Welcome to Tuffley Rovers

A warm welcome to Tuffley Rovers who have made the trip over from Gloucestershire for this afternoon's UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. We hope all from Tuffley enjoy their short stay with us this afternoon and we wish them a safe journey home.

Tuffley are definitely one of our bogey sides. In twenty games between the two sides Wootton Bassett have only won three times whilst Tuffley have been victorious on nine occasions, with twelve draws between the two sides over the years. With so many draws what odds on a draw again here this afternoon? The two sides met back in September in Gloucester and a poor performance saw us go down 3-1. We will certainly be looking to put right that disappointing result here this afternoon. After a tough season last time round which saw Tuffley finish in 17th place and in a theoretical relegation position they have certainly turned things round this season and currently sit in 6th spot in the table with 27 points from their opening 16 games. They have recently added striker Carl Brown to their forward line from Southern League Evesham United and will be tough opponents here this afternoon.

Tuffley are in their fourth season back in the Hellenic League after dropping out of the league in 2005-06 and re-forming in the Gloucestershire County League for season 2007-08. They were promoted back to the Hellenic League at the end of Season 2012-13 after they finished runners-up in the Gloucestershire County League. In their second season back in the Hellenic they were promoted to the Premier Division after finishing runners-up in Division One West in 2014-15.

Sandhurst Town

Last home game saw a comfortable 5-1 home win over Division One West opponents Sandhurst Town in the Floodlit Cup. Five different scorers were on target against Sandhurst and we will now play Lydney Town in the next round. Sandhurst will be back here again next week in the Bluefin Insurance Cup and we should expect a much tougher game as we look to progress in another of the league's cup competitions. I am sure Sandhurst will be able to field a stronger side for a Saturday away fixture than they were able to for the Floodlit Cup. We should certainly not read too much into the result from the last game and treat our Division One East opponents with respect else we could find ourselves on the end of a cup upset.

Burnham

Apologies on behalf of the club to any spectators who, like myself, made the long journey to Burnham last week only to find that the game was then postponed by the match referee due to a waterlogged pitch. Lucky for me the journey to Burnham was only 21 miles but due to horrendous road works at the M4 junction at Windsor it took us longer than anticipated to get there. We were literally 2 miles from the ground when Paul Curtis' tweet that the game was read at 2.30pm. Thankfully the game has been re-scheduled for another Saturday date at the back end of the season rather than a midweek date. Not sure why Burnham couldn't have arranged an earlier inspection although with management changes during the week the club obviously had other things on their minds.

Bradford Town County Cup

The scheduled County Cup game at Bradford Town in midweek was also postponed due to Bradford needing a replay in the FA Vase against Brimscombe & Thrupp. The replay saw Bradford Town win 5-0 and according to the Wilts FA site our game is now scheduled for next Wednesday 23rd when we were scheduled to play Longlevens in the UHlsport Hellenic League. At the time of writing these notes this has not been confirmed on the Hellenic League site on FA.com but knowing that the County Cup games take precedence I have assumed that the County game will be on Wednesday and there will be no home game next Wednesday. Opponents - History

Tuffley Rovers • Club History

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.



The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. The next season, a much younger side finished a slightly disappointing 11th but with a year's experience gained the Rovers challenged again at the top of the table for most of the next season before finishing 3rd.

The 2010/11 season saw some variable performances in the league, with a final finishing position of 6th, followed by a third place finish in 2011/12. The 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers survived a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results.

The following season saw them secure promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division (after finishing second in Division One, West) and in 2015/16 the team finished seventeenth, surviving relegation and securing a second consecutive season at Step 5 of the Non-League game.

Away from the first team, the club has, over the past few seasons, developed considerably, so that they now field four senior sides and a full youth section.

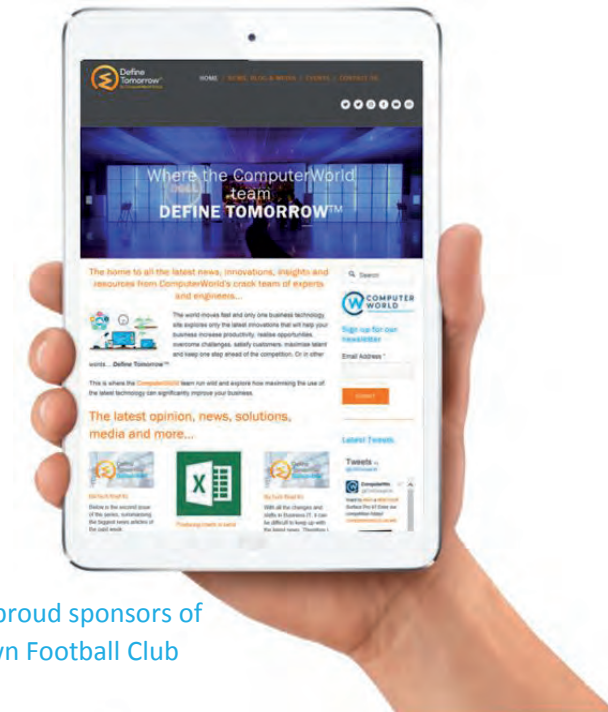

 Back in football after a year out through injury and a new signing this season. A former Longlevens and Gala Wilton player who will add graft, bite and energy to the midfield.



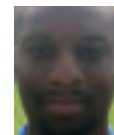
Courtney Hamilton Midfield

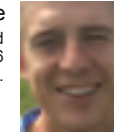
Brett James Forward

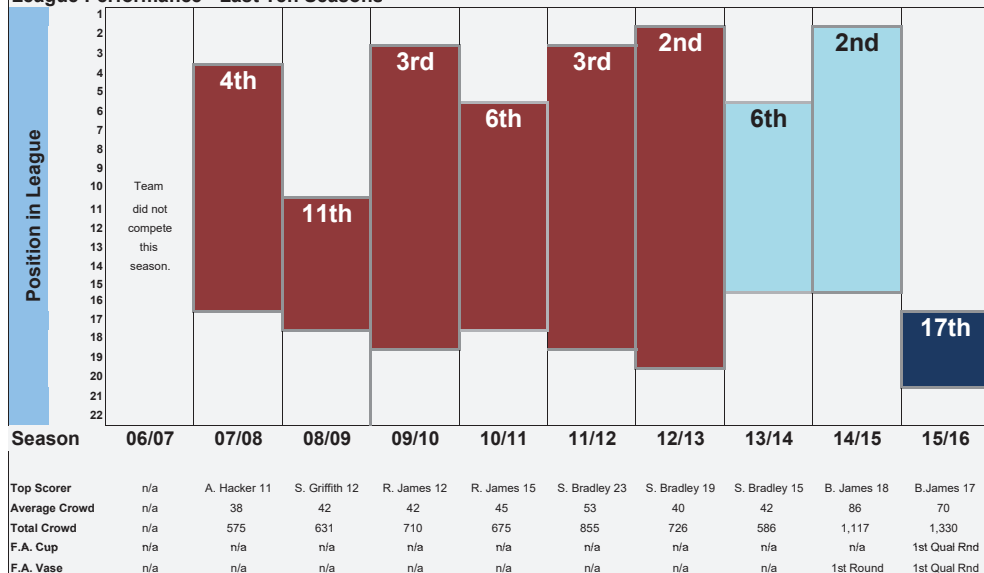

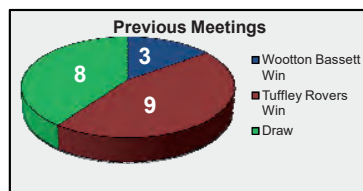
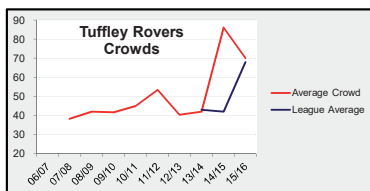

Old Football Revisited

Inspired by the fantastic book "Got, Not Got" by Derrick Hammond and Gary Silke this Season's new feature looks at football related matters from the Editor's long lost youth that are no longer with us. Today it is.....

European Knockout Competitions



The Champions League has never done it for me. One it does not just involve the champions of the various European nations and two all of the teams get multiple chances to make sure they can earn more money to make sure the same old teams appear in the competition year after year. Domestic leagues are getting boring (same old 4 teams at the top etc) but the Champions League has always been boring (same old European teams with Arsenal always appearing in it even though they only ever finish 4th). Those European nights when it was win or bust from the very first round were much more special. Little Nottingham Forest could win the competition; even Scottish teams could win the thing!

Now before all those Man Utd fans start giving me grief that my little club are just jealous we did actually play in the UEFA Cup (the father of the Europa League to the young readers and we would have been in the Champions League had it existed back in 1976 having finished runners-up in the top division). Games against Brann Bergan, Slovan Bratislava, Cologne and AEK Athens, these were real European death or glory encounters played over two legs.

As the authors of Got Not Got note in their excellent book, the European Cup was a proud and prestigious tournament, breathtakingly simple in its purpose. The champions only of each European nation played a knock-out tournament to find out which side was the best. Generally it was the best clubs in Europe who repeatedly lifted the trophy, think Real Madrid, Ajax, Bayern Munich, Inter Milan, and err Nottingham Forest and Aston Villa.

In the early 1990's it was decided that there were not enough games to meet the needs of television and corporate sponsors, so UEFA introduced a group stage. At this point it was still only the champions that took part but then the big wigs at UEFA, in 1997, ignoring the words from the Queen song We are the Champions,.... "no time for losers, 'cos we are the champions" decided to allow runners-up to take part allegedly to boost the numbers but more likely to ensure that the biggest teams in Europe were taking part to keep the TV and sponsors happy.

Once the Champions League was no longer solely for the Champions, it was not long before the 3rd place sides and, in some instances, the 4th placed sides from the big European footballing nations. Bringing these sides into the European Cup meant that the UEFA Cup, normally competed by the league runners-up and 3rd placed sides, was diluted and has now morphed into what is the Europa League (or better known as that competition played on a Thursday that results in lots of Premier games and even Championship league games having to be moved to a Sunday to give the poor players a rest after their European exertions).



Whilst the UEFA Cup still survives albeit in a similar format to the Champions League (and also gives losing Champions League sides another chance to play more games) the poor old Cup Winners Cup is no more. This was also a straight knock-out competition for the winners of each domestic knockout cup. 39 years of history which had seen Tottenham, West Ham and Chelsea was ended in 1999 when Lazio defeated Real Mallorca 2-1 at Villa Park. The death of this competition also is partly to blame for the demise of the once great FA Cup.

When the competitions were knockout you could not afford to have an off-night. No losing home and away to Basel and still making it to the last 16 of the competition as a certain club from West London have done a few seasons back. Bring back the knockout competitions and stop the big clubs being greedy so and so's I say to the likes of Man Utd, Chelsea, Man City and Arsenal. No doubt when Man Utd finish 7th this season there will be cries to extend the Champions League to the top 7 clubs, you heard it here first!

Ryan Thomas (midfield)



Skilful, creative and difficult to defend against, Thomas is a quality attacking midfielder who is a threat from out wide or through the middle where he can create space for himself in between the lines.

The son of Steve Thomas – who enjoyed an illustrious and lengthy career for Bassett throughout the 1980s and early 1990s - the attacking midfielder is extremely gifted and capable of turning a game on its head. Whilst small in stature, Thomas can dance away from defenders with ease and also knows where the back of the net is.

Thomas' previous spell with Bassett was a successful, albeit brief one as he helped then-manager Dave Turner's team secure promotion from Hellenic League Division One West in 2009/10. Though he made 19 of his 22 appearances that year from the bench, he made an impact in many of them.

He made his debut in the home derby against Purton in August, before his first league start came at home to Lydney Town in mid-September. And he certainly made the most of that opportunity, getting himself on the scoresheet in a convincing 5-0 victory. He went onto to find the back of the net twice more. He completed the scoring in a 5-0 drubbing of Launton Sports in March with an exquisite curling effort from 25 yards before side-footing home the only goal of the game at Tytherington Rocks – just moments after his introduction to the game – to seal at least a top three finish and promotion.

His chances were more limited than he would have hoped in the Premier Division, however, and he made just seven substitute appearances in 2010/11. In order to get more first team football, Thomas moved to Cricklade Town, scoring four times in 18 games and earning the Young Player of the Year award as his team finished seventh in Division One West.

He began the 2010/11 campaign at Stones Lane, scoring twice in four games, with his form enough to catch the attention of Highworth Town manager Dave Webb. In 26 games with the Worthians, 12 of which he started, Thomas scored twice.

Thomas was back at Cricklade for the start of the 2012/13 season, scoring six goals in 15 games. An unfortunate knee injury then kept him out for the 2013/14 campaign. After recovering, he re-signed with Bassett ahead of last season, but suffered another injury in pre-season, which, along with work commitments, limited him to just 12 appearances, 6 of which were starts.

Thomas is a Cirencester Academy graduate, although whilst an under 16 he featured for Bassett's Floodlit League side. During his time at the Corinium Stadium he was a feature of the side that made it to the third round of the FA Youth Cup where the Centurions lost at the Stadium of Light to Sunderland.

Caught Napping

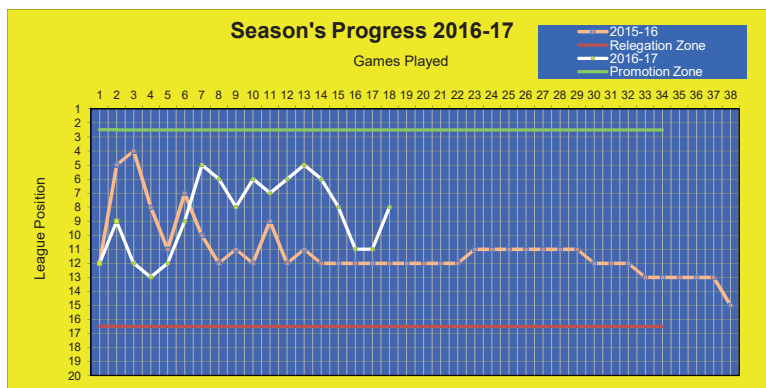
After a fine four game run that yielded ten points, Royal Wootton Bassett Town were reminded by Tuffley Rovers that, as much as you write your own luck in football, you can just as often bring about your own demise. In a lively contest, which saw chances aplenty for both sides, the seconds after Steve Robertson had scored an equaliser for the visitors proved decisive in determining the destination of the points, which the Gloucestershire side eventually earned with a 3-1 victory. Still celebrating getting back on level terms, Bassett were caught napping as Marcus Foxwell's audacious effort from the halfway line sailed in over the head of 'keeper Curtis Meare to put Tuffley back in front. And, as much as Bassett tried to get back on level terms, they were unable to find a second, allowing for Warren Mann to wrap up the three points from the penalty spot in the final minute. After a brief period of quiet to begin the match, the game quickly livened up. Brett James and Shayne Bradley both narrowly missed the target for the hosts, while Henry Spalding and Steve Robertson did the same for Bassett. Spalding was the first to draw either of the two 'keepers into action as he raced through only to be denied by a good stop from David Evans. Tuffley then broke the deadlock on the stroke of half time. It appeared as though the teams were headed into the interval deadlocked, but Foxwell swung in a fine free kick which Bradley stooped to head home at the far post.

Upon the resumption both defences continued to be tested. Robertson again went close before James struck a rasping drive over. Shortly after the hour Bassett finally got back onto level terms as Robertson demonstrated his predatory instincts, firing home after a deflected cross had spun into his path. That should have served as a platform on which to build. However, Bassett immediately found themselves back in arrears when Foxwell went for glory from the halfway line and succeeded in beating Meare. To Bassett's credit, heads didn't drop as Sam Packer danced past four defenders before seeing his progress halted by Tristan Haswell's tackle just as it appeared as though the midfielder would have a shot on goal. Dale Richards also went on a surging run only to produce an effort that lacked the vim required to beat Evans. Chasing that elusive equaliser, Bassett were eventually caught out. Rovers continued to threaten with their best opportunities falling to Bradley and Ashley Davies. And eventually they found a third as Mann dispatched the penalty after James had been tripped.

This will be his 5th season with Bassett with over 130 appearances having re-joined the Club from Shrivernham. Previously with Calne Town a player who gives 100% every game.



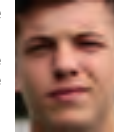
Dale Richards Defence

Hard working and talented midfield player in his third season with the club. Prior to this season had made 87 appearances scoring 10 times.



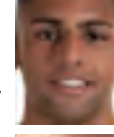
Scott Walduck Midfield

Another product of Bassett's youth section. Former Swindon Town Centre of Excellence player who then joined Yeovil Town. Previously also with Highworth Town and Calne Town.



Steve Robertson Forward
Free scoring forward who re-joined the Club from Shrivernham in Season 2014-15. Top scorer last season with 30 goals from 38 appearances. Manager of the Swindon Town Ladies side.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35. Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II.



After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed.

The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 only to be immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 and promotion back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and in 1987-88 they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06. Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away.



















With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year groundshare with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year at Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and a record points total. Last season saw the club return home playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, Bassett finished 15th in the Premier Division. With some top summer signings the Club are looking for a much higher finish this season.



The table below shows the addresses of all the grounds we will be visiting this coming **2016-17** Season. This season we have 3 new teams in Burnham, Carterton and Henley. The table below includes the postcode to enter into your Sat Nav. A rough estimate of the distance from Royal Wootton Bassett is also shown. This season we have 74 less miles of travel in total (it could have been 164 more if North Greenford had come into the Hellenic and Cheltenham had not stayed down) but the average journey has increased by just over a mile.













Five Star Bassett March Past Sandhurst

New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, 9th November 2016

Five different scorers were on target as Royal Wootton Bassett Town made light work of Hellenic League Division One East Sandhurst Town in their Floodlit Cup second round clash.

Rich Hunter's side were dominant throughout.

They built a 2-0 lead early on, with Dale Richards slotting home the opener into an open goal after Henry Spalding had raced onto Steve Robertson's through ball and unselfishly squared to his fellow in form winger.

Alioune Diouf then dispatching a towering header as he connected with an inswinging Spalding corner.

Sandhurst were able to halve the deficit just after the half hour mark though. Sloppy defending saw the visitors steal possession from a throw in Bassett had deep in their own half, and Maurice Black capitalised, dancing past a stranded George Drewitt before finishing neatly.

Thankful for that let off, Bassett turned the screw even further.

Robertson was again provider for the fourth, collecting a short free kick from Sam Packer and advancing into the box. It did appear he was going for goal himself with a right footed effort from a tight angle. Nevertheless, defender Liam Edmondson made sure that the ball found the back of the net by guiding a header over the line.

The hosts arguably saved their best goal until last. Catching Sandhurst out with a short corner on the left hand side, Robertson set a pass back to Packer, who shifted the ball onto his right foot before curling a delicious strike into the far top corner from the wing.

Facing a side in the division below them, Bassett were always favourites to win this tie. Yet extra satisfaction can be gleaned from the fact they went about the game in a professional manner, which ensured Sandhurst had little hope of pulling off the shock.

A significantly tougher test awaits in the last sixteen with Lydney Town - a side Bassett have been tormented by in recent contests - set to visit the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground.

THE ROAD TO WEMBLEY FOR WOOTTON BASSETT TOWN F.C. 2015-16

"Because we support the first team (who play in the Toolstation League Premier Division) we don't know what team we will have for the weekend.

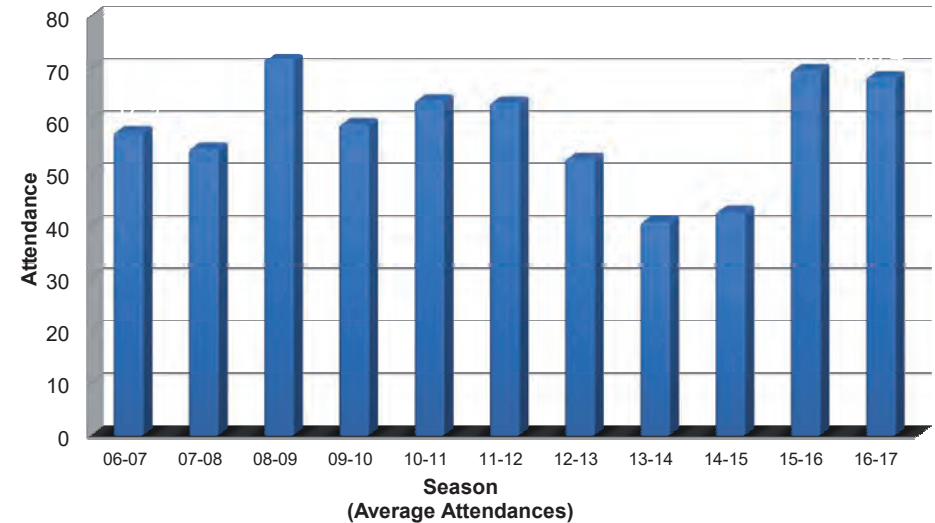
"We have got Shrewton and they beat us 6-3 earlier in the season, but we go there with confidence."

Wroughton moved within two points of leaders Shrewton United as they defeated third-place Cricklade Town, who slipped to their fourth loss of the campaign.

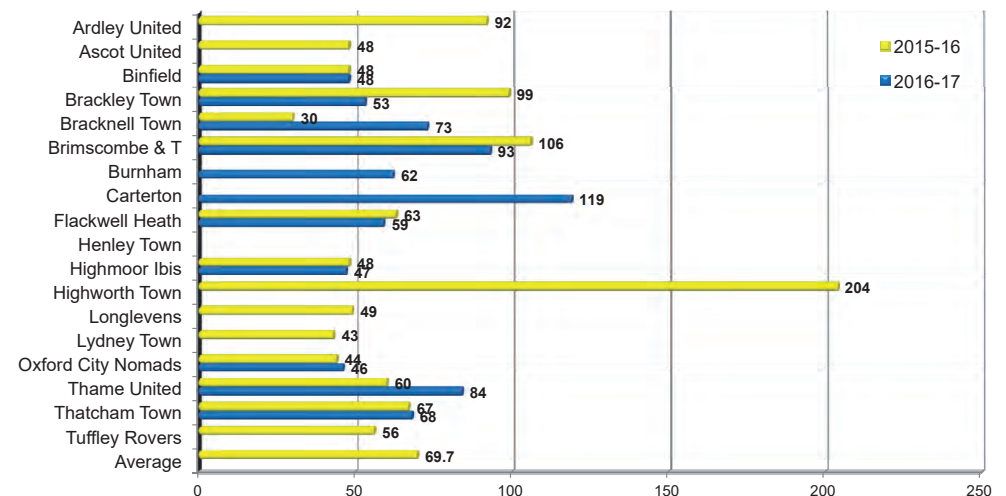
Mark Love's men currently sit in fourth place and have a game in hand on the table-toppers.

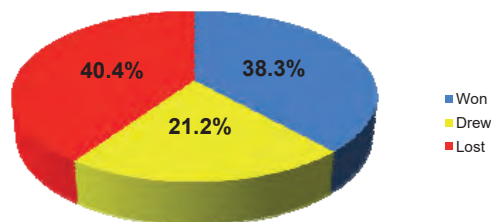

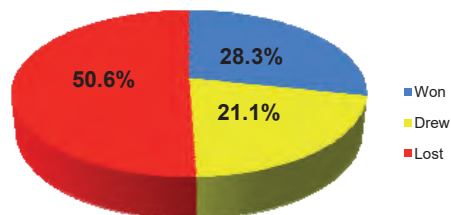

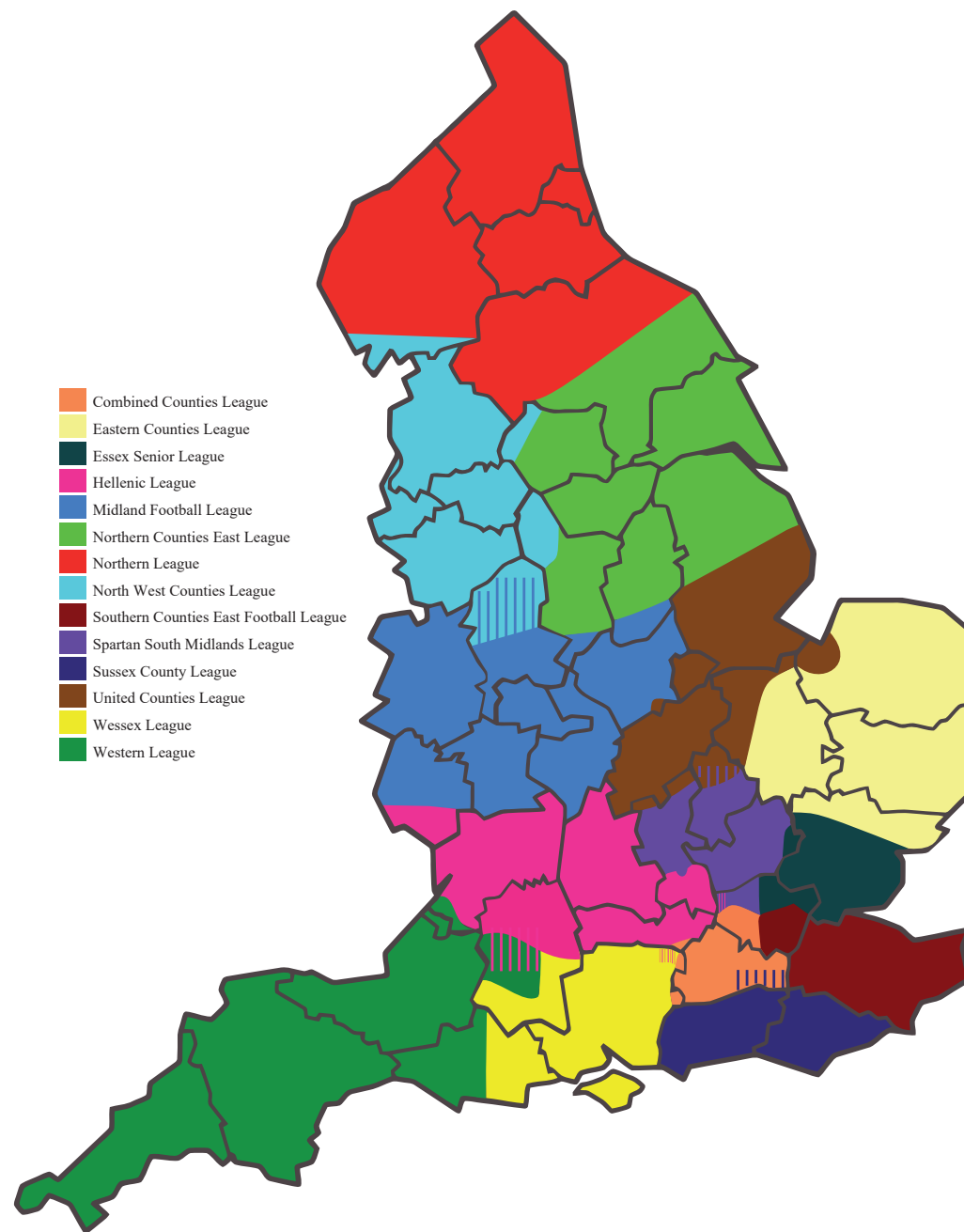

Non-League Paper's Alex Narey on Stadium Naming

IT'S a conundrum we're faced with more and more. Ground re-naming; from the bet365 Stadium to the Sports Direct Arena, we're stuck between a rock and a hard place where supporters would rather stay with tradition, while the commercial bean-counters want to see make the most of the money they are pouring into the club – and the naming of the ground offers the perfect opportunity to do this.

The re-naming of grounds is big business these days. But for some supporters, it's a big issue. Sponsored partners coming into a club and splashing their branding all over the place leaves a sour taste with the fans coming through the turnstiles.

Like it or not, sponsorship oils the wheels of the modern-day game. But if you feel uncomfortable about having your favourite place transformed into the so-and-so.com Arena, well you aren't alone.

Selling off the naming rights doesn't always sit easy, so when the supporters aren't happy, what do the press do?

Clubs, of course, want the media to refer to their home by its new commercial title. They've just struck a deal and want everyone to know about it.

You could argue they give us access; we sell papers by being pitchside, so it's only right we respect their wishes in copy. If a company wants to back a Non-League club in such a way, then they surely deserve their name on our pages?

It's an awkward one from the press' point of view as well. We're always keen to help, but upsetting supporters by removing the historic ground name they've always known from their favourite paper? Now we've got ourselves a moral dilemma.

Some may argue us giving good coverage to clubs is enough. The media aren't there to promote products, especially when our own commercial activity isn't been boosted by plugging insurance companies or a well-known florist.

But with shirt sponsors' logos and advertising hoardings seen in our pictures, are we doing enough already without risking the wrath of our readers? I think if you asked any journalist, they would rather stick to the traditions for the sake of making their copy easier to digest.

There still doesn't seem to be a right answer. But as ground names and historic competitions become more and more barney (the Checktrade Trophy or the Carabao Energy Drink League Cup anyone?) the more difficult things become.
