Editorial & RWBTFC News

Welcome to New College

A warm welcome to New College who have made the short journey from Swindon for this afternoon's Wiltshire Senior Cup fixture. We hope all from New College enjoy their visit to our new ground and we wish them a safe journey home. Three of our players who will be looking forward to today's game will be Harvey Scholes, Joe Hiscock and Christy Millar, all of who made their first big break in adult football with New College.

Following our promotion to the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division it is now 2.5 years since the two sides have met. In total the two clubs have played each other seven times with Wootton Bassett Town having the better of things with six wins and just one defeat. Mark Barnes certainly enjoyed playing today's visitors, netting seven times in the last three fixtures between the two clubs.

Of those six Wootton Bassett Town victories, two have actually come in this competition. Back in 2006-07 goals from mark King, Stu Hemsley and Steve Yearley gave us a 3-1 win in the First Round encounter. Six years later the two sides met in Round Two as today and on this occasion a Sean terry hat-trick plus two for Mark Barnes and one a piece for Matty Bown and Jack Ellis did the damage in a 7-2 win.

New College are currently on a good run of form with four wins in their last six games, including a victory over Purton. They currently sit in 12th place in Division One West but have a number of games in hand over the sides immediately above them in the table. Of the two defeats in those six games one was a narrow 2-1 reverse at home to league leaders Cheltenham Saracens, so we will need to be at our best if we are to avoid going out of this prestigious competition. These cup games are always tight affairs and New College will be looking to achieve an upset here at the New Gerard Buxton ground. Like the game in the previous round against Ludgershall Sports our visitors will come with nothing to lose. With New College sides traditionally playing good football on the deck they will certainly find the pitch here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground to their liking.

Highmoor Ibis

We were without a First Team game on Saturday but the previous Monday we had made the trip down the M4 to play Highmoor Ibis. There is my match report on that game in today's programme. Unfortunately we lost the game 4-0 against one of the better forward lines I have seen for a while. Playing on a Monday night is designed to bring in people who would normally watch other sides and the hospitality suite at the Palmer Park Stadium certainly had more representatives from Henley and Binfield than from Bassett that night. The Bassett officials can be forgiven for their absence though as they were playing host to the Swindon Town Under 16 game.

On the night we were also struggling to field a full side due to injuries and work commitments and to be honest we were not really much of a threat going forward against Highmoor. As one of our spectators said at the end though, you could not fault the lads who made themselves available for the game; the problem on the night was those that were missing. Hopefully Paul will be able to find some new players to strengthen the squad from somewhere but the player pool in the Swindon area is drying up as lads find other things to do with their time. With the Wiltshire League and the Swindon & District League having much fewer teams' football as a participation sport in the County is not in good shape in my view. Somehow the FA needs to do something about all these players that disappear once they finish with kids football. I am not sure what the answer is. Credit to the Wiltshire FA though as I understand that they do propose to now run an Under 21 league and hopefully this will act as a span breaker between kids football and the adult game.

Opponents - History

New College Academy • Club History

New College opened in 1984 with a football team playing friendly football fixtures on Wednesday afternoons. Football developed into an Academy in 1996 and between then and 2002, when it became a Senior Club in its own right, New College explored joint ventures with Swindon Town FC, Forest Green Rovers and Swindon Supermarine. New College finished mid-table in their one season in the Hellenic League in 2002-03 before ground issues moved the club into the Wiltshire Football League. Having Re-entered the Hellenic League a few seasons ago to further develop their players at a higher level. The coaching programme is directed on a daily basis by Academy Manager Ian Howell who is also part of the Academy Youth coaching team at Chelsea Football Club.



He is assisted by Matt Cosnett, who has progressed through the Academy programme as a player and due to his career ending knee injury has become part of the coaching team within the Academy.

Students join New College to follow an educational program for one, two or occasionally three years, together with their football coaching and competition. It is not an Old Boys club, although in any season one or two 'leavers' may continue before making the step up to what we hope is a higher level of football or progressing onto Football Scholarships in the USA. The New College Football Academy is the biggest running programme in the local area and is continuing to build its football development programme.

The academy currently runs three representative sides. There are two under 18's teams. The first of which plays in the Wiltshire Youth Floodlit league on Thursday nights. This side is managed by Mick Burke and Gary Clarke and the second which plays in the South West Counties U18's Youth league versus academy sides from all of the major non-league sides in the South West. This side is managed/ coached by Steve Robertson and Mick burke. The Academy also play in a number of Local U18 and U20 midweek fixtures against other colleges and Schools. For the first time in its history the Youth/U18's sides have entered into the FA Youth Cup for the 2014 season.

The open age squad now plays in the UHlsport Hellenic Football League Division 1 West, which is at step 6 of the non-league pyramid. This side is managed by Mark Teasdale. Mark is assisted by his coach Matt Cosnett. This side also now competes in the FA Vase and FA Youth Cup.

Ian Howell, Matt Cosnett and Eric Stott work behind the scenes. Eric works fulfilling the role of Match day Secretary for the Hellenic League side. Ian fulfils the role of Chairman.

The Charter Standard Scheme is best practice guide that sets standards of coaching, administration and child protection for all clubs outside the Football League and Premier League. As a benchmark for quality, it will improve the playing experience for all.

New College Academy achieved this prestigious award in 2009 and has held it ever since. The FA Charter Standard Clubs program, supported by FA Community Partner McDonald's, was launched in February 2001 and is a core component of The FA Football Development program.

The project is aimed at all clubs outside the Football League and Premier League, players, children and parents find a club in their local area that meets FA standards.

Defunct Opponents

A look back at former opponents who are no longer competing. After Avebury, Sanford, Walcot Ath, Wollen Sports, Meadowcroft and Ferndale Athletic today's featured team is former Swindon side...

Lawn FC

Lawn FC started life in the Swindon & District League as St Paul's. They subsequently became Emmanuel and then Lawn YC. They won the Swindon & District League Junior Cup in 1965, for sides in the lower two divisions of that league. They subsequently became Lawn FC and won Division One of the Swindon & District League in Season 1967-68 gaining promotion to the Premier Division in the process. They eventually joined the Wiltshire County League where they first met Wootton Bassett Town in Division 2 of the County League in Season 1978-79.

The first meeting between the two sides came in the First Round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup in Season 1977-78 when on Christmas Eve 1977 Wootton Bassett progressed to the next round of the competition courtesy of a 2-1 win, Bob Burton amongst the goals for Wootton Bassett.

The first league meeting between the two sides saw a 3-2 win to Wootton Bassett Town in Swindon thanks to goals from Bob Burton, Phil Keep and Tony Cable. In the return at Rylands Way a solitary strike from Alan Burton was all that separated the two sides and meant that Wootton Bassett did the double over their Swindon opponents in that first and only season as league opponents. Lawn finished the season in 9th place whilst Wootton Bassett Town were promoted in 2nd place behind Ferndale Athletic to Division One of the League. The two sides also met in the Subsidiary Cup competition in the same season, drawing two each at Rylands Way, Alan Turner with both Wootton Bassett goals.

This was to be the only season that the two first teams of the two Clubs were to meet in any league.

Some old names that represented Lawn FC included, Ian Titcombe, Ivan Woolford, Dave Terry, Tony Wilson, Tony Williams, Tom Sawyer, Chalky White, Sammy Rose, Ray Miller, Billy Sherwood and Bert Bozley.

Of all the ex-opponents no longer with us the competition between Wootton Bassett Town and Lawn FC was to be very fleeting and they must be one a very few clubs over whom we hold a 100% league record.

Good solid defender, can also push into midfield. Reliable in performance and always looking to improve. First proper season in the Hellenic squad after a few appearances last year.



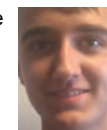
Josh Croucher Defence

Outstanding defender with a great reading / understanding of the game. Can play anywhere along the back and was the stand out performer in the under 18s squad last season.



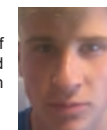
Alex Baker Defence

Former college player and Swindon Supermarine. Knee injury finished playing career but now enjoying working day in and day out with the lads and passing on any help and knowledge he can.




Reminiscing - The Good Old Days

MS: You won the league with the Reserves and Pete then went on to run the First Team when Barry Giles left. Why did you not join Pete with the First Team management?

PB: An honest answer would be that I didn't get asked but I know Pete knew that I still wanted to play so it wasn't a problem really and maybe that was the reason. There certainly wasn't anything else behind it and it was the right decision at the time.

MS: You eventually did become manager at the Club and went very close to winning promotion back to the Premier Division at the first attempt. What do you remember of that first season?

PB: All the older players that had got the club relegated had left and we started with the young lads we had in the reserves from the previous season and the younger players from the last season's squad that had stayed. We started off very slowly and were very unlucky not to get more points on the board in the early season games. It also took us time to decide what was our best formation etc and the experienced players like Lee Marshall had injuries which didn't help. Then suddenly it all clicked and we went on an amazing run where we played some breathtaking football in a 13 game unbeaten spell and needed 4 points from the last 2 games. I got stitched up by Andy Cryer from the Advertiser about Trowbridge Town and the article they produced certainly did their team talk for them and although we battered them on the night and had a clear penalty turned down we lost 1-0 and our promotion dream was over. I was gutted as I wanted to take the club back up and thought with the group of lads we had we'd be okay but it wasn't to be and although we hammered Easington in our last game we lost out by one point. I blamed myself for being so naive when talking to the Adver about Trowbridge as they had nothing to play for but the article clearly worked for them as their manager told me after the game. So near but so far.

MS: Would I be right in thinking that Trowbridge is not on the list of your favourite grounds to visit?

PB: Correct, as I remember playing them early in the season at home and their manager Neil Kirkpatrick was quite damning of our ground and our players. Their ground was a tip and the other reasons above are why I didn't like it but I only had myself to blame for them having the last laugh.

MS: You had some real characters in that side, I am thinking Quinny, Stu Hemsley and Steve Bunting for example. You must have had fun nights out (I am remembering the "Bunting Stripogram" that Woody endured at the end of season do")?

PB: They were a great bunch of lads to work with and share time with both on and off the pitch and we enjoyed many nights out in Bassett and Swindon. I'm still in contact with so many of them and I'll never forget that first season.

MS: Similar to the earlier question, of all the players who played under you as a manager what would be your all time starting eleven?

PB: John Haines, Dwayne Quinn, Steve Yeardley (Capt), Lee Marshall, Steve Bunting, Matt Bennett, Ben Gascoyne, Stuart Hemsley, Paul Crabtree, Sean Terry and Chris Mills.

MS: As well as Trowbridge, would I be right in thinking Letcombe was also not on your list of favourite grounds to visit?

PB: No, as they always promoted themselves as a friendly club but the way their team treated a young Phil Tearle in the league game there after he had scored a hat-trick against them in an earlier cup tie was as bad as anything I've seen as they did everything to get him sent off. They called him names all game and dived every time he got near them and did get him sent off. Phil was as good a forward as I've seen and the actions on that day really took their toll on him.

MS: After managing the First Team you took up managing a youth side. I did the same having managed at Bassett Sports and Minety I then ran a youth team at Wootton Bassett Town from Under 9 through to Under 18. Looking back I have much more enjoyable memories of managing the adult sides than the youngsters. Which did you prefer?

PB: I was actually running the under 8s at the same time as the first team and carried on doing it until the Under 15s when I packed it in due to many reasons really. As with the adult team working with Woody, I was lucky enough to run the youth team all the way through with Mal Chivers who has also become a very good friend to me but it was much harder than the adult teams. We won the Cup at Under 9s at the County Ground but had lost our good friend and fellow coach Robert Woodhouse the week after which affected us all but for a time it brought us all working in the same direction. It's not nice to get sworn at by an adult when he's sub or gets taken off but to have parents moaning was the hardest thing of all so although I love coaching young players it's the adult game I prefer.

MS: Would you consider going back into management in the future?

PB: I was offered the job as assistant manager at Melksham by Wayne Thorne the summer after I finished with Bassett but turned it down mainly due to problems with travelling and a change of my work hours. I regret that as it would've been a great opportunity for me and nothing has really happened since. I still think I have something to give and feel like I have unfinished business as a manager, an assistant manager or coach and hope one day to get another chance. If not then I'm proud to say I was manager of a great football club and worked with so many good people.

MS: Finally on football, I ask everyone this question. Bassett bobble at Rylands Way – fact or just an excuse used by players with poor ball control?

PB: It was a fact but it made Rylands Way all the more special for me and sometimes the ball would sit up and you'd slice it but sometimes you'd smash it into the top corner.

MS: Well thank you for taking the time to answer my questions Paul, some great answers that should make good reading.

Tough College Test Passed

Rylands Way, 14th October 2006 v New College Won 3-1

Three goals from three different scorers were enough for Wootton Bassett Town to progress through to the next round of the Wilts Senior Cup as they beat a tough, energetic New College side 3-1.

Bassett made their opponents look out of their depth in the first twenty minutes and were unlucky to only lead 1-0 going to half time. 30 seconds in, Nathan Hall had a shot from eight yards cleared off the line after Dwayne Quinn helped on a Matty Bennett cross. Mark King netted his second goal of the season on 4 minutes as he powerfully volleyed home a Hall cross from 12 yards. Looking for his second in the 16th minute, King found only the side netting after cutting in from the right but could also have put through Steve Yeardley who was ready to pounce in the middle of the box. After a shaky opening spell, the visitors, to their credit, put up a battling display for the rest of the game and Bassett had 'keeper Adam Miller to thank once again as he kept New College from equalising. With 24 minutes gone Ben Rutter picked out an unmarked Sean Wood with a crossfield ball. His attempted lob of Miller, who had raced off his line, was batted away brilliantly to avert the danger. Steve Yeardley was booked five minutes later for a dangerous tackle from behind before Tom Cadden shot just wide from 15 yards after Scott Campbell did well to pick him out. Paul Crabtree was booked on the stroke of half time and King missed another chance to double his tally for the day when his attempted lob of Gary Eggleton rolled wide after the forward had capitalised on a defensive error.

Both sides took the game to each other in a frantically paced second period. Four minutes after the restart the Bassett defence allowed Mark Chatwin to take a shot at goal but his long range effort went just over. Steve Yeardley doubled Bassett's lead in the 52nd minute, sliding in to direct a low Matty Bennett cross into the back of the net from six yards, this after Chris Mills' well weighted ball into the corner for Bennett to run onto. Paul Burke made his first change after the goal, bringing Andy White on for Hall. A freak goal brought New College back into the game. Bassett were caught offside five yards into their opponents' half and Jordan King thumped the free kick upfield. The ball took a wicked bounce in front of Miller who got a finger to the ball but couldn't stop it from going in. A minute later King was booked for dissent.

Stu Hemsley replaced Andy Hallett on the hour mark before Miller made up for the freak goal with a great reflex save in the 70th minute. Bassett were caught on the break and Cadden's low cross was connected with by Bradley Gill eight yards out and the ball cannoned off Miller's head and wide. Bassett failed to clear from the resulting corner and Chatwin forced a save with a shot from the edge of the area. Sam Lawro, a late replacement for the injured Scott Large, came on for Mark King with just under twenty minutes to go. On 74 minutes Bennett ran onto a Hemsley ball over the top but could only fire wide after being put under pressure from Matty Hoare. A minute later a Mills long throw found an unmarked Bennett ten yards out but Eggleton was well placed and comfortably held a powerful strike from Bennett. Gill again missed from close range as he fired over from six yards after connecting with another Cadden cross. With eleven minutes to go a Bennett free kick from the right corner was connected with by Yeardley and beat Eggleton but bounced over off the bar.

Hemsley finished the game as a contest in the 83rd minute as he raced onto a Dwayne Quinn through ball and dinked the ball over the oncoming Eggleton from twenty yards to the displeasure of number one fan Steve Bunting. Hemsley could have had another two minutes later but struck over first time after Bennett cut the ball back to the edge of the area. Substitute Josh Goldsworthy was unlucky to not reduce the deficit to a single goal as his header rolled just wide after he lost Rich Gee and flicked a deep Rutter ball goalwards.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Matty Bennett – was unlucky not to grab a couple goals himself but provided the assist for Yeardley's goal and his crosses troubled the New College defence all day long.

Scoop Rating: 7/10 – Should have really won the game by more with the amount of chances created but after a dominant opening twenty minutes, Bassett were given a stern test as New College battled to the death.

Reminiscing - The Good Old Days

MS: Did you manage to put any tackles in on the Swindon players and knowing your game you must have had some banter/words with at least one of the Swindon players?

PB: We lost 11-2 I think but I was late on a couple of tackles and Glenn Hoddle went up to the ref and said if I did one more he had to either send me off, ask the Bassett manager to take me off or they'd walk off the pitch. Needless to say I calmed down and never got close enough to a player to make a tackle the rest of the game. There was plenty of banter during the game but we just felt we couldn't tackle them as Hoddle kept moaning about it. Nobody was trying to hurt anyone but they were so much better and quicker than us.

MS: How many seasons in the end did you play for the Town and what other clubs did you play for during your playing career?

PB: I played for Bassett for about 15 seasons, Bassett Sports for 3 or 4 seasons and had a half a season at Purton. On Sundays I played a couple of seasons for Black Sports in the Chippenham League and then it was Champ Sports and the other names we had for 10 seasons before finishing with the other Bassett Sunday side whose name I can't remember when Champs finished.

MS: What do you remember of those derby games between Wootton Bassett and Purton over the years?

PB: They were great games to play in and strangely the best result I had was playing for Purton versus Bassett over Christmas at The Red House when Purton won 5-1. That was a good day and I thought I would get a hard time from the Purton "faithful" when I went there but Jean and her group of fans were great to me and the bank made it a great atmosphere. As a manager and a player I only ever lost 2 games and one was the last season I was in charge and I knew the time was right for me to resign when we battered them and my "Captain" missed his first penalty. Someone above was telling me my time was up.

MS: When did you first come across Bryan Wood who was to become your assistant when you became manager at Wootton Bassett Town?

PB: I'd known Woody for years playing against him mainly on Sundays and he never had a bad game. He was the Wiltshire "Didier Deschamp" as he always passed the ball to his team mates and popped up with the occasional goal but don't mention the winner I scored against his team in the Sunday Cup semi-final or the penalty he missed at Ballards Ash against us. I enjoyed every second we shared as a management duo and it was always funny when he lost his cool occasionally in the dugout. There isn't anything that Woody doesn't know about the game and he is very well respected and I was very lucky to have him as my assistant and he will always be a great friend.

MS: Over those years you would have played with a few Bassett legends, who do you view as the best player you ever played alongside and why?

PB: Crikey that is a tough one, but again I will have to go with Tony Vines because of the reasons I gave above but more on to do with wherever he played on the pitch he was quality and I didn't realise at the time just how old he was. He also loved the game and was still playing well into his 50, which is some achievement.

MS: If you were to pick your dream team from players that you played alongside at Wootton Bassett Town what would be your starting eleven?

PB: Mark Ayres, Mitch Johns, Clive Chappell, Tony Vines, Paul Harper, Barry Giles, Bryan Wood, Roger Frost, Damon York, Scott Vincent and Alan Wilson. A 4-3-3 formation with a hard working midfield of Giler, Woody and Alan Wilson with 3 top forwards in Frosty, Yorkie and Scott Vincent. It's a hard one though as there's so many to choose from.

MS: As someone who also attended Wootton Bassett School you would have been taught by both Mr Tanner and Mr Short amongst others but would you agree with me that Chris Kirkland was the teacher who did most for football at Wootton Bassett School?

PB: No not for me as Mr Kirkland didn't have anything to do with the football whilst I was there and Mr Tanner always took our school teams to matches.

MS: Did you ever have Mr Kirkland for geography or economics and if so did most of the lessons end up talking about football?

PB: No I only had Mr Kirkland for assemblies and then he'd bring his running shoes in and talk about running more so than football in them.

MS: Your first step into management came with Wootton Bassett Reserves alongside Pete Yeardley. How did that partnership come about?

PB: Barry stepped up to do the first team and the Chairman at the time Paul Harrison phoned me and asked if I'd do the reserves on a caretaker role and then he must have approached Pete as I still wanted to play as well. I knew Pete from our Sunday side and cricket so it was easy to work with him.

This week with Paul Burke

MS: I remember playing in the same team as you with Wootton Bassett Sports but that you tended to switch between the Sports and the Town. Is my memory standing up to the test of time here?

PB: Yes you are correct as I started with the Sports when Kenny Howie was manager when I was 16 or 17 and a few of Bassett's reserves players would play for us when they had no game and one of them asked if I'd go training with Bassett but I can't remember which one. I then started playing for the reserves under Mal Baker and stayed with them until a certain reserve team management duo thought the younger players in the team were listening to me more than them, which had nothing to do with anything apart from trying to help them during the game. I left to go to Purton who had put a 7 day approach in for me the previous 3 seasons but went back to Bassett later that season. I then didn't play Saturdays for a few months as my daughter was born but went back to Bassett Sports when Richard Vincent took over and played for them until Barry Giles asked me to go back to Bassett when he took over the reserves and I've been with the club ever since.

MS: I remember that you were a very skilful midfielder player and a big talker on the pitch but not necessarily the hardest working member of the team. Again have I got that one right?

PB: I can honestly say that I didn't think I wasn't a hard working player and never had a manager tell me that in all the time I played football. There were times when I'd worked all day Friday on the milk round, went to work behind the bar at The Woodshaw Inn after that until closing time and then was up early again for the milk round and rushed to games to play. That as well as having a young family meant some days I simply was whacked and I was told by a few of my managers I always played better on a Sunday morning or when the team I was playing for had a mid-week game. I certainly felt fresher in those matches. As a left footer it's easier to look skilful but I will take that from you and there will be a lot of players who said I moaned as well as talked on the pitch and I'd agree with that.

MS: Who was your first manager at Wootton Bassett Town and what did you learn from him that you would later go onto use when you became First Team Manager at the club?

PB: Mal Baker with the reserves and Mick Woolford was first team manager and they were both as honest as you could get and very approachable if you asked them something. Both of them would tell you before a game, phone you or talk at training if they thought you were having a bad spell but used that as an incentive because they didn't leave you out of the team as a result of it. You knew it was a kindly kick up the bum and it worked more times than not. When I went into management I just tried to be honest with the players and explain the decisions to leave them out or why they were substituted and was always there if they wanted a chat.

MS: How many other managers did you get to play under at Wootton Bassett Town and who do you view as being the one that had the biggest impact/influence on you?

PB: Paul Mackie, Jeff Youd, Paul Fishlock, Dave Warren, Alan Blythe (caretaker manager), Barry Giles, Pete Yeardley and Myself are the ones I can remember. It would have to be Mal, Mick for the reasons above, and Barry Giles who was the manager who brought me back to the club when the first team manager at the time said it was a mistake but was always nice to my face and he stuck up for me which is something I'll never forget. Without Barry doing that I don't know if I would've got a way back into the club again and everything that happened since might not have so he made the biggest impact for me.

MS: You played for the club for many years. When you first started out as a youngster who were the leading players in the First Team and which of the older players took you under their wing?

PB: There were loads of good players in the club and the reserve team players found it hard to break into the first team due to the quality that was in their team and we had a very good reserve team. I looked up to Tony Vines as he trained the same way as he played and was a winner in everything he tried to do. We used to go for long runs around Bassett at training and I tried so hard to beat him and only ever once got close but he still passed me as we entered the old Comp on the sprint to the gym where we did our ball work. He was so fit and even today I marvel at all the running he still does and he's a top fella as well. There were some real characters at the club like Mitch Johns, Roger Frost, Pete York and we had some great nights out especially at the Bier Keller in Bristol. I always remember my first game for the first team when we were away to North Leigh and arriving at the club was asked by a player why I was so early for the reserve team game and when I told him I was with the first team he said "I didn't realise we were short". I waited my time and a few years later when he'd returned from a knee op and came back with the first team I said the same thing to him. We had a laugh about it as he finally apologised for saying it to me.

MS: I believe you played in the game against Swindon Town when Glenn Hoddle brought the Swindon Town First Team to Rylands Way and over 2,000 fans filled Rylands Way. What do you remember of that game and is it the highlight of your time at Wootton Bassett Town?

PB: A great occasion to see so many fans at the ground and the fact that it was their first team squad made it so special to be on the same pitch. I wouldn't go as far to say it was the highlight of my time at Bassett Town F.C though as that would have to be managing in the F.A Cup and sharing that experience with my great mate Woody in the dugout. Every time I played or managed the club has been a highlight but when I was told by a ref that I should be proud of the first team one game because they showed the same passion for the game that I had was also a special moment.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

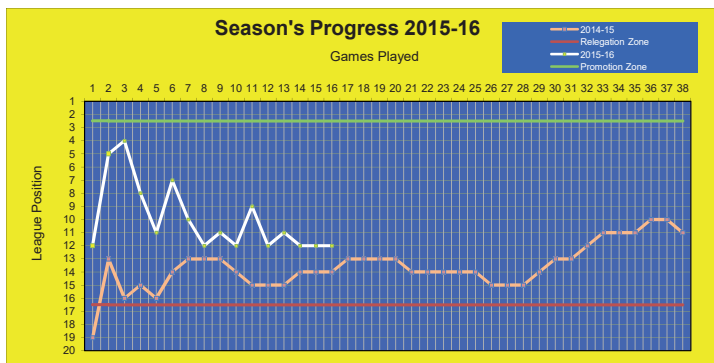
Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivensham Dave tragically passed away.

With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year ground share with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year playing its games in Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and record points haul in the division. This season sees the club playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name.

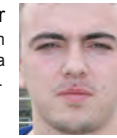

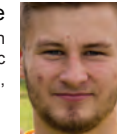

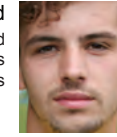

He played a handful of times for the Reserves in the 2010/11 and 2011/12 seasons before becoming the regular 'keeper for Bassett's second string in the 2012/13 campaign, a year in which Bassett finished with the third best defensive record in Hellenic League Division Two West.

2013/14 was another successful year, with Bassett conceding just 22 league goals – second best in the division –and reaching the semi-final of the President's Challenge Cup. Kuczynski gained his first taste of first team action at the start of that season, playing three games. He made his debut in a 2-1 home defeat against Highworth Town before featuring in the FA Cup loss to Totton and Eling and an away draw with Ascot United.

Kuczynski initial first team appearance last year came in a 2-1 away defeat at Ardley United in November. A month later, he replaced Ben Mitchell between the sticks for the visit of Binfield and was rewarded for his display in that 1-1 draw with a run of games where he was handed the No.1 jersey. In total, he appeared 13 times, keeping one clean sheet.

Perhaps his best display came in a 1-1 home draw against Abingdon United where he pulled off a number of fine reflex saves to ensure a vital point was earned in the face of an Abingdon barrage.

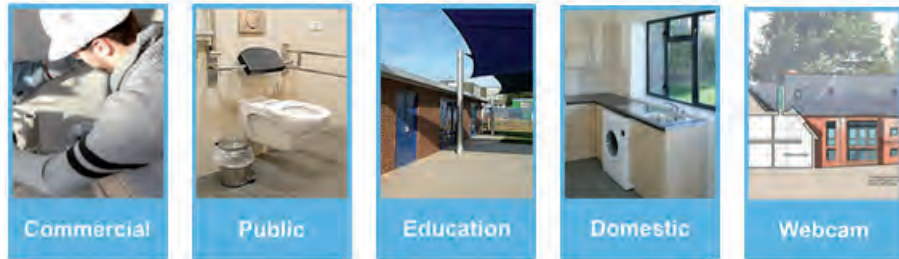

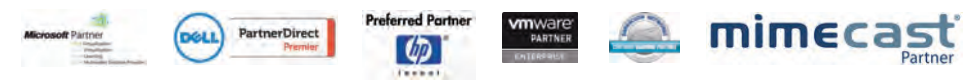

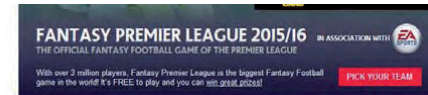

Oxford had just conceded to go 2-1 down against Chelmsford City, and the 27-year-old got his name on the scoresheet in spectacular fashion, striking an audacious effort straight from kick-off.

The ball dipped, clipping the crossbar on its way in and clearly surprising Claret's goalkeeper Ashley Timms who, despite a desperate dive, could not claw the ball away. But while it may have surprised Timms, Oxford captain Darren Pond wasn't so shocked. Pond said: "It was funny actually because Fozzy (Oxford City goalkeeping coach Alan Foster) said to me about shooting from the halfway line.

"I told him I can't kick it that far, so I had to tell Brad to do it and he couldn't have hit it any better to be fair."

And while Bubbs' effort was almost dead on the halfway line, Wealdstone's Davies went one better. In fact, he went about 20 yards better.

With the Stones already leading Brockenhurst 3-1 in the FA Cup third qualifying round, a free-kick from Brockenhurst keeper Callum Maher, landed kindly at the feet of Davies, midway inside his own half.

After taking a touch and lifting his head to see Maher still rushing back, Davies went for goal. Yes, it was an open goal, but from 70 yards, it's not easy to hit the target. For a moment, it looked like the 27-year-old's effort may bounce over the bar. As it was, it bounced just before the goal line and nestled into the net.

The FA Cup has been full of goals, and just two weeks after Davies' effort, Poole got out his best David Beckham impression in front of some of the former England captain's team mates to send his Salford City side through to the FA Cup first round.

Poole netted from just inside his own half, to the delight of City co-owners Gary Neville and Paul Scholes, as the Step 3 Ammies shocked National League side Southport.

There will undoubtedly be some more screamers over the next six months, and whoever follows Sean Geddes, who scored with an audacious rabona attempt last season, to pick up our National Game Award for goal of the season is sure to have wowed all.

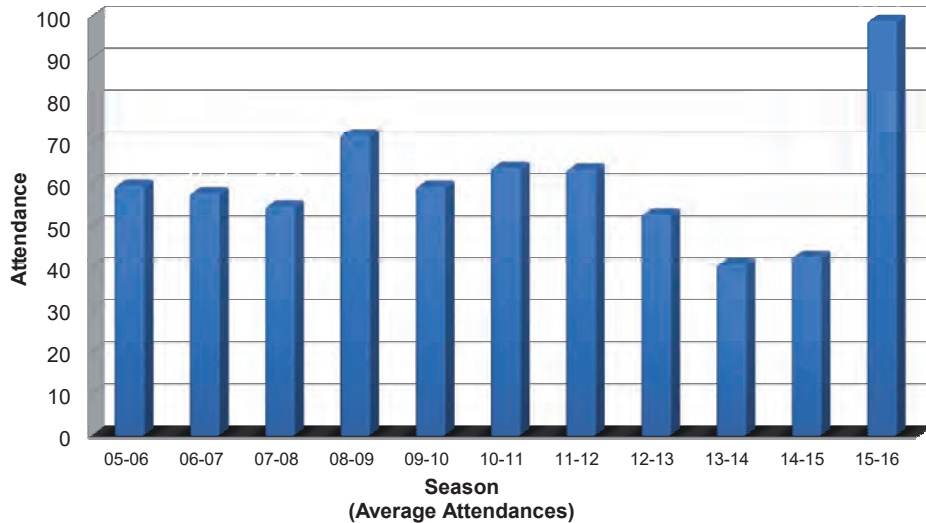

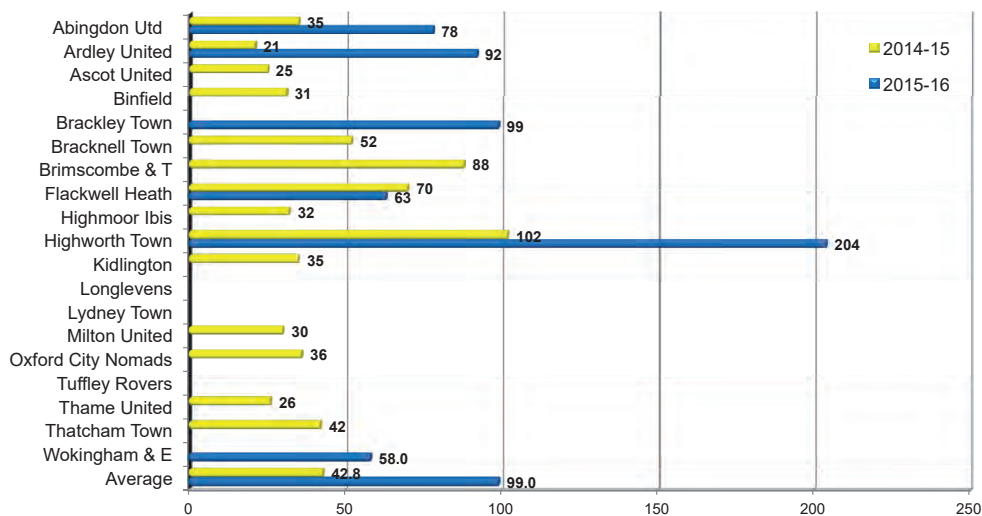
RWBTFC Attendances

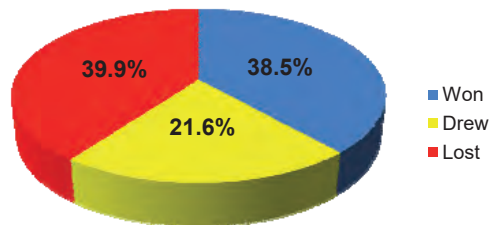

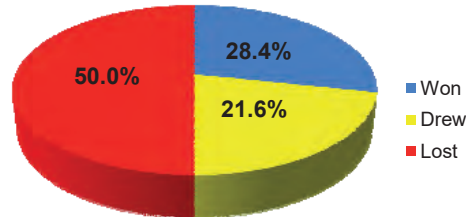

The UHL Bulletin (BRC) going forward The end of an era

The Bulletin was instigated by Trevor Cuss, the then Secretary of the League, in the 1980's. In those days it was delivered by the Royal Mail to clubs and League officials. The first electronic version was developed by Brian King early in the 1998-1999 season. Brian still has this edition on file. For many years it has been the flag-ship of our League with a circulation list exceeding 500. Most clubs have been able to produce their Match Programs from the information it provided. It broadcast The Hellenic message around the world.

Actually producing The Bulletin, itself is not an easy exercise. The timescale often means working into the small hours on Saturday and Sunday nights. Brian King produced every copy since 1998, until Brian Kirk took over for the last two years.

However, following the adoption by the League of The FA developed operating system Full Time, it was realised that the days of The Bulletin could be numbered: -

- The Results and League Table information is all now fully available on Full Time 15 minutes after the end of the last game taking place that day
- The latest and most up to date League Fixtures are shown on Full Time
- Our Web-Site includes the latest and most up to date news

After 17 years of being the information provider to and for The League, modern technology has now over-taken it. It is now better that the League invests time and energy in these areas. Hence the last edition of The Bulletin is set this Sunday November 1st 2015.

Depleted Bassett easily defeated

Not the easiest place to visit at the best of times but when you have to travel to Highmoor Ibis on a Monday night without 6 of your key players you always knew it was going to be a tough ask to come away with a result and so it proved. On 33 minutes a chance fell to Joe Hiscock after a Bassett free kick and he should really have done better but the chance again went begging. The game was effectively over as a contest when seconds later a defensive clearance from Austin Best looked a simple take for keeper Luke Kuczynski but the ball took a wicked bounce just in front of him and sailed over his head into the empty net. One of the most bizarre goals seen in a long time. Bassett did their best to try and get a goal back just before the break. Bailey shot from 20 yards and the effort was deflected for a corner. From the resulting corner, good work from Bailey set up Matt Cheetham but he fired over to leave it 2-0 at the break to the home side.

The second half saw Bassett trying to get back into the games and two efforts in the space of a couple of minutes from Steve Olphert was the closest Bassett came. Both efforts went well wide of the goal, the second coming after a great set-up by young Scott Walduck making his first start of the season in the Premier. The best chance of the night for Bassett came on 70 minutes when Matt Cheetham missed a header after a great cross from Dan Comer. It looked like a goal all the way but went wide of the post.

After that it was really all Highmoor. Harrison Bailey made it 3-0 to the home side. Moments later it was 4-0 when keeper Luke Kuczynski hesitated and Jemel Forde-Small nipped in to score. With all three points secured Highmoor took their foot off the gas and Bassett were able to create three further chances but all came to nothing. Cheetham shot just wide on 85 minutes before Dale Richhards was put clean through only to fire into the side netting. A little more composure and it would have been a consolation goal. With two minutes to go Dan Comer fired in a free kick which was tipped over the bar by Cadle in the Highmoor goal. 4-0 to the home side on the night and despite a few chance sin front of goal in reality there was only ever going to be one winner in this game. Credit to the lads who made it to Reading on this Monday night the problem for Bassett was really those that were not there.

Bassett now take a break from league action with three key cup games coming up which could define the season for Bassett. Hopefully most of the missing players will be back soon. If not there really is a need to strengthen the squad to compete better at this level.

Man of the Match: Matt Cheetham – Again another hard working performance from Bassett's experienced midfield player. Along with Steve Olphert and Dan Comer put in the usual graft in the Bassett midfield but not enough to inspire the young and inexperienced Bassett side.

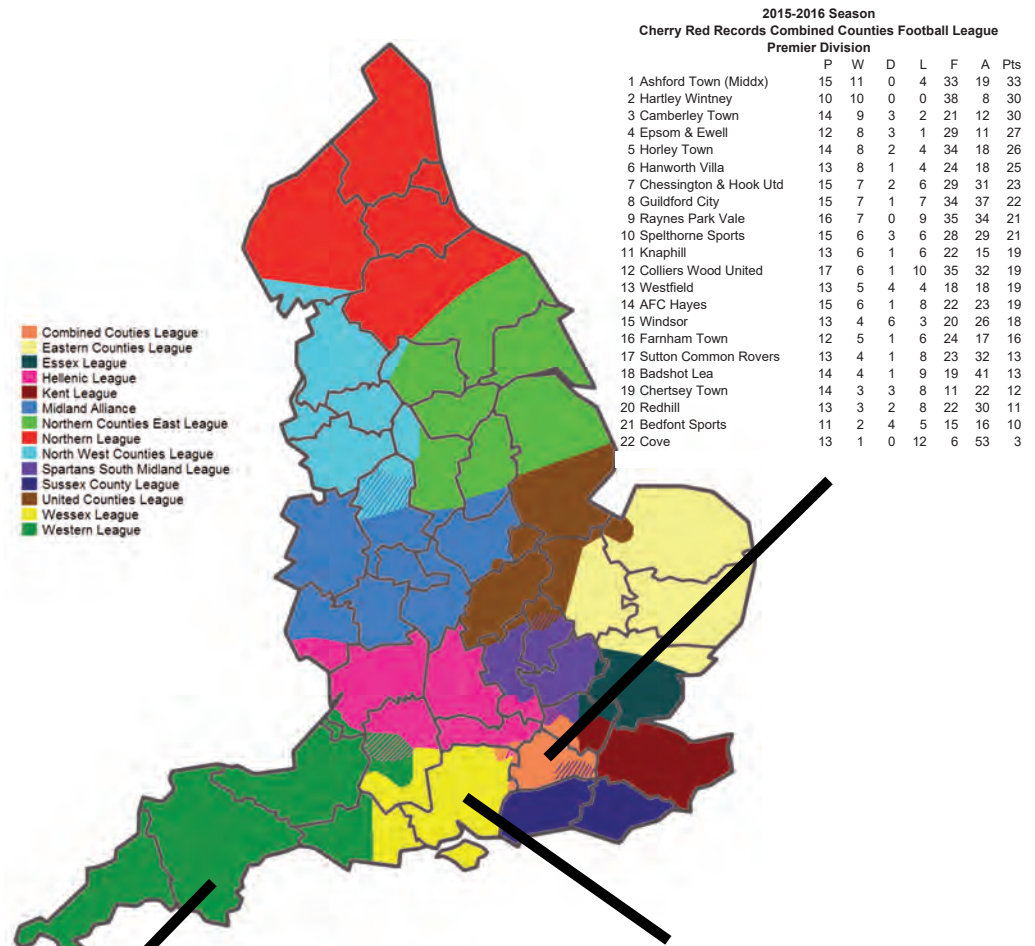
