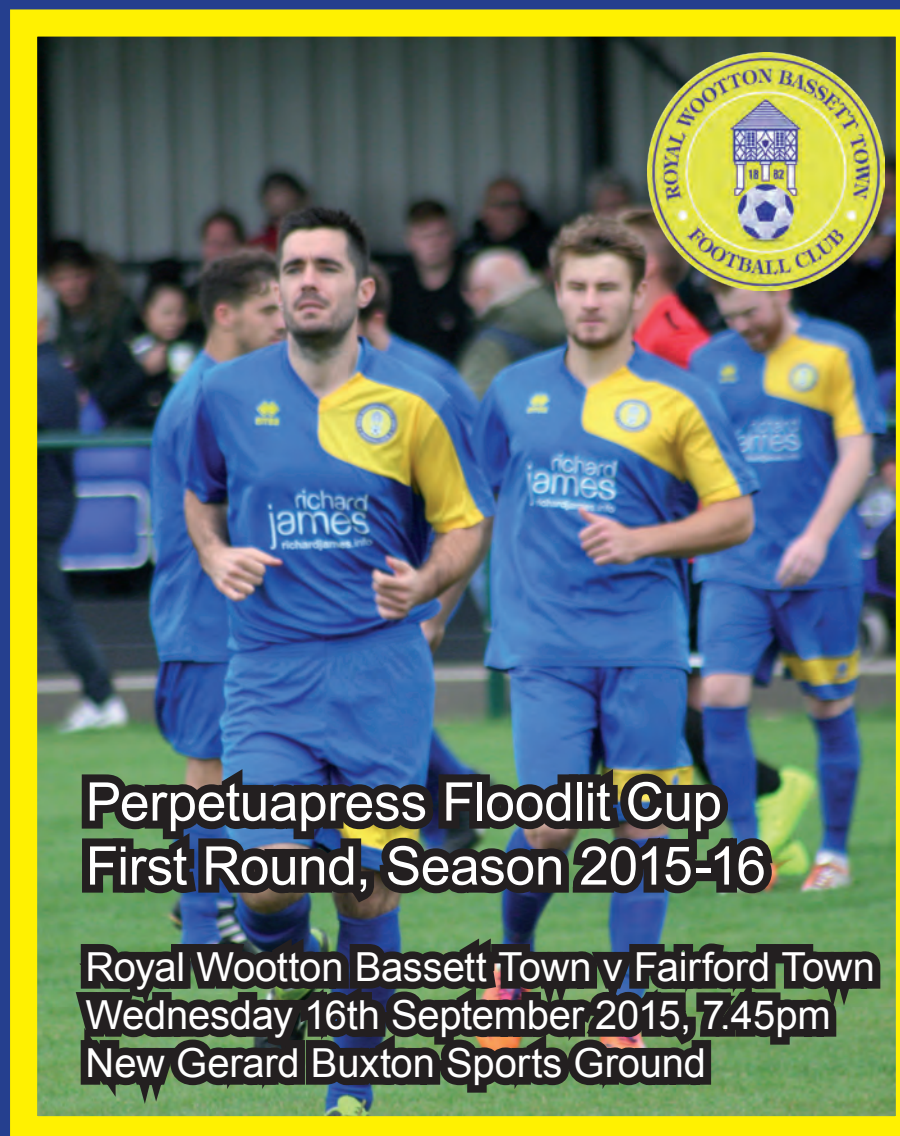

# Editorial & RWBTFC News

## Welcome to Fairford Town

A warm welcome to Fairford Town who have made the short journey from Gloucestershire for this evening's Perpetuapress Floodlit Cup 1<sup>st</sup> Round tie. We hope all from Fairford enjoy their visit to our new ground and we wish them a safe journey home.

Fairford started the season in Division One West with a narrow 2-1 away win at Shrivenham. This was followed by a heavy defeat away at North Leigh where the home side hit 5 goals, Tom Ballard with the consolation goal for Fairford. First home game of the season saw Fairford meet a very strong Hook Norton side who left Cinder Lane with all 3 points following a 3-0 win. Fairford returned to winning ways against Clanfield 85 when strikes from Scott Chilcott, Jack Allen and former Bassett player Jason Milhench gave Fairford the points in a 3-0 win. Milhench was again on target as Fairford went down 2-1 at home against Cirencester Town Development in the County Cup competition. Fairford then had a great result in the F.A. Vase when they defeated Premier League side Ardley United 3-0 at home with Milhench again amongst the goals scoring a brace, Adam Webb with the third. On Saturday by a quirk of the fixtures Fairford played North Leigh United for the second time this season even though the season is only a few weeks old. In a stylish performance they extracted revenge for that earlier heavy defeat running out 6-1 winners. Former Bassett players scored all six goals on Saturday, Matty Boucher bagged a brace and there was one a piece for Jason Milhench, Lee Smith and Danny Hale.

## Previous Encounters

The two sides have met on 17 occasions previously and it is our visitors who have had the better of things with 9 victories, Bassett winning 4 and 4 games ending in draws. That said Wootton Bassett Town have had the better of things in recent times with all 4 Bassett wins coming in the last 6 encounters. The last time the two sides met was back in 2012-13 when Paul Braithwaite was manager at Fairford. Wootton Bassett did the double over Fairford that season, winning 4-3 at Cinder Lane courtesy of goals from Mark Barnes, Jack Ellis, Matty Bown and an own goal and won 2-1 at Rylands Way, Mark Barnes getting both Bassett goals in the home fixture. In 2010-11 it was again Bassett who had the better of things. A Shaun Carter goal was enough to give us a point at Cinder Lane and goals from Jon Beedon, Matty Boucher and Sam Collier secured the 3 points at Rylands Way in a 3-1 win.

Prior to that, with Bassett having been relegated to Division One West, you had to go back to Season 2004-5 for a meeting of the two sides. That season the sides in fact met 3 times with a Supplementary Cup fixture in addition to the two league games. This was the only one of the games that Bassett won that Season against Fairford, goals from Dave Tyler and Chris Mills seeing us into the next round. In the league we lost 2-0 at Cinder Lane and drew 1-1 at Rylands, Dave Tyler again the Bassett scorer.

The two sides have also met twice in this competition (both also in the First Round) with Fairford coming out on top on both occasions. The first occasion was back in September 2000 at Cinder Lane when Fairford won 3-1, Lee Stoddart, a player who was to go on and make his name at Fairford, scoring the Bassett consolation goal that night. Three years later the two sides again met in the First Round with Fairford winning by a solitary goal at Rylands Way.

Despite Fairford being a division below us we will need to be at our best if history is not to repeat itself. With so many connections between the two sides, both sides should be up for the game, so hopefully an entertaining game will follow.

## Binfield Games

After holding on for 45 minutes with just 10 men we managed to take a very good Binfield side to a replay. Given the circumstances of having to travel to Binfield on a Monday night minus our four most experienced players in Steve Yeardley, Adam Corcoran, Richie Carter and top scorer Steve Robertson, few would have predicted what happened last Monday night. With six players starting the game under the age of 19 and with 17 year old Hugo Vivash on the bench it was a very inexperienced side that Bassett fielded at Stubbs Lane. The one thing with youth is that they show no fear and this performance demonstrated that admirably. What a game this was with both sides scoring stunning goals and Bassett taking the lead on 3 occasions, extending that lead to 2-0 at one point, only to be pulled back twice. The first two goals from Harvey Scholes would both probably feature on the Uhlsport Hellenic League goal of the month competition were such a thing to exist. The first a stunning strike and the second a fine individual goal. Having let go a 2-0 lead Binfield must have thought the tie and the £600 prize money was theirs once they got back onto level terms for the first time but all credit to the lads who continued to play some great counter-attacking football and worked their socks off for the club and got their noses back in front courtesy of a Dan Bailey header. The goal resulted in a comment from the bloke next to me that "how did we let the worst player on the pitch score", not sure what game he was watching but for me Dan had been involved in all our attacking play and was having a great game like everyone else. With Binfield equalising late on, the bloke next to me then said there would only be one winner now but how wrong he was as Nathan Hawkins rose to head home a late corner to restore our lead. Made my night but the bloke next to me probably went home with the hump. Great to see both sides applauded off the park at the end and the Chairman of the Hellenic League Bob Dalling, who was watching, commented that the game had been a credit to the Uhlsport Hellenic League. I had to agree with that one.

## Thame United

It was back down to earth on Saturday when we travelled to Thame and went down 3-1. By all accounts a very harsh penalty was awarded in the opening minutes but Thame are becoming something of a bogey side for us as we have yet to win in 7 encounters with them. Our consolation goal was scored by Steve Robertson who moves onto 7 for the season and currently sits in 6<sup>th</sup> place in the top scorers table. Talking of tables we are currently top of the Premier Division attendance table with an average of 132 from our home league games to date. Obviously the Highworth game has helped put us in this position but it would be great if we could continue to get people turning up on the gate.

# From The Dugout

Good evening and a warm welcome to Fairford Town to the New Gerard Buxton Ground for this Perpetuapress Floodlit Cup 1<sup>st</sup> Round tie. I would like to make a special personal welcome to Mike Tanner and Bill Beech, along with Reserve Team Manager Andy Bright, to the New Gerard Buxton stadium this evening. These are the 3 people who helped myself and Chris on our managerial path and are 3 real footballing people too. They all give up great amount of time and effort to local football and Fairford Town in particular. A warm welcome also to Fairford Manager Gareth Davies. As Gareth will already know Fairford are a good club and I know the Board and Gareth will be working hard to break into that top 3 or 4 in the league to give themselves a chance of returning to the Premier at the end of the season. It is not easy in any league and even more so when, like us, you have to rebuild a squad. It is not an overnight process it can take 2 to 3 seasons.

Based on recent results Fairford are definitely starting to improve after a tough season in 2014-15. Saturday saw them win 6-1 at home against North Leigh United, a side they had lost to 5-1 earlier this season. As well as the North Leigh win they have also defeated Ardley United from the Premier Division in recent weeks and we will need to be at our best tonight if we are to secure a place in the next round. When this draw was made Chris and I couldn't wait for this game to come around. Tonight our side includes a number who joined us from Fairford and the Fairford side named for the programme also includes 8 players who had played for Wootton Bassett Town in recent seasons. These kinds of games are always played with a passion and the fans could be in for a treat tonight under the lights.

Since my last programme notes we have again played 3 games with contrasting results and performances. In the home F.A. Vase game against Binfield we did enough to take the game to a replay thanks to a stunning goal from Robbo. Credit to the defence and midfield though for playing 45 minutes with 10 men and not conceding, they earned us the right to go to Binfield along with Robbo's wonder goal.

Great result at Binfield on Monday night in an end-to-end game of football which contained another batch of great goals. Fielding a very young side due to work commitments, we were involved in a hard fought game but we matched a very good Binfield side all the way. Those from Bassett who went along were certainly treated to some entertainment that night and it was nice to see both sets of players applauded off the pitch at the end.

# Opponents - History

## Fairford Town • Club History

Fairford Town Football Club was formed in 1891 and for many years played in the Cirencester & District League against local teams with varying degrees of success.

After the Second World War, the club joined the Swindon & District League, winning the Premier Division in both 1963-64 and 1968-69, also winning the Advertiser Cup in the same years and in 1962-63 won the Gloucestershire F.A. Junior Cup.

Success in this league was followed by election to the Hellenic League in 1970, only missing out on promotion from the First Division on goal average at the first attempt. The club also reached the Division One Challenge Cup Final, only to lose 5-1 against Hungerford Town in a match played at Wantage. The following year, 1971-72, saw Fairford win the Hellenic League First Division & Division One Challenge Cup, beating Chipping Norton Town in the Final whilst the reserves won the Gloucestershire F.A. Minor Cup, the Advertiser Cup, and finished as runners-up in the Swindon & District Division One. The successful run continued and the Town were beaten finalists of the 1972-73 Premier Division Cup losing to Witney Town, only to then be relegated back to Division One in season 1973-74. Fairford Town were then promoted again in 1975-76 and steady progress led to the Premier Division runners-up spot in season 1978-79 and in 1979-80, also winning the Premier Division Cup in 1978-79 beating Thame United 3-1 in a Final played again at Wantage Town's Alfredian Park ground.

The club were also winners of the Gloucestershire FA Trophy in 1979-80 beating Shortwood United 1-0, 1998-99 defeating Patchway Town, also 1-0 and again in 2002-03 when they defeated Yate Town 2-0 in the Final. They were also runners-up in 1982-83 losing to Old Georgians 2-1 and 1994-95 when defeated 2-1 by Shortwood United, giving their Hellenic League rivals revenge for the earlier defeat. The most recent success in the league came in 1990-91 and 1994-95 when the club again finished in the runners-up position. Fairford Town also won the Norman Matthews Floodlit Cup in 2001-02, beating Gloucester United over a two-legged Final. In the First Leg Fairford recorded a 3-2 victory at Meadow Park, home of Gloucester City Football Club and then a 3-1 win back at Cinder Lane to take the trophy 6-3 on aggregate. The club made a second appearance in the Floodlit Cup Final in 2003-04, unfortunately this time finished as runners-up to Slimbridge. The First Leg played at Slimbridge finished 1-0 and after a goal less first half at Cinder Lane in the Second, Slimbridge scored three times to win the Cup 4-0 on aggregate. Whilst silverware has been elusive over the past few seasons; the club was pleased to be awarded the Fair Play award at the end of the 2007/08 campaign, the award following what was a traumatic season for the club off the pitch.

Over the next few seasons, the club struggled at the wrong end of the table, avoiding relegation due to having Step 5 ground grading. However, at the end of season 2011-12, the club were relegated into Division 1 West. This proved a good move as results improved and the team finished 4th. With the signing of a few new faces, the club hopes to finish higher this time round, with promotion back to the Premier Division the goal.

# Defunct Opponents

A look back at former opponents who are no longer competing, today's featured team is former Swindon side...

## Oldacre FC

Oldacre FC played out at Penhill School in Swindon and were managed for much of their time in the Wiltshire League by former Wootton Bassett Town manager Bob Malkin (1979-80 – 1982-83) who also took a number of Wootton Bassett players with him to Oldacre. These players included Graham Large, Andy Ferguson and Danny Groom (pictured), now Vice Chairman of Wootton Bassett Town.



Oldacre joined the Wiltshire County League in the early 1980's and had their first success in Season 1983-84 when they finished runners-up in Division Four of the County League behind Plessey Sports. They were to repeat this feat the following season in Division Three, having been promoted, with Plessey Sports once again the champions. However, this season they also won their first piece of silverware when they won the Wiltshire League Ghia Junior Cup. This competition was to see the first real meaningful playing encounter between the two clubs as the team they defeated in the final was Wootton Bassett Town Reserves. The Swindon Evening Advertiser dated, Friday May 17th 1985 contained the following report under the headline

"Oldacre Take Cup":

*Oldacre won the Ghia Junior Cup with a 2-0 win over Wootton Bassett Reserves in last night's final at Aldbourne. Bassett were on top in the first half, when Micky Brooks was unlucky not to score and John Saunders had a shot parried away by Martin Rees. Oldacre gained a vital goal right on the interval when Darren Jell knocked the ball home in a goalmouth scramble. Oldacre carried the game to Bassett in the second half to seal the issue with a 66th minute header by Kevin Roberts.*



The first encounter with our First Team came in Season 1986-87 when the two sides met in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, Oldacre now playing in Division Two of the Wiltshire County League. With Wootton Bassett playing in the top division of the league there was to be no cup upset as Wootton Bassett won 6-1, Gary Dixon giving the Oldacre defence a torrid time scoring four goals. Paul Harrison and Paul Gadsen added further goals.

Despite this heavy defeat in the cup it was to be a successful season for Oldacre in the league as they stormed to the Division Two championship. This promotion meant that Oldacre would be in the same division as Wootton Bassett Town First Team, well for one season anyway. The two sides did not meet until 12<sup>th</sup> March when goals from Damien York and Roger Frost (pictured) gave Wootton Bassett Town a 2-0 win at Rylands Way.

It was somewhat closer in the return game at Penhill with Wootton Bassett winning by the odd goal in 3. Ian Johns and Terry Hanrahan on target for Wootton Bassett Town in this one.

At the end of the season Wootton Bassett Town were to finish as champions which led to promotion up into the Hellenic Football League and hence ended league encounters between the two clubs.

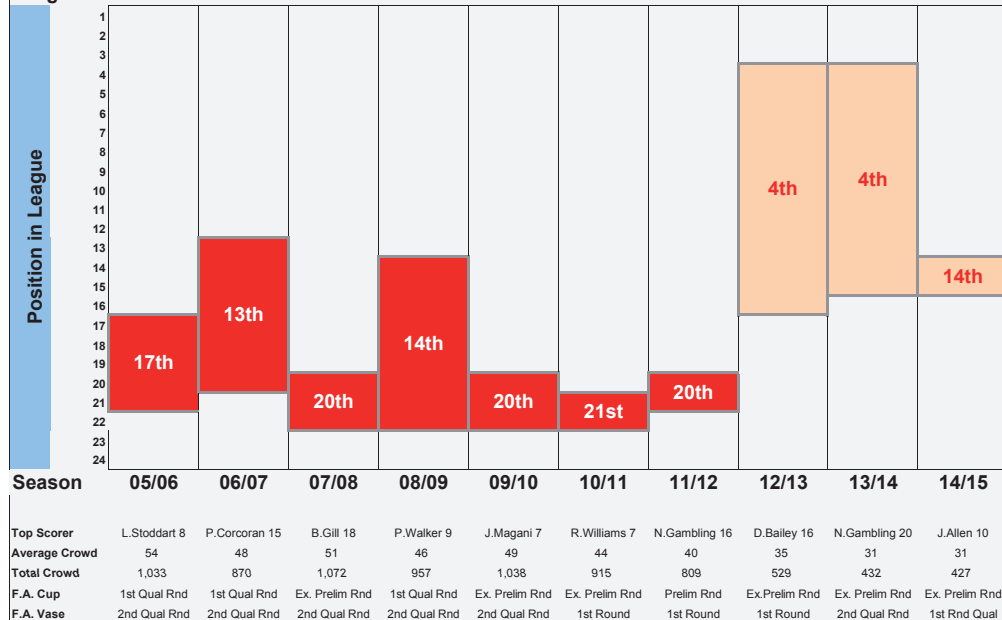

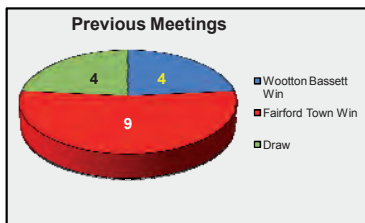
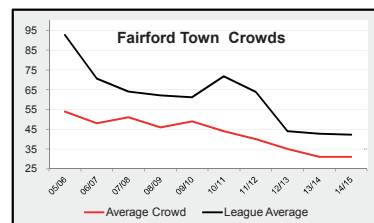

# Match Reports

## A Right Royal Occasion

Stubbs Lane, 9<sup>th</sup> September 2015

Binfield 3, Royal Wootton Bassett Town 4

**A superb performance from Royal Wootton Bassett Town on Monday night secured Bassett a trip to Windsor in the next round of the F.A. Vase following a thrilling 4-3 victory away at Binfield.**

Given the circumstances of having to travel to Binfield on a Monday night minus their four most experienced players in Steve Yeardley, Adam Corcoran, Richie Carter and top scorer Steve Robertson, few would have predicted what happened on Monday night. With six players starting the game under the age of 19 and with 17 year old Hugo Vivash on the bench it was a very inexperienced side that Bassett fielded at Stubbs Lane. The one thing with youth is that they show no fear and this performance demonstrated that admirably.

Royal Wootton Bassett went close to taking the lead on 5 minutes when an audacious shot from Dan Bailey from his own half nearly caught out Binfield keeper Nathan Silver. Having been done on Saturday with a shot over his head Silver only just managed to do enough to keep out Bailey's cheeky effort.

Binfield's first effort on goal came on 9 minutes from Liam Ferdinand but his shot was easily saved by Curtis Meare in the Bassett goal. Bassett immediately counter attacked and great set up play between Dan Bailey and Steve Olphert put Kalum Youngsam through but his effort was well saved by Silver. The best chance of the night so far fell to Binfield on 20 minutes when, after good set-up play, James Knight missed a sitter. The game continued to be very open and played at pace, with Binfield hurrying every throw-in and free kick. On 30 minutes a shot from Matt Cheetham was well held by Silver. Binfield themselves had another glorious chance to take the lead on 36 minutes when a ball to the far post found Liam Ferdinand in acres of space but his header was poor and did not trouble Curtis Meare in the Bassett goal. The deadlock was finally broken on 37 minutes when Harvey Scholes became the second player in a couple of days to beat Silver from distance with a cracking 30 yard shot screaming over the keepers head and into the back of the Binfield net. So, whilst Binfield had more the possession in the first period it was Bassett that went into the half time break with the slender lead.

Three minutes after the break things were to get even better for Bassett when a great solo run from young Harvey Scholes beat 5 players and ended with a cool finish with a shot into the bottom right hand corner of the Binfield net, 2-0 Bassett and a very shocked home side. On a night of great goals Jemel Johnson brought Binfield back into the game with another quality goal. Coming in from wide on the left, he played a one-two with Liam Ferdinand before hitting a brilliant dipping volley from 25 yards in off the far post. The game continued to ebb and flow and Binfield introduced substitute Brad Brown who was then booked after a very silly two footed lunge within minutes of coming on. On other days this would have resulted in a straight red and both Brown and Binfield benefitted from the referee's leniency when moments later he curled a ball into the Bassett net from the edge of the box to bring Binfield level with half an hour left to play.

At that moment all present probably expected the young Bassett side to capitulate but they continued to work hard defensively and keep the home side from getting their noses in front. Brown again tested Curtis Meare and only the keeper's finger tips with the help of the post kept the score level. Whilst soaking up the pressure Bassett were always a threat on the break and when Dan Bailey rose highest on 82 minutes to meet a left wing cross from man of the match Scholes, his downward header gave Silver no chance and Bassett were back in front again. Having got back in front surely Bassett would not throw away the lead again? However, a controversial corner award six minutes from time allowed Binfield to continue to exert pressure. With Bassett still smarting from the corner award Lewis Leonetti connected with the corner, but this was cleared off the line but Liam Ferdinand was there to force the ball home. 3-3 and still five minutes to play in this pulsating game. Just when it looked like extra time would again be needed Bassett broke up a Binfield attack and won a corner of their own. From the corner centre-back Nathan Hawkins rose highest to head powerfully into the Binfield net for the 7<sup>th</sup> goal of the night. The closing moments were tense but the youngsters held out against the more experienced Binfield side and secure that precious win and prize money. So it is the Royal town of Wootton Bassett who will make that trip to Windsor. Both sides were applauded off the pitch at the end. It had been a cracking game witnessed by the Chairman of the Hellenic League who commented that the game had been a credit to the UHlsport Hellenic League.

## Bassett Bomb Out of Floodlit Cup at First Hurdle Against Local Rivals Fairford

Rylands Way, Tuesday Sep 9 2003

Lee Kilfoyle ended Bassett's hopes of going far in the Floodlit Cup as his 44th minute header sealed a 1-0 victory for local rivals Fairford Town – this was also the fourth game on the trot Bassett had lost. Ben Gascoyne nearly got Bassett off to a terrific start in the second minute of play when he hit wide from a Geoff Swatton ball.

Neither side managed to create chances for a while as the game developed into an even contest before in the twenty fifth minute Chris Knowles hit the side netting from the edge of the area after a ball over the top which the Bassett defence failed to deal with. Ex-Bassett favourite Lee Stoddart hit wide for the visitors on the half hour mark when he capitalised on some poor Bassett defending but failed to finish. Two minutes later Fairford were on the attack again only for Matt Bennett to break the play up with a great tackle stopping Courtney Chessell from having a clear cut chance on goal.

Stoddart came close again, this time in the 34th minute when he hit just over the crossbar as Rich Stevens stared on from a free kick from twenty yards out. Fairford continued to dominate before the break and got the only goal of the game in the 44th minute when Lee Kilfoyle headed in a simple opportunity from ten yards out after Bassett 'keeper Rich Stevens was flattened by his defence after he came to collect a Ryan Lovegrove corner from the left. Another sloppy goal conceded by Bassett which, in the end, cost them the game. The start of the second half was much like the end of the first with Fairford the dominant side. Lee Clark came close first in the 51st minute when he hit wide from the edge of the box. Stoddart did the same a minute later when his shot sailed wide.

Courtney Chessell put Chris Knowles through after 55 minutes but Knowles' header was saved by Stevens before Andy Hallett made another piece of fine defending to block a Stoddart shot immediately after. On the hour mark Stoddart again was causing problems when Paul Davis slid in to edge the Fairford goal machine's shot over for a corner. Bassett continued to play Fairford's game and could not find anyway of getting a goal – or even a shot on target. More problems came for Bassett in the 63rd minute when a deep Bassett free kick was connected with by Ben Gascoyne who played Geoff Swatton through but the referee Adrian Matthews pulled play back after an incident involving himself and Paul Davis resulting in a booking for Davis for dissent.

Bassett made a double change a minute later Ben Gascoyne and Tony Macek were taken off and were replaced by Sam Reason and John Magani. Magani came close for Bassett in the 71st minute when he hit Captain Mark Simpkins' free kick wide. Bassett continued to push forward but couldn't create any decent chances. A Mark Vaughan shot was the closest they could come in the final few minutes but he shot well wide from the edge of the area. Bassett had no shots on target all game although Gascoyne and Geoff Swatton were linking up well and when Gascoyne came off Magani was linking up well with Swatton. Bassett have scored only three goals in their last five – all against Didcot – and conceded seven which shows both the forwards and defence need to get their act together if Bassett are to win in a tough game on Saturday at Southall.

# RWBTFC History On One Page

## Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

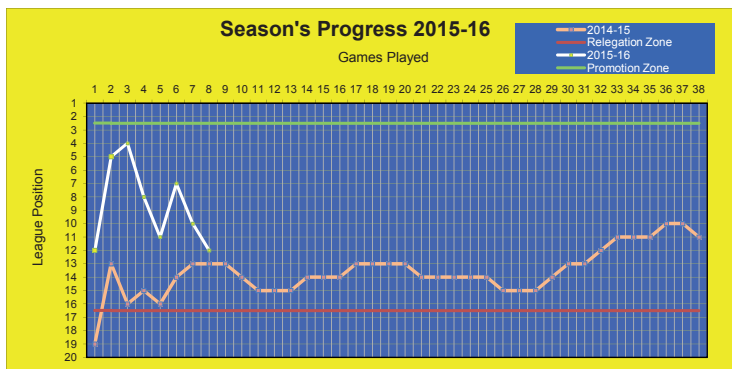
Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivensham Dave tragically passed away.

With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year ground share with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year playing its games in Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and record points haul in the division. This season sees the club playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name.

### F.A. Cup

THE FA Cup is up and running and even in the first two preliminary rounds, the world's most famous knockout competition has already thrown up miraculous scorelines and incredible comebacks.

With the first round qualifying upon us, there is surely more to come this weekend after some pulsating Preliminary Round ties in the past fortnight. Ryman Division One South side South Park demolished Southern Counties East League club Holmesdale 10-1 and were rewarded with a visit from the Cup itself last week, courtesy of The NLP's partnership with the Football Association.

With seven different goal scorers on target the magic of the Cup returned to Whitehall and the players were reminded of the prize that awaits down Wembley Way next May.

With a nine-goal cushion to their progression, and already managing to get their hands on the silverware, surely the cliché of "confidence is crucial" will ring true this weekend when they host Premier Division side Leatherhead.

Maybe to imagine their name on the Cup is a step too far, but to etch their names in club history could be just as special and they'll be dreaming of winning through to the first round proper and going one step further than in 2012-13 when Met Police beat them in the fourth qualifying round.

But in terms of FA Cup shocks surely even Midland League Premier club Westfields' most hopeful followers would not have expected progression following a first-half mauling in their replay at Step 4 opponents Kidsgrove Athletic.

An embarrassment was on the horizon as they fell four goals behind and to just win the second half would have been an achievement in itself.

Evo-Stik NPL Division One outfit Kidsgrove were cruising and despite a setback, which saw them concede four goals in the last half-hour, they still took the lead again. At 5-4 they surely thought the match was sealed, but this was set to be a classic.

A 95th-minute equaliser was dramatic enough but after the two sides finally let up for 30 minutes of goalless extra-time, penalties were imminent. In true FA Cup style, the shoot-out was not to be – but it was a spot-kick that settled it with the Hereford club running out 6-5 winners thanks to an added-time pen from four-goal hero Craig Jones.

With £3,000 up for grabs in prize money, progression at this stage sets clubs up nicely for a busy couple of months as the Cup games come round thick and fast.

As each match passes and November edges ever closer, so does the hope of facing a Football League club in the first round proper and the chance to collect some much-needed gate money and TV cash, if they are lucky enough to be chosen for coverage.

League form is forgotten and the opposition is merely incidental as the 90 minutes, 120 minutes and possible penalties result in remarkable score lines and incidents not to be forgotten by fans, players and managers.

There are 116 ties being played this weekend and heroes will emerge from every one. Even with the big boys still four rounds away, the magical stories are writing themselves – you can rest assured they'll be featuring in our pages over the next few days!

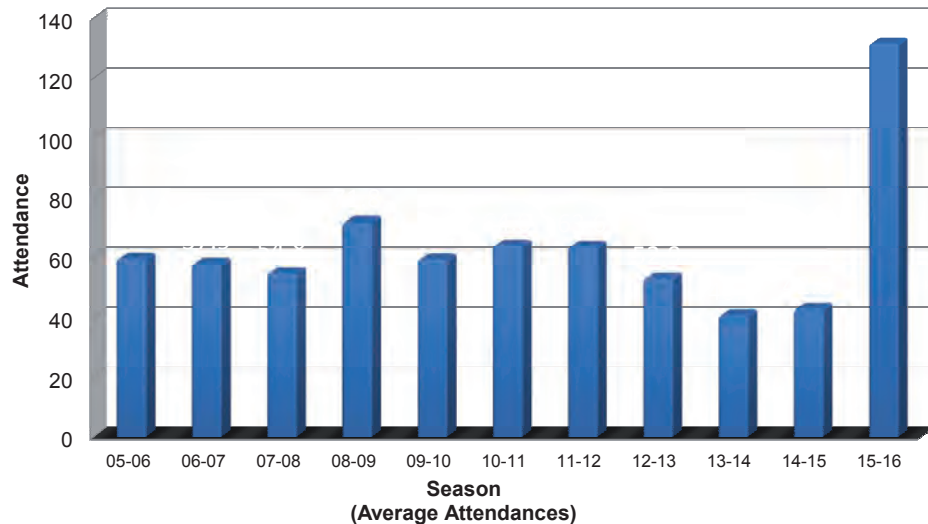

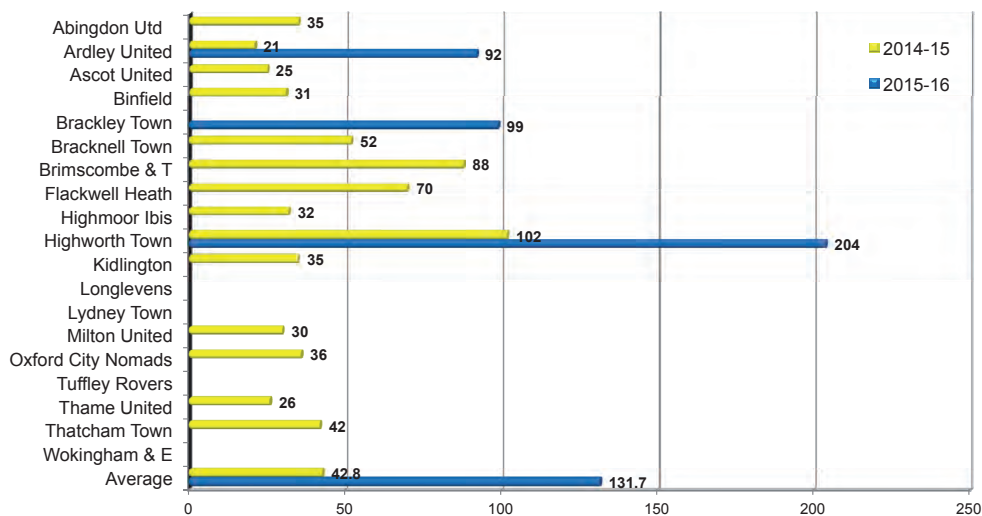

## Derby Disappointment

New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, 31<sup>st</sup> August 2015

Royal Wootton Bassett Town failed to build on Saturday's impressive away victory against Ascot United, falling to a 2-0 defeat against local rivals Highworth Town in a derby encounter that offered few thrills.

A bumper crowd of over 200 were provided little real entertainment as Bassett in particular were muted. In the end a pair of well taken goals, one in either half, from TJ Bohane provided the visiting Worthians with an all too comfortable triumph that preserved their 100% league record so far this season. Although without leading marksman Steve Robertson, there were no great shifts in the line-up from that which performed so brilliantly on the road on Saturday. However, there was a marked output in terms of performance.

Robertson's absence led to manager Paul Braithwaite starting the game with Nathan Gambling on his own up front as he packed the midfield to match Highworth man-for-man. While Gambling did well holding the ball up, his lack of strike partner too often led to him being in a situation where he had to wait endlessly for a teammate to pass too. And frequently his sole option for a pass was to play back into midfield rather than into space behind the visitors' defence, who were rarely tested.

The one moment that Bassett had any tangible success offensively in the opening period came on 25 minutes when Sam Packer received a reverse pass from Gambling and surged beyond Sam Wadieh before cutting back for the unmarked lone striker on the edge of the area. Gambling, however, snatched at his shot, firing to the right of the goal.

A minute later the hosts were behind, Bohane demonstrating his deadly eye for goal. Aaron Maximen danced past challenges from Packer and Steve Yeardley in the midfielder before slipping a ball into the left channel. Bohane, timing his run across the forward line perfectly, beat the offside trap and raced onto the loose ball before lofting a delicate chip over the onrushing Luke Kuczynski. Prior to that goal the best Highworth could conjure was a glancing Callum Parsons header, which sailed narrowly wide of the left post. But after taking the lead they began to impose their authority. Brad Clark did well to control Toby Clark's angled free kick, before swivelling and sending a dipping strike inches the wrong side of the right post from 25 yards. Richie Saunders then dragged a 20 yard drive across goal after being brought into play by Bohane's hold up play.

The Worthians continued to apply pressure after the restart, and Bassett suffered a lucky escape on 52 minutes when Bohane, unmarked and six yards from goal, could only head Brad Clark's right wing cross off target.

Five minutes later he had his second though. It came from Bassett losing possession from their own throw, and the ball was eventually worked to Bohane on the right edge of the area, where he rolled George Drewitt and arrowed a low strike with his favoured left foot beyond Kuczynski at the near post. Falling two behind heralded a shift in strategy for Bassett, with central midfielder Richie Carter being sacrificed for young forward Kalum Youngsam.

While the next action in front of goal came with Kuczynski acrobatically tipping over a Parsons header, that substitute did eventually help spark some life into the home team's attacking efforts. Dan Bailey's pot shot from the left touchline had Kurtis Sharkey scrambling, the 'keeper just being able to punch over as the shot threatened to creep into the top corner.

A well worked move then saw Harvey Scholes deliver a dangerous low cross from the right into the Highworth six yard box. Dale Richards looked set to steer in at the far post, but was denied thanks to Lee Bowen's last ditch sliding tackle. That proved to be the best Bassett could muster. Indeed, they were somewhat fortunate to finish the game two goals behind their visitors as Nathan Blackford rattled the post from a tight angle and Toby Clark failed to find the target with another free header.

**Man of the Match: Kalum Youngsam** – showed a willingness to run at and take on defenders in the half hour he was given; it was his introduction that helped spark at least some life into a subdued side.

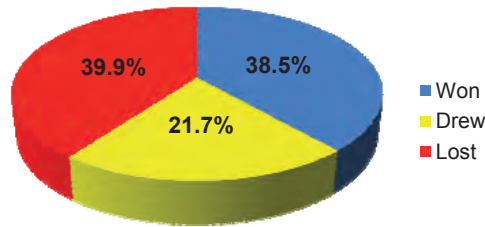

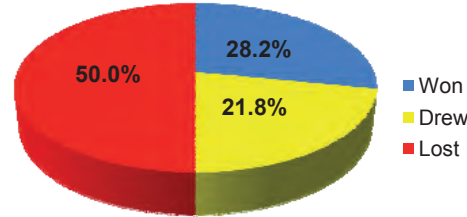

## Match Reports

### F.A. Vase 1st Qualifying Round Replay

Two replays were eventually required for UHlsport Hellenic League sides to decide whether or not they were to proceed to the Preliminary Round in a couple of weeks' time. ### Perpetua Print Floodlit Cup 1st Round Bradshaw Treble Fires Robins into Next Round

A scintillating first half hat-trick from winger Martin Bradshaw fired Bracknell Town into the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round of the Perpetua Print Floodlit Cup. Two goals inside a minute on the quarter hour mark set the Robins on their way to victory over Rayners Lane but he saved his best until last with a 40<sup>th</sup> minute solo goal and rightly earned a standing ovation when he was replaced after seventy minutes. Mike Lokwa added a fourth in first half stoppage time as the visitors had no answer to the hosts attacking play.

The opening goal on fifteen minutes saw Lokwa set up Bradshaw who fired into the far right hand corner. ## Robbo Super Strike Earns Replay

New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, 5<sup>th</sup> September 2015

**Royal Wootton Bassett's F.A. Vase run continues for 2 more days at least.** A stunning 20 yard strike from Steve Robertson earned Royal Wootton Bassett Town an F.A. Vase replay on a historic day that saw the official opening of the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground. The result against a very good Binfield side certainly pleased the Bassett management and fans alike, especially given that the closing stages of normal time and all of extra-time had been played with just 10 men following a second yellow card for Sam Packer.

Whilst the management were happy with a well earned replay the Monday night scheduling for that replay did not generate the same response. Royal Wootton Bassett will have to travel to Binfield on Monday with a few key players missing as they are unable to change work commitments at such short notice. The good news is that manager Paul Braithwaite has a sizeable squad this season and will still be able to field a competitive side for this important game.

In this first encounter between the two sides things did not start too well for Bassett as they fell behind within two minutes of the start when Liam Ferdinand headed in from a corner. This was a poor goal to concede, especially so early on, but to be fair Bassett did not let this set-back get to them. That said, during the first 45 the Bassett side found it tough to hold onto the ball and the back four often found themselves having to hit the ball long for strikers Youngsam and Robinson to chase. Whilst Binfield were much the better side in the first half, having a lot of possession, they lacked a little bit of composure in front of goal. A very young side, they had a lot of pace and clever movement off the ball within their ranks and Bassett were pleased to get to the break just one goal down.

Whatever the management said at half time it seemed to do the trick as a much improved second half saw Bassett come more into the game. Steve Robertson was always the danger man and was ably supported by Kalum Youngsam, the latter given his opportunity following the departure of Nathan Gambling who had left Bassett to join Highworth Town during the week. The Bassett youngster chased lots of long balls pumped forward from the Bassett back four and also hassled the Binfield defence throughout. However, if anyone was going to score for Bassett it was likely to be top scorer Steve Robertson and so it proved and what a goal it was. Picking up the ball 20 yards out, he fired an unstoppable shot into the top left hand corner of the Binfield net.

Following the goal Bassett started to get on top and at that stage it looked like a home win and a trip to Windsor in the next round was the likely outcome. Referee Christodoulou had whistled for a number of fouls throughout the game without showing any cards, with Binfield's striker James Knight in particular a persistent offender benefitting from the referee's leniency. However, 10 minutes from time he was given no option but to give a second yellow to Bassett's Sam Packer when Packer prevented a quick free kick being taken. Having already been booked the Bassett midfielder could not have been surprised to see another yellow followed by the obligatory red. Sensing blood Binfield stepped up their game and Bassett were now really up against it from a very lively and skilful Binfield side. All credit to the remaining 10 players who worked hard during those closing minutes to prevent the visitors finding a winner. It was the same story throughout the 30 minutes of extra time as the 10 men denied the visitors that second goal. To be honest neither side looked likely to score during the extra half hour as the expected onslaught from Binfield didn't happen. Dan Comer, Nathan Hawkins and George Drewitt, in particular were outstanding in extra time and ensured the game remained level. So a Monday night replay down in Berkshire it is, with a 7.45pm kick-off.

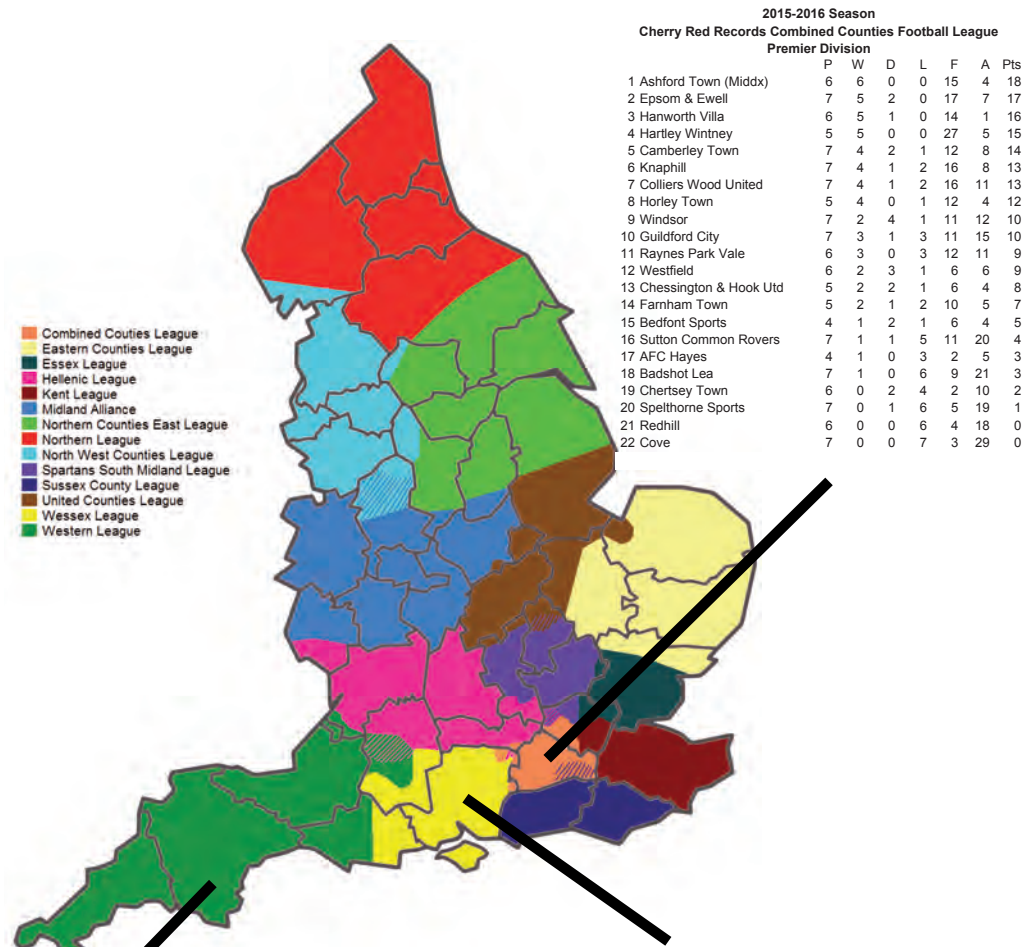
