Welcome to Melksham Town

This afternoon sees Melksham Town visit us in the Wiltshire Senior Cup. Whilst during the 1950's, 1960's and early 1970's Melksham Town were regular opponents for Wootton Bassett Town, today's game is only the second competitive fixture between the two sides in the last 42 years! A warm welcome to all from Melksham who have made the rare journey to Wootton Bassett for this afternoon's Wiltshire Senior Cup fixture. We hope all from Melksham enjoy their first visit to our new ground and we wish them a safe journey home.

Melksham play in the Toolstation Western League and were in fact Premier Division champions last season. However, due to ground grading issues they remain at Step 5 of the pyramid and this season currently sit in 7th place in the table, having won half of their eighteen games, drawn four and lost five. The last time the two sides met was back in January 2007 again in this competition, that day Melksham won by a solitary goal to progress to the next round. We will be looking to avenge that defeat here today. The two sides have met on seventy-three occasions in competitive fixtures over the years with Melksham having the better of things having won thirty four games to Wootton Bassett's twenty seven, with eleven drawn games (we have not been able to trace the result of the game at Melksham on 19th April 1965, so if anyone knows the result of that game it would be gratefully received).

This is the fifth time the two sides have met in this competition and the point to worry about is that Melksham have a 100% record against us in the Senior Cup. As well as the 2007 victory, they defeated us 3-2 back in 1972-73, 4-2 twenty years earlier in 1952-53 and 5-2 back in 1949-50. Hopefully today will see us secure that first win in this competition against Melksham.

The last time the two sides played in a league game was way back on 8th December 1973 when Wootton Bassett secured all the points thanks to a 5-2 win at Rylands Way. An interesting fact from that game was that a certain future celebrity darts player Bob Anderson fired a hat-trick for Wootton Bassett Town that day. Full details of all previous encounters between the two sides going back to 1903-04 are included in the programme today. There is also a match report from that last Wiltshire Senior Cup fixture in January 2007.

Kidlington

This time Royal Wootton Bassett Town were unable to stop one of the Hellenic League Premier Division's leading sides in their tracks as a goal late on in both halves ensured Kidlington reclaimed top spot from Flackwell Heath, whose reign at the top was limited to just 48 hours. Bassett's performance was a spirited one. Yet up against an extremely well organised side - something Paul Braithwaite was expecting Kidlington to be - we couldn't make a breakthrough. Instead, Ryan Brooks' right foot shot from just outside the box three minutes before the break, and Lewis Coyle's goal to round off a counter attack with eight minutes remaining in the second period made sure the visitors went home with the spoils. We were caught out a little bit by the number of groundhoppers attending the game and sold out of programmes on the night. Apologies to anyone who was unable to get a copy. Included amongst the groundhoppers was Talksport's Tony Incenzo who tweeted some comments about the game. It was also pleasing to see some of the comments

Congratulations to the Under 18's on securing the Under18 Floodlit League North Division title last Thursday with a 1-1 home draw against Shrivenham last night. Paul Gerrish's side, who still have one game to play against Calne Town, have enjoyed a stellar campaign so far, winning five of their seven games, while falling to just one defeat. They started with a 5-2 victory against Calne, with Ryan Collins leading the way as he bagged a brace. A Jake Covey hat-trick then sealed a comfortable 3-0 away win against Shrivenham. That was followed by a ten goal thriller against Chippenham Town in which Bassett prevailed 6-4 as both Collins and Covey netted twice alongside Aidan Thompson and an own goal. Bassett's next assignment was a trip to New

College, who at the time were, like their visitors that evening, unbeaten. However, a pair of goals from Dan Murphy and a stunning strike from 'keeper Jack Gregory earned another 3-0 triumph. Collins (2), Covey (2) and Thompson soon made it five wins on the trot as a five star display handed New College another defeat in the return fixture. Bassett eventually relinquished their 100% record away at Chippenham, who triumphed by the odd goal in three, Hugo Vivash's strike not being enough for the visitors. Still, the team found themselves well out in front in the division, and a point against Shrivenham was enough to claim the crown. Well done Paul and the lads.

From The Dugout

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to Darren Perrin and the rest of his management team and players from Melksham Town to the New Gerard Buxton Ground for this Wiltshire Senior Cup fixture.

It is a long time since we last played Melksham and we are not very familiar with them as a side. This is one of the attractions of this County Cup competition as we get to play sides that we very infrequently come up against. With the likes of Salisbury, Highworth Town, Bemerton and Laverstock & Ford still in this competition whoever we played in this round of the competition it was always going to be tough and I am sure the lads are looking forward to the challenge today. Unlike the previous two rounds when we have probably been the overwhelming favourites we go into this game as the underdogs given that Melksham were winners of the Western League. The pressure is certainly on Melksham here today.

It was strange not to have a game last weekend and to be honest it would have made sense to play this game last week when both ourselves and Melksham were without a game. This was the scheduled date for the County Cup competition but we understand that the Wilts FA wanted all the quarter final ties to go ahead on the same date and with Salisbury and Highworth Town playing each other in the FA Vase and with Bradford Town also in FA Vase action that meant delaying matters until this weekend.

Last time out we lost narrowly to league leaders Kidlington and on the night we were disappointed not to take something out of the game. This match, together with Ascot and Thatcham away have shown we are more than capable of holding our own against the top sides in the Hellenic League.

After today's game we have the small matter of a local derby away to John Fisher's Highworth Town. I am sure the players are looking forward to this game which is sure to be played in front of a bumper crowd with the game having been moved from Boxing Day. After that we have Brimscombe & Thrupp here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground to kick off the New Year.

After this we have just 15 league games to go and with 8 at home we are confident that we will move up in the Premier League table. Our ambition is to achieve a higher finish than last season's record breaking achievement but we will need to be at our best in the second half of the season to achieve this. The supporters here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground can play an important role in this by getting behind the lads in the remaining games this season.

Hopefully we can win today and go into the New Year still fighting on three fronts.

Enjoy the game this afternoon and see you in the bar afterwards.

Opponents - History

Melksham Town F.C was formed in October 1876, the first game being played at "Challymead". The club were founder members of the Wilts League in 1894, playing in that league for 80 years. They only won the league once in 1903/1904 but finished runners-up in 1924/25, 29/30, 59/60, 67/68 & 71/72. In 1903/04 the club won the Wilts Senior Cup beating Swindon Hayden Street Workmen in the final. The club did not reach the final again until 1957/58 when they lost to Devizes Town after a 2nd replay. The same season saw the Conigre's record attendance of 2,821 in an FA cup match against Western League Trowbridge Town in which Melksham lost 6-0 after losing goalkeeper Mick Beaven with a finger injury. Mick later became a football league referee before his untimely death in 1978. In the early 60's, the club did not enjoy a great deal of success on or off the field, and in 1967 the club appointed ex-Bath player Ken Owens as player manager who brought a more professional attitude to the club. The Club reached the Wilts Senior Cup final three seasons running, 1967/68 to 1969/70, the latter seeing a 2-0 win against Devizes with two penalties from Ron Low. In 1968/69 the club should have won the league but lost it in the last match, the season however was a notable one with Gareth Lewis scoring a club record 72 goals and the team reaching the first round proper of the FA Amateur Cup, only to lose at home in front of a 800 crowd to Harwich & Parkeston 3-2.

In 1974 the club joined the Western League and results were poor for the first two seasons and in 1976 Melksham Town were relegated to the newly formed first division. Alan Skirton took over as Manager but promotion eluded the club although we won the Wilts Senior cup again in 1978 beating Avon Bradford 3-0. Pete Carter took charge in 1979 as player manager and guided the town to the First Division title, Pete remained in charge until 1982 taking the club to fifth place in his last season and winning the wilts shield in 1980/81 and 1981/82. Brian Ballinger took over briefly in 1982/83 followed by Mel Gingell in November 1983 and he guided the club to the league cup in 1985 and two further wilts shield triumphs. In 1986 new toilets, dressing rooms and floodlights were erected and first division Southampton visited the Conigre for the opening ceremony in front of a 1,500 crowd. At the end of the 1987/88 season the town were relegated back to the first division ending an 8 season stay in the top flight. During the following season 1989/90 a change in management saw Alan McDougall taking over from Mel Gingell, Alan an ex - Stranraer, Mangotsfield and Trowbridge Town player was forced to resign after only a short spell owing to work commitments. Former Larkhall manager Dave King was quickly installed in November 1990 and the season ended with Town finishing a disappointing 16th position. A change in club policy owing to financial difficulties ended with Dave King's resignation in pre - season. Local man Nigel Brimble a former assistant manager to Mel Gingell was appointed but the club finished bottom of the league in the 1992/93 season and were relegated from the Great Mills league under the pyramid system. For the 1993/94 season Mel Gingell returned to the club as 1st team manager. If the 1992/93 was the lowest point in the clubs history, and then the 1993/94 was one of complete success as Town clinched the County Championship and the league double.

Winning the championship together with all the necessary work off the field completed and promotion back to the Great Mills league after one year was a magnificent achievement. In 1995/96 Town finished 9th in the league and at the end of the season Darren Perrin was appointed Manager. What a season 1996/7 was to be as Town clinched the 1st Division title and in the process becoming the first ever winners under Screwfix Direct the new sponsors. On the way they had a 24 game unbeaten run in the league and clinched the title by one point at Yeovil in the last game. 1997/98 saw Town finished in 3rd position, their highest ever Western league placing on their return to the Premier Division. Robbie Lardner was appointed as Manager following Darren's departure and he guided the team to a very respectable finishing place of 9th in the Screwfix Premier league. Season 2001/02 saw the club celebrate its 125th year in football since being founded in 1876 and finished in 10th position. In the 2002/03 season the Town won the Wiltshire Senior Cup for the 4th time in their history by beating Trowbridge Town 2-1 at the Chippenham FC ground, the Wiltshire Senior Cup had previously been won in 1904-05, 1969-70, and in 1977-78 although they had made the final on three other occasions only to finish runners -up. At the end of the 2002/03 season with the Town finishing in 8th place Robbie Lardner decided to stand down as Manager and move on. In the 2003/04 pre-season, Nigel Tripp was appointed the new Player/Manager for the Town but towards the end of the season decided it was time to hang up his boots and concentrate on the management side of the season with Town finishing the season in 13th place. However in February of the 2004/05 season Nigel resigned from his position as Manager following the clubs heaviest defeat at the hands of Bideford. Lee Burns was immediately instated as caretaker Player /Manager until the end of the season at which time he decided to stand down and concentrate on his business in Bristol. The end of the 2004/05 season saw Town Finish 14th Place and also the end of the Screwfix Western League sponsorship. In the close season Kelvin Highmore former Manager of local rivals Calne joined the club to take over the reins as Manager and take Town into the 2005/06 Western League season under the umbrella of Toolstation the new sponsors of the Western League. The team had a mixed season of league results and finished in 14th place but had an excellent run in the Wiltshire Senior Cup. However they ended up as runners-up by losing to Corsham Town with the final going into extra time and penalties and although losing on an aggregate of 7-5 the team put up a first class performance. The Reserve team reached the final of the Corsham Print KO Cup losing out to Corsham Town Reserves 2-0. However The icing on the cake for the clubs season was the Youth teams 3-0 win over Malmesbury Victoria Youth to take the Wiltshire County FA Youth Cup.

The 2006/07 season saw the first team start poorly but soon get back into gear and finished the season in 5th place, the highest they have been since finishing 3rd in the 1998/99 season. They also were runners -up in the Wiltshire Senior Cup for the second season running. The Youth team finished the season as Champions of the Wiltshire Floodlight League. Season 2007/08 saw Town finishing 11th in the league and they equalled their best ever run in the FA Vase(until the 2014-2015 season) reaching the third round proper losing 3-0 at home to the Holders Truro City. They ended the season on a high winning the Wiltshire Senior Cup for the 5th time defeating Laverstock and Ford 5-2. At the start of the new 2008/09 season Wayne Thorne took over as the new Town Manager when the club finished 10th. The 2009/10 season saw the club finish 19th and relegated to the First division. In the summer of 2010 a new committee for the club was formed to take over from Mike Perrin and Dave Phillips who had been involved for many years in the club. The new committee of Dave Wiltshire, Ian Forester, Mark Jeffery, Andrew Butcher and Karen Forester took over the leadership of the club with a view to taking the club forward installing a strong belief in using the local young talent within the Town. New Manager Adam Young and his assistant Gary Newman were appointed prior to the start of the 2010/11 season and guided the team to a respectable 8th position in their first season in charge. In October 2011 Adam Young decided to step down as Manager due to work commitments and ex Town players Dave Clayton took over the manager's role with Justin Messenger as his assistant and they guided the club to runners up in the Toolstation Western League Division One in the 2011-2012 season to gain promotion back to the Premier Division for 2012-2013. The 2012-2013 season saw the Town defeat Downton 2-0 after extra time in the Wiltshire Senior Cup to capture the trophy for the sixth time in their history and end up a creditable 13th place in the first season back in the Western League Premier. In September 2013 Manager Dave Clayton and assistant Justin Messenger left the club and Town appointed Darren Perrin for his second stint at the club after successful spells at Chippenham Town and Frome Town. The season 2013-2014 saw the Town finish in 7th place in league and retain the Wiltshire Senior Cup after a thrilling win on penalties after a 3-3 draw AET with Bradford Town. The 2014-2015 season culminated in the club winning the Toolstation Western League Premier Division for the first time in their history despite being one of just a few clubs not setting aside a budget and relying upon a team based on players from within the Town, a truly special achievement. In addition the club progressed to the fourth round of the FA Vase for the first time in their history and manager Darren Perrin won the Manager of the Year award. The club were denied promotion as the current facility at The Conigre was deemed inadequate and the proposed new ground building was delayed. The 2014- 2015 season was anticipated to be the last season the club would play at the Conigre ground but after unforeseen delays the Town are now forced to play the 2015-2016 season at The Conigre. However with work already started on the new ground at Woolmore Farm in Melksham to include the Town's strong and growing Youth and ladies sections the club will move at the start of the 2016-2017 Season.

A look back at former opponents who are no longer competing. After Avebury, Sanford, Walcot Ath, Wollen Sports, Meadowcroft and Ferndale Athletic amongst others today's featured team is former Bradford-on-Avon side...

Spencer Moulton FC

The first known games between Wootton Bassett Town FC and Spencer Moulton came in the Wiltshire Senior League in Season 1935-36 when, having joined the Wiltshire League, Wootton Bassett met the reserve side of the Bradford-on-Avon club. Wootton Bassett did the double winning 4-1 at home thanks to goals from Arthur Embling (2), Ernie Fry and Bull. The game at Bradford-on-Avon was a closer affair with goals from Eric Pearce (2) and Fred Perry.

With Wootton Bassett Town being promoted to the top division of the Wiltshire League it was the First Team of Spencer Moulton that Wootton Bassett were to meet the following season. Spencer Moulton won comprehensively at Bradford-on-Avon, 6-0 the final score. The return in Wootton Bassett saw Spencer Moulton win by the odd goal in seven, Embling, Brown and Beazley with the Bassett goals. Spencer Moulton finished 6th with Bassett back in 10th place.

In Season 1937-38 Spencer Moulton won 5-0 at home but Bassett extracted revenge at Rylands Way winning 3-2 thanks to goals from Arthur Embling (2) and Bartlett. The following season saw Spencer Moulton do the league double over Bassett winning 3-0 at Rylands Way and 7-1 on their own ground. These were to be the last encounters between the two sides for seven years with the outbreak of World War II.

When the Wiltshire League reconvened in 1945-46 the two sides were to struggle, Wootton Bassett finishing bottom of the league and Spencer Moulton just two places above them in 12th place. Their record in the rest of the 1940's and 1950's was:

1946-47 – 3rd out of 16
1947-48 – 13th out of 16
1948-49 – 12th out of 15
1949-50 – 10th out of 15
1950-51 – 5th out of 16
1951-52 – 8th out of 16
1952-53 – 12th out of 16

1953-54 – 9th out of 16
1954-55 – 14th out of 16
1955-56 – 12th out of 16

The formation of the new Wiltshire League and the creation of a Premier Division saw the two sides in different divisions, Spencer Moulton in the Premier League and Wootton Bassett in Division 1. With Wootton Bassett winning Division 1 in 1958-59 the two clubs once again met as the 1960's started.

On 19th September 1959 first half goals from Teetgen, Campbell and Nash helped Wootton Bassett win 5-1. The return game on 9th January 1960 saw another 5 goals for Bassett including a Peter Teetgen hat-trick as Bassett won 5-2. This was a bad season for Spencer Moulton who picked up just one point from 28 games and were relegated.

Spencer Moulton regained their Premier Division place at the end of Season 1965-66. In Season 1966-67 it was the Bradford-on-Avon side who had the better of things winning 8-2 at home and 5-3 at Rylands Way, finishing in 6th place whilst Wootton Bassett were just one off the bottom in 16th spot.

The following season it was honours even, Wootton Bassett Town winning away 2-1 but losing 3-0 at Rylands Way. Despite this defeat Bassett finished 3 places above Spencer Moulton in 8th place.

Season 1968-69 saw the formation of the Wiltshire Combination with both clubs as participants. It was to be Wootton Bassett Town who had the better of things. In October two goals from Brian Ewen and one from Tom Gardiner gave Wootton Bassett a 3-2 away win at Bradford-on-Avon. In the return at Rylands in December, goals from Colin Taylor and Dave Challis ensured a point a piece.

Season 1969-70 was to see the last known encounters between the two clubs as Spencer Moulton, finishing second from bottom dropped out of the league at the end of the season. On 4th October 1969 goals from Dave Challis, Dave Clark and Roy Blackburn gave Wootton Bassett Town a 3-1 win. The final game between the two clubs took place on the 15th May 1970, the final fixture of the season for Wootton Bassett. Goals from Tommy Gardiner (3), Graham Reid, Roy Blackburn, Dave

Clark and Stuart Ward secured a 7-0 win for Wootton Bassett Town.

Spencer Moulton took part in the FA Cup for seven seasons just after the Second World War. In 1946-47 they lost in the Extra Preliminary Round 2-4 at home against Melksham Town. In 1948-49 they secured their best ever result winning 10-3 at home against West End Rovers. A narrow 2-1 defeat at Westbury in the Preliminary Round ended their interest in the FA Cup that season. The following season they went out in the Extra Preliminary Round losing 3-1 at home to Devizes Town.

Season 1950-51 saw Spencer Moulton draw Wootton Bassett Town in the Extra Preliminary Round. The Wiltshire Times dated Saturday 9th September 1950 carried the following report on the game which saw Wootton Bassett win 2-1:

"Spencer Moulton went to Wootton Bassett for their FA Cup game. Only one minute from the kick-off Thompson, the home team's inside-left, had to leave the field with an injury. The visitors attacked and Young had saved from Sherman. The home team rallied, and Newbury was called upon to save twice from Brown. Brown scored for Wootton Bassett after 30 minutes, but the ball quickly changed ends, and Young pulled off a splendid save from Dawson. The equalising goal came with a long dropping shot from Bolwell which completely beat the home goalkeeper. The second half saw a win for Wootton Bassett by 2-1, the deciding goal being scored by Farlie."

The two following seasons saw FA Cup interest ended by Chippenham Town. Spencer Moulton's second win in the competition came in Season 1953-54 when they won 6-2 at home against Westbury United in the Preliminary Round. Interest in the competition was ended by Welton Rovers who won 5-3 in the First Qualifying Round tie. Spencer Moulton were not to enter the competition again until 1969-70, their final season in the Wiltshire Combination, when they were hammered by Weston Super Mare 11-2 in what was also to be their final appearance in the FA Cup.

Bradford Town of the Western League now play on the old Spencer Moulton ground having been formed in 1992 when Senior football was brought back to Bradford-on-Avon.

David Thompson-Midfield/Defender –Aged -27- Appearances 173 –Goals 28

Returned to club in September 2013 after spells at Paulton Rovers and Frome Town. Equally comfortable at the back or in midfield and stayed loyal to home town club despite tempting offers elsewhere. Debut August 2008.

Ian Jeffery - Full Back - Aged 25 - Appearances - 225 - Goals - 5

Full back who has made the left back spot his own over recent seasons featuring in over 200 games for his home Town club after making debut in Jan 2008.Joint Managers Player of year 2014-2015.

Sayeed Ibrahim - Defender - Aged 26 - Appearances 107- Goals 2

Established himself in side in central defence during last season but another who is comfortable at full back and a regular squad member who can always be relied upon when called upon. Possesses dangerous long throw. Debut April 2011

Ryan Bennet - Defender - Aged 24 - Appearances 74-Goals 14

Central defender joined from Mangotsfield United in November 2013 and has become a regular in the side and becoming player's player of season in successive seasons and now skips the side. Always likely to pop up with a goal from set plays. Previous spell at Frome Town and Mangotsfield.

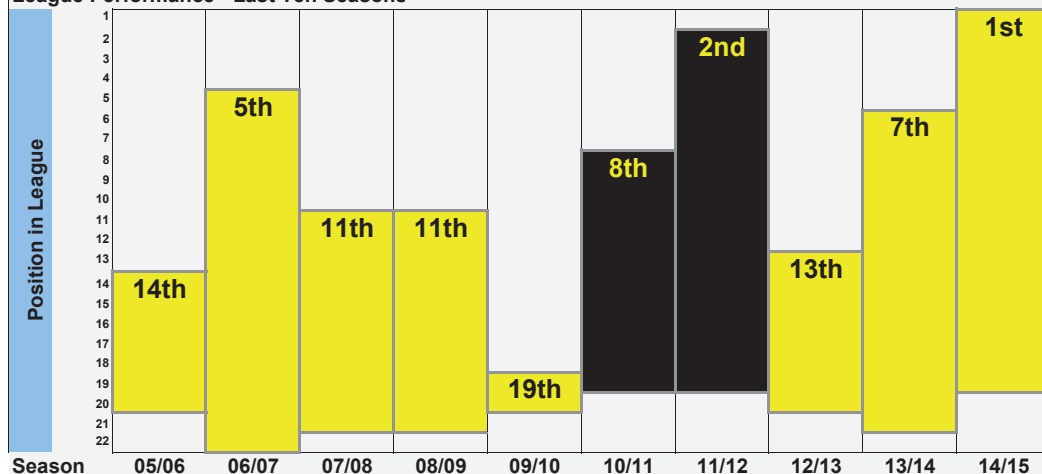

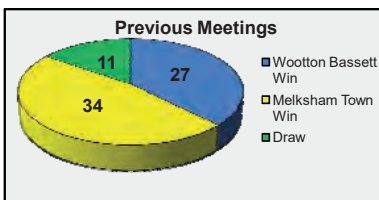
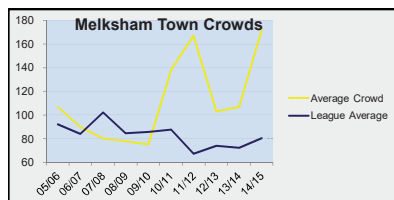

Today's Opponents - This Season

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.



Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away.

With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year ground share with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year playing its games in Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and record points haul in the division. This season sees the club playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name.

10 Man Bassett Booted Out of County Cup

The Conigre, 13th January 2007

Adam Young's 62nd minute strike was enough for Melksham Town as they knocked 10-man Wootton Bassett Town, who played the whole second half a man down, out of the Wiltshire Senior Cup at the quarter final stage.

Bassett made a game out of it though against a side one level above them and were unfortunate to see Jon Davis given a second yellow for only his second foul of the game on the stroke of half time after a hard challenge. Yellow cards were produced frequently in a game where there wasn't one real dangerous challenge made all game; the first came after only eight minutes and was given to Andy Hallett after he impeded Luke Ballinger after the forward had gotten by him.

On quarter of an hour Simon Price's effort was cleared off the line after patient build up by the Western League side. Four minutes later Matty Bennett almost gave Bassett the lead with their first chance of the match as his 20-yard half volley sailed just wide following a Chris Mills crossfield ball. Davis received his first caution in the 29th minute, somewhat harshly getting tangled up with an opponent. Three minutes later Stu Hemsley connected with an Andy White cross but Steve Perrin did enough to save the header after Mark King had held the ball up well. Tim Eatough then had a chance at the other end as he slid in for Mike Perrott's low cross but his shot at the front post went inches wide.

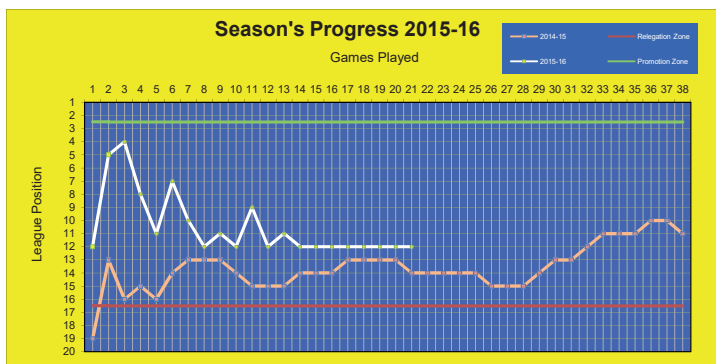
Melksham captain Leigh Burke was then booked for dissent. Steve Yeardley's quick free kick after the infringement created an opening but White headed wide from Hemsley's cross at the far post. A quick Yeardley set piece then almost cost Bassett as Ballinger intercepted and raced towards goal. He squared for teammate Ashley Groves but James Domm denied him, brilliantly parrying away at the forwards' feet. Two minutes before the break Ballinger beat Domm as his 25-yard free kick bounced back out off the woodwork, seconds before Davis received his second yellow.

Unsurprisingly the first action of the second half involved the referee as Price was booked for jumping in front of a Bassett free kick. Domm was forced into action again just before the hour as Perrott rounded four Bassett defenders before finding himself one-on-one with the 'keeper. Domm averted the danger as he parried away at the tricky winger's feet. Steve Shaw then replaced Marcus Neale before Scott Large found himself in the book for another innocuous foul. Perrott was cautioned in the 66th minute as he played the ball whilst not on the field of play after having received treatment, much to the home side's disgust although the yellow was rightly given. Miscommunication amongst the Bassett defence led to Young's winner in the 72nd minute as neither Domm, Yeardley nor Hallett dealt with Ballinger's cross. Domm was able to glove the ball away but only as far as Young who fired easily into the top corner from 12 yards. Hemsley and King were then replaced by Paul Crabtree and Nathan Hall respectively as Bassett searched for an equaliser. However being a man down, Bassett were unable to keep hold of possession long enough in Melksham territory to allow any sort of attack to succeed allowing the hosts to deal with most of what was thrown at them. Bassett did well to ensure the loss was only by a single goal as Large cleared a Josh Brigham header off the line before Eatough squandered a great chance – blazing over from 12 yards after substitute Steve Tweddle had cut the ball back to him.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Matty Bennett – caused problems on the right wing for a slow Melksham defence and was unlucky not to score. Most of the second half play went through Bennett and still he was able to beat men.

Scoop Rating: 7/10 – Bassett weren't helped by the red card but put in a solid performance against opposition from a higher level. If Davis hadn't received a red it would have been an entirely different game.

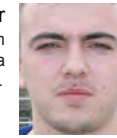

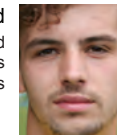

Callum Wright - Midfield



A former Chelsea and Bristol City youth player, Wright is a gifted young midfielder who re-joined his hometown club last season after a brief spell during Jeff Roberts' season-long tenure. He is calm on the ball with excellent football intelligence and an eye for a pass.

Wright appeared 27 times last season, scoring twice. His first goal came in a 3-2 comeback victory against Cheltenham Saracens, while he also netted in a 1-1 draw against Kidlington late in the season. He largely played in the centre of midfield, though also filled in at centre half when necessary and produced high quality displays in both positions.

He initially joined Bassett in 2013/14, having spent that pre-season with Conference South outfit Weston-Super-Mare. In all he made eight appearances, four of which came from the bench including his debut against Highmoor Ibis in a 2-2 draw. Wright featured at full back, in wide midfield as well as in the centre of midfield – his most natural position. He then signed with Chippenham Town in November, and featured sparingly for the Bluebirds until re-signing with Bassett.

At 12 years of age, Wright moved from Swindon Town to Chelsea, where he played in the same youth side as England under 21 international Josh McEachran and Olympic sprinter Adam Gemili. A severe injury eventually led to his release from the Premier League club, and he was soon picked up by Bristol City, earning a place as a scholar. Wright now is a student at the University of Bath, and in 2012/13 made eight appearances for New College.

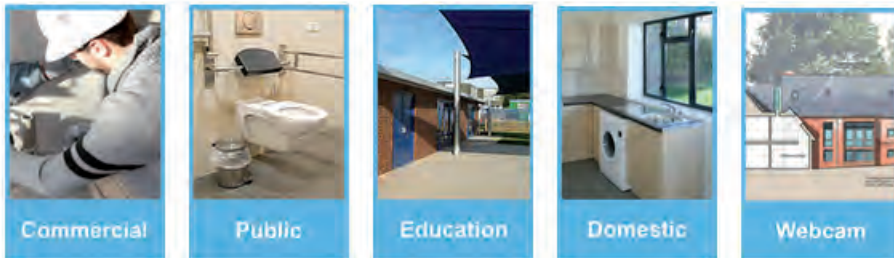

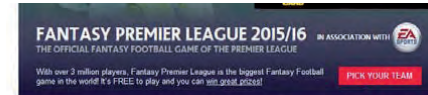

F.A. Cup Third Round Draw

Securing a draw in football can often evoke a range of emotions depending on the circumstances – whether your team have frustratingly dropped points or they have managed to battle back from a losing position. But last weekend, three Non-League clubs secured draws that meant more than the usual sharing of the points.

With the FA Cup third round welcoming the big boys to the party, securing a replay is a welcome result. It means your name is in the hat for the eagerly awaited draw that can immediately add to the significance of playing the fixture for the second time.

Along with the financial incentive, the FA Cup third round draw also creates the prospect of the players and managers walking out alongside a Premier League side and that surely alters the mentality during a replay.

No side will know this feeling better this year than National League South's Whitehawk. A scalp was always on the cards against League Two strugglers Dagenham & Redbridge but after conceding just four minutes in, many would have been forgiven for predicting a routine afternoon for the Football League side.

But the reason the FA Cup is so wonderful is its unpredictability, and equalising in the 94th minute is one of those feelings in football that all fans relish.

This result was not just sweet for the Hawks because they came from behind, but because they have given themselves a chance to visit Goodison Park.

Roberto Martinez's Everton will host them of the Daggers in the third round and with the Hawks now boasting home advantage, the momentum is well and truly with the Non-League side.

Evo-Stik Northern Premier side Salford City – the lowest ranked team left in the Cup – will have to travel to Hartlepool for their replay as they also came from behind to gain a priceless draw.

They have once again been handed the prospect of hosting a big side, with promotion chasing Derby their potential visitors.

Grimsby impressed with a 0-0 draw with League One Shrewsbury, and they could travel to Cardiff to face former boss Russell Slade's side.

These results can alter the shape of the Cup completely and teams in the higher divisions rarely want to add another fixture to their busy schedule.

But in Non-League, it is what these players and managers live for – packed schedule or not.

We must, however, not forget that one Non-League side have already guaranteed their place in the third round.

Eastleigh, of the National League, may have been the favourites against Evo-Stik Northern Premier side Stourbridge but history was made and in style.

A 2-0 victory not only sent them in to the third round for the very first time but it also dealt them a fantastic draw that is likely to attract television coverage.

They will welcome Championship side Bolton and it will no doubt be seen as another possible upset.

As we edge towards the busy Christmas period, let's hope these hugely important replays – thanks to hugely impressive draws – result in a present to remember.

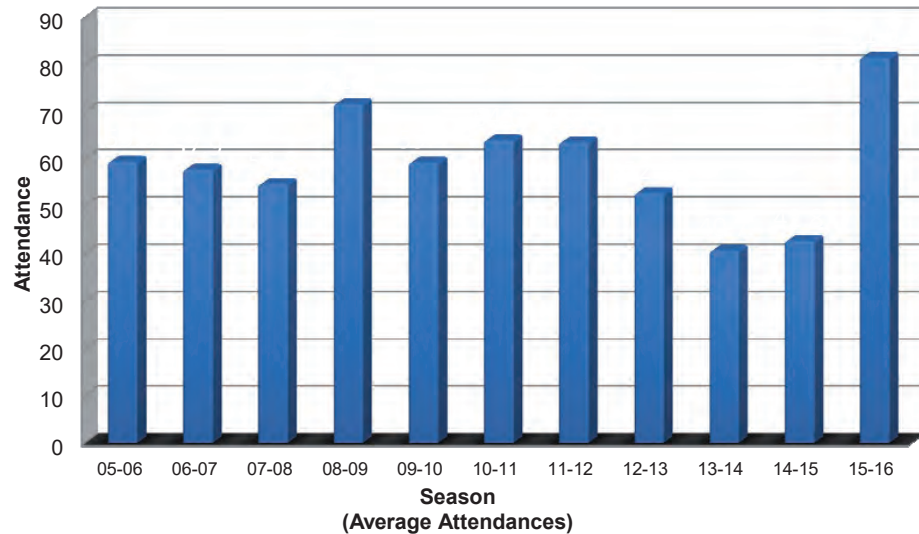

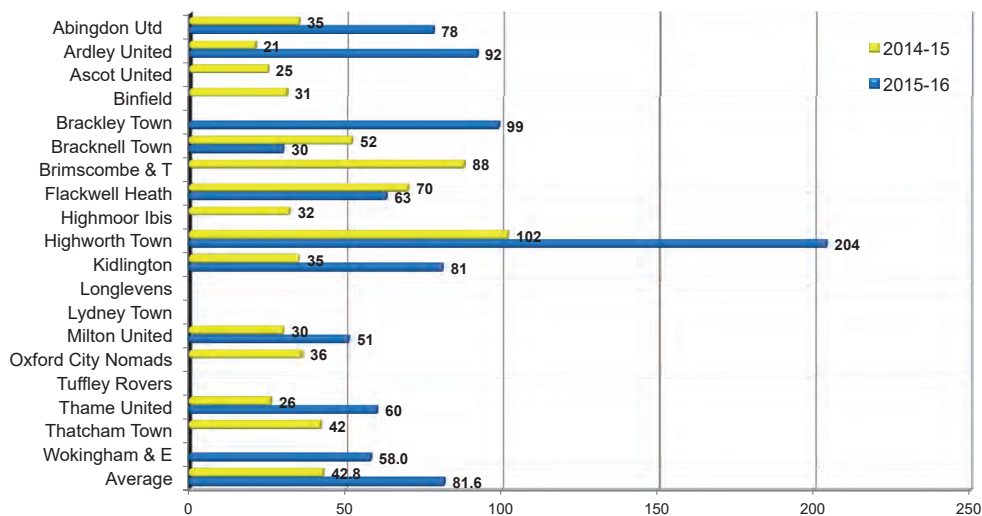

Match Reports

Bassett win with the wind in their sails

New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, 5th December 2015

While their 2-0 victory was heavily assisted by the ferocious December winds, Royal Wootton Bassett Town deservedly claimed another scalp of one of the Hellenic League Premier Division's leading sides as a second half brace from Dan Comer helped account for sixth place Thame United. Comer's pair of goals were near identical, the defender heading and stabbing in from close range after Thame stopper Steve Clarke, enduring a torrid afternoon, misjudged two inswinging corners from Dale Richards.

The duo's combination at that end of the pitch ultimately made sure it was three points Bassett wound up taking from the match. But it was their efforts in defence in the opening period, alongside those of Nathan Hawkins – whose performance was imperious, debutant right back Dan Carter and 'keeper Curtis Meare, which laid the foundations from which their team could go on to victory. With clearances rarely getting any further than the halfway line and Thame therefore enjoying the lion's share of play, playing against the wind prior to the break demanded the utmost concentration. Indeed, conditions were so bad, conceding just one goal would have been seen as an achievement. Bassett's defensive quintet delivered better than that though, standing firm in the face of persistent pressure from the visitors to ensure the half ended goalless. Thame certainly helped matters as they failed to master the elements and take advantage of having the wind behind them. It took them until the 20th minute to create their first chance, which Luke Ricketts squandered as he shot tamely across the face of goal after racing onto Dan West's through ball into the left channel. The visitors also found Meare in top form. He was first called into action when he acrobatically prevented a looping header back from Comer from flying over him. While his reactions there were impressive, the saves he pulled off to first deny David Lynn and then keep out Daniel Pounds were infinitely better. On 28 minutes, after patient build up play in the final third, Lynn surged forward before striking a piledriver from 20 yards, which Meare, flying to his left and outstretched, diverted over with a single-handed tip save. Moments later, a long ball over the top set Pounds in free behind the defence, but Meare, with a Schmeichel-esque starfish spread at point blank range, brilliantly managed to steer his poke from ten yards around the post. Then from the resultant corner, one of many that Thame won in the first half and failed to capitalise upon, Nick Dugmore planted a header over from close range. Having survived that barrage of pressure, Bassett could have taken the lead from two forays into opposition territory late in the period. However, Dan Bailey mishit from a Richards pull back when in a good position, while a curling Ryan Thomas effort from 20 yards brought an awkward parry from Clarke.

Going forward soon became much easier for the hosts as they had the wind at their back following the restart. And they quickly used it to their benefit. On 48 minutes, Richards whipped in his first inswinging corner to the edge of the six yard box, which Clarke failed to claim, allowing Comer to nod in from a matter of yards. Demonstrating how dangerous corners could be on an afternoon so blustery, another Richards set piece then crashed against the bar with Clarke, failing to judge the wind, off his line in no man's land. With 65 minutes on the clock, his low delivery was spilled onto the near post by Clarke and Comer again had the fortune of finding himself in the right position at the right time to prod the rebound home from a yard out. Thame having no recourse to a reply, Comer's second served to sew up the points for Bassett. The final twenty five minutes were therefore a relatively comfortable affair. Yet Paul Braithwaite's side refused to take their foot off the gas, and could have had three when clever play from Joe Hiscock in the right corner allowed him to feed a pass inside for Steve Robertson. The division's leading scorer failed to build on his 22 goals so far this campaign, however, as his toe poke from 12 yards was blocked.

Man of the Match: Nathan Hawkins – despite being just 22, Hawkins was the elder statesman of Bassett's back five and marshalled the back line with maturity and class in the opening period. That helped make sure they failed to concede prior to the break and was crucial in setting the team up for victory.

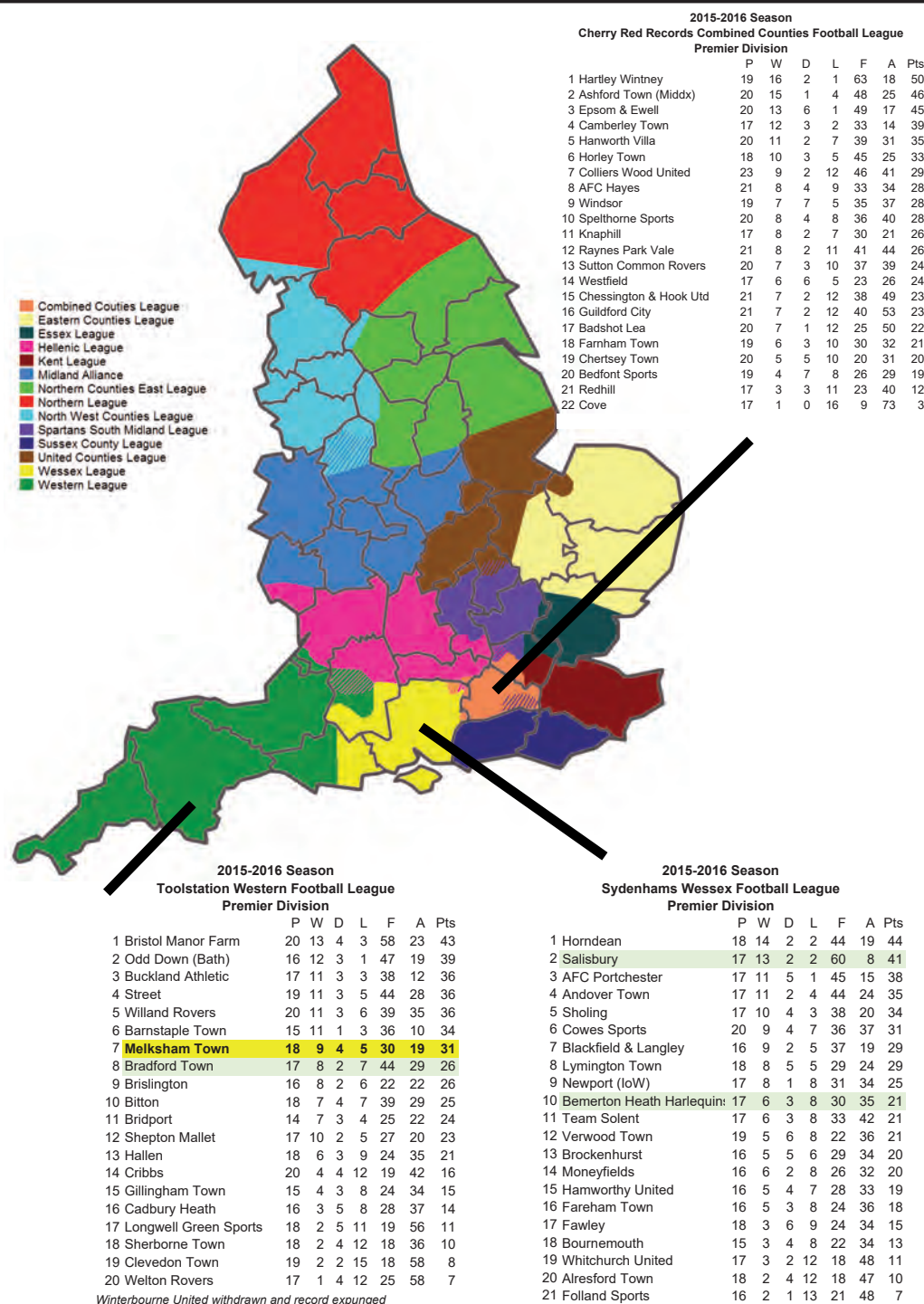
