Welcome to Oxford City Nomads

Today's visitors are Oxford City Nomads for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. A warm welcome to all from Oxford who have made the journey to Wootton Bassett for this league fixture, we hope you enjoy your first visit to our new ground and we wish you a safe journey home.

The two sides have met each other on 11 occasions previously with Oxford City Nomads having the upper hand with 5 wins, to 4 for Bassett with 2 drawn games, all 11 meetings having come in league matches. Earlier this season goals from substitutes Ryan Thomas and Harvey Scholes gave us all 3 points in a 2-0 win at Oxford. Bassett's biggest win against the Nomads came in Season 2010-11 when we hit 8 goals without reply, Alex Green having a good day at the office with half of the Bassett goals. Also on target that day were Terry Adams, Sam Collier, Ethan Delaney and James Turner. Our biggest defeat came in Season 2007-8 when we last 6-2 at Oxford City, Paul Patel and Richie Saunders with our consolation goals that day.

At the time of writing these notes Oxford City Nomads sit one place below us in the league with their scheduled home fixture against Tuffley Rovers on Wednesday night being postponed. Oxford started the season brightly but are currently without a league win in their last 10 games and we will be looking to ensure that run continues here this afternoon. They have also not yet played in 2016. Top scorer so far this season is Billy Gillett with 10 goals to his name, with Kaylem Patterson 1 goal behind him. Once again we can expect another close encounter here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground as we look to get back to winning ways after two back-to-back defeats.

Ardley United

I was lucky enough to miss the two heavy defeats at Flackwell Heath and Highworth Town earlier in the season but last Saturday I did see how vulnerable this side can be to a complete collapse when our opponents get a couple of goals in front. How we can manage to lose a game 7-1 when with 25 minutes to go we are still in it at just 1-0 down is hard to explain. I am sure the management team didn't get much sleep on Saturday night as they tried to work out what went wrong. I expect that there would also have been one or two players who also would have done the same. We have now shipped 22 goals in just 3 away fixtures this season and something is not right for this to happen. How can a side that won well away at top sides Ascot United and Thatcham Town then lose so heavily to other top sides? Whilst it was an inability to defend set pieces that caused most of the goals on Saturday (and I hoped we practiced defending corners in training on Monday) for me our midfield is just not working hard enough in recent games and this is where a lot of our problems are stemming from. A few players in the side, in my opinion (and football is a game of opinions), are living a little bit off last season's performances and perhaps it is time to give the likes of Joey Hiscock more of a chance? The one thing you will get with Joey is a lot of effort and endeavour, something sadly missing from a couple of players last week once we went a couple of goals behind. Before that the effort was definitely there.

The one bright spot for me from last week's heavy defeat was seeing our new signing Jamie Richards make his Bassett debut. Having seen Jamie as a youngster playing for Greenmeadow against my own youth side I know that with Jamie the one thing you will get is a lot of effort and also a high level of technical ability. Hopefully the level of effort he will no doubt show in the coming weeks will rub off on a few others. Robbo also battled away all game on Saturday and deserved his goal but other than that I did not see much to be encouraged by. It is probably best to write that performance off as a bad day at the office and try and put things right as quickly as possible, starting here today. We should also not get carried away with our current 11th placed position. A few more defeats and we could easily get sucked into a relegation battle so it is important to bounce back straight away from last week's defeat. The two people I know who will have been hurt by the result on Saturday are Paul and Chris and I am sure they will be pulling out the stops to put things right.

Cirencester Town

The last home game saw us go out of the Bluefin Insurance Cup at the hands of Cirencester Town Development. I must confess that having come back late after half time I thought when we scored our second goal that we had gone back in front. It was only when the ref blew the final whistle and the Cirencester lads started celebrating that I realised we had lost and that I had missed a couple of their goals! I was not the only one as former manager Paul Burke asked why there was no extra time (so he must have also missed one of the Cirencester goals). A disappointing result but I must admit I was quite impressed with the Cirencester side who tried to play football in what were atrocious conditions. I don't remember such bad conditions in a long time and I am sure on a wind free day there may have been a different result. In the end Cirencester made the most of the conditions and won the tie and good luck to them in the next round. We now just have the league to concentrate on and, as noted above, we need to buck our ideas up pretty quickly to avoid getting dragged into a relegation battle. What is becoming clear is that our new ground is in something of a wind tunnel and the Committee probably need to look at putting in some quick growing conifers to try and offer up some protection to the players from the wind.

From The Dugout

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to Oxford City Nomads to the New Gerard Buxton Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture.

After the disappointment of Highworth and the great reaction from the players in the following match against Brimscombe I didn't expect to be writing another column after another heavy defeat. Our loss last week at Ardley by 7 goals to 1 was hard to understand when we had still been in the game with about 20 minutes to go. In the end we were well beaten and that final whistle could not come quickly enough. Some of the goals we conceded, a number of which came from set plays, were disappointing to say the least. Yes the pitch was poor, yes conditions were difficult but we should not have lost so heavily and we will be looking to put things right here today.

Oxford City Nomads are another side in the same area of the league table as ourselves and another one of those games that it is important to win. They started the season very well and have fallen away a bit of late but we under estimate them at our peril. Nothing short of 100% effort for 90 minutes is needed here today if we are to get something out this game.

One of the few bright spots from last week's trip to Ardley was the debut of Jamie Richards. Jamie is 25 years of age and has just joined us from Purton where he has been Fans Player of the Season and was a well respected clubman. He was previously at Cirencester Academy and went to Purton in 2008 where he has played well over 200 games. He either plays at left back or can slot in at centre back. Jamie is a great addition to the club. He is a senior Hellenic player who, given his age, will make the transition to Premier football easily. He is a 100%er in terms of dedication to football and just what we need at the club. Please join us in making Jamie welcome here at Wootton Bassett.

Aaron Oakley has also played a couple of games for us now on loan from Swindon Supermarine. At the time of writing these notes it is not clear whether Aaron will be recalled by Supermarine. Despite playing in two games where the results have been disappointing Aaron has shown what a classy player he can be and why he has represented his country (Wales) at U16, U19 and U21 levels. Aaron signed for Supermarine at the start of December 2014 from Frome Town with whom he joined at the start of that season having been released by Swindon Town in the Summer of 2014. He had two loan spells at Chippenham Town between December 2013 and April 2014. Aaron is a powerful centre half who has been plagued by injuries over the last few seasons, in particular a long-term foot injury, a stress fracture that eventually had to be operated on. He is now working his back to full fitness and looking to push for a starting place at Supermarine with Webby giving him the opportunity to get some match fitness playing for Bassett where I understand it all started for Aaron in the club's youth section. Welcome back to Wootton Bassett and best wishes from all at the club for an injury free period.

Enjoy the game this afternoon and see you in the bar afterwards.

Opponents - History

Oxford City Nomads • Club History

Oxford City Nomads is the club's Hellenic League team formed to provide a strong standard of football to local youngsters and bridge the gap between the successful Oxford City youth structure and the club's Step 2 Conference North team. The Nomads name is retained from the original association with neighbours Quarry Nomads FC in 2005 which competed for two seasons as Oxford Quarry Nomads in the Hellenic League Division One East playing at City's stadium. Upon the retirement of key officials Keith and Linda Dolton in 2007 it was decided to bring the team fully into the Oxford City structure yet ensure that the famous Nomads name lives on.



Oxford City Nomads won promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division in 2008/9 and in the first season finished in a creditable mid table position with a young team and scoring 100 goals. Season 2010/11 saw the first Oxford City Nomads team play in the FA Vase – 15 years after Oxford City were beaten finalists at Wembley. In season 2011/12 Nomads were Hellenic Champions under managers Justin Merritt and Justin Lee and in 2012/13 won the Hellenic League Cup and finished a creditable fourth in the table in their first season with ex City star Chris Fontaine as manager. Several Nomads players have progressed to play for City in the Southern League and Conference and that trend is destined to continue with a succession of youngsters currently coming through the successful development process. Last season's strong Nomads Development team in the Hellenic Division Two finished League Champions and won the League and County Cups under up and coming manager Craig Adey. This season Craig takes over the Nomads Hellenic Premier Division team and will progressively introduce the young players into the squad to compete at a senior level as part of their development route.

Quarry Nomads History

Quarry Nomads were founded in 1936, but football in Headington Quarry dates back to the latter part of the 19th century. The "Oxford Times" of 1893 reports that a football team has been formed in Quarry in direct opposition to the newly formed Headington United side, the paper also refers to them at the "semi-savages" from the Quarry. A suitable name was being considered for the team and someone suggested "The Nomads", everyone agreed. In their first season the club lifted the Oxfordshire Youth Cup. Prior to the Second World War the team played in the Oxfordshire Youth League and when the war was over the club moved onto the Oxford City Football Association where the League Challenge Cup was won in 1950. Throughout the 1950's the club played in the Oxfordshire Junior League and then the Oxford Intermediate League before joining the Oxfordshire Senior League around 1960. Quarry Nomads continued playing in the Oxfordshire Senior League until the club hit rock bottom in 1981. The last season in the Senior League was 1984-85 when the club left the league and did not compete in competitive football for two years.

Quarry Nomads reformed at the start of the 1987-88 season under the guidance of Keith Dolton a former player who has been a member of the 1966 Oxfordshire Senior Cup winning side. The club entered the Oxford City FA Junior League. In season 1988-89 the club rejoined the Oxfordshire Senior League and ultimately returned to the Senior League Premier Division.

In 1994-95 the club was accepted into the Charrington Chiltonian League and finished runners-up to champions Denham United. The 1996-97 season saw them finish in 12th spot followed by 10th position for the next two seasons. It was back to 12th spot again in the last Chiltonian Premier Division when the club, along with the rest of the Chiltonian League joined Division One (East) of the enlarged Cherry Red Records Hellenic League for the season 2000-01. Season 2002-3 saw the team carry on from where they left off the previous term. All season the side were well up with the league leaders and a final good run of results saw the club take the league title by a clear seven points. The team enjoyed a good run in the Oxfordshire Charity Cup and got as far as the semi-finals before losing 1-0 to Oxfordshire Senior League side Eynsham Association. At the Hellenic Leagues A.G.M. the club was awarded the Hungerford Trophy – a fitting honour for Quarry Nomads.



In season 2005-06 the history of Quarry Nomads moved forward one more stage with the formal association with another famous local club, Oxford City. This forward thinking partnership between two of Oxford's oldest clubs was a positive innovation for the development of players in the Oxford region and the renamed Oxford Quarry Nomads played all home 1st team matches at City's stadium and progressively adopted the Oxford City training and player development procedures.

Defunct Opponents

A look back at former opponents who are no longer competing. Today's featured team is.....

Viking Sports

Viking Sports joined the Hellenic League in Season 1980-1. They had been formed in 1945 however its roots go back a year earlier in 1944, when Roy Bartlett started his working life at the AEC Factory in Southall when London was in the midst of the German Secret Weapon onslaught in London. In the lunchtime the workers kicked a ball made up of rags and string, then challenge matches were arranged within the factory. A team was formed and the name allegedly came from a crossword puzzle from a daily paper that Roy was doing. The first match was played at Ravenor Park, Greenford against 342 Squadron ATC, the result was best forgotten as they went down 13-0.

The team became founder members of the Ealing Youth League in 1948 and they became the first youth team to visit Europe after the war. Trips into Europe were to become a tradition for the club. In 1956 they joined the Nemean League and were champions of the Nemean League and the following year won the AFA Middlesex Senior Cup. In 1967 the club moved their ground to Avenue Park, Greenford. Over the years they developed this once derelict site into a fine stadium with capacity of over 400 and excellent facilities including a covered stand behind one goal. In 1970 they joined the Middlesex League and finished runners-up in their first season. However, after 10 seasons they moved up to the Hellenic League for Season 1980-81. Under the management of Roy Ruffell they won Hellenic League Division One in Season 1985-86, scoring exactly 100 goals in the process, the ton coming from a penalty in the dying seconds of a 7-1 home victory over Lambourn Sports. They were promoted to the Premier in where they remained for two seasons, being relegated back to Division 1 after finish bottom in their second season.

In 1992 floodlights were erected and they moved across to the Combined Counties League where they were to remain for 8 seasons before a name change. Their most successful season saw them finish runners-up in 1994-95. In 1999 they changed their name to Viking Greenford continuing for another 3 seasons before folding in 2003. Famous players who have played for them include Les Ferdinand and Alan Devonshire.

Wootton Bassett Town first came to play Viking Sports in Season 1989-90 after they were relegated back down to Division One. In the first encounter on 30th September 1989 goals from Steve Ackrill, Warwick Burnett and Tony Hoare gave Wootton Bassett Town a 3-0 win down in London. In the return at Rylands Way the points were shared following a 1-1 draw, Damon York netting for Bassett. Bassett survive Oxford onslaught to take point

The Corinium Stadium, 4th April 2015

Wootton Bassett Town may have seen a two goal lead slip out of their hands, but they won't be too disappointed with the point they claimed against Oxford City Nomads in light of the second half barrage they were subjected to by their visitors.

First half goals from Nathan Gambling, who stroked home from the spot, and Dale Richards provided enough of a buffer, allowing Bassett to extend their unbeaten league run to seven games. Yet Paul Braithwaite's team certainly rode their luck.

The Nomads had demonstrated their attacking quality in the opening period, stroking the ball around at will. Yet their desire to try and pass the ball into the back of net allowed the hosts' defence to sit deep and fend off most attacks.

That allowed Bassett to eke out their advantage, albeit largely against the run of play.

The game's first real opening had fallen to the home side when, after Oxford had been penalised for Robert Gosling picking up a backpass, Dan Bailey smashed a low drive towards goal which the visitors' keeper did well to parry.

He was unable to keep out Gambling's coolly taken penalty 20 minutes in, a spot kick which had been awarded thanks to Rubin Lago's handball on the edge of the area.

It was soon 2-0 as Nathan Hawkins launched a free kick from the deep into the box, which Richie Carter headed back across goal, causing panic in the Nomads defence. Richards seized upon this,

slicing a right foot shot from close range that crept in off the right upright.

For all of their play in the final third, Oxford had yet to trouble the Bassett defence. But those two goals flicked on a switch that almost led to an immediate reply. Louis Joyce collected a corner into his feet from Zac McEachran, rolled his man and fired towards goal only to see Bailey block his shot on the line. The rebound fell for John Rixon who produced a snap effort that rattled the bar.

Moments later Bailey could have been a hero at the other end as he chested down a Gambling pass before managing to wrap his leg around a volley that appeared destined for the top corner, only to see Gosling climb high to tip over.

Tyler Sheppard then found himself in good position to add what would likely have been a game ending third but he poked straight at the 'keeper after latching onto a Carter through ball.

Unable to stretch their lead any further, Bassett were given a taste of what they would be in for following the restart when Lago made an arcing run inside from the left to avoid the offside trap and race onto McEachran's defence splitting pass. Through on goal, he should have scored, but was thwarted by Kurtis Sharkey who made a fingertip save to divert the ball around the post.

Once play resumed after the interval, the hosts found themselves pinned deep and struggling to get out of their own half. That problem worsened as Bassett legs tired as they were constantly having to chase and in the end a great deal of thanks was owed to 'keeper Sharkey to thank for preserving a point.

Opportunities continually opened up for Oxford from the hour mark onwards. Sighs of relief were

breathed when Hawkins cleared off the line as Joyce sought to stroke home from a tight angle and when Matt Peake-Pijnen headed wide from a Joyce cross with an open goal at his mercy.

With fifteen minutes remaining Nomads finally made their pressure count as John Rixon – a player who seems to enjoy playing Bassett – pounced on a loose ball, drove down the left channel into the box and arrowed into the opposite bottom corner.

Sensing blood, Oxford continued to surge forward. A quick free played into Joyce would have brought the equaliser three minutes after they had halved the deficit, but a double reaction save from Sharkey denied him.

The Bassett 'keeper was helpless to prevent the leveller when it did arrive with six minutes to go though. Nomads worked the ball to substitute Daide Parente in the left corner, who set a neat pass into the path of Rixon, lurking unguarded a few yards outside the box. And with one swing of his right boot, the midfielder thundered a drive into the top corner, Sharkey having no time to react.

The game's final act came when Sharkey smothered at the feet of Kieran Davis as Bassett clung on, literally, for the draw.

Man of the Match: Kurtis Sharkey – conceded twice, but could do little to prevent either. Otherwise the stopper was in fine form, making a trio of saves from one-on-one situations that helped preserve Bassett's unbeaten league streak.

RWBTFC History On One Page

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivensham Dave tragically passed away.

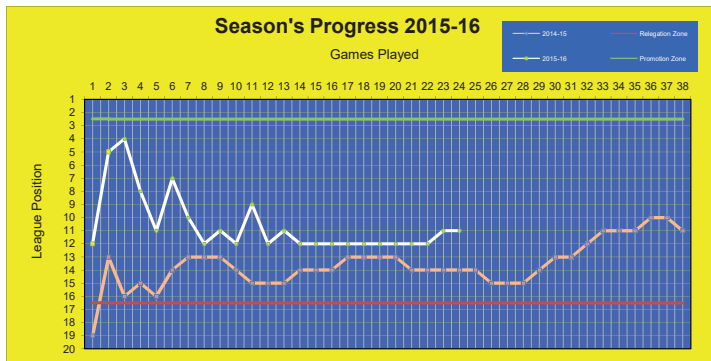
With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year ground share with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year playing its games in Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and record points haul in the division. This season sees the club playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name.

Big Crowds and a Non-League Buzz

Dulwich Hamlet launched a beer named after former player Edgar Kail – the last Non-League player to represent England – at their FA Trophy game against Guiseley.

A cult hero, his name is still sung on the terraces despite playing his final game way back in 1933.

Judging from the bar queue at Champion Hill, which sits on Edgar Kail Way, you would have been lucky to get a taste.

Every week, the club a stone's throw away from central London is packed. For their recent Ryman Premier game with Enfield 2,249 turned up – a brilliant attendance for Step 3 football.

Even last Saturday for the Trophy, where lots of clubs saw gates drop, the figure was just under 2,000.

The club have seen a real upsurge in interest, so much so they've even been given the dreaded 'hipster' label (which they aren't massive fans of apparently).

Does it help they are winning football matches and top of their league? Of course, but there's more to it than that. Prices are good and the atmosphere is great.

With Dulwich manager Gavin Rose and his staff boasting a reputation for unearthing rough diamonds and sending them on their way into the Football League, the football ain't bad either.

Apparently the burgers are good too – described by the PA announcer as the best in Non-League and not the usual type of football fare.

It's just the latest example of football fans rejecting the so-called modern game and becoming part of something. Dulwich fans put into a fund to help pay player wages.

It's their team in more ways than one. We saw it earlier in the season with Grimsby Town supporters raising more than £100,000 for their boss Paul Hurst.

With the success of fan-owned clubs like FC United and Chester, more and more want a similar feeling.

Just look at Hereford. A year ago fans were boycotting their Southern League games. Last weekend nearly 3,000 watched them in FA Vase action.

These are people who were watching League One football not so long ago. A reformed club all the way down in Step 5, is getting the public just as interested.

In the Northern League Division Two – Step 6 – South Shields are getting four-figure crowds. It helps they're in a big town and have ex-Sunderland man Julio Arca playing for them, but it just highlights the increasing desire for a good afternoon outweighing watching the game's elite.

Not every club is as lucky and struggle to pull the numbers in. But teams like Dulwich, who were skint not that long ago, are really showing the way.

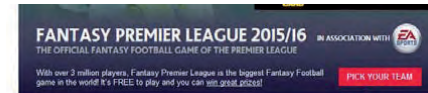

Ground Grading

THE thorny issue of ground-grading is hot topic right now. If your club wants to go up, be ready. For some, it's panic stations.

March 31 isn't far away, that's the date when houses have to be in order. Get the biscuits in the boardroom ready, the inspectors are coming.

It has been thought for some while that demands are, to say the least, well, too demanding.

Do a club who average attendances of 50 in Step 6 really need to put in an additional turnstile, with gates at Step 5 likely to swell to by a gate-clogging 20?

Can a goalkeeping coach in the National League South or North not sit outside the subs bench, instead of clubs having to put in new totally covered dug-outs for 11 rather than nine people in the leagues below?

Well if your club is going through similar structural issues, it won't be anything like what the good folk at Truro City are having to put up with.

Imagine having to fork out up to £100,000 - on a ground which is being ripped down weeks after the inspection deadline!

The White Tigers are in the mix for promotion into Non-League's top tier, but there are certainly complications.

They are leaving Treyew Road this summer and, for a year, are sharing at Torquay United. Truro get the keys to their new home in the summer of 2017 but they'll be relegated from the National League South if over £50,000-worth of work isn't carried out - on a stadium they won't be using!

If they want to go up? They will need to put in a new 250 seater stand on top of the 200 they have been ordered to instal anyway - at a cost of around £45,000 - just to be in a position to compete in the play-offs.

It's stick or twist. Write a £100,000 cheque to try and go up - they may not even reach the top five remember, but still must have everything in place to try. Accept the £50,000 bill to retain Conference membership or save the money and return to the Southern League?

The main bugbear of course is not what needs to be done, but the fact that if improvements are made the upgrade will be enjoyed for little over a month. Truro have three home games scheduled after March 31 - so if they do reach the play-offs with an extra match, they are being forced to cough up £25,000 per 90 minutes of football.

The FA point to the problem of their up-coming groundshare with Torquay.

"As clubs are not allowed to enter into a groundshare agreement in order to gain promotion or to retain membership, it was necessary for Truro to commit to completing the 2015-16 season at their existing ground (or a new one) - as such the deadline for improvements remains in force," Wembley chiefs told us last week.

Rules are rules of course, even Truro chairman Pete Masters accepts the demands placed upon him and says they have a decision to make in regards to promotion.

But as other chairmen have told him, the situation is mad - and more evidence of money that could be much better spent elsewhere.

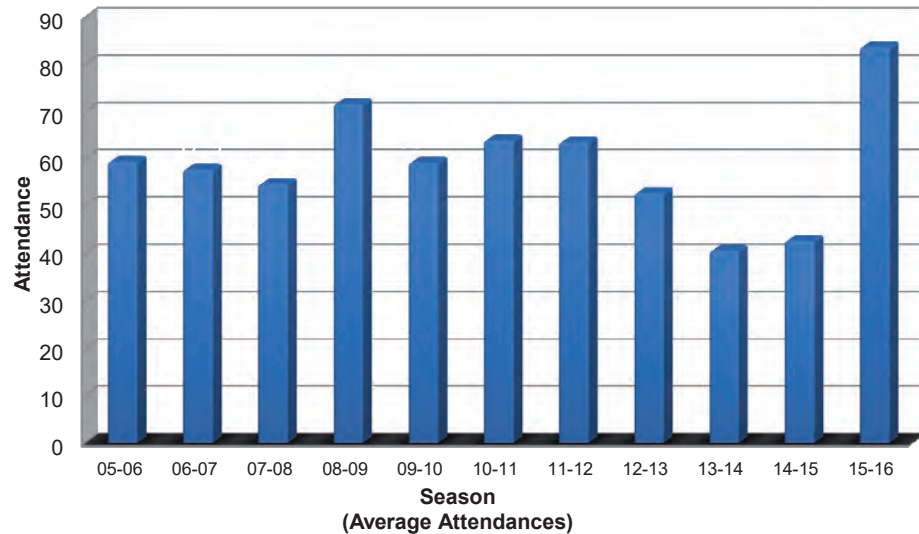

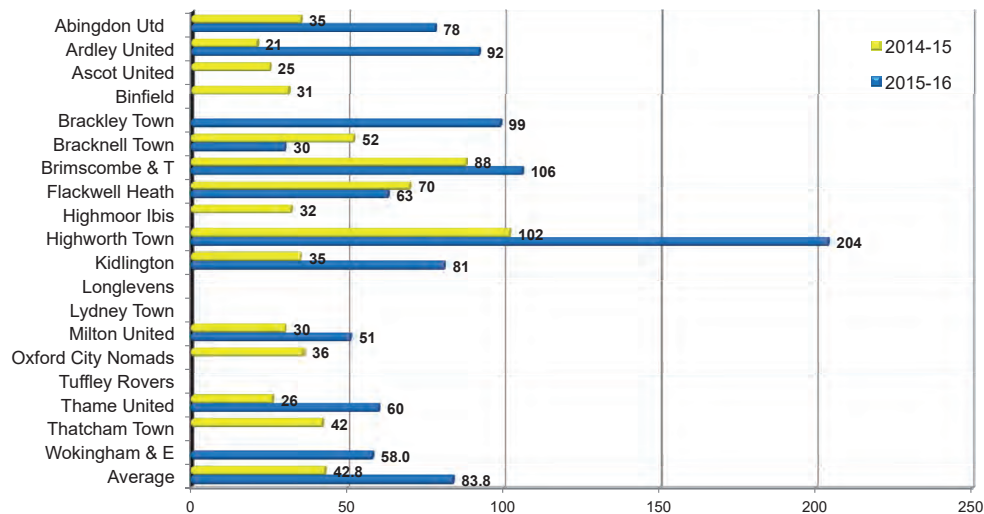

Second half collapse spells danger

Ardley Sports Ground, 16th January 2016

If Royal Wootton Bassett Town's run of desperate form continues, there's only one direction in which they'll be heading. And that's down. Their miserable league run – halted only briefly by a last ditch rescue act against Brimscombe and Thrupp – continued apace as, for the second time in the space of a month, Bassett were embarrassed. Memories still fresh of their 8-0 mauling at the hands of local rivals Highworth Town, Paul Braithwaite's team plumbed new depths of humiliation as they were crushed 7-1 at the hands of Ardley United, conceding six in the second half.

Though on a run which had seen them win four straight and lose just one of their last nine, the Oxfordshire side still began the day a couple of places below their visitors in the Hellenic League Premier Division table. Yet on this day they were streets ahead. While they led by just a single goal at half time, coming courtesy of Reece Bayliss' well taken free kick after quarter of an hour, the advantage they held could well have been much greater. Ryan Markham was controlling play in midfield, while wingers Bayliss and Jacob Daffern were afforded far too much space thanks to the 3-5-2 which Bassett had opted for. But for finishing that lacked composure, there could have been five goals in the game's blistering opening stages, with four fine opportunities falling to the hosts. Daffern struck narrowly wide after cutting in and leaving behind Dale Richards, before an unmarked Chris Jackson somehow headed Bayliss' free kick over from six yards, while Carl Tappin skewed over after a give-and-go with Daffern on the edge of the box had opened up the Bassett defence. Bassett too had their chances early on, Steve Robertson curling an attempted lob narrowly wide after just 30 seconds. A fine Kieran Beesley save then kept out the frontman's header following Steve Olphert's cross, with Robertson seeing his follow-up effort blocked. A goal appeared an inevitability, and Bayliss soon provided it. A brief lull in play followed. Yet Ardley still had their chances, troubling Bassett primarily on the break and from set pieces. From a Bayliss corner, Lewis Strafford flicked a header narrowly wide, while a surging run from Bayliss saw him ghost beyond Adam Corcoran and round Curtis Meare only to see his cutback for dangerous forward Troy Bryan blocked.

It was a counter attack that delivered their second midway through the second period. Dale Richards' left wing cross failed to beat the front man and moments later at the other end Nathan Hawkins had been outmuscled by Lewis Hayden, who squared to substitute Elias Katsoloudi to tap in. That ushered in Bassett's collapse. Four minutes later an unmarked Ade Talabi – another substitute – headed in from a corner to make Ardley's lead appear unassailable. A small glimmer of hope for the visitors was provided by Robertson, who expertly controlled a Jamie Richards cross before steering a shot into the opposite corner from twelve yards. However, a calamitous fourth spelled doom for Bassett as Daffern's corner flew straight in. The white flag was quickly raised and the lack of effort shown in the final five minutes was galling. Another corner was not cleared and Talabi hooked in. Talabi then robbed Hawkins before squaring to Katsoloudi on the right and he coolly picked out the bottom left corner. The final act came when Talabi completed his hat trick – and made it five goals between him and fellow substitute Katsoloudi – with a header at the right post. Only the final whistle spared the visitors further embarrassment. Earlier this season Bassett were tearing apart Ascot United and defeating table toppers Thatcham Town on their own turf. Now they appear to be a shadow of their former selves, shorn of ideas and imploding at the merest sign of difficulty in games. The eleventh place position in which they still sit may imply a degree of comfort. But with no sign that they are about to turn a corner, there's no doubt that the team are now staring a relegation dogfight firmly in the face. To overcome that is going to require a number of team members to ask serious questions of whether they themselves are willing to tough it out. At the moment there are too many passengers in the side, with too few appearing concerned about the rut into which their team have slipped. Now's the time for soul searching and, most urgently, a reaction before things go from bad to worse.

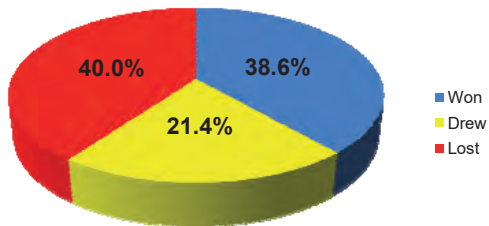

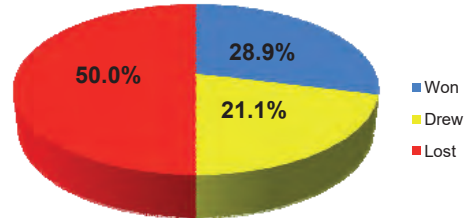

Second half collapse sends Bassett crashing out

For the remainder of the season, now all Royal Wootton Bassett Town can do is concentrate on improving their league position. A horror show of a second half saw all hopes of a deep run in the Bluefin Sports Challenge Cup end in inglorious fashion as Bassett slipped to a 3-2 defeat against Cirencester Town Development. While they took a single goal lead into half time thanks to Steve Robertson's 23rd minute free kick, Paul Braithwaite's side were nonetheless guilty of failing to take advantage of playing with the wind behind them in the opening stanza. And they were quickly punished for their negligence as two goals in the opening six minutes of the period - the first cheap, the second a result of the team switching off - swung the tie in the Centurions' favour. Playing from behind, Bassett failed to recover, falling further in arrears with quarter of an hour remaining. Steve Olphert's late header was therefore nothing more than scant consolation on a hugely disappointing afternoon. There may have been some sense of Bassett feeling hard done by for only being 1-0 ahead at that point given the failure of referee Charlie Bullock to award a penalty in the twelfth minute for an obvious trip on Olphert. But aside from that, the hosts were only able to test Josh Langley's goal on four occasions. The first resulted in the opener, Robertson swinging in a free kick from the right corner, which flew straight in. Six minutes after that, Dan Bailey glanced wide at the right post after debutant Aaron Oakley had re-directed a Robertson corner back across goal. The same player then failed to connect properly with a Sam Packer cross as he charged in at the left post. After that, the best opportunity presented itself to Packer, who collected a Robertson set back and smashed a well struck long range drive narrowly over.

Without that killer instinct, Bassett had left the door wide open for their visitors. And they duly ushered them through that door in the opening minutes of the second period. Less than two minutes had elapsed when a mix up between centre half George Drewitt and 'keeper Curtis Meare allowed Danny Gudger to present lone frontman Jack Smith with the simplest of tap ins to level the scores. Cirencester soon were ahead. Incorrectly thinking that the ball had gone out of play for a throw in on the right, all bar Gudger ground to a halt. Taking advantage of that, the winger galloped forward before sending in a low cross, which was helped on by a clever Smith flick to an unmarked Sam Farr and the former Bassett Under 18 captain steered into the bottom right corner from twelve yards. It could have been game over before the hour mark too, but a slight deflection helped divert a low Gudger free kick around the post. The introduction of Josh Fowler eventually provided a spark that a labouring Bassett were missing. And with twenty minutes to go, a firm tackle from Packer in the middle of the park and an Olphert through ball set the speedy forward free. After bearing down on goal, Fowler attempted a delicate clip over the advancing Langley, but his shot lacked the required accuracy, while strike partner Robertson failed too to divert the ball in at the right post.

With that glorious chance squandered, further salt was rubbed into the wound when the Centurions grabbed their third in the game's 75th minute. Smith had come close to netting his second minutes earlier when he struck over from Charlie Buse's cutback. But he had no trouble finding the target with his unmarked header from another Gudger delivery after Langley's diagonal punt had picked out the winger in acres of space. Bassett's reaction was muted, far too muted. Bailey stung the palms of Langley a couple of minutes after he saw his side fall further behind. But between that and Olphert eventually clawing one back in the first minute of stoppage time when he beat Langley to the punch to head home from a Nathan Hawkins' cross, Cirencester, although defending deep, were not overly stretched.

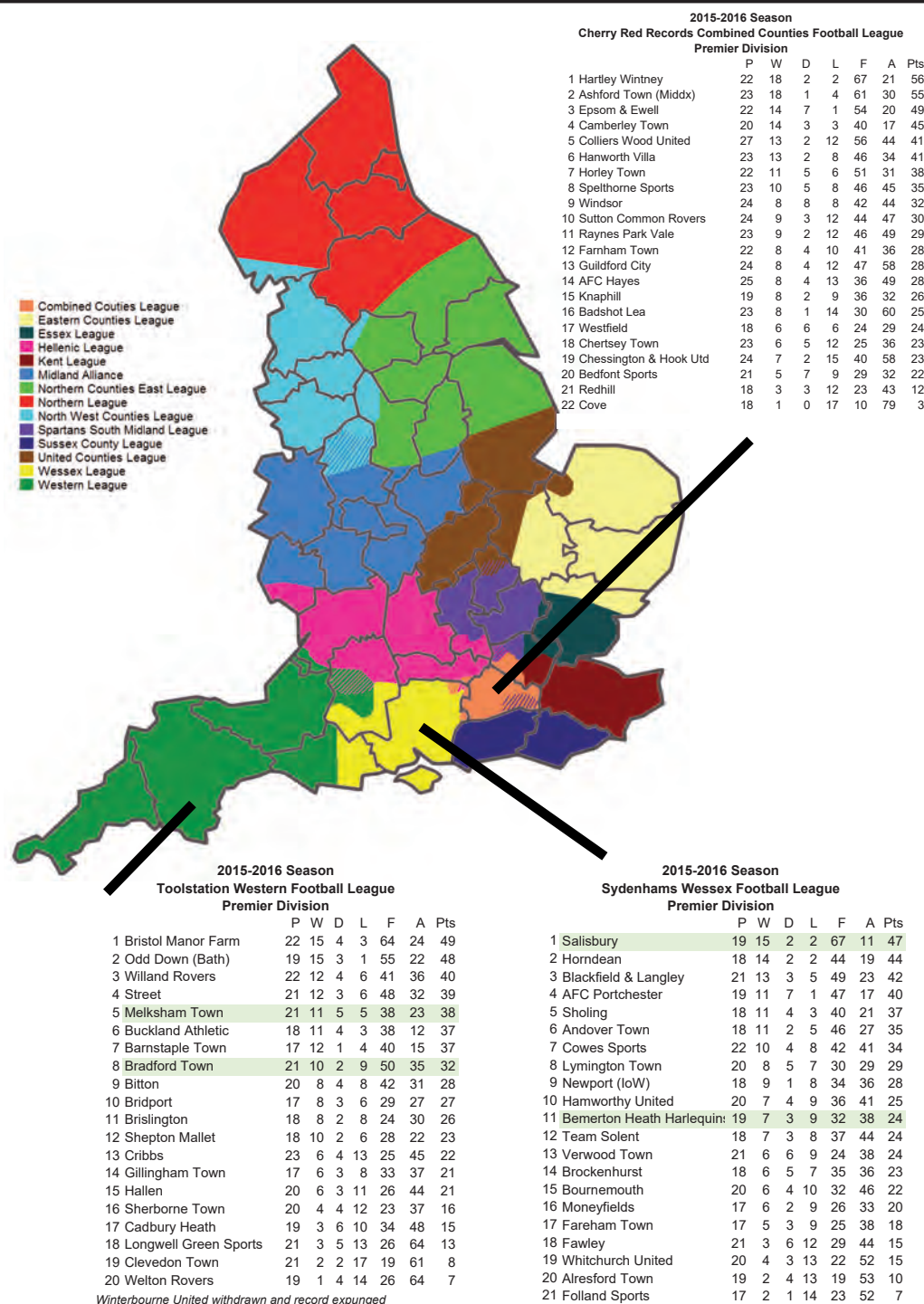
