Editorial & RWBTFC News

Welcome to Binfield

This afternoon our visitors are Binfield for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. A warm welcome to all from Binfield who have made the journey along the M4 to Royal Wootton Bassett for this league fixture, we hope you enjoy your second visit to our new ground and we wish you a safe journey home.

The reason that this is Binfield's second visit to the New Gerard Buxton Ground is that the two sides were drawn together in this season's FA Vase competition. The game here on 5th September finished one goal a piece after a stunning 20 yard strike from Steve Robertson earned Royal Wootton Bassett Town an F.A. Vase replay on a historic day that saw the official opening of the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground. The replay two days later will go down as one of our best performances for many a season. Given the circumstances of having to travel to Binfield on a Monday night minus our four most experienced players in Steve Yeardley, Adam Corcoran, Richie Carter and top scorer Steve Robertson, few would have predicted what happened. With six players starting the game under the age of 19 and with 17 year old Hugo Vivash on the bench it was a very inexperienced side that Bassett fielded at Stubbs Lane. The one thing with youth is that they show no fear and this performance demonstrated that admirably as we ran out 4-3 winners with young Harvey Scholes the star of the show with two stunning goals. Dan Bailey also scored but it was Nathan Hawkins who popped up to score the winner with a header from a corner and earn Bassett a nice £600 bonus as well as a place in the next round. Bassett were to make the trip to Binfield again two weeks later for the first league meeting between the two sides. On a night of great frustration Bassett finished the match with just nine men as both George Drewitt and Dale Richards saw red as we slipped to a 2-0 defeat.

Binfield currently sit in 8th place in the table with 15 wins from their 29 games played to date. On Monday night they entertained Oxford City Nomads at Stubbs Lane and won 4-2 after going two down. This result followed a surprise 2-1 defeat at home against Lydney Town last Saturday. This defeat was disappointing from a Bassett perspective as it allowed Lydney to go above us in the table. The two sides have met 9 times previously with today's visitors having the better of things with 5 wins to just 2 for Bassett with 2 drawn games. We have scored 10 goals against Binfield in those 9 games with two a piece for Steve Robertson, Harvey Scholes and Alex Green. Hopefully Robbo and Harvey will be able to add to that total here this afternoon.

Highmoor Ibis

I understand that it was a frustrating evening in our last home game here against Highmoor Ibis. We just did not get going and went down to a disappointing 2-0 defeat and we still have yet to beat Highmoor in 5 games.

Milton United

I travelled to the away game at Milton a fortnight ago and with a few brave souls on a bitterly cold afternoon witnessed a very entertaining game where it was safe to say that the defences were not on top. We shared 4 goals and the points with Milton and, having the better chances in the second half, we should really have come away with all 3 points but in the end we had to settle for the one point. Two excellent goals from Robbo took his total for the season to an impressive 30. Back in 2012-13 when Mark Barnes fired us to promotion from Division One West with 26 goals I did not expect this scoring record to be surpassed anytime soon. The fact that Robbo has hit his 30 goals this season against Premier League defences is even more impressive, as is the statistic that Robbo has scored 43% of our goals this season.

Reserves

On Saturday the Reserves picked three more points following a 1-0 win over Wilts Calne Town, Lewis Tidy with the solitary goal. The Reserves are now unbeaten in 3 games ahead of today's cup feature with Wroughton. With bottom of the league Sarum Youth to play twice, along with games against Marlborough Town and Vale of Pewsey there is no reason why the Reserves cannot lift themselves into the top half of the league table come the end of the season.

Ladies Team

Youth Section Sup Semi-finals

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Under 18s booked their place in the North Wilts League Cup final with a convincing 4-1 victory against Ramsbury Juniors. They were the only one of five Bassett sides in semi-final action to make it through, as the Under 12, 13, 15 and 16 Blue teams fell to agonising defeats. Dan Smith was the star of the show for the Under 18s as he netted a hat trick, while Ben Gerrish made it four. The first half was a relatively tight affair as Division Three Ramsbury proved tough to break down. But Bassett managed to go into half time a goal up and pulled away after the restart. They will take on Division Two Shrivenham Royals in the final after they defeated Division One leaders Fairford Town Youth 3-1. While on paper a shock, Shrivenham have a perfect record in the league this season and will provide a stiff test for Bassett when they meet at the County Ground.

For Bassett's four other semi-final representatives there was ultimately to be disappointment, though all should be congratulated for making it to the final four. With both teams possessing identical league records in Division One, the Under 15 Blues' contest with Swindon Supermarine 'L' promised to be a tight one. And that was the case, with a lone Supermarine goal in the first half deciding the outcome in their favour. Meanwhile, the Under 16 Blues were unable to exact revenge over Wroughton for inflicting defeat in the final last year as the league leaders beat Bassett 6-2. The Under 13 Blues, cup winners last season, will relinquish their crown as they were seen off 3-1 by Croft Junior Red. There was defeat against Croft Red for the Under 12 Blues too. Despite a spirited performance, Bassett fell to a 2-0 loss against a Croft side who are still yet to taste defeat in any competition so far this season.

Club shop set to launch

Royal Wootton Bassett Town will be launching an online club shop on Monday 21st March. From The Dugout

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to Roger Herridge and his Binfield side to the New Gerard Buxton Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. This is the fourth time the two teams have met each other this season with one win a piece and one drawn game so far. It was a bad day at the office at their place in the league back in September when we not only lost the game but also had two players sent off. We will be looking to keep eleven on the pitch this afternoon and extract some revenge for that defeat. Hopefully we can reproduce the performance we gave in the FA Vase Replay when we won 4-3.

Since the last set of programme notes we have played three games against Highmoor Ibis, Milton United and Brackley Town Saints. The Highmoor game was another disappointing performance as we just didn't get going against a Highmoor side that looked beatable. Then against Milton it was another frustrating day where we have come away having played better than the opposition, created more than the opposition, but only come away with a point. Two mistakes cost us against Highmoor Ibis and then the same against Milton where we have let them take the lead twice through individual mistakes. It is just frustrating that we keep putting ourselves in the same situations and I am bored of talking about it and telling people off. We just cannot keep being naïve, doing the same things and lacking in concentration. The players need to look at themselves rather than do extra work on the training ground.

It is something that needs to be looked at. Either player-wise in pre-season for next season; I don't know what it is. Players who are there at the moment; if they are playing for next season, need to concentrate more at pivotal points in the games, because I can't keep defending them. After the Milton came we had a week off and I don't know if that is a good thing or a bad thing. I would rather be playing Saturday-Wednesday-Saturday, and I think the players would as well.

We did have a midweek game this week when we made the "short journey" to Brackley. We had last played them on the opening day of the season drawing 1-1 and we repeated that result thanks to a late goal from Dale Richards. Given that we travelled with a few players missing it was pleasing to put in an improved performance and get a point out of the game. Hopefully this afternoon will see us return to winning ways as we look to finish as high as possible in that final league table.

Opponents - History

Binfield • Club History

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.



During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground. In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972, Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house we see today. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In the following season we reached the final of the Berks and Bucks Intermediate Cup for the first time but unfortunately lost in extra time. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt, and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign. A Cup Final appearance in the Reading Senior Cup also ended in disappointment as we lost by the odd goal in three to Peppard. In 1995 we reached the final of the Reading Senior Cup only to lose to Mortimer on penalties and in 96 we won the Chiltonian League again.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the membership, with over 20 teams playing every weekend this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013. We're also in our second season of a partnership scheme with Reading FC where some of our younger players have the opportunity to train with Reading FC. In 2003 we added an Allied Counties Youth team which is now providing a steady stream of talented young players ready for Senior football for the Reserves and 1st Team. Our reserves side are a vital and successful part of our club, providing progression from our youth team into senior football and regularly providing players for the 1st team squad, whilst also being successful in winning UHlsport Hellenic Division 2 East in 2012, runners up in 2013 and coming runners up in the Reserves Challenge Cup in both seasons. Half a dozen players last season progressed from our Youth team into our Reserves and four of those went on to make 1st team appearances this season two of those 'home-grown' players are in the starting 1st team squad. Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. We've continued to improve our facilities with the car park and changes to the club house. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team and Veterans. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division and 3rd in 2012/13. August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup. Ultimately the step up to the next tier of English non league football is our aim.

A Right Royal Occasion

Stubbs Lane, 9th September 2015

Binfield 3, Royal Wootton Bassett Town 4

A superb performance from Royal Wootton Bassett Town on Monday night secured Bassett a trip to Windsor in the next round of the F.A. Vase following a thrilling 4-3 victory away at Binfield.

Given the circumstances of having to travel to Binfield on a Monday night minus their four most experienced players in Steve Yeardley, Adam Corcoran, Richie Carter and top scorer Steve Robertson, few would have predicted what happened on Monday night. With six players starting the game under the age of 19 and with 17 year old Hugo Vivash on the bench it was a very inexperienced side that Bassett fielded at Stubbs Lane. The one thing with youth is that they show no fear and this performance demonstrated that admirably.

Royal Wootton Bassett went close to taking the lead on 5 minutes when an audacious shot from Dan Bailey from his own half nearly caught out Binfield keeper Nathan Silver. Having been done on Saturday with a shot over his head Silver only just managed to do enough to keep out Bailey's cheeky effort.

Binfield's first effort on goal came on 9 minutes from Liam Ferdinand but his shot was easily saved by Curtis Meare in the Bassett goal. Bassett immediately counter attacked and great set up play between Dan Bailey and Steve Olphert put Kalum Youngsam through but his effort was well saved by Silver. The best chance of the night so far fell to Binfield on 20 minutes when, after good set-up play, James Knight missed a sitter. The game continued to be very open and played at pace, with Binfield hurrying every throw-in and free kick. On 30 minutes a shot from Matt Cheatham was well held by Silver. Binfield themselves had another glorious chance to take the lead on 36 minutes when a ball to the far post found Liam Ferdinand in acres of space but his header was poor and did not trouble Curtis Meare in the Bassett goal. The deadlock was finally broken on 37 minutes when Harvey Scholes became the second player in a couple of days to beat Silver from distance with a cracking 30 yard shot screaming over the keepers head and into the back of the Binfield net. So, whilst Binfield had more the possession in the first period it was Bassett that went into the half time break with the slender lead.

Three minutes after the break things were to get even better for Bassett when a great solo run from young Harvey Scholes beat 5 players and ended with a cool finish with a shot into the bottom right hand corner of the Binfield net, 2-0 Bassett and a very shocked home side. On a night of great goals Jemel Johnson brought Binfield back into the game with another quality goal. Coming in from wide on the left, he played a one-two with Liam Ferdinand before hitting a brilliant dipping volley from 25 yards in off the far post. The game continued to ebb and flow and Binfield introduced substitute Brad Brown who was then booked after a very silly two footed lunge within minutes of coming on. On other days this would have resulted in a straight red and both Brown and Binfield benefitted from the referee's leniency when moments later he curled a ball into the Bassett net from the edge of the box to bring Binfield level with half an hour left to play.

At that moment all present probably expected the young Bassett side to capitulate but they continued to work hard defensively and keep the home side from getting their noses in front. Brown again tested Curtis Meare and only the keeper's finger tips with the help of the post kept the score level. Whilst soaking up the pressure Bassett were always a threat on the break and when Dan Bailey rose highest on 82 minutes to meet a left wing cross from man of the match Scholes, his downward header gave Silver no chance and Bassett were back in front again. Having got back in front surely Bassett would not throw away the lead again? However, a controversial corner award six minutes from time allowed Binfield to continue to exert pressure. With Bassett still smarting from the corner award Lewis Leonetti connected with the corner, but this was cleared off the line but Liam Ferdinand was there to force the ball home. 3-3 and still five minutes to play in this pulsating game. Just when it looked like extra time would again be needed Bassett broke up a Binfield attack and won a corner of their own. From the corner centre-back Nathan Hawkins rose highest to head powerfully into the Binfield net for the 7th goal of the night. The closing moments were tense but the youngsters held out against the more experienced Binfield side and secure that precious win and prize money. So it is the Royal town of Wootton Bassett who will make that trip to Windsor. Both sides were applauded off the pitch at the end. It had been a cracking game witnessed by the Chairman of the Hellenic League who commented that the game had been a credit to the UHlsport Hellenic League.

RWBTFC History On One Page

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivensham Dave tragically passed away.

With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year ground share with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year playing its games in Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and record points haul in the division. This season sees the club playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name.

NON-LEAGUE has received plenty of positive coverage from the national media that normally disregards it this season so it was a shame to see negative headlines dominating coverage over the weekend.

On our Non-League Paper front page, we covered the story concerning Martin Potton, chairman of United Counties League side Wellingborough Town, who had been banned after being found guilty of telling referee Mary Harmer that she "wasn't fit enough to referee a woman's match, let alone a men's game". Then news came out on Sunday that police and the Football Association were investigating after Altrincham's Josh Ginnelly reported he was racially abused in their game at Barrow. These sort of headlines are not good for Non-League, clubs are struggling enough as it is to entice people through the turnstiles.

The grass-roots game has long been known for its general friendliness between supporters, players and management. That's part of what makes Non-League so special. But we're in danger of losing it. If incidents like these start becoming the norm, people will be turned off.

One of the big reasons people don't attend Non-League games is because it is seen by many as 'living in the past' while others think the game at our level hasn't evolved. They couldn't be more wrong but stories like the one with Potton only feed into those theories. The Doughboys' chairman insists he didn't make the comments which were reported to the FA by Lindsay England, founder of equality group Just A Ball Game.

England attended Town's UCL game against AFC Rushden & Diamonds back in April 2015 and said the comments aimed at Harmer came flying out after Wellingborough went 7-0 down. When contacted by my colleague Sam Elliott, Potton claimed he had been "hung out to dry" by the official and the BBC who, he claims, purposely published the story of Tuesday March 8 – International Women's Day – to cause controversy.

"There was a group us – what she says was said, but not by me," Potton said. "There's an agenda there. She has picked me out of the line up as I'm the only club official and has singled me out because the others were just everyday fans.

"There was banter flying around and a tongue-in-cheek comment was made. This has now got out of hand. Why didn't she just come to me and allow me the chance to explain myself? Instead she runs to Rushden and then to the FA.

"No, I don't think women should be allowed to referee in the men's game. That is a personal opinion and that, I'm afraid, is my view. It's not because I am a sexist, it is because of other factors. They get intimidated very easily and I don't agree with it."

It may be a personal opinion, but it's one that most, thankfully, don't share. There are good referees (surprising I know!) and bad referees. Gender has little to do with it. As the popularity of women's football increases, more females will seek to get involved with the beautiful game. Whether that be the ladies' side or the men's game, it can only be a positive. Then the news about Ginnelly came out and once again, Non-League was dragged into a racism row. Grimsby Town defender Toto Nsiala and Gresley forward Gary Ricketts were also allegedly subject of racist comments recently.

It would be naive to sweep these under the carpet and claim Non-League is 99 per cent pure. Much like society in general, it definitely isn't. But we must do our best to uphold the integrity of the game at our level. If you see or hear anything that's not right, tell somebody. Dulwich Hamlet displayed the true Non-League spirit of community by playing a Syrian refugee awareness game against FC Assyria last week.

Non-League has long been known for its inclusion and welcoming attitude - we need to make sure we don't lose it.

Quickfire double condemns Bassett

Milton's second came as the Bassett defence failed to deal with another shot, the ball falling to Will Norton, who scored from the edge of the area.





















Sleeping Giants

If you had gone into a coma three years ago and woken up recently just before the FA Vase semi-final draw, you'd have been asking a lot of questions. How exactly did Hereford United and Salisbury City fall so much that they're now competing in a competition for clubs at Step 5, 6 and 7? Of course, the two clubs matched in the Vase semi-final were Hereford FC and Salisbury FC, not United and City, and they face off in the first leg at Edgar Street on Saturday.

The pair themselves went into somewhat of a coma after terrible mismanagement meant we lost two great Non-League names. With so many phoenix clubs successfully fighting back in recent times, there was hope that Hereford and Salisbury would be supporting ambitious clubs once more. Not surprisingly, as I write this, Hereford are top of the Midland League Premier and Salisbury are at the Wessex League Premier summit.

Of course with any story like this, some people are supportive and others scoff at it. The reaction to the pair drawing each other in the semi-final was mixed. Some were pleased they wouldn't be meeting in the final against either Morpeth Town or Bowers & Pitsea while others weren't happy that clubs of their size were at this stage, taking up a slot that could have gone to a 'proper' Step 5 or 6 club.

Just a few years back when Sholing won the Vase after taking voluntary relegation from the Southern League the season before, they were criticised for their decision with some even claiming they did it as they planned to win the Vase. If only it was that easy! The Vase is the most unpredictable and difficult FA competition so to win it is a fantastic achievement, regardless of the club's size. Success often attracts detractors.

I followed and reported on the slow demise of Hereford United. The club was a farce towards the end of its life and from my first conversation with Hereford FC chairman Jon Hale, you could tell he had the passion and the plan. Ian Ridley has helped spearhead Salisbury FC and both clubs are being run by the right people - what's there to dislike about that? Two weeks ago we had a brilliant column in The NLP from Bulls great Ricky George, who scored arguably Hereford's most important goal ever as they beat Newcastle United in the FA Cup third round in 1972 - one of the biggest upsets ever. George still loves the Bulls and said: "The words of the club's motto, 'our greatest glory lies not in never having fallen but rising when we fall', would never be more appropriate than now.

"Credit goes to every single person who has helped in the emotional re-birth of the Bulls, but the ghosts of the Giant Killers and the hallowed Meadow End at Edgar Street where the two goals against Newcastle were scored, will forever play a part in uniting the supporters of this famous old club."

Salisbury City's recent past was littered with difficulties and problems but happier times have arrived under the management of Steve Claridge. Vice-chairman Ridley said:

"Both Hereford United and Salisbury City were failing clubs who let a lot of creditors down, including in City's case, plenty of unfortunate season ticket holders whose money they still took as the club was going under.

"We have paid a price, believe me. A lot of people and companies were sceptical about the club and would not touch it again. It had been a hard sell this season at times, particularly early on.

"We'll suffer the odd barb with a smile, I hope. They will matter not when our wonderful Whites - we'll be in blue, actually - step out at Edgar Street. Such moments make all the heartache and hassle in running a club worthwhile."

Whatever your views on both clubs, Hereford and Salisbury are back in good hands and making some more history - surely that's only good for Non-League?

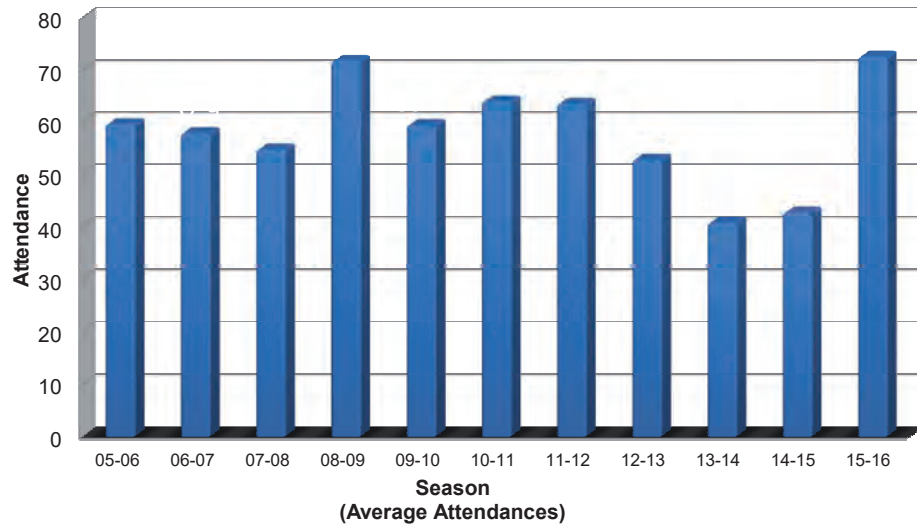

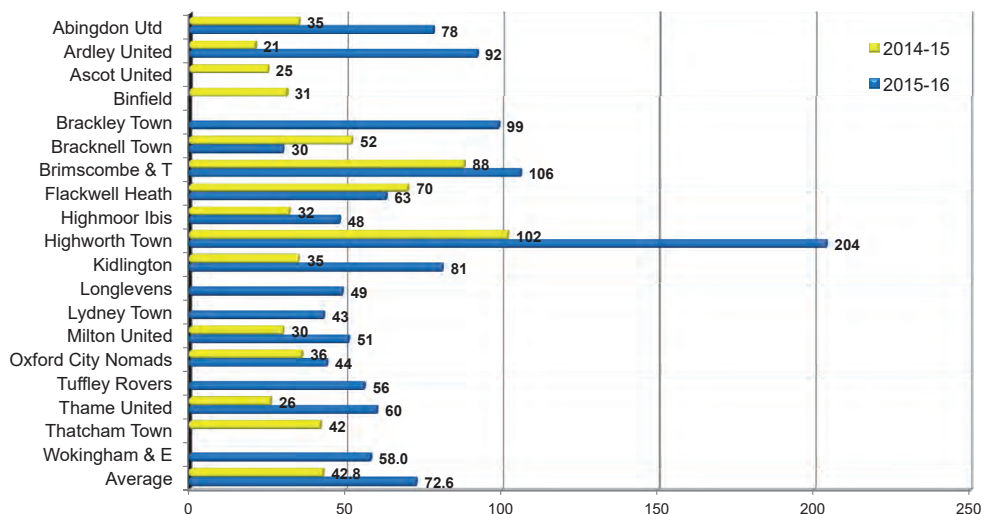

The first leg of the semi-final with Salisbury attracted a massive 4,683 spectators to witness Hereford win 1-0 thanks to a goal from Mustapha Bundu. Interesting to note that should Hereford gain promotion to Step 4 at the end of the season Bundu would not be able to play for them next season as the terms of his educational visa mean that he could not play for a team above Step 5. Wiltshire side Salisbury will be looking to pull back the one goal in the second leg and given their record this season so far in the Wessex League and all cup competitions it would be a brave man who would bet against Salisbury winning (although given the recent controversy in non-league football regarding betting perhaps I should have worded that differently!).

Wiltshire Football Round-up

Chippenham Town dropped two points at home on Saturday when they were held 1-1 by Hitchin Town. On target for Chippenham was Alex Ferguson. Manager Mark Collier appeared to be not too disappointed with the outcome with Chippenham's opponents having the better of things in the second half. With leaders Poole Town going down 1-0 at Leamington Chippenham closed the gap to the leaders to just 3 points, although Chippenham have played one game more. Redditch United were 5-0 winners away at Paulton Rovers and are in 2nd place ahead of Chippenham on goal difference only.

In the Southern League Division One South-West Swindon Supermarine maintained their push for promotion with a 2-1 win at Wimborne Town. On target for Supermarine were Joe Shepherd and Connor Thompson. This win meant Supermarine stayed in 3rd place, 4 points behind leaders Banbury United with a game in hand. 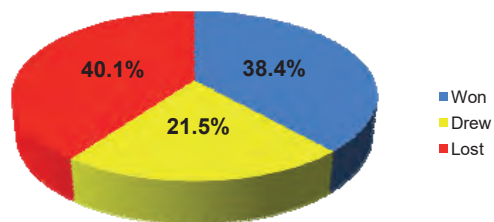

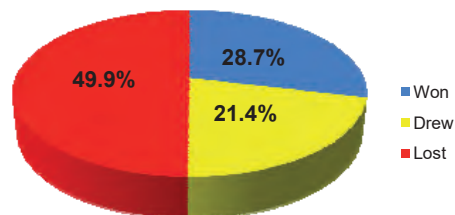

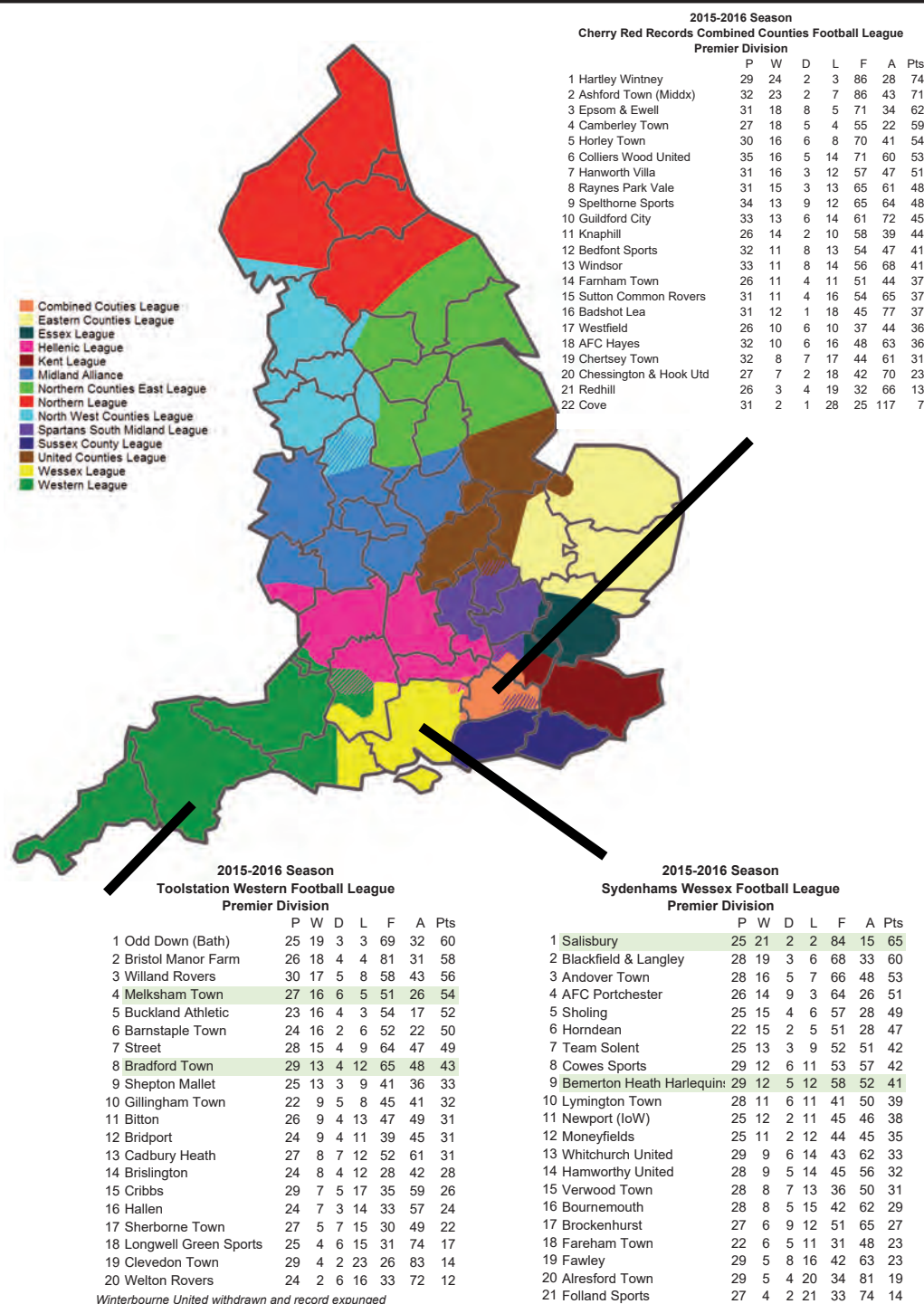
