Editorial & RWBTFC News

Welcome to Binfield

This afternoon our visitors are Binfield for this third home UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture of Season 2016-17. A warm welcome to all from Binfield, including manager Roger Herridge and his players, who have made the journey to Royal Wootton Bassett for this league fixture, we hope you enjoy your visit and we wish you a safe journey home. This fixture was inserted after both sides crashed out of the FA Cup. Whilst we were losing 5-2 at Andover, Binfield were going down 1-0 at home against North Greenford United, a side who for a short time were scheduled to be part of the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division this season.

Like our opponents on Wednesday, Binfield have made a great start to the new league season with a 100% record from their 3 fixtures to date. They opened the season with a 2-1 win at Henley Town thanks to goals from the prolific Liam Ferdinand and Michael Walton. This was followed up by a 4-1 home win over Lydney Town with Liam Ferdinand and Tom Williams both bagging a brace. Another 4 goals on Monday night when they defeated Burnham 4-0. Liam Ferdinand was once again amongst the goals with another brace, with Ross Seldon and Jean-Claude Etienne netting in this latest win. They did the double over us in the league last season but we did defeat them in the FA Vase after a replay.

Thame

Wednesday night was a tough day at the office for Royal Wootton Bassett Town when, despite a spirited performance we went down by 3 goals to nil against league leaders Thame United. Despite the defeat I understand that there were some encouraging performances on the night. The result came on the back of a number of alleged departures from the club from the group of players who had joined from Highworth Town in the summer. At the time of writing these notes it appears that TJ Bohane, Aaron Maximen, Bradley Clark and Jonny Aitkenhead have joined Gary Eggleton in leaving the club. If Jonny has left I will be personally disappointed given he played for me as a youngster for many years and is a Bassett lad. Hopefully this proves to be a false rumour but certainly if these players have left attacking options will have been diluted. That said the players that remain are more than good enough to do a job for us in this division. This will give chances to the likes of Liam Edmondson, George Drewitt and Nathan Hawkins to hold down a First Team place. Presumably some of the alleged departing players will be making their way back to Highworth and I hope the club applies the 7 day notice of approach rules as they are intended as they are there to protect clubs from these sorts of situation.

Reserves

The Reserves kick-off their season on Saturday with a trip to Corsham Town Reserves. They had been scheduled to be at home against Melksham Town Res but with the UHlsport Hellenic League inserting a late league game against Binfield, with both sides out of the FA Cup, the Reserves game had to be re-scheduled. This will be followed by a short trip to Cricklade Town the following Tuesday as Bassett Reserves visit the re-born former Hellenic side.

Ladies FA Cup Draw

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies have been handed an away tie against former league rivals AEK Boco in the FA Women's Cup second qualifying round. The tie will take place on Sunday 18th September. The Bristol-based side finished as champions of the Gloucestershire County Women's League Division One in 2015-16, earning them promotion to the South West Women's Football League Eastern Division.

All three meetings between the sides last season saw AEK Boco emerge victorious. A League Cup second round meeting in October saw them triumph 4-1, while they prevailed by the odd goal in three in the league meeting at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground before winning 4-0 at home. Boco also enjoyed a run to the fourth qualifying round of the Women's Cup, defeating higher level opposition in the form of Frome Town and Shanklin before falling to Chichester City. This year though they will be the hunted, with Bassett hoping to cause an upset as they enter the national competition for the fifth consecutive season. Their lone win so far in the

Women's Cup came in the 2013-14 preliminary round when Sam Wood scored the only goal of the game against Cheltenham Civil Service.

Last season Bassett fell to a 5-1 home loss against South West Women's Football League Premier Division outfit Downend Flyers in the first qualifying round.

RWBTFC receive Community First funding

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club are pleased to announce they have received funding of £1,400 from The Hills Group Limited, which will be put towards the purchase of equipment for the club. The money has been made available through the Landfill Communities Fund (LCF) which is administered for Hills by Community First, the Rural Community Council for Wiltshire. Upon receiving news that the club will receive funding, Chairman Andy Walduck commented: "This funding allows the club to complete the purchase of urgently required football goals which will boost sport within the community of Royal Wootton Bassett."

The Hills Group Limited is a privately owned family company which was founded in 1900. It is a regional business based in Swindon, but with operations in the surrounding counties. Its principal activities are recycling and waste management, quarrying of aggregates and production of ready-mixed concrete, and building new homes. Community First is a registered charity and a private company limited by guarantee. With the aim of strengthening communities, growing communities and tackling disadvantage across Wiltshire and Swindon, its team of professional staff provides technical advice, practical support and grant aid to promote local initiatives. Community First also manages countywide programmes bringing benefits to local people, informing and influencing policy makers in the development of rural policies and practices. The Landfill Communities Fund (LCF) is an innovative tax credit scheme enabling operators of landfill sites to contribute money to organisations enrolled with ENTRUST as Environmental Bodies (EBs). The Government introduced tax on landfill waste in 1996 to reduce the amount of land-filled waste and to promote more environmentally sustainable methods of waste management. The LCF allows Landfill Operators (LOs) to contribute a portion of their landfill tax liability to community and environmental organisations to 'offset' some of the negative impacts of living in the vicinity of a landfill site.

Fixtures

The league has now published the fixtures until the end of November and these can be seen in the centre pages, along with our Boxing Day fixture against Highworth Town. By the time of reading these notes more fixtures may have been scheduled and these will be included in the next home programme.

Next Here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground

After this afternoon's game we make the midweek trip to Reading to play one of our bogey sides, Highmoor Ibis, before returning here to the New Gerard Buxton Ground next Saturday where we will entertain Brackley Town Saints. Highmoor Ibis are another side who have made a good start to the season and are currently in 3rd place in the table, it certainly doesn't get any easier. On Bank Holiday Monday we make the trip to Highworth for the big local derby game. Interesting to see that Highworth have lost all three of their opening games and there will be more than just local pride at stake on Bank Holiday Monday.

This will be another very tough game this afternoon but let's get behind the lads and see if we can get back to winning ways. I will be at QPR this afternoon so will miss the game but look forward to catching up with everyone at the Brackley and Highworth Town games.

Opponents - History

Binfield • Club History

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.



During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt – a feat we repeated in 1996 – and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the membership, with over 20 teams playing every weekend – this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013. We're also in our fourth season of a partnership scheme with Reading FC where some of our younger players have the opportunity to train with Reading. In 2003 we added an Allied Counties Youth team which is now providing a steady stream of talented young players ready for Senior football for the Reserves and 1st Team.

Our reserves side are a vital and successful part of our club, providing progression from our youth team into senior football and regularly providing players for the 1st team squad, whilst also being successful in winning UHlsport Hellenic Division 2 East in 2012 and again in 2014. Moving to the Suburban League for a new challenge last season, our reserves excelled, winning the league on the final day and later bringing the Ascot Fielden Cup back to Binfield FC for the first time since the 1970s, which the club first won in 1924! In 2015/16 the side consolidated in the Suburban Premier Division and retained the Fielden Cup. Our reserves also provide the bridge from youth into senior football with our Allied Counties players a regular feature of reserves teams and many of our regular reserves stepping up into the 1st team when called upon.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team and Veterans. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup – and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

Ultimately the step up to the next tier of English non league football is our aim..

(19) Joined the Moles at the tail end of last season and scored 4 goals from 10 appearances. Got better and better as match fitness returned and an exciting prospect for this season.



Matthew Jones Forward
(27) - A proven goalscorer at both Wokingham and Ascot, joins the Moles front line to add firepower. Was capped for England Schoolboys and a talented cricketer too.



Luke Scope Forward
(31) Strong, physical striker who's been a regular scorer for Wokingham against the Moles. Joined for the start of this season, a proven finisher who works the opposition defence hard.



Jake White Forward
(23) Made his name previously at Bracknell Town where he played in most positions on the park. His pace is a real asset especially when playing out wide either at full back or in midfield.



Tom Williams Forward
(27) An attacking winger who's equally at home out wide or centrally and has the ability to beat a player on either side. A youth player at Wokingham & Emmbrook, has also played at Reading Town.

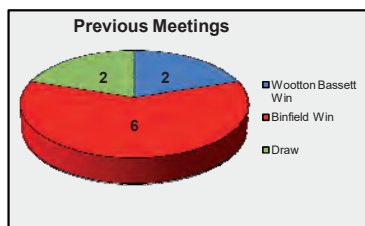
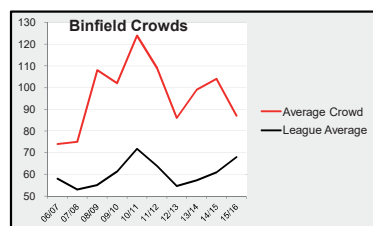

Old Football Revisited

(as first published in Season 2013-14)

Inspired by the fantastic book "Got, Not Got" by Derrick Hammond and Gary Silke this Season's new feature looks at football related matters from the Editor's long lost youth that are no longer with us. Today it is.....

A&BC Cards



Long before the advent of the Panini sticker album and even before the FKS Sticker albums of the 1970's there were A&BC football cards produced by A&BC Chewing Gum of Romford Essex.

In the aftermath of World War II four young men, recently demobbed from their war service, Mr Simon Anysz, Mr Rudy Braun, Mr Douglas Coakley and Mr Tony Coakley decided to form a company with the aim of producing and selling chewing gum. The partners decided on the name A&BC Chewing Gum Ltd from the initials of their surnames.

Due to rationing after the war sugar was not available without a licence, so A&BC produced one of the first ever-sugarless chewing gums using an artificial sweetener. They worked in this way so that the product did not require sweet rationing coupons and the business grew rapidly. Who can forget the great smell of that gum.

The concept of producing football cards at A&BC came from Douglas Coakley. The first set of football only cards was issued in 1958 with a set of 92 cards, and thus began a run of 16 unbroken years of football card production. During this 16 year period A&BC produced both English and Scottish player sets.

A footballer set was produced every year in their thousands and therefore became the mainstay of A&BC. In order to produce the cards Douglas Coakley appointed a sports agent who went around to training grounds locating and signing up the individual players on contracts. The agent also wrote the text for each card. The text on the back of each card was almost as important as the picture on the front as the kids in the 1960's and 1970's could not rely on the internet to get information on their footballing heroes. In addition to player cards themselves the checklists included within the set also became important to the avid collector.



In later years A&BC introduced the concept of 'series' within a set. Series 1 would be produced to coincide with the start of a football season for distribution around August each year. A second series would be introduced some months later and, if required, a third series would also be produced. This enabled the customers of A,B&C to sell to young boys throughout the football season. A very clever piece of marketing from the company. In the 1960s each footballer was paid a set fee of £10 for the rights to use their image on an A&BC card. This was irrespective of their 'fame'. George Best was the first player to use an agent who refused the £10 fee and instead in 1969 asked for £1,000. A&BC refused. George Best appears in the 1966/67, 1967/68 and 1968/69 sets,

but not any A&BC sets after that date.

In the early 1960's Rudy Braun was bought out by the US company Topps, after a successful joint venture between the two companies to produce cards of the Beatles. The two companies then worked together on various sets of cards on both sides of the Atlantic. However, after many years there was a falling out between A&BC and Topps, and litigation followed. While A&BC were preparing for the court case there was a large fire at their factory. The Coakley brothers lost the court case in June 1974 and, as per their licence agreement, the business was wound up. Topps Chewing Gum took over where A&BC Chewing Gum ended. They produced their first set of football cards under the Topps Bazooka Limited name in 1975. They continued each year until 1981. In 1995 Topps acquired Merlin, and became major producers of football cards again in the late 1990s. Both the A&BC and Topps produced cards can these days be found on e-bay with the prices varying depending on the set. Unchecked checklists are particularly sought after cards. A full set of cards can be worth hundreds of pounds. If only we hadn't moved house so often.....

Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Binfield have met on 10 occasions previously and it is our visitors who have had the better of things with 6 wins to our 2 with 3 draws between the two sides.

Last season Binfield did the double over us in the league. We were beaten 2-0 at Binfield and then lost 2-5 in the return at the New Gerard Buxton Ground, our consolation goals coming from Steve Yeardley and Dan Bailey. We did play twice more last season in the FA Vase. A 1-1 draw at the New Gerard Buxton Ground thanks to a late Steve Robertson goal was followed by a fantastic 4-3 away win. A match report from that game is included on the next page.

The first meeting between the two sides was back in 2010-11 with Binfield again doing the double over us, winning 3-1 at Rylands Way and thrashing us 7-1 at Binfield, one of a number of heavy defeats we have suffered against Binfield. Alex Green scored both consolation goals in the games that season.

Our first win came in Season 2013-14 when Sam Collier netted in a 1-0 win at Rylands Way. We had lost by the same score earlier in the season at Binfield. The opening day of the 2014-15 Season saw us lose heavily at Binfield on a warm summers day, Nathan Gambling netting a solitary Bassett goal in a 6-1 drubbing. We improved over the season and took a point from a 1-1 draw in the return at Cirencester, Steve Robertson with the goal.

Liam Edmondson (defender)



Commanding in the air and an excellent man marker, Edmondson re-joins Bassett this season after spending the past three seasons with Shrivenham and Highworth Town.

He originally played for Bassett between 2008 and 2013, and established himself as an important part of the defence under Dave Turner. During that five-year period, the defender made just under 200 appearances, scoring eleven goals, while he collected both the Managers' Player and Players' Player of the Year awards in the 2010/11 campaign.

Edmondson was a captain for the Forest Green Rovers youth side before breaking into senior football with Pewsey Vale during the 2007/08 season when he appeared 22 times. He then made the switch to Bassett with then-manager Dave Turner. Following a brief period on the fringes of the team at the beginning of the 2008/09 season, he never looked back. During his first season with the club Edmondson spent most of his time as a full back and made 38 appearances, 11 of those coming from the bench. During the 2009/10 promotion

winning campaign he featured 35 times, scoring his first goal for the club in a 3-2 home victory against Easington Sports in November 2009. Making the centre back position his own in 2010/11, he recorded 48 appearances. While he would only score a single goal, it was an important one as it paved the way for the 2-0 home win against Highworth Town.

In 2011/12 he appeared 31 times, netting three goals, including a 90th minute equaliser in a wild Challenge Cup fixture against Carterton that Bassett wound up winning 4-3. A season later Edmondson was Bassett's leading appearance maker and also finished as fifth top scorer, netting six times in 39 games. His performances were again of a high calibre, most notably leading the defensive line astutely in a nail-biting 1-0 FA Cup win against Hamworthy United. He finished the season strongly as well, scoring four of his goals in the last ten games of the season, including a vital brace in a 4-2 home victory against New College.

While Turner moved to Shrivenham ahead of the 2013/14 season, Edmondson initially stayed with Bassett under Jeff Roberts. However, he only made two appearances before reacquainting himself with his long term manager. In all he scored three goals in 45 appearances for Shrivenham that season before scoring once in 25 games a year later. Part way through that campaign he departed for Highworth with whom he scored three goals in 22 games. Last year he featured 25 times for the Worthians, scoring once.

Commanding in the air and an excellent man marker, Edmondson makes his return to Bassett after spending the past three seasons with Shrivenham and Highworth Town. He previously enjoyed a five-year spell with the club, in which he appeared 193 times, scored 11 goals and collected both the Manager's and Players' Player of the Year awards for the 2010/11 campaign. Edmondson started his career in senior football with Pewsey Vale in 2007 and made the switch to Rylands Way along with manager Dave Turner a year later.

A Right Royal Occasion

Stubbs Lane, 9th September 2015

Binfield 3, Royal Wootton Bassett Town 4

A superb performance from Royal Wootton Bassett Town on Monday night secured Bassett a trip to Windsor in the next round of the F.A. Vase following a thrilling 4-3 victory away at Binfield.

Given the circumstances of having to travel to Binfield on a Monday night minus their four most experienced players in Steve Yeardeley, Adam Corcoran, Richie Carter and top scorer Steve Robertson, few would have predicted what happened on Monday night. With six players starting the game under the age of 19 and with 17 year old Hugo Vivash on the bench it was a very inexperienced side that Bassett fielded at Stubbs Lane. The one thing with youth is that they show no fear and this performance demonstrated that admirably.

Royal Wootton Bassett went close to taking the lead on 5 minutes when an audacious shot from Dan Bailey from his own half nearly caught out Binfield keeper Nathan Silver. Having been done on Saturday with a shot over his head Silver only just managed to do enough to keep out Bailey's cheeky effort.

Binfield's first effort on goal came on 9 minutes from Liam Ferdinand but his shot was easily saved by Curtis Meare in the Bassett goal. Bassett immediately counter attacked and great set up play between Dan Bailey and Steve Olphert put Kalum Youngsam through but his effort was well saved by Silver. The best chance of the night so far fell to Binfield on 20 minutes when, after good set-up play, James Knight missed a sitter. The game continued to be very open and played at pace, with Binfield hurrying every throw-in and free kick. On 30 minutes a shot from Matt Cheetham was well held by Silver. Binfield themselves had another glorious chance to take the lead on 36 minutes when a ball to the far post found Liam Ferdinand in acres of space but his header was poor and did not trouble Curtis Meare in the Bassett goal. The deadlock was finally broken on 37 minutes when Harvey Scholes became the second player in a couple of days to beat Silver from distance with a cracking 30 yard shot screaming over the keepers head and into the back of the Binfield net. So, whilst Binfield had more the possession in the first period it was Bassett that went into the half time break with the slender lead.

Three minutes after the break things were to get even better for Bassett when a great solo run from young Harvey Scholes beat 5 players and ended with a cool finish with a shot into the bottom right hand corner of the Binfield net, 2-0 Bassett and a very shocked home side. On a night of great goals Jemel Johnson brought Binfield back into the game with another quality goal. Coming in from wide on the left, he played a one-two with Liam Ferdinand before hitting a brilliant dipping volley from 25 yards in off the far post. The game continued to ebb and flow and Binfield introduced substitute Brad Brown who was then booked after a very silly two footed lunge within minutes of coming on. On other days this would have resulted in a straight red and both Brown and Binfield benefitted from the referee's leniency when moments later he curled a ball into the Bassett net from the edge of the box to bring Binfield level with half an hour left to play.

At that moment all present probably expected the young Bassett side to capitulate but they continued to work hard defensively and keep the home side from getting their noses in front. Brown again tested Curtis Meare and only the keeper's finger tips with the help of the post kept the score level. Whilst soaking up the pressure Bassett were always a threat on the break and when Dan Bailey rose highest on 82 minutes to meet a left wing cross from man of the match Scholes, his downward header gave Silver no chance and Bassett were back in front again. Having got back in front surely Bassett would not throw away the lead again? However, a controversial corner award six minutes from time allowed Binfield to continue to exert pressure. With Bassett still smarting from the corner award Lewis Leonetti connected with the corner, but this was cleared off the line but Liam Ferdinand was there to force the ball home. 3-3 and still five minutes to play in this pulsating game. Just when it looked like extra time would again be needed Bassett broke up a Binfield attack and won a corner of their own. From the corner centre-back Nathan Hawkins rose highest to head powerfully into the Binfield net for the 7th goal of the night. The closing moments were tense but the youngsters held out against the more experienced Binfield side and secure that precious win and prize money. So it is the Royal town of Wootton Bassett who will make that trip to Windsor. Both sides were applauded off the pitch at the end. It had been a cracking game witnessed by the Chairman of the Hellenic League who commented that the game had been a credit to the UHIsport Hellenic League.

Man-of-the Match: - **Harvey Scholes** On the night when there were 14 heroes in blue shirts it was two goal Harvey who shone the brightest.



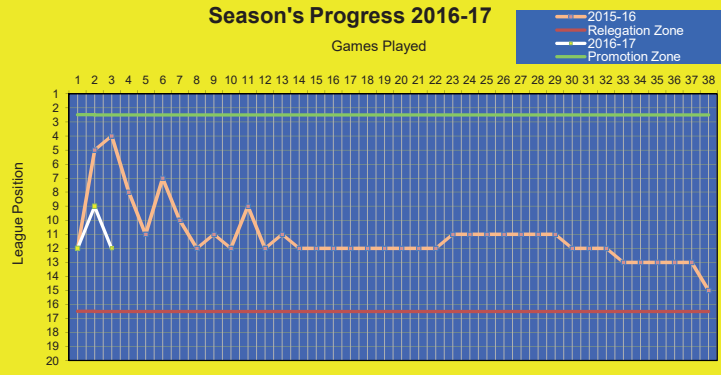

Sam Packer Midfield

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35. Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II.



After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed.

The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 only to be immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 and promotion back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and in 1987-88 they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06. Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away.



















With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year groundshare with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year at Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and a record points total. Last season saw the club return home playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, Bassett finished 15th in the Premier Division. With some top summer signings the Club are looking for a much higher finish this season.



The table below shows the addresses of all the grounds we will be visiting this coming **2016-17** Season. This season we have 3 new teams in Burnham, Carterton and Henley. The table below includes the postcode to enter into your Sat Nav. A rough estimate of the distance from Royal Wootton Bassett is also shown. This season we have 74 less miles of travel in total (it could have been 164 more if North Greenford had come into the Hellenic and Cheltenham had not stayed down) but the average journey has increased by just over a mile.

Total away travel = **1,732** miles (2015-16: 1,806 miles)

Average away game travel (return journey) = **96.2** miles (2015-16: 95.1 miles)

Cool Heads Prevail

The Triangle Ground, 13th August 2016

It wasn't so much superior quality that helped Royal Wootton Bassett Town open their league account for the 2016-17 campaign. Rather their ability to keep their heads, while opponents Henley Town self-destructed, having three men sent off, was vital to securing three points that will hopefully kick-start a season that had got off to a stuttering start.

At half time the scores were deadlocked, there being little to separate the teams.

Bassett came close twice in the early exchanges, TJ Bohane missing a header from an Alioune Diouf cross and Sam Packer hitting over from a Bohane cut back. Henley had a pair of decent opportunities too, but Ben Blackwell struck over from close range and Grant Kemp saw a firm effort palmed away by emergency 'keeper Steve Yeardley.

On balance though it had been an extremely scrappy opening stanza, made the more frustrating for the spectator by the number of fouls and whistle happy nature of the man in the middle.

Soon after the restart though, the hosts - promoted as the third place side in Division One East - gifted their visitors a numerical advantage that quickly spiralled.

Jordan Goddard was first dismissed for raising his arms before Blackwell received his marching orders, earning a second yellow for a rash challenge on Packer.

Only when two men better off did Bassett break the deadlock, Steve Robertson delivering the opener as he converted a Bohane cross.

Brad Hoy then got a straight red for handling on the line, and Bohane, who has created a handful of goals this season, bagged his first of the season from the spot.

Henley were now rowing against a swelling tide with just eight men on board. Despite having a trio of players sent for early showers though, the hosts managed to get on the scoresheet when Jack Thomson took advantage of some slack defending and halved the deficit.

But Packer made certain of the points for Paul Braithwaite's team, following up on great work from Bohane to add Bassett's third, the move having been initiated by Jonny Aitkenhead's fine interception and pass.

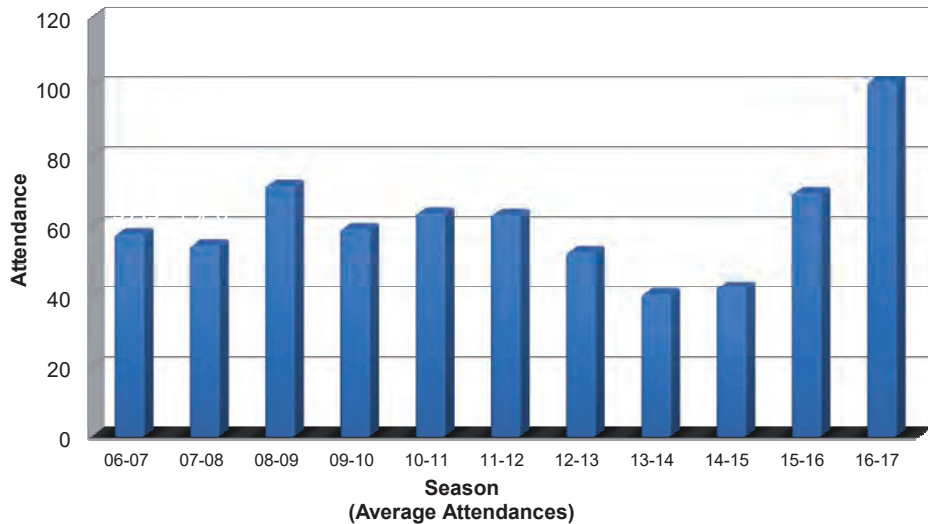

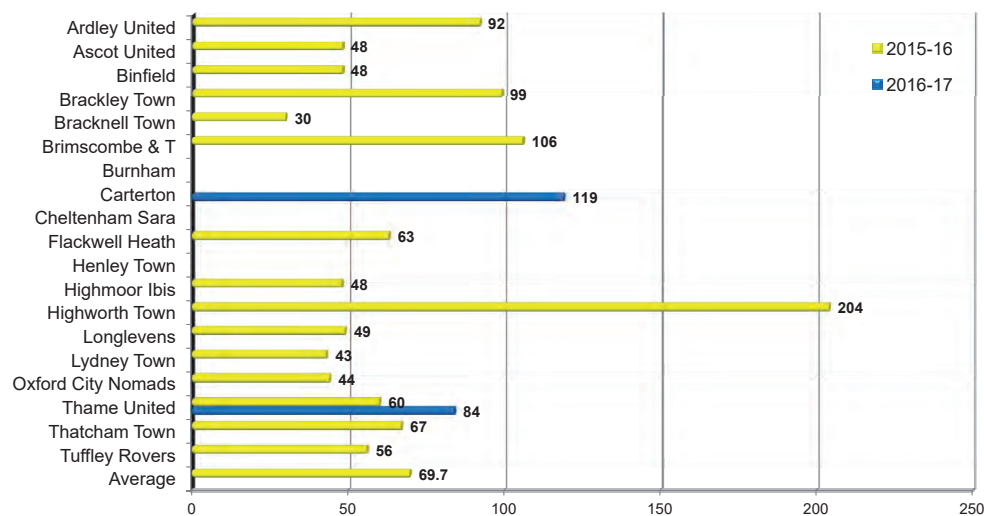

Spirited second half showing not enough

After a first half which saw them battle with their backs against the walls, Royal Wootton Bassett Town fought back in spirited style after the restart against Thame United. The pressure Paul Braithwaite's side came under during the opening period would have been enough to make lesser teams buckle early on. Yet, inevitable though a Thame goal was, to Bassett's credit they only trailed 1-0 at the moment the half time whistle arrived.

That goal came after 'keeper Tyron Connolly narrowly misjudged a cross, allowing for Ken Feyi to head in.

The home side were then much improved after the break, turning the game into a more even contest. Nevertheless, good chances didn't arise often for Bassett, their best opportunities coming from Dale Richards' and Dan Bailey's long range efforts.

Thame eventually extended their lead with eleven minutes remaining, Lynton Goss netting. And with a couple of minutes to go Dan West made it three, scoring his team's fifteenth league goal of this embryonic campaign.

GIVE us your predictions, they said. What could go wrong, they said. A fair bit, actually. I've had managers with the hump that I didn't tip his team for promotion, and a day later one dodge my calls because I did – apparently heightening the pressure on him by doing so! Prophecy is not always welcome in football. Ask Ian Holloway, or as he's now referred to as a "Failed player, failed manager and now a f*****d pundit". Not by a fan who has lost his head on twitter, but Aston Villa owner Dr Tony Xia. Holloway dared to suggest they may not finish in the top half of the table, you see. Maybe Ollie had a little smirk after Villa sunk at Sheffield Wednesday on Sunday. It's not easy sticking your neck out. But here are my thoughts with all the league up and running as of this weekend.

National League:

Perhaps the most telling signing arrived the week before the season. Defender Ryan Cresswell is on big money at Eastleigh but he and striker Mikael Mandron are top players. The title could be between the Spitfires, Tranmere – they've had a productive summer – and, if they start well, Lincoln City under the brothers Cowley. Cheltenham came up and went down last year, Bristol Rovers the season before but I don't expect a repeat. York City don't have a manager with any Non-League experience, and the signing of Richard Brodie is a headscratcher. Dagenham & Redbridge have the best boss around but finances are tight. Keep an eye on Gateshead, I like the look of Wrexham under Gary Mills – the play-offs for them this time – and on paper, Aldershot have a team with half a chance. Boreham Wood will push on.

National League North:

Potentially the best league around. Where to start? If the club isn't a big one, it's an historic one. If it isn't either of those it's probably a club like AFC Fylde with a benefactor and a new stadium. The best summer signing is FC Halifax's Billy Heath. Although Jim Harvey's departure lacked class, at least they've replaced him with a winner. After taking North Ferraby up last year, I expect him to do the same. Stockport County under Jim Gannon will be stronger, and the teams coming up – Darlington and Salford City will be predicted to challenge. I don't think either will have the know-how to be in contention for the title. Altrincham know the league, but it'll be play-offs at best for Neil Young's side. Kidderminster Harriers begun brilliantly but they need a good first season under John Eustace and I expect a top five push. Chorley are my surprise tip to shine – Jason Walker is a great addition.

National League South:

Just when we were thinking this is not the money league it once was, Chelmsford City go and secure huge new investment. They may well have a go. Ask Ebbsfleet fans if a wide wallet guarantees success. It certainly doesn't, but past experience shouldn't stop Daryl McMahon getting the job done this season - providing the loss of striker Matty Godden doesn't show. Hampton & Richmond with an eye-catching 4-2-1-2-1 formation love the get the ball down and play - the play-offs aren't out of the question. Maidenhead under Alan Devonshire are another to keep an eye on, there's been huge turn over at Whitehawk and you get the feeling the foreign invasion on the south coast is either going to work brilliantly and they will be title contenders or they'll belly flop.

Ryman League:

Welcome to Lee Bradbury's biggest season in football. Lucky to keep his job after Havant & Waterlooville were relegated with a huge budget, he knows the talking must stop for the big spending Hawks. In Wes Fogden they have re-added class, and in Bognor's front two Alfie Rutherford and Jason Prior 60 goals. Dulwich need to get up this year, striker Gavin Tomlin is a great bit of business. Staines Town under Johnson Hippolyte should be up there. The Swans lost top scorer Pat Cox to Merstham, who could make the play-offs - as should Lowestoft. Worthing and Harlow will make use of their 3G pitch and won't struggle. In the North there's no stand-out team so AFC Hornchurch and Thurrock will fancy the title. The South seems stronger. Hythe Town are a good tip but Lewes under the excellent Darren Freeman should do well. Guernsey will be better this year too.

Evo-Stik NPL

The division seems to be more balance now Salford's spending power and Darlington's upward movement are gone. That should play into Blyth Spartans' hands with Tom Wade's fruitful summer. Beware the teams coming up, last year told us that. Stafford Rangers could be up there, adding George Bowerman is good business, Warrington certainly won't be worried about the step up. Ashton United are play-off regulars but never seem to get over the line, they should be around the top five again. Stourbridge look a force and Workington could have a real go. Northwich Victoria finished third in the North last year but now they've moved to the South they will be either be an unknown force or they won't know the opposition. Shaw Lane will have a say, but AFC Rushden probably would rather be down south. In the North, Hyde if they can stop their three-year rut should make the play-offs on their new 3G pitch. Glossop and Burscough may be in contention with the league's top three clubs from last year all gone.

Evo-Stik Southern

A lot of eyes are on Terry Brown at Basingstoke after his shock appointment but this is a long-term project, so don't expect a sustained challenge from the Dragons. That may come from Leamington - who went so close to an instant Step 2 return last time - and Weymouth, who go in on the back of a good summer. It's may seem a lazy choice but there's a history of go-again clubs taking Step 4 in their stride, so Hereford for me in the Southern League South & West. Farnborough were very strong towards the end of their Ryman Premier season and would have stayed up if it wasn't for CVA rules. Spencer Day finds good players but Egham, Bedford and Royston will all be up there.
