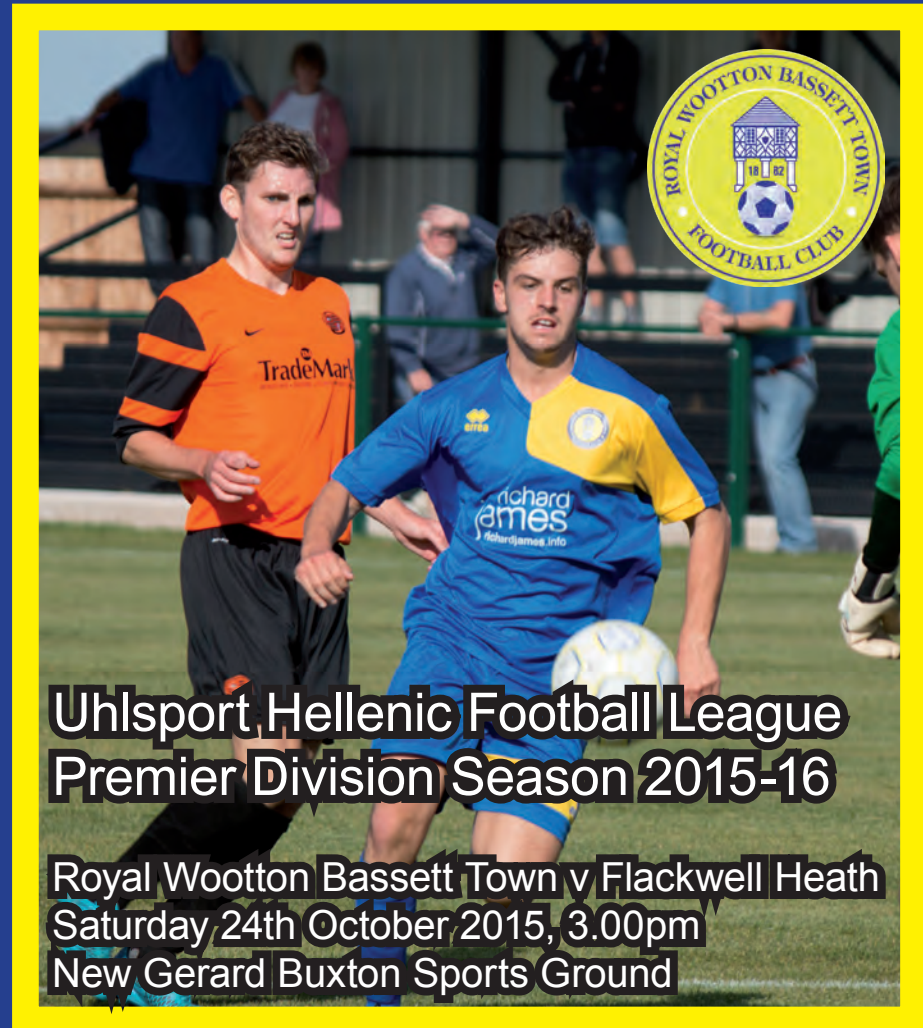

Editorial & RWBTFC News

Welcome to Flackwell Heath

A warm welcome to Flackwell Heath who have made the journey up from Buckinghamshire for this afternoon's UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. We hope all from Flackwell enjoy their visit to our new ground and we wish them a safe journey home.

This same fixture was our last game of last season and we lost that game 5-0 to a rampant Flackwell side who had already been crowned champions of the UHlsport Hellenic League. This was expected to be our last game against Flackwell for some time as they progressed up into the Southern League. That the two sides meet again here today is down to the Football Association and yet another one of their silly decisions (this one is up there with our demotion a few seasons back). Flackwell had been looking forward to progressing up into Step 4 and playing in the Southern League Central Division One. In the Central Division there would have been a number of local derbies and the vast majority of games would have been within a 30 mile radius of their Wilks Park ground. However, in their infinite wisdom the Southern League and the FA decided that Flackwell along with Marlow and Burnham would all be moved to the Southern League South & West Division One in order to accommodate the relegation of Clevedon Town from the South West Division. Despite protests from all three Clubs the Southern League stuck by their decision which was ratified by the FA. The change of division would have increased the travel for Flackwell from around 1,400 cumulative miles to well over 3,000 miles, considerably increasing the financial cost of operating at the Step 4 level. Consequently the club's committee after very careful consideration took the decision to refuse promotion and stay in the UHlsport Hellenic League. In the circumstances this decision was understandable and should send a message to the FA that they need to spend more time doing their Geography revision before doing their league allocation exam each year. For the pyramid to work teams need to be progressing up and down each season but the FA have yet to crack the geography question, despite many attempts. Thankfully the stupidity of Oxford City playing in the National League North has been corrected this season and it is good to see Oxford now doing so well having switched to the South Division. Unfortunately Gloucester City continues to play in the North, with trips to Bradford, Manchester, Harrogate and Stockport amongst others. It is not surprising that in contrast to Oxford who are in second place they are in the bottom three.

In the other game with Flackwell last season we left Wilks Park with a point when two late goals from Sam English in the August fixture gave us a share of the spoils. The two sides have already met at Wilks Park already this season and we suffered our biggest defeat of the season going down 7-2, Steve Robertson with our two consolation goals. I know Paul will be looking for a reaction from his players to this heavy defeat and we are fortunate to welcome back our three key defenders from suspension today to strengthen the squad.

Abingdon United

Despite missing suspended defenders Dale Richards, Nathan Hawkins and George Drewitt and with Adam Corcoran also being unavailable we were able to secure all three points last Saturday against an improving Abingdon United. We were certainly helped by Steve Yeardeley's intended operation being postponed allowing him to play and on the day Matt Cheetham was simply outstanding as the stand-in centre half. There was also a great First Team debut for Under 18 player Martin Sinclair and all-in-all I thought it was an excellent performance from the side and three very vital points. In my view the young Abingdon side will certainly take points against a lot of sides before the season is out. In the end the first half header from Dan Bailey and the penalty from the ever reliable Steve Olphert (they always seem to be awarded at the bottom end of the ground) secured those three points. These notes are being prepared ahead of Tuesday's visit to Longlevens. Hopefully by the time you read this editorial we will have three more points on the board. It was pleasing to see the gate for the Abingdon game creep back up. After having loads of programmes left over the week before for the Ludgershall game I cut the number back by 20 and we then sold out for the Abingdon game!

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to the management team and players from Flackwell Heath to the New Gerard Buxton Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture.

I missed last week's game due to a family function but stayed in touch with Chris via Marcus. Given the difficult circumstances we went into the game with four of our defensive regulars missing this was a tremendous result and defensive performance. I think Scoop in his match report that this was only the second clean sheet of my regime. I understand from everyone that Cheets had a fantastic game at centre-back. At the start of the season he was not making the starting eleven, he never moaned but he waited his chance and now is a regular in our starting line up. Similarly Olph's both are now showing why I brought them both to this football club.

These notes are being prepared ahead of Tuesday's visit to Longlevens. We played them last season in the cup, losing after extra time and would have been looking to avenge that defeat in our first league encounter with them. Hopefully by the time you read these notes we will have three more points to our total.

For both Tuesday and today's game we should have Nathan Hawkins, Dale Richards and George Drewitt back from suspension and also Adam Cocoran back available for selection. Given the result against Abingdon it will be tough to bring them all back in and it is nice to have that selection challenge. Flackwell will be tough opponents and we have conceded twelve goals against them in our last two meetings. We will be looking for an improvement on those last two games but know it will again be tough. Flackwell Heath are reigning champions and at the time of writing are again at top of the league. Really Flackwell should be playing Southern League football this season and it is a shame they were messed around by the Southern League and the FA. It will be interesting to see what they do at the end of this season if they once again win the UHlsport Hellenic League.

After today we have five games on the road starting with a trip to Highmoor Ibis on Monday, always a tough place to visit and even more so on a Monday night. At the moment we do not have a fixture next Saturday and the next fixture would be a midweek trip to Bristol to play Tytherington Rocks in the Floodlit Cup. We then have three away league games in the space of eight days against Bracknell Town, Brimscombe & Thrupp and Thatcham Town. It would be as good if as many of you as possible could travel to give the lads your support in these tough and important away games.

Our next home game here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground is not until Saturday 21st November when we entertain Milton United. We then have a social event in the clubhouse that evening and it would be good to see as many as possible of you attending. There will be Indian food available, a band and the cost is very cheap at £5 a head.

Opponents - History

Flackwell Heath • Club History



Flackwell Heath FC was founded in 1907 and the club joined the High Wycombe and District League for its inaugural season. The Heathens proved to be a major force in local football, having won twelve Wycombe League championship titles and fourteen High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup finals.

In the 1950's Flackwell joined the Great Western Combination League and won this league twice before returning to the Wycombe League. In 1956 the club moved to its current home, the new ground being donated by the Wilks family.

Through the 60s and 70's the club continued their success on and off field and the new clubhouse was built in 1974 as the first stage of their rise into senior football. In 1975 The Heathens won the Berks and Bucks Intermediate Cup and the Reading Senior Cup. In 1977 the club achieved Senior status and moved up into the Hellenic League Division One. Promotion to the Premier Division was achieved at the first attempt. After five seasons in this league, during which time floodlights were installed at Wilks Park, Flackwell were elected into the Athenian League. In 1984 they joined the expanding Isthmian League. The clubs first season in this competition saw them playing in Division Two (North) and against some tough opposition they finished in a respectable eighth position. The following season Flackwell was switched to Division Two (South) where life turned out to be even tougher. At the end of season 1990-91, after finishing below mid-table, The Heathens found themselves placed in the newly formed Ryman League Division Three.

At this stage the club installed a 150 seater stand to stay in senior football, and new home changing rooms were built to comply with new ground gradings. For the next 10 years the club carried out further ground improvements and they established themselves in senior football.

In 2002/03 for the first time in their history Flackwell reached the 4th qualifying round of the FA Cup losing 4-1 at home against Crawley and finished third in the newly formed Ryman League Division Two, the highest position achieved to date.

In 2003/04 Flackwell won The High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup for the twelfth time. In season 2004/05 The Heathens reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup for the second time in three years, this time losing 3-0 at Ryman Premier Division Billericay Town and were runners-up in the Ryman League Associate Members Cup, losing 2-1 after extra time to Division Two champions Ilford on their own ground. The Veterans team won the FA Umbro Sunday Cup, lead by Byron Walton a feat which was repeated in 2006 and 2007. After winning the National final the lads went to The Bernabeu Stadium and played against Real Madrid veterans for the European Cup and lost by 3-1.

Flackwell finished fourth in Ryman League Division Two in 2005/06, narrowly missing out on promotion. After the end of 2006/07 the FA reorganised the non-league pyramid and we were due to be relegated into the South Midlands Spartan League until Barking and East Ham United went out of business and we were given the opportunity to take their place in the Ryman Division One (North). Unfortunately we finished bottom of the league and were relegated into the Hellenic Premier Division for season 2008/09.

In 2007/08 season we held our centenary game against Wycombe Wanderers with a crowd of 1300 watching Peter Taylor's first game in charge at Wycombe.

In our first season in the Hellenic League we finished in 9th position and lost 2-1 to Chalfont Wasps in the final of the High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup at Adams Park. In 2010/11 we got to two cup finals but both were lost on penalty shoot-outs, The Berks & Bucks Trophy to Newport Pagnell and the Reading Senior Cup to Newbury Town.

The 2014/15 season, managed by Graham Malcolm and assisted by Paul Shone, saw us gain promotion into the Southern League Division 1. However, a late move by the Southern League of us from the Central Division into the South West Division meant FHFC were unable to accept promotion and we stay in the Hellenic League Premier Division for season 2015-16. 2014-15 also saw us with places in the final of the Berks & Bucks Trophy (losing to Windsor FC) and the High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup (winning against Penn & Tylers Green FC). Earlier that season we reached the fourth qualifying round of the FA Cup losing to Conference side Weston Supermare 4-1. For the first time in club history we also reached the last sixteen of the FA Vase losing 3-2 to Shaw Lane Aquaforce.

Defunct Opponents

A look back at former opponents no longer competing, today's featured team is.....

Walcot Athletic



Walcot Athletic started life in the Swindon & District League and were runners-up in the 1974-75 Swindon and District League Division Two. Soon after they progressed to the Wiltshire League where they started to make a name for themselves as they won Division Three of the higher level County League in 1976-77. In 1978-79 they finished runner-up in Division Four of the County League, presumably having suffered relegation somewhere in between, unless the 1978-79 triumph was their reserve side. In the 1980's they won both Division Four (1985-86) and Division Three (1989-90)

and also finished runners-up in Division Three (1981-82). The 1980's also saw them as an excellent cup side winning the Ghia Junior Cup in both 1987-88 and 1988-89 and finishing runners-up in the two seasons before and after their cup triumphs. The 1988-89 triumph came at the expense of Wootton Bassett Town Reserves, the winner coming in extra time. Walcot had recorded convincing victories against Wootton Bassett Town Reserves in their two league encounters, and took the lead just before the break, despite Wootton Bassett having the majority of the first half chances. Chappell equalised for Wootton Bassett to force extra time midway through the second half, but Wootton Bassett were to be undone by a 106th minute strike. For any side to make four consecutive cup finals is a major achievement. Their greatest achievement came in 1991-92 when they finished runners-up in Division Two of the County League.

They played on pitches at Shrewsbury Road in Walcot and also at Croft Sports Centre. In terms of meetings with Wootton Bassett Town it would have been our Reserve side who would have been regular opponents but the First Team were in the same division for a couple of seasons in Division Two of the County League in the mid 1980's. In 1983-84 the two sides drew both games. At Rylands Way the two sides shared four goals and the points, Kevin Bishop and John Small on target for Wootton Bassett. In the return game at Walcot neither side managed to find the net. The two sides also met at the end of the season in the Subsidiary Cup and the two sides again drew a game 2-2 at Rylands Way. Unfortunately the result of the game at Walcot in this competition is one of the missing results we have not been able to trace from that season. Whilst Wootton Bassett Town ended the season in fourth place, Walcot Athletic were not quite so successful, finishing down in tenth place.

The following season saw Wootton Bassett Town march to the Division Two title and this included a handsome victory at Rylands against Walcot. Goals from Gary Dixon (2), Brian Fingleton, Kevin Bishop and Roger Bishop on the 1st of September 1984 saw Wootton Bassett triumph 5-0. The return at Walcot in April, as was the case the previous season, ended goalless in what was the final game of the season in the league but by then the title had been secured. As Wootton Bassett were promoted to Division One, never to return to Division Two, Walcot Athletic finished in sixth place.

Like many Swindon sides during the 1990's, the name Walcot Athletic was to eventually disappear from the Wiltshire football scene. The old Walcot Athletic Club is understood to have become Dunbar Athletic, which then was renamed Dunbar Wills, then became Dunbar Westside upon merging with the Westside youth team and then just plain Westside. Westside were then eventually to become Southbrook FC who today play in what is now the Premier Division of the Wilts County League. The old Walcot Athletic players are known to hold the occasional team reunion and the Swindon Evening Advertiser carried the story of one such reunion in May 2009. Former top players include the likes of Joe O'Rourke.

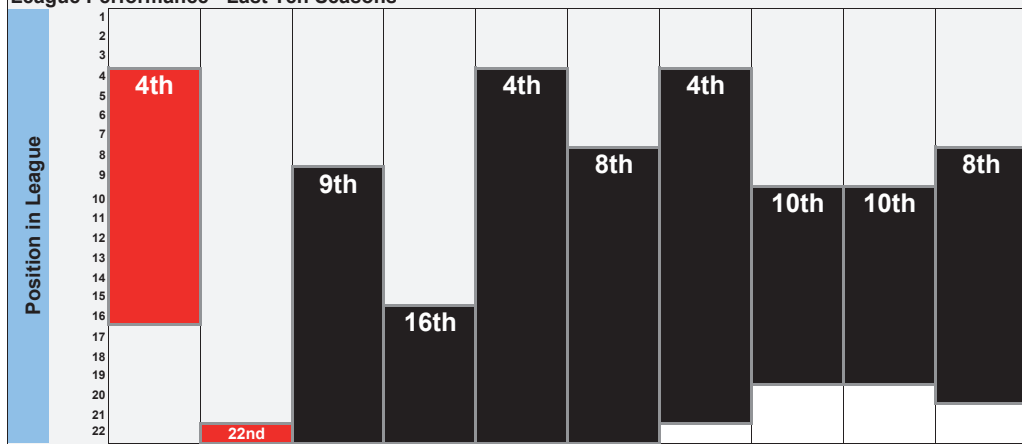

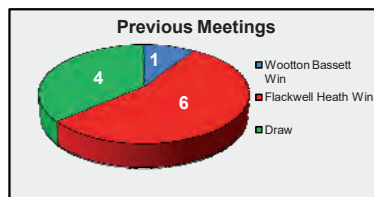
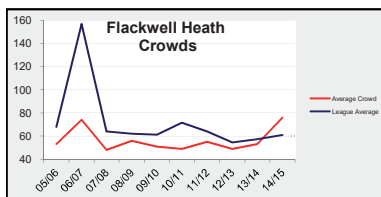

Reminiscing - The Good Old Days

MS: What do you view as the funniest moment watching, supporting and reporting on Wootton Bassett Town?

SS: Probably seeing Mick Byrne lobbed from the halfway line when he had to go in goal against Gloucester United. Although it came in defeat, it's something that sticks in the memory.

MS: You have worked occasionally for the Swindon Advertiser Sports Desk. What was it like working for a group of professional journalists and what did you learn from them that you have brought into your reporting?

SS: Having witnessed some of their behaviour, 'professional' is an interesting adjective to use... But I jest. It has been great working with them throughout the years. All the journalists at the Adver who I've had dealings with have been brilliant – they're an extremely hard working bunch and they're dedication to local sports is something that shouldn't be taken for granted. I owe a particular debt to Craig Lyus, Steve Butt, Ned Payne – all of who have since moved on elsewhere – and Owen Houlihan for the opportunities they've given me. I had my first by-line when I was aged 13 and it was always neat to see my name next to a report I'd written in the paper. Opening up the sports section on a Monday afternoon when I got home from school was always exciting because of that. In terms of bringing anything into my own reporting, they taught me the importance of writing with your own voice and style. That's something that I've particularly picked up from reading reports by the likes of Jon Ritson and Sam Morshead, who are two high calibre journalists.

MS: When you were a young referee you were headbutted by a player which made the national press as well as the local press. Sky Sports tried to interview you at the time but your mother wouldn't let you do the interview, they had to do with Mike Benson instead. Could that interview with Sky Sports have been your big break in football journalism?

SS: It wasn't that mum wouldn't let me do the interview; it's more she answered the phone when they rang and said I wouldn't be interested...I can't recall Mr. Benson appearing in the feature they did, but will take your word for it. All I remember is that they sent a journalist to Lydiard Park – where the incident happened – and mentioned that on the pitches behind them a young referee had been assaulted. I don't think it would have been my big break in football journalism, but I like to think I would have caused a stir with what I said had I had the opportunity to appear.

MS: In covering Wootton Bassett Town you will have gone to many grounds around the South of England. What do you consider to be the best ground you have visited and what was the worst ground?

SS: The best ground I've visited is without doubt Rylands Way. In terms of opposition grounds I'd say Didcot's – great pitch and brilliant facilities and one of the places that helped inspire our new home. There are a number of grounds, which are not all necessarily the prettiest, but that I've enjoyed going to: Purton, Brockenhurst, Brimscombe and Thrupp and Shortwood United. The worst would be Trowbridge's, partly because it's a bit ramshackle, but mostly because of that game at the end of the 2005-06 Season. Neither Easington Sports nor Pegasus Juniors' old ground inside the racecourse rank highly too. Saying that, it's a bit unfair to pick a 'worst' ground. We're fortunate to have a fantastic facility that we now call home, and it's something I'd like to see all teams we visit benefit from having. As a club, that's what we should champion.

MS: Finally I ask all the former players about the alleged 'Bassett Bobble'. As the match reporter who has also played at Rylands Way what are your thoughts on this matter?

SS: The 'Bassett Bobble' was a fact and caught me out many a time when I was warming up as a sub for our youth team or for the Under 18s...

Flackwell firepower leaves Bassett shell-shocked

Wilks Park, 22nd August 2015

Twenty torturous second half minutes set the stage for a crushing defeat for Royal Wootton Bassett Town as Flackwell Heath's four goal salvo in that period helped the classy reigning champions on their way to a 7-2 victory.

That spell, in which the Buckinghamshire outfit ruthlessly exploited the left side of Bassett's defence, ensured it was a country mile separating the teams at full time, rather than the width of a cigarette paper which could have been placed between the sides an hour earlier at the culmination of the game's opening period. At the stage Flackwell held a slender 2-1 advantage, an entertaining and relatively even opening period having produced opportunities at both ends. The Heathens were their typical selves, seeking to switch play at every available opportunity to bring dangerous wingers Dan Rapley and Seb Bowerman into the fray, with frontman Dan Burnell lurking between the lines to try and drag the Bassett defence out of shape. Largely though the visitors coped with what their opponents threw at them. Indeed, were it not for two instances of Bassett's defence switching off, and with a bit more luck for frontman Steve Robertson, it could even have been the visitors who went into the break in front. Saying that is pure conjecture though, and likely wouldn't have prevented the battering Bassett later took.

In the game's fourth minute, home 'keeper Dan Weait, attempting to deal with a woeful James Tripp backpass by sidestepping a pressing Sam Packer, presented Robertson with an open goal, but the forward blazed over from the edge of the area. Minutes later the hosts were in front. Receiving Joel Jacobs' short corner, Dan Burnell curled a low effort towards the far right corner, where Chris Hurst – his run unchecked - was on hand to ensure the ball wound up in the back of the net. However, after surviving a brief period of Flackwell dominance in which Curtis Meare expertly repelled a rasping Liam Tack drive, Bassett soon restored parity. Seizing on the Heathens' failure to clear from a throw deep in their territory, Dane Moulden stole possession on the edge of the box. Showing some quick feet, he shuffled the ball out to Robertson, who thrashed a stunning left foot drive from an angle into the roof of the net. Having survived scares as Rapley flashed an instinctive strike across the face of goal and Hurst snatched at a header from close range, it appeared as though Bassett were on course to go into the break on level terms. Another lapse in concentration put paid to that though. When the majority of the home side went up appealing for a penalty for an alleged Adam Corcoran handball, the Bassett defence stopped in their tracks. Hurst didn't though, and from a narrow angle on the right he arrowed into opposite corner.

While disappointing to be behind, there were plenty of positives Paul Braithwaite's team could take from their performance in the opening period. How quickly that was undone, however. Flackwell's decision to swap Rapley, perhaps the Hellenic League's preeminent performer, from the left wing to the right proved inspired and paid immediate dividends. Within three minutes he had the ball in the back of the net. Burnell clipped a through pass into the right channel for Rapley to run onto as he breezed beyond Dale Richards. Initially it appeared as though the winger would not make it, but, outstretched, he was able to guide home beyond Meare. That sparked a goal-rush. With 55 minutes on the clock, Rapley and Burnell exchanged passes to unlock room in the right corner and the former cut back for the onrushing Mitchell Woodward to steer in for the hosts' fourth. Flackwell's tally for the afternoon soon became five: Rapley whipped in a cross from the right, which Corcoran was unfortunate to slice into his own net. Their sixth then came from a lightning fast counter. Kalum Youngsam had got in behind the Flackwell defence only to see Weait smother at his feet. Less than thirty seconds later, play was at the other end, Hurst racing through the middle, rounding Meare and slotting home. Robertson stemmed the bleeding with quarter of an hour to go, diverting Packer's mishit long range drive beyond Weait. But Burnell made certain that his side's margin of victory was five, scoring with an outrageous arcing chip from 25 yards after having shrugged off the attentions of Moulden.

Man of the Match: Sam Packer – his displays so far this season have been positive and this one was no different for the creative midfielder. It was playing through Packer, wise and clever on the ball, that Bassett appeared to threaten most.

Reminiscing - The Good Old Days

MS: A follow-up question that Dip has asked me to ask you. Did Dave "Chogi" Jones pay you to make him man of the match so many times?

SS: No. He was just a quality centre midfielder!

MS: Rumour has it that you scored a winning goal at the County Ground in the pre-match entertainment for one of our County Cup wins. How much do you remember of that evening and do you think that win helped inspire the First Team also to win that night?

SS: That's not a rumour. That's fact. It was from a long Brett Embling throw-in, and I either volleyed or headed it in. This was back in the days when I was a striker! I can't quite remember the details though seeing as it took place 16 years ago now. I'd like to think it inspired the First Team, but I can't say that it did. That was a great evening though, and I can remember going up to the top of the Arkell's Stand during the First Team's match with Pewsey and bashing on the steel at the back of the stands in support of the team, which you probably told me off for...

MS: You also played in the same youth team as Phil Tearle and Jonny Aitkenhead, two players who would go onto play for the First Team. What are your thoughts of Phil no longer playing and Jonny playing for Highworth Town?

SS: It's unfortunate that Phil is no longer playing, but he had a bad knee injury a couple of years ago, which kept him out of the game for a while. He was a fantastic forward: lightning quick with a keen eye for goal and it would be nice if he was still playing for Bassett as he had the talent to be a quality player. His hat-trick in a cup match at Letcombe in Crazy's final year as manager showed what ability he had. With Jonny, it's fantastic to see him doing well. It's just a shame that he's playing for Highworth and not with Bassett! While not the world's most skilful footballer, he loves a tackle and reads the game extremely well. After stepping into the First Team in 2007-08 alongside Phil, he was messed around a bit by Dave Turner the following pre-season and left for Shrivenham where he quickly established himself. He had a year back with Bassett when Jeff Roberts was manager, but was frustrated first by an injury and then by Jeff not giving him a fair crack of the whip, so I completely understand why he's made his name elsewhere. Also, you forgot I played with George Drewitt and it was brilliant to see him do so well last year after a number of years in the Reserves. I've got every faith that he'll continue to perform at a high level now that he's got that year of First Team experience under his belt.

MS: What would you view as the greatest game that you have reported on for the club?

SS: There are a few that stand out. Most recently there were the FA Cup wins under Dave Turner against Hamworthy United - a real battling display – and then Highworth Town in 2012. Going back to when Pete was boss, there was the Bank Holiday victory away against the powerful Didcot Town when Ben Gascoyne, Matt Bennett and John Magani all scored. Last year's Vase win at Cove was a superb contest too. But probably the greatest game was the FA Cup victory against Bracknell Town, who were then in the Southern League, in 2007. Beating a team two divisions above us at the time was a stunning achievement, and it was fitting that two Bassett boys – Dip, who scored both goals, and Crazy, as manager – were responsible for that triumph.

MS: Conversely what was the game you have reported on that you most like to forget, I assume it was that Highworth game?

SS: Seeing Highworth seal the title at Rylands Way on the day that our relegation from the Hellenic Premier was confirmed wasn't nice. But the game that I'd most like to forget was when we lost away at Trowbridge Town at the back end of the following season to end our chances of automatically bouncing back. We absolutely battered Trowbridge that evening, but failed to take our chances, while Trowbridge got the only goal of the game; we should have had a penalty too. That hurt more than any other game, because the team – full of a great bunch of characters and players - had been on a magnificent 13 game unbeaten league run, in which they'd conceded just eight goals. A point at Trowbridge, followed by a win against Easington in the final game would have been enough to seal promotion, but it wasn't to be.



This week with Stuart Smedley

MS: When did you first start doing the match reports for Wootton Bassett Town?

SS: I began writing reports for the website back in the 2002-03 season, when I was 12. After the Holland Tour in April of that year (when I acquired my nickname) we all had to put together a project, which was assessed by Chris 'Football Grandad' Kirkland. I enjoyed doing that, which gave me the idea to ask then-first team manager Pete Yeardeley if I would be able to write reports for the first team games, which would be published on the website, which my brother Scott was designing. I remember the first game I reported on: a 2-1 victory at home against Gloucester United at Rylands Way. Back then we were a side who often found ourselves battling at the foot of a very strong Hellenic Premier Division, so that victory may have given me false expectations as to what to expect following the team. Still, it's been fantastic fun covering the team since then.

MS: Over the years you will have had to deal with a fair few managers, I am thinking Pete Yeardeley, Chris Jones, Paul Burke, Dave Turner, Jeff Roberts and Paul Braithwaite. Which manager was the easiest to deal with and why?

SS: Tough to answer, but I'd probably go for Pete and Braithwaite. Pete because he, along with Mick Byrne and the players at the time, made that weird kid with the notepad hanging out by the dugout at each game welcome. Then with Paul, he is great to deal with as he'll provide me with news and quotes to include in articles that help make my life easier. None of them would probably say that I'm particularly easy to deal with though!

MS: On the other hand who was the most difficult to deal with and again why was that?

SS: It's hard to decide between Paul Burke and Dave Turner for this one. Both could be difficult, but in a positive way. They were managers who wore their heart on their sleeve and would never refrain from airing their opinion (which is how I think I am too). That sometimes led to criticism of my reports and evaluation of performances. Equally, they were both honest people and generally accepting of what I wrote and never stopped me from having an opinion. After Dave's final game as a manager before his tragic death (a 2-1 win for Bassett against his Shrivenham side), he text me to say he thought that my report was an extremely fair one. That sums up his character: it was a nice touch and will live with me.

MS: Have any of the players ever got upset with what you have written in your match report and sent an email or confronted you in the clubhouse or up town?

SS: I've never been confronted in the clubhouse or had any angry emails from players because of what I have written, but I'm sure many have got upset before (assuming they read the reports)! I've had a couple of arguments with Dip down the years, though that was more for rash comments made during games towards him (I'm thinking mostly of when he got sent off in the FA Vase away at Christchurch for a stamp and when he finally missed a penalty in a cup game at home against Cheltenham Saracens).

MS: Is it right that when people ask you which team you support you tell them Royal Wootton Bassett Town? Surely you must also have a favourite professional team?

SS: What else am I going to say?! Sometimes I'll say that I support Swindon Town when the inevitable follow up question "No, but which team do you really support?" comes up. I always look out for their results and wish to see them do well, but really there's no professional team that I support. Thank god I've avoided falling into the trap of following the blue and white hooped rubbish that you follow...

MS: You will have written about a lot of players but which eleven players would make your dream team?

SS: Stewart Thompson in goal. At the back: Steve Yeardeley, Stuart Lamont, Chris Oram and Paul Patel. In midfield: Matt Bennett, Mark Vaughan, Dave Jones and Ben Gascoyne. Up front: Shaun Terry and Neil Bridges Steve Robertson.

MS: Not a bad team that. Thought Dave Jones would be in there!

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

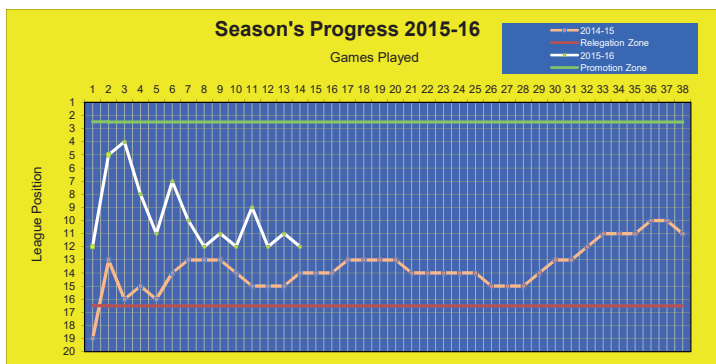
Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away.

With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year ground share with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year playing its games in Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and record points haul in the division. This season sees the club playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name.

Comer is the son of former long-time Bassett keeper Paul Comer.

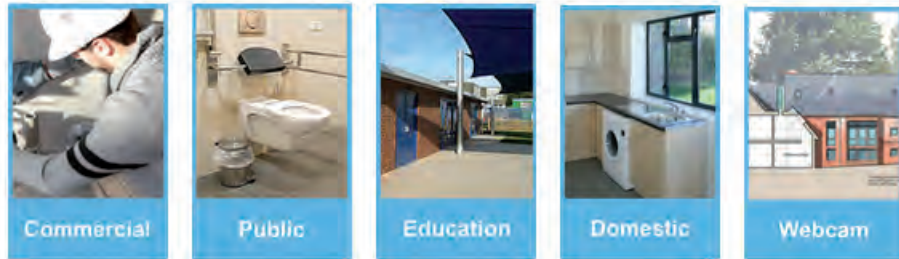

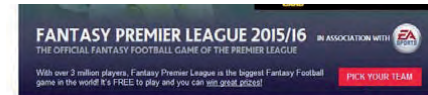

F.A. Cup

Who doesn't love a Cup comeback? We do, and so do Westfields. Evo-Stik NLP South Kidsgrove were 4-0 up at half time against their Midland League opposition. Suddenly, something changed. By the time the full-time whistle went after extra-time Westfields won 6-5 to progress. Talk about getting your money's worth.

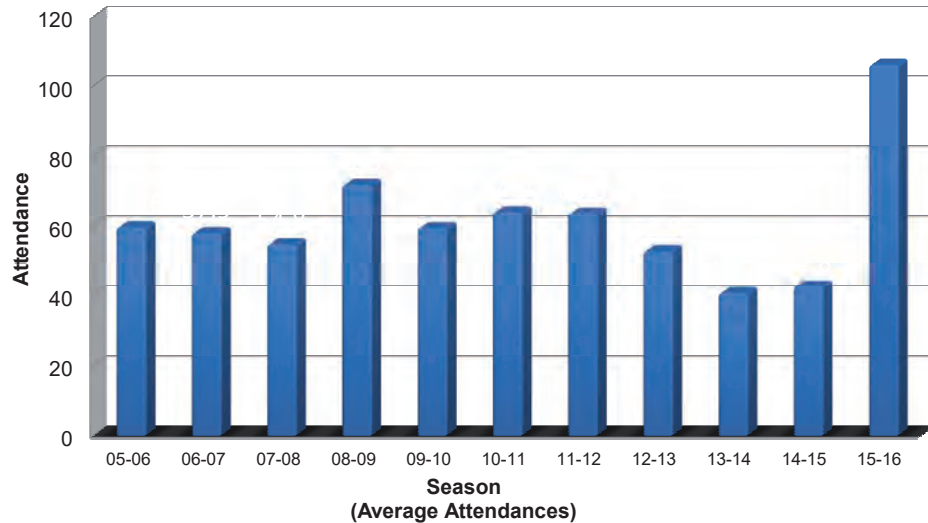

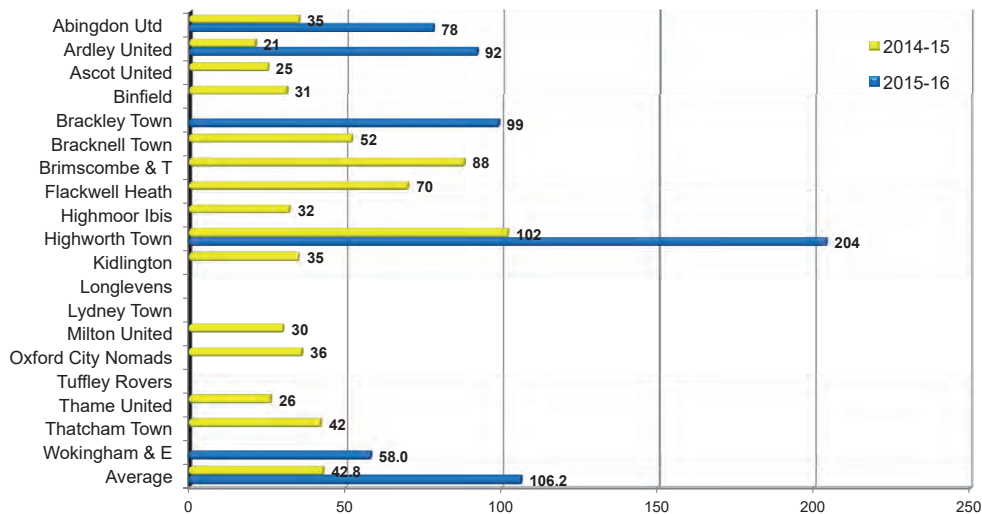

Match Reports

Defence make their case in comfortable win

New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, 17th October

If one criticism could be made of Royal Wootton Bassett Town under Paul Braithwaite's stewardship it would be the lack of clean sheets that the team have been able to keep. Only twice in 38 league games last season did Bassett not concede, while, going into their return league encounter with Abingdon United, they had pitched just one shutout so far this campaign.

They now have double that number - and another three points to boot following a 2-0 victory, despite missing Adam Corcoran, George Drewitt, Nathan Hawkins and Dale Richards from their back line. The selection dilemma posed by that quartet's absence - three were missing through suspension - meant shifting to a back three consisting of regular full back Dan Comer, Steve Yeardley, who has made most of his appearance this season in midfield, and central midfielder Matt Cheetham. And they didn't put a foot wrong all afternoon, nullifying any threat posed by the visitors, who, although struggling in the league, looked much sharper and well drilled than in the teams' meeting a month ago and enjoyed long periods of possession. Cheetham especially was imperious. A player who was frequently an unused substitute at the beginning of the season, he continued the trend of making the most of the opportunities afforded to him with a quality performance in an unfamiliar position. The defensive trio made sure it was a quiet afternoon for 'keeper Luke Kuczynski, who was only brought into action once - in the contest's 64th minute - when he had to tip over John Dennis' powerfully struck long range drive. Their efficiency and organisation meant that a pair of bookend goals, the first ten minutes in, the second ten minutes from time, were all that Bassett needed to secure victory on their return to league action.

They went ahead with the first opportunity of the game. A well worked attack was kept alive by Joe Hiscock and, after receiving a neat set back from impressive debutant Martin Sinclair in the left corner, Harvey Scholes delivered a towering cross which Dan Bailey was on hand to bravely head in at the far post. The rest of the opening period was something of a slow burner as a midfield battle emerged. But at no point did the hosts look likely to concede. At the other end, meanwhile, Steve Robertson twice failed to find the target from difficult angles after being slipped through by Sam Packer. Shortly before the break Scholes was presented with a good opening too as a defensive header failed to sufficiently clear the danger posed by a speculative ball into the box from Packer. However the Bassett wide man, after cutting in onto his favoured right foot failed to test 'keeper Jack Griffiths with a curling shot.

The woodwork was next to deny the hosts. Three minutes after the restart Steve Olphert intercepted an attempted clearance before Yeardley threaded a pass to Robertson, who saw his weighted shot cannon off the bar. Proceedings had begun to open up and, after Kuczynski's lone save, Sinclair snatched at a header from ten yards as he connected with Hiscock's floated cross. Midway through the second period, Bassett's job was made somewhat easier when Tom Booker picked up two yellow cards within a matter of seconds. His first came for his reaction to a foul from Robertson, who was treading a fine line himself after being cautioned in the opening period. The reason for Booker's second yellow wasn't immediately apparent, though it was likely for dissent aimed at the referee. That numerical advantage led to a flurry of chances for the home side. Bailey saw a close range strike deflected wide following a twisting run inside from the right before Scholes was denied at point blank range by Griffiths as he this time got on the end of a Hiscock delivery. The points were finally made fully secure by Olphert, who swept home from the penalty spot for the fifth time this campaign following a trip on Robertson by Abingdon captain Jamie Essex. It could then have been three late on as a Scholes daisy-cutter had an outstretched Griffiths beaten, but his effort only found the left upright. Another goal would only have added a slight extra touch of glass on the performance. Instead, it was the clean sheet that stood out most in a good afternoon's work.

Man of the Match: Matt Cheetham - although not in his most comfortable position, he made it look as though he was a natural centre half. Dominant in the air and in the tackle, Cheetham also sought to play the ball out from the back in another impressive display.

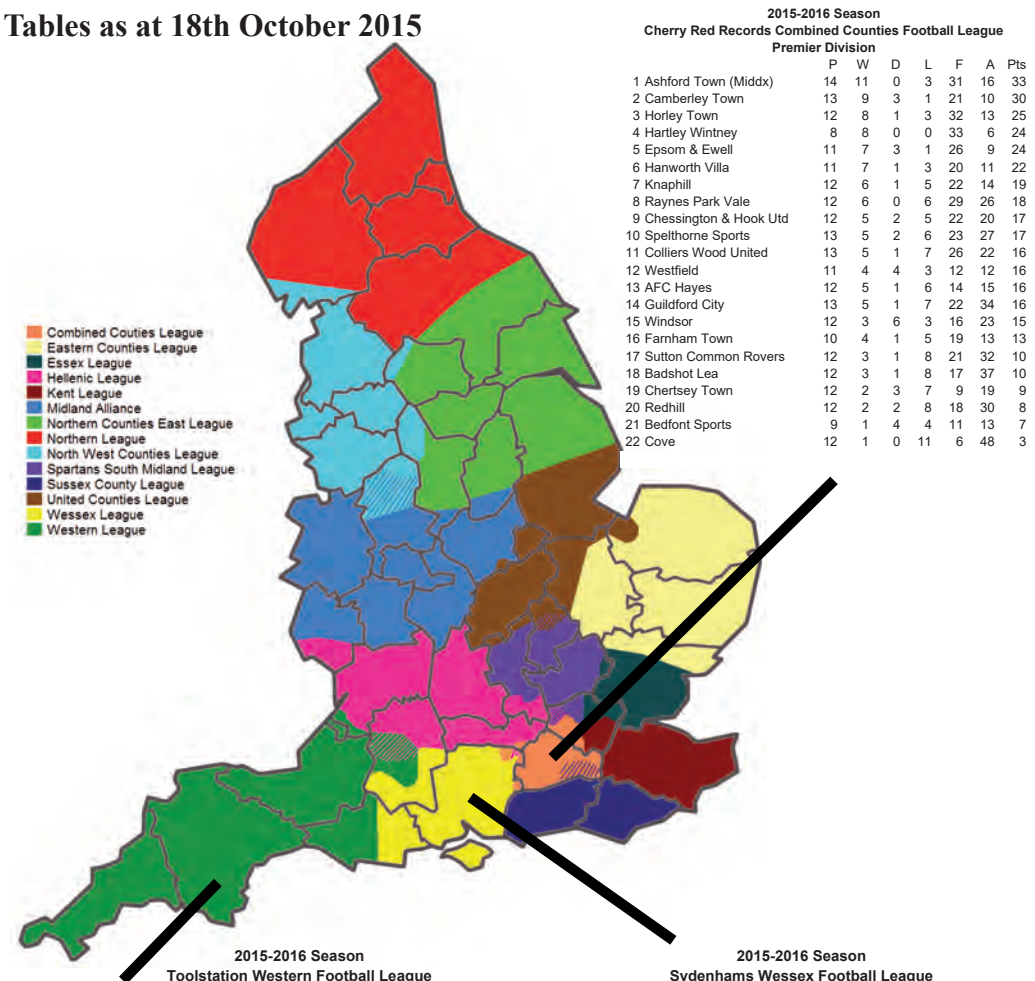
