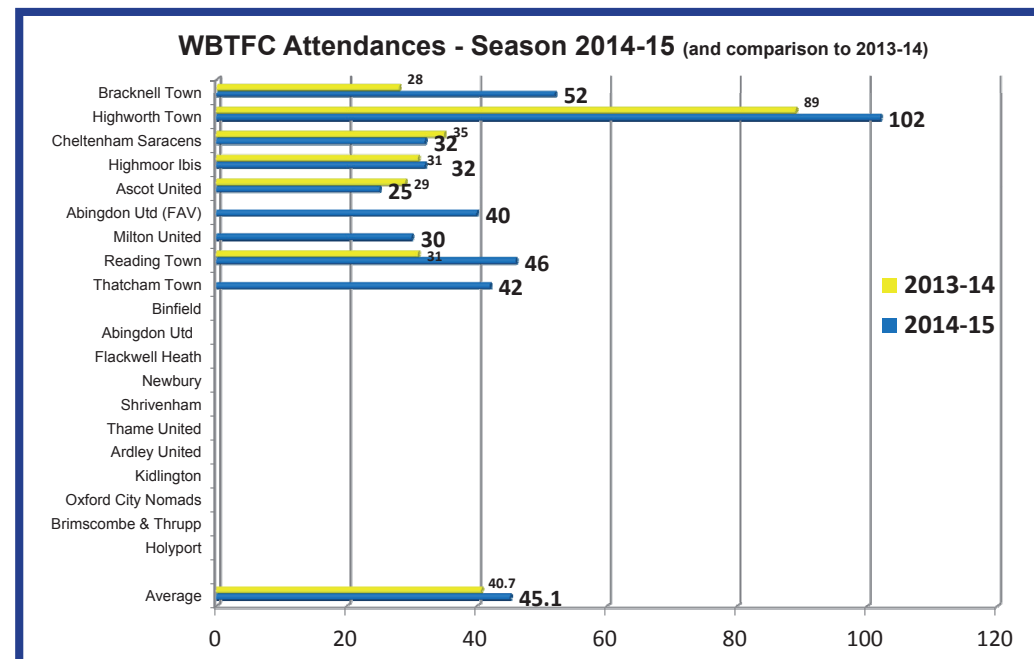
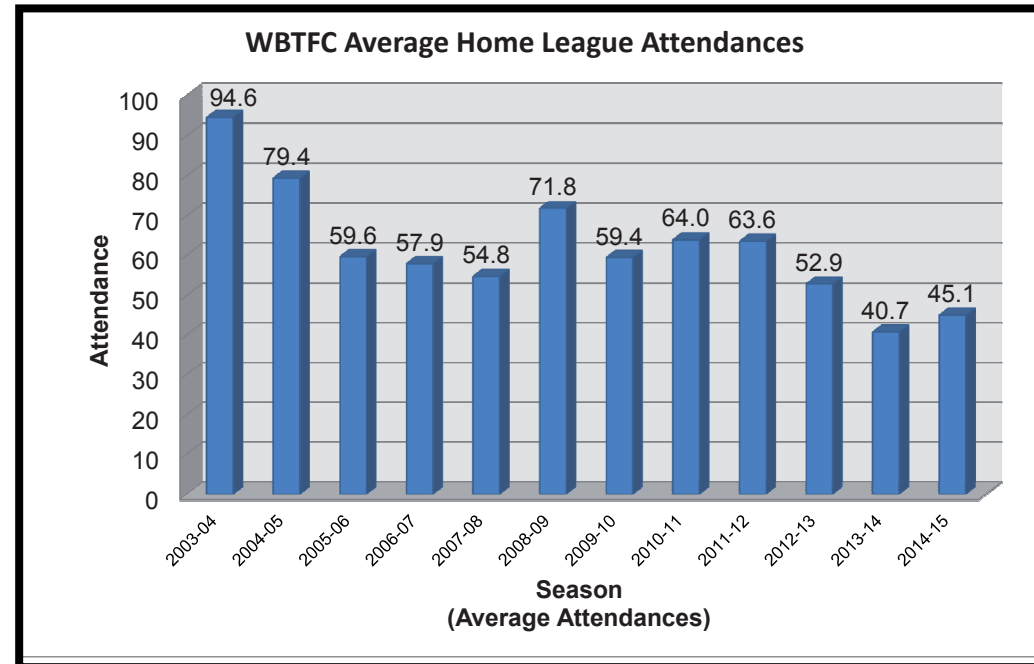

Quickfire double 'We won't be knocked for six,' says Braithwaite

Player Profile

Tyler Sheppard Midfield / Striker

A combative forward who is also adept at playing out wide, Sheppard joined Bassett – a team he represented as a youth – from Calne Town ahead of last season.

Sheppard was snapped up by Swindon Town as an under 13 in 2006 and played for the Robins for three years before his release. His professional dreams remained alive though as he joined Yeovil Town, spending two seasons with The Glovers in which he appeared 48 times for their youth team scoring ten goals. However, he was unable to secure a professional contract and joined Highworth Town in 2011. He made 23 appearances for the Worthians, ten of which came from the bench, and scored a handful of goals, including a dramatic extra time equaliser in the dying stages against Willand Rovers in the FA Vase.

December 2011 saw Sheppard transfer to Bremhill View and he scored one goal in 20 games for Jeff Roberts' team as they finished fourth. During the 2012/13 he found the back of the net six times in 37 appearances for the Lilywhites.

In his first season with Bassett, Sheppard was frustrated somewhat by injuries. He still managed to appear in 27 games, ten of those as a substitute, though, and he scored four goals. His first for the club came in a 2-1 defeat against Ardley United. He netted in consecutive games at the turn of the year, scoring in victories against Holyport (6-2) and Shrivenham (2-1), putting away an all-important equaliser in the latter, before also grabbing in a goal in a late season thrashing of Abingdon Town.

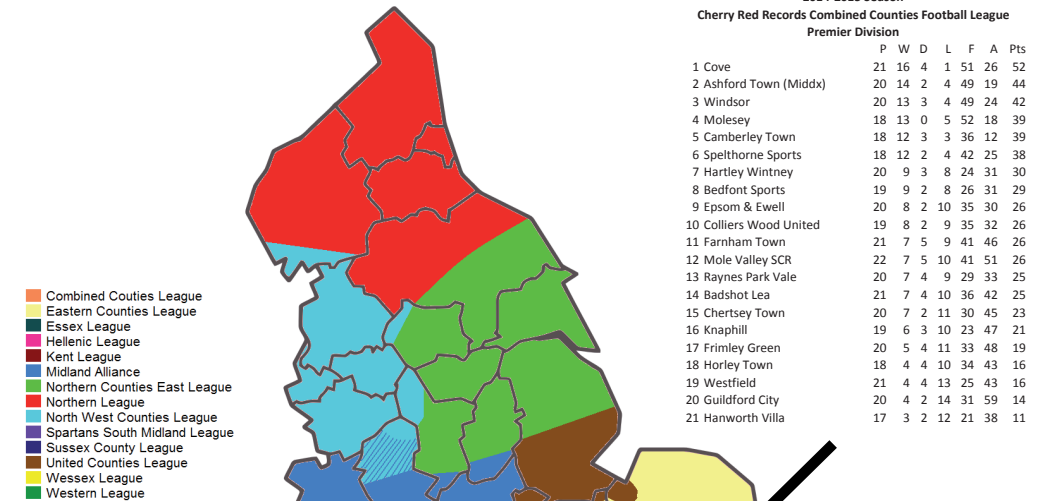
