Welcome to Shrivvenham

A warm welcome to our visitors from Shrivvenham who have made the short journey along the A419 for this UHIsport Hellenic League Premier Division clash.

When the two sides met back in September it was a very tight affair with Bassett winning the game 2-1 thanks goals from Nathan Gambling and Richie Carter. Ben Mitchell also saved a penalty as Bassett defeated a side which included a number of our former player such as Liam Edmondson, Sam Collier, Adam Corcoran, Craig Bowden, Matty Bennett and Sam Packer.

Of that squad we can only expect Craig Bowden and Adam Corcoran to be here again this evening as the others have moved on, including player manager and former Bassett star Sam Collier.

Sam Fails

Sam has had a baptism of fire in the manager's seat having the difficult task of managing the Shrivvenham side following the sad death of Dave Turner. Shrivvenham have struggled all season and currently sit second from bottom with just 3 wins in 34 league games. With just 4 league games left they cannot go any higher in the league but will be fighting Cheltenham Saracens to avoid that bottom position in the table. When you look at the squad that they had at the start of the season you really wonder why they have struggled because they had some very good players in their squad.

At the beginning of this month Sam stepped down from the manager's seat stating that he had taken the team as far as he could. It is always difficult playing as well as managing and for me that has probably been Sam's downfall. It is very hard to go in at half time and give a passionate team talk that gets everyone fired up when you have just missed a sitter.

Whilst Sam has clearly failed as a manager this time round I am sure he will have learned from the experience and come back a better manager when he next gives it a go. I suspect this will be a few years off though whilst he concentrates on playing.

I understand he has joined another of his former clubs Abingdon United for the rest of the season. I was surprised and disappointed to see this move as he would have gained a lot of respect from the local football community if he had remained as a player and seen out the rest of the season with Shrivvenham.

Longlevens (A)

It was very disappointing to lose in extra time on Saturday against a very useful Longlevens side. Longlevens were very much a footballing side, getting the ball down and playing a quick passing game. However, despite missing key players such as Steve Robertson, Dale Richards and James Skinner we were very much in the game and scored two well worked goals. The winner came following a poor defensive header but we still created two clear cut chances which would have allowed us to at least take the game into extra time so I am not going to blame the defence. The central partnership between George Drewitt and Nathan Hawkins has developed well in recent weeks and the two makeshift full-backs in Steve Yeardley and Nathan Gambling have also played well at both Reading and in the game on Saturday. It would have been nice to have kept the cup run going but if we had won it would have been a tough quarter final tie as Longlevens have been drawn at home to Ascot United. The late sending off of Tyler Sheppard and the injury to Henry Traas were big downers on Saturday, although in the case of Henry it is great to hear that nothing is broken as it looked a bad collision with the advertising boards. We will certainly miss him over the next few weeks as he has probably been our most consistent performer of late

FA Vase

Good luck to Highworth Town in their FA Vase quarter final tie on Saturday against Tadcaster. The scheduling of this game means that our league fixture against Highworth has been put back to Tuesday 17th March 2015.

FA Statement

There is no doubt that the news in the world of non-league football has been dominated in the past week by

the change of heart by the FA regarding Step 6 ground grading requirements. This had the potential to decimate leagues like the Hellenic League at the end of this season. In the end common sense has prevailed partly driven by the fact that 13 of the current Step 6 leagues have clubs that fail to meet the criteria. More time has been given to clubs to comply with the requirements outside of the need for floodlights.

No doubt the FA will be criticised by the clubs who have been busy trying to comply and spending funds on developing their facilities but as they still need to be compliant with all aspects other than floodlights by 31 March 2016 this will not be money wasted.

The good news is that long standing clubs such as Purton can stay at the Hellenic League level and in the case of the Combined Counties league the closest club to where I live, Sheerwater, can remain at Step 6.

The full statement from the FA is shown below:

To all Steps 5/6 League Secretaries

Dear Colleagues

I am writing to you further to the recent meeting of the FA Leagues Committee when the issue of clubs failing to meet the Step 6 grading requirements was discussed at length. This followed a series of meetings with some leagues and their member clubs. After giving the matter careful consideration and taking into account the adverse effect demoting clubs would have on the Step 6 level of the game it was agreed to recommend that the following would apply with immediate effect:

Clubs that fail to meet the required grading requirements as at 31 March 2015 will retain their position at Step 6 going forward.

Leagues with failed clubs must pass a resolution at their next and subsequent AGMs confirming the agreement of their member clubs to accept clubs without the appropriate grading into the constitution.

- Clubs without floodlights must achieve the other Step 6*

requirements by 31 March 2016.

- When a league achieves full membership (number to be agreed) clubs that fail to meet the required grading criteria will then become subject to relegation.
- The criteria for promotion from Step 7 to Step 6 remains as at present.
- That clubs without the appropriate Step 6 grading will not be permitted to enter FA competitions.
- That clubs without the appropriate Step 6 grading will not be permitted to gain promotion to Step 5.
- That clubs without the appropriate Step 6 grading will not be permitted to seek a lateral Step 6 movement to another competition.

Members also agreed that this situation will be monitored and be subject to review in 3 years- time (March 2018). Leagues will soon receive a written undertaking that you will be requested to sign to confirm the agreement of your league to the new Step 6 requirements.

Finally, on no account will a competition be allowed to accept any additional clubs that do not meet the appropriate criteria for Step 6.

I hope that the above is clear and that you will be able to communicate to your member clubs as quickly as possible. One final point for you to consider is that 13 of the current Step 6 leagues have clubs that fail to meet the Step 6 grading!!

Swindon Advertiser **Extra-time sickener dumps** **Bassett out** Sunday 22nd February 2015

WOOTTON Bassett Town's interest in the Hellenic League Challenge Cup was brought to an end on Saturday as Paul Braithwaite's men suffered last-gasp heartbreak at the hands of Longlevens.

Bassett and Division One West's current table-toppers couldn't be separated after 90 minutes of play at the Corinium Stadium but the Gloucester visitors stole a march into the quarter-finals with a dramatic extra-time match-winner.

Longlevens took the lead with 32 minutes on the clock but Braithwaite's men got back on level terms before the break, Tyler Sheppard finding the net after getting on the end of Hugo Vivash's fine cross.

A header from a corner saw the away side regain their lead in the tie but Bassett ensured that the tie would go to an extra half-an-hour as Steve Yeardley teed up Dan Bailey to head in his 13th goal of the season.

But the decisive goal came five minutes into the first added period, with Longlevens capitalising on a defensive lapse to net their third of the afternoon and seal the hosts' exit from the competition.

Braithwaite's side, who are 15th in the Premier Division, host local rivals Shrivenham next Wednesday evening.

Swindon Advertiser **Worthians slump to Flackwell** **defeat** Sunday 22nd February 2015

HIGHWORTH Town manager John Fisher admitted that his side had more than one eye on Saturday's big FA Vase tie as they slumped to a 4-1 defeat against high-flying Flackwell Heath yesterday.

The Worthians welcome Yorkshire outfit Tadcaster Albion, who sent a scout to the Elms on Saturday, in the quarter-finals of Vase next week.

And while Fisher said that he planned to play a full strength side against the Hellenic League Premier Division title-chasers, he knew that it would be difficult to keep whatever side he sent out focused.

"Everyone is just thinking about next weekend," Fisher said. "It is no good saying otherwise.

"No wants to get injured - I don't want anyone injured and it was a very difficult game.

"But saying that, Flackwell Heath are a very good side. I think they'll probably go on to win the title, and even if we had been fully focused, it would have been incredibly tough."

Highworth's task against Flackwell, who had striker Dan Burnell net all four of their goals whilst Ryan King grabbed the hosts' consolation, was made even more difficult by the fact that Shaun Carter was sent off for stamping midway through the first half.

"He had to go - no two ways about it," Fisher said. "When we went to Highmoor on February 9, I said to the lads to go out there and give it their all and they did.

"And they did that again on Saturday, but as I said before, everyone is thinking about the Vase game."

The Worthians boss also said that the scout from Tadcaster, who defeated Matby Main 3-2 yesterday, would have learnt very little from yesterday's performance.

"At first he tried to pretend that he wasn't from Tadcaster, but he had a thick Yorkshire accent," said Fisher.

"We got speaking and I told him that he would learn very little. He stayed for the first half and then left.

"To be honest, if we'd had them watched yesterday, I'm not sure how much we would have got from it.

"We have now got a full week to prepare - the league has kindly called off our Reading (Town) game on Tuesday night."

Swindon Advertiser **McNally happy with Shrivenham** **point** Sunday 22nd February 2015

SHRIVENHAM caretaker manager Michael McNally left Milton United a happy man as his side picked up their first point in a month.

The Barrington Park outfit, who saw player-manager Sam Collier resign in early February, claimed a goalless draw in Oxfordshire on Saturday and their temporary chief felt his side could have taken all three points.

And while feeling Shrivvy should have got the win, McNally was pleased that his side returned home with something.

"If that had been a couple of months ago, we would have lost one or 2-0," McNally said. "To be honest, we had chances to win the game three or 4-0.

"Adam Corcoran and Steve Halford hit the bar and post from free-kicks and John Rees missed two one-on-ones.

"But I'm happy we have got a point. The lads were really positive after the match."

McNally heaped praise on Corcoran and striker Dan Martin, who left Southern League outfit Swindon Supermarine at the end of last week, for how they battled throughout the 90 minutes at Milton.

"They really raised the bar," McNally said. "This was only my second game in charge but I have got the same lads in the dressing room that were here before (I took over).

"That helps - it means you can do something with them. It can be hard when you have got four or five new faces every week."

The point at Milton will give Shrivenham a boost in confidence as they prepare to face county rivals Wootton Bassett Town on Wednesday night.



McNally said that his side came through the Milton game unscathed and he has drafted in Gareth Brown from Thatcham Town to help bolster the defence.

The Shrivvy caretaker is also hoping to secure another new face ahead of the trip to the Corinium Stadium.

From The Dugout

Newbury (H)

After the game away at Thame it was important to get back to winning ways. Newbury had been strengthened by a couple of players signing from Wantage and had some improved results so we knew it would be a tough game. With them so close to us in the league it was vital that we got something out of the game and we were very pleased with the effort and commitment shown by the players.

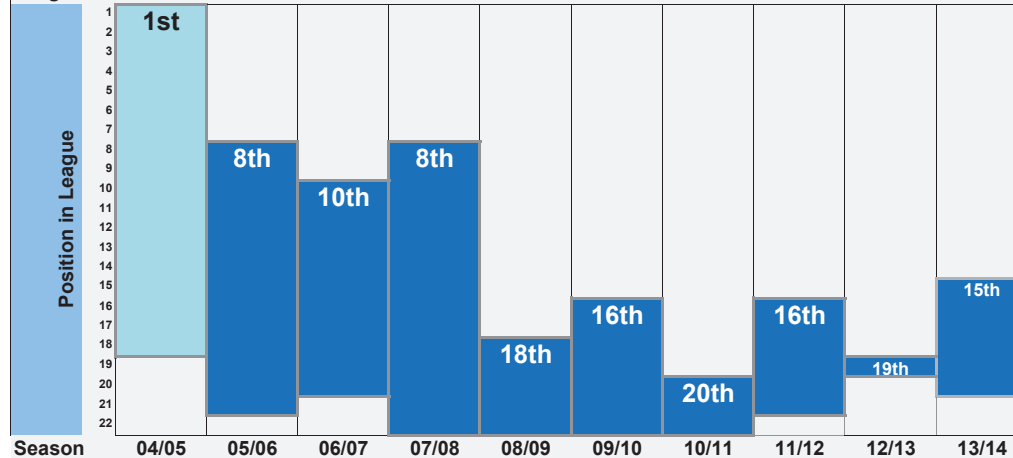

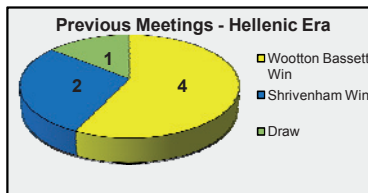
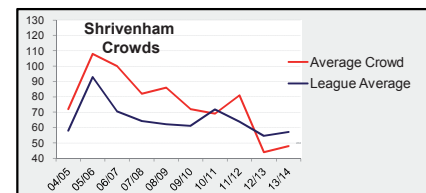

ball across after linking up with Taylor. Giles' physical presence sealed the game in the 73rd minute when he muscled his way through two Bassett defenders and struck in after latching onto a Jack ball. In the last few minutes, Highworth put defender McSherry up front and he could have done even more damage but on three occasions he failed to convert his chances. Bassett now face a big encounter at Almondsbury on Saturday followed by games against Brackley and Hook Norton and will look to gain wins at least against Almondsbury and Hook Norton to ensure safety."

True to Scoop's word, that is exactly what Bassett did. In a crunch encounter in Bristol, they came away 2-1 winners thanks to a stunning effort from Bunting and yet another goal from top scorer Swatton in a game that had it all. A 7-2 defeat to eventual champions Brackley followed – a result which helped the Northamptonshire side seal promotion to the Southern League because top spot was in the end determined by goal difference – but focus was by then firmly set on the far more winnable contest on the final day of the season. Everything was on the line going into the game, with Bassett sitting in 18th and just a point separating them from a second bottom finish. Hook Norton, though, had nothing to play for with their relegation already confirmed thanks to the ending of their ground share agreement with Southern League Banbury United, and they were duly thumped 5-1. Magani led the way with a brace and Bennett, Swatton and assistant manager Mick Byrne – scoring an absolute beauty in a rare outfield appearance – supplied the other three goals to ensure survival.

Somehow, someway, safety had been secured. The final league table for the season and results and scorers for games played are shown below.

Today sees us play our 920th game in the Hellenic Football League in what is our 27th season in the league. Of those 27 seasons we have spent 19 in Division One and this is just our 8th season in the Premier Division. The highest we have ever finished is 13th in our first season in the Premier back in 2000-01.

Cox steers Bassett to dramatic derby victory

Barrington Park, 11th January 2014

In the most dramatic fashion, Levi Cox ensured Wootton Bassett extended their unbeaten league streak to eight games with a 2-1 victory as his exquisite stoppage time flick decided the outcome of a local derby with Shrivenham that, for long periods, had hung on a knife edge.

Seconds earlier, Fraser Joyce came within inches of winning the game, but saw his low shot parried just around the post by home stopper Louie La Touche.

That appeared to have confirmed the final score as a tie. But, thinking quickly, a short corner routine between Ryan Stanners and Jordan Roberts crucially caught the Shrivenham defence off guard. After a low cross and a deft Cox flick, which the forward applied with his back to goal, Bassett had earned the points and completed the season double over their neighbours.

Former Bassett boss Dave Turner, now at the helm at Shrivenham, was left gutted. His side had started brightest and could have had more than the one goal lead they eventually took into the break.

Within the game first's minute they almost went ahead as Richie Miles had room to turn and smash a 25 yard effort towards the top corner. Awkwardly, but fortunately Steve Allison tipped over.

The Bassett 'keeper was unable to prevent Dan Drewitt finding the net with a howitzer five minutes later. Debutant Mani Randhawa's headed clearance went only as far as the midfielder, who then thrashed a thunderous strike into the top right corner from just beyond the edge of the area.

On the quarter hour mark the visitors should have been level. A Stanners ball over the top of the defence set Cox free and he was bundled over in the box following a clumsy Scott Scanlon challenge. With both Cox and Stanners having

missed from twelve yards in the past two games, Dan Lardner stepped up to take the penalty. He sent La Touche the wrong way, but found the left post with a kick that lacked conviction.

Carrying on Bassett's recent spot kick woes, it was the fourth penalty in a row that Bassett have missed. The hosts almost punished their visitors further for failing to take advantage of that opportunity. Recovering possession on the right after his corner had only been half cleared, former Bassett midfielder Matt Bown cut inside and slammed a left-footed effort across goal and narrowly wide.

Another Bown long range effort soon tested Allison, who could not hold onto the shot, the ball eventually being scrambled clear.

Disjointed in the middle of the park – playmaker Roberts was clearly suffering from a lingering injury, Bassett struggled to piece together penetrative attacks. And the best opportunities they could muster for the rest of the period were merely half chances, Stanners curling over from range and Randhawa heading over from a Tyler Sheppard corner that La Touche had come to claim and missed.

The break seemed to do Bassett some good. No longer was it Bown pulling the strings in midfield, as Lardner and Roberts became more prominent. It would be the latter who helped set up the equaliser too on 55 minutes.

Receiving a Stanners pass into feet deep in Shrivenham territory, Roberts found space and curled a low left-footer towards the bottom corner. An outstretched La Touche clawed the ball away, only to find left winger Sheppard follow up and tap in from an angle.

That goal really opened the game up as play shifted from end to end. With midfield legs tiring, that potentially left the previously untried Bassett back four exposed. But Randhawa and Sam Ockwell, his makeshift partner in central defence, expertly marshalled matters. Ockwell in particular performed superbly.

This solidity enabled Bassett to attack with more purpose, and as

the game grew ever older it was they who carved out the better chances.

After twisting and turning for what seemed an eternity, Cox eventually found room to shoot from range with just over quarter of an hour to go, but he could only sting La Touche's palms.

Minutes later Steve Yeardley picked out an unmarked Stanners with a cross. However, the forward's touch on this rare occasion let him down. With five minutes left, Roberts rose to redirect Kyle Rigley' corner back across goal. With no teammate gambling to turn it home, the Shrivenham defence were able to breathe a sigh of relief.

They initially felt they could do so again when La Touche gloved Joyce's one-on-one effort around the post, the hard working midfielder not getting the reward he deserved for the clever run inside from the left he had made to race onto Stanners' clipped through ball.

Yet Shrivenham's repeated sighs of relief soon turned into gasps of anguish, as around them Bassett's exulted celebrations feted Cox's fine winner.

Man of the Match: Fraser Joyce – made the most of another opportunity to step up from the Reserves to the first team. Joyce has always been a player you can rely on for maximum effort. And he supplied that along with a performance of much quality out on the wing.

Rating: 6/10 – winning local derbies is always a great feeling, this one even more so considering how late the winner came and that victory extends the gap between Bassett and Shrivenham to nine points. Nevertheless, Jeff Roberts' team were disjointed for long periods, squandered another penalty and were overall slightly fortunate to come away with the points.

Yeardley's side now lay second from bottom, eight points off Bicester and Shortwood – the two sides just above the relegation zone – with a single game in hand. What is more bottom side Gloucester were now a mere point behind with two games more to play! The rot was finally stopped in a tense game against Shortwood though. Bassett came from behind to win by the odd goal in three, courtesy of strikes from Swatton and recent signing Steve Bunting. More importantly, a first victory in four months loosened the nails from the relegation coffin. There were to be no miracles at title-chasing Slimbridge a few days later as the hosts prevailed by two goals but with three wins on the bounce following this game, the great escape looked on. Henley were first to be defeated with a single Swatton strike being enough for a side Bassett containing just one player over the age of 25 (defender Rob Hopkins) to return victorious. He then found the back of the net again, as did John Magani, to seal a 2-0 home win over Bicester. A huge win followed at Gloucester as goals from Matt Bennett and Mark Hammond secured a 2-1 triumph.

However, a disastrous Easter weekend sent Bassett back into troubled waters. Fairford struck four times without a single reply to emphatically send Bassett crashing back down to earth, before more misery followed at Highworth where the home side reeled off a 2-0 victory in front of a bumper crowd, as Stuart Smedley reported:

“Two goals from Adam Giles were enough for Highworth to avenge their earlier season defeat to Wootton Bassett Town as they sent their rivals back into the relegation dogfight. Coming off four wins in their last six games, Bassett's recent run of form has taken a slump over the Easter period and with only three games remaining, they need to pick up as many points as possible. Highworth had much of the early chances and on three minutes Shaun Terry found Paul Cooper whose shot went across the face of goal and wide. Matt Jack came close twice in quick succession but failed to hit the target on both occasions. An anxious Bassett fell behind in the 13th minute when Giles rose to head in after an Ian McSherry corner was headed back across the face of goal to the rising forward. Pete Macklin troubled Bassett a minute after the goal as he saw Steve Bizley off his line but could only hit wide. Giles came close again half way through the first period but he hit wide a Terry free kick on the turn. Geoff Swatton could have levelled on 21 minutes when John Magani played him through one-on-one with Elliott Jackson but the Highworth 'keeper brilliantly parried away Swatton's shot. Paul Patel was next to trouble Jackson but his long range effort was tipped away. Six minutes from the break Patel was at work at the other end when he had to clear a Ross Adams header off the line before Paul Cooper fired the rebound over. Bassett then had their best chance of the half when Swatton fired a ball across towards Matty Bennett whose powerful header was tipped onto the woodwork and cleared away by the Highworth defence.

Cooper and Terry combined three minutes into the second half and again Cooper failed to convert as he headed over a Terry cross. Minutes later Bizley presented Giles with a golden chance but the Highworth forward hit well wide. Terry was then booked after a late lunge on Andy Hallett which could have seen him being sent off. Bizley was again tested on 59 minutes when he comfortably held a Giles effort. Twelve minutes after coming on Carl Taylor set up Mark Hammond with a great chance but at full stretch, Hammond hit over from ten yards after Swatton put a great

Respite finally came with September winding down as a Swatton brace sealed an important away victory against Tuffley Rovers. The losing streak was finally over, but it was a mere taster of what was soon to come. After edging past Division One side Easington Sports in the opening round of the Challenge Cup, Bassett earned another valuable league point at home to Carterton Town. A rare goal from Neil Bridges put Bassett 2-1 ahead with just a minute to go, but an equaliser deep into stoppage time ensured the points were shared. A two goal defeat at Slimbridge followed before Sam Reason earned a point at home versus Tuffley. A convincing 3-0 away victory at Shortwood United thanks to a Bennett brace and a further strike from Swatton gave the impression that things were finally beginning to pick up once again, but another prolonged losing streak ensued.

Already sitting 18th, mid-table rivals Henley Town (0-1), Chipping Norton Town (0-3) and Pewsey Vale (0-2) as well as pacesetters Brackley Town (1-3) sent Bassett hurtling further towards the basement of the table, whilst Division One Cheltenham Saracens ensured there was to be an early exit from the Challenge Cup. With the team reeling in 19th place and Highworth Town set to visit, it seemed as though November would end miserably. However, a goal just after the break from Magani ensured triumph in a typically full-blooded derby.

However, this was to be the last time the sweet taste of victory was savoured until March – a period spanning 15 games, of which 13 were league contests, and during which a mere two points were picked up. What made things overly frustrating was the fact that these were generally not big defeats either, the majority of them seeing Bassett lose by the odd goal. After a 2-1 loss at Pegasus Juniors and a 1-1 home draw with Fairford, Bassett faced bottom side Gloucester United in what was undoubtedly a relegation six-pointer at Rylands Way just two days after Christmas. And in true festive spirit, the visitors were gifted three points, the second of their three goals on a bitter afternoon coming straight from the second half kick-off as a shocked Mick Byrne was lobbed from the halfway line.

The New Year didn't begin any better with two further narrow league defeats to Bishops Cleeve and struggling Pegasus, with a 4-1 County Cup thrashing courtesy of Pewsey sandwiched in between. An impressive point was then earned at Abingdon United in a goalless draw before four more consecutive defeats followed – all of them coming at Rylands Way. A late winner from ex-QPR and Wales forward Michael Meaker gave title-chasing Southall a win by the odd goal in three before a solitary strike just before the break was enough for Didcot to avenge for their loss earlier in the season. Bassett and Hungerford then combined for six goals in an entertaining contest, but despite a Swatton brace, the Berkshire side went home 4-2 victors. A lousy performance finished this run of home fixtures with Chipping Norton running out convincing 4-1 winners in another important contest. Two more single goal defeats followed in quick succession, the first coming at fellow strugglers Pewsey before North Leigh were given another run for their money, but this time the opponents prevailed 1-0. A 3-0 reverse at the hands of Carterton further imperilled Bassett, who by now had just ten games – seven of which were away contests - remaining and were staring relegation firmly in the face.

What was going on in the world



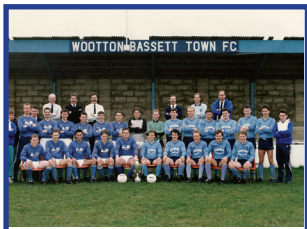
Although they started off with a single goal defeat at Hook Norton, Bassett made a huge impression in their next three fixtures, two of which came against a pair of pre-season favourites. An entertaining home opener against Almondsbury Town, who had struggled the season before, ended with Geoff Swatton's second half header separating the two sides and got Bassett off the mark as they headed into a daunting Bank Holiday weekend double header. Reigning champions North Leigh were first up – a game which few expected Bassett to get anything from, even more so given the fact no recognised 'keeper was available. A chance meeting in a local supermarket with Kenny Regan, then managing and playing the odd game in goal for County League Wootton Bassett United, helped fill the void. Yet, the expectation was still that he would have to pluck the ball from the back of the net on more than one occasion. However, that was not the case. Regan belied his age, turning in an outstanding performance - along with the rest of the team - to hold the Oxfordshire side to a goalless draw. Better was to come two days later at free-spending and free-scoring Didcot Town, who boasted goal-machine Ian Concannon (scorer of 43 league goals the season before) amongst their ranks. Regular shot stopper Darren Curtis was back between the sticks for this game, and with little under a minute gone was picking the ball from the back of the net after Concannon – surprise, surprise – put the hosts ahead. But goals from a trio of youngsters – Ben Gascoyne, John Magani, who was majestic on the day, and Matty Bennett – helped spring one of the biggest upsets of the season. The club's website carried the following report on the game:

“Ben Gascoyne, John Magani and Matt Bennett were on target as Bassett overcame Didcot 3-1 in a game Didcot were supposed to win. Magani was a potent force throughout as he played a part in all three of Bassett's goals in a tight and, at times, rough dogfight at the Loop Meadow Stadium. Bassett were one-nil down though inside the first three minutes as a short corner into the back post was played back across to the Didcot scoring machine that is Ian Concannon (118 goals in a 102 appearances for Didcot says it all) who fired home after the Bassett defence was

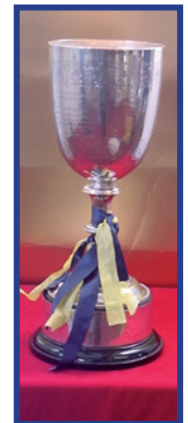

WBTFC History On One Page

Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away. Last season Bassett were managed by Jeff Roberts. Despite assembling a skilful side on paper and paying players for the first time, the side ended the season in 14th place and with a poor discipline record. Ahead of the move into a new ground at Ballards Ash the Club again has a new manager with former Fairford Town manager Paul Braithwaite taking over the management duties.

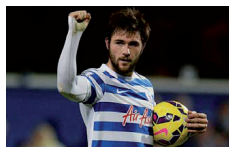
TV Money

ATTENTIONS last week turned to the announcement of the mammoth new Premier League TV deal with rights being 'snapped up' by Sky, BT Sport and the BBC.

Those at football's top table will end up using £50 notes for toilet paper the way things are going, with a whopping £5.1 billion forked out to show top-flight games from 2016-19. One Premier League match will cost you the same as over 500 Vanarama Conference clashes – just frightening figures.

Of course they throw the odd crumb down to those of us further down the food chain but it feels like grass-roots football is constantly playing the Oliver role and asking "please sir, can we have some more?"

The problem is that Premier League clubs, and the league itself, do not feel a duty of care. The rich get richer and the poor, well, continue to struggle.

I think we can all agree that the monster has got out of hand. Football will never be the same again, at the top level of the game at least.

Yes, we are seeing world class players grace our pitches, but at what expense (apart from the £5bn of course)? Will the feeble national team weaken even further?

Richard Scudamore and the Premier League bigwigs can talk as much as they like about how money has found its way down to grass-roots.

Some, of course, has. But it's not nearly enough. Facilities, on the whole, are getting worse and that should be a huge concern for all.

If we want our children to aspire to be the next Wayne Rooney instead of being intent on watching him on TV, we need to have the right facilities to help these budding footballers into the game.

I also think the government can, and should, do their bit too. It's all too easy for them to point the finger at Scudamore and co. But drastic cuts are also adding to the decline.

Premier League clubs are so far removed from their communities and that's where Non-League clubs fill the void.

I hope this latest deal leads to more fans seeking an alternative. Supporters helped make the top-flight what it is and now they're being ignored – again. Ticket prices are astronomical and a drop across the board can only be a good thing – it's about time fans tried

to wrestle some of the power back.

Non-League has long been admired because of its persistence and charm despite the lack of cash. We all know how special our grass-roots game is and we don't want it spoilt.

But some of that fortune must be re-invested. How about an increase in prize money, especially for the FA Vase? Step 5 and 6 clubs don't make much from the fantastic competition because of the amount of travel involved and that's not right.

The very bottom of our Pyramid also needs all the help it can get when it comes to facilities. This country has always prided itself on its welfare system in which we aid the needy and top-flight football now needs to do its bit for the good of everybody involved.

The Non-League game is, and will continue to be, special and we don't need a bumper new TV deal to remind us of that. It would be just nice to get some help from the rich lot up the road.

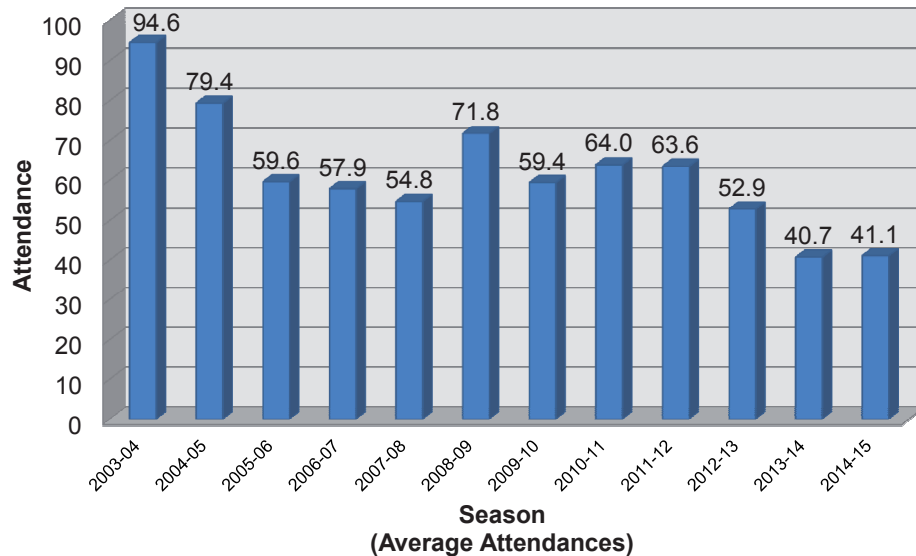

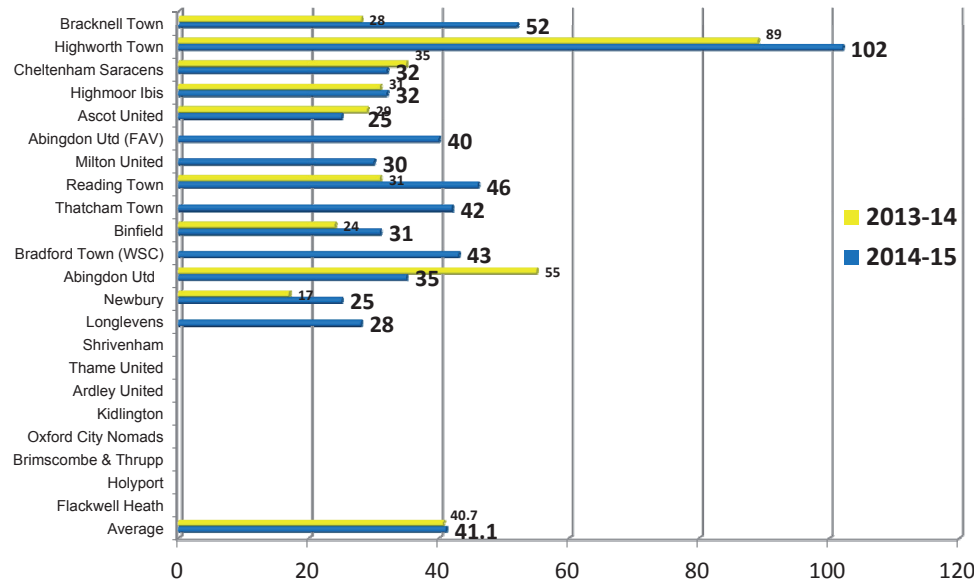

Cup exit comes at an extra cost

Corinium Stadium, 21st February 2015

For the fourth time this season Wootton Bassett Town were forced to face extra time in a cup contest. However, they were unable to make it a hat-trick of victories after an additional half hour of play, as their Bluefin Sports Challenge Cup hopes were ended by Longlevens, who prevailed by the odd goal in five.

With Wednesday's derby against Shrivenham on the horizon, Bassett would likely have preferred not to have gone the distance in this game. Yet Paul Braithwaite will no doubt be bemoaning two incidents that occurred at either end of an entertaining, albeit ultimately frustrating, contest against the Hellenic League Division One West pacesetters.

After just five minutes, Bassett lost Henry Traas to a serious ankle injury, which will sideline the talismanic midfielder for at least five weeks, when he slipped on the small strip of concrete by the Corinium Stadium's advertising boards while trying to keep a ball in play and crumpled to the ground.

Then with seconds remaining in extra time Tyler Sheppard received a straight red card for allegedly throwing an elbow in a scrum that developed when visiting 'keeper Ollie Hall failed initially to hold onto a Nathan Gambling free kick before pouncing on the loose ball in a goalmouth scramble.

With nine important league games to come, losing both for an extended period is not what the Bassett boss will have wanted.

Such is life though, and Bassett will cope, especially if those called into a shuffled starting pack perform as they did for long periods of the cup defeat. Given a rare start up front, Joe Hiscock led the line well, linking up effectively with Sheppard and running the channels well. Youngster Hugo Vivash impressed too, and it was his stunning delivery from deep on the right that set up Bassett's equalising goal, put away neatly by Sheppard, shortly before the break.

Prior to that Longlevens, playing neat football and posing a threat when coming forward, had arguably edged the game, and they eventually took the lead on the half hour mark.

Early on Luke Kavanagh fired wide on the volley, while Luke Kuczynski did well to repel strikes from Jack Overthrow and Ryan Dunn.

He was let down by Bassett cheaply giving away possession from their own throw in prior to Longlevens going in front though. The visitors quickly moved the ball forward, and Kuczynski did well to block Dunn's low drive from the edge of the area, but Brad Martin was quickest to react to the loose ball and bundled in from close range.

Bassett reacted in fine fashion with a quality goal, whose origins lay in George Drewitt's calm pass from inside his own box out to right back Steve Yeardeley. Vivash took over on the halfway line, burst forwards a few yards and picked out Sheppard on the edge of the area with a peach of a diagonal ball. The forward then outfoxed his marker, before finding the bottom corner with a low shot, aided by a slight deflection.

Longlevens' advantage was restored ten minutes into the second half as Ed Smyllie beat Kuczynski with a header at the near post from a Martin corner.

Again, however, the hosts responded with a superbly worked goal. A flowing cross-field move brought the ball to Yeardeley, making an overlapping run, on the right and he delivered an inch-perfect cross which Dan Bailey headed home.

This really opened the game up as both teams sought out a winner. For Bassett, Hiscock drilled over from an angle after a brilliant piece of skills to burst between two defenders. At the other end Craig Martin fired a sidefoot volley straight into the hands of Kuczynski before fellow substitute Dave Merrick steered Brad Martin's right wing cross over the bar from close range in the dying moments of normal time.

That failure to find a decisive fifth goal of the game meant another half hour of play was required.

Early in the opening period of extra time, Sheppard came close twice, forcing a save from Hall before finding the side netting.

It was to be a minute after that second opportunity when the game was decided. Centre half Nathan Hawkins got underneath a header from a long ball pumped forward, an error which Craig Martin seized upon as he fed an onrushing Ryan Hughes with a neat through ball into the left channel. The midfielder continued towards goal before slipping an angled left foot shot past Kuczynski and into the opposite corner.

Thereafter, Bassett's desperate search for a third equaliser ultimately proved in vain. Callum Wright curled over from the edge of the area two minutes after the interval, before Sheppard repeated that feat after having the ball set up perfectly for him by Bailey. Then with five minutes remaining Gambling planted a free header inches over from a teasing Bailey free kick.

Frustrations at having come up short soon boiled over as the final whistle approached, with the ugly confrontation that led to Sheppard receiving his marching orders.

That, combined with defeat and Traas' injury, overshadowed a promising display. The task for Bassett now is to put that behind them in Wednesday's derby.

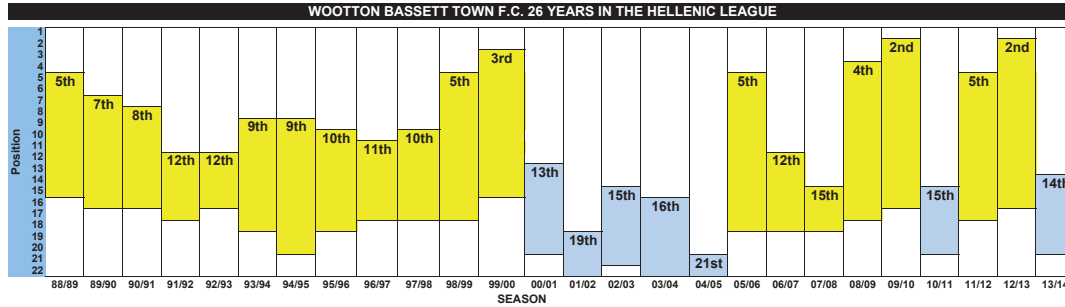

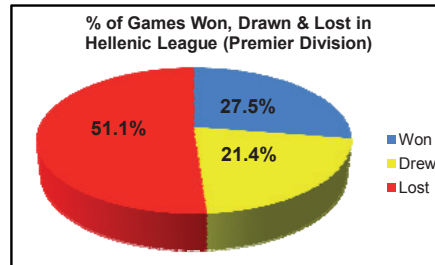
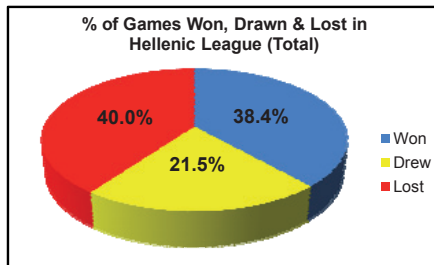

Match Reports

Robbo runs riot as Bassett roll past Reading

Scours Lane, 14th February 2015

Another week, another important 3-1 victory for Wootton Bassett Town.

Paul Braithwaite's team have now triumphed by that score against sides in three of their last five league fixtures, with those triumphs coming against sides in and around them in the bottom half of the Hellenic League Premier Division.

This time Reading Town were the victims, falling to a fine Steve Robertson hat-trick, with the in-form forward's two late goals swinging Bassett's penultimate away fixture in their favour.

While his deadly finishing may have made the vital difference on the scoresheet though, it was an all-round battling Bassett display that proved crucial.

The absence of Dale Richards and James Skinner meant there was an unfamiliar look to the visitors' back line, especially given that Nathan Gambling was utilised as a makeshift left back. But Gambling, operating in unfamiliar territory at the other end of the pitch, did superbly despite arguably having the toughest task of all against the speedy and skilful Sam Bangura.

Across the midfield Bassett worked relentlessly, although there were some hiccups when trying to overplay on a heavy pitch. Then up front Tyler Sheppard proved a menace to the Reading backline in the second half, helping force errors that proved crucial in teeing up Robertson.

'Keeper Luke Kuczynski, continuing to justify his promotion from the reserves, produced another solid performance as well. He made a handful of firm saves, starting with one in the game's twelfth minute when he diverted Bangura's low drive from a tight angle around the post after the winger had juked past Gambling and then George Drewitt.

He was soon involved in a close penalty call when Bangura went tumbling when trying to round the Bassett stopper, but correctly no

penalty was awarded. Then on the half hour mark a strong fist sent a stinging Kensley Maloney shot over the bar.

Having survived that passage of pressure from Reading, Bassett then went ahead. From the middle of the park, Henry Traas' played a lofted reverse ball forward that flat-footed home centre half Chris Fabianczyk headed on into the path of Robertson. Assuming possession with just Nathan Silver to beat, the forward made no mistake, taking one touch to steady himself before emphatically burying beyond the Reading 'keeper.

That lead lasted all of seven minutes though as the hosts made Bassett pay for their frustratingly persistent wish to turn with the ball on a chewed up surface. Sheppard was the guilty partner, being robbed of possession deep inside his own half. The ball was eventually worked to Liam Ferdinand, who rolled Drewitt on the edge of the box before arrowing a low strike beyond Kuczynski with the help of the right post.

Prior to the break Silver prevented Robertson from restoring Bassett's advantage with a near post save, and on the balance of play it was arguably fair that the teams went into the interval with nothing separating them.

Once play resumed, the midfield struggle initially continued, with the only chance before the hour falling to Reading's Danny Horscroft, who saw his long range drive batted wide by Kuczynski.

Slowly, however, Bassett gained the upper hand as Reading legs began to get weary. Playing in such conditions, tiredness was always going to be a factor at some stage and the pressure that their visitors began to assert served only to make things worse.

A surging run from Robertson down the left stretched the home defence on 63 minutes, but Callum Wright failed to capitalise, steering his shot from his teammate's cut back over with the help of a deflection.

Wright misfired again soon after as Robertson sent another low cross into the box and Hugo Vivash teed up the central midfielder.

Clever thinking from Wright then deserved better as he played a quick free kick to an unmarked Robertson, but the forward rushed his effort, skewing wide. Traas was the next Bassett player to be let down by his finishing, spooning a shot over from just inside the area after driving inside from the right wing.

Eventually a second goal did arrive.

With ten minutes left, heavy pressing inside the Reading half forced an errant square pass that Robertson jumped onto. His through ball slipped in Sheppard, who drove into the box before cutting a pass across the six yard box where Robertson slid in to score.

Robertson then almost immediately returned the favour, picking out an unmarked Sheppard in the box, but the ball got stuck in his strike partner's feet, allowing a defender to get back and deflect a shot wide.

However, no mistake was made by Robertson with just four minutes to go as he wrapped up his hat-trick. Jumping on another misplaced pass, he broke down the middle of the pitch, played a neat give-and-go with Sheppard on the edge of the area and prodded beyond Silver into the bottom left corner.

There was still time for a desperate late rally from Reading, but Kuczynski dived low to keep out a Horscroft free kick before Steve Yeardeley acrobatically diverted a blasted Chris Ferdinand effort wide.

Had either of those gone in, it still wouldn't have been enough for Reading as Bassett's spirited display had sealed the points.

After another positive stride taken on the road, it's now time for Bassett - with just one away fixture remaining - to take control of the home advantage they have for the remainder of the season.

Man of the Match: Steve Robertson - the forward's ruthlessness in front of goal brought him a deserved hat-trick, while his movement with and without the ball in the second half helped tire out an already flagging Reading defence.

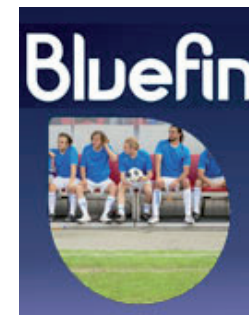

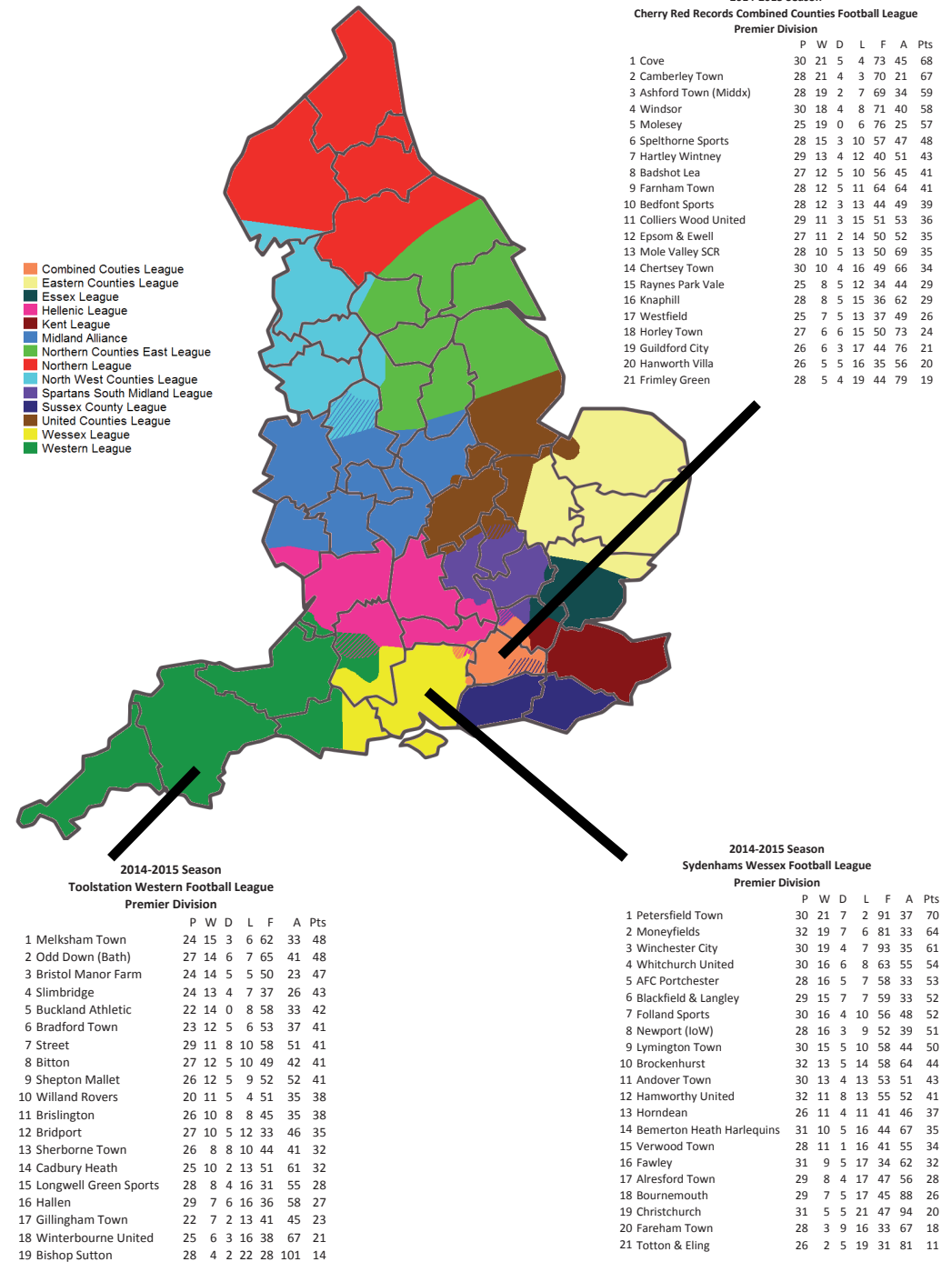
