Editorial & RWBTFC News

Welcome to Woodley United

Welcome to Woodley United for this Pepetuapress Floodlit Cup fixture here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground. This is the second meeting between the two clubs in the space of a couple of weeks after the sides met in the Supplementary Cup, Bassett needing extra-time to defeat our visitors from Division one East in that one. As we found out in that game Woodley are a very good side and another tough game is in prospect tonight. Once again it was Steve Robertson who scored our goals in the first meeting between the two sides taking his total for the season to 26.

Those who bought the programme on Saturday will know from the editorial for the Ascot game about the circumstances as to why tonight we are playing a Second Round tie here tonight having already won in both the Second Round and Third Rounds already this season. This follows the FA having upheld at the end of January an appeal by Woodley Town against their expulsion from this Floodlit competition for a game played way back on 6th September 2016, I repeat a game played on 6th September 2016! As I said on Saturday Woodley clearly had every right to appeal a decision about an ineligible player charge and there should be no ill feeling towards them in this matter but again why on earth did the football authorities responsible for dealing with the appeal not deal with it earlier? It is ridiculous that we have the situation where the decision comes out in the last week of January 2017, over 4 months since the original game. In the intervening period we played the side who were relieved, Sandhurst Town, winning the right to play Lydney Town in the Third Round, a game we also played and won. We thought that this meant we would now play Bicester Town in the quarter-finals of the competition but no these two games are now null and void and we have to play Woodley Town to win the right to try and play Bicester Town. This is a slight change from what I wrote on Saturday as I understand that if we win tonight we will not have to play Lydney again but should Woodley defeat us tonight they will have to play Lydney. Not sure how that works but it is something of a recognition that we have already beaten Lydney in the competition and I understand Lydney are comfortable with that situation. In the meantime I hope we will continue to pursue expenses for the Sandhurst game. As I said on Saturday why the FA could not have heard the matter earlier escapes me and in my view is very disrespectful to the UHlsport Hellenic League and the sponsors of the Floodlit Cup who see their competition descend into a bit of a farce. I repeat again what I said on Saturday, if this matter had involved either of the FA's own competitions, in the shape of the FA Cup or FA Vase, they would not have delayed matters for so long.

Woodley currently sit in 3rd place in Division one East with 30 points from their opening 13 league games, having won 10 and lost 3 with no drawn games. With Woodley sharing the Rivermoor as tenants of Highmoor Ibis and will be in a position to achieve promotion should they finish in a promotion place given Highmoor are already a Premier team.

Ascot United

Saturday saw us pick up a point following the 0-0 draw with Ascot United. Whilst there were no goals it was quite an entertaining game between two sides fielding a number of youngsters and it is pleasing to report played in a good spirit after the feisty first encounter between the two sides at the beginning of January. In a game of limited chances both sides had the opportunity to take all three points but at the end I feel that a draw was probably a fair result.

As expected having suffered the departure of their manager Ascot fielded a completely different side to the one we had met in January, fielding a side which I understand from their Committee members had mainly come up through their youth section, more of which we should be doing in my opinion. At the moment I am struggling to see how our Reserves side are helping the Club in terms of player development when I hear that the current keeper from the Wiltshire Youth side is being overlooked for someone who is unlikely ever to be given the chance to play for the First Team. It is not as if the Reserves are in with a chance of winning the league and we should be looking towards the future and bleeding more of the Under 18's in my view. I accept that the Reserves contain a number of Bassett lads who have been very loyal to the club over the years and we should reward this loyalty but perhaps the answer is to bring back the popular adult Sunday side in the Swindon Sunday League to give these players an adult game, just a thought for the Committee as they look at this for next season. On Saturday the Reserves lost 4-2 at Calne Town, our consolation goals coming from Rich Clark and Jack Sanderson.

Uhsport Hellenic League Premier Division

Whilst we were picking up a point against Ascot elsewhere in the Premier Division Flackwell Heath cut Bracknell's lead at the top of the table to just 2 points thanks to a 3-2 home win over Lydney Town. On target for Flackwell were James Trip, Dan Ballis and Tom Wooliment, whilst the prolific Declan Morley-Lyne bagged another two goals for visitors Lydney. Ardley had an excellent 1-0 win over Thatcham Town, a dramatic 90th minute winner from Matthew Cruise giving Ardley all 3 points. I am sure that our friends from Thatcham were moaning about that one all the way back home after that result. Binfield were comfortable 5-0 home winners over Longlevens. The goals at Stubbs lane came from Jeff Brown, Jon Bennett, Sean Moore, Liam Ferdinand and an own goal. With Thatcham losing Highworth Town took advantage and moved above them in the table into 4th spot courtesy of a 3-1 win. Aysa Corrick was once again amongst the goals with Jon Davoille and Chris Taylor also scoring for Highworth. The other game in the division saw Thame United and Brimscombe share 4 goals and the points, Ollie Pitt and Jack Smith giving Brimscombe a 2-0 half-time lead but two from Andy Gledhill gave Thame a share of the points, although the slipped one place in the table as a result of Flackwell's win.

FA Vase Quarter-Final Draw

The FA Vase has reached the Quarter-Final stage with the draw made last Monday. Western league Buckland Athletic will travel to Step 6 side Bromsgrove Sporting from the Midland League. South Shields from the Northern League will be at home to United Counties League side Newport Pagnell Town. Another Step 6 side Southall from the Spartan South Midlands League will play host to Cleethorpes Town league leaders in the Northern Counties East Premier Division. The final tie sees an all Midlands League Premier Division clash with Coleshill Town (currently in 3rd place) playing host to Sporting Khalsa (5th). Unfortunately there is no Uhsport Hellenic League representation in the quarter-finals this season.

Host families sought for FC 's-Gravenzande visit

The requirements are minimal - the club is asking for families to provide bed and breakfast for three nights as well as a packed lunch on each day of their visit. These trips are always special occasions for those who take part, and as a club we are certain we can count on our many members to ensure that our visitors can all be hosted and they leave with a wonderful impression of our club and country. Opponents - History

Woodley United • Club History

Woodley United FC was formed in 2011 as a result of four Woodley based football clubs and Berks & Bucks FA recognising that the provision of women's and girls' football in the town would be better provided by one club dedicated to this purpose rather than the existing clubs each having one female team to satisfy FA Charter Standard needs but no player progression policy.



During its time as a female club, Woodley United FC saw success on and off the pitch. This included coaching in schools, supporting the Woodley Community Carnival inter school tournaments, being presented the Wokingham Borough Sports Council annual award for Service to Sport in and the Community in 2014, winning four Berks & Bucks FA County cups and the Southern Region Women's Football League league cup.

Such were the benefits of working together that two of the town's oldest clubs, Woodley Town FC and Woodley Hammers FC in conjunction with Woodley United FC saw greater opportunities for the provision of local football if the clubs were to amalgamate. As such a "One Woodley" steering group was created in April 2014 and has overseen proceedings so that from 2015 – 16 the three clubs have been playing under the Woodley United FC name and is one of the biggest clubs in the county with approximately thirty youth and adult teams for male and female players together with a thriving mini kickers pre-school section.

The objective of the club is to "offer everyone in our community the opportunity to play, develop and grow through football, regardless of race, gender, age or ability" and in so doing provide community based football that is the envy of the footballing world." To help with this objective the club is a FA Charter Standard Community Club.

Considerable interest in the project resulted in BBC Radio 5 Live running an article on it for their Non-League Show while The FA's National Clubs' Manager Mick Backie has stated "The vision, ambition and purpose of the One Woodley project is an inspirational football model that places the players and its community at its core."

The benefits of working together are already being seen with the support the club has been able to give to Reading University with the building of their new sports pavilion in at the Bulmershe, Woodley campus, which is available for use by club players, and to Woodley Town Council in their application to the Football Foundation for a new 3G 9v9 pitch that was completed completed in June 2016.

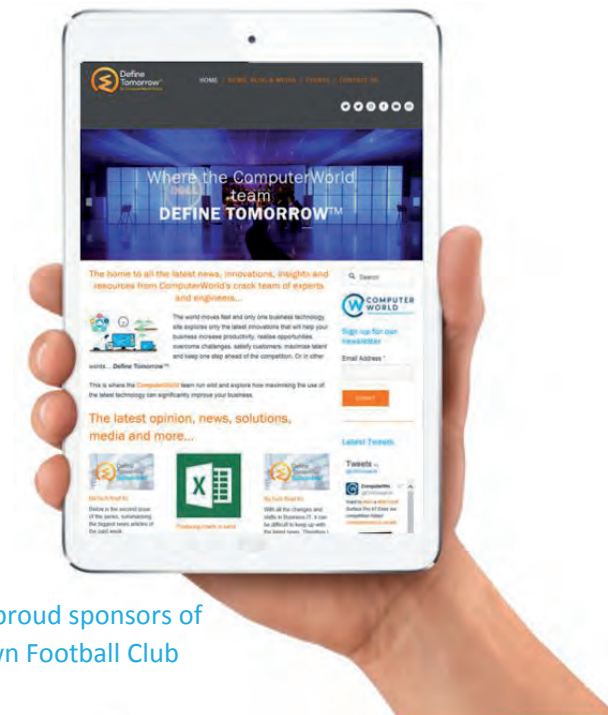

Midfield

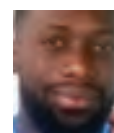
Jake is a very skilled midfielder who loves to get on the ball and dictate play. Former Camberley player who is the real heartbeat of this side. Jake is also joint captain.

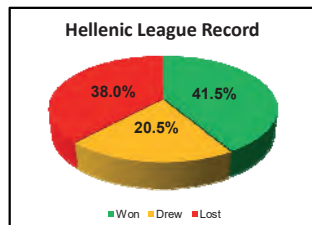
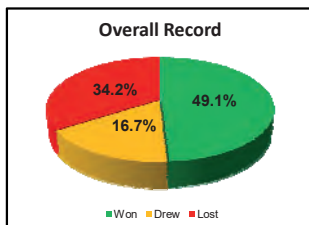

Old Football Revisited

(as first featured in Season 2013-14)

Inspired by the fantastic books "Got, Not Got" and "The Lost World of Football" by Derrick Hammond and Gary Silke this Season's new feature looks at football related matters from the Editor's long lost youth that are no longer with us. Today.....

GOAL Magazine



Before Shoot magazine came along I can remember that as a young kid I used to get my football magazine fix from the wonderful publication called GOAL. GOAL began its life on 16th August, 1968. Published by Longacre Press, an arm of the mighty IPC Magazines, the magazine cost 1s 6d and for this, you got 48 pages full of features and photographs, both colour and black and white.

Many aspects of the magazine stayed unchanged (or changed only slightly) for the whole of the magazine's life. The big player attraction was Manchester United and England's Bobby Charlton's diary which lasted through 260 issues and only finished when Bobby took on the manager job at Preston North End (although he probably wished he had stayed writing for GOAL).

As far as front covers were concerned, the first issue had Liverpool and England's Emyln Hughes and Manchester United and Northern Ireland's George Best on the front cover, two players who would feature regularly throughout the magazine's life.

The mix of content and layout set the scene for pretty much the whole of the magazine's life and there was only really a slight change to the mast head and inside page design in the last few issues. Overall, the look of the magazine, both externally and internally, didn't really change at all. As the weeks and then seasons went by, there were numerous interesting things to read about. Looking back 40+ years later, many of the features, articles, advertisements, competitions provide a lovely snapshot of both football and life at the end of the 1960's and early 1970's. Thanks also to the wonders of Ebay I have been able to collect all 296 editions of the magazine and it is great going back through the various articles and features. One personal favourite is "The Girl Behind the Man" feature. Long before the term WAGS came along GOAL magazine included a weekly picture of a player's wife, usually with her husband. Indeed it was the turn of Jane Rogers, husband of Swindon Town's superstar Don, to be featured in No. 18 on 7th December 1968. A copy of the feature is shown on the right and when I found this I did forward it onto Don and Jane to see if they remembered it being taken.



As well as the feature on players wife's being fun to look back at now another bit of the magazine that offers much nostalgia is the adverts section. In the old days of the late 1960's clubs did not have one manufacturer producing their replica kits, in fact the clubs had not even thought about producing replica kits for their fans. No in those days you had various suppliers producing what were known as "boy's authentic team outfits of famous clubs" at a cost of 27'6. One such advert is shown to the left.

Other great merchandise on sale in the magazine were "Rosettes as seen on TV", "100% Nylon Roll Neck Pullovers - The 1968 Look" and "Apollo Briefs". In a way more innocent age before the advent of email and social media the "Classified Advertisements" section included numerous offers for "Pen Friends" both here and abroad and membership of an intriguing club called the "Friendly Folk Association" established in Torquay since 1943 apparently!

My favourite articles are generally the interviews with Rodney Marsh who, even in those days, said it how it was as he does on his Twitter feed today. Never afraid about who he upset Rodney was as entertaining off the pitch as he was on it. The final issue of GOAL was produced on 1 June 1974 and featured a picture of Johann Cruyff in a Barcelona shirt on the cover. Included on page 4 was a letter from the Editor which said "Dear Reader, it is with deep regret that we have to announce that this is the last issue of GOAL. There are many factors which have forced this unhappy decision upon us, not the least of which has been the tremendous increase in the last few months of paper, printing and distribution costs. They leapt to such a degree that it is not now possible to continue publication without increasing the price substantially. This, we feel, we cannot do. We thank our readers and our advertisers for the loyalty they have shown us during the past years, and hope that they will miss us just as much as we will miss them. GOAL Club, of course, has to be ended, and no more application for membership should be sent. The Editor". Now I cannot remember if I was a member of GOAL club but I do know I would have been very disappointed at the demise of my favourite football magazine but at least by then Shoot was going and I could still get my football magazine fix, even if the best ever in my view was no longer being published.

In collecting all 296 editions I have managed to acquire a lot of swaps and if anyone is interested I will be selling these at the forthcoming Programme Fair at the County Ground on Sunday 19th February 2017.

The second period started with the home side conceding a penalty. However, Curtis Meare - who produced a handful of quality saves during the match - guessed correctly and was able to repel the effort.

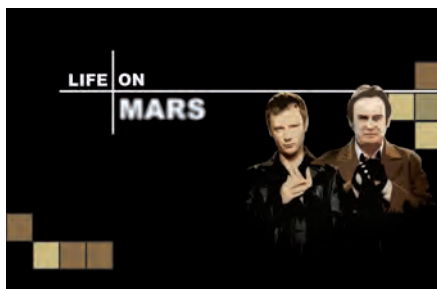
Thankful for that let off, Bassett turned the screw even further.

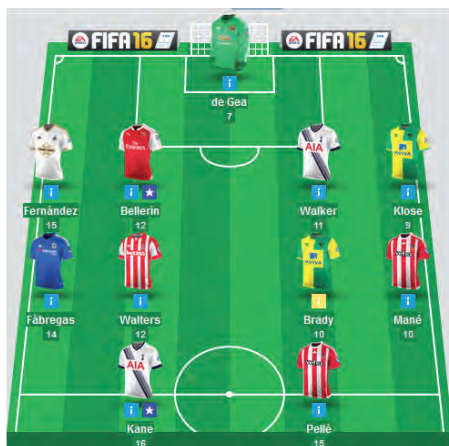

Floodlit Cup Match Reports

Robertson shines in extra time to deliver Floodlit Cup victory New Gerard Buxton Ground, 14th December 2016

Finally Royal Wootton Bassett Town got one over Lydney Town. After suffering four straight single goal defeats against their Gloucestershire bogey side, Bassett were able to record a 2-0 victory against them and book their place in the quarter finals of the Floodlit Cup.

It took one hell of a struggle, 120 minutes of closely-fought action and a couple of nail-biting moments to get there though.

However, in the end an extra time brace from the ever-reliable Steve Robertson separated the sides before the game reached a somewhat premature conclusion as a result of the floodlights failing - somewhat ironic given that the competition the teams were playing in.

Good job penalties weren't needed in the end.

There was little goalmouth action in the opening period, the only noteworthy moments coming from the full-blooded tackles put in by both teams.

In the second half, Robertson fired straight at the visiting 'keeper when through one-on-one before Lydney's Declan Morley-Lyne saw a free kick strike the post and roll along the goal line.

The game should really have been settled in the closing stages of normal time when Dale Richards found the back of the net, only to see what appeared to be a perfectly legitimate goal ruled out for by an erroneous offside flag.

Extra time was therefore required, and Bassett struck early in the first half, Robertson lobbing the 'keeper after being played through by Richards.

He then grabbed his second after the interval. It came in somewhat scrappy fashion, but they all count. Through on goal again, Robertson unselfishly sought to square to a teammate only to see his attempted pass bounce of a defender. The ball fell straight back to Robertson though, and the forward simply walked it in.

Bassett were arguably grateful they had netted a second and had Lydney beaten as, shortly before full time was due, the floodlights were inadvertently switched off. Light was eventually restored, and the final minute played out. But without that additional cushion, Lydney would arguably have had reason for complaint.



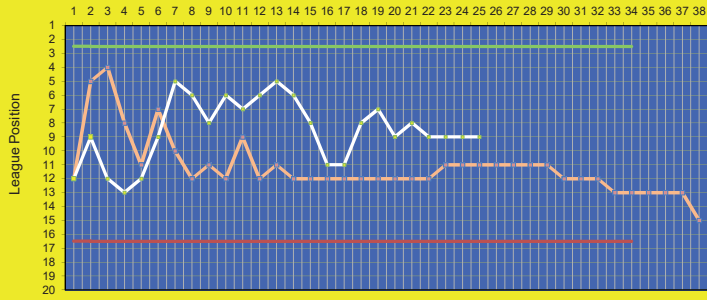

This will be his 5th season with Bassett with over 130 appearances having re-joined the Club from Shrivenham. Previously with Calne Town a player who gives 100% every game.



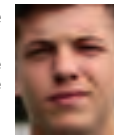

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35. Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II.



After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed.

The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 only to be immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 and promotion back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and in 1987-88 they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06. Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away.



















With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year groundshare with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year at Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and a record points total. Last season saw the club return home playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, Bassett finished 15th in the Premier Division. With some top summer signings the Club are looking for a much higher finish this season.



The table below shows the addresses of all the grounds we will be visiting this coming **2016-17** Season. This season we have 3 new teams in Burnham, Carterton and Henley. The table below includes the postcode to enter into your Sat Nav. A rough estimate of the distance from Royal Wootton Bassett is also shown. This season we have 74 less miles of travel in total (it could have been 164 more if North Greenford had come into the Hellenic and Cheltenham had not stayed down) but the average journey has increased by just over a mile.

Average away game travel (return journey) = **96.2** miles (2015-16: 95.1 miles)

Match Report

Bassett battle to Ascot stalemate New Gerard Buxton Ground, 4th February 2017

Royal Wootton Bassett Town played out their first goalless draw in nearly three years as they were made to sweat by a vibrant, young Ascot United side at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground.

Not since a trip to Thame United in April 2014 had a game involving Bassett finished 0-0. And there were plenty of occasions during this tense contest against the Yellamen which threatened to extend that streak.

Yet, while both teams strived to play a progressive, passing game, a lack of end product and composure in front of goal meant that it finished all square.

The visitors were a much-changed outfit from that which Rich Hunter's side defeated 3-1 a month ago. Just five players who featured in that heated meeting in Berkshire remained, their much changed teamsheet being something that no doubt instilled a great deal of confidence in the Bassett ranks.

Though Dan Davies tested Curtis Meare four minutes in, a pair of chances which fell to the hosts during the early exchanges seemed to justify that optimism.

They should arguably have both been taken, but the ease with which they came about suggested Bassett were a goal away from breaking the game open.

Two minutes after Davies saw his shot from the edge of the area pushed around the post, visiting 'keeper Matt Hill was brought into action after a fine move down the right side opened up the Ascot defence. Steve Robertson slipped a pass into the right channel for George Lance to run onto and the youngster cut back across goal for Lewis Thompson, who saw his shot from twelve yards bravely parried away at his feet.

Moments later, Dan Comer swung in a free kick from the left wing, which fell perfectly for an unmarked Steve Yeardley. However, the Bassett centre half somehow skewed a header way over the bar from all of ten yards.

Having survived those nervy moments, Ascot then found a level of fluency which the home side lacked. Through wide-men James Goodey and Arafat Kabuye they looked threatening down both flanks, while imposing centre forward Josh Dillon made sure that Yeardley and defensive partner Liam Edmondson were on their toes throughout.

It didn't really translate into opportunities prior to the break though, Ascot's best opening for the remainder of the period coming when the ball broke for Kabuye just inside the area, but his powerful strike was blocked.

Following the restart the game became a frenetic, frayed affair with play shifting from end-to-end.

Early on, Thompson came closing to breaking the deadlock when he received a throw in from Comer, cut inside and arrowed a drive from the right edge of the box narrowly wide.

With the hour mark approaching, Kabuye's cross from the left found Goodey at the far post, and his close range half volley forced a fine reaction save from Meare to keep it out.

Robertson then almost took advantage of a rash decision from Hill to race off his line and attempt to beat the prolific Bassett forward to Steve Olphert's switch of play. He came up short, and from a narrow angle on the left, Robertson attempted to slot into the empty net, but couldn't quite find the target.

With ten minutes to go, Bassett thought they had their moment when Dan Bailey hooked a through ball in behind the visiting defence, which Lance raced onto. After the Ascot defence was able to recover, the midfielder cut back and squared for Robertson, whose shot was blocked by a superb goalline clearance, although the offside flag would have ruled it out anyway.

Defensively, Hunter's team were forced to defend corner after corner during the second period. However, it was from a free kick that they came closest to conceding the decide. Four minutes from time, Dan Davies swung one over from the left-hand side that carried to the far post where two unmarked Ascot players looked set to pounce. Their teammate Tom Wensley strode in prior to the ball reaching them, connecting with a weak header that sailed wide much to the relief of Bassett.

0-0 the game finished then, but it was not for the want of trying on the part of both teams.

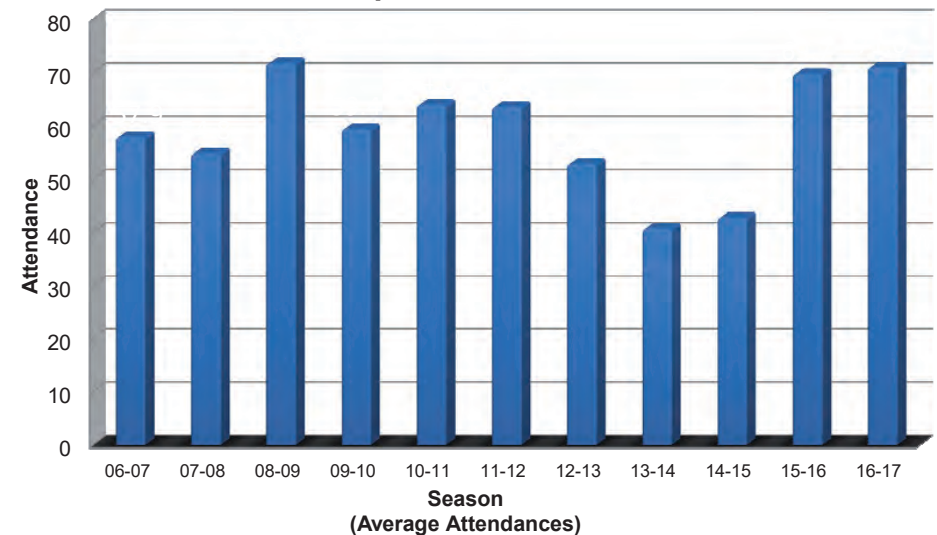

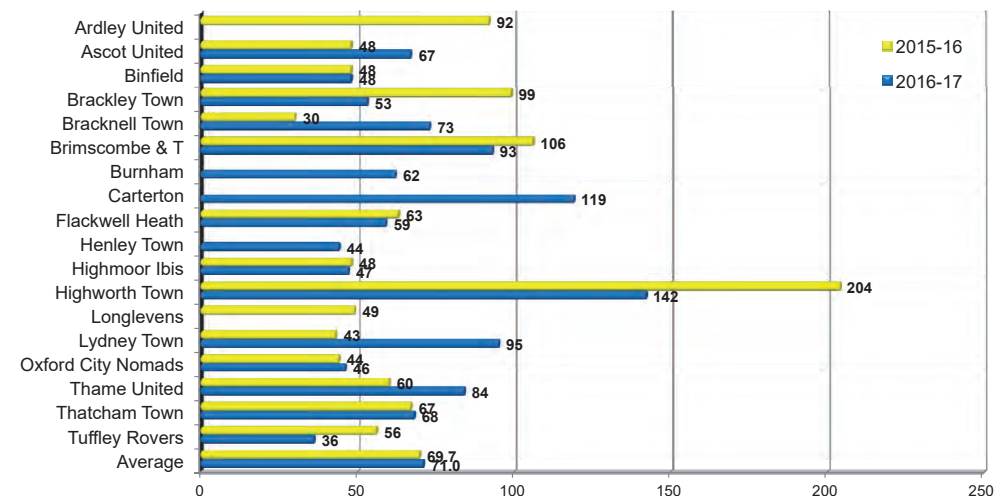

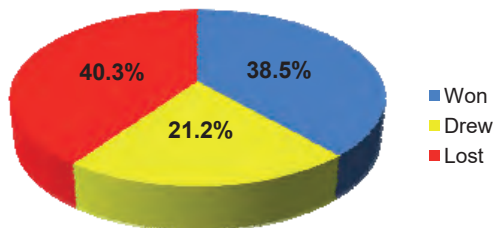

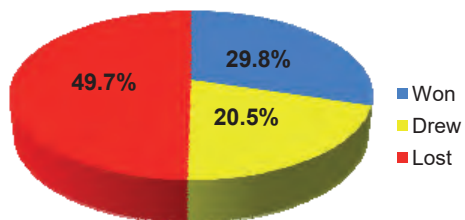

Bassett blank frustrates Rich

ROYAL Wootton Bassett Town manager Rich Hunter berated his side after they played out a goalless draw with Ascot United in the Hellenic League Premier Division.

Jeff Roberts' side fell behind early on as the hosts took a 1-0 lead into the interval, but Chris Taylor was on hand to level the scoring in the second half.

After gaining some confidence, the Worthians then took the lead when Jon Davoile applied the finish from close range.

Highworth were then able to add a third late on as Aysa Corrick sealed all three points with his 31st goal of the season.

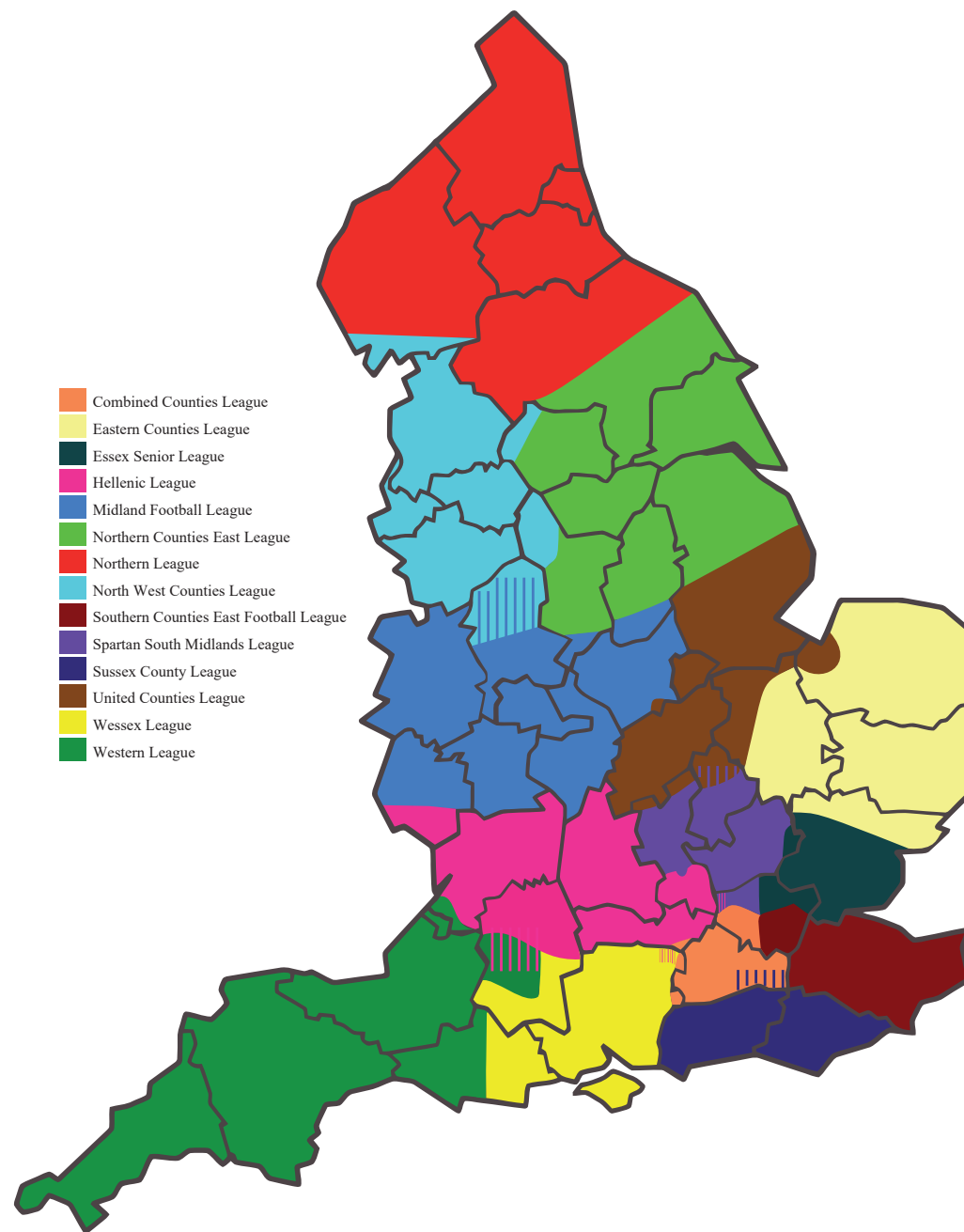

Robertson rescue act sees Bassett through

New Gerard Buxton Ground, 28th January 2017

Staring at a second elimination from a cup competition at the hands of a Hellenic League Division One East side square in the face, sharpshooting Steve Robertson stepped forward to rescue Royal Wootton Bassett Town and guide them to an eventual 2-1 Supplementary Cup first round victory after extra time against Woodley United.

Trailing ever since Charlie Oakley's finely taken fifth minute opener, Bassett had encountered stiff resistance from a well-organised, stingy Woodley defence, which has conceded less than a goal a game in league contests so far this season. However, with one thunderous swing of his left boot in the fourth minute of stoppage time, Robertson brought his side back level to force an extra half hour's play.

Then, in the first period of extra time, a sublime first touch with his back to goal allowed Robertson not only to bring Dan Comer's cross under control, but also forge a path in behind the visitors' back line before he calmly slotted into the corner for what proved to be the winner. Prior to that, Bassett's leading marksman had cut a frustrated figure, with his team unable to conjure up any real meaningful chance in front of a goal. But Robertson is a player who has the quality to turn a game in an instant – even on what are, by his standards, quiet days. And that is exactly what he did on this occasion, much to the delight of his boss Rich Hunter. His goals have been vital to Bassett's fortunes over the past two and a half seasons, and it is hoped his late contribution against Woodley can spark a deep run in this competition. Saying that, had it not been for the performance of 'keeper Curtis Meare throughout the ninety minutes preceding Bassett's equaliser, then they would certainly have been mulling another exit against lower level opponents. The Bassett shotstopper, who has been in excellent form throughout the campaign, had another great day between the posts, pulling off a series of important saves and brave claims to ensure that the deficit his team faced was kept to a minimum. He could well have done more to keep out Oakley's opener. But more at fault was slack marking from those in front of him, which allowed the Woodley frontman to receive a throw in on the left edge of the area without a marker in sight. Afforded way too much time, Oakley was able to arrow a fierce drive past Meare and into the bottom right corner, the ball taking an awkward bounce just in front of the 'keeper which did enough to beat him.

Along with a goalline block from Steve Yeardley, Meare was on hand to deny Woodley a second in the game's eighth minute. Danny Horscroft headed onto the bar after Bassett had failed to clear. Then, Yeardley threw himself in the way of Oakley's follow up before Meare sprung to his right to prevent the still loose ball from crossing the line. With eighteen minutes elapsed, Meare saved with his chest to keep Horscroft's powerful drive out before, on the half hour mark, he batted away Carl Prestige's low curler after the midfielder had dispossessed Liam Edmondson on the edge of the box. Bassett had been slow out of the blocks and stifled by Woodley's sharp pressing game. After the restart the hosts did come into the game more, but that did not translate into James McKimm being tested in the Woodley goal. Instead, it was his opposite number who continued to be brought into action.

Just before the hour, Greg Beckett cut in from the left before feeding pass into the feet of Horscroft, who rolled Edmondson before shooting on the turn from close range only to see Meare pull off another fine parry. The 'keeper then diverted Oakley's deft touch from Beckett's low left-wing cross around the right post. Bassett finally had an opening eleven minutes before the end when Jamie Richards attempted shot broke for Dale Richards in the area. Despite having just McKimm in front of him, he was unable to get a shot off as Idris Kamara – perhaps with the help of a nudge on the Bassett winger – recovered to make a saving tackle.

It therefore appeared that the home side's desperate search for a goal was to prove in vain. However, deep into injury time, Edmondson delivered a towering cross from the left, which Dale Richards, rising highest at the far post, redirected into the path of Robertson, who hammered home into the bottom corner with a high-quality, lethal finish.

Midway through the opening period of extra time, substitute Dave Morgan stung Meare's palms with an effort from distance. But two minutes later, the game was to be decided in some style at the other end courtesy of Robertson's magic.

Man of the Match: Curtis Meare – while he may have felt he could have done better to keep out the shot that put Woodley ahead, the Bassett 'keeper was otherwise outstanding again. He made a number of vital, high calibre saves, was assured when coming to claim the ball from multiple corners and crosses and made all the right decisions when leaving his line to help snuff out any additional danger.

Non-League Paper's Joshua Peck on Non-League teams making the Fifth Round of the FA Cup

LINCOLN City and Sutton United made history recently by reaching the fifth round of the FA Cup, becoming the eighth and ninth Non-League teams to do so since the Second World War. Both teams have beaten Championship opposition en route to Round 5 having entered the competition in the fourth qualifying round and both the Imps and the U's will come up against Premier League sides in their next clash. But with the pair making history, it's the first time two Non-League sides have made it this far in the same year, it's time to look back at the others who have made the last 16 of the famous Cup competition.

First to make the fifth round while playing Non-League football was Colchester United, then of the Southern League, in 1947-48. After beating Essex rivals Chelmsford City 3-1 in the fourth qualifying round, Colchester won 2-1 at home against Banbury Spencer (now United), before seeing off Wrexham 1-0.

In the third round, Huddersfield Town were on the wrong end of a 1-0 before a 3-2 victory over Bradford Park Avenue saw Colchester reach the fifth round. It was to end there though with Blackpool dashing the dreams by beating the U's 5-0.

Yeovil Town, also from the Southern League, repeated the feat a year later, beating Lovell's Athletic, Romford and Weymouth to reach the third round. From there, the Glovers were 3-1 victors over Bury and a famous 2-1 win over Sunderland. In round five came giants of the English game Manchester United, and the Red Devils proved too strong, ending Yeovil's run with an 8-0 win.

It was almost 30 years until another Non-League side made it to round five and this was perhaps the most famous one.

Northern League side Blyth Spartans in 1977-78 started in the first qualifying round, and progressed to draw their first fifth round tie away to Wrexham 1-1, Blyth Spartans were actually in the hat for the sixth round draw.

They were drawn to play Arsenal at home, just like Sutton will in the fifth round this year, in the sixth round, but lost the replay 2-1 at home to Wrexham, played in front of a crowd of over 42,000 at Newcastle's St James' Park.

Telford United needed replays against Lincoln City and Darlington to progress through in 1984-85 before Everton were too strong for them, while Kidderminster Harriers beat Birmingham City and Preston North End on their way to round five in 1993-94.

Just six seasons ago Steve Evans' Crawley Town upset Swindon, Derby and Torquay before being drawn at Old Trafford. Live on TV, the Non-League Red Devils were narrowly beaten by Manchester United, but promotion was earned instead.

And just four years ago, Luton Town became the most recent example of a Non-League team beating top-flight opposition as they overcame Norwich City on their way to the fifth round.

Now there's two more. Can Lincoln or Sutton become the first to reach the quarter-finals? Here's hoping....
