I made the long journey from Surrey to Stroud for the game on the day after Boxing Day against Brimscombe & Thrupp with one eye on the weather. With heavy rain on the M4 I had visions of getting there only to find the game postponed. It was pleasing to see the floodlights on when we arrived and I must say I was very impressed with the facilities at Brimscombe & Thrupp having never visited the ground before. That said, as expected, the pitch was very heavy before the game started and cut-up early on and it was certainly difficult to play on. Finding ourselves one down at the break and not playing that well it was pleasing to see us come back in the second half and score 3 without reply. The conditions got markedly worse in the second half as a snow storm came in and I started worrying whether I would be able to get the car up those steep hills! Fortunately the snow did not settle and we all got away safely with the 3 points in the bag courtesy of 2 goals from Steve Robertson and a rare Dale Richards goal.

## Thame United

With no game on either Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> or Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> of January it seemed a long time ago since we had played when we met Thame, no Harry Redknapp like excuses from players being over played during the festive period will be coming from the Wootton Bassett Town management!

However, whilst Thame put 4 away, we had only a penalty from Steve Yeardley to show for our endeavours. Thame looked a useful outfit and were very hospitable guests off the pitch. They are one of a handful of clubs that have applied for promotion to the next step and they certainly have the facilities to take the step up to the Southern League.

## Reserves

Since the last programme the Reserves have had three games. On 20<sup>th</sup> December they shared six goals and the points with Highworth Town. Two more goals in this game for Danny Hale who must be knocking on the door of a First Team recall sometime soon.

They then travelled to Oxford City for a league fixture that was played on the 3G pitch, with Oxford City's First Team meeting my home town club Woking in the F.A. Trophy on the main pitch. With Oxford City going well at the top of the Reserves Division the Reserves went down 6-2, Nathan Gambling with both consolation goals for Bassett.

Last Saturday, with the First Team game postponed, we fielded what was a full strength First Team in the Reserves fixture against Clanfield. Whilst not something I would normally advocate, with so few fixtures having been scheduled in January and then losing 2 that we did have I can see why Paul requested that we do this. I just hope that there is no fall-out in terms of our Reserve Team players as a result of this. Fielding such a strong side we won 2-0 and I am sure the players will have benefitted from the run out given the 2 week winter break the league gave us at the start of January. The Reserves currently sit in 5<sup>th</sup> place in the table but are now 9 points behind 4<sup>th</sup> placed Kidlington having played 2 games more.

## New Ground

Four weeks ago the Sports Association arranged for the member clubs to have a tour of the new facility opposite Ballards Ash. It was really great to be able to go on site and inspect the development work that is going on and gain an appreciation of the size of the new facility. The site was very muddy following all of the recent rain but it was particularly pleasing to see the new First Team pitch covered in a healthy growth of grass but also looking incredibly dry compared to the rest of the site.

We were able to go inside the new Clubhouse building and see the size of the various changing rooms, bar area, physio room, function room etc. The frame and structure of the building is already in place enabling all those who were part of Saturday's tour to get a full appreciation of what the building will look like.



The Football senior dressing rooms are large with a sensible shape and with the physio room next door to the Home Team dressing room. The methodology used to construct the various rooms and the outside structure is very innovative and one could not fail to be impressed. The only slightly disappointing aspect for me was the size of the function room area. The Sports Association, in my personal view, have missed a trick by not constructing a larger area which could be used for events. For me what has been built will still mean the Youth Section having to do their presentation function in a number of sessions and the area is not really going to be large enough to hold social functions. The only way of holding, say, a summer ball would be to have a marquee attached to the building.

One very impressive aspect of the construction is the eco-friendly features which are being built into the design of the facility. This includes for example the capture and use of water and the use of solar panels to help provide some of the electricity for the building. These features will help keep running costs down as well as doing their bit for the environment. A big thank you to the Sports Association for allowing us all on site whilst the work is still in progress.



Whilst in Bassett Stuart and I took the opportunity to also look at the Development on the old pitch at Rylands Way. They certainly have not wasted time in getting those houses up. The picture below is from the Rylands Way end of the ground close to the tennis courts.



Stuart and I travelled back to Surrey that afternoon excited that it will not be long now before the new facility is ready and in use.

## Programme

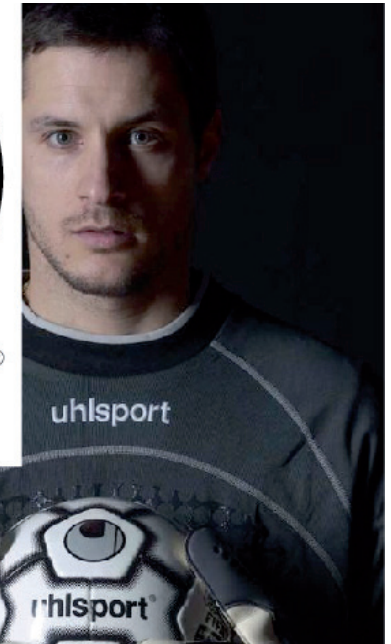

**Worthians focus on Vase clash**  
Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> February 2015

HIGHWORTH Town boss John Fisher admitted his side had one eye on next weekend's FA Vase clash with Bradford Town as they lost 1-0 away to Binfield in the Premier Division on Saturday.

With that cup game in mind, a few players were rested for the visitors and, after being reduced to 10 men in the first half, it was always going to be an uphill battle.

The goal came for the hosts after 37 minutes when defender Callum Whitty was able to turn the ball home.

Binfield had a corner that was defended by Highworth, but the ball was returned into the box and Whitty was able to get across the line of the Town back four to flick the ball in.

Things got worse for Town when Callum Parsons was sent off in the first half for a two-footed tackle on Seb Bowerman.

But Highworth re-grouped at half time, showed good spirit in the second half and could have nicked a point.

"I was a bit disappointed but I think we had our eye on next week," said Fisher, who admitted that the league is now out of their reach following the defeat.

"I could see at half time that some of the boys had their eye on next week and I would be a liar to say if I had been playing I wouldn't have been the same.

"Fair play to the lads though, they went back out second half and could have got back into it.

"Binfield are a decent side. They have got some real good players and I think they should be higher up the league than they are.

"It is disappointing but next week is the more important thing for us.

"What the actual prize is next week (they face Bradford in the last 16 of the FA Vase), to get the chance to play at Wembley is massive for any amateur footballer.

"That is our league gone now, there is no point me saying any different, we would have to win ten on the bounce really.

"We've just got to give a good account of ourselves now."

One of the players rested by Fisher ahead of next weekend's cup game was TJ Bohane.

However the forward had to be brought on in the first half, before later being substituted after picking up a yellow card for a dive in the box.

"TJ should have had a penalty in the second half. The linesman has flagged, for what we thought was a penalty, but instead it was for diving, even all their back four said it was a penalty afterwards," added Fisher.

"TJ of course got booked for diving so I had to take him off. I have never subbed a sub, but I did for the first time yesterday."

**Step 6 Restructuring**  
Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> February 2015



The question that I am asked most at present is "What is happening at Step Six (our Division One level) next season?."

The short answer is that we are in the hands of The FA as the Ground Grading requirements for Step Six are to be fully implemented. These include, amongst others, the need for floodlights and stands. This latter two areas have proved to be stumbling blocks in the South East particularly, largely due to planning and green belt issues.

This implementation with the Grade requirements are no surprise to us all as we have been presenting them at Clubs Meetings as far back as 2008. We are not expecting to hear back from The FA until mid February and at this point will need to take the action requested.

Prior to this we have a Management Sub-Committee Meeting to look this situation and review options. If any club has a view on the way forward can I ask that this is discussed with your Club Representatives this week as they will be leading the discussions.

Personally my goal is to ensure that whatever happens, the result includes the opportunity for every Hellenic club to remain within the family.

As soon as I have more I will be in touch.

## Newbury FC • Club History



Originally starting as a Sunday side, the Saturday team was formed in 2002 and entered into the Reading League Division 4, winning it in its debut season. In the next two years, the club had won successive promotions and this culminated in arriving in Division 1 of the Reading League.

With pretty much the same squad, the club then won the Division 1 title and was asked to compete in the Reading Senior league, jumping a division, and having led the league for most of the season, and going 17 games unbeaten, the club finished second in the league on the final day of the season, in an epic game at Cookham Dean in which promotion was secured and Senior football was finally returned to the town of Newbury.

The original members who first set up the Saturday side are still actively involved. After Keith Moss won groundsman of the year last year, he is chairman, manager for the first team, and groundsman this season. Lindsey, his best half, still running around after him and providing match food. Mike Skelly, who used to run the pub for the original side, is treasurer for the club

During our first season returning to senior football the club finished a credible 3rd in the league having pushed the leaders all season. The club were winners of the Hellenic League's Division 1 East in the 2011-2012 season.

Last season saw the introduction of the youth side as under 18's in the Allied Counties Youth League South Division. Not only did they win the division, but this gave birth to some amazing players with great potential. Some of these players played for the reserves in the Reading League Premier Division who were also promoted. The youth development currently continues while waiting for the under 16s.

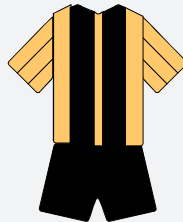

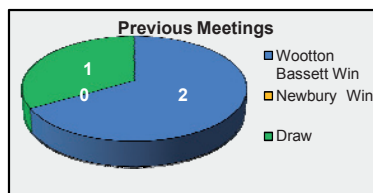
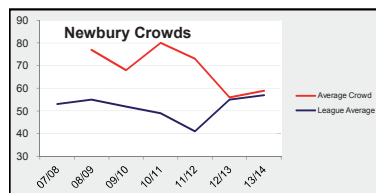

## Newbury

## Throwaway Bassett gift Newbury a point Faraday Road, 26th December 2013

It may be the season of goodwill, but after gaining a 2-0 first half advantage Wootton Bassett Town should have shown the spirit of Scrooge away at struggling Newbury. Instead though, Jeff Roberts' team gifted their hosts a point as two late goals earned the hosts a point.

Dominant for much of the game, Bassett later took their foot off the gas, with the midfield and forwards failing to press an error prone Newbury defence. That, and the home side switching to a five man midfield, helped push Bassett ever deeper as the match progressed. And the inevitable eventually happened.

With twenty minutes remaining Gary Dredge tucked away as an outstretched Steve Yeardley could not get enough on the ball to clear from Rob Clare's low cross. Then in injury time, Clare – unmarked eight yards from goal – steered a Danny Langford corner past Steve Allison to equalise.

The match, however, should have been over as a contest an hour in. While Newbury looked dangerous coming forward, they only threatened occasionally in the opening exchanges.

At the other end, meanwhile, their back four could not cope with the pace and movement of Levi Cox and Ryan Stanners. They would have 'keeper Kyle Clough to thank though for ensuring Bassett's lead was not greater than two goals.

The opening three minutes almost brought goals at both ends thanks to some stray passing. Within thirty seconds of the opening whistle, a woeful clearance fell to Jordan Roberts and he played in Fraser Joyce, but the right winger shot tamely at Clough.

Then at the other end, Dennis Sorrenti was guilty of playing across the face of goal, Langford stole possession and rounded Allison

only to see Sam Ockwell clear his shot off the line.

As the game settled down, Bassett gained the upper hand and should have been ahead on the quarter hour when Cox found himself with just Clough to beat. But rather than putting the 'keeper on his backside, the striker sought to curl a shot around him and Clough parried away.

Stanners soon showed how it should be done, racing onto a Cox flick and taking the ball around Clough with ease before easily slotting home.

It seemed easy for the visitors to get in behind the Newbury defence, with Clough often left exposed. And when Joyce raced past full back Jack Young and collected Steve Yeardley's clipped pass in the 31st minute, he won a penalty as the 'keeper barrelled into him just inside the box.

Bassett's perfect opportunity to double their advantage was squandered though, as Cox went for power over placement and allowed Clough, diving to his right, to fist away. Stanners would make it two seven minutes before the break. Cutting across the defence with an expertly timed diagonal run, he collected Dan Lardner's through ball and, with the outside of his right foot, directed the ball past an onrushing Clough and into the bottom right corner.

With such a command of the game, never should Newbury have been allowed to come close to claiming a point. Despite central midfielder Callum Willmoth's probing passing and Langford's energy up front, they did not create a chance from open play until they halved the deficit.

Up to that point, their only chances on goal had come from Bassett errors. That trend continued on 58 minutes when a Lee Stevens slip allowed Ben Wickens to let fire from range, but Allison was able to comfortably deal with his snap shot.

Moments later 'keeper Clough made another fine save to prevent Bassett going 3-0 up. A surging Jordan Roberts, which run was brought to an abrupt end on the edge of the box, earned the visitors a free kick in prime shooting range. Lardner

curled the ball up and over the wall towards the bottom left corner, but was prevented from celebrating his first Bassett goal as an outstretched glove diverted his effort away from goal.

Momentum then shifted in Newbury's favour. The tactical switch allowed them to outnumber Bassett in midfield, but their life was made easier as the visitors sat deeper and deeper. Newbury's first soon came. Wickens fed Clare, whose cross from the right evaded Yeardley and Dredge – his run not tracked – snapped up his chance with glee.

Now rattled Bassett were unable to create any further opening of note. Additionally, their now slender lead appeared increasingly vulnerable, and Allison was relieved to see a side foot volley fly over his crossbar with three minutes left after Sorrenti was caught ball watching.

In the final minute Newbury were again inches away from equalising as Shawn Foster beat Allison to the ball and headed Willmoth's corner inches over.

When they again won a corner in stoppage time, they wouldn't be denied. Clare should have been marked. But with nobody around him he was able to steer home. And with that Bassett had seen three points transform into just one. It may have taken them above Bracknell Town into fourteenth, yet the result gets them no nearer to extricating themselves away from the clutches of the Hellenic League Premier Division's lower reaches.

Bassett's unbeaten run got extended to six games too. Yet this draw felt worse than a number of defeats suffered so far this campaign, and with good reason.

**Man of the Match: Ryan Stanners** – caused significant problems for the Newbury defence and took his two goals supremely well.

**Rating: 5/10** – from the commanding position they were in, Bassett should never have allowed Newbury to get back into the game and claim a point. But a failure to finish the game off and yet more poor defending from a set piece turned what would have won been a big three points into just one.

cross. On fifty minutes, another Swatton ball led to the best chance of the game at that point, as Danny Clayton hit both the bar and post. Bassett continued to press and in the 53<sup>rd</sup> minute Gascoyne was felled in the box and a penalty awarded. The spot-kick though, was missed as Stu Lamont failed to convert with Kevin Alder saving the weak kick. Bassett were still searching for an opening and were given a scare on the hour mark when Darren Maisey put through Matty Ellis who was just beaten to the ball by oncoming 'keeper Rich Stevens. Bassett were lucky not to go down to ten men a minute later when Hyde was booked for raising his hands at an opposition player. Bassett were on the back foot at this point and were let off once again due to excellent defending by Steve Yeardley and Stevens, who pressured Nick Hughes, who placed his shot wide. Jones put Swatton through in the 69<sup>th</sup> minute but unfortunately he hit the post. The game was getting aggressive by this stage and referee Tony Sharkey was having trouble controlling the players. January Player of the Month Stevens saved Bassett again in the 71<sup>st</sup> minute by pulling off an awesome save to deny Nick Hughes a certain goal. At the other end Swatton was denied again when Alder pulled off another great save to thwart the lively striker. Substitute Gary Ashford then had an immediate impact as he headed Swatton clear of the North Leigh defence and the forward scored a superb goal following a twenty yard run and powerful shot. North Leigh threw everything but the kitchen sink at Bassett in the closing stages but were unsuccessful due to more brilliant defending.”

Victory lifted Bassett into 15<sup>th</sup>, a relatively comfortable six points clear of the drop zone, but a six game winless skid followed, beginning with a 2-0 home loss to local rivals Highworth Town. Didcot Town were run close in a 2-1 loss, but, after elimination by Calne Town in the County Cup, Bassett hit another low when they were thumped 6-0 at Yate Town. Five were then conceded without reply at Didcot, but this was something of a blessing in disguise given that it signalled elimination from the Supplementary Cup.

With concentration now firmly squared on the league, an upturn in form followed that would lift Bassett into a more comfortable position. It began with a valiant defensive display that earned a point at home to promotion chasing Yate in a goalless draw before a Dave Jones brace capped off a fine display at Bicester that saw the hosts downed by three goals to one. A single goal defeat at Highworth followed before a 2-1 home win over Bishops Cleeve avenged for the earlier season embarrassment. Tony Macek and Gascoyne were Bassett's protagonists. The latter was on target twice, alongside fellow young prospect Ben Jarrett, four days later in a vital 3-1 win at Gloucester United.

This was to be the last win of the season, but with ten games left Bassett, in 13<sup>th</sup>, were more or less secure of their Premier Division status. An emphatic 5-1 reverse at Southall brought the run to its end, before relegation-bound Wantage Town won by a single goal at Rylands Way. A point was then earned in a goalless draw at Abingdon on a day notable for the return of CJ O'Connell, who had been involved in a devastating car crash just a year and a half earlier. Following the draw, four games were lost on the spin, including back-to-back games against near neighbours Fairford Town. The season petered out with consecutive 1-1 draws,

was not accomplished, Bassett did bow out in style, winning thanks to a solitary Swatton goal four minutes in.

Disappointment was to come in the shape of a 4-2 home defeat to Hook Norton before Wantage Town were edged out by a single goal to herald a return to winning ways. This did not last though, and 2002 finished on a losing note as Shortwood narrowly outlasted Bassett to win by a single goal scored just before the hour. Still, the Gloucestershire side remained below their opponents, Yeardley's team beginning the New Year 15<sup>th</sup>, albeit with just four points separating them from fourth bottom Tuffley.

Bassett would have to wait until the middle of January to get back into action, and that showed against Wiltshire County League Cricklade Town in the opening round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup. Paul Clegg may have scored a brace in a 3-0 win, but the performance was sluggish to say the least. Another average performance followed against lesser opposition, but a Lamont goal proved enough to see off Cheltenham Saracens and book Bassett a place in the Supplementary Cup quarter finals.

The long trip to Hereford to reassume league commitments against fellow strugglers Pegasus proved fruitless. On top in the opening period, the side failed to take advantage of a number of decent openings and were made to pay as the hosts scored twice without reply after half time. Bassett responded brilliantly though to knock off North Leigh for the second time of the year at Rylands Way. Again, the game was decided by a single goal, but it could have been more had Lamont not missed a penalty. Stuart Smedley reported the following from the game:

“Bassett shrugged off the challenge of top of the table visitors North Leigh in a thrilling encounter at Rylands Way to win 1-0 thanks to a late Geoff Swatton goal and some brilliant defending. Bassett were the most dangerous of the two sides in the first few minutes with Geoff Swatton having three good opportunities. North Leigh's first chance came after twelve minutes when Nick Hughes had a shot blocked in the six yard box from a corner kick. Bassett created another good chance three minutes later when Ben Gascoyne had a shot saved by Kevin Alder after what Barry Giles described as ‘magic’ work by Nick Tooley. North Leigh picked up the pace halfway through the first half and started putting pressure on the Bassett defence. Their best chance of the half came when a Harry Burnley shot wasn't dealt with, but luckily for Bassett, it sped past the far post. Bassett were let off again on 34 minutes when North Leigh captain Gary Murphy hit wide. Bassett had two further chances before the half time whistle. On forty minutes a Dave Jones free kick dipped just over from 30 yards and a minute later Geoff Swatton hit over again following a good Justin Hyde run. Bassett were the better team in the first half and had numerous chances to take the lead – most falling to Swatton and Dave Jones but the game remained without a goal at the break.

Bassett, again, were the team who got off to the best start in the second half. Two minutes after the restart, Gascoyne had a good chance but missed following a Swatton

### What was going on in the world







The season kicked off with Pop Idol contestant Darius at the top of the charts with Colourblind and ends with Room 5 and Make Luv at number one. Come the end of the season, Arsenal lift the FA Cup by defeating Southampton in the final whilst Manchester United win the Premier League from Arsenal, with Newcastle in third place. Having narrowly survived the drop, it was with much relief that Wootton Bassett Town began their third season at Hellenic Premier League level with a victory by the odd goal in three against Gloucester United. Despite a midweek defeat at Pewsey Vale, Pete Yeardley's side's early good season form continued as much fancied Brackley Town were comfortably seen off thanks to goals from Mark Simpkins and Nick Tooley. The win was made ever more impressive given the fact 'keeper Rich Stevens was sent off just six minutes in, as a combination of forward Justin Hyde and defender Luke Sharps making cameo appearances between the sticks helped keep a clean sheet. A week later, Sharps was again forced to don the gloves as Stevens was once more sent off in a Challenge Cup match at Pewsey. However, this time he had little time to perform any heroics as Bassett were downed 3-0.

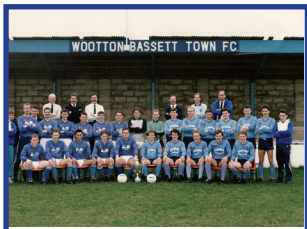
A second defeat to their Wiltshire rivals in as many weeks helped initiate a barren spell for Bassett that would see them win twice in ten contests, with just one of those victories coming in the league. After a 3-1 reverse at home to Tuffley Rovers, there followed consecutive goalless draws against Southall Town and Hook Norton. A 3-1 triumph in the Floodlit Cup over New College Academy offered some respite, but Bassett came crashing back down to earth again a week later in the FA Vase at league rivals Shortwood United. The game seemed brilliantly poised at half time after a Tooley strike cancelled out an early goal for the hosts, but the visitors completely capitulated, conceding four goals without reply to lose 5-1. The defence continued to leak goals in the next pair of games, with Abingdon United (0-4) and Didcot Town (0-2) both leaving Rylands Way with all three points. A fine come from behind win at Almondsbury Town thanks to a Paul Garbutt penalty and Stuart Lamont strike suggested the rot had been stopped, but the worst was yet to come. On a miserable afternoon just outside Cheltenham, Bassett produced a performance to match the weather as they were slaughtered 8-0 by Bishops Cleeve – a team below Bassett going into the game!

Something of a renaissance followed though, beginning with a fantastic performance to beat league leaders North Leigh by a single goal in the Floodlit Cup thanks to a stunning Dave Jones strike. Lamont and Nathan Hall then secured a valuable league point in a home draw with Pegasus Juniors before Simpkins and Ashford scored either side of half time to ensure a 2-0 home win over Bicester Town. After seeing off Division One West side Adderbury Park by a single goal in the Supplementary Cup, a 2-1 victory over Shortwood gained sweet revenge for the early season Vase defeat. All three goals came in the second half, Bassett's

# WBTFC History On One Page

## Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away. Last season Bassett were managed by Jeff Roberts. Despite assembling a skilful side on paper and paying players for the first time, the side ended the season in 14th place and with a poor discipline record. Ahead of the move into a new ground at Ballards Ash the Club again has a new manager with former Fairford Town manager Paul Braithwaite taking over the management duties.

ARE you reading this column from a ground named, I don't know, Meadow Fields? Or perhaps you are your tucking into your pre-match meal on the terraces of something along the lines of The [www.webuyanycar.com](http://www.webuyanycar.com) Arena?

We all accept sponsorship has a big part to play at any level of football, but for some supporters the selling off of the name of their beloved stadium they've been to all their lives remains an uncomfortable experience.

It's an awkward one from the press' point of view as well. We have a number of duties, we're passionate about helping clubs prosper where possible, but upsetting supporters by removing the ground name they've always known from their favourite paper? Now we've got ourselves a moral dilemma.

Let's start at the beginning. When a club builds a new stadium and they don't name it – instead opting to hand over the keys to the highest bidder – things are a lot simpler.

Arsenal's Emirates Stadium has never been questioned because it's never been known as anything else. There's a tolerance from fans that they wouldn't be sitting in their plush new seats if it wasn't for the company's cash injection. If some fans would rather still be at Highbury, of course, is another matter.

But when a club decides to suddenly change the name of their famous ground to bring some money in and the fans aren't happy, what do the press do?

You could argue that if a club is good enough to opens its doors to the media then it's only fair you adhere to their wishes. You could also suggest that if a company pays for the privilege of supporting a Non-League club, they deserve recognition by seeing their name in copy.

To counter that, the press are there to counter the team, not the club's commercial activity.

The sponsor's shirt logo is seen in our pictures, as are the advertising hoardings should the ball fall in the right place and our cameras capture the big moment. Publications aren't paid by the companies to promote their products, so if supporters are put off picking up the paper because of it – what direction do we go in?

Last week I put together a piece for our sister publication, The Football League Paper, regarding a world record attempt at Crawley Town. On their release, in the first paragraph, came the boast of the longest game of football ever played, happening at the CheckaTrade.com stadium.

I felt almost grubby writing it, knowing that fans of the 2011 Conference champions probably wouldn't thank you for it. They are the ones reading, remember. In the end, I wrote 'the Broadfield' – and, as it was for charity, mentioned the cowboy-banishing trade website later on in my article. Perhaps that's the way to go, a little bit of both.

It seems like there's no right answers to this predicament.

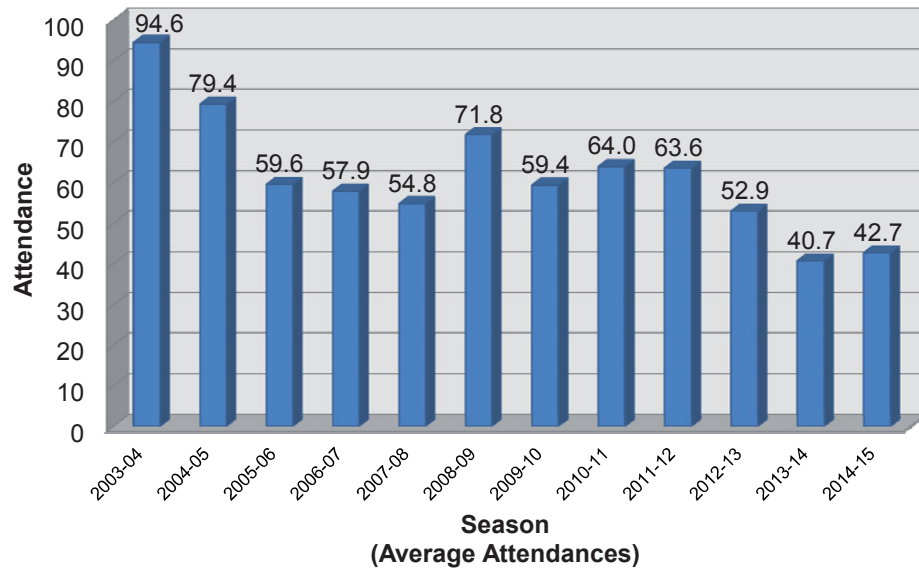

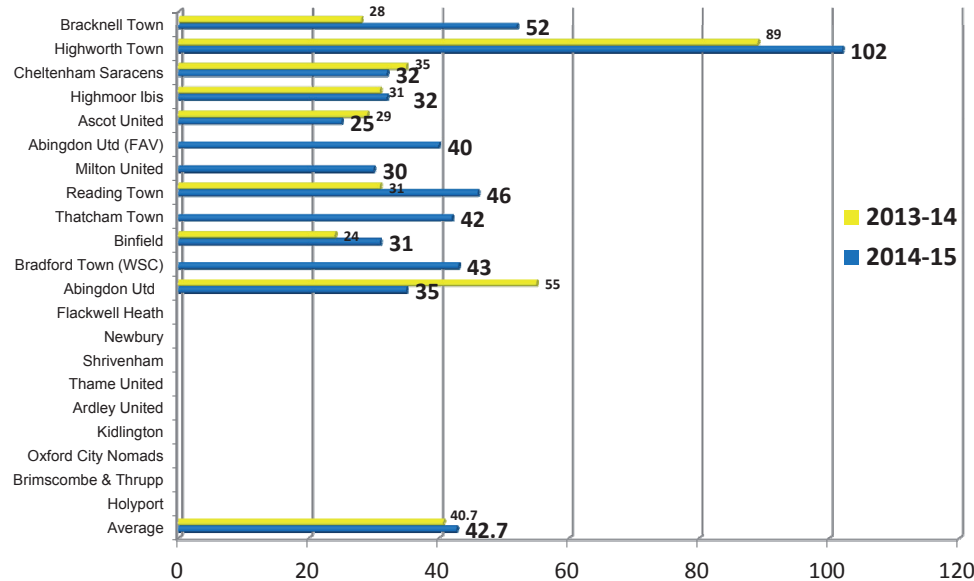

## Comeback delivers Christmas cheer

**The Meadow, 27th December 2014**  
A second half comeback from Wootton Bassett Town ensured they could end the festive season in high spirits as they defeated Brimscombe and Thrupp 3-1 to secure three vital points.

After a dismal first half performance, which saw Bassett fortunate to go into the break just a goal down, Paul Braithwaite's team eventually clawed their way back into the game through Dale Richards' first goal in senior football before a late Steve Robertson double took them on to victory.

Against a side beginning the day with four games in hand over Bassett and seven points behind, this was a contest where a result was a must to avoid getting dragged into danger.

By any means, Bassett had to get something from the game. And that they did – with particular emphasis on the first clause of that sentence.

This was traditional Christmas football fare: two teams scrapping it out in torrid conditions on a pitch whose condition deteriorated quickly into a mudbath, with little quality play.

In the opening period Bassett's play lacked any semblance of fluency with Brimscombe adjusting best to the heavy surface. While the visitors packed the centre of midfield, the hosts looked to get wide men Dave Woodfield and Ben Deakin – operating in the least impacted areas of the pitch – involved as often as possible.

This was something Bassett struggled to deal with. In just the second minute Woodfield delivered a dangerous ball from the right which a stumbling Ash Caldwell headed straight into the arms of Luke Kuczynski at the near post.

Deakin proved to be the biggest threat. Midway through the half he raced onto Jonny Davis' pass into the space behind right back Steve Yeardley before cutting back across the box. Bassett were glad that Sam Blackie sliced his shot from twelve yards, but the loose ball fell to

Woodfield on the edge of the area, who sent in a low curling effort that was deflected inches wide.

A similar move eventually led to the opener for Brimscombe after 33 minutes. Chris Greenough this time played in Deakin whose testing cross was cleared only as far as Ollie Pitt. The left back then drove forward, shrugging off the challenge of Ryan Thomas, before firing beyond Kuczynski with a 20 yard thumper.

It was an advantage the hosts deserved and they should really have extended it prior to the break.

Minutes after taking the lead, Thomas conceded possession with an errant pass which Deakin seized upon. He played a pass inside to Caldwell whose shot on the turn from the edge of the area forced Kuczynski into a low save.

A sliding Blackie then knocked wide at the far post after another dangerous Deakin delivery played across the face of goal. The whistle for the break offered Bassett a lifeline and whatever was said in the dressing room certainly seemed to have an effect.

Within two minutes of the restart a rising Richards strike flew narrowly over, before the same player sent an opportunistic strike just wide when a clearance from Steve Sparrow fell straight to the full back with an open net to aim for.

The scores should have been level on the hour. Richards fed in an overlapping Thomas whose shot from a tight angle was tipped across goal. The ball fell to Robertson yards from goal but he fluffed his opportunity, allowing Brimscombe to clear.

However, where Robertson failed Richards soon succeeded as the youngster grabbed his first senior goal. He owed a great debt to Tyler Sheppard for setting it up though.

Awarded a free kick 25 yards from goal, Sheppard spotted space in the right channel where he was rolled a pass from Dan Bailey. Driving to the byline and belatedly attracting attention from two defenders, he successfully created space to clip a cross into the heart of the area where Richards rose highest to plant a header beyond Sparrow.

Parity almost lasted less than 120 seconds with Davis driving wide from distance following patient build up play involving Caldwell and Ben Snook.

With snow driving down and the grass well and truly cut up, the game was precariously balanced and one slip was going to prove costly.

And it was a slip from Sparrow that set up Bassett's second to with eight minutes to go. Pressure from Robertson when chasing down a Nathan Gambling lofted pass forced a mix-up between the 'keeper and centre half Christien Turner that eventually led to the former tripping over his own feet when trying to retrieve the ball near the edge of the box. Gambling, who had made his way forward, gained possession and squared across the six yard box for his strike partner to apply a simple tap in.

Brimscombe had one last chance to get back on level terms with Woodfield playing in Caldwell twelve yards from goal. But the forward lost his footing briefly when turning to shoot, allowing Callum Wright time to recover and get a crucial boot on the ball that directed it centimetres outside the left post. Without that deflection, Kuczynski would have been beaten.

With that scare survived, Bassett went on to wrap things up in the final minute. It was route one stuff that led to the goal, initiated by Bailey thrashing a clearance behind the Brimscombe defence. Gambling raced onto the ball before hold up play on the edge of the area and passing across to Robertson, who squeezed a toe poke between Sparrow's legs that trickled over the line.

Ugly and as messy it may have been, the victory was the perfect present Bassett had been waiting for.

**Man of the Match: Callum Wright** – with Nathan Hawkins and George Drewitt both missing, Bassett went with a makeshift centre half pairing of Wright and James Skinner. Both did a sterling job dealing as well as they could with the difficult conditions though, with Wright – calm and sensible as ever on the ball – especially standing out.

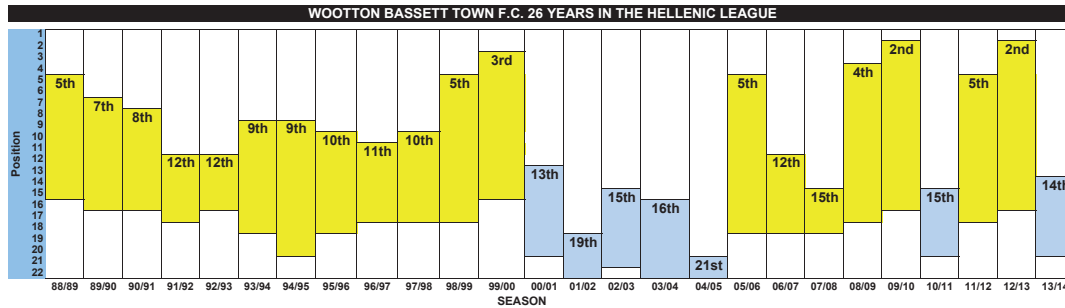

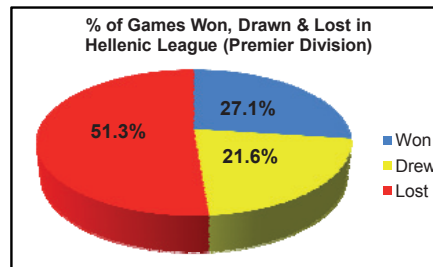
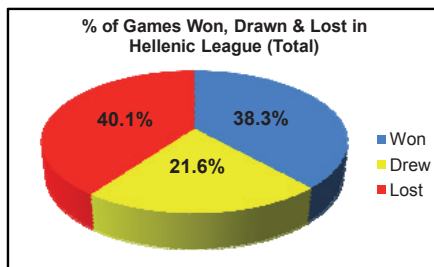
#### DIVISION ONE WEST

# Match Reports

## No Happy Returns ASM Stadium, 24<sup>th</sup> January 2015

It's around this time of year that talk about whether English football should, in line with countries on the continent, introduce a winter break surfaces. Supporters of such a proposition won't be using Wootton Bassett Town's return to action following a four week layoff as evidence to boost their case however, as they fell to a heavy 4-1 away defeat at Thame United.

Hosts Thame had enjoyed the benefit of playing two games since the turn of the year. Although they saw a 12 game league winning streak curtailed last week at Thatcham Town, there was a spring in their step and sharpness in decision making that their opponents, whose feet had been up since December 27th, were demonstrably lacking.

And that told, with Thame bursting into a three goal half time lead that they quickly extended after the game's restart.

Bassett's performance was a vapid one. Paul Braithwaite's side gifted Thame three of their goals, and while there were good enough chances created at the other end, there was not enough cutting edge to cut into the deficit they faced.

Thame got rolling in the eighth minute when a Bassett attack stalled and one long ball caught out the defence. Conor McDonagh charged forward to collect possession, shrugged off the challenge of a trailing George Drewitt and coolly dispatched beyond debutant Wes Clarke.

Ten minutes later it was two. Attempting to pass out from the back, Nathan Hawkins played a wayward pass that failed to find its intended target Dale Richards. This allowed Ben Gray to steal possession and he breezed by the left back, who took a bad angle when trying to close Gray down. The winger then continued forward before delivering a low cross which McDonagh slammed beyond Clarke with an emphatic first time finish.

In a hole, Bassett did come close to pulling at least one back as they

enjoyed a brief spell of good play midway through the period.

On 26 minutes, a clipped pass was flicked onto Nathan Gambling, retreating from what would have been an offside position, via a home head. Taking advantage of this fortuitous flick, Gambling drove towards the byline before squaring across the six yard box only to find no teammate had made a bursting run into the box.

Moments later a flowing move initiated by Henry Traas culminated in an unmarked Steve Yeardley seeing a shot on the stretch from close range foiled by home stopper Matt Tapping. Receiving the ball on the halfway line, Traas squared to right back Callum Wright who played a perfectly weighted pass in over the Thame defence for Steve Robertson to run onto. The forward fended off a tackle before delicately delivering a cross from the right into the danger area which the onrushing Yeardley almost steered in.

It didn't take long for Bassett to punish for this profligacy. Luke Ricketts crossed from deep on the left to the far post where Gray, jumping off his back foot, was able to connect with a looping header that sailed over Clarke, who had got his starting position all wrong, and make it three.

Compounding that misery, Dan Bailey passed up a great opportunity at the other end. Capitalising on a defensive slip that left Tapping stranded off his line, Bailey sought to chip into the far corner only to find his effort clip the inside of the post. There was still work to do for Tapping with the ball still having a chance of crossing the line and the keeper did his best to get Bassett on the board as he dived on the loose ball only to fumble onto the right post before finally recovering.

While the odds of salvaging something from the game were extremely long, Braithwaite took a gamble at the break by making a double substitution and shifting from a 4-5-1 to a 3-5-2 formation.

With less than two minutes of the second period gone though, the move had not paid off.

Thame's pressing forced Bassett to again concede possession deep in their own half. Making matters, two weak challenges allowed Gray to dance free on the right edge of the box, and he squared to McDonagh, who put away another composed side foot finish for his hat-trick.

Almost immediately after conceding Bassett came close as Robertson shot on the turn after received a pass from Tyler Sheppard, but saw his effort crash off the left upright.

On the hour they were spared from letting in a fifth when another underhit pass, this time from Drewitt, was seized upon by Alex Kedzierski, creating a two-on-one for the hosts. The midfielder slipped in Gray, but Clarke ensured Thame did not make it a handful, parrying a firmly shot struck around the post. Bassett did have the final say as Steve Yeardley sent Tapping the wrong way from the spot for his tenth of the season after Joe Hiscock had been bundled over in the box.

But the muted response to that late consolation was reflective of their vastly underwhelming return to action.

Well rested they may have been. Yet the lack of action over the last four weeks surely played a part in them ending up well beaten.

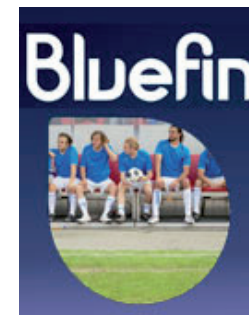

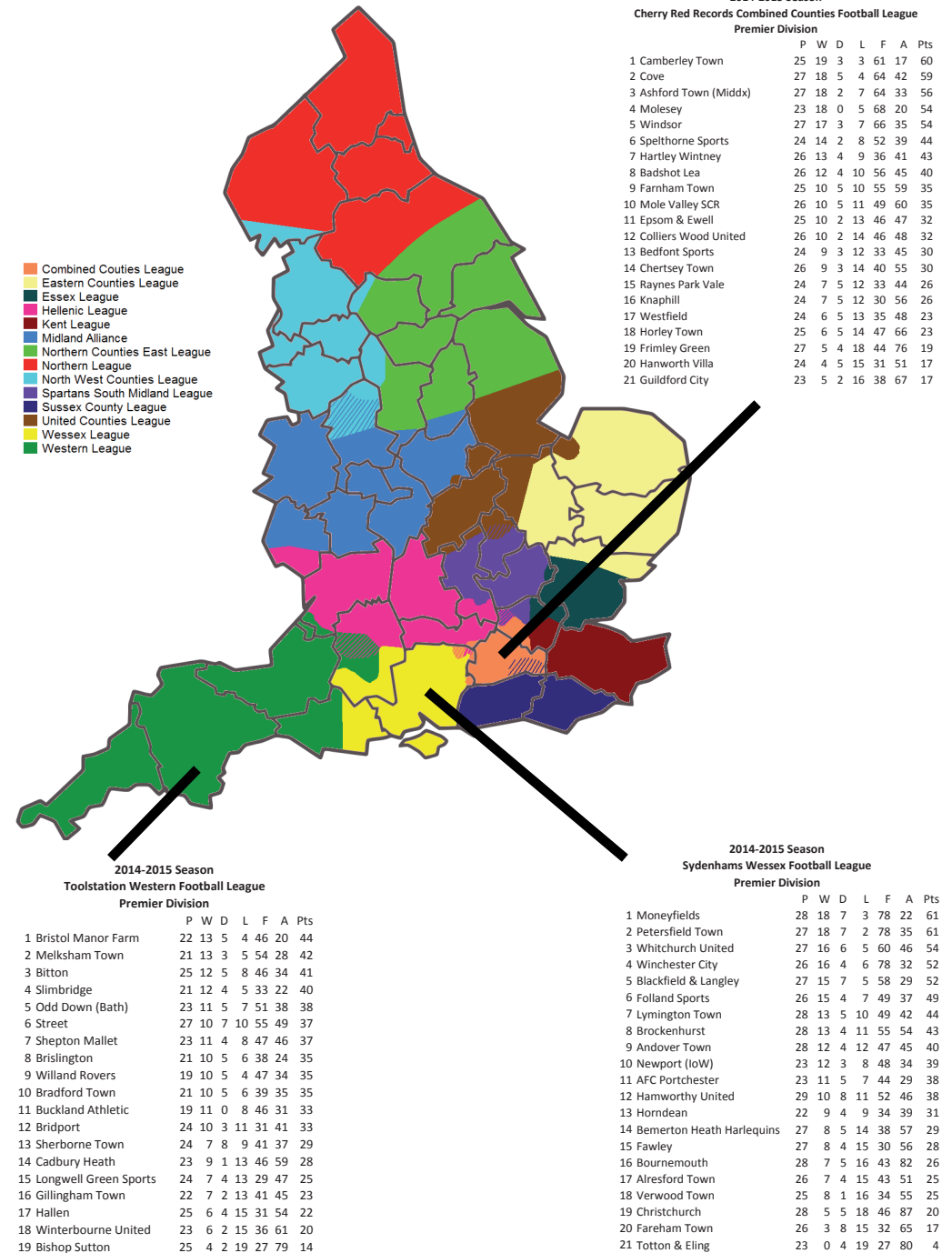
