## Welcome to Burnham

A warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Burnham for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. We hope all those from Burnham enjoy their short stay with us today and we wish them a safe journey home back to Buckinghamshire.

Burnham were reprieved from relegation at the end of Season 2016-17 following Ardley United's request to be relegated and have had an equally difficult start to this season. They currently sit bottom of the table with 3 points from 9 games but have shown improvement in recent weeks. Like last season they seem to be experiencing a heavy turnover of players. They used 97 different players last season and have already used 46 in their opening 11 fixtures. Whilst we are on a good run at the moment as we have seen many times over the years, if you are not at your best you can be beaten by any team in this division so it is important that we are focused and up for the battle today. You only have to look at Ascot's surprise 2-0 win over Bracknell Town on Tuesday evening as evidence of the sides at the bottom being capable of beating those at the top.

On the subject of Bracknell it was interesting to see that Mark Tallentire left the club over the weekend after their first defeat of the season. It was not as if the defeat was not against top opposition as it was Thatcham Town who lowered their colours. The final result was 3-0 in Thatcham's favour with ex-Thatcham player Shane Cooper-Clark inflicting the damage with two goals. There was clearly some sort of breakdown in the relationship between manager and chairman judging by the press statement that Bracknell subsequently issued. For more on the story go to the Bracknell news website. Bracknell have already appointed the former Ascot manager into the position and the reaffirmed their intention to get promoted back to the Southern League this season. With Highworth's impressive start and that of Thatcham Town and Flackwell Heath it is certainly going to be an interesting season at the top of the table. Highworth currently look in pole position with their 100% record but have back-to-back games coming up against Flackwell and Thatcham. Win those and there is every chance that they will ultimately win the division this season.

## Codicote

It was pretty comfortable on Saturday against Coldicote with Sam Packer scoring those 4 first half goals and then Rory Sproule scoring his first for the club in the second half to make it 5-0. You often find when you go into half time with such a comfortable lead that the goals dry up in the second period but it was a good win and sees us through to the next round.

We have been handed a home tie against Amptill Town in the Buildbase FA Vase first round as our reward for the win over Codicote. The tie will take place on Saturday 21st October at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground. Amptill are Codicote's rivals in the Spartan South Midlands League Division One. Not since 2010-11 have we appeared in the First Round proper of the competition and we will be looking to go one better than in that season, when we suffered a 2-1 away defeat against Cadbury Heath. Victory would ensure we match our best ever run nine years ago, which ended in the Second Round.

Amptill, despite playing a level below us at step six, will be difficult opponents. They have a great Vase pedigree. The Bedfordshire outfit have made it to the Third Round or beyond on seven different occasions. That includes a three year stretch of reaching at least the last 32. In 2011-12 Amptill made it to the Fourth Round before they went a stage further a season later. Their best performance came in 2013-14 when they made it through to the Quarter Finals, being eliminated 2-1 after defeat to Eastbourne United Association. That run to the last eight coincided with a runners-up finish in the South Midlands League Premier Division. However, they were relegated in 2014-15, following that up with consecutive 14th place finishes at step six. So far this season the Amps have been in outstanding form. In the Vase they have comfortably seen off two UHlsport Hellenic League sides already, thrashing New College 10-0 away before triumphing 4-0 against

On Sunday, the Ladies side made it three wins in three league games with a narrow 1-0 win over Cheltenham Civil Service, Laura Gammon with the only goal of the game. Tomorrow the Ladies are home to Swindon Town Development.

## Concert

The latest in a series of music events being held by the Sports Association, it should be a fantastic night's entertainment. Demand for tickets is expected to be high, so make sure to purchase as soon as you can. Advance tickets for the event cost £5 and will be available to purchase from the bar. Entry on the night will cost £6.50. Doors will open at 7.30pm.

## Youth Section

Draws for the second round of the North Wilts League Cup have been announced, and three of the five Royal Wootton Bassett Town sides remaining in the competitions have been handed home ties. Both Under 15s sides have been drawn away from home. And the Blue team will need to defeat Division One rivals FC Calne if they are to maintain hopes of repeating their cup triumph last year. The two sides have already met in the league, with Bassett recording a 5-0 victory. However, FC Calne helped play a part in denying Bassett the double last season, defeating them 2-1 in a crucial encounter late in the campaign. Meanwhile, the Yellows, who have made an outstanding start in Division Three, face a trip to either Cirencester Town Centurions or Malmesbury Youth Eagles, both of who play a division higher. The Under 18 Blues will host Division One rivals Fairford and Lechlade, while the Yellows welcome AFC Newbury Colts. The Under 12 Blues are the other side handed home advantage, and they will face fellow Division One outfit AFC Newbury Red. All games are scheduled to take place on Sunday 5th November.

## Next Up

The next First Team action at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground is not until Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> October when Cricklade Town visit in the Wiltshire Senior Cup. This is the first of 5 home games in a row for the First Team with a home tie in the Floodlit Cup against Kidlington Reserves also still to be scheduled. After tomorrow's Ladies game with Swindon Development Team the next action here sees Devizes Town Reserves visit in the Wiltshire Senior League. For full details of all forthcoming games at the Gerard Buxton Ground see elsewhere in the programme. Enjoy the game and here's to our winning run continuing.

# Opponents - History

## Burnham FC • Club History

Founded in 1878, Burnham FC is the second oldest club Buckinghamshire. We played in the early years, with considerable success, in various leagues, before joining the Great Western Combination in 1948.



The 2012-2013 season without doubt was the most successful in the football clubs history. The First Team won the Evo-Stik Southern League Southern & West Division One Central (Southern League) championship earning promotion to the newly sponsored Calor League Premier Division (Southern League) while our Reserves won the UHlsport Hellenic League Division Two East championship at the first time of asking and themselves earned promotion to Division One East where they will now come up against the First Teams of many of last seasons opposition.

We moved to the Wycombe Combination in 1964 and then spent one season (1970/71) in the Reading Combination.

In 1971 the club were elected to the Hellenic League winning both the Premier Division and League Cup in 1975/76. We were also twice beaten finalists in the League Cup.

In 1977 the club were elected to the Athenian League and were twice runners-up before the league folded in 1984. We competed in the London Spartan League in 1984/85 winning both the Premier Division title and the League Cup. The summer of 1985 bought about the amalgamation of the football club with Hillingdon Borough FC who had lost their ground and were about to fold.

We played in the Southern League as Burnham & Hillingdon FC but reverted back to the former name of Burnham FC in 1987. Season 1994/95 saw us finish bottom, resulting in relegation to the Hellenic League.

After 3 seasons in the Hellenic League finishing fifth, third and again third in 1998/99 the club won both the Premier Division title and the League Cup, thus gaining promotion back to the Southern Football League where we have played since.

Season 2006/07 saw the club achieve their highest league position, finishing 3rd, thus qualifying for the end of season Promotion Play-Off semi final, unfortunately losing to the eventual winners Swindon Supermarine.

In cup competitions Burnham reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase in 1977/78 and then went one better in reaching the Semi Final in 1982/83 losing over two legs to Halesowen Town by 4-2. In the home leg the clubs record attendance of 2400 was achieved.

We have twice reached the Third Qualifying round of the FA Cup and in 2005/06 reached the First Round Proper for the first time ever before losing at home to Aldershot Town.

In the FA Trophy we reached the Fourth Round (the last 16) in 1999/2000 before losing to Scarborough in a replay after a creditable 1-1 draw at The Gore.

In the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup we have reached the Semi Final twice before losing on both occasions to Chesham United.

Division One of the Hellenic League was won by Endsleigh who finished just one point ahead of Milton United.

Meanwhile in the Wiltshire League, Division 1 was won by Aldbourne-Ferndale, Malmesbury Victoria were runners-up. Division 2 champions were Melksham Town Reserves with Swindon Supermarine Reserves runners-up. Raychem SSC won Division 3 at a canter finishing some 16 points ahead of runners-up Wootton Bassett Sports. Division 4 was won by Shrewton United Reserves who finished 15 points clear of Sundstrand.

Aldbourne-Ferndale also won the Addkey Senior KO Cup defeating Melksham Town Reserves in the final, doing the league and cup double in the process. Raychem SSC matched this achievement as they also lifted the Fountain Trophies Junior Cup in addition to the Division 3 title, defeating Shrewton United Reserves in the final.

Elsewhere in the Swindon & District League the Premier Division champions were Wootton Bassett based Old Nick for the second season running, making it four championships in four seasons. Division 1 champions were White Hart Lyneham with Division 2 being won by John O'Flynn. Moonrakers took the Division 3 title. The Advertiser Cup was also won by Old Nick to take the double. The George Thomas Cup was won by John O'Flynn.

Blackburn Rovers win the Premier League title, pipping Manchester United by a point. United lose out in the FA Cup too, as Paul Rideout's goal was enough for Everton to clinch the cup. Swindon Town are relegated from Division One after finishing 21st. Ajax are crowned champions of Europe, while Arsenal lose to Real Zaragoza in the Cup Winners' Cup final as Nayim scores a last minute extra time winner from the halfway line.

# Hellenic Years - 1994-95

As this is the 30<sup>th</sup> year of our participation in the Hellenic League this year's programme will look back at each of those years to see what was going on in the local Non-League football at the time.

Today the featured season is 1994-95:

The 1994-95 season would mark the end of an era for Wootton Bassett Town. Mick Woolford, having assumed the reins of a middling Wiltshire County League side in 1985 and turned it into Hellenic League mainstays and cup specialists, would finally take leave at the end of his tenth year in charge. Too often, farewells can seem belated, a significant figure's tenure outliving their success. Yet for the long time Bassett manager this was not to be the case. Though he would guide his team to a league position just inside the top half of Hellenic League Division One, there would be one final journey to the Division One Challenge Cup final – the third trip to the showpiece of that competition, and fourth cup final in all during Woolford's period in charge.

Winners in 1989-90, the Division One Cup had become Bassett's forte. Though two early exits followed after that triumph, the club would venture to the semi-finals in 1992-93, losing in an agonising replay against Purton, before going further a year later and claiming the silverware for a second time. What better way to bow out in 1995 than than with another medal and one earned doing what is considered one of the hardest things in any sport at any level – repeating as winners?

The denouement would come on Saturday May 6th at Abingdon United's Northcourt Road ground, the opponents Ardley United. However it was not to be the finest of exits for undoubtedly Bassett's most decorated manager in its modest history. The afternoon started perfectly for Bassett, but a slump in the second half saw the Oxfordshire side run out winners by an emphatic 4-1 margin.

A significant problem faced Bassett though as they prepared for their final appearance. And that was league duties. At the beginning of April the team had played only 21 of its 38 games, an issue compounded by a late August start to the season and the typically drab English winter weather. With games coming thick and fast, tiredness no doubt impacted the team's performance against Ardley. Indeed, the team had not won for four games going into the final, a run which included a 3-3 draw with the eventual cup winners. However it was not until late on in the showpiece that glory slipped through Bassett's hands. In the end Bassett finished in ninth place in the league – a repeat of the previous season. It was unfortunate that their performance a year earlier in the Division One Cup could not also be repeated. Yet the journey to another final still merited a place on the club's honours board, something which Woolford had transformed during his time in charge.

## Aaron Maximen – Midfield/ Forward



Maximen is a tough tackling midfielder, who possesses a great engine and a knack of scoring goals. While imposing given his size, he nevertheless has a great touch and is adept at bringing others into the game.

He initially made his name with Cricklade Town where he played primarily as a centre forward. In his first season at Stones Lane in 2009/10, he appeared 16 times, scoring three goals, including the decisive strike in a 2-1 victory against Bassett that ended Dave Turner's side's sixteen game unbeaten run.

Four goals in eleven appearances to start the 2010/11 campaign earned the attentions of Hellenic Premier Division Shrivenham, who signed Maximen late in the year. He made an immediate impression, scoring on his debut to earn a point at Old Woodstock Town before going on to score three more before the end of the season.

His first full season at Shrivenham was an impressive one as he netted ten times – good enough to be his side's second top scorer – in 40 games.

Maximen followed manager John Fisher to Highworth Town at the start of the 2012/13 season. Although the Worthians struggled in the league, Maximen continued to be amongst the goals, netting twelve times in 44 games. He again scored against Bassett, though his early header was not enough to prevent a 3-1 defeat in the FA Cup.

His goal tally reduced a season later, with seven in 45 appearances as he began to play in a deeper role in midfield.

Maximen then played a key role in Highworth's run to the FA Vase semi-final, featuring in all but three games. Overall he scored five times in 43 games during the season. Then he scored eight goals in 33 appearances for the Worthians in 2015-16.

Last season he made a brief appearance for Bassett at the start of the season before playing for Wroughton in the Wiltshire League, helping them to the Premier Division title.

## Spalding stars in Burnham rout

*New Gerard Buxton Ground, 1st October 2016*

For the second week in a row Royal Wootton Bassett Town's attack shone brightly as they tore basement dwellers Burnham apart in a 5-1 victory. As against Oxford City Nomads, Steve Robertson, Lewis Thompson and Dale Richards were again all prominent, with each player finding the net and making important contributions to the other goals that made up the team's handful, it was the returning Henry Spalding who was the star of the show.

A niggling injury kept him out of last week's thumping triumph. But he returned with a vengeance, scoring one goal and featuring in the build for the other four that Rich Hunter's team scored against the Buckinghamshire outfit, who despite being committed to getting the ball down and playing were a class below their hosts. Switching between the left and right wings throughout the game, he ran rings around Burnham, taking the mickey at times - as was the case when he nutmegged a defender in the right corner before providing a teasing cross for Robertson to add Bassett's fourth. Although the opposition was not the strongest, he provided a sublime demonstration of his abilities.

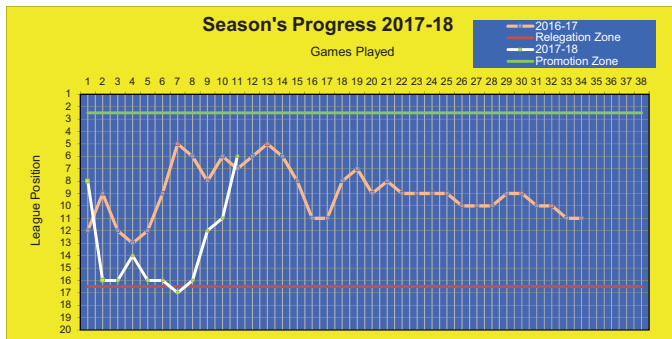
It was his cross from deep on the left, which resulted in Bassett's first in the game's 27th minute. That delivery was cleared only as far as Robertson, who smashed a strike against the bar. Danger had not been averted as the rebound fell to Thompson, and he set the ball to Richards who lashed a rising strike beyond the reach of Burnham stopper Samuel Szymczyk. Prior to that, Bassett had largely been in control, but the end product had been missing. Thompson had gone close after five minutes, seeing a curling effort deflected over, before Richards drew a parry from Szymczyk, the rebound falling to Robertson square in front of goal, but his scuffed effort was blocked. However, Richards' opener denied any confidence the visitors had and further goals were always on the cards. And Steve Olphert ensured Bassett went into the break a comfortable two to the good. The midfielder took his goal in some style - at full stretch on the edge of the area, he redirected another Spalding delivery from deep on the left into the top left corner with a fine half volley.

Bassett had a brief scare early after the restart when the ball broke for Oscar Dubrowski to run free on goal, but Curtis Meare was quick to shut the angle and saved at the speedy forward's feet. They then quickly established a three goal advantage. Thompson went on a surging run down the right wing and played a cut back from the byline, which Spalding composedly guided into the left corner. Three minutes later came Bassett's supremely well worked fourth. A flowing move set Spalding free in the right corner, and his audacious nutmeg and perfectly weighted cross set up Robertson to join the party, as the team's leading scorer beat Szymczyk to the ball and prodded in from close range for his twelfth of the campaign. With the points sewn up, the home side eased off to an extent, and that allowed Burnham to reduce arrears, Cheyenne Cripps rounding off a successful counter attack with a confident finish. While that defensive lapse was frustrating, the quality of Bassett's forward play remained high. After Sam Packer came close, Thompson made it five, completing a move that he had started. Spalding was again set free down the right by Thompson and picked out Robertson at the far post. Unselfishly passing up the option to shoot from an extremely tight angle, the forward instead teed up Thompson for a close range finish. Opportunities continued to be created. Steve Yeardley should have done better with a header from a Packer corner as he failed to find the target from ten yards out. Alioune Diouf then saw a powerful effort from the edge of the area deflected over as he released Spalding and darted into the area to connect with the return pass. With five minutes to go, Robertson appeared as though he would grab his second when he flicked Packer's corner towards goal at the near post, however Szymczyk did well to glove the ball behind. It had already been an outstanding five star attacking display though, and with a tough County Cup test and a pair of league games against two of the division's best attacking sides to come, keeping some goals in reserve will hopefully prove a wise move.

**Man of the Match: Henry Spalding** – justified the decision of manager Rich Hunter to bring him straight back into the starting eleven with a high quality display that saw him play a role in all five of Bassett's goals.

# Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated in the small market town six miles west of Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established within the town in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in the county of Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the prestigious Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although both ended in defeat. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when the club began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by local dignitary Major Gerard Buxton for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County Senior League with limited success until Season 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. Season 1987-88 also saw the club again reach the final of the Wiltshire Senior Cup but that first win remained elusive. That changed in 1998-99, however, when the Club defeated Pewsey Vale 3-2 in the final at the County Ground and success was again achieved in Season 2000-01 when Shrewton were defeated 2-0 in the final. The First Team, having finished runners-up in Division One West in Season 2012-13, currently play in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League, at Step 5 of the Football Pyramid.

As well as the First Team the Club has always run an adult Development/Reserve team. Since the onset of the new millennium the club has also expanded significantly, with the establishment of a large thriving Youth Section and a very successful Ladies Section. The Ladies side recently did the "double" of being cup winners and securing promotion in the same season. The latest addition to the Club has been the establishment of a Veterans team, so the club now operates 26 teams from under 7s upwards. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established, with three Youth Section teams touring Holland annually since 2001. This has led to a relationship with amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande, who are based near The Hague.

The club now play their games at the fantastic New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, the Club continues to thrive as a key part of the community of Royal Wootton Bassett. Season 2017-18 again sees Rich Hunter in charge of the First Team as the Club looks to better its highest ever position in Non-League football the 11th place finish achieved in Season 2014-15. The Club will again be entering the F.A. Cup and F.A. Vase with the Development side playing in the Wiltshire County League.

## In This Week From the Archives...

### Bennett and Bassett Show Grit, Forcing Replay

Rylands Way, 1<sup>st</sup> October 2005

**With Christchurch leading 1-0 in the dying seconds, and with 'keeper John Haines in an ambulance on his way to hospital with a knee injury, a rasping effort from Matty Bennett levelled the scores and ultimately forced a replay as Bassett's grit and determination showed in an epic FA Vase 2<sup>nd</sup> Qualifying Round match.**

It was a game that had it all – two red cards, a missed penalty and a brilliant display for 40 minutes by a 9-man Bassett side. However, the day didn't start well with Dave Roberts heading in from eight yards to give Christchurch the lead in the 10<sup>th</sup> minute. Dwayne Quinn was booked in the 21<sup>st</sup> minute for a rugby tackle, saving Bassett from going two down before an elbow on Richard Gee from Christchurch captain Chris Swan produced the first red card of the day, Bert Barry having no option but to dismiss Swan.

On 34 minutes Haines made one of the saves of the season, using his legs to deny Roberts a second after Lewis Till had gotten in behind the Bassett defence and squared for the unmarked Roberts. Wessex League Christchurch were looking nervy with 10-men and it only looked to be a matter of time before the dangerous Bennett would showcase his ability in front of goal. The second half didn't start the way Bassett wanted though, as Mark Edmonds was brought off injured and replaced by Moses Greene with only five minutes gone before Christchurch were awarded a penalty and Quinn sent off.

In the 54<sup>th</sup> minute Steve Yeardley dragged down Billy Puckett just inside the box and Barry awarded a penalty before sending off the ill-disciplined Quinn for swearing at Puckett. The luck was with Bassett though, as Puckett, just 16 years of age, dragged the penalty left of the goal. Craig MacLaren replaced Stu Hemsley with twenty minutes left after Hemsley picked up a knock. On 75 minutes MacLaren made a much needed tackle to deny Puckett a chance to redeem himself before Jack Dodd replaced Jon Davis, a sub Bassett could have done with, considering what would happen with ten minutes left. After parrying a Matt Czastka corner, Haines ran to try collect the ball but heard something tear in his knee forcing Yeardley to take over between the sticks. Yeardley dealt with his first action in goal comfortably, saving from Czastka. Bassett then began pressurising the Christchurch defence with MacLaren heading just over before Bennett struck with a 20-yard volley past the outstretched arms of Gareth Barfoot, forcing extra time.

It took a valiant defensive effort from Bassett to keep Christchurch from stealing a win – solid tackles from Gee, MacLaren, Tom Messenger and even Yeardley ended good chances for the Dorset side. Simon Atkins forced a comfortable save from Yeardley in the first period before Martin Lawrence shot wide. Bassett dodged a bomb with four minutes to go when a corner from the right fell to Tom Hughes ten yards out and with an open goal in front of him. His powerful effort looked destined to go in but bounced back out off the bar and was cleared to force a replay on Tuesday night.

**Scoop's Man of the Match: Matty Bennett – tested the Christchurch defence all day and deserved the goal. However, the whole team fought, stepping their game up when needed to and battling on with 9 men.**

**Scoop Rating: 9/10 – A courageous display considering the circumstances and a brilliant defensive display to snuff out Christchurch's chances towards the end.**

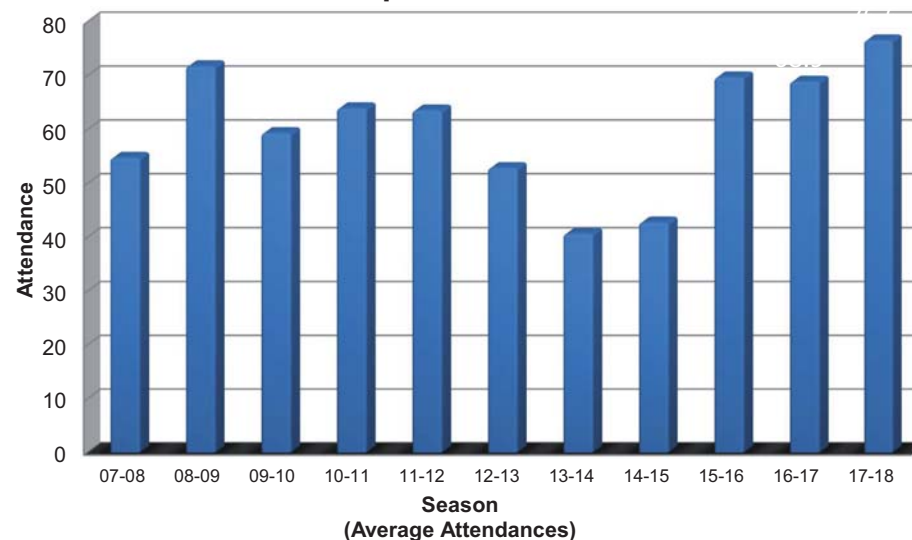

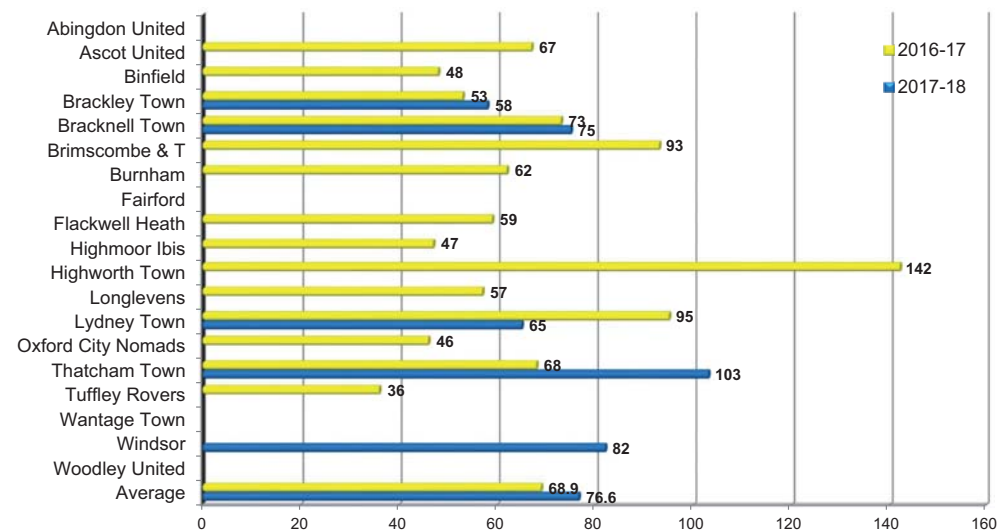


# RWBTFC Attendances

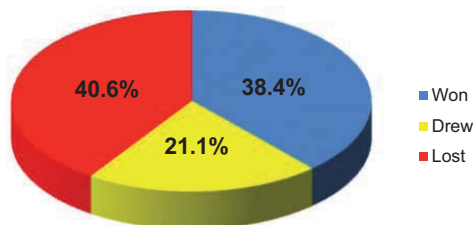

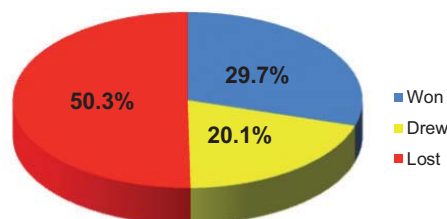

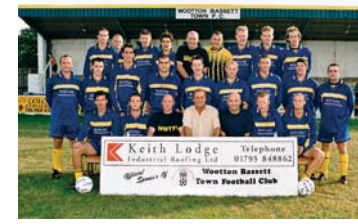

Last year was a very special year for the FA Cup, with the four teams contesting the semi-finals having finished in the top five of the English top-flight. Only once since the Premier League, or Premiership, kicked into action in 1992 has the last four been represented with such strength and quality (in 2008-09). The cup was alive and it seemed to mean something to the world's biggest and richest clubs... Or so we were told.

The truth of the matter is – and this really isn't breaking news – all four of those clubs, Manchester City, Tottenham, Chelsea and most certainly the eventual winners, Arsenal, would have swapped that victory walk up those famous steps in northwest London for a top-four finish that opens the gate for Champions League football. They reached the last four through the sheer strength and depth they could call on, stripping back their playing resources and showing the competition little respect in the early rounds as they breezed past much-lesser opponents.

I don't blame them for this, but let's stop dressing it up; the FA Cup, while no doubt being a competition the biggest clubs still 'want' to win, is little more than a back-up plan for managers – like Arsene Wenger – to fall back on should the primary goal of top-class European football not be attained. Even then, for the most demanding of clubs, winning it will not be enough to save a manager his job.

Despite this, last season really was a very special year for the FA Cup, and the biggest success story came from Non-League football with Lincoln City reaching the quarter-finals. They talk about romance in the cup, and there was plenty of that as Danny Cowley's side became the first Non-League club in 103 years to reach the last eight.

For their efforts, and ignoring the TV revenue that was pulled in, they also picked up £395,000 for the six games they won. In the grand scheme of the FA's current pay structure and a pay pot that tips £15 million – this is probably about right, but the issue needs addressing in the earliest rounds. So let's shave a bit off the top and pile a bit more into the bottom. What difference does £1.8 million, the money picked up by the eventual winners, make anyway?

The FA would be doing a lot more for the game should they bump up the prize money in the first and second Preliminary rounds, which is currently just £1,500 and £1,925 respectively.

Forget the TV cash bonuses that 'may' come into it should smaller clubs proceed past the first round – give grassroots football the money it deserves.

The FA have suggested they are going to address this, but actions speak louder than words and more cash is needed from the ground up. The £1.8 million that goes to the winner, most certainly a top-flight club and more than likely a top-four contender, will be nothing but loose change.

In fact, it probably won't even come close to covering the compensation package for the sacked manager who has the temerity to win the bloody thing!.

## Youth sides experience cup agony and ecstasy

Ryan Battershell and Joe Mitchell found the back of the net for the Yellows as they eliminated Division Two rivals Avonvale United in a 2-0 triumph.

Also advancing were the Under 15 Blues, who are looking to retain their cup title. They defeated Malmesbury Youth Tornadoes 4-0.

Both Under 14 teams were eliminated. The Blues lost 3-0 to FC Chippenham Youth White, while the Yellows were beaten 5-0 by Swindon Supermarine J.

While the Under 13 Blues' 5-4 defeat to Liden Community was an eventful one, the Yellows were overpowered 10-1 by Robins Red.

The Under 12 Whites, victorious in the preliminary round, fell to an 8-0 loss against Stratton Juniors Lions.

Packer would make no mistake a minute later though. Sproule dinked a ball over the top of the defence which his partner in crime latched onto before delicately steering over Tallas-Hiranta and into the back of the net with his left foot.

Chances did begin to dry up following the restart thanks to a combination of Codicote defending deeper and Bassett preserving energy given their unassailable advantage.

Failing to record more than five goals can't be seen as a disappointment though.

It could well have been more too. Prior to Sproule's 83rd minute strike, Scholes had rattled the woodwork following Ben Lodge's cutback and forced Tallas-Hiranta to make a save with a curling effort. ## Four-some Packer leads Vase procession

Sam Packer scored four as Royal Wootton Bassett Town progressed to the FA Vase first round with a 5-0 triumph against Codicote.

Four first half goals from Sam Packer ensured Royal Wootton Bassett Town romped to success in their FA Vase encounter with Codicote as Bassett brushed aside their Spartan South Midlands League 5-0.

Packer's quartet of goals comprised a perfect hat-trick, as he headed his first before adding two with his right foot and finishing off his 41-minute haul with a fine left foot effort.

Rory Sproule then completed the scoring in the second half as he finally got the goal that his industrious performances have merited since first taking the field in blue and yellow.

Rich Hunter's side were always favourites to win this tie against the step six strugglers. But knowing that you are expected to triumph can often result in complacent, below-par performances.

Not so on this occasion. Bassett's first half display was a dominant one as they passed the ball around with confidence and gave their visitors the run around. While they did take the foot off the pedal somewhat in the second period, there was still no danger of them conceding, and a fifth clean sheet in six games was duly earned.

The game was over as a contest come the 24th minute, by which point Packer had already completed his hat-trick.

His first arrived on six minutes as he met Gio Wrona's perfectly weighted corner and flicked a near post header into the opposite top corner.

The playmaker's second resulted from another set piece on the quarter hour mark. Packer was tripped on the right edge of the box, dusted himself down and whipped a stunning free kick around the wall and beyond a helpless Victor Tallas-Hiranta in the Codicote goal.

All the action was happening at one end as Codicote's goal lay under siege.

And Sproule and Chris Jackson both came close before Packer grabbed his third.

After racing onto Jackson's ball in the left channel, Sproule cut inside his man before dragging a shot just wide of the near post, while Jackson saw a towering header crash off the bar after Wrona had floated a cross to the left post.

Minutes later the third arrived in contentious fashion. The visitors were punished after Harvey Scholes was lightly clipped in the box, and though the midfielder stayed on his feet a penalty was awarded, which Packer – ignoring captain Steve Yeardeley's desire to take spot kick himself – swept into the bottom left corner.

Sproule then came close again after being played in by Jackson, but his attempted lob could only find the roof of the net.

After Hanad Nur had Codicote's only shot of the game, which he arrowed across the face of goal and wide, Bassett continued their onslaught.

Great set up play from Sproule presented an unmarked Packer with a golden opportunity to grab his fourth, yet he skewed over his first time left foot shot from 15 yards.

The award is presented monthly to the best performing team in the Uhsport Hellenic League Premier Division and the combined Division One East and West.

Performance is calculated for each month of the season, with the production of a league table based in games played in the respective divisions along with FA Cup, FA Vase, and Hellenic League Cup games - it does not include County FA cup games or any external other cup a team may have entered.

A very important part of the final table produced for each month is a deduction of points for the number of bookings accrued during play. 1 point deducted for each yellow card - 2 points for a double yellow sending off in a game - 4 points for a straight red - 10 points for a mass melee.

The monthly total of those points are averaged against the number of games played. So effectively in any month a team could be top of the table having won every game, but end up bottom by not applying to the rules of the game.

The Full information is then provided to each member of the Uhsport Hellenic League committee to make a final vote.
