Welcome to Lydney Town

A warm welcome to Lydney Town for this Perpetuapress Floodlit Cup 3rd Round tie here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground. This is the first of two meetings between the two clubs here in Royal Wootton Bassett before the turn of the year with Lydney scheduled to return here on New Year's Eve for a league fixture. We hope all from Lydney enjoy their visit to the New Gerard Buxton Ground and we wish them a safe journey home.

Lydney have made it through to the 3rd Round having received a bye in Round One and then defeating Cirencester Town Development 3-2 on their own patch in Round Two to set up this tie. We also had a bye in Round One and made it through to this round courtesy of the 5-1 home win over Sandhurst Town. Last season Lydney made it through to the Quarter –Final stage where they lost 3-0 to Brimscombe & Thrupp. That run to the Quarter-Finals included a 3rd round tie against ourselves which Lydney won 2-1 at the New Gerard Buxton Ground. Hopefully lightning wont strike twice and we will be able to extract revenge for the defeat at the same stage last season.

The two sides have met once already in the league back in September when Lydney won by the odd goal in seven. Lewis Thompson, Dale Richards and Dan Bailey scored for us that night. Other than that encounter the two sides have met each other a further 14 times with Lydney having much the better of things, winning 10 games to just 3 for Bassett, 2 games having been drawn. To say Lydney are bit of a bogey side for us would not be an understatement. Two of those defeats came in cup matches which means our league record is a bit more respectable but at an average of just 0.85 league points per game our record against Lydney is the 7th worst of teams in this seasons Premier Division.

The two sides met for the first time back in 2006-7 when Lydney won both games against us by two goals to one, Nathan Hall and Chris Mills scoring our consolation goals. A Scott Ward goal gave us our first point against Lydney in Season 2008-09. The return game was lost 1-0. Our first win came in 2009-10 and it remains our best result ever against Lydney. Goals from Alex Green 2, Sam Collier, Ryan Thomas and Adam Field secured a 5-0 win for Bassett at Rylands Way. The points were shared in the return, Andy Brien and Sam Collier scoring in a 2-2 draw. Sam Collier was again on the score sheet the next time the two sides met in Season 2011-12, Ethan Delaney scoring a second in a 2-0 Bassett win. Lydney won 3-0 in the return at Rylands Way as they did the following season. Our last win against Lydney came back in February 2013 when three goals without reply from Mark Barnes, Liam Edmondson and Taylor Gill secured the three points. The last five games between the two sides have seen Lydney come out on top. That said Steve Robertson has a good scoring record against Lydney scoring in three of those defeats and hopefully he will be able to continue his fine run of form in front of goal here tonight. After two more on Saturday Steve now has 20 goals to hi stally and is on track to score even more than the 30 he got last season.

Lydney currently sit in 11th place with 26 points from their opening 18 league games, having won eight, lost eight and drawn two games.

Henley Town

Another good performance in the league saw us secure all three points comfortably on Saturday against a resolute Henley Town side. The 4-0 win was our 4th consecutive win in the league and we are now unbeaten in five league games. Hopefully we can transfer that fine league form into a cup performance here tonight having recently gone out of both the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup and the Wiltshire Senior Cup at the hands of Sandhurst Town and Bradford Town respectively. To be honest we could have won by a lot more on Saturday if we had taken all the chances we made and the defence rarely looked like conceding in a good all round performance which saw three youngsters introduced in the second half who all went forward at pace and caused the Henley defence all kinds of problems. deservedly was voted man-of-the match special mention to youngster George Lance who started the game, was excellent all game, and was only taken off after being injured by a late tackle. With these youngsters coming through it certainly bodes well for the future.

100 Club

I have an apology to make as I failed to publicise before today the achievement by 3 players who have joined the group of players who have now made more than 100 First Team appearances for the club. Take a bow Dale Richards, Sam Packer and Nathan Hawkins who join Steve Yeardley, Dan Bailey, Liam Edmondson and Adam Corcoran in having reached this milestone.

Reserves Team

The Reserves were without a game on Saturday but are in action again this coming Saturday when Corsham Town Reserves visit the New Gerard Buxton Ground.

Ladies Team

The Ladies side were also without a game this weekend as their scheduled opponents AEK Boco Development conceded their cup quarter-final tie. This means our Ladies side are through to the semi-finals were they are joined by a strong looking trio in St Nicholas Ladies Reserves, Almondsbury UWE and Forest of Dean Ladies. Full details of the Ladies Cup competition is included in tonight's programme for the first time this season.

Travel

Our visitors tonight Lydney Town have travelled 53 miles to be here tonight and whilst this may sound a lot this journey is the 4th shortest that Lydney have to make during the season. I recently did some analysis of the distances travelled by sides in the Premier Division and Lydney have the longest distance to travel of any club in the league with a grand total of 1,331 miles to all Uhlsport Hellenic League grounds, 2,662 for the round-trip to all the grounds. The only other side to travel more than 1,000 miles to get to their games is Tuffley Rovers. The two sides with the least travel to make are Oxford City Nomads (631 miles) and Henley Town (700 miles). The full table of distances (one-way) to the various grounds is shown to the right. Well done to Lydney for undertaking this travel to compete in the Uhlsport Hellenic League.

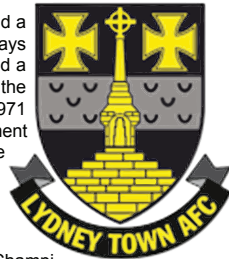

Opponents - History

Lydney Town FC • Club History

Although Lydney is one of the main towns of the Forest area the Severnsiders have always led a very nomadic existence. With the town very much a Rugby stronghold the football club has always found it difficult to exist and although the club can trace its roots back to 1911 it never has had a sound base. The club competed in the local leagues until 1952 when they were elected to the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League. In 1969 the club folded due to lack of committee. In 1971 the soccer lovers of the town pulled together and the club re-formed and in 1974 the appointment of Harold Elliott as player/coach saw many players from Lydney Juniors introduced with the resulting effect of promotion to Senior League Division One in 1976. During this period the club switched from Bathurst Park onto the Recreation Ground using the changing facilities at the Cricket Club.



In 1979-80 after twice finishing Runners-Up they finally lifted the Senior League Division One Championship. Applications to the County League were unfruitful so the club turned to the Hellenic League, where the club held its own, but after 4 seasons the huge financial burden of the League forced the club to return to the Senior League. A dispute with the Cricket Club saw the club move back onto Bathurst Park and following this Secretary Roger Sansom, who had been elected in 1975 and who is still secretary to this day, investigated the possibility of building a clubhouse on the Recreation Ground. Unfortunately on the pitch the downward spiral continued and the club found itself back in the NGL. The players thankfully stayed together and they bounced back into the Senior League the following season. Ambitious plans to have our own clubhouse were still in the pipeline and a clubhouse was opened on Lydney Recreation Trust in 1990. In 1995 the club did the double by winning Division Two and the Forest Green Supporters Trophy, a feat they repeated in 1996-97.

In 2003-04 Manager Peter Elliott, who along with Roger Sansom are the longest serving members of the club with 40 plus years service, guided the club to the Final of the League Cup and the Senior Amateur Cup but in 2004 due to work commitments Peter decided to step down. The club turned to Stuart Liddington to take the helm and with Peter being persuaded to assist him they forged a very successful partnership. The addition of Pete Macklin from Cinderford Town, Danny Clarke ex-Oxford United, Matthew Timmins from Whitecroft and the return of Mark Saunders from Australia gave the club a real boost. Pete, Danny and 'Matty' provided the missing link in the goalscoring department scoring over 70 goals between them, Danny leading the way with 32 goals. The Senior League title was secured with 4 games to go and they did the double by lifting the Senior Amateur Cup. The season was complete with the news of acceptance into the County League a prize denied to them some 25 years ago. The clubs County League campaign started in unconvincing fashion with only 4 points from 3 home games but a 20 game unbeaten run saw the club take over as league leaders at the start of 2006, a position they held for the remainder of the season. Scoring goals was very much the key to winning as 87 goals proved, 'Matty' Timmins finishing the leagues leading goal scorer with 28 goals. This success was beyond the clubs wildest dreams and gave the club the opportunity of a return to the Hellenic League after 22 years. A steady start saw the club 12 points behind the leaders in October but a 6 game winning streak at the end of the year saw the club take over as leaders at the start of January. The critical game came in mid-April with fellow title contenders Trowbridge Town visiting 'The Rec'. In front of a crowd of 305 goals from Danny Clarke and Mark Crabbe secured victory and a 5 point cushion. With 3 games to go the Title was won at Malmesbury when Danny Bishop came off the subs bench to score 2 late goals and give the club an unprecedented 3rd title in as many seasons. The squad had certainly exceeded all expectations and can quite easily be classed as the best in the clubs history. Ambitious plans for the required improvements to gain promotion were put forward and accepted by the League allowing the club to play at the highest level in its history.

A steady start was overshadowed by events off the pitch when despite gaining planning permission for erection of floodlights the club became embroiled in a sea of red tape with their landlords. To continue playing in the Premier Division an agreement was reached to use Cinderford Town and Harrow Hill for home games. Despite these off the pitch issues an unbeaten league run of 11 games placed them in the top half of the table. Despite finishing in 10th position the club were unable to satisfy the April deadline imposed by the league and were forced to be relegated back into Division One (West).

With relegation came the inevitable loss of players who wished to play at a higher level of football and the club decided to pin its future hopes on the youth of the town. Mark Lee, who joined the club 8 years ago from County League side Ellwood, took on the role of Player/Manager and despite a tough baptism over the last he is 6th year in charge. The club finished runners-up to Tytherington Rocks in 2014-15 but despite finishing in a promotion position ground development had not been completed by the March 31st deadline and a further season in Division One followed.

Determined that such a situation would not happen again further development work followed to ensure the necessary G grading but disappointingly after all the clubs efforts the club finished in third spot which would not necessarily ensure promotion. As luck would have it circumstances led to the club being offered a place in the Premier Division which they readily accepted but this again meant further development was needed to obtain an F Grading. On the pitch the team held their own in the Premier despite long term injuries to key players Pat Gibbs, Jamie Addis & Jarred Liddington finishing in a respectable 12th position and with the installation of a 2nd stand the club successfully received an F Grade ensuring that they will compete in the Premier Division for the 2016-17 season.

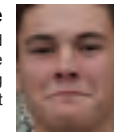
Josh Davis Defence

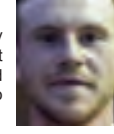
Kerry Hale Midfield

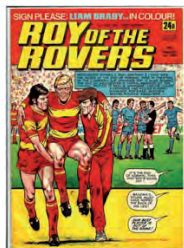


Old Football Revisited

(as first featured in Season 2013-14)

Inspired by the fantastic books "Got, Not Got" and "The Lost World of Football" by Derrick Hammond and Gary Silke this Season's new feature looks at football related matters from the Editor's long lost youth that are no longer with us. Today it is.....

Roy of the Rovers



In the 1970's the one comic that any true football loving kid had to have was Roy of the Rovers, starring the one and only Roy Race. Roy started life as a Melchester Rovers football player in a weekly feature in the Tiger comic in 1954. Roy was so popular that 22 years later he got his own publication which lasted until 1993. With the notable exception of players like Ryan Giggs, few players show the kind of loyalty exhibited by Roy who signed with boyhood club Melchester Rovers in 1954 as a 14-year old and didn't retire from playing until 1993 (only Tony Vines comes close). In 1983 he had his one stint away from the club when he played 21 games for Walford Rovers – scoring 45 goals – but couldn't stay away and returned to Melchester within the year.

Roy was the main feature in the comic but there were other football stories such as Billy's Boots (think Shaun Terry becoming a better player because he borrows his Dad Dave's boots) and Hotshot Hamish amongst others. In total the Roy of the Rovers ran for 851 issues.

At the peak of the comic's success about 450,000 copies were sold each week. There were also hardback annuals.

For a brief period, starting in 1986, before Eddy Shah thought about building golf courses in Wootton Bassett he deemed it a good idea to include Roy of the Rovers in his newly launched Today newspaper to help sales. These were all-new strips, focusing largely on the relationship between Roy and his wife Penny, rather than the action on the pitch. Following the closure of the weekly title in 1993, Roy appeared in a re-launched monthly publication in September that year, with grittier storylines intended to attract teen and young adult fans who had read the weekly comic in their youth. In the monthly comic focus switched to Roy's son, Rocky, who also played for Melchester. Between January 1994 and January 1995, the monthly strips were mirrored by a weekly edition in Shoot magazine.

The comic strip was resurrected in July 1997, printed as short features in the BBC's monthly Match of the Day magazine. Father and son Race were reunited as manager and player respectively at Melchester. These strips ran until the magazine's demise in May 2001. By then the strip's wholesome tone, often espousing the virtues of fair play and strong moral character, was beginning to seem old-fashioned as the Premier League became more cosmopolitan and out of touch with the lives of the ordinary supporter.

In the comics glory years, to keep the stories exciting, Melchester was almost every season either competing for major honours or struggling against relegation to a lower division. The strip followed the structure of the football season, thus there were several months each year when there was no football. By far the most common summer storyline saw Melchester touring a fictional country in an exotic part of the world, often South America, where they would invariably be kidnapped and held to ransom.



Interesting to note that in the Premier League, the average Golden Boot winner scores 24 goals in 35 games, a strike rate of 0.69. In total, the prolific Roy Race bagged 533 goals in 565 games for club and country, an astonishing strike rate of 0.94. For Wootton Bassett only Steve Robertson comes close. With sex-scandals and extra-marital affairs being as much a part of modern footballers lives players these days would do well to follow the example set by Roy who married his childhood sweetheart Penny Laine at the end of the 1976 season. They had three kids together before breaking up in the early Eighties. In that time though, Roy remained faithful to Penny.

In 1981, Roy was shot by out-of-work actor Elton Blake and left in a coma. With Alf Ramsey in temporary charge of Melchester Rovers, hospital staff decided to play him commentary of their game with Keysborough. Miraculously, the commentary helped Roy come out of his

coma and when that news was relayed to his team-mates, they were so overjoyed they went on the break the league goal-scoring record by winning 14-0.

These days, modern players moan about a lack of protection from the referees but they never suffered from the hardship poor old Roy Race did. In his career, he was kidnapped at least half-a-dozen times, shot, bombed and saw his home ground destroyed by an earthquake. Despite all this tragedy, Roy still picked up 10 league titles, 9 FA Cups and three European Cups. In the end his highly successful career was brought to an end by off the field tragedy. In his 50's he was still going strong but on a scouting mission in 1993 he lost control of his own helicopter and lost his iconic left foot as a result of the crash

With the likes of Wayne Rooney unhappy at being played out of position at Manchester United, he would do well to follow Roy's lead and do whatever his manager asks him to do. To this day, Roy Race is still the only player to score a hat-trick in a cup final and go in goal and save a penalty in the last minute! The stock media phrase "real 'Roy of the Rovers' stuff" is often used by football writers, commentators and fans when describing displays of great skill, or results that go against the odds, in reference to the dramatic storylines that were Roy of the Rovers trademark.

Old fans maybe interested to know that old comics and annuals can still be bought on e-bay and Roy of the Rovers lives on with his own Facebook and Twitter pages!

- Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Lydney Town have met each other 15 times with Lydney having much the better of things, winning 10 games to just 3 for Bassett, 2 games having been drawn.
- To say Lydney are bit of a bogey side for us would not be an understatement. Two of those defeats came in cup matches which means our league record is a bit more respectable but at an average of just 0.85 league points per game our record against Lydney is the 7th worst of teams in this seasons Premier Division.
- The two sides met for the first time back in 2006-7 when Lydney won both games against us by two goals to one, Nathan Hall and Chris Mills scoring our consolation goals. A Scott Ward goal gave us our first point against Lydney in Season 2008-09. The return game was lost 1-0.
- Our first win came in 2009-10 and it remains our best result ever against Lydney. Goals from Alex Green 2, Sam Collier, Ryan Thomas and Adam Field secured a 5-0 win for Bassett at Rylands Way. The points were shared in the return, Andy Brien and Sam Collier scoring in a 2-2 draw.
- Sam Collier was again on the score sheet the next time the two sides met in Season 2011-12, Ethan Delaney scoring a second in a 2-0 Bassett win. Lydney won 3-0 in the return at Rylands Way as they did the following season.
- Our last win against Lydney came back in February 2013 when three goals without reply from Mark Barnes, Liam Edmondson and Taylor Gill secured the three points.
- The last five games between the two sides have seen Lydney come out on top. That said Steve Robertson has a good scoring record against Lydney scoring in three of those defeats.

Lydney Town 4 Royal Wootton Bassett 3 (Home team report)

Once again the fixture with Royal Wootton Bassett produced another goal fest down The Rec.

Lydney have beaten their opponents on the last 4 occasions and there has always been a flood of goals.

Ryan Pendry started in place of Mason Lewis and the bench was made up of Pat Gibbs, Josh Davis, Tom Baldwin, Tom Maxted and Tom Shaw.

The game was only 4 minutes old when Lydney went in front. Declan Morley-Lyne broke into the box and squared for Niall Halford to slide a shot inside the far post. Lydney's front two were causing major problems for the Bassett defence and Town scored another on 10 minutes. Morley-Lyne's corner was challenged for by Halford and the ball fell for Kerry Hale to play in Lewis Halford who smacked home through a crowd of players.

More was to follow, Niall Halford was brought down on the edge of the box 16 minutes in and Morley-Lyne found the bottom corner with the free kick to put Town 3-0 up.

Most sides would have caved in following this but Wootton Bassett were having none of it. Their slick pacey passing made them a dangerous side going forward, Dale Richards and Dan Bailey in particular causing scares in Town's back four. Bailey had handed Lydney a warning when first he headed over close in and then hammered a drive just over the top on the half hour mark. Five minutes later he went one better. When the ball was played across the goal Bailey smashed a superb drive that flew into the top corner.

Lydney responded and should have put the game to bed. Twice strikers Halford and Morley-Lyne had chances to add to their tally but a combination of good goalkeeping from Curtis Meare and poor finishing kept the visitors in it. They reduced the arrears once again a minute before the break. Henry Spalding made a break down the left and his cross was knocked back across goal by Town defender Ryan Pendry where Lewis Thompson was on the spot to tap home. 3-2 at the break.

The goal changed the halftime team talk and Bassett came at Lydney straight from the restart. It was Thompson again who probably should have scored in their first attack but his effort sailed wide.

Lydney lost the influential Pete Macklin only 3 minutes into the half with a hamstring pull. Pat Gibbs was sent on up front with Niall Halford dropping into the back four. Spalding tested Thomas from the edge of the box before Lydney hit a superb 4th goal.

When an attack was cleared by keeper Meare the ball fell to Lewis Halford just inside his own half. Town's man of the match hit a superb half volley straight back over the keeper's head and it dropped just underneath the bar to give Lydney the 2 goal cushion once again.

Lydney lost skipper Jamie Addis to a red card with 25 minutes left. The midfielder was scrapping for a loose ball when Referee Staten ruled he had stamped on a defender. Rather harsh to say the least. Bassett pushed on with the extra man and pulled another back on 72 minutes. Dale Richards scoring from close in.

Tom Maxted and Tom Shaw replaced Lewis Halford and Ryan Pendry 2 minutes later and Town got back on track. Morley-Lyne hammered a shot against the upright, while at the other end Matt Cheetham shot wide when well placed. Some resolute defending from Town saw them close the game out and hold on for 3 hard earned points.



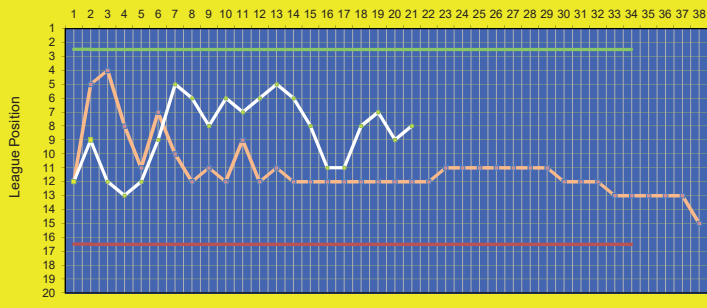

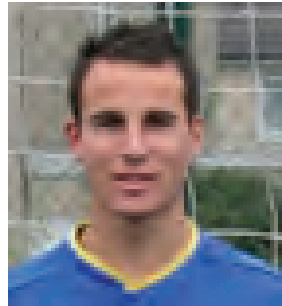

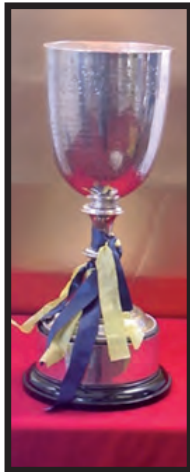

This will be his 5th season with Bassett with over 130 appearances having re-joined the Club from Shrivernham. Previously with Calne Town a player who gives 100% every game.



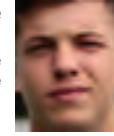
Dale Richards Defence

Hard working and talented midfield player in his third season with the club. Prior to this season had made 87 appearances scoring 10 times.



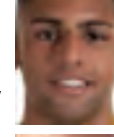
Scott Walduck Midfield

Steve Robertson Forward
Free scoring forward who re-joined the Club from Shrivernham in Season 2014-15. Top scorer last season with 30 goals from 38 appearances. Manager of the Swindon Town Ladies side.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35. Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II.



After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed.

The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 only to be immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 and promotion back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and in 1987-88 they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06. Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away.


















With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year groundshare with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year at Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and a record points total. Last season saw the club return home playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, Bassett finished 15th in the Premier Division. With some top summer signings the Club are looking for a much higher finish this season.













The table below shows the addresses of all the grounds we will be visiting this coming **2016-17** Season. This season we have 3 new teams in Burnham, Carterton and Henley. The table below includes the postcode to enter into your Sat Nav. A rough estimate of the distance from Royal Wootton Bassett is also shown. This season we have 74 less miles of travel in total (it could have been 164 more if North Greenford had come into the Hellenic and Cheltenham had not stayed down) but the average journey has increased by just over a mile.

Total away travel = **1,732** miles (2015-16: 1,806 miles)

Match Reports

League roll continues

New Gerard Buxton Ground, 10th December 2016

Royal Wootton Bassett Town enjoyed a rather comfortable afternoon as they recorded their fourth straight league victory with a stylish 4-0 triumph against Henley Town. Rich Hunter's team's attacking football was as slick as the damp Gerard Buxton Sports Ground pitch and, after going into half time with a slender advantage despite controlling proceedings, they swept aside their Oxfordshire opponents in the second period. Sam Packer, playing the majority of the game in his favoured number ten role, was in particularly devilish form. More or less unplayable, Henley had no answer to the Bassett playmaker, who must have had a role in close to a dozen of the chances the hosts created. He played a key role in the game's opener on nineteen minutes, perfectly weighting a return pass to set free right winger Dan Bailey, who cut the ball back from the by-line for Steve Robertson to provide an emphatic finish into the top right corner. That goal had followed a somewhat nervous start, punctuated by a third minute opportunity which fell to Henley's Chris Hood after a poor touch from Steve Yeardley inside his own penalty area. However, Hood's snap shot was fortunately turned around the post by a fast reacting Curtis Meare. Once they were ahead though, Bassett were in control. Packer came close to doubling the lead moments after Robertson had struck, hammering a 20-yard shot from the right edge of the area narrowly past the opposite post. Adam Corcoran's far post header from Dale Richards' corner then appeared to be destined for the back of the net, yet was deflected wide. On 33 minutes, Packer, aided by a slip from his marker Mitch Cooper, raced onto Corcoran's clipped ball over the top and found himself with only 'keeper Matthew Hill to beat. Opting to attempt a lob from just outside the area, rather than advance on goal, he again was a matter of inches away from taking his tally of goals for the season to four. Not that he let the frustration of failing to register a goal affect his performance. He continued to be at heart of Bassett's forays forward. His cut back and Robertson's deft touch on the edge of the area set Bailey in with seven minutes to go until the break, but no goal was forthcoming as Hill raced off his line to take the ball away from Bailey's feet. Packer's through ball then set an overlapping Bailey in on goal. Again the winger was thwarted by Hill though as the 'keeper parried his low effort from a tight angle across the face of goal.

Bassett's half time lead should really have been more. But they quickly established a more comfortable advantage after half time. Yeardley played a brilliant pass to Packer in the right corner, and his cross into the danger area just evaded Robertson. The Bassett forward was quickly able to jump on the loose ball, steering in cross from the left edge, which Dale Richard guided home with a header from ten yards. Chances kept coming Bassett's way. After racing onto a Robertson's through ball, Packer unselfishly sought to play a square pass back when in on goal, but the forward could only snatch at his effort affording Hill a relatively comfortable save. Richards soon nearly had a second when his stooping header from Bailey's corner wasn't gathered clearly by the Henley stopper. However, Hill was able to dive on the ball just as it appeared set to roll over the line. The game was eventually killed off with twenty minutes remaining. Substitute Kias Bonner-Shaw cut inside from the right and saw a shot from a tight angle blocked. The rebound fell to Robertson who was never going to miss. It was quickly four as Ryan Withers, another substitute who injected dangerous pace, raced clear before coolly picking out the bottom corner when one-on-one. Moving the ball around at will, Bassett were in full control. And come full time it could well have been six or seven. Indeed, Robertson should probably have at least completed his hat-trick. He saw a close-range strike from Bonner-Shaw's cutback swatted away before then failing to get a toe on the end of the same player's low fizzing cross. Finally, with two minutes remaining he put a shot from an angle across the face of goal after latching onto Packer's superb defence splitting pass which had been played with the outside of his right boot.

Man of the Match: Sam Packer – Henley had no answers for the playmaker, as he constantly found a way in behind their backline. It was probably a welcome relief for the visitors when Packer dropped into a deeper role late in the game.

FAIRFORD Town manager Gareth Davies found it difficult to take comfort from putting 17 goals past struggling Cheltenham Saracens on Saturday. “We’ve ambled around mid-table for the last few seasons and we want to be up there and challenging for trophies but we’re under no illusions that it will be tough.

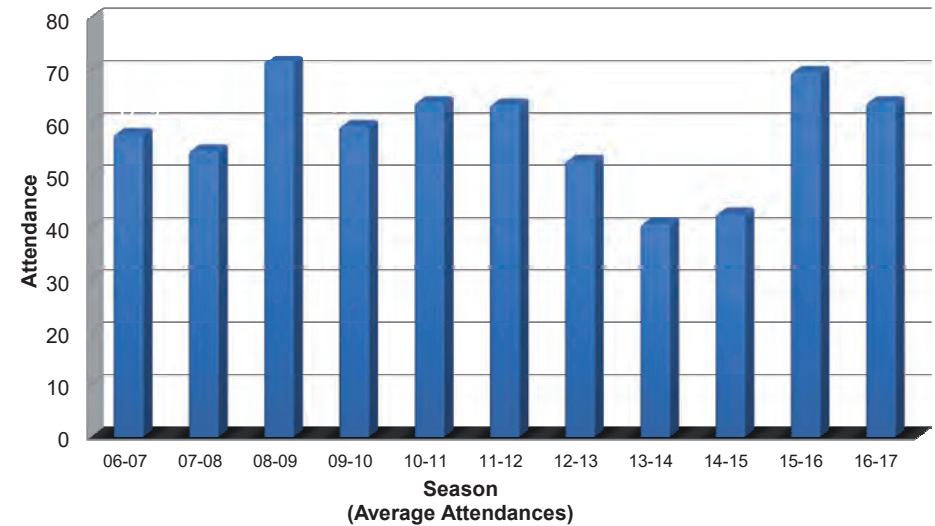
“There’s nothing won yet, I’ve been around local football long enough, and there are some tough teams in this league like Marlborough and Melksham.

“There’s still a massive amount of work to do and this result is just one step closer to getting to what we want to achieve.”

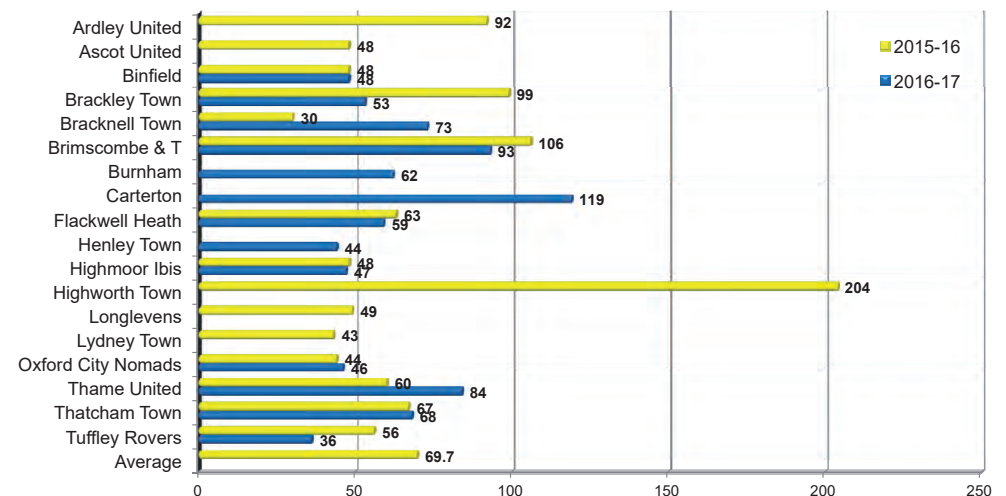

WBTFC Attendances - Season 2016-17 (and comparison to 2015-16)



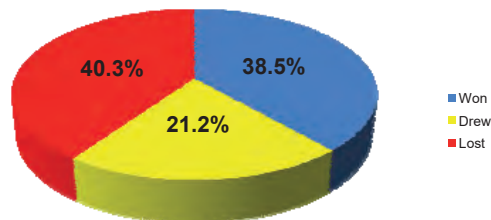

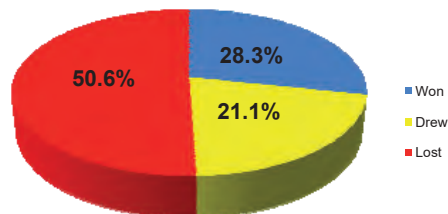

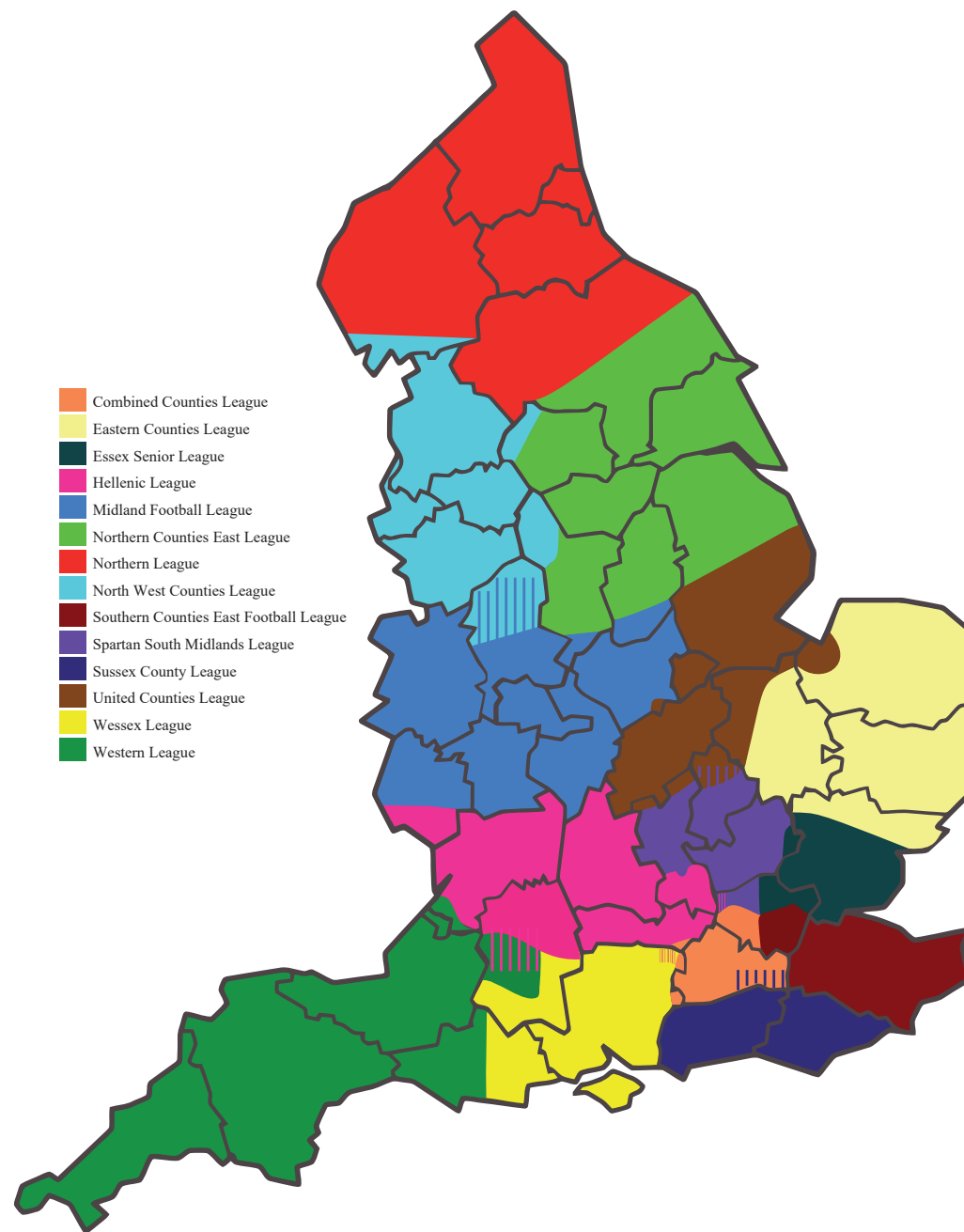

Friend of the paper Tony Incenzo has a bee in his bonnet. After years of journeying around the grounds for work and for pleasure, TalkSPORT's best known traveller has finally snapped with the cruel mistress than is Mother Nature.

He's had enough of games being called off at short notice and fans suffering after being left out of pocket because of our wild winters – and he's come up with an idea to get to the bottom of it.

Now let's put our cards of the table here for a moment. Tony's crusade is not just a moral pilgrimage. His angst is born out of a wasted afternoon even the most stone-hearted Fulham or Chelsea fans wouldn't have wished on our QPR-obsessed explorer.

Setting off on a near 400 mile trip from his London home to the Rhondda Valleys last weekend, Incenzo had his heart set on ticking off another far flung ground.

The Welsh Cup tie between Ton Pentre and Bangor City caught his gaze – but he was soon in the eye of a snow storm.

Soon after his arrival following hours on the road, the game was postponed an hour before kick-off because of a heavy overnight front.

Unsurprisingly, a good look around and a warm cup of tea couldn't remove the dark cloud hanging over his head. He's got over 2,000 grounds chalked off, but sadly this was a totally wasted trip.

As we all know, for Groundhoppers to tick a club off their list they have to have seen a full 90 minutes. He's required by strict Hopper law to return to south Wales before hanging up his pen and notepad.

Tony's cogs was clearly turning on his four-hour trip home. Just what can we do to avoid these late-in-the-day annoyances?

He says that if the conditions prompt cause for concern, there must be an inspection before away clubs set off. If there's any doubt – call the game off there and there.

Inenzo reckons from then on, there's to be no postponement unless there's a complete deterioration in the conditions.

Stourbridge fans will probably agree. Losing their FA Cup tie with Northampton last Sunday with many of the supporters already in the ground – was that pitch any less playable at 2.30pm than it was at midday?

In reality, there's precious little Non-League clubs can do about a frozen pitch. But the calls for a quick decision and to give the game the best chance possible should be listen to.
