Editorial & RWBTFC News

Welcome to Thame United

This afternoon our visitors are Thame United for this Buildbase FA Vase 2nd Round Qualifying tie. A warm welcome to all from Thame who have made the journey to Royal Wootton Bassett for the second time this season for this fixture, we hope you enjoy your visit and we wish you a safe journey home.

The two sides met earlier in the season here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground in the league and it was our visitors who won the game comfortably 3-0. Thame are currently one of the early pace setters in the league table currently sitting in 4th place behind Binfield, Thatcham Town and Flackwell Heath. They are the division's top scorers with some 33 goals from their 7 games to date an impressive average of close to 5 goals per game! The line is also led by the division's top scorer in Andrew Gledhill who has hit 19 goals so far this season already and certainly will keep our defence busy here this afternoon.

Introduction to the Buildbase FA Vase

Until 1974, football players in England were either professionals or amateurs. Professionals were paid to play by their clubs, and the only cup competitions such clubs were allowed to enter were the FA Cup and after 1969, for clubs outside The Football League, the FA Trophy. Amateurs, on the other hand, did not get paid (at least not officially) by their clubs, and such clubs had their own cup competition, the FA Amateur Cup. In 1974, with many of the top amateur players receiving payment for playing, The Football Association abolished the distinction, scrapped the Amateur Cup and introduced the FA Vase for the majority of clubs who had previously played in the competition. Well over 200 clubs entered in the first season, 1974-75 and Hoddesdon Town of the Spartan League beat Epsom & Ewell of the Surrey Senior League 2-1 in the final at Wembley Stadium before a crowd of 9,000. The FA Vase as a competition has then gone from strength to strength and become a key part of the season for clubs at our level and the chance to get national recognition..

Can this season be the one that Royal Wootton Bassett Town finally put their rather miserable historical record behind them and embark on an FA Vase run? This year is the sixteenth season in which Bassett have entered the national tournament open to teams at step five of the non-league pyramid and below. And although the club's Vase debut in 2001-02 began with a bang (and a damaged away team dressing room door after Calne Town were defeated 3-2 after extra time in a fiery afternoon at Rylands Way), it's a competition that has rarely been kind to them.

Only once have Bassett advanced more than the one round – that being eight seasons ago when victories against Buckingham Athletic, Henley Town and Kidlington saw Dave Turner's side reach the second round where defeat was inflicted by a strong Wimborne Town outfit. In just four other seasons, including the last two, have Bassett recorded wins in the competition.

There have been defeats in replays – a thriller against Shrewton United and a disappointing narrow loss at Christchurch after a mesmerising opening contest. There have also been gut-wrenching late losses when just one game was needed: extra time disappointments against Windsor and Abingdon United, the home clash with Hamble ASSC in 2009 and the away trip to Cadbury Heath a year later, which saw the Bristolians snatch a late winner. Too frequently though there has been embarrassment. The list of heavy defeats is numerous: Shortwood United (twice), Bemerton Heath Harlequins, Wellington, GE Hamble, Odd Down and - it hurts to bring it up – Bournemouth.

Let's hope that today can be the start of a more positive relationship with the competition. Our visitors Thame can look back fondly on a trip to the semi-finals in 1998-99. While matching that feat, also achieved by near neighbours Highworth Town two seasons ago, is certainly unrealistic, why not aim to advance to the second, third or fourth round? Think how brilliant it will be to draw a side from another part of the country – those kind of away days are what make national competitions special. Make no mistake, it will take a near perfect performance against quality opposition today just to take the first step on that road. But to do well in the Vase, it's necessary to beat the good teams at some point.

Flackwell Heath

Last Saturday saw us put in another hard working performance but again we lost narrowly to one of the division's leading sides, Flackwell Heath winning by a solitary goal. In a game of few chances we did create some good goalscoring opportunities of our own but just could not find that all important equaliser. Another 1-0 defeat to one of the top sides, as with the Binfield game, shows on our day we can compete with the best in this division. And so it proved on Tuesday night.

Thatcham Town

On Tuesday night we made the trip along the M4 to play Thatcham Town. The side accompanied by a healthy travelling support enjoyed their trip to Thatcham. This has been a happy hunting ground for us in the past with a 100% record from our 2 previous visits. Dale Richards has cut something of a frustrated figure in recent weeks. Finding starts hard to come by thanks to the consistent early season performances of namesake Jamie Richards at left back, the youth section product has frequently found himself on the bench, being an unused sub on more than one occasion. However, afforded the opportunity to start in a more advanced role thanks to the absence of both Sam Packer and Steve Robertson, Richards grasped the chance given to him and then some, demonstrating the exceptional talent he possesses in a brilliant 3-1 win. First, his powerful shot got Bassett back on level terms. He then turned provider, teeing up Henry Spalding to put the visitors in front, before finally delivering a wicked cross which was diverted into the net by a Thatcham defender for what proved to be the clinching goal on 65 minutes. His outstanding contribution was the icing on the cake of a superb team performance, which maintains Bassett's record of having won on all three of their visits to Waterside Park. Despite going behind, the team demonstrated resilience, discipline and determination, taking the game to a Thatcham team whose sights this season are set on claiming the top spot they narrowly missed out on last time out. Commanding displays from Nathan Hawkins and George Drewitt at centre half and Matt Cheetham in the heart of midfield helped nullify the danger posed by the likes of Jemel Johnson and Shane Cooper-Clark, particularly during a spell of heavy pressure early in the second period. Meanwhile 'keeper Curtis Meare - facing the team he started the season with - was also on top form, producing a fine save before the break to keep his team in front. That provided the platform for Richards, Spalding, Alone Diouf and the equally vibrant Lewis Thompson to cause all kinds of problems for the Thatcham defence. Well done lads for a tremendous performance.

Floodlit Cup

The Second Round draw has been made for the Floodlit Cup and we have drawn Division One East side Woodley United at home, with the game scheduled for Wednesday 2nd November. The full draw is included in this programme for the first time today.

Reserves

The Reserves have started the season well but on Saturday also went down by a single goal away at Shrewton United. That result left Dave Terry's side in 7th place in the table.

Ladies Team

On Sunday the ladies pushed last season's Gloucestershire League champions AEK Boco all the way in the F.A. Cup, eventually losing 3-1 after extra-time.

Next Here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground

After today our next home First Team game is on Saturday 1st October when Oxford City Nomads are our visitors. Before that on Thursday the Under 18's are home to Fairford Town, 7.30pm the kick-off for this game.

This will be a very tough game again today but let's get behind the lads and see if we can commence a run in this prestigious FA Vase competition. Enjoy the game.

Opponents - History

Thame United • Club History



Thame was formed in 1883 making it one of Oxfordshires' oldest clubs. Its early years were spent in Oxfordshire Leagues and in 1906, 1909 and 1910 Thame won the Oxfordshire Senior Cup and the Senior League in 1907, 1908, 1910, 1930 and 1931. A switch to the Hellenic League then brought further success culminating in the Hellenic League title in 1961-62 and 1969-70, as well as being runners up in 1960-61, 1976-77 and 1980-81.

The Oxfordshire Senior Cup was won in both 1976 and 1981 but a poor spell in the mid eighties preceded a crossing of the pyramid in 1988-89 to join the South Midlands League. The Club finished runners up in both 1988-89 and 1989-90 before eventually winning the title in 1990-91. Thame received the green light to join the Diadora League in 1991/92. 1994-95 saw the Club win the Division 2 Championship with 93 points - an 11 point margin. In 1995/96 the Club reached the 3rd Round Qualifying in the FA Cup and the FA Trophy. In the league we finished a creditable 13th in our first ever season in the Isthmian League Division One. Andy Sinnott was appointed first team manager in June 1997 and, with a dramatically reduced operating budget, the side were relegated to Ryman Division Two. The Club bounced straight back into Ryman Division One and reached the semi-finals of the FA Vase. 1999/2000 saw the Club come within two points of achieving promotion to the Premier Division.

2000/2001 season the team lead the way for most of the season, putting together a club record of 12 consecutive league wins but a slump in form in the latter part of the season resulted in a 5th place. A mid-table finish followed in 2001/2002 season but the Oxfordshire Senior Cup was retained. Mark West was appointed player/manager when Andy left United during the Summer of 2003. In October 2003 the club reached the 4th qualifying round of the FA Cup for the first time in its history, before being beaten 1-2 by Conference side Farnborough Town. After a mid-table finish the Club moved to the newly formed Southern League, Division 1 West. In October 2004 the Club again reached the FA Cup 4th qualifying round and finished the season 11th in the league. Mark West left to join Slough and defender Tony Joyce was appointed player /manager.

By July 2005 the Club were in financial trouble and, following a visit from Bailiffs acting on behalf of HMRC, the landlord enforced a clause in the tenancy agreement and evicted the club from Windmill Road. A ground share agreement was reached with neighbours Aylesbury United and, with the side struggling at the foot of the Southern League Division 1 West, Tony Joyce resigned in December 2005, with a new joint managerial partnership of Richard Searl and Alan Thorne appointed. Relegation to the Hellenic League was confirmed later in the season. A ground share agreement was reached with AFC Wallingford for the 2006/07. Mark West returned to the Club mid-way through the season but could not save the Club from relegation to the Hellenic League Division 1 East. The 2007/08 season provided greater stability for the Club, with Mark West and new assistant, Frank Thompson, looking after first team affairs. A mid-table finish resulted, which was followed by a ninth placed finish in 2008/09. 2009/10 saw the Club win the Division 1 East title by six points and reclaim their place in the Premier Division.

The 2010/11 season was the most significant in the Club's recent history. With work on a new £3.1m ground at Meadow View Park commencing in March 2010, United returned to Thame at the ASM Stadium on 11 December 2010, just over five years after their enforced eviction from the town. Boasting eight pitches, a floodlit 3G training pitch and 8000sqft clubhouse, United now have one of the best sporting facilities in the Hellenic League. The official opening against Oxford United on 18th January 2011 set a record crowd of 1,382. In the last two seasons, under the stewardship of Mark West and Stuart Blaik, United have finished fifth and sixth in the Premier Division

Old Football Revisited

(as first published in Season 2013-14)

Inspired by the fantastic book "Got, Not Got" by Derrick Hammond and Gary Silke this Season's new feature looks at football related matters from the Editor's long lost youth that are no longer with us. Today it is.....

School Football Leagues

In the good old days the School Team used to play regular matches and for the kids of Wootton Bassett Comprehensive that meant the Swindon Schools League. Yes really there did used to be a schools league along the lines of the competitions run by the North Wiltshire Youth League. Teams would play each other home and away and who can forget those visits to the delights of Hreod Burna, Cricklade, Kingsdown, Braden Forest, Cricklade, Headlands, Ferndale, Penhill and Richard Jefferies.

In the 1960's and 1970's the PE teacher, or some enthusiastic Maths or Arts teacher who dreamed of being a PE teacher, would drive the team to away games in the school mini-bus with games often being played midweek after school. Think of Brian Glover in the film Kes and you will get the picture.



For the kids of Wootton Bassett the main man was Mr Tanner ably supported by Mr Short. Looking back these were great times and I never really got the opportunity to thank Mr Tanner for all those extra hours he put in for no additional pay before he sadly past away a few years ago. I know he was not liked by the non-sporting kids at the school but for those who played sport he was a legend and well respected. The only time I ever really had a problem with him was when Andy Ferguson and I played for Wootton Bassett Town in a Mid Wilts League football fixture on a Sunday rather than play in a school volleyball tournament. School games did not take priority on a Sunday but I am pretty sure Fergie and I had a rough time in PE lessons for a few weeks after that given that we had preferred to play for WBTFC.

As I said the Swindon League often meant midweek trips in the school mini-bus into the metropolis of Swindon. Now the school mini-bus had seen better days. In today's health and safety conscious world it would probably not have been permitted for the transport of children. Indeed when I started owning a car I often wondered how the old mini-bus had actually passed its MOT, one of the teachers obviously knew someone at a garage me thinks.

In addition to those league games there would also be friendlies against such exotic sides as Hardenhuish (Chippenham), Devizes and Melksham. These would invariably be played early on a Saturday morning on grounds that were often rock hard due to the overnight frost. Again health and safety did not seem to come into the equation in those days. The games got played, no one got hurt, no one got too upset at losing and it also had the added bonus of improving the kids knowledge of geography in Wiltshire.

The leagues died off when the teachers no longer wanted to work out of hours for no extra pay (hardly blame them really) and when the lefty do-gooders went soft and decided to stop playing competitive sport in case kids got upset at losing (most of the kids supported teams like Swindon Town, or in my case QPR, so losing was something we were already used to so not really sure what they were trying to achieve by this non-competitive thing. The kids who hated PE still hated PE).

Visiting Headlands on a Thursday night when it was starting to get dark and potentially be threatened was all part of growing up for a Bassett kid in them days. You learned to look after yourself and the clever ones amongst also made friends with kids from the other schools just in case you bumped into them at the Brunel Rooms and needed someone to put a good word in for you.

Wootton Bassett Comp rarely won any schools competitions but always put up a good show. My personal memories are of great games against Hreod Burna and in particular a personal duel against Bobby Henshall. Bobby was very fast, whilst I was very slow, but somehow I always seemed to have a good game against him. The game my brother and others remind me of though is a cup game at Kingsdown when I was marking Paul Rideout. I think we came in level at half time and Mr Tanner congratulated me on how I was playing only for Rideout to go and score 5 goals in the second half. That mini-bus journey back to Bassett that night was a long one.



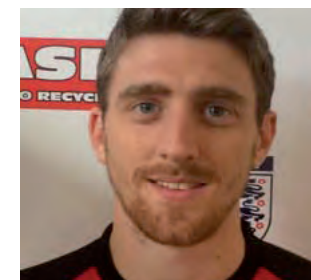

- Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Thame United have met on 9 occasions previously and it is our visitors who have had the better of things with 4 wins to our 1 with 4 draws between the two sides. Earlier this season Thame defeated us here in the league by 3 goals to nil.
- Last season we were beaten 3-1 at Thame, Steve Robertson scoring the consolation goal, but won the return at the New Gerard Buxton ground 2-0 thanks to two rare goals from young defender Dan Comer.
- The first meeting between the two sides was back in 2010-11 with Thame winning by a solitary goal at Rylands Way. The return saw the points shared, Sam Collier and Alex Green scoring in the 2-2 draw. Collier was again on target in the next meeting between the two sides when the score again finished 2-2, Jordan Roberts with the other Bassett goal. Towards the end of the season the two sides drew again at Thame with neither side finding the net. Season 2014-15 saw Thame get the better of things. A convincing 4-1 result in favour of Thame at their ground, Steve Yeardley with our consolation goal, was followed by yet another 2-2 draw, Joe Hiscock and Nathan Gambling on target for Bassett that day.
- Thame started life in the Hellenic League back in 1959-60 and were a very successful side in those early years of being in the league, finishing as runners-up twice and champions twice. The end of the decade saw them win the league again for the second time. Two further runners-up spots saw them then move to the South Midlands League where they continued their winning ways, winning the league and finishing runners-up twice. This led to promotion to the Isthmian League. They were champions of Division two of the League in 1994-95 before falling on hard times. Eventually they were to return to the Hellenic League and were relegated to Division One East in 2006-07. Promoted back to the Premier Division 3 seasons later and since then they have never finished outside the top 10.

Player Profile - Season 2016-17

George Drewitt (Defender)



Double first team Player of the Year award winner in 2014/15, Drewitt is an outstanding reader of the game, comfortable on the ball and strong in the tackle.

Having enjoyed an outstanding first full season with Bassett's first team two seasons ago, he was frustrated by injuries last year and limited to 24 appearances. He did become the first player to be sent off at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground after receiving two yellow cards in the FA Cup tie against Bracknell Town.

Having played for many years with Bassett's Reserves, the centre half grabbed the first team opportunity given to him by manager Paul Braithwaite in 2014/15 with both hands, playing 36 times, scoring once and leading by example as Vice-Captain. His lone goal was an important one too, putting Bassett ahead in a key victory against Newbury, which helped spark Bassett's late season charge.

Drewitt is a home town player, who began with the club's youth section as an Under 8 and captained the Under 18 Floodlit League team in 2008/09.

He made his reserve team debut in 2007/08 before making his first team bow in 2009/10 in a narrow Floodlit Cup loss at Ardley United.

Injuries had limited his chances that year, but he became a regular fixture in the Reserve team in 2010/11, and also made a couple of appearances as a substitute with the first team.

Drewitt was the reserve team's captain and leading appearance maker a season later, and his eight goals helped guide Simon Paish's side to a fourth place finish – the second string's best performance in a number of years. His play was enough to earn recognition from his peers as he was awarded Players' Player of the Year.



Again captain in 2012/13, he helped his side achieve another top five finish. He then enjoyed his most successful season with the second string three seasons ago, scoring four goals as the team finished third in Division Two West and reached the semi-finals of the President's Cup. That year he claimed the Players' Player of the Year award for a second time.

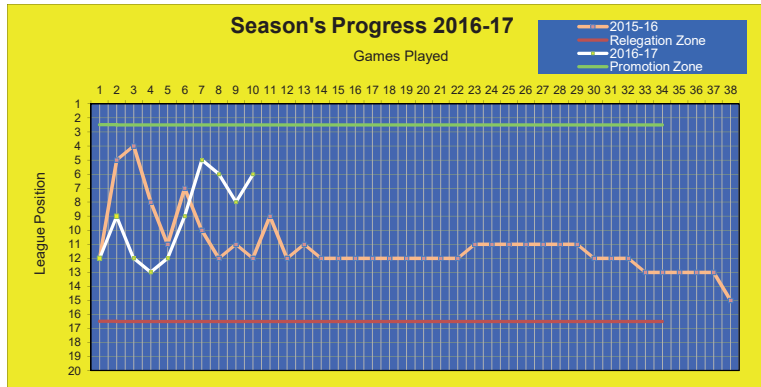

Royal Wootton Bassett Town have been given a home tie against local rivals Purton who currently have former Bassett player Matty Bennett in their side.

This will be his 5th season with Bassett with over 130 appearances having re-joined the Club from Shrivernham. Previously with Calne Town a player who gives 100% every game.



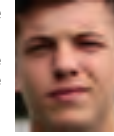
Dale Richards Defence

Hard working and talented midfield player in his third season with the club. Prior to this season had made 87 appearances scoring 10 times.



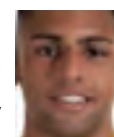
Scott Walduck Midfield

Tyler Sheppard Forward
Another product of Bassett's youth section. Former Swindon Town Centre of Excellence player who then joined Yeovil Town. Previously also with Highworth Town and Calne Town.



Steve Robertson Forward
Free scoring forward who re-joined the Club from Shrivernham in Season 2014-15. Top scorer last season with 30 goals from 38 appearances. Manager of the Swindon Town Ladies side.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35. Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II.



After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed.

The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 only to be immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 and promotion back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and in 1987-88 they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06. Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away.



















With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year groundshare with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year at Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and a record points total. Last season saw the club return home playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, Bassett finished 15th in the Premier Division. With some top summer signings the Club are looking for a much higher finish this season.



The table below shows the addresses of all the grounds we will be visiting this coming **2016-17** Season. This season we have 3 new teams in Burnham, Carterton and Henley. The table below includes the postcode to enter into your Sat Nav. A rough estimate of the distance from Royal Wootton Bassett is also shown. This season we have 74 less miles of travel in total (it could have been 164 more if North Greenford had come into the Hellenic and Cheltenham had not stayed down) but the average journey has increased by just over a mile.

Total away travel = **1,732** miles (2015-16: 1,806 miles)

"It gives us another opportunity to get three points on the board."

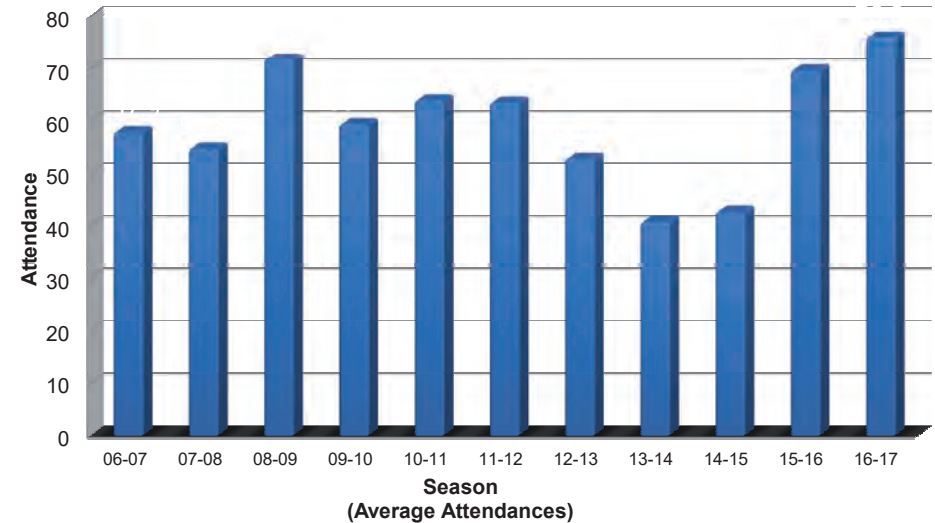
Elsewhere, Wootton Bassett Town Reserves were unable to build on a midweek success against Wilts Calne as they went down 1-0 at Shrewton United.

Shrewton were reduced to nine men with 55 minutes remaining but they clung on to their narrow lead keep up the pressure on Cricklade on top.

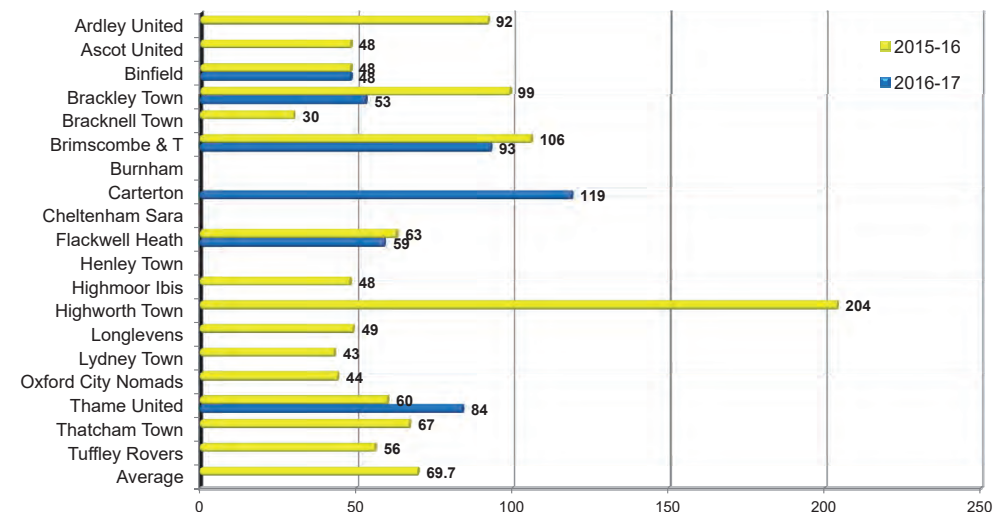
Wroughton moved up to third spot in the league with a comfortable 4-0 away victory at Bromham.

WBTFC Attendances - Season 2016-17 (and comparison to 2015-16)



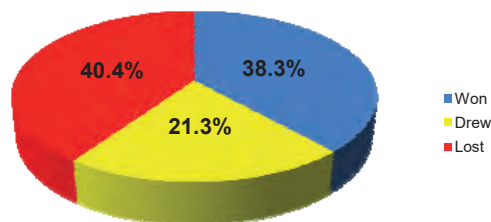

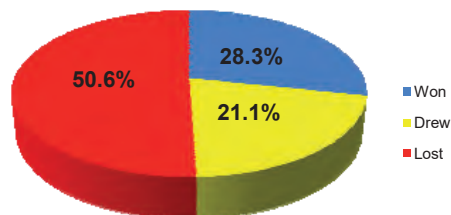

However a late double from Paterson, who completed his hat-trick, put the game comfortably out of reach for the Worthians.

Jamie Pricor was dismissed in the first half for two cautions and manager Michael McNally thought the decision was harsh. "It was two yellow cards in 15 minutes," McNally said. "To be fair the first one is probably a yellow card but the second one it was one of those where the referee couldn't wait to send him off. "I'm afraid with the referees at this level it is what we have to deal with but we have to get on with it."

Despite his frustrations with the officials, McNally was full of praise for his side as they dug deep to secure a goalless draw. "I am overwhelmed with the lads," he said. "They put their bodies on the line, chased lost causes and to be fair we probably deserved three points. "It was good, it was a shame we went down to 10 men, but considering the situation, they weren't a bad side, they had three or four first-teamers playing and it was good point. "Obviously with 11 men on the pitch I would have expected three more points but we'll take a point and I think most teams in that position would."

New College were thumped 8-1 by Cirencester Town Development at the Webbs Wood Stadium. Dan Gudger and Charlie Buse both scored first half hat-tricks to put the game out of reach as New College went in at half time trailing 7-1. A fourth from Gudger shortly after the interval rounded off the scoring on a disappointing day for the hosts. Meanwhile, Purton recorded a second win of the season as they beat Abington United 1-0 at Red House moving them up to seventh place in Division One West.

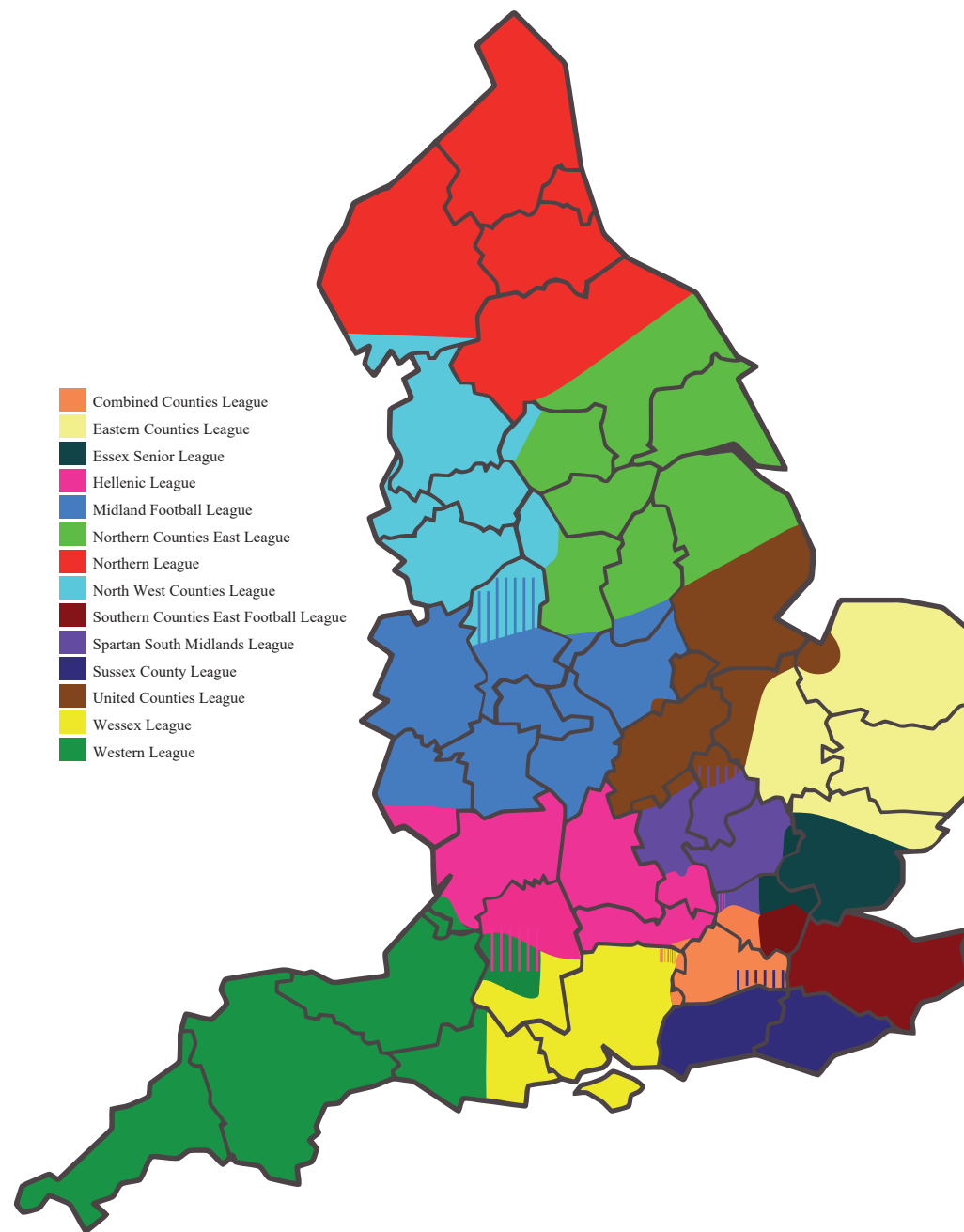

Frustration as Heathens head home victorious

New Gerard Buxton Ground, 17th September 2016

Only once have Royal Wootton Bassett Town defeated Flackwell Heath, so taking anything away from their latest meeting against the Buckinghamshire side was always going to be seen as a bonus. Yet, after a determined display that saw them have the better of proceedings in the second half, Bassett will be left ruing the fact they failed to claim a share of the spoils. Instead the Heathens went home with all three points, Joe Blount's 36th minute poacher's finish determining the outcome of the contest in their favour.

Although arriving in untidy fashion – the midfielder stabbed in from close range after his initial header struck the bar - at the time it was certainly a deserved goal as the opening period belonged to the visitors. However, after coming close to doubling their lead five minutes into the second half, they were forced to play on the back foot for much of the remainder of the afternoon. Yet Bassett lacked the necessary composure and killer instinct when they entered the final third as that crucial final pass was often missing. It was something Flackwell possessed. But they found themselves frustrated by an outstanding performance from home 'keeper Curtis Meare. He found himself called into action in the opening minute as an Adam Morris drive stung his palms.

At the other end, Steve Robertson struck Dan Bailey's cutback just wide with a first time shot from a promising position. Aside from that eleventh minute chance, Bassett spent a significant portion of the first half fending off forays forward from the dangerous visitors. Flackwell should have been in front on twenty minutes when they broke down the right, Blount feeding Morris who delivered a low fizzing pass into the box which James Essex sought to steer in from six yards out. However, Meare was somehow able to parry away at point blank range.

On the half hour mark he was alert to awkwardly tip over as a Blount cross from the right wing drifted towards goal. He then flew low to his left to guide a rasping long range drive from Dan Rapley around the post. A minute later though he was finally beaten. Andrew Dean's long throw was flicked on by Rapley at the near post and Blount rose to head it towards goal from close range. While that found the bar, Blount was on hand to bundle in the rebound. Scrappy as it was, they all count, and that sloppily defended throw in ultimately proved costly for Bassett.

It could have been worse too had both Essex and Ben Sturgess have done better early after the restart. The former was again denied by Meare, who saved at the forward's feet, before the latter dragged wide from directly in front of goal. Bassett took that let off as an opportunity to assert themselves more and more. And the introduction of Lewis Thompson, playing on the wing opposite Henry Spalding gave the Flackwell defence something extra to think about.

On the hour Spalding crossed from deep on the left to Thompson, who had made a bursting run into the box. Running at full tilt, the former Cheltenham Town trainee directed a header towards the top left corner but missed the target by a matter of inches.

Minutes later Spalding came close. Sam Packer found space on the right and his cut back fell to an unmarked Spalding at the left post. From an angle, the midfielder shot low towards goal only to see his powerful effort blocked by sprawling centre half James Tripp.

The greater use of their two wide men continued to serve Bassett well as another fine Spalding delivery picked out Steve Robertson. The forward's first touch took him away from his marker, but the ball squirmed away from him, allowing 'keeper Dan Weait to rush off his line and smother.

A mix up between Weait and right back Liam Tack then allowed Spalding to attempt a lob towards and open goal from the left wing. That it just lacked in accuracy, winding up wide of the right post, summed up the frustrating nature of Bassett's afternoon though.

A point was there to be taken, but narrowly missed out on.

Non-League Paper's reporter Steven Coney on the FA Vase

THE road to Wembley is a long one but clubs from Steps 5 to 7 can start dreaming of walking out under the famous arch following the FA Vase's return on Saturday. For most clubs at those levels, the Vase is a huge part of their campaign - a chance to earn some invaluable national attention. A mammoth 592 clubs enter with sides going in at the first round qualifying knowing nine wins stood between them and a stroll down Wembley Way. Of course, nine games doesn't sound like much in the grand scheme of things but in the FA Vase, it's a huge task.

My colleague Matt Badcock wrote a column in Sunday's Non-League Paper about his affinity with the competition. In 1991, as a six-year-old, Matt was taken to the old Wembley for his first taste of football on the grand stage with Guiseley and Gresley Rovers putting on a 4-4 classic - not a bad introduction! I have been fortunate enough to cover four of the past five Vase finals for The Non-League Paper and gladly tell anybody that will listen that the Vase is my favourite FA competition.

The FA Trophy is Non-League's premier cup competition and, after taking quite a battering from disillusioned managers a few years ago, has somewhat recovered. It still seems like a distraction for many National League clubs however, something you could never accuse the Vase of being.

There are always a few jokes flying around the office on FA Vase day - mainly because we know we've got some hard work coming up! Getting 194 results from the first round qualifying last weekend was no easy task and some of the crazy happenings in the Vase don't exactly help. Big scorelines that wouldn't look out of place in our sister publication The Cricket Paper, extra time and penalties, red cards and abandonments - it's never a quiet Saturday when the Vase rolls into town! Bromsgrove Sporting grabbed the headlines from this season's first round as they trounced poor Ellistown & Ibstock United 13-0. Just two years ago, Ellistown were celebrating after knocking Hereford United - by then a complete shadow of the historic club they once were - out of the FA Cup. The Leicestershire-based club have lost all eight of their East Midlands Counties League games so far this campaign while Hereford are storming back up the Non-League Pyramid. How times change. Sporting, formed as Bromsgrove Rovers crumbled, will be hoping for a long run in the Vase this season, much like league rivals AFC Hinckley who have also had to battle back from financial ruin.

One of the best things about the Vase, from a reporter's point of view anyway, is some of the fantastic stories you encounter. Already this season we've seen FC Deportivo Galicia enter the competition for the first time, although their debut was ruined by Irchester United. Penistone Church picked up their first ever Vase win, overcoming Winterton Rangers, while Sam Allardyce's former apprentice Brian Hart led his Daisy Hill side to victory against Garforth Town.

Winning clubs picked up just £600 and while the prize money, in my opinion at least, should be greatly increased, you know the modest amounts will still go a long way for clubs at Steps 5, 6 and 7.

So whether it's a mountain of goals you seek, unpredictability is your thing or just watching 22 men battle it out to keep their Wembley dreams alive sounds good - the Vase has something for everyone!
