Welcome to Longlevens

A warm welcome to Longlevens for this final UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division home fixture here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground during Season 2016-17. Yes you have read that correctly, today is our final home league game of the season and we are still in February. This is the first time in all of our 29 seasons in the Hellenic League that we have not gone at least into April with our home league fixtures. So unless we defeat North Leigh in the Supplementary Cup and then get a home draw in a subsequent round this will be the last programme of Season 2016-17. It seems way too early to be saying the final thank you's to players, committee members, helpers, supporters and sponsors and I am going to take a gamble that we will have another home game before the season is out and not do the thank you's today. If necessary I can put this right at the start of next season. Whilst this is our final league home game we do have five away league fixtures still to play as well as that Supplementary Cup game.

Our visitors Longlevens are currently two places below us in the table with 30 points from their opening 28 league fixtures. The two sides met in Gloucester back in September when goals from Lewis Thompson (2), Henry Spalding and Steve Robertson gave us a 4-1 win. Unfortunately the points gained that night were taken off us when it transpired that one of the subs we had taken from the Reserves had not signed UHlsport Hellenic League forms. A costly error on our part that still hurts every time I see the league table. If we still had those three points we would be one place higher in the league table, hopefully these lost points will not cost us our highest ever position in Step 5 football as this would be very disappointing. The lads just need to make sure they keep picking up points from now and until the end of the season despite a tough run in of games against three of the championship chasing sides.

Last League Outing

Following our defeat at Binfield last week we have now lost our last two league games and have gone three without a win, our last win coming from the trip to Highmoor Ibis. I know that Rich felt last week's defeat at Binfield was our worst performance of the season and no doubt the lads will be looking to respond to his comments about this in Monday's Adver. On paper this is one of our less tough fixtures but as we have found in this league, unless you are at the top of your game you can get beaten by anyone in this league. Just look at some of the points sides at the bottom of the table have been picking up in recent weeks. In the last home game against Ardley we were unable to take advantage of playing with an extra man for the final half hour as the Oxfordshire visitors eked out a 2-1 victory. Trailing by a goal we were handed a huge boost early in the second period when Ardley centre half Joel Meade was dismissed for needlessly kicking out at Sam Packer after being fouled by the Bassett playmaker. However, within eight minutes of being reduced to ten men Ardley were able to double the lead and, although Steve Yeardeley pulled one back from the penalty spot, we could not get back on level terms and fell to our eighth home league defeat of the campaign.

Elsewhere in the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division

There were some key games in the UHlsport Hellenic League in the past week. On Saturday leaders Bracknell Town were held 1-1 at home with fellow title contenders Flackwell Heath. Thame took advantage winning 3-0 away at Highmoor Ibis and followed this up on Tuesday night with a comprehensive 5-0 thrashing of Flackwell Heath to go top of the league, two points ahead of Bracknell who have a game in hand. Bracknell kept the gap to two points by securing a hard fought 1-0 away win at Binfield in front of a massive 289 spectators on Monday night. The title looks like it is going down to the wire and with us having to still play all of the top three we may have a say in the destiny of the title. At the other end of the table Henley Town picked up three useful points on Tuesday night, winning 2-1 at Ascot United to give themselves a chance of avoiding the drop. Oxford City Nomads also won 2-1 at home to Brackley Town Saints. With just three points separating the bottom three sides the relegation battle could also go down to the wire.

Floodlit Cup

So after having made the quarter-finals and then being told to go back to Round 2 through no fault of our own, where we duly lost second time around, I note that the team we beat in Round 3, Lydney, defeated Woodley and are now through to the quarter-finals where they will now

meet Bicester Town. Whilst this still rankles what irritates more is the lack of transparency about what actually happened and why the FA had to overturn a League decision. I suspect we will never get to know the truth but someone clearly cocked-up big style here and we were the innocent victims of it all.

Reserves

The Reserves disappointing run also continued on Saturday as they lost by the odd goal in seven at home to Trowbridge Town. Jack Sanderson, Martin Sinclair and Ryan Withers with the consolation goals for Bassett. The Reserves have just three games left to play, all of which are at home, against Devizes Town Reserves, Malmesbury Vics Development and Wroughton. After a good start to the season the Reserves have really fallen off track in recent weeks and are looking like they will now finish in the bottom half of the table.

Ladies Team

In contrast the Ladies Team remain on track for runners-up spot in the league and possible promotion. However, in their last outing they dropped points when they were held by the Ladies side of today's visitors Longlevens, Hannah Gulliver scoring for Bassett in the 1-1 draw.

Youth Section Round-up

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Under 13 Yellows moved a step closer to wrapping up the North Wilts League Division Three title with a 4-2 victory against Wroughton Youth. With three games left to play, they are eight points clear of second place Lydiard Millicent Juniors Green, meaning a point is all they require to claim the crown. And given they have lost just once all season, that should be a formality. Samuel Osei Bonsu scored twice against Wroughton, with Samuel Case and Sebastian Turner chipping in with a goal each. The Under 16 Yellows also recorded an important victory to keep their hopes of a top two finish in Division Three alive. A Ryan Battershell brace earned them a win by the odd goal in three against Marlborough Youth to lift them into fourth. Bassett are now three points behind second place Ramsbury Juniors with a game in hand. Elsewhere, the Under 12 Yellows defeated FC Abbey Meads 3-1. Alex Roberts gave Bassett the lead, before Ellie Gulliver and Ellie O'Nions struck.

Host families sought for FC 's-Gravenzande visit

Royal Wootton Bassett Town is still seeking families to volunteer to host players and support staff from sister club FC 's-Gravenzande when they visit on tour in May. For the past 27 years - and 15 times through the football club - youth players from Bassett have been travelling to Holland for an Annual Tour, with these run on an exchange basis on a few occasions. During those years, Bassett's partner clubs in Holland have also visited these shores multiple times, with the last visit from FC 's-Gravenzande having taken place in 2013. They will be visiting England again this year between Thursday 4th and Sunday 7th May, and the club wishes to extend the outstanding hospitality it receives when in Holland. FC 's-Gravenzande's tour party will consist of 44 boys aged 12 to 15 and 18 adults. The club would be looking to host boy in pairs at a minimum, although host families are welcome to accommodate more. The requirements are minimal - the club is asking for families to provide bed and breakfast for three nights as well as a packed lunch on each day of their visit. These trips are always special occasions for those who take part, and as a club we are certain we can count on our many members to ensure that our visitors can all be hosted and they leave with a wonderful impression of our club and country. Opponents - History

Longlevens AFC • Club History



The Club, in its current format, was formed in 1954, although we believe that a Longlevens team had been in existence before the Second World War, but that it folded in 1952, although we have never been able to confirm this through official records. It was a proud moment for the Club when we were elected to the Gloucestershire County League, in season 2011/12, for I can remember that the aim of the Club, when I first joined forty years ago, had been to reach the County League – it was a long time coming, but the wait made the achievement all the more welcome!

We nearly made it to the County League more than 20 years ago - we had successfully undergone our facilities inspection (which, incidentally, would now be considered woefully inadequate) but being in pole position, we 'blew up' in the final three fixtures and were pipped to the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League (GNSL) title by Berkeley Town, eventually finishing as Runners-Up. However, in 2002/03 we repeated the feat and again in 2006/07, until finally winning Division One in 2008/09, under our current Manager – James French - and since the turn of the century, we had become something of a bench-mark in the GNSL, as we had consistently finished in and around the top five and it was this consistency that helped us win our place in today's County League. At the end of Season 2010/11, we had finished outside of the automatic promotion places, but our consistently strong performance, over a number of years in the GNSL, coupled with a re-structuring of the League and the fact that we had the tenancy of a brand new facility provided by the Gloucester City Council, at Sawmills, in Gloucester, saw us finally make it to the County League. When we first took over the facility at Sawmills, we were indebted to the management of E.G. Carter and Company Limited (probably better known simply as Carter Construction) because without their input, both financial and with the provision of man-power, we would not have been able to meet the requirements of the County League. Ironically perhaps, it was the creation of the County League itself which enabled us to progress from Premier Division of the North Gloucester League, because the new League created additional spaces in the Northern Senior League and although in 1967/68 we had not finished in the automatic promotion places, in 1968/69 we were elected to the GNSL (the sharp-eyed among you may have noticed a common theme here!)

Over the years we have added further senior men's sides and we now run five, with our reserves competing in GNSL and the other three all participating in the Stroud and District League. In recent years we have added a Ladies side and they have made significant progress in recent seasons and have become an integral part of 'The Club'. Our representation at youth level has been somewhat variable, we have had some very successful youth teams in the past, but these teams have tended to be transitional and we have not been able to sustain teams at all levels. However, as part of our plans for achieving Charter Standard Development Status, we implemented a structure that should see a steady influx of youth teams in future seasons, which can only be good for our future and I am glad to report that this season we will be fielding teams from Under 11's through to Under 16's. In our first season with the County League we were rightly thrilled to reach the final of the Les James League Cup, only to be soundly beaten by Cribbs Friends Life, who did the League and Cup Double that season – we also consolidated our position in the League by finishing half-way. However, I think it's fair to say that to win the League title last season was - to revert to a well-worn cliché – "beyond our wildest dreams" – especially given where we were in the League in November/December. Words have been written elsewhere about the trauma surrounding Mark Moore and his near-death experience at Southmead and his miraculous recovery, but we rose from what was almost the darkest hour of our long history, to the very heights of a thrilling run in the League, culminating in the title at only our second attempt. However the joy was cut short as we were unable to gain promotion that season in to the Hellenic league as we did not have the facilities required to progress, this was mainly due to the fact that we simply didn't see our remarkable 26 unbeaten run coming, we exceeded our own expectations and failed to get the ground ready in time.

So we went into the 2013/14 season knowing we had a team capable of challenging for the County league again and with the support of the committee agreed that should we be good enough to retain the title we should do all we can to ensure that the facilities were improved to Hellenic league level. We had a settled side and were getting consistently good results, the season started superbly and by Christmas it was clear we had a shot at retaining the title, the work had been done all we had to do was maintain our form and keep on winning matches, luckily we were able to produce our best run to date of 34 unbeaten matches which spanned over the latter stages of the season and the start of the next season, a run that lasted almost one year, we went on to with the league by a margin of 17 points from local rivals Gala Wilton, and we wrapped up the double beating Rockleaze Rangers 3-0 in the Les James League Cup at Kingswood AFC. Promotion to the Hellenic League Div One West followed in the 2014/15 season, and suddenly after a terrific few seasons we were playing step 6 football for the first time in the clubs history. We started the season well and won 8 and drew 1 of our opening 9 games before our run ended with a bang at fellow title contenders Lydney Town (4-0). We had got ourselves into a three horse race for the title already though, with Lydney Town and Tuffley Rovers ready to do battle in an exciting title race. Off the field we were continuing to make improvements just in case we could achieve the unthinkable (a third successive title) and ensure we had everything in place for yet another promotion to the Hellenic Premier league. It was much closer than the previous season but the team managed to see off the threat of the rival two Gloucestershire clubs, the notable victory being a 2-1 away victory against Tuffley Rovers in front of almost 400 spectators, with an injury time winner!

We had done it, three successive titles, two successive promotions and we now find ourselves about to start a season as a step 5 football club, with midweek matches under floodlights to look forward to for the first time. We are excited to take on the challenge and very much looking forward to the 2015/16 season.

Old Football Revisited

(as first featured in Season 2013-14)

Inspired by the fantastic book "Got, Not Got" by Derrick Hammond and Gary Silke this Season's new feature looks at football related matters from the Editor's long lost youth that are no longer with us. Today it is.....

The Football Pink



I can remember when Saturday 6.00pm meant wandering over to the newsagents on the Poets Estate to wait with much excitement for the arrival of "The Pink". I would be there with the same old faces, a group of men and boys of all ages, awaiting the arrival of a van from the Adver. The van would arrive, the driver would bring in a bundle of newspapers tied with string, the newsagent would cut the string, often with haste, and the papers would literally fly off the counter. The same scene would have been played out in many newsagents across the Swindon area that night.

The Pink was published every Saturday, coming off the presses straight after the end of the games, all of which would have kicked off at 3pm.

It was the end product of an incredibly efficient operation given the technology of the day. On a good day it would be there spot on 6pm. Remember this was way before the era of the internet, mobile phones and other electronic ways of keeping in touch with football scores that we all take for granted today. In the days of the Pink all you had was either the tele-printer on BBC1 agonisingly tapping out the final scores or the scores on BBC radio's Sports Report at 5pm.

The front page of the Pink gave you a full blow by blow account of Swindon Town's game that day, phoned in from the ground, home or away, by the intrepid reporter. The descriptions of the goals scored were emphasised in heavy type. There were also round-ups of all the other Football League games that had been played, a report on the Reserves game plus also round-ups of a whole series of games played in the Wiltshire area. These would have been phoned in by dedicated followers of the teams in question, with Percy Stone probably being responsible for most of the reports on the games involving Wootton Bassett Town over the years.

Inside the paper was fantastic detailed coverage about local games played the previous week...Swindon and District League, Wiltshire League, Hellenic League and the big one for me The Borough League. I played for Highworth Town youths and when researching the history of Wootton Bassett Town FC found a few goals that I notched for Highworth in the Borough League. As well as reports on the games there were also all the league tables.

It was incredible value for money and one of the highlights of the week for the football fan in the days before the Sky Sports News, Soccer Saturday and the Internet.

Wiltshire Newspapers committed a heinous crime when the Pink was ended in 1978. It did, however, make a re-appearance in the 1990's, although it was not quite the same being produced on a Monday and did not last that long in its new form.

Whilst Swindon had its Pink, there were similar papers up and down the country, Green Un's, Blue Un's and Buffs, any colour as long as it was not white. All these football papers have now gone although the Norwich Pink 'Un and Ipswich Green 'Un do live on as website's. How ironic that the medium which was finally the cause of the death of many of the papers is now the home for the grandchildren of the Norfolk and Suffolk football papers.

For those of you who want to re-live those days of the Pink then I would suggest a visit to either the National Newspaper Library in London or Swindon library. The National Newspaper Library has a comprehensive collection of the Pinks going back to 1925. These are the actual newspapers themselves which are held in binders. Unfortunately you now have to order the papers 48 hours in advance as they have to be sent to London from Yorkshire following the closure of the old site at Colindale.

The Swindon library also has a few editions of the Pink but this is a very limited collection. I am told the only other complete collection of the newspapers, other than at the National Newspaper Museum, resides at the Adver offices but unfortunately these are not available to the public.

The Football Pink has been a major source of the information that is now recorded on the Club's website (results, league tables and goal scorers).

- Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Longlevens have met each other just 4 times with Bassett yet to register a win that counts. Longlevens have won 3 of the previous counters whilst the one game Bassett won earlier this season resulted in a 3 point deduction due to the playing of an ineligible player.
- The game earlier in the season saw a 4-1 win to Bassett thanks to goals from Lewis Thompson (2), Henry Spalding and Steve Robertson but the use of a late substitute from the Reserves who transpired had not been signed on UHlsport Hellenic League forms cost us the three points.
- The first meeting between the two sides came in the League Cup in Season 2014-15 when Longlevens were a Division One West side and they defeated us 3-2 at Cirencester.

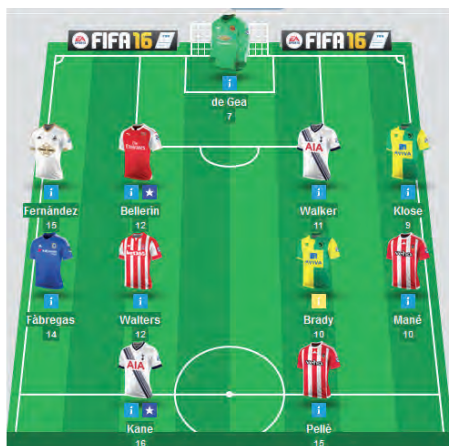

Late strike denies Bassett a share of the spoils

A tight game against Longlevens, which saw both teams reduced to ten men for the final half an hour, ended in defeat for Royal Wootton Bassett Town as Brad Martin netted a 90th minute winner for the Gloucestershire side.

Martin bundled the ball in at the back post for the Hellenic League Premier Division's sixth placed side after a free kick had been flicked over stand-in 'keeper Steve Yeardley and onto the frame of the goal.

Defeat was harsh on Bassett, who produced a solid performance and were certainly worthy of a point to build on three won last weekend against Oxford City Nomads.

There were certainly chances for the home team to grab a goal, but Longlevens, possessing one of the division's better defensive records were able to keep their sheets clean.

Within the game's first five minutes Dan Bailey got in behind the visitors' defence, finding himself one-on-one with Ollie Hall. With the 'keeper drawn off his line, Bailey went for a chip that wound up inches wide.

Dan Comer then skied a close range shot over after good combination play between Harvey Scholes and Steve Robertson resulted in the latter delivering a dangerous cross which fizzed across the six yard box.

Bassett were afforded a man advantage just before the hour when Dave Rich was harshly dismissed for a second yellow card.

Yet that lasted all of three minutes as 'keeper Curtis Meare picked up his second straight red card of the campaign when he handled outside of the area having instinctively sought to block a shot after a heavy touch presented Longlevens with possession inside the final third.

For third time this season Yardley donned the gloves. And he was immediately brought into action, saving the resulting free kick with his legs.

He wasn't much bothered after that as the two defences continued to control the game.

At the other end, there was one good opportunity for Robertson, his effort drawing a fine save from Hall.

Unfortunately for Bassett, the game did have a goal in it. Pretty Martin's strike may not have been, but arriving as the game approached its conclusion, it proved decisive.

The hosts did muster one final chance as they sought a quickfire equaliser. However, Dale Richards' bursting run and cross narrowly evaded Robertson, who was in a position to pounce.

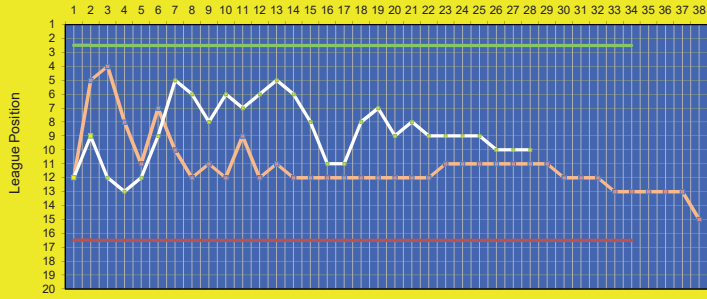

This will be his 5th season with Bassett with over 130 appearances having re-joined the Club from Shrivenham. Previously with Calne Town a player who gives 100% every game.



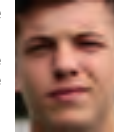
Dale Richards Defence

Hard working and talented midfield player in his third season with the club. Prior to this season had made 87 appearances scoring 10 times.



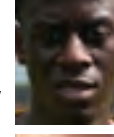
Scott Walduck Midfield

Steve Robertson Forward
Free scoring forward who re-joined the Club from Shrivenham in Season 2014-15. Top scorer last season with 30 goals from 38 appearances. Manager of the Swindon Town Ladies side.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35. Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II.



After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed.

The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 only to be immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 and promotion back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and in 1987-88 they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06. Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away.



















With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year groundshare with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year at Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and a record points total. Last season saw the club return home playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, Bassett finished 15th in the Premier Division. With some top summer signings the Club are looking for a much higher finish this season.



The table below shows the addresses of all the grounds we will be visiting this coming **2016-17** Season. This season we have 3 new teams in Burnham, Carterton and Henley. The table below includes the postcode to enter into your Sat Nav. A rough estimate of the distance from Royal Wootton Bassett is also shown. This season we have 74 less miles of travel in total (it could have been 164 more if North Greenford had come into the Hellenic and Cheltenham had not stayed down) but the average journey has increased by just over a mile.

Match Report

Failure to make extra man count proves costly New Gerard Buxton Ground, 11th February 2017

Royal Wootton Bassett Town were unable to take advantage of playing with an extra man for the final half hour of their clash against Ardley United as the Oxfordshire visitors eked out a 2-1 victory. Trailing by a goal, Rich Hunter's side were handed a huge boost early in the second period when Ardley centre half Joel Meade was dismissed for needlessly kicking out at Sam Packer after being fouled by the Bassett playmaker. However, within eight minutes of being reduced to ten men Ardley were able to double the lead and, although Steve Yeardeley pulled one back from the penalty spot, the hosts could not get back on level terms as they fell to their eighth home league defeat of the campaign. That poor home record could ultimately end up being the difference between a top and bottom half finish and, again, a blunt attack meant too much was asked of Bassett's defence leading to a familiar frustrating conclusion.

Ardley, riding high in sixth, were always going to be tough opponents. And they demonstrated their intent from the kick off as 'keeper Curtis Meare was the first Bassett player to touch the ball, doing brilliantly to repel Jack Ross' close range effort from Matt Cruse's cross after just forty seconds. Despite that great save, the danger wasn't averted, and it took a goalline block from Adam Corcoran to keep out Nathaniel Lewars' follow up. Lewars then steered narrowly wide from Declan Benjamin's delicate through ball as they continued to have the better of the opening exchanges.

There were chances for Bassett too though. Yet they lacked the same clinical edge posed by Ardley. After eighteen minutes, Lewis Thompson got in behind the visiting defence but stabbed wide from a tight angle. Then, just before the half hour mark, a well worked move from left to right eventually saw Corcoran square inside to Matt Cheetham, whose dipping shot from the edge of the area forced an awkward tip over the bar from Nick Bennion.

The breakthrough eventually came for Ardley in avoidable fashion. Corcoran's attempted pass back to Liam Edmondson was picked off and the best the centre half could do was foul on the edge of the box. Benjamin curled a terrific free kick over the wall which struck the left upright and the rebound fell for Ross who swept home. It should really have been worse for Bassett heading into the break as Ross somehow failed to guide Benjamin's low cross into an empty net from six yards out as he skewed his effort across the face of goal. That was a let off for Bassett's defence. But the failure to create at the other end meant they were under added pressure. Too often, a move going forward came to nothing as either the wrong pass was chosen or a failure to look across the line resulted in offside.

And when they did manage to get through, a lack of composure in front of goal let them down, as was the case on the hour when Packer's clipped through ball set Dale Richards free. Although the left winger had a trailing Chris Jackson breathing down his neck, he should have done better when he sought to slot past Bennion. Instead, a weak attempt was hacked away for a corner.

The dismissal of Meade did offer the possibility of changing the balance of play in Bassett's favour. And within three minutes of that occurring, a Lewis Thompson free kick from the right corner fell for Steve Olphert on the edge of the six yard box but the ball stuck in the midfielder's feet and before he could get a shot off a tackle was made.

Ardley quickly punished Bassett further. The ball was played into the feet of target man Troy Bryan on the edge of the area, and he slipped in Cruse, who coolly picked out the bottom left corner. The reaction from Bassett to going two down was prompt. Packer split the Ardley defence with a sublime pass, which Thompson raced onto before being hauled down in the box by Bradley Cox, who was lucky to escape with just a yellow card. From the spot, Yeardeley sent Bennion the wrong way.

However, with just fifteen minutes remaining, pulling back to level terms was going to be a difficult task. They had Meare to thank for ensuring the deficit remained a single goal as he pulled off a fabulous one-handed save to deny a Bryan effort headed for the top corner. Then, in the closing stages, Thompson did twice come close to restoring parity. With five minutes remaining he arrowed wide from the edge of the area. Moments later he swung in a low free kick from the right corner, which appeared to cross the line before Bennion got his hands on the ball to swat it away. Bassett appealed in vain to the officials, though they would have been best served thrashing the loose ball into the net as it squirmed across goal following Bennion's save.

It was not to be, and another fine Meare save spared them falling to a 3-1 defeat as the 'keeper tipped a powerful Benjamin drive over.

Man of the Match: Curtis Meare – there was little he could do to keep out either of Ardley's goals, but a trio of excellent saves helped keep Bassett in the game.

“On Saturday, I thought when it went 4-3: ‘Here we go again.’ We had some tired legs out there but I was pleased to see the boys close the game out.”

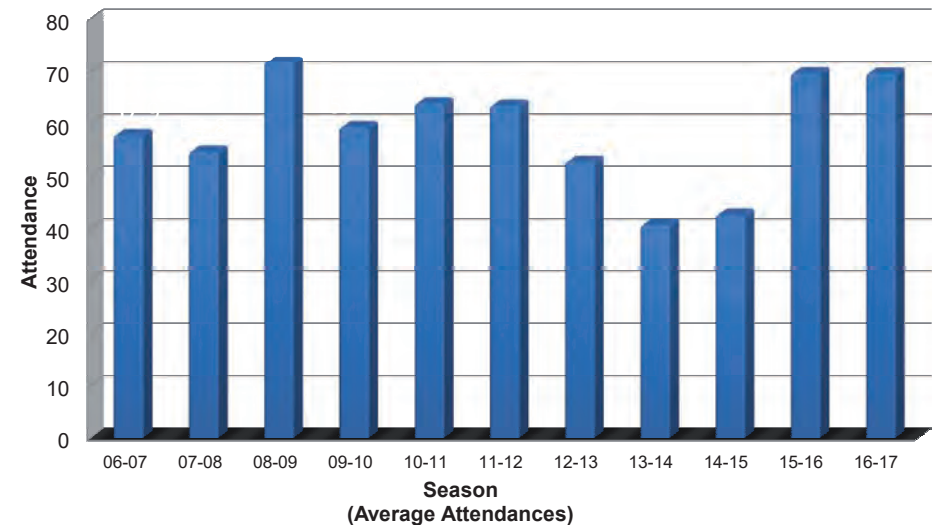
Wroughton returned to the top of the table on Saturday courtesy of a 3-1 victory over Corsham Town Reserves.

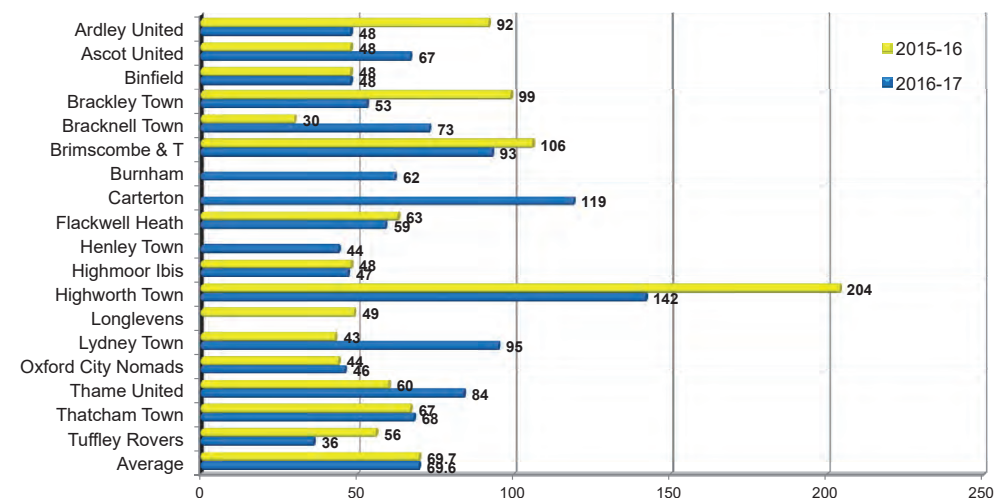
Mark Love’s men are a point clear of second placed Melksham Town Reserves, who beat Ludgershall Sports 3-2, while Shrewton slipped to third.

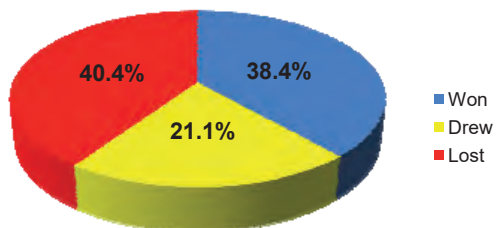

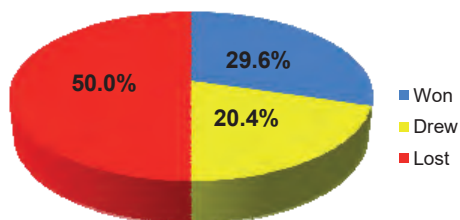

Pre-match v Binfield

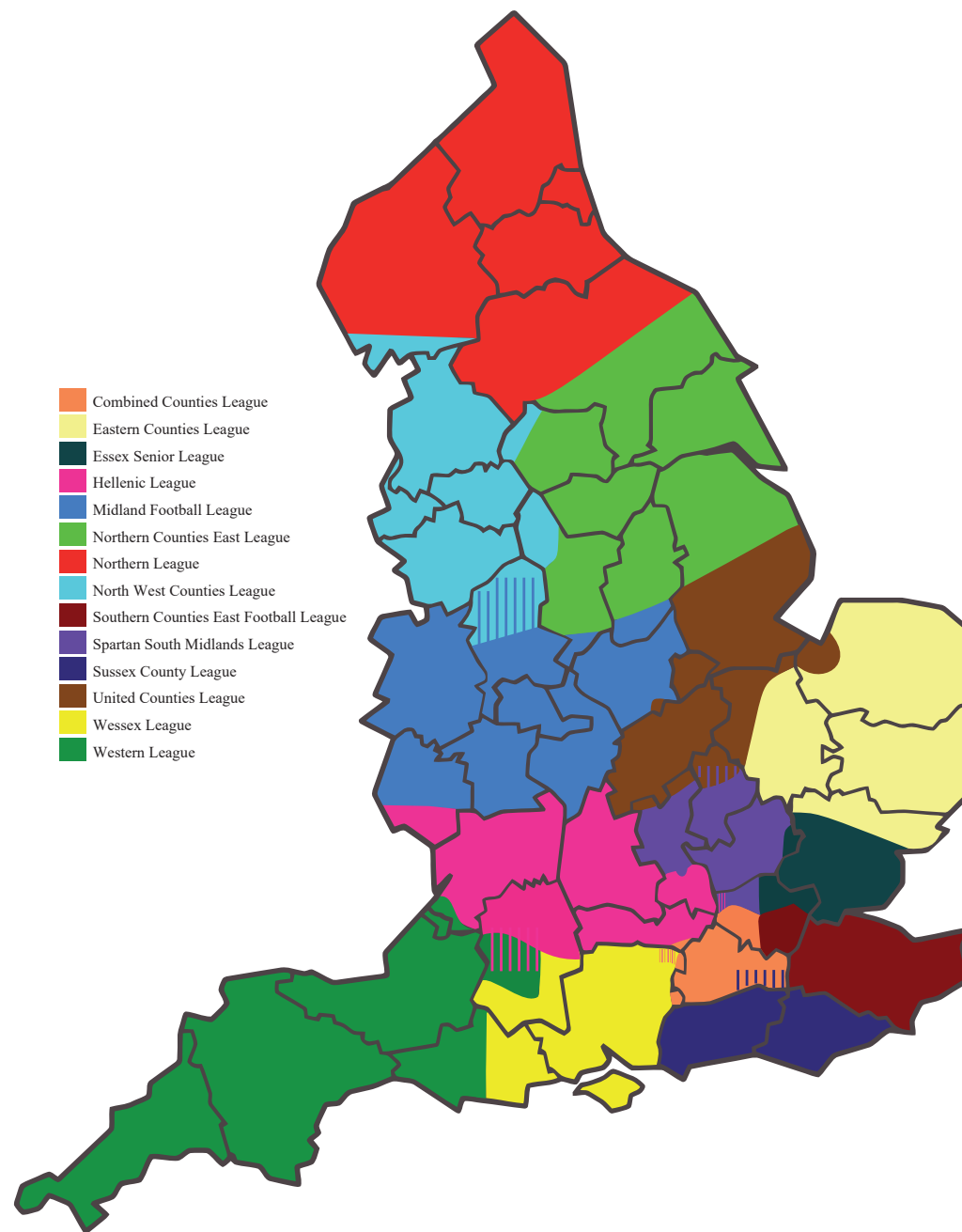

Quarter finalists dumped out in second round

Despite reaching the quarter finals, Royal Wootton Bassett Town were dumped out of the Floodlit Cup at the second round stage following a 2-1 defeat against Woodley United.

Having originally defeated Sandhurst Town and Lydney Town in the competition's second and third rounds, Rich Hunter's side were expecting to prepare for a trip to Bicester Town in the last eight.

However, as a result of what can only be described as an administrative farce, Bassett were forced to go back two rounds and play Woodley instead. And Reading-based side would end any hopes Bassett had of fighting for silverware this year.

To compound matters, the home side were reduced to ten men early on as 'keeper Curtis Meare was sent off for denying an obvious goalscoring opportunity.

His replacement, 16-year-old Conor Chivers, acquitted himself well on his first team debut, the Wiltshire Under 18s shotstopper making one particularly fine save. However, he could do little to deny Charlie Little's 32nd minute opener and Jake Nicholls' 52nd minute free kick.

Captain Matt Cheetham did equalise for Bassett in first half stoppage time. Yet, his team failed to create much else, disadvantaged as they were by playing shorthanded for the majority of the game.

How the game got to be played in the first place was ridiculous though.

Originally Woodley had defeated Sandhurst in the opening round - a game played back in early September. They were then deemed by the Hellenic League to have fielded an ineligible player, and so Sandhurst were re-instated.

As was their right, Woodley - who Bassett narrowly defeated in the Supplementary Cup two weeks ago - appealed that decision. The wheels of FA bureaucracy obviously had not been oiled though, as it was not until January when their appeal hearing was held with Woodley winning the case.

In the intervening period no further games impacted by the appeal should have been played given that their participants were going to be affected by its outcome.

Instead, the league allowed them to go ahead, with Bassett thumping Sandhurst 5-1 and edging out Lydney 2-0 after extra time.

Into the quarter finals they marched with a great opportunity to book a place in the final four of the Floodlit competition for the first time since the 2002-03 season.

Not so fast. Woodley should be wished the best of luck for the remainder of the Floodlit Cup, as they have been wronged in this situation too. Nonetheless, it's an episode that the Bassett players and management can rightly feel aggrieved about, and one which the Hellenic League should look back on with no feelings other than that of shame.

Opportunity missed

Stubs Hill, 18th February 2017

Having the chance to move back into the top half of the Hellenic League Premier Division failed to act as sufficient motivation for Royal Wootton Bassett as they were defeated 3-1 by Binfield.

Victory would have lifted Bassett above the Berkshire Moles by virtue of goal difference.

However, Bassett were outfought and ultimately well beaten with their performance leaving manager Rich Hunter scratching his head as to why his troops failed to summon the levels of desire and commitment demanded of them.

Jon Bennett opened the scoring for Binfield after just ten minutes.

Dan Bailey did pull Bassett level midway through the opening period.

Yet, the hosts got their noses in front again shortly after the restart courtesy of their leading scorer Liam Ferdinand.

Then, in the fifth minute of added time, Luke Hayden added the third.

It was a disappointing afternoon all round for Bassett as they failed to take advantage of Binfield defender Jack Broome being forced to play in goal for an extended period of the game after an injury to regular custodian Munoda Nyamunga.

Non-League Paper's Matt Badcock on fund raising for Jamie Mines

JAMIE MINES was a real fans' favourite for his goalscoring exploits at clubs like Frome Town, Larkhall Athletic, Paulton Rovers and Radstock Town. "In his early 20s he was quite direct – he wouldn't want me to say, 'greedy,'" says former team-mate and long-time friend Billy Wright. "At the age of 23 or 24 something clicked and he started banging in goals left, right and centre. At Larkhall he was very prolific and was a big part of some successful seasons.

"He was part of the Frome set-up and a fans' favourite as they went up through the leagues. He loves playing football. He's a very infectious character who loves the team spirit. We've got a very close-knit group of friends born from our football days 10-15 years ago. We used to all knock about in Sunday football when that was popular as well."

But this isn't just a happy story. Days before Christmas, around seven weeks ago, the 33-year-old, a scaffolder, was working at height in Swindon when he was severely electrocuted. Instead of spending his first Christmas with his five-month old twins Isabella and Savannah he was in an induced coma in hospital. His injuries so severe that both hands and one of his legs have been amputated. It's difficult to imagine how much his life has been changed forever in a single moment. The Football Family can sound a tired cliché at times. But it's in times such as this it rings true. And the sport is looking after one of its own. A Go Fund Me page set-up to raise money for Mines smashed the original target of £10,000. The next milestone of £20,000 was quickly surpassed with donations flooding in from all over the country. The running total is now at £88,600 – and it's not stopping there. Frome, Slough Town, Bath City, Warminster, Westbury United, Bradford Town, Larkhall, Shepton Mallett and Kettering Town have all held bucket collections. Former team-mate Matt Cooper raised £6,000 with a game in Australia. Wright played with Mines and his older brother Ben for years and is helping with the mammoth fundraising effort.

"It's amazing to see the football community pull together, hear about it and do something about it," Wright says. "Even though you don't play in the same team as somebody, it's that thought of loving the game so much and having it taken away from you in the blink of an eye."

Alan Shearer, Michael Owen, Burnley boss Sean Dyche, boxer Joe Calzaghe, writer Alastair Campbell and comedian Rob Brydon have all been in touch and recorded video messages of support. Mines is still in intensive care but he's making progress in what has been a very dire situation.

"He's definitely aware of all the support that's been coming in," Wright said. "It's a massive help to him so that's been positive. He's seen all the video messages that have come through and they've cheered him up."

On March 19, Frome Town will host a family fun day. Entry is free and 12 teams – drawn out of a hat by Arsenal greats Lee Dixon and David Seaman – will play for the Mines Cup. Frome Town legends – led by goal hero Mark Salter – are taking part, along with other teams from the clubs Mines played for or players he's played with. After the tournament, there will be an auction with some amazing lots on offer. Signed shirts from Newcastle United, Bristol City, Swindon Town and Burnley as well as an England shirt signed by Gazza, who has also sent a personal message to Mines. There's even an autographed Joe Montana NFL helmet, Bath rugby shirt, Ricky Hatton shorts, Chris Eubank Snr and Jnr boxing gloves, Fernando Alonso's steering wheel and Frome-born Jensen Button's signed BAR helmet. It's hoped the cash will keep pouring in to help Mines' future.

"The idea of the fund is to help with his rehabilitation," Wright said. "That's not cheap. There are programmes and places you can go to around the world for people who have lost limbs and the Army do lots of things too. This money will be used to help him get the best support and treatment possible. It will help him massively."

Premier Division

Andy Sandell's spot-kick six minutes from time saw Southern League Premier Division leaders Chippenham Town extend their unbeaten streak to 16 games with a 1-0 win at Stratford Town on Saturday.
