Welcome to Highworth Town

A warm welcome to Highworth Town for this Boxing Day Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground. We hope all from Highworth enjoy their second visit to the New Gerard Buxton Ground and we wish them a safe journey home. A special welcome to our former management team of Jeff Roberts, Ant Brown and Drew Youngsam for what will be their first visit to the New Gerard Buxton Ground as participants in a game here. With this being a local derby we are hoping for a large crowd. Last season this fixture saw a healthy crowd of 209 in attendance, by far our biggest of the season and it would be great if we could beat that this afternoon.

Hopefully Santa brought you everything you wanted yesterday although that is certainly not the case for Royal Wootton Bassett Town manager Rich Hunter. With both Sam Packer and Steve Yeardley expected to be suspended for this game and with keeper Curtis Meare amongst others not available it is going to be something of a different looking Bassett side here this afternoon for what is probably our toughest fixture of the season against our near neighbours who are in a rich vein of form. When we played Highworth at their place earlier in the season they then had a large number of players missing due to injury, evidence that these things can even themselves out over the season I guess. That earlier meeting at the Elms in August saw the two sides share six goals in a thrilling encounter. Bassett came back from 3-1 down to share the points thanks to goals from Steve Robertson (2) and Sam Packer.

Highworth currently sit in 5th place with 42 points from their opening 22 league games, having won thirteen, lost six and drawn three games. Last week they made it throughto the semi-finals of the Wiltshire Senior Cup with a 2-0 home win over Bradford Town, our conquerors in the previous round the week before. Highworth are joined in the semi-finals by near neighbours and their biggest rivals Swindon Supermarine, Salisbury and Calne Town. I suspect manager Jeff Roberts will be hoping to draw his former club Calne when the draw is finally made.

Lydney Town

Finally we have got one over Lydney Town. After suffering four straight single goal defeats against our Gloucestershire bogey side, Bassett were able to record a 2-0 victory against them and book their place in the quarter finals of the Floodlit Cup in our last game here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground. It took one hell of a struggle, 120 minutes of closely-fought action and a couple of nail-biting moments to get there though. However, in the end an extra time brace from the ever-reliable Steve Robertson separated the sides before the game suffered problems with the floodlights - somewhat ironic given the competition the teams were playing in.

The game should really have been settled in the closing stages of normal time when Dale Richards found the back of the net, only to see what appeared to be a perfectly legitimate goal ruled out for by an erroneous offside flag. Extra time was therefore required, and Bassett struck early in the first half, Robertson lobbing the 'keeper after being played through by Richards. He then grabbed his second after the interval. It came in somewhat scrappy fashion, but they all count. Through on goal again, Robertson unselfishly sought to square to a teammate only to see his attempted pass bounce of a defender. The ball fell straight back to Robertson though, and the forward simply walked it in for his 22nd of the season. Shortly before full time was due, the floodlights were inadvertently switched off. Light was eventually restored, and the final minute played out with Bassett securing 2-0 win.

Reserves Team

The Reserves must have thought they would get something out of the league game with Corsham Town Reserves last time out as they led 2-1 at half time thanks to a brace from Ryan Thomas. However, a bad second half saw the Reserves concede six goals without reply to go down 7-2 in a bad end to the year. Hopefully, they will bounce straight back when fixtures restart in the New Year.

Highworth Town • Club History

Highworth Town Football Club was formed in 1893. They joined the Cirencester & District League and it took them some time to record their first honours, until 1909-10 in fact, when they won both the Swindon Junior Cup and the local Advertiser Cup, a cup they were to capture again in 1912-13.

After winning the Cirencester & District League Division Two Championship in 1931-32, Highworth moved to the Swindon & District League, where they completed the Third Division Championship and Swindon Junior Cup double in 1933-34.

The 1950s saw Highworth make a dramatic rise through the local football ranks. They won the Swindon & District League Third Division title again in 1954-55 and then the Division Two title the following season. One more season was needed to clinch the Division One title and also the Wilts Junior Cup. They then went on to win the Premier Division title in 1957-58, along with the Faringdon Thursday Memorial Cup and the following season saw them Premier Champions again, also winning the Advertiser Cup.

Highworth continued to dominate the Swindon & District Premier Division in the 1960s, winning four successive titles from 1960-61 and another hat-trick from 1965-66 to 1967-68, making seven titles in eight seasons. They reached the final of the Wilts Senior Cup for the first time in 1962-63 and won it the following season.

There was a switch to the Wilts Combination League, where they finished as Runners-Up in Division Two in 1970-71. 1972-73 saw another Wilts Senior Cup victory and all this success prompted them to join the Hellenic League. They achieved their first honours in 1988-89, winning the First Division Challenge Cup and reached the final of the Wilts Senior Cup yet again.

They finally achieved Premier Division status in 1993-94 gaining promotion after finishing third in Division One. Since then they have been Winners of the Wilts Senior Cup in 1995-96, 1997-98, 2008-09 and again in 2014-15, Winners of the Hellenic League Challenge Cup in 2011-12, Winners of the Hellenic League Supplementary Cup in 1998-99 and Runners-Up in 2003-04, Runners-Up in the Premier Division in 1999-2000 and Winners of the Premiership Title in 2004-05.

However, their greatest achievement to date was in reaching the Semi-Final of the FA Vase in 2015, where they were knocked out by eventual winners, North Shields in a closely fought two-legged tie.

Wembley Board Game

It is not strictly correct to say that the Wembley Board Game is not still around, as you can still buy it on Ebay, but the days of board games and Wembley in particular being popular is just about gone now. The children these days have their Play Stations and X-Box's. Even the big boys don't take the FA Cup and a final at Wembley that seriously so what chance the board game!

Rainy days and school holidays in the 1970's what shall we do? I know let's have a game of Wembley. If you could not be out playing football in the park and your Subbuteo team had a couple of broken legs and no Airfix glue the next best thing was a game of Wembley. Anybody out there remember the game?

It came in a green box with a nice picture of the FA Cup on the front. The board was a bit like a Monopoly board but with football teams round the edge rather than properties. The great thing about Wembley was the fact that any number of kids could play. It was not complicated or long winded like Monopoly. The whole idea of the game was the dream of most youngsters in those pre-Champions League days - to win the FA Cup.



Whilst it relied totally on the luck of the dice roll, there was an element of skill by spending your match winnings on purchasing an "International Star", which gave you an additional goal in the tie you were playing. You saved your "International Star" for your favourite team. The most exciting parts of the game were firstly the allocation of teams to the various players and then the Cup draw itself. No balls in bags but the excitement was just the same.

Thirty two teams featured, though only eight from Division One (Premiership in New Money) and 8 from each of the other 3 divisions. Therefore, the makers played heavily on 'giant killing'. Often you would get ' Arsenal will play Darlingon' or 'Tottenham will play York City'. In fact more often than not, you would finish up with 'Wrexham v Rochdale in the Cup Final'!! Or 'Stockport County,



conquerors of Manchester United and Chelsea in the earlier rounds v Aston Villa

(who were, it should be pointed out, a Third Division team when this game was manufactured).



It was all great fun. You had scores of 5-0, 6-4 or 5-5. Second replays, neutral grounds the lot. Often you would have arguments with your mates when their favourite teams were knocked out.

For me the only disappointment with this excellent game was that QPR had not been included. However, the makers knew how to deal with this and you could change some of the teams using the blank cards that came with the set. So in my Wembley there was always a QPR team and they strangely they often won the Cup in the Smedley household (so as you can see the game wasn't that realistic). I even remember keeping a list of historic winners and I am sure Darlington had won it more times than Manchester United, certainly more times than the enemy from SW6.

Gibson Games bought out a version in the 1990's (see right) that my boys had but it was not quite the same, the board for a start looked completely different. QPR still did not feature but interestingly neither did Chelsea. This was now the era of the new Premier League and the 8 representatives of the league were Arsenal, Aston Villa, Leeds Utd, Liverpool, Manchester Utd, Newcastle, Notts Forest and Tottenham. Swindon Town were in there though as a Second Division side. Anyone fancy a game?

RWBTFC History On One Page

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35. Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II.

After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed.

The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 only to be immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 and promotion back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and in 1987-88 they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06. Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away.

With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year groundshare with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year at Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and a record points total. Last season saw the club return home playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, Bassett finished 15th in the Premier Division. With some top summer signings the Club are looking for a much higher finish this season.

This season we have 74 less miles of travel in total (it could have been 164 more if North Greenford had come into the Hellenic and Cheltenham had not stayed down) but the average journey has increased by just over a mile.

Match Reports

League roll continues

New Gerard Buxton Ground, 10th December 2016

Royal Wootton Bassett Town enjoyed a rather comfortable afternoon as they recorded their fourth straight league victory with a stylish 4-0 triumph against Henley Town. Rich Hunter's team's attacking football was as slick as the damp Gerard Buxton Sports Ground pitch and, after going into half time with a slender advantage despite controlling proceedings, they swept aside their Oxfordshire opponents in the second period. Sam Packer, playing the majority of the game in his favoured number ten role, was in particularly devilish form. More or less unplayable, Henley had no answer to the Bassett playmaker, who must have had a role in close to a dozen of the chances the hosts created. He played a key role in the game's opener on nineteen minutes, perfectly weighting a return pass to set free right winger Dan Bailey, who cut the ball back from the by-line for Steve Robertson to provide an emphatic finish into the top right corner. That goal had followed a somewhat nervous start, punctuated by a third minute opportunity which fell to Henley's Chris Hood after a poor touch from Steve Yeardley inside his own penalty area. However, Hood's snap shot was fortunately turned around the post by a fast reacting Curtis Meare. Once they were ahead though. Bassett were in control. Packer came close to doubling the lead moments after Robertson had struck, hammering a 20-yard shot from the right edge of the area narrowly past the opposite post. Adam Corcoran's far post header from Dale Richards' corner then appeared to be destined for the back of the net, yet was deflected wide. On 33 minutes, Packer, aided by a slip from his marker Mitch Cooper, raced onto Corcoran's clipped ball over the top and found himself with only 'keeper Matthew Hill to beat. Opting to attempt a lob from just outside the area. rather than advance on goal, he again was a matter of inches away from taking his tally of goals for the season to four. Not that he let the frustration of failing to register a goal affect his performance. He continued to be at heart of Bassett's forays forward. His cut back and Robertson's deft touch on the edge of the area set Bailey in with seven minutes to go until the break, but no goal was forthcoming as Hill raced off his line to take the ball away from Bailey's feet. Packer's through ball then set an overlapping Bailey in on goal. Again the winger was thwarted by Hill though as the 'keeper parried his low effort from a tight angle across the face of goal.

Bassett's half time lead should really have been more. But they quickly established a more comfortable advantage after half time. Yeardley played a brilliant pass to Packer in the right corner, and his cross into the danger area just evaded Robertson. The Bassett forward was quickly able to jump on the loose ball, steering in cross from the left edge, which Dale Richard guided home with a header from ten yards. Chances kept coming Bassett's way. After racing onto a Robertson's through ball, Packer unselfishly sought to play a square pass back when in on goal, but the forward could only snatch at his effort affording Hill a relatively comfortable save. Richards soon nearly had a second when his stooping header from Bailey's corner wasn't gathered clearly by the Henley stopper. However, Hill was able to dive on the ball just as it appeared set to roll over the line. The game was eventually killed off with twenty minutes remaining. Substitute Kias Bonner-Shaw cut inside from the right and saw a shot from a tight angle blocked. The rebound fell to Robertson who was never going to miss. It was guickly four as Ryan Withers, another substitute who injected dangerous pace, raced clear before coolly picking out the bottom corner when one-on-one. Moving the ball around at will, Bassett were in full control. And come full time it could well have been six or seven. Indeed, Robertson should probably have at least completed his hat-trick. He saw a closerange strike from Bonner-Shaw's cutback swatted away before then failing to get a toe on the end of the same player's low fizzing cross. Finally, with two minutes remaining he put a shot from an angle across the face of goal after latching onto Packer's superb defence splitting pass which had been played with the outside of his right boot.

Man of the Match: Sam Packer - Henley had no answers for the playmaker, as he constantly found a way in behind their backline. It was probably a welcome relief for the visitors when Packer dropped into a deeper role late in the game.

Cricklade Town regain their poise with Vale victory

CRICKLADE Town overcame a stuttering first half display to return to winning ways in the Wiltshire Senior League Premier Division last weekend.

Luke Alford's side suffered a 3-2 defeat at the hands of title rivals Wroughton last weekend and despite a Ben Carter hat-trick, they led by just a single goal halfway into their trip to struggling Pewsey Vale Development, who have lost every one of their games so far this season.

However, Cricklade finished off the job emphatically, with Carter notching again to take his tally for the afternoon to four while Gio Wrona's hat-trick and Bradley Clark's effort rounded off an 8-2 triumph.

"We were 3-2 up at half-time on Saturday and we'd given away two sloppy goals, which is something that we've done a bit too much recently," said Cricklade manager Alford.

"We've got Ben Carter up front and we weren't playing to his strengths, so we got them in at halftime and told the lads that we needed to do things a bit differently.

"It was just about changing the tactics a little bit and the second half was a walkover.

"We just lost to Wroughton and we think they'll probably go on and win the league but we'll keep going and see what we can do.

"They've been together for a little while whereas it's our first season and we've not done too badly at all."

Elsewhere, Wroughton moved two points clear at the top of the table with a 3-1 victory at Malmesbury Victoria Development – their ninth win on the spin.

Marlborough Town have dropped down to fourth in the table after they suffered a heavy 5-2 defeat at Ludgershall Sports while Corsham Town Reserves put seven goals past Royal Wootton Bassett Town Reserves.


A brace from Bassett's Ryan Thomas cancelled out Adam Mitchell's effort in the first period but the Corsham man went on to complete his hat-trick in the second period, notching once from the penalty spot, with Aaron Masson and Josh Bright also weighing in with braces as the visitors ran out 7-2 winners.

Trowbridge Town were hammered 7-0 at Shrewton United but there was better news for Wilts Calne Town, who won 4-1 down the road at Beversbrook, Nathan Davis scoring twice from the spot while Eddie Summers and Rory Davis also netted.


Devizes Town Reserves claimed only their second victory of the season with a 2-0 win over Bromham.

WBTFC Attendances - Season 2016-17 (and comparison to 2015-16)







Combined Counties

Five teams from the Combined Counties League have applied to be considered for promotion to Step 4. This includes leaders Hartley Wintney who extended their lead at the top of the table to fifteen points following a 4-1 away win at Knaphill. Through on goal again, Robertson unselfishly sought to square to a teammate only to see his attempted pass bounce of a defender. The ball fell straight back to Robertson though, and the forward simply walked it in.

Bassett were arguably grateful they had netted a second and had Lydney beaten as, shortly before full time was due, the floodlights were inadvertently switched off. Light was eventually restored, and the final minute played out. But without that additional cushion, Lydney would arguably have had reason for complaint.

Non-League Paper's Joshua Peck on "Going back"

At all levels of football, we see heroes returning to a team, years after leaving.

These players are often lauded, and fans rejoice when they see the announcement that J. Bloggs has come back to where he has made his name.

Whether it's Jose Mourinho returning to manage Chelsea, six years after first leaving Stamford Bridge, or even Paul Scholes coming out of retirement to come back to Manchester United.

Returning to a former club doesn't seem to be all too common in the higher echelons of football but it's seen a lot more in our beloved Non-League.

Whether it's players leaving to move into the Football League and returning on loan following the move not quite working, or wanting to return home.

That second reason is why midfielder Andy Drury has returned to Ebbsfleet United, a decade after leaving Stonebridge Road.

Drury has a young family in Kent, but was starring at National League Eastleigh. That meant a six-hour round trip every day.

Drury explained: "I needed to get back to my family, we live in Kent, and I was stuck in the car for six hours a day. For family reasons I needed to get back and play for a club closer to home. This is only 40 minute drive from home so it's ideal.

"I felt like I was having a good season but the team as a whole weren't progressing like I thought we would. With the budget they've got, they should really be right up the top but for one reason or another, things weren't working."

Drury has dropped down a league to return home, but perhaps it shows why managers and clubs should never cut ties with a player completely.

As Jimmy Greaves famously said, "football is a funny old game" and you never know when you might require the services of a player again.

For the likes of Drury, it's been all change in the Garden of England, but that doesn't mean it hasn't felt like a homecoming.

He added: "I went and met Macca (Ebbsfleet manager Daryl McMahon) and had a chat there and it was all sorted. I played with Macca at Stevenage for a while and I've come across a lot of the players over the years so it's easy to settle in.

"It's a little bit like I'm returning home. There is a lot going on off the pitch and the owner is really going for it."

And with the Fleet chasing Maidenhead in the National League South, Drury's signing could prove pivotal.

Perhaps this will be a lesson. Folk heroes of a club don't just vanish. Those doors should always remain open, because one day, they might be just what the club and the fans need.

However after 14 minutes it was the hosts who took the lead through Lewis Powell, after he was found with a lofted ball to the back post, before applying the finish. Powell went close again, but his effort was matched by Connor Johns in the Supermarine goal. The game than began to slow with half-time approaching as Supermarine continued to look for a way back into the contest. Despite going into the break a goal behind, the visitors were handed a huge lift just after the interval when the hosts had Matt Coupe sent off for a second yellow card. Supermarine took advantage as Callum Parsons equalised in the 48th minute, netting his fifth goal in three matches. Parsons' free-kick was curled into the top left corner from 25 yards. The draw left Supermarine in 5th spot.
