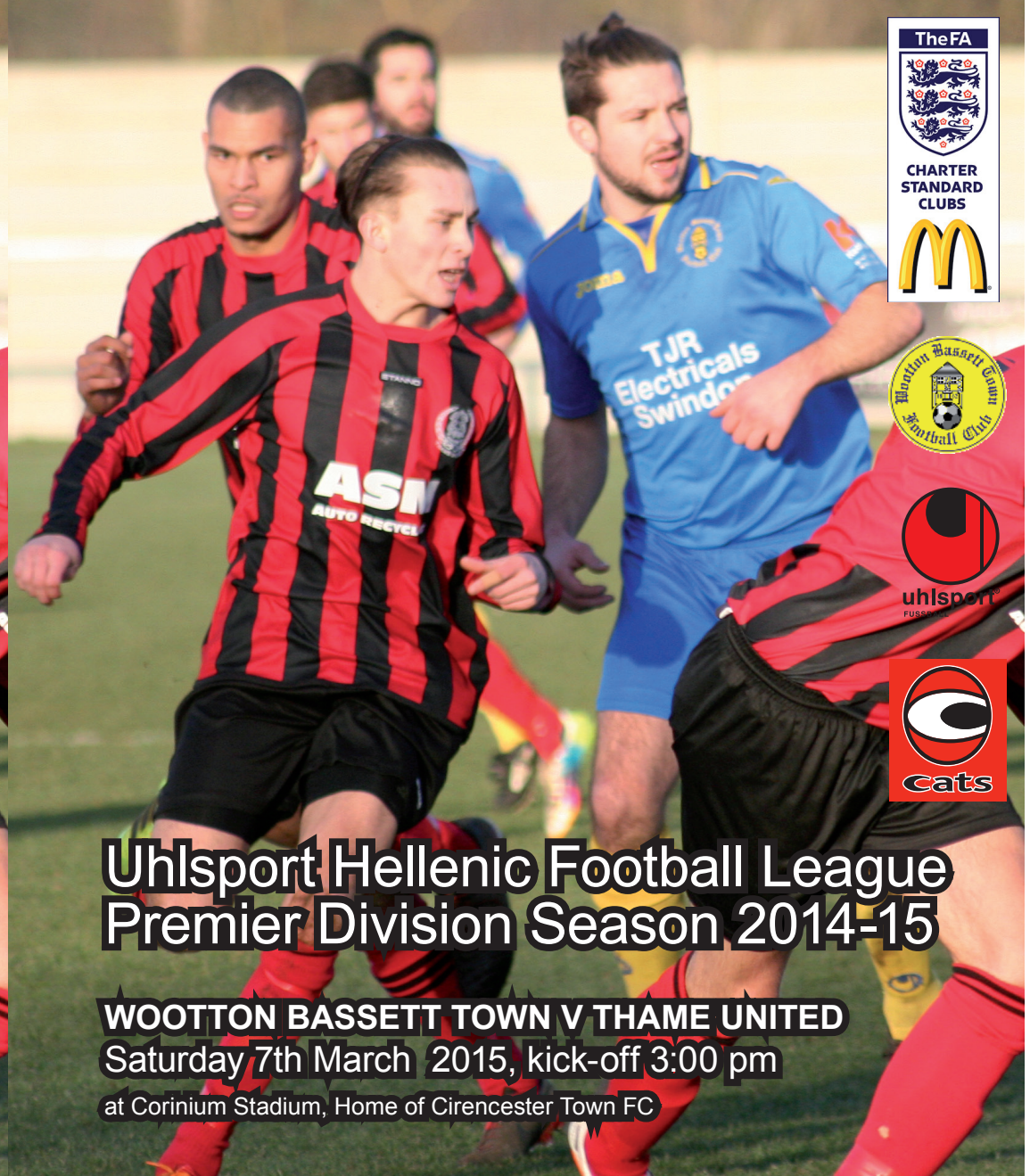

Welcome to Thame United

A warm welcome to our visitors from Thame United who have made the trip to the Corinium Stadium for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division clash.

When the two sides met back in January at Thame the game came on the back of a long break over the festive period and we put in a very poor performance going down 4-1. All we had to show from the game was a Steve Yeardeley penalty. In terms of the games I have witnessed this season it was probably the poorest from the lads and hopefully they will be looking to put that right here this afternoon.

At the time of writing these notes Thame currently sit in 4th place in the league having won 19 of their opening 29 league fixtures. With 2 draws they sit on 59 points, one above Ascot United having played the same number of games and 8 points behind Kidlington with 2 games in hand.

After Highmoor Ibis's defeat at Bracknell on Saturday the title is now Flackwell Heath's to lose. Flackwell are 7 points behind Highmoor with 7 games in hand, with Highmoor having just 4 games to play, including tough fixtures against Highworth Town and Binfield.

Going back to Thame, whilst they sit in 4th place in the table, it was interesting to see that before Saturday's win over bottom side Cheltenham Saracens they had lost 4 games in a row since they had defeated us in that first game. So Thame are hardly in a rich vein of form of late so Paul and the lads have a chance to take something out of this game. With 3 draws in 5 previous meetings I am confident that we will get at least one point here today which will be important in the battle at the bottom of the table.

Shrivenham (H)

I know everyone at the Club was disappointed to drop 2 points in our last game at home to Shrivenham but by all accounts we were lucky to get the one point with Shrivenham the better and more adventurous side on the night. This was really 2 points which would have gone a long way to securing Premier

Division football for another season and we will now need to take points off one of the leading teams to make absolute certainty of our position in the top flight ahead of crucial games with Brimscombe and Holyport in April.

Fixture Changes

Please note that the UHlsport Hellenic League have made changes to our fixtures. Instead of Ardley United we will next week entertain Kidlington with the Ardley fixture now scheduled for Tuesday 31st March 2015. Given that our normal midweek day is a Wednesday I am not sure why this one is on a Tuesday. This may yet change again so please keep your eye on any changes on the Club website.

The Reserves went down 4-2 at Brimscombe & Thrupp on Saturday and dropped a place in the league table as a result.

Braithwaite and McNally keeping calm for derby
Wednesday 25th February 2015

SHRIVENHAM caretaker manager Michael McNally is hoping to take Saturday's performance in tonight's Wiltshire derby at Wootton Bassett Town. The Barrington Park outfit claimed their first point in the Premier Division since January 24 at the weekend when they held Milton United to a goalless draw. And as McNally, who took temporary charge following Sam Collier's resignation at the start of the month, gets his side ready he believes that the team have started to improve.

"There has been a little change in attitude since I started – the lads seem more relaxed in the changing room," McNally said.

"I have had the same 13 or 14 players for the last couple of matches and at Bassett I'll have a squad of 16 or 17 to choose from.

"They are also listening to what I have to say and if they are doing that then you've won half the battle."

The caretaker manager is expected to hand defender Gareth Brown his debut after he joined the club from Thatcham Town, however, McNally's bid to bring in a new striker for this evening's derby have failed. Shrivvy go into the derby clash lying second-from-bottom 14 points adrift from safety, while Bassett are hovering two places above the drop zone with an eight-point buffer. Bassett, who will be looking to bounce back from their Bluefin Sports Challenge Cup defeat to Division One West leaders Longlevens at the weekend, will be without influential midfielder Henry Traas for a minimum of five weeks after he twisted his ankle follow a bizarre slip. Manager Paul Braithwaite added: "I have to treat it like any other game.

"I don't care who we play, whether it is Longlevens who are top of Division One or Highmoor who are top of the Prem, I just want to win.

"I know that we lost to a side that are in the division below us, but there were plenty of positives to take.

"Hugo Vivash made his full debut, he only just turned 17 a couple of weeks ago and has been with our Under 18s.

"Joey Hiscock got an important 90 minutes under his belt.

"All I want us to do is go out there and continue from where we left off in our last league game against Reading (Town) which we won 3-1.

"We have quite a good record in 2015 so far and I want that to continue."

Bassett held by Shrivvy
Wednesday 25th February 2015

SHRIVENHAM made it two draws in five days as they picked up a point away at local rivals Wootton Bassett Town. However, the result means Shrivvy, who also shared a goalless draw at Milton United at the weekend, will now definitely finish in the Premier Division's bottom two as they are 11 points adrift of Abingdon United with just three games remaining.

Shrivvy have been out of sorts all season and the writing looked on the wall as early as the sixth minute when Nathan Gambling fired Bassett in front. However, an own goal pulled the visitors back level on the half-hour mark and neither side was then able to find a winner before full-time. The point does Bassett little good either as although they have climbed above both Holyport and Milton on goal difference, boss Paul Braithwaite will no doubt view this as a missed opportunity.

I can say we got to the semi-final draw Sunday 1st March 2015

When the penultimate ties of this season's FA Vase are drawn on Monday afternoon, manager John Fisher will be brimming with pride as Highworth Town's name comes out of the hat. The Worthians may have to travel more than 180 miles for a quarter-final replay at Tadcaster Albion next Saturday following the two teams' absorbing 1-1 draw at the Elms on Saturday but Fisher has a strong sense of perspective as his club find themselves three games from a Wembley final.

"It's great for the club. We're disappointed that we've drawn but when you look at it and realised how far we've come – we're still there," said the Highworth boss.

"It's disappointing we've got to go up there (Tadcaster) but I'd rather be going up there than not be going up there.

"When you're a footballer and you play in front of big crowds, I don't think you know how many are there because you're just involved in the game but they coped with everything I

asked them to cope with and they're adapting to everything they need to."

The home section of the bumper 771 crowd at the Elms were almost silenced in the opening stages as Carl Stewart was played in one-on-one but Highworth goalie Garry Stevens pulled off a superb save. Ryan King's effort was ruled out for offside and then on the hour mark, Callum Parsons leapt into Albion goalie Tom Morgan before being bundled over, allowing TJ Bohane to fire the Worthians in front from the penalty spot.

But an apparent handball in the box as Stewart battled for space saw the visitors awarded a spot-kick of their own, which was confidently dispatched by Callum Ward to make it 1-1. Dan Drewett, Ash Taylor and Nathan Blackford all came close to snatching a winner whilst Tadcaster's Ward volleyed just over the bar and Liam Ormsby headed onto the crossbar in the dying stages of extra-time.

"I felt we had the better chances to have won it and the wind spoilt it but definitely, ours was a penalty. I'm not quite sure if theirs was a penalty," said Fisher.

"In extra-time, I thought they looked quite strong and we looked a bit tired but looking back, a draw was a fair result. "There was a great turnout with the crowd, so it's just onwards and upwards for next week now.

"I think they think it's finished and they think they're through but so did Tunbridge Wells. "Let's be fair, us having to travel all that way; they think they've done the job. But I know what our boys are like, so we've got nothing to fear."

Despite the magnitude of the occasion, Fisher also took up his usual first half position on the opposite side of the ground from the home dugout, leaving him submerged deep amongst the visiting Tadcaster fans. The Highworth chief said: "I always watch it from the side of the pitch. Normally it's not amongst the fans because I'm usually on my own and I will do it next week.

"It's just a thing I've been doing since I started as a manager because I just see something different and when we go in half-time, we have two different opinions rather than the same opinion all the time.

"I was amongst a lot of them (Tadcaster fans) and they were a very friendly lot. They didn't realise I was the manager until I told them."

Non-League Day



Non-League Day partners with The Football Association to promote 2015 FA Trophy Final

The last five years have seen Non-League Day (NLD) grow from being an event on Facebook to an annual national campaign which has grabbed the attention of clubs, leagues, the media and most importantly the fans.

As NLD has grown we've received many requests to run a second event during the season to get even more people involved. Given the huge amount of time and effort and to preserve the uniqueness of NLD, we've never really been able to entertain this idea but have thought about other ways we could do things.

New event

Our favourite alternative was to create an event where, rather than send football fans to a wide variety of grounds around the country, we would encourage them to head to just one ground, bringing as many members of the non-league community together in the same place at the same time. We just weren't quite sure how to do this.

It then came to our attention that this year's FA Trophy Final is taking place on Sunday 29th March during the spring international break. Being on the Sunday, it allows fans of virtually every team in the country - whether they follow a club in the Premier League, Football League or non-league - to take part.

We have therefore partnered with The Football Association in an initiative to try and mobilise fans in a different way and bring as many of us together at the country's national stadium for one of the non-league game's most prestigious finals.

The FA Trophy Final photo competition

To celebrate this occasion/partnership, we will be running a photo competition where snappers of all ages will be offered the chance to see their best non-league pictures published in the match day programme, displayed on the stadium's big screens and win tickets for the match itself.

To enter, simply attend a non-league match and upload your photos on to Instagram or Twitter using #myfanphoto. Closing date is 10PM on Saturday 7th March.

A panel of respected non-league photographers will judge the five best entries in each category (adults and under-18s) with the winners contacted shortly afterwards. In the weeks leading up to the game we will also be giving away further tickets via our social media channels in other competitions so there will be plenty of opportunities to take part.

Tickets for the game itself go on sale on Monday 16th February and are only £20 for adults, £10 concessions and £7.50 for U16s. These prices decrease still further if booked for a group of 15 or more.

We hope you like this idea and will think about joining us in trying to turn Wembley into the centre of the non-league football world for one afternoon on Sunday 29th March.

Opponents - History

Thame United • Club History



Thame was formed in 1883 making it one of Oxfordshires' oldest clubs. Its early years were spent in Oxfordshire Leagues and in 1906, 1909 and 1910 Thame won the Oxfordshire Senior Cup and the Senior League in 1907, 1908, 1910, 1930 and 1931. A switch to the Hellenic League then brought further success culminating in the Hellenic League title in 1961-62 and 1969-70, as well as being runners up in 1960-61, 1976-77 and 1980-81.

The Oxfordshire Senior Cup was won in both 1976 and 1981 but a poor spell in the mid eighties preceded a crossing of the pyramid in 1988-89 to join the South Midlands League. The Club finished runners up in both 1988-89 and 1989-90 before eventually winning the title in 1990-91. Thame received the green light to join the Diadora League in 1991/92. 1994-95 saw the Club win the Division 2 Championship with 93 points - an 11 point margin. In 1995/96 the Club reached the 3rd Round Qualifying in the FA Cup and the FA Trophy. In the league we finished a creditable 13th in our first ever season in the Isthmian League Division One. Andy Sinnott was appointed first team manager in June 1997 and, with a dramatically reduced operating budget, the side were relegated into Ryman Division Two. The Club bounced straight back into Ryman Division One and reached the semi-finals of the FA Vase. 1999/2000 saw the Club come within two points of achieving promotion to the Premier Division.

2000/2001 season the team lead the way for most of the season, putting together a club record of 12 consecutive league wins but a slump in form in the latter part of the season resulted in a 5th place. A mid-table finish followed in 2001/2002 season but the Oxfordshire Senior Cup was retained. Mark West was appointed player/manager when Andy left United during the Summer of 2003. In October 2003 the club reached the 4th qualifying round of the FA Cup for the first time in its history, before being beaten 1-2 by Conference side Farnborough Town. After a mid-table finish the Club moved to the newly formed Southern League, Division 1 West. In October 2004 the Club again reached the FA Cup 4th qualifying round and finished the season 11th in the league. Mark West left to join Slough and defender Tony Joyce was appointed player /manager.

By July 2005 the Club were in financial trouble and, following a visit from Bailiffs acting on behalf of HMRC, the landlord enforced a clause in the tenancy agreement and evicted the club from Windmill Road. A ground share agreement was reached with neighbours Aylesbury United and, with the side struggling at the foot of the Southern League Division 1 West, Tony Joyce resigned in December 2005, with a new joint managerial partnership of Richard Searl and Alan Thorne appointed. Relegation to the Hellenic League was confirmed later in the season. A ground share agreement was reached with AFC Wallingford for the 2006/07. Mark West returned to the Club mid-way through the season but could not save the Club from relegation to the Hellenic League Division 1 East. The 2007/08 season provided greater stability for the Club, with Mark West and new assistant, Frank Thompson, looking after first team affairs. A mid-table finish resulted, which was followed by a ninth placed finish in 2008/09. 2009/10 saw the Club win the Division 1 East title by six points and reclaim their place in the Premier Division.

The 2010/11 season was the most significant in the Club's recent history. With work on a new £3.1m ground at Meadow View Park commencing in March 2010, United returned to Thame at the ASM Stadium on 11 December 2010, just over five years after their enforced eviction from the town. Boasting eight pitches, a floodlit 3G training pitch and 8000sqft clubhouse, United now have one of the best sporting facilities in the Hellenic League. The official opening against Oxford United on 18th January 2011 set a record crowd of 1,382.

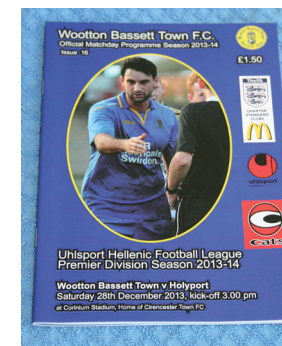
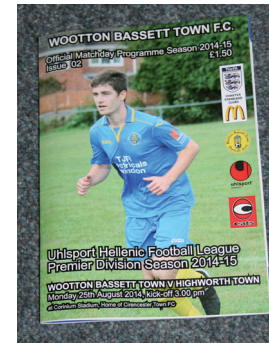

Thame United

Today sees us play our 921st game in the Hellenic Football League in what is our 27th season in the league. Of those 27 seasons we have spent 19 in Division One and this is just our 8th season in the Premier Division. The highest we have ever finished is 13th in our first season in the Premier back in 2000-01.

Our visitors Thame United are in their 38th season in the Hellenic League. Of those 35 have been in the Premier Division albeit this is in three spells. Thame first joined the Hellenic Premier Division in 1959-60 where they remained for 29 seasons. In that time they were twice winners of the league and runners-up four times. In 1988-89 they joined the South Midlands Premier League and had immediate success finishing runners-up

in consecutive seasons before going one better and winning the title in Season 1990-91. This resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League where they were to remain for 13 seasons which included a Division 2 title in 1994-95.

In Season 1998-99 they made the semi-final of the FA Vase.

In Season 2004-05 they moved across to the Southern League Western Division but struggled and were relegated back into the Hellenic Premier League. A poor season in 2006-07 saw them relegated further to Division One East. They were to remain down in the East Division for just 3 seasons and returned to the Premier Division as 2009-10 champions, losing just 3 game all season.

Wootton Bassett Town have played Thame United on just 5 occasions previously in the Hellenic League. Wootton Bassett have yet to win a game against today's opponents, there have been 3 draws and 2 victories for Thame. Details of these games are shown below.

The last meeting was in January when we put in a poor performance having not played for a number of weeks, going down 4-1 with Steve Yeardley scoring a consolation goal. Last season both games ended in draws, a 2-2 scoreline at the Corinium (Sam Collier and Jordan Roberts scoring) was followed by a 0-0 score at Thame.

No Happy Returns ASM Stadium, 24th January 2015

It's around this time of year that talk about whether English football should, in line with countries on the continent, introduce a winter break surfaces. Supporters of such a proposition won't be using Wootton Bassett Town's return to action following a four week layoff as evidence to boost their case however, as they fell to a heavy 4-1 away defeat at Thame United.

Hosts Thame had enjoyed the benefit of playing two games since the turn of the year. Although they saw a 12 game league winning streak curtailed last week at Thatcham Town, there was a spring in their step and sharpness in decision making that their opponents, whose feet had been up since December 27th, were demonstrably lacking.

And that told, with Thame bursting into a three goal half time lead that they quickly extended after the game's restart.

Bassett's performance was a vapid one. Paul Braithwaite's side gifted Thame three of their goals, and while there were good enough chances created at the other end, there was not enough cutting edge to cut into the deficit they faced.

Thame got rolling in the eighth minute when a Bassett attack stalled and one long ball caught out the defence. Conor McDonagh charged forward to collect possession, shrugged off the challenge of a trailing George Drewitt and coolly dispatched beyond debutant Wes Clarke.

Ten minutes later it was two. Attempting to pass out from the back, Nathan Hawkins played a wayward pass that failed to find its intended target Dale Richards. This allowed Ben Gray to steal possession and he breezed by the left back, who took a bad angle when trying to close Gray down. The winger then continued forward before delivering a low cross which McDonagh slammed beyond Clarke with an emphatic first time finish.

In a hole, Bassett did come close to pulling at least one back as they

enjoyed a brief spell of good play midway through the period.

On 26 minutes, a clipped pass was flicked onto Nathan Gambling, retreating from what would have been an offside position, via a home head. Taking advantage of this fortuitous flick, Gambling drove towards the byline before squaring across the six yard box only to find no teammate had made a bursting run into the box.

Moments later a flowing move initiated by Henry Traas culminated in an unmarked Steve Yeardley seeing a shot on the stretch from close range foiled by home stopper Matt Tapping. Receiving the ball on the halfway line, Traas squared to right back Callum Wright who played a perfectly weighted pass in over the Thame defence for Steve Robertson to run onto. The forward fended off a tackle before delicately delivering a cross from the right into the danger area which the onrushing Yeardley almost steered in.

It didn't take long for Bassett to punish for this profligacy. Luke Ricketts crossed from deep on the left to the far post where Gray, jumping off his back foot, was able to connect with a looping header that sailed over Clarke, who had got his starting position all wrong, and make it three.

Compounding that misery, Dan Bailey passed up a great opportunity at the other end. Capitalising on a defensive slip that left Tapping stranded off his line, Bailey sought to chip into the far corner only to find his effort clip the inside of the post. There was still work to do for Tapping with the ball still having a chance of crossing the line and the 'keeper did his best to get Bassett on the board as he dived on the loose ball only to fumble onto the right post before finally recovering.

While the odds of salvaging something from the game were extremely long, Braithwaite took a gamble at the break by making a double substitution and shifting from a 4-5-1 to a 3-5-2 formation.

With less than two minutes of the second period gone though, the move had not paid off.

Thame's pressing forced Bassett to again concede possession deep in their own half. Making matters, two weak challenges allowed Gray to dance free on the right edge of the box, and he squared to McDonagh, who put away another composed side foot finish for his hat-trick.

Almost immediately after conceding Bassett came close as Robertson shot on the turn after received a pass from Tyler Sheppard, but saw his effort crash off the left upright.

On the hour they were spared from letting in a fifth when another underhit pass, this time from Drewitt, was seized upon by Alex Kedzierski, creating a two-on-one for the hosts. The midfielder slipped in Gray, but Clarke ensured Thame did not make it a handful, parrying a firmly shot struck around the post. Bassett did have the final say as Steve Yeardley sent Tapping the wrong way from the spot for his tenth of the season after Joe Hiscock had been bundled over in the box.

But the muted response to that late consolation was reflective of their vastly underwhelming return to action.

Well rested they may have been. Yet the lack of action over the last four weeks surely played a part in them ending up well beaten.

The Town made the long journey into London to meet lowly Division One East side Rayners Lane in the Second Round of the Supplementary Cup and following an inept performance went down 2-0. This was the worst performance of the season to date and ended what had been a relatively successful run of four games without defeat. A 3-0 away defeat at Ardley followed leaving Wootton Bassett second from bottom in the table and facing a relegation battle. Goals from Matty Bennett and Steve Yeardley helped Wootton Bassett to three vital points at home against fellow strugglers Hungerford Town in a 2-1 win. However, the team could not repeat the win against other fellow strugglers Chipping Norton the following week, drawing 0-0 in a result that did neither side much good in the relegation battle. This was followed two defeats against Fairford (0-2) and Slimbridge (0-5) to intensify the relegation concerns.

Almondsbury has traditionally been a reasonably happy hunting ground for Wootton Bassett Town and, despite the struggles of Season 2004/5, this was again to prove the case. A solitary strike from Tom Messenger gave renewed hope of salvation with four home fixtures to come. The fact that just one point was secured in these four games, a 1-1 draw with Almondsbury following defeats against Bicester Town (0-1), Tuffley Rovers (1-5) and Witney (0-2) meant relegation was now almost certain. Four away games followed and again yielded just one point. A 2-0 defeat at Bishops Cleeve was followed by a 4-1 defeat at Bicester Town before a point was gained from a 1-1 draw at Pewsey, Steve Yeardley with the goal. The final away fixture saw Wootton Bassett go down 1-0 at Carterton in the game re-arranged following a floodlit failure in the first fixture, a game and set of circumstances that had seen the author charged by firstly the Hellenic League and then the FA with improper behaviour, a charge that was found not proven following a personal hearing and the case dismissed.

The season ended with a home fixture against near neighbours Highworth Town. With Wootton Bassett Town already relegated the game was only really for local pride as far as Wootton Bassett Town were concerned, however for Highworth Town the Hellenic League championship was at stake and as a result the match drew a large crowd of 226. On a day of mixed emotions Wootton Bassett Town had to suffer the pain of seeing near rivals Highworth celebrate their first ever Hellenic League Premiership title whilst knowing their place at the top table had been lost. Highworth won the match 3-0 and once they got in front the result was never in doubt. Wootton Bassett Town had finished second from bottom, one point ahead of Pewsey Vale, one point behind Bicester but a massive 13 points below the 4th from bottom side, Chipping Norton Town. Just six games had been won and strangely four of these had come away from home. Eleven games had been lost by the odd goal demonstrating that at times Wootton Bassett Town were not that far away but with just 30 goals from 42 games, by far the lowest in the division, it is clear where the problem lay.

flying Slimbridge indicated things may be improving and a win was secured in the next game, a Wiltshire County Cup fixture at Bromham. In reality the win was against a weak Wiltshire League side in a performance that left a lot to be desired and did nothing on a freezing cold day to cheer up the travelling Bassett support. The Wootton Bassett goals were scored by Andy Youngsam and coach Mick Byrne. The following week stand-in keeper Chris Mills was the star of the show in a 0-0 draw at home against Milton United. There then followed a desperate run of form as Wootton Bassett lost six games in a row against Slimbridge (2-3) in the Floodlit Cup, Highworth Town (1-4), Tuffley Rovers (1-2) in cup, Bishops Cleeve (0-1), North Leigh (0-4) and Witney United (1-2). Saturday 20th November will go down as the day that probably led to manager Pete Yeardley finally calling it a day, although it was to be a two more weeks before he made that decision. Leading 3-0 with thirty minutes to go down in Hereford thanks to goals from Geoff Swatton (2) and Dave Tyler the points were as good as in the bag. Somehow in those final thirty minutes the Town side managed to ship four goals on a cold afternoon to make that long journey back a very depressing and seem even longer than normal. On the bus back Chairman Mark Smedley and sponsor Ken Locke talked Pete into continuing but knew that one more inept performance like that would probably see one of the best managers in Wootton Bassett Town's recent history step down. A 2-2 draw with Shortwood improved morale, Matty Bennett and Geoff Swatton finding the net but a 1-0 defeat at home to Henley Town made in no win in ten games.

Saturday 4th December saw Abingdon United visit Rylands Way and leave with all three points after inflicting a painful 5-1 result. After the game manager Pete Yeardley advised the Chairman he was stepping down and coach Mick Byrne also called it a day in what was a disappointing moment for the Club. The fact that Mick is now a coach at Conference Club Forest Green Rovers demonstrates the quality Pete had brought to the club but unfortunately the team had lost the ability to win games and Pete felt a change of voice was needed in the dressing room if the Club was to avoid defeat from the Premier Division. Former First Team manager Barry Giles was put in temporary charge but there was no immediate change in fortune as the team went down 1-3 at Wantage and 1-2 at home to Carterton. A penalty win in the Supplementary Cup finally stopped the rot and was followed by a 1-1 away draw at Fairford at the turn of the year, Dave Tyler with the Wootton Bassett goal. The next side to visit Rylands were title chasing Didcot Town, who included former Swindon Town, Oxford United and West Ham United player Joey Beauchamp in their side, and left with a 5-0 win. A 2-0 away defeat at Devizes Town meant it was eighteen games since the Town had tasted victory at the end of ninety minutes. Under 18 Manager Chris Jones was appointed manager to the end of the season with Barry Giles continuing as his assistant. There was an immediate change in the team's fortunes as goals from Steve Yeardley and Matty Bennett secured a 2-1 away win at Milton United. This was followed up win a 2-1 Supplementary Cup win away at Fairford Town and then two league draws against Pegasus Juniors (1-1) and high flying North Leigh (2-2), Dave Tyler scoring in both fixtures and Mark King getting the second at North Leigh.

Season 2004-05 – Sometimes You Can't Make It On Your Own


What was going on in the world

The season kicked off with 3 of a Kind at number one in the pop charts with Baby Cakes and ended with Tony Christie/Peter Kay at the top with the re-issued Is this the Way to Amarillo. You Tube was invented by Steve Chen, Chad Hurley and Jawed Karim from a garage as a destination to watch and share original videos worldwide through the Web. In non league football, 2004-05 saw the restructuring of the pyramid and introduction of Conference North and South divisions. Arsenal and Manchester United met in the FA Cup Final and neither side managed a goal but Arsenal won on penalties. Meanwhile Chelsea were winning the Premiership, twelve points ahead of Arsenal. Liverpool won the Champions League in one of the most exciting finals of all time against AC Milan, clawing back a 3-0 half time deficit before triumphing on penalties.

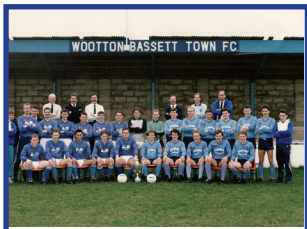
Pete Yeardley remained at the helm as the 2004-5 season kicked-off with an away visit to Abingdon United. On a hot summers day Wootton Bassett Town put up a spirited performance against a side that were to make a serious challenge for honours by the end of the season, going down by a solitary goal. Three days later the first win of the season was secured courtesy of a goal from new signing Andy Youngsam as Shortwood were sent home pointless. With this opening win optimism for a good season prevailed around Rylands Way. Next up saw Wootton Bassett Town take part in the Hellenic League's annual Ground hoppers weekend programme. This involved six games played over the Bank Holiday weekend at the end of August where kick-off times were staggered to allow "Ground hoppers" (a person who visits football grounds across the country) to attend each fixture in succession. In order to feed the large crowd anticipated the club arranged for an outside caterer to provide burgers and refreshments and additional programmes were ordered. The Club were rewarded with a large crowd of 268 for the local derby fixture against Pewsey Vale. Dave "Bonnie" Tyler scored the goal for Wootton Bassett Town in the one all draw in front of the largest crowd witnessed at Rylands Way since the pre-season friendly against Swindon Town. Large crowds were the order of the day again in the Town's next two fixtures but both games were disappointing affairs. In front of a crowd of 117, Wootton Bassett Town went down 4-1 at Hungerford Town in the league. Ben Gascoyne with the Bassett goal. Four days later the team travelled by coach down to Exmouth Town for the Club's first fixture in the FA Cup since Season 1950-51. With a large travelling support swelling the crowd to 140, the day was to end in heartbreak for Wootton Bassett as Stuart "Scoop" Smedley reported on the Club's website.

"An 89th minute goal from Neil Saunders robbed Bassett Town of a replay as Exmouth Town won their Preliminary Round tie by three goals to two. Bassett were the better team for most of the game but failed to capitalise on this as poor defending led to three silly goals and some abysmal officiating also cost them dear. After five minutes, Exmouth nearly took the lead when Richard Pears got goal side of Rich Willis but headed over from a Steve May free kick. A minute later, Bassett were ahead when Andy Youngsam played through Matty Bennett who slotted under 'keeper

WBTFC History On One Page

Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away. Last season Bassett were managed by Jeff Roberts. Despite assembling a skilful side on paper and paying players for the first time, the side ended the season in 14th place and with a poor discipline record. Ahead of the move into a new ground at Ballards Ash the Club again has a new manager with former Fairford Town manager Paul Braithwaite taking over the management duties.

Qatar World Cup

SEVEN years is a long time in football, but the 2022 FIFA World Cup almost feels like it could be this November instead of that month in seven years' time.

The ongoing discussion about when football's showpiece tournament should be held seems to be coming to an end with Qatar set to host the event in November and December.

It makes sense. Summer temperatures in Qatar can exceed 40c while those in November and December drop to around 25c, although the recent recommendation is still to be ratified. That decision should come in mid-March.

It's no surprise that the bigwigs at the Premier League and other European leagues wanted an April-May solution to minimise disruption to their domestic programmes, and we wait to see what the outcome will be.

But for those in our beloved Non-League, FIFA's decision could be a blessing in disguise.

If the Premier League, and Football League for that matter, decides to suspend competition for two months while the players are in the Middle East, then it leaves a huge hole for football fans.

We already see how much success can be gained from Non-League Day, when international fixtures dictate that there are no matches in the top two tiers of English football. Now imagine a 'Non-League Couple of Months'.

There will be no reason for the schedule to change below League Two with clubs likely to be unaffected by international players jetting off, and the two to three-hour time difference between the UK and Qatar should mean most games will be shown in the late afternoon.

So with no games on the box to watch during the day, and fans of the Premier League likely to have no ground to visit on a matchday, there's a potential for an estimated 300,000 extra through Non-League turnstiles. Just like Non-League day.

It's not all positive for those in Non-League. Attendances already tend to fall during the winter months.

It's understandable. Cold, and sometimes wet, weather are not the most pleasant of conditions to be watching football in. Especially midweek evenings.

Then there's Christmas. It's a brilliant period, some would say most wonderful time of the year, but with the rising cost of football, the beautiful game can take a backseat while festive activities take place.

So teams need to get preparations in now. Ensure these 'floater' fans attend as regularly as they can now. Come the winter of 2022, these fans will have no other games to go to.

Make sure they pick your ground as their place to be!

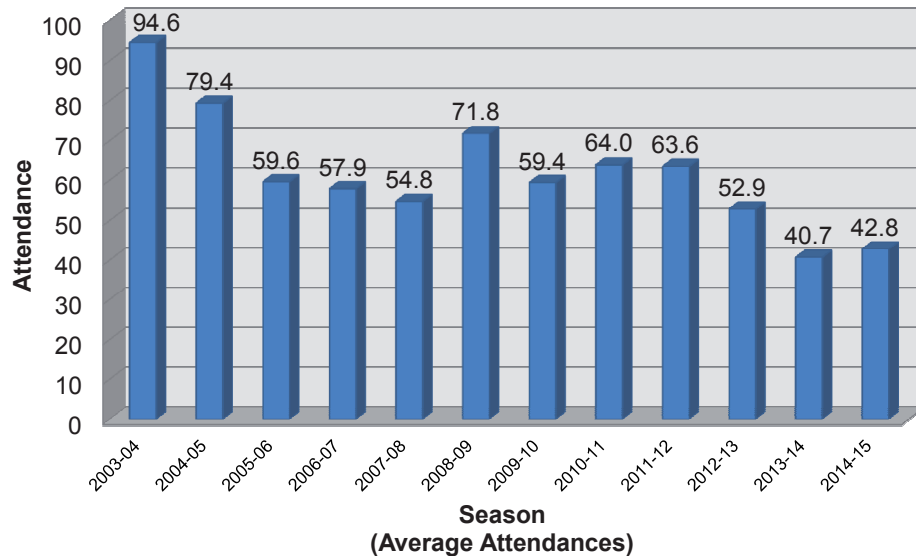

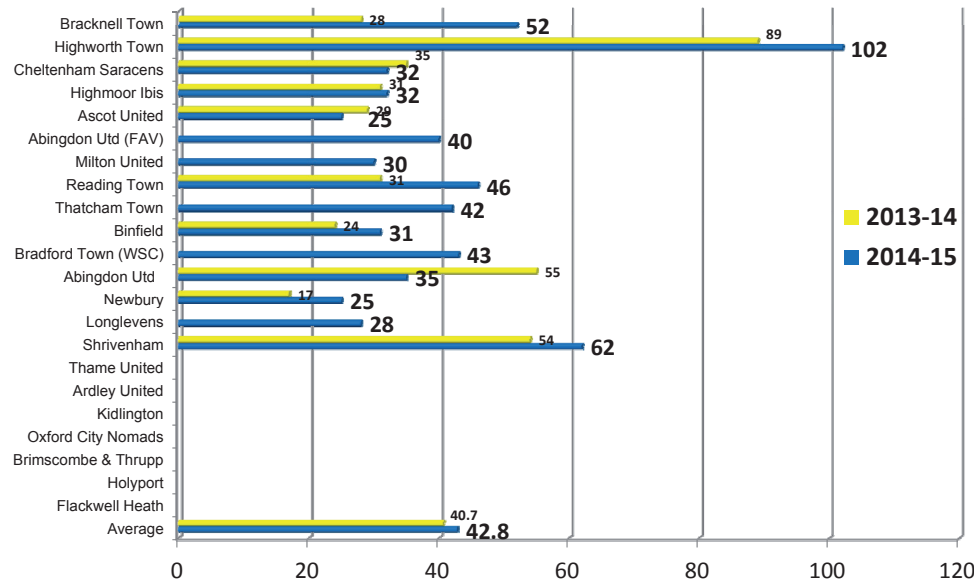

Cup exit comes at an extra cost

Corinium Stadium, 21st February 2015

For the fourth time this season Wootton Bassett Town were forced to face extra time in a cup contest. However, they were unable to make it a hat-trick of victories after an additional half hour of play, as their Bluefin Sports Challenge Cup hopes were ended by Longlevens, who prevailed by the odd goal in five.

With Wednesday's derby against Shrivenham on the horizon, Bassett would likely have preferred not to have gone the distance in this game. Yet Paul Braithwaite will no doubt be bemoaning two incidents that occurred at either end of an entertaining, albeit ultimately frustrating, contest against the Hellenic League Division One West pacesetters.

After just five minutes, Bassett lost Henry Traas to a serious ankle injury, which will sideline the talismanic midfielder for at least five weeks, when he slipped on the small strip of concrete by the Corinium Stadium's advertising boards while trying to keep a ball in play and crumpled to the ground.

Then with seconds remaining in extra time Tyler Sheppard received a straight red card for allegedly throwing an elbow in a scrum that developed when visiting 'keeper Ollie Hall failed initially to hold onto a Nathan Gambling free kick before pouncing on the loose ball in a goalmouth scramble.

With nine important league games to come, losing both for an extended period is not what the Bassett boss will have wanted.

Such is life though, and Bassett will cope, especially if those called into a shuffled starting pack perform as they did for long periods of the cup defeat. Given a rare start up front, Joe Hiscock led the line well, linking up effectively with Sheppard and running the channels well. Youngster Hugo Vivash impressed too, and it was his stunning delivery from deep on the right that set up Bassett's equalising goal, put away neatly by Sheppard, shortly before the break.

Prior to that Longlevens, playing neat football and posing a threat when coming forward, had arguably edged the game, and they eventually took the lead on the half hour mark.

Early on Luke Kavanagh fired wide on the volley, while Luke Kuczynski did well to repel strikes from Jack Overthrow and Ryan Dunn.

He was let down by Bassett cheaply giving away possession from their own throw in prior to Longlevens going in front though. The visitors quickly moved the ball forward, and Kuczynski did well to block Dunn's low drive from the edge of the area, but Brad Martin was quickest to react to the loose ball and bundled in from close range.

Bassett reacted in fine fashion with a quality goal, whose origins lay in George Drewitt's calm pass from inside his own box out to right back Steve Yeardley. Vivash took over on the halfway line, burst forwards a few yards and picked out Sheppard on the edge of the area with a peach of a diagonal ball. The forward then outfoxed his marker, before finding the bottom corner with a low shot, aided by a slight deflection.

Longlevens' advantage was restored ten minutes into the second half as Ed Smyllie beat Kuczynski with a header at the near post from a Martin corner.

Again, however, the hosts responded with a superbly worked goal. A flowing cross-field move brought the ball to Yeardley, making an overlapping run, on the right and he delivered an inch-perfect cross which Dan Bailey headed home.

This really opened the game up as both teams sought out a winner. For Bassett, Hiscock drilled over from an angle after a brilliant piece of skills to burst between two defenders. At the other end Craig Martin fired a sidefoot volley straight into the hands of Kuczynski before fellow substitute Dave Merrick steered Brad Martin's right wing cross over the bar from close range in the dying moments of normal time.

That failure to find a decisive fifth goal of the game meant another half hour of play was required.

Early in the opening period of extra time, Sheppard came close twice, forcing a save from Hall before finding the side netting.

It was to be a minute after that second opportunity when the game was decided. Centre half Nathan Hawkins got underneath a header from a long ball pumped forward, an error which Craig Martin seized upon as he fed an onrushing Ryan Hughes with a neat through ball into the left channel. The midfielder continued towards goal before slipping an angled left foot shot past Kuczynski and into the opposite corner.

Thereafter, Bassett's desperate search for a third equaliser ultimately proved in vain. Callum Wright curled over from the edge of the area two minutes after the interval, before Sheppard repeated that feat after having the ball set up perfectly for him by Bailey. Then with five minutes remaining Gambling planted a free header inches over from a teasing Bailey free kick.

Frustrations at having come up short soon boiled over as the final whistle approached, with the ugly confrontation that led to Sheppard receiving his marching orders.

That, combined with defeat and Traas' injury, overshadowed a promising display. The task for Bassett now is to put that behind them in Wednesday's derby.
