Welcome to Flackwell Heath

Welcome – and congratulations – to tonight's visitors from Buckinghamshire, for what is the final league game of the season for both teams.

Flackwell have enjoyed a remarkably successful campaign this year, which has culminated in them deservedly sealing the Hellenic League Premier Division title and, with that, promotion to the Southern League for next season.

On top of that, they made it to two cup finals, the third qualifying round of the FA Cup and the last 16 of the FA Vase.

Their league campaign has been one of sustained excellence as well. At the time of writing (before their games on Saturday and Monday against Shrivenham and Reading Town) they have lost just one game all season – in September against Binfield. Indeed, since then they have lost all but seven games in all competitions (four draws and three defeats).

Since dropping down to the Hellenic League in 2007-08, Flackwell have always been a hot tip for the title at the start of the season, yet never achieved better than two fourth place finishes. Finally though, things have clicked for them this year - and in some style.

They have, however, found the going relatively difficult when up against Bassett. The last three meetings between the teams have all ended in draws, as was the case when two sides met back in August.

That afternoon it looked as though Flackwell were on course for victory as they took a two goal lead. However, a stoppage time brace from full back Sam English saw Bassett claim a dramatic point for the second year in a row at Wilks Park.

Even with this being the last match of the season, there's plenty of incentive for Bassett to dig deep and put in another performance as a positive result will take the unbeaten run in the league into double figures.

Holyport

That is possible after the excellent 4-1 victory over Holyport ten days ago.

By all accounts it was a game affected by the swirling winds. Bassett coped better though, taking a lead just before half time through Dan Bailey after Holyport had the better of the chances during the open period.

Bailey then scored two more to complete his hat-trick on the day – and take him one shy of 20 for the season in all competitions, while Steve Robertson also netted. Our Berkshire visitors then grabbed a late consolation.

Thank you to Cirencester Town

Tonight not only marks the end of what has been a successful season, but it also signals the conclusion of our two year groundshare at Cirencester Town's Corinium Stadium.

A huge debt of gratitude is owed to the Centurions for serving as our 'tenants' during the period between the start of building on our old Rylands Way ground and the opening of the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which we will finally get to call home from next season.

The Corinium is one of the premier football facilities in the south west, whose model has helped inspire the new Sports Association site.

Although playing in Cirencester has been tiring and demanding for all involved at Bassett, having this excellent ground to play at and the assistance of those behind the scenes here has certainly made matters a lot less stressful than otherwise would have been the case.

So on behalf of all at Wootton Bassett, a huge thanks to all at Cirencester Town. We look forward to welcoming and extending our hospitality to you when you visit our new facility in the future.

Highest Ever Finish

In the programme notes for the Holyport game we were celebrating a highest ever finish of at least 12th place. Victory in that game though means that we will finish no lower 11th.

Brimscombe and Thrupp look likely to pip us for 10th, but concluding the season in 11th is still a fantastic achievement, especially considering a significant proportion of the team are playing their first full season of football at this level.

Again, well done to Paul, Chris, Ian and the players on this achievement.

There's still another record that can be obtained tonight. Currently on 51 points, a draw will match our Premier Division points haul back in 2000-01 and a victory will exceed that figure.

Development Team

The Development team began a hectic couple of weeks on Thursday when they visited Wroughton. Two goals from Lewis Petrie and one a piece for Danny Hale and Carl Shepherd in a 4-3 success gave the Development side their 3rd straight win.

Saturday they were scheduled to host Supermarine Sports, though that game did not go ahead as their opponents had been suspended by the Wiltshire FA.

They should have played yesterday evening too away at title chasing Malmesbury Victoria in a game rearranged after Luke Adams' horrific injury forced their meeting to be abandoned last month.

The Dev side still have six games to go – beginning tomorrow away at Devizes Town Reserves. Their remaining home games are against Sarum Youth on Saturday, FC Chippenham Youth on 2nd May and Trowbridge Town on Tuesday 5th May.

Please do get along to those games and give the team your support as they look to extricate themselves from the lower regions of the Wiltshire League Premier Division table with a late run.

Ladies

As with the First Team, Bassett's Ladies have enjoyed a strong end to their season, having lost just once in twelve matches since the turn of the year.

A 4-0 triumph against Forest of Dean Ladies on Easter Sunday made it six unbeaten in the league, before they defeated Swindon Town Development 1-0 in a friendly thanks to a Lisa Curtis goal.

End of season awards will be presented for the First, Reserve, Development and Ladies teams. It will be very interesting to see who picks up the First Team awards as there are plenty of candidates, all of whom can make one last case for the prizes on offer tonight.

Youth Cup Finals

There's still a couple of Bassett teams who'll be playing at the Corinium Stadium this season.

This year's North Wilts League Cup finals will take place in Cirencester, Swindon Town's likely place in the League One playoffs meaning that no suitable weekend was available for the matches to be played at the County Ground.

Our Under 12 and Under 15 Blue teams will be participants, games taking place on the weekend of the

9th and 10th May. Kick off times are as yet unknown.

The Under 12 Blues, who have finished runners-up in Division One, are taking on league champions Greenmeadow Youth. In the only league meeting between the teams so far this season, Greenmeadow won 1-0. Their second meeting was this Sunday just gone, though this programme went to print before the result of that fixture was known.

Meanwhile, the latter face Wroughton Youth, who they have split their league games against this season, each team recording a 2-0 victory.

Looking Back in Time

A look back at fixtures played in the club's history at this time of year:

2 Years Ago (23rd April 2013)

Steve Robertson scores a hat-trick – with all three goals coming in the second – as Wootton Bassett Town defeat Malmesbury Victoria 3-0 in the first team's final ever game at Rylands Way.

7 Years Ago (22nd April 2008)

Ten man Wootton Bassett Town come back from 2-1 to defeat Division One West champions Winterbourne United 3-2.

14 Years Ago (16th April 2001)

Wootton Bassett Town seal their place in the Wiltshire Senior Cup final for the second time in three seasons with a 2-1 victory after extra time against Cricklade Town. Goals come courtesy of Micky Goodwin and an own goal.

27 Years Ago (16th – 27th April 1988)

Four wins in eleven days against Oldacre (2-1), Aldbourne Park (3-0), Amesbury (2-0) and Pinehurst (7-1) take Bassett to the Wiltshire County League Division One title – and seal promotion to the Hellenic League.

50 Years Ago (26th – 28th April 1965)

Bassett score ten goals in three days as Warminster Town are thumped 7-0 and Devizes Town beaten 3-1 as the Wiltshire League Premier Division draws to a close.

107 Years Ago (20th April 1908)

A Boland hat-trick helps Wootton Bassett Town to a 6-1 home triumph against Devizes Town to conclude their Wiltshire League campaign. This would be the latest game Bassett play, let alone win, for 22 years as the club folded later that summer. They were only re-formed in 1930 as a result of the opening of the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground.

Opponents - History

Flackwell Heath • Club History

Flackwell Heath FC was founded in 1907 and the club joined the High Wycombe and District League for its inaugural season. The Heathens proved to be a major force in local football, having won twelve Wycombe League championship titles and the High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup on a record twelve occasions.

In the 1950's Flackwell joined the Great Western Combination League and won this league twice before returning to the Wycombe League.

In the 1970's they continued their success and the clubhouse was built as the first stage of their rise into senior football. The clubhouse was opened in 1974. In 1975 The Heathens won the Berks and Bucks Intermediate Cup and the Reading Senior Cup. In 1977 the club achieved Senior status and moved up into the Hellenic League Division One. Promotion to the Premier Division was achieved at the first attempt. After five seasons in this league, during which time floodlights were installed at Wilks Park, Flackwell were elected into the Athenian League. In 1984 they joined the expanding Isthmian League. The clubs first season in this competition saw them playing in Division Two (North) and against some tough opposition they finished in a respectable eighth position. The following season Flackwell was switched to Division Two (South) where life turned out to be even tougher. At the end of season 1990-91, after finishing below mid-table, The Heathens found themselves placed in the newly formed Ryman League Division Three.

In 2002/03 Flackwell reached the 4th qualifying round of the FA Cup, losing 4-1 at home against Crawley and finished third in the newly formed Ryman League Division Two the highest position achieved to date. The Youth team also won the Allied Counties League Southern Division in this year. The High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup for a record twelfth time in 2003/04, beating Prestwood 4-0 in the final at Adams Park, the home of Wycombe Wanderers. In season 2004/05 The Heathens reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup for the second time in three years, this time losing 3-0 at Ryman Premier Division Billericay Town and were runners-up in the Ryman League Associate Members Cup, losing 2-1 after extra time to Division Two champions Ilford on their own ground. The veterans team won the FA Umbro Sunday Cup, a feat which was repeated in 2006 and 2007. After winning the first final the lads went to The Bernabeu Stadium and played against Real Madrid veterans for the European Cup and lost by 3-1. Flackwell finished fourth in Ryman League Division Two in 2005/06, narrowly missing out on promotion. After the end of 2006/07 the FA reorganised the non-league pyramid and we were due to be relegated into the South Midlands Spartan League until Barking and East Ham United went out of business and we were given the opportunity to take their place in the Ryman Division One (North). Unfortunately we finished bottom of the league and were relegated into the Hellenic Premier Division for season 2007/08.

Byron Walton led the club in its first season back in the Hellenic League but following his resignation in January 2008 the team plummeted down the table but made a late recovery under the tutelage of Terry Glynn to finish in 9th position and also reach the final of the High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup where they were beaten 2-1 by Chalfont Wasps. Season 2008/09 was another one full of inconsistency and Terry Glynn resigned at the end of October 2008 and was replaced by one of our former club captains, Matt Flint. Matt brought in the experienced ex-Marlow and Slough Town midfielder James Pritchard at Christmas time in the capacity of player/assistant manager along with Graham Malcolm as head coach and James took on the role of Flackwell Heath manager when Matt resigned in 2010. In his first full season James led the club to two cup finals but both were lost on penalties, the Berks and Bucks Trophy to Newport Pagnell Town and the Reading Senior Cup to Newbury. Ex-Slough Town and Yeading striker Matt Miller joined the club as joint manager at the start of 2011/12 season and the team finished the season in 4th position.

Graham Malcolm took over as Manager midway through the 2012/13 season. He continues in this role for the forthcoming season having seen Flackwell Heath FC to 8th place in season 2013/14. He is ably supported Assistant Manager/Player, Paul Shone.

by Stoddart on his former stomping ground. Mid-table Wantage then dished out a 4-0 hammering at Rylands Way.

It took a herculean effort in the final week of the season to ensure survival. A 20-yard drive from Vaughan decided the encounter at bottom side Harrow Hill in Bassett's favour before newly installed Highworth boss John Fisher was given a shock when their visitors triumphed by the odd goal in five. On a balmy April evening, strikes from Tooley and Turner earned another vital three points. Then on the final day of the season at Gloucester United – who at that moment headed the league, a lead they would eventually blow – a Kevin Theobald header with quarter of an hour to go secured a point, meaning Yeardley's men finished 19th.

While the symptoms of second season syndrome had been present throughout the course of the campaign, thankfully relegation had been avoided.

And that would soon become a habit.

The final league table for the Hellenic Premier League is shown below along with all the results and scorers from the season:

Hellenic Premier Division 2001/02

Town really should have won by more than two goals but Bassett keeper Richard Stevens was outstanding, keeping out decent strikes from Juan Cobian and Paul McAreavey. Although they faded badly in the second half, Bassett did threaten in the early stages.

The lively Geoff Swatton thumped a shot just wide of Richard McKinney's right post in the seventh minute and Nathan Hall should have done better in the 23rd minute, scuffing a poor effort wide. But the visitors went desperately close to snatching a shock lead on 27 minutes when Richard Merchant sent a half volley whistling inches over the crossbar from the edge of the box.

Town player-coach Neil Ruddock then tried a cheeky shot from the halfway line after a poor Bassett clearance. Ruddock said: "The keeper's teased me into having a go. But seriously he was brilliant, making some great saves."

But Town finally made the breakthrough on 36 minutes when Nathan Edwards slid home Juan Cobian's cross. The lead was doubled four minutes before the interval when Paul Reed's clever chip was headed home by skipper for the night, Bertie Brayley.

Paul Edwards caused havoc down the left flank and crashed a second half shot against the crossbar before being substituted.

Bassett manager Pete Yeardley said: "Our lads battled hard throughout. Our game plan was to close them down, frustrate them and try and hit them on the break. We had a couple of early chances we should have done better with but in the second half we were just chasing shadows. Swindon passed the ball around very well."

When back in league action, the losses continued to mount up, March finishing with poor performances away to Didcot (0-3) and at home against mid-table Shortwood (0-1). However, there was a glimmer of hope when talisman Vaughan scored an unstoppable volley to decide Bassett's visit to Bicester.

Still, Yeardley's team had plenty of work to do in what was to be a hectic final month of the season. Eight games remained and it really was do-or-die, Bassett having slid into the bottom five, with two points separating them from 20th place Bicester. Goals either side of half time from Hall and Ricky Theobald helped Bassett on their way to a narrow 2-1 home win against Pegasus. Three disappointing defeats followed though, beginning with a 4-0 thumping at the hands of Southall on what was a night to forget. On the way to west London, the team minibus broke down, meaning they arrived late and had to changed in the vehicle's claustrophobic confines; they may as well not have bothered given the punishment they were then to receive! The team fared better at Abingdon where the spoils were shared following a goalless draw, but in the next contest, Fairford comfortably triumphed 2-0. Rubbing salt into the wounds that afternoon was the fact both of the Gloucestershire side's goals were bagged

Hunts Copse supremo John Murphy clearly wants to focus on the club's quest for Dr Martens safety and blooded academy and fringe players such as Richard Knox and Liam Thompson. But Marine still had seven regulars in the starting line-up, so Bassett can be rightly proud of their performance."

Four days later, it was a case of after the Lord Mayor's show when Almondsbury picked up all three points comfortably, defeating Bassett 2-0. December's performances continued to deteriorate as both Fairford (2-0) and North Leigh (6-0) showed no sympathy, leaving Yeardeley and his team lingering dangerously in 16th position going into the New Year. Whereas previously they had been just six points off a place in the top half, the distance had by now doubled.

January began on a similarly negative note with a 2-0 defeat at home against Yate in a game which saw Hall and Luke Sharps sent off and Yeardeley ordered from the dugout. With suspensions therefore piling up, the manager could ill afford to lose any more players, but that is exactly what happened when Newton made the switch to join ex-Bassett teammate Lee Stoddart at Fairford. In fairness to the winger, staying with his hometown club would not have helped further his burgeoning career, but still, losing such a gifted player was a bitter pill to swallow.

Without him though, Bassett began to regain some of their lost form. Steve Howse's 90th minute header earned a point against Bishops Cleeve, though it could well have been all three had Hall had not missed an earlier penalty. Maximum points were then taken from the only two games played in February. Against Cirencester Academy, Vaughan scored the only two goals of the game before getting sent off, and Cheltenham Saracens were defeated by the odd goal in three courtesy of a last minute Simpkins free kick. Those results helped lift Bassett eight points above the relegation zone. Yet that cushion would soon deteriorate.

Debutant Nick Tooley found the back of the net to grab a hard earned point at Henley before consecutive home defeats against Southall Town (0-2) and Carterton (0-3) and a convincing loss away to Brackley (1-3). It wasn't exactly the greatest preparation for the Premier Shield last four contest with Swindon Town. The competition was generally used for blooding the then Division Two side's youngsters. But for this tie, former Liverpool star Neil Ruddock was given a run out as part of his recuperation from an injury. Bassett performed admirably and only narrowly missed out on a matchup with Chippenham Town in the final, with 'keeper Rich Stevens in particular in fine form, as the Wednesday 21st March 2001 edition of the Evening Advertiser noted in its report of the game:

"Andy King will come face to face with Tommy Saunders after Town's 2-0 win over Wootton Bassett booked a Wiltshire Shield final date with high-flying Chippenham. First half goals from Nathan Edwards and Bertie Brayley were enough to give the Second Division side a comfortable victory but Pete Yeardeley's Hellenic side did not disgrace themselves.

The hangover from this loss lingered, with a 3-0 thrashing at the hands of Cirencester Academy four days later and a 9-2 thumping – at home – against Yate in the Challenge Cup to make it four consecutive defeats. Fortunately Bassett bounced back, beating Wessex League Bemerton Heath Harlequins at home courtesy of a first goal for the club from Geoff Swatton in the opening round of the Wiltshire Premier Shield. It was the first and only time Bassett had taken part in this competition, which at this stage featured all county clubs from what was then step four of the non-league pyramid upwards, with Swindon Town also participating.

November then began with the visit of second placed North Leigh, who were given an extremely tough time and only prevailed thanks to a controversial goal that was scored directly from an indirect free kick. Three days later, nothing separated Bassett and Tuffley once again, with goals from Swatton and Richard Merchant being cancelled out by the visitors. The games continued to come thick and fast, with the trip to Almondsbury Town being switched to a Friday night. And the journey to Bristol was to be a fruitful one as Merchant and classy midfielder Tony Macek both scored in a 2-0 win. Another draw followed, this time against Abingdon United at Rylands Way, Simpkins from the spot and Paul O’Connell notching for the hosts. It should really have been all three points though given Bassett had jumped into a two goal lead. Carterton Town were next to be held in a goalless draw that saw both teams have shots cleared off the line.

Bassett’s troubles then returned in December, beginning with a 4-0 shellacking at the hands of Pegasus Juniors. Next was the first meeting of the season with Highworth Town. Goals from Macek and Nathan Hall had the hosts ahead 2-1 at the break, but the Worthians fought back during the second period to claim victory by the odd goal in five. Yeardeley’s side then continued their strange trend of faring better when up against opposition heavily favoured to win when they met Southern League Swindon Supermarine in the quarter finals of the Wiltshire Premier Shield. The Hunts Copse outfit sent a weakened side to Rylands Way, although seven regulars still made an appearance. And they were to be embarrassed thanks to the brilliance of Swatton, as noted by the Evening Advertiser on Wednesday December 12th 2001 under the headline, “Bassett ace Geoff Swats aside Marine”:

“Swindon Supermarine crashed out of the Wiltshire Shield last night at the hands of a spirited Wootton Bassett side.

A goal in each half from Geoff Swatton proved enough to give Bassett a deserved 2-0 win against an understrength Marine.

The only threat to their safe passage was the thick fog that descended on the Gerard Buxton ground during the match. Referee Brendon Malone must have been tempted to abandon proceedings as visibility levels swiftly deteriorated. But once Swatton had put Bassett 2-0 up on the hour, Malone was never going to risk getting lynched by the jubilant home faithful.

Today's Opponents

Flackwell Heath

Today sees us play our 928th game in the Hellenic Football League in what is our 27th season in the league. Of those 27 seasons we have spent 19 in Division One and this is just our 8th season in the Premier Division. The highest we have ever finished before this season was 13th in our first season in the Premier back in 2000-01. That record was broken by Paul and the lads following the recent win over Brimscombe.

Our visitors Flackwell Heath are in their 14th season in the Hellenic League. Of those 14, Flackwell have spent 13 in the Premier Division. Flackwell

have in fact had two spells in the Hellenic League. In Season 1976-77 they finished 2nd in Division One gaining promotion to the Premier where they spent 5 seasons before joining the Athenian League and then the Isthmian League where they were to remain until relegation at the end of 2006-7 back into the Hellenic League. This season they have finished as worthy champions and achieved promotion back to Step 4 of the Pyramid.

Their highest placed finish in the Isthmian League was 3rd in Division Two in Season 2002-3.

Wootton Bassett Town have played Flackwell Heath on 9 occasions previously in the Hellenic League era with Flackwell having the better of things with 4 wins to one for Bassett, with 4 games ending in draws. Details of these games are shown below.

The last meeting was in August when two late Sam English goals gave us a share of the points. Last season the two games between the two sides both ended in draws so what odds on a repeat of that sequence of results?

Late English brace frustrates Flackwell

Wilks Park, 23rd August 2014

Wootton Bassett Town's application and attitude were rewarded in thrilling fashion as they came from 2-0 down to earn a fantastic point and put an end to Flackwell Heath's 100% record.

Full back Sam English was the source of an unlikely brace as he headed in a James Skinner cross with five minutes remaining before thrashing home a dramatic, controversial equaliser in injury time to frustrate Flackwell.

A stunning Dan Rapley goal shortly after the restart and an unfortunate Richie Carter own goal had put the hosts in command. Being in such a position against Bracknell Town on Wednesday night led to heads dropping. But this time Paul Braithwaite's team rose to the occasion to claim a point that they deserved.

Given their strong start to the season, Flackwell were favourites to claim the points, but they failed to create significant chances throughout the match as Bassett's defence – led in sterling fashion by centre halves Carter and Nathan Hawkins – gave little away. Aside from Rapley's moment of magic, they didn't really threaten to score.

That said, opportunities were initially limited at both ends, especially in the opening half.

On six minutes first team debutant Danny Hale forced home stopper Robert Bullivant to tip around his post with a low drive from range, though the 'keeper made the save look less comfortable than it should have been.

Four Flackwell corners in succession then finally led to an opening for Flackwell, but when Riccardo Cannon swivelled to shoot from twelve yards, the close attention Carter gave him meant his effort was blocked by the defender's leg.

A looping Rapley header soon ensured Ben Mitchell had to be at

full attention, but the ball floated harmlessly onto the roof of the net.

For the remainder of the period neat passing in the middle of the park from both teams failed to lead anywhere thanks to strong defensive play.

A half chance did come Bassett's way nine minutes before the interval when a switch of play out to Lewis Chatwin on the right allowed the winger to cross. Dale Richards, who had initiated the move, met the delivery with a header at the far post yet could only direct this across the face of goal.

Flackwell finally managed to get beyond the Bassett backline shortly after the restart. However Rapley twice passed up great opportunities, hooking straight into Mitchell's hands following Mitchel Woodward's lofted pass before he dragged well wide when put through on goals thanks to quick interplay between Cannon and substitute Thomas James-Peddle.

He quickly made amends for that wastefulness though, scoring a peach of a goal with 50 minutes on the clock. The ball was worked out to Rapley on the left edge of the box and he stepped inside Pete Sykes before wrapping his boot around a beautiful curling strike that picked out the top right corner, leaving Mitchell no chance.

A neat move involving Dan Bailey and Hale almost led to an equaliser midway through the half as the latter's defence splitting pass was latched onto by Skinner. One-on-one with Bullivant, the midfielder failed to steer his shot into the bottom corner though.

Bassett then conceded an avoidable second with thirteen minutes to go to seemingly put the result beyond doubt. Rapley received a quick free kick from Woodward in the left corner and, after riding a Sykes, challenge delivered a weighted cross which Carter connected with at the near post only to head into his net.

With a comfortable lead and Bassett's previous troubles so far this campaign when falling behind, Flackwell could have expected to make their advantage count.

Yet they continued to meet rather spirited resistance as Bassett remained composed with their play despite having to chase.

And Braithwaite, who had moved from a four to three man backline to try and salvage something, saw his team duly rewarded five minutes from time. Skinner teased a superb first time cross into the box and, at the left post, English fought to get in front of his marker and planted a header beyond the reach of Bullivant.

Confidence revived, Bassett continued to push forward and a minute after the deficit was halved, Gambling sent a rasping 30-yard drive inches over.

That appeared to be as close as the visitors would get to a point. But then they were awarded a free kick five yards inside their own half. From five yards in front of that innocuous position, Mitchell pumped the ball into the box where it fell to Chatwin. He nudged the ball back a yard or two into an opening which English quickly filled and the full back proceeded to blast beyond Bullivant before racing off to celebrate completing a superb recovery.

Flackwell's players were equally as quick to storm down the pitch, confronting the referee's assistant working the Bassett half of the pitch. After the kick was taken he had waved his flag because Mitchell had cheekily stolen five yards, only to cease doing so when he had failed to gain the referee's attention. A short conference ensued, but the man in black soon decided the goal would stand, infuriating the home team even further.

The visitors, on the other hand, couldn't have been happier. Their fine display had been justly rewarded.

Man of the Match: Nathan Hawkins – a rock in the heart of defence, he helped keep the dangerous Ricardo Cannon quiet and was a composed presence throughout when playing the ball out from the back.

The Vase win seemed to be the perfect tonic for Bassett. It was quickly followed by three points in the league, with goals from Vaughan and talismanic winger Jeremy Newton securing a 2-0 win at Cheltenham Saracens. The second month of the campaign then finished with progress in another cup competition, with unbeaten Bristol-based Division One side Winterbourne United being dispatched by three goals to one in the Challenge Cup. Dave Turner's solitary goal in the 89th minute made all the difference against Bicester Town before one of the upsets of the season came with the visit of previously unbeaten Didcot Town to Rylands Way. Towering defender Stuart Lamont was the key performer on the evening, netting a brace, whilst ample assistance was supplied by both Walsh and Mark Simpkins as the hosts triumphed 4-2 to leave the Railwaymen stunned.

Hyde's early goal against high-flyers Brackley Town gave thoughts of another unexpected home result, but two vital mistakes from inexperienced stand-in 'keeper Darren Curtis meant at least a point went begging, allowing the Northamptonshire side to win 3-1. That defeat marked the beginning of another poor patch of form, with elimination from the FA Vase following a week later against Cornish visitors St. Blazey. Bassett put in an admirable performance against the South West Peninsula League outfit, who brought with them a jovial bunch of supporters. Reporting on the match for the Evening Advertiser, Ray Burroughs wrote for the Monday 22nd October 2001 edition:

“Wootton Bassett's hopes of an extended FA Vase run were dashed by Cornish visitors St Blazey who scored two late goals to defeat the Hellenic Premier side 2-0.

Bassett almost took a surprise lead after three minutes, Justin Hyde just failing to get a final touch. Home keeper Richard Stevens kept his side in the game making a great save from a well taken free-kick. As half-time approached a quick break by the home side saw Mark Simpkins thread a good through ball for Mark Vaughan who shot just wide of the post.

Bassett started the second half well, forcing a couple of quick corners, but they were well cleared by the Cornish defence who switched to the attack and Harrington scraped the bar with good effort and Stevens made a brilliant close range save from Hooper. The home side missed a glorious chance to take the lead on the hour when Paul O'Connell found himself with only the keeper to beat but shot wide.

With just 10 minutes remaining St Blazey took the lead their top marksman Dominic Richardson forcing the ball over the line from a corner. Bassett defender Phil Penning thought he had cleared the ball but the linesman decided that the ball had crossed the line. Three minutes later the visitors made sure of victory by adding a second from Nigel Pugh.”

Things therefore didn't bode well for the team going into their next match, which was to be a historic one for the club – their inaugural FA Vase tie against near neighbours Calne Town. Not since the 1964/65 campaign had Bassett competed in a national competition, and the excitement level at the club was unsurprisingly palpable. Adding further spice to the tie was the fact the Calne team – joint managed by former Bassett 'keeper Steve Hale – included a number of players familiar to the Rylands Way club, namely 'keeper Daryl Simms, defender Paul Davis and forward Shaun Terry. The match drew a healthy three figure crowd, and they were certainly entertained, as Yeardley's outfit took the game to extra time before triumphing. The Monday 24th September 2001 edition of the Advertiser carried the following report of the game, under the headline, "Vaughan is on the Mark for Bassett":

"Wootton Bassett are through to the first round of the FA Vase after beating local rivals Calne Town 3-2 after extra time.

"We needed that," said a relieved Bassett manager Peter Yeardley. "It was a superb all round performance, the lads stuck to their task and got their reward. It was nice to win our first game in the Vase and let's hope we can start playing like that in the league and pick up a few more good results."

Visitors Calne Town had the better of the opening exchanges and took the lead on 32 minutes when they were awarded a penalty after a push in the box. Shaun Terry tucked the spot kick away past keeper Richard Stevens. Gradually the home side came more into the game and Gareth Walsh found the net on 40 minutes but the effort was disallowed. On the run-up to the interval things began to get heated and the referee was forced to disperse half a dozen yellow cards between the two sides.

Calne almost scored a second at the start of the second half, Stevens making a great save from Craig Buck, and at the other end Jeremy Newton went close with a good effort. On 64 minutes Bassett at last drew level when Mark Vaughan was brought down and Mark Simpkins' free kick found Newton, who drove a low shot into the net. Bassett then began to get on top and Calne keeper Daryl Simms made several good saves to ensure the tie went into extra time. However the keeper was unable to stop a header from Vaughan entering the net five minutes after the start of extra time to give the home side the lead.

Calne fought back and equalised ten minutes later, Matt Peters getting on the end of a free kick by Andy Power. In the second period play switched frantically from end to end and on 109 minutes a good through ball by Chris O'Connell found Vaughan who ran through to shot past Sims for the winner.

Calne manager and former Bassett keeper Steven Hale said: "For some reason we stopped playing midway through the first half and a couple of defensive mistakes gave away the goals. Bassett ran the second half and deserve credit for their win. I wish them all the best in the next round."

What was going on in the world

The season kicked off with Atomic Kitten at number one in the charts with Eternal Flame and ended with Oasis at the top of the pile with Hindu Times. Apple announce the invention of their new music device called the I-Pod. The 11th of September sees Islamic terrorists fly aeroplanes into the World Trade Center in New York and also crash planes with intended targets in Washington. Thierry Henry fires the goals which take Arsenal to the Premiership championship, finishing seven points ahead of Liverpool. Arsenal then go onto do the double by defeating Chelsea 2-0 in the FA Cup Final. Swindon Town finish in 13th place in the third tier of English football. The summer's World Cup, held in South Korea and Japan, sees Brazil claim their fifth title after defeating Germany 2-0 in the final.

The summer of 2001 was one of stark change at Wootton Bassett Town, with numerous players following former manager Barry Giles out of Rylands Way. Free scoring Lee Stoddart was undoubtedly the biggest loss, but also gone were defenders Paul Davis and Lee Marshall and midfielders Paul Harper and Mick Goodwin. With the newly installed Pete Yeardley, who a season before had led the reserves – alongside Paul Burke – to the Hellenic League Reserve Division Two title, forced to rebuild, it was unsurprising that club's ambitions – but for one person - were scaled back, as the season preview published by the Evening Advertiser on Friday August 17th highlighted:

“Top of the bottom three will suit us fine,' says one Wootton Bassett supporter only half joking. Wootton Bassett secured a noteworthy 13th position in their top-flight debut in the Hellenic League last season. However, the summer has seen a mass exodus of players and management alike, causing an air of defeatism to descend on the supporters watching a low-key pre-season friendly. Bassett went on to lose the game but only just and to strong opposition in Western League outfit Devizes Town. The performance is enough to give new manager Pete Yeardley cause for optimism.

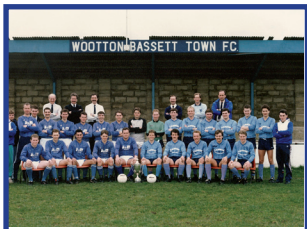
He said: "We've made an encouraging start. Mick Byrne (assistant manager) and myself have trained the boys really hard over the last five weeks, and it shows. The fitness levels are excellent." Yeardley, who controlled last season's unbeaten reserve team, has stepped up to replace former boss Barry Giles, who decided to step down at the end of last season. Giles's departure opened the flood gates and the majority of the first team followed him out of the door. Yeardley, aided by assistant Mick Byrne, has reassembled the squad, bringing in talented lower league players, and offering some of last season's all- conquering reserve side the chance to prove themselves in the first team.

"We know the Wiltshire football scene well, so we targeted players who are young and receptive to coaching," said Yeardley. Nurturing gifted youngsters is the overriding theme at the club, with players aged six to 18 representing Bassett. "The youth set-up here is fantastic," said Yeardley. "We have good young teams in all age

Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out of the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivensham Dave tragically passed away. Last season Bassett were managed by Jeff Roberts. Despite assembling a skilful side on paper and paying players for the first time, the side ended the season in 14th place and with a poor discipline record. Ahead of the move into a new ground at Ballards Ash the Club again has a new manager with former Fairford Town manager Paul Braithwaite taking over the management duties.
