Welcome to Ascot United

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Ascot United for what is our penultimate home UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture of the 2017-18 Season. We hope all those from Ascot who have made the long journey today down the M4 enjoy their stay with us this afternoon and we wish them a safe journey home.

Since the last home game we have played just one more fixture, that coming last Tuesday night away at Oxford City Nomads. A late collapse saw us go down 5-0 for the second time this season against a good Oxford side. By all accounts the final score line does not reflect the performance as we competed well for all but the last 10 minutes and it is disappointing to concede a load of goal sin the closing stages, something that has been all too frequent this season. Hopefully we will put that right today else we may still yet get sucked into a relegation battle with possibly up to 4 sides being relegated this season.

Ascot currently sit in 15th place in the table, two places and eight points below ourselves but with two games in hand. Were we to lose today they could catch us by winning those games in hand so it is very important that we get a result of some sort today. Those who travelled down the M4 for the game at Ascot will recall that Ascot are very much a footballing side who play the ball on the deck and that meeting saw a very close game between two evenly matched sides. In the end the game was decided by a solitary goal from Harvey Scholes and we survived a few late scares to just about hand on to the three points. Expect another tough game here this afternoon.

In our last home game we picked up a useful point against another useful midtable side in Abingdon United. In this game it was our turn to score late on to take a share of the points. By all accounts Richie Saunders rolled back the years and had a solid game in a Bassett shirt and it is goo dto see him back playing in the blue and yellow.

With the transfer deadline for signing players fast approaching it will be interesting to see if Sam adds any other players before the cut-off. Personally, like we have brought Richie back into the fold, I would probably have approached Cricklade to see if we could tempt Matty Bennett across. Not seen him play in recent years but he still scoring goals at Wiltshire League level. I could be that I am guilty of living in the past, imagining the Matty of old ripping defences to shreds under Pete Yeardley, but thought I would throw it out there.

F.A. Vase

Well done to Thatcham Town winning the first leg of the their FA Vase semi-final last week with the second leg scheduled for this afternoon. All those involved in the UHlsport Hellenic League will no doubt be wishing them well this afternoon and hopefully the league will be represented in the Wembley Final on the 20th May (see advert for final elsewhere in today's programme).

Development Team

Since the last programme the Development Side have two games both of which have been lost. Two weeks ago they went down 4-0 away at Corsham Town Reserves then last Saturday, on a bitterly cold day, they lost 3-0 away at league leaders Melksham Town Reserves. Today they make the short trip to Purton before meeting the same opponents here at the Gerard Buxton Ground next season. Whilst our Development Side are well up with their fixtures, Purton still have half their fixtures still to play and will no doubt be grateful of a midweek encounter against ourselves before the clocks change to help catch-up.

The Sunday team's game last weekend fell victim to the snow that fell on Saturday night. They have slipped behind Eldene in the table but are still in the running for promotion to the top division in what

Ladies Team

The Ladies Team booked a place in the Wiltshire County Women's Cup final with a resounding 7-0 win against league rivals Swindon Spitfires. Hayley Huckin was the star of the semi-final show for Bassett as she netted six of her side's goals. The win ensured Bassett a first final berth since the 2013-14 campaign when they were defeated by Swindon Town. They will meet either fellow South West Women's League Eastern Division title contenders Swindon Town Development or Wiltshire County Women's League leaders Trowbridge Town in the showpiece, which is set to take place on Sunday 15th April at Melksham Town's Oakfield Stadium. Having earned a league runner-up finish and cup title last season, the County Cup could be the first of another outstanding double for the Ladies. Still atop the league, they will be hoping to get their hands on two pieces of silverware too.

Holland

With lots of free Saturday's of late in the Uhlspor Hellenic League (free even before the weather turned bad) it has given me the chance to get the Holland Tour programme finished early this year. When Spring comes around and the programme for the Youth Section Tour is prepared it always brings back some great memories of when I took my side to the Hague and Dordrecht 16+ years ago. Including the trips made under the banner of the school this will be the 30th anniversary of the a team from Wootton Bassett making the trip to Holland and it is great that Jan van der Deijl who arranged that first trip with Chris Kirkland from the school is still involved in the tour. A Holland Tour Information Evening for parents and players is being held in the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground clubhouse on Friday 23rd March at 6.30pm. Full details of the visit to Holland departing on Saturday 7th April will be given and there will be an opportunity to ask any questions. The meeting will last for around thirty minutes, and parents and players are strongly encouraged to attend.

Last Saturday, on what was a bitterly cold day, members of the Under 12, 13 and 14 sides braved the freezing conditions to raise over £1,000 for this year's Holland Tour as they cycled the distance between Bassett and Dordrecht. The 'Highway to Holland' event was the final instalment of the fundraising efforts for this year's tour, and the amount it drew in means that over £6,000 has been raised in all – an absolutely outstanding total. In the end, it took the players six hours to cover the 336 mile (540 kilometre) distance, representing the length of journey between Bassett and the location of the hostel the tour party will be staying at in the Netherlands. That was quicker than anticipated, though it was certainly much appreciated by all involved given the chilly weather! Huge thanks go to those who supported the event. Finally sincere thanks go from the entire club to Karen Watkinson and her team of fundraisers. It's truly been a magnificent effort from you all and what have you done is massively appreciated.

Best wishes to the Under 15 Blues and the Under 18 Yellow teams as they aim to book a County Ground place in the finals of the North Wilts League Cups. A preview of these games is contained later in the programme.

Opponents - History

Ascot United • Club History

Ascot United as we know it, was founded in 1965 by a men's team who played their games at Sunninghill with "after match meetings" in The Wells in Cheapside village (now Mikado's). Teams playing as long ago as 1928 under the name Ascot United but nothing to link them directly to the current club. In 1965, the club had gained permission from the Ascot Racecourse Trustees to convert the land east of coach park 10 into a football pitch. A wooden clubhouse was built and this team went on to win many prestigious trophies in the years that followed.



Various youth teams represented Ascot United over the years up to 1988, and 1992 the East Berks 7-a-side Association was formed by our then Chairman Keith Wicks introducing small-sided junior games and having disbanded in 1980 the men's team also reformed. The club continued to grow, entering into partnership with Charters School and being awarded FA Charter Standard status in 2004. The men's senior team enjoyed early success through the East Berks League gaining continued promotions to the Senior division and winning various Cups including the Fielden Charity Cup in 1996/7. 2001 saw the 1st team join the Reading Senior League and winning the Evening Post Senior Cup at the Madejski Stadium in 2006. Promotion to the Hellenic League soon followed in 2007, followed by promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division in 2009. The club today has grown to become one of the largest Community football clubs in the UK with over 1000 registered players and over 70 teams playing every weekend embracing all ages and abilities from 5 year olds through to Vets. A new clubhouse opened in September 2010, together with an improved main pitch, floodlights and a stand.

The club has enjoyed much success at all levels particularly in the Ladies and Girls Section where they are regularly winners of leagues and county Cups. Last season, our senior Ladies won promotion to the Premier Division of the Southern Region Women's Football League. In 2015, the Under 16 Youth team finally won a Boys' County Cup, and in 2016 both of our Under 15 Boys' sides ended the season with cup victories.

The past half a decade has been hugely successful for our first team; our debut in the FA Cup in 2011 attracted 1,149 people to the Racecourse on a Friday evening where the famous trophy itself was on display and the match was streamed live on Facebook. Since 2012-13 we have reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase twice, enjoyed two top-three finishes in the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division, and won both the Bluefin Sport Challenge Cup and Perpetua Press Floodlit Cup. Last season saw a period of change including a new management team and relatively young playing squad. However, manager Neil Richards has continued to strengthen his squad since his appointment in January 2017 with the aim of bringing further success to the Racecourse in the near future.

Youth Section Cup Semi-Finals

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's Under 18 Yellow and Under 15 Blue teams are aiming to book a County Ground place as they face the prospect of semi-finals in the North Wilts League Cup this weekend.

The elder of the two sides will need to pull off an upset to book their final place as they square off against Division One FC Chippenham Youth.

But Bassett, who ply their trade in Division Two, have already knocked out higher division opposition on their journey to the last four.

Highworth, currently sitting a place below Bassett in the league, began with a narrow win by the odd goal in seven against Wanborough Juniors Black. Their 16-0 second round victory against FC Abbey Meads Rangers was much routine, while they beat Division Three promotion hopefuls Stratton Youth 3-1 in the last eight.

Kick off for their tie at Beversbrook is 3.45pm, with the victors progressing to face Swindon Supermarine R or Cirencester Town in the showpiece.

Player Profile

Callum Wright - Midfield



A former Chelsea and Bristol City youth, Wright is a gifted midfielder who is returning to the club after a lengthy spell out with a knee injury suffered while at university in the United States of America.

An assured passer of the ball, strong in the tackle and boasting a high level of football intelligence, he is capable of dictating a game from the centre of the park.

Wright initially joined Bassett in 2013/14, having spent that pre-season with Conference South outfit Weston-Super-Mare. In all he made eight appearances, four of which came from the bench including his debut against Highmoor Ibis in a 2-2 draw. Wright featured at full back, in wide midfield as

well as in the centre of midfield – his most natural position. He then signed with Chippenham Town in November, and featured sparingly for the Bluebirds until re-signing with Bassett.

Wright appeared 27 times for Bassett in 2014-15, scoring twice. His first goal came in a 3-2 comeback victory against Cheltenham Saracens, while he also netted in a 1-1 draw against Kidlington late in the season. He largely played in the centre of midfield, though also filled in at centre half when necessary and produced high quality displays in both positions.

He then featured five times at the beginning of the 2015-16 campaign, before moving to the USA to take up a scholarship at the University of Incarnate Word in San Antonio, Texas. Playing in the NCAA Division One Western Athletic Conference, Wright played fifteen times for the Cardinals before suffering a serious knee injury.

Last season saw Wright sit out the majority of the campaign as he rehabbed from his injury, though he did appear twice for Bassett towards the end of the year.

At 12 years of age, Wright moved from Swindon Town to Chelsea, where he played in the same youth side as England under 21 international Josh McEachran and Olympic sprinter Adam Gemili. A severe injury eventually led to his release from the Premier League club, and he was soon picked up by Bristol City, earning a place as a scholar. Wright now is a student at the University of Bath, and in 2012/13 made eight appearances for New College.

After a week to forget comes a performance to remember

Racecourse Ground, 29th August 2015

Any team who had endured as torrid a past week as Royal Wootton Bassett Town would have been satisfied to get back on track with a narrow victory or even just a scrappy draw. Paul Braithwaite's side weren't content with that however, producing a stunning team performance that resulted in a 4-1 away victory over Ascot United.

Never before had Bassett beaten the Yellamen on their own turf. But with hat-trick man Steve Robertson in rampant form and a defence - still smarting after conceding ten goals in their past two outings - that shackled the hosts' dangermen for the majority of the game, they recorded one of the club's best wins in a long while.

Only in the opening quarter of the game could it be claimed that Ascot - convincing 3-0 winners against Flackwell Heath in the week - had the upper hand. In that period they took the lead through Joe Jarra, who lashed home from twelve yards after Steve Deverall's inswinging corner fell perfectly for him, and had Jarra and Damien Markman skew a pair of threatening opportunities off target. Yet, once Bassett had found their feet they were more than a match for the home side. They signalled to Ascot that they were in for a difficult afternoon when a well-crafted move ended with Steve Yeardley seeing his glancing header deflected onto the bar on 25 minutes. After that it didn't take long for the visitors to get on level terms, and they did so in sublime fashion. Purposefully, Bassett shifted the ball around the midfield before it was turned around the corner to Yeardley, who had made a darting run into space that had opened in behind the Ascot defence. The skipper advanced down the right before clipping a perfectly weighted cross into the path of Robertson, who guided a fine header beyond the reach of Chris Grace.

Confidence grew mightily following that equaliser. A snap shot on the turn from Dan Bailey forced Grace to scurry across goal and save at his near post before Nathan Gambling fizzed a dangerous low ball across the six yard box, which needed just a touch to divert it goalwards. Robertson then seized upon an error from home centre half Alex Rodrigues, presenting Gambling with a one-on-one opportunity, which the centre forward, having the ball stick in his feet, failed to capitalise upon. However, Gambling made amends on the stroke of half time, planting a firm header into the top right corner as he connected with Harvey Scholes' brilliant right wing delivery.

Following what was an evenly contested opening period, that goal would prove vital. Ascot were forced to chase the game following the restart, coming close early on as Joe Grant shot from range and forced Luke Kuczynski to tip around the post. Bassett were able to soak up the large majority of the pressure which the hosts sought to apply though. Playing with great patience, they were then able to pick off Ascot on the break. One such counter resulted in Bailey playing a clever reverse pass for Robertson, who, goalside of Jesse Wilson, was clearly dragged back by the Ascot defender only for no penalty to be awarded. When Bassett's third goal eventually arrived, there was no need for any assistance from the officials. It followed a swift transition from defence to attack as Gambling raced onto Dale Richards' clipped pass in the left corner before cutting back for Bailey on the edge of the box. The midfielder's shot was blocked, but the ball deflected into the path of Robertson who eventually prodded in from close range. An immediate reply almost arrived via the head of Jamie West. However, his connection with David Pitt's cross flashed inches wide of the right post. That would be the last occasion on which Ascot threatened though as thereafter they were limited to a series of pot shots from distance thanks to continued resolute defending. They were then punished for trying to commit too many men forward with ten minutes to go when Robertson raced onto a Richards' clearance which had split the hosts' centre halves and coolly slotted past Grace to complete his hat-trick and nab his sixth goal in the past three games. Given that record, his week has been a personal success. Prior to the Ascot visit, it had certainly not been a seven days to look back on with pride for his teammates. This grand day at the races is certainly one that deserves to be recalled fondly though.

Man of the Match: Adam Corcoran - produced a commanding performance at centre half alongside Nathan Hawkins as the pair silenced dangerous frontmen Jamie West and Damien Markman.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated in the small market town six miles west of Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established within the town in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in the county of Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the prestigious Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although both ended in defeat. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when the club began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by local dignitary Major Gerard Buxton for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County Senior League with limited success until Season 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. Season 1987-88 also saw the club again reach the final of the Wiltshire Senior Cup but that first win remained elusive. That changed in 1998-99, however, when the Club defeated Pewsey Vale 3-2 in the final at the County Ground and success was again achieved in Season 2000-01 when Shrewton were defeated 2-0 in the final. The First Team, having finished runners-up in Division One West in Season 2012-13, currently play in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League, at Step 5 of the Football Pyramid.

As well as the First Team the Club has always run an adult Development/Reserve team. Since the onset of the new millennium the club has also expanded significantly, with the establishment of a large thriving Youth Section and a very successful Ladies Section. The Ladies side recently did the "double" of being cup winners and securing promotion in the same season. The latest addition to the Club has been the establishment of a Veterans team, so the club now operates 26 teams from under 7s upwards. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established, with three Youth Section teams touring Holland annually since 2001. This has led to a relationship with amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande, who are based near The Hague.

The club now play their games at the fantastic New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, the Club continues to thrive as a key part of the community of Royal Wootton Bassett. Season 2017-18 again sees Rich Hunter in charge of the First Team as the Club looks to better its highest ever position in Non-League football the 11th place finish achieved in Season 2014-15. The Club will again be entering the F.A. Cup and F.A. Vase with the Development side playing in the Wiltshire County League.

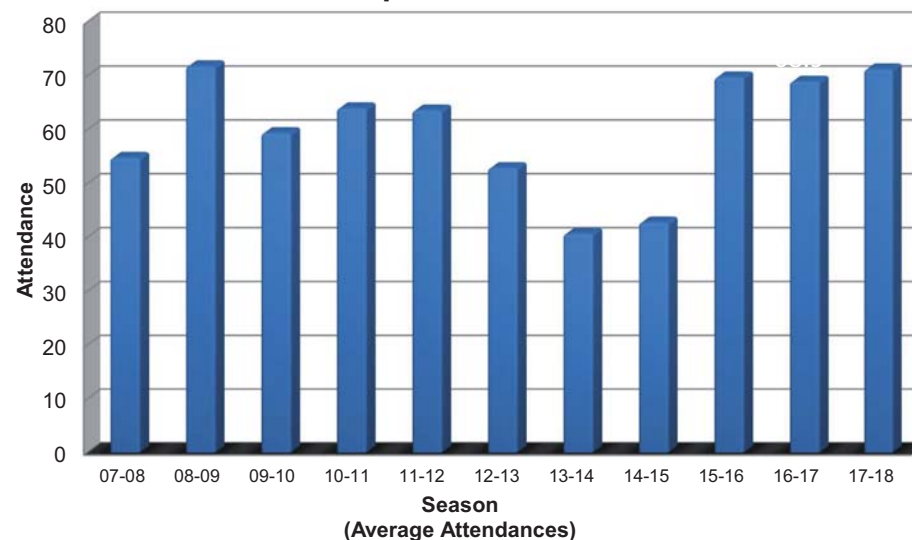

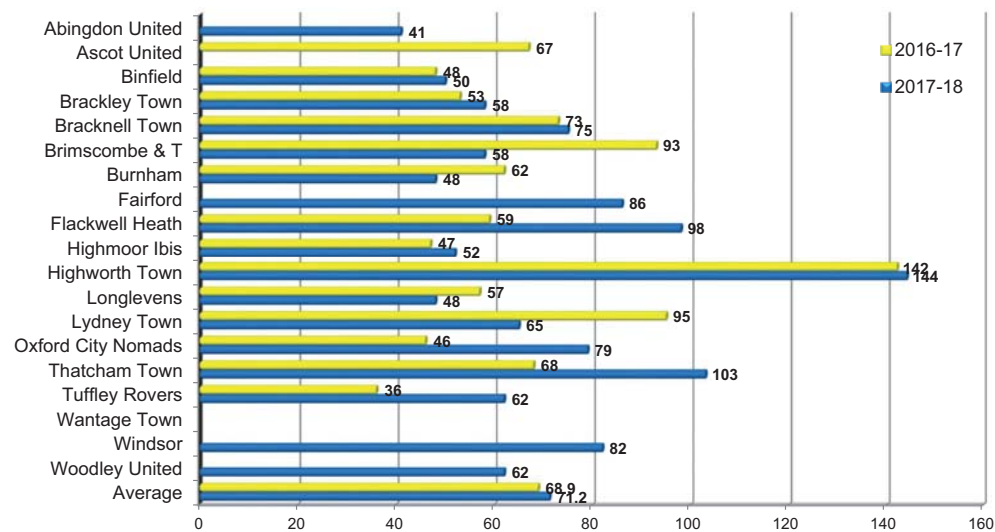

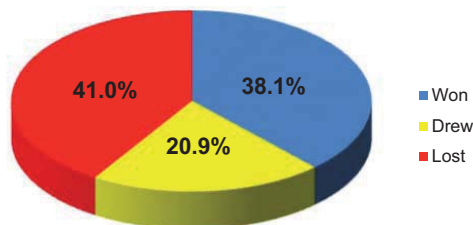

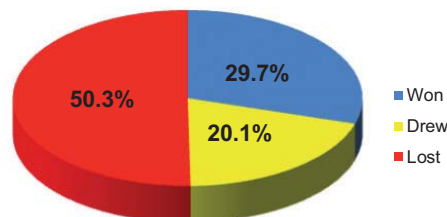

The lifeline that saved offered was soon seized upon. With ninety minutes on the clock, Withers was fouled on the left edge of the box. Wright stepped up and produced a free kick that had Woodcock beat only to be denied by the woodwork. Luck was finally on Bassett's side though, and Richards was in place to drill into the back of the net.

It was almost the prelude to a thrilling come from behind win too. After blocking a clearance, Robinson jumped on the loose ball before being hauled down by McCormack, who was duly dismissed.

Wright again lined up the free kick, at least thirty yards from goal, and smashed a thunderous strike towards goal. Woodcock was unable to react to the ball, which, though hit towards the middle of goal, moved sharply. For the second time in as many minutes, however, the crossbar would get in the way.

It meant the spoils were to be shared after an entertaining, eventful ninety minutes of football. While a long-awaited return to winning ways in the league does remain elusive for Bassett, this was a result they can be satisfied with.

Not least for the promise shown by the fearless youngsters given their chance to impress.

Man of the Match: George Staten - stepping up from the Development team, the seventeen year old performed extremely well in his full first team debut. Staten was, sensible and effective with his passing, unafraid to run at the Abingdon backline and, importantly given he was playing at wing back, willing to contribute at both ends of the pitch.

Late drama delivers deserved point

Dale Richards scored a dramatic 90th minute equaliser to seal a point for Royal Wootton Bassett Town in an entertaining 1-1 draw with Abingdon United.

Despite an impressive performance - which included fine displays from young debutants Alex Bowers and George Staten, it appeared as though Royal Wootton Bassett Town were going to come up empty-handed once more against visitors Abingdon United.

And when Callum Wright curled a stunning last minute free kick onto the underside of the crossbar frustration seemed as though it would be the feeling Sam Collier's side would finish the game with.

However, within seconds Bassett had grabbed a deserved equaliser, the rebound dropping for Dale Richards, who, with extreme composure, drilled a half volley from twelve yards into the back of the net.

Richards' first goal of the season ensured a fair outcome to what had been a closely fought encounter. Both sides were more confident in attack than they were in defence and that led to them trading periods when they were the team on the top.

Initially it was Abingdon - whose football was positive throughout - holding the whip hand, which resulted in the visitors taking an eighth minute lead.

With the Bassett midfield standing off, they were able to comfortably work the ball from left to right. Right back Cian McCormack had moved into an advanced position, and after receiving possession he steered a low cross into the box, which John Dennis was first to meet, the forward steering a delicate first time shot past Bowers and in off the post.

Although taking time to settle, Bassett's response was almost instant as Ryan Withers - another youngster who performed well - raced onto Gio Wrona's defence splitting through ball. But the forward rushed his shot, allowing Henry Woodcock to save on the dive.

Passed played in behind proved to be a vulnerability for both defences, with Bassett next to be caught out.

Tom Butler was the recipient of such a pass on nineteen minutes and strode forward with purpose before being brought down by Bowers outside the penalty area. Fortunately for the young shotstopper, Steve Yeardley was providing cover, while Butler was going away from goal at the point of contact, resulting in only a caution from the referee.

The 'keeper remained a key part of the action shortly after, maintaining focus to track McCormack's deflected shot and prevent it from sneaking in at the right post.

Save for Butler heading over after a quick counter, for the remainder of the half it was Bassett who appeared in the ascendancy. The pace of Withers and probing play from the likes of Kai Robinson and Staten - who really stood out at left wing back - was asking questions of Abingdon, with equalising goals nearly arriving on two occasions before the break.

After racing onto a chipped Wright pass, Withers cut inside from the right and fired over from the edge of the box when a pass inside to an onrushing Wrona may have been the better option.




Then, in stoppage time Wrona won a free kick just outside the area, which Jon Beeden sent towards the top corner only to see Woodcock fingertip over.

Since the last programme there has been a marked improvement in the results for Chippenham Town. A flying start on Saturday gave their National League South survival hopes another massive shot in the arm as they defeated Weston-super-Mare 2-0 at home. Andy Sandell fired Chippenham ahead after just nine minutes and Mark Collier's side were well on their way to a second straight league win – and third in a row in all competitions – just three minutes later when Mike Jones hit the back of the net. Chippenham had won 3-1 the previous weekend away at basement boys Whitehawk before following that league win with an 8-0 thrashing of Bemerton Heath Harlequins in the Wiltshire Senior Cup semi-finals in midweek. They will now play either Highworth Town or Salisbury in the final, with the other semi-final scheduled for last Tuesday and at the time of writing these notes it looked unlikely to go ahead because of the weekend snow. Perhaps by the time you read these notes the other finalists will be known but there would have needed to be a quick change in the weather to allow the game on Tuesday to go ahead. Chippenham's latest league victory has moved them seven points clear of the bottom three and also moved them one place above Hungerford Town who are themselves in a bad run of form and also believed to be struggling financially.

At Step 4 Salisbury had an entertaining battle with runaway leaders Taunton Town on Saturday. Salisbury took the lead in the first minute of the game when Stuart Green got on the end of a Danny Young cross. Taunton responded well and got themselves back on level terms when Shane White rose to head home Ryan Brett's cross on 15 minutes. Following another cross from Brett Taunton went in front when Matt Wright got on the end of the cross to put Taunton in front a couple of minutes before the break. A second goal on 65 minutes from Stuart Green denied Taunton a potentially title-clinching victory. The point a piece left Taunton eight points clear of Salisbury with a game in hand, with Salisbury having 10 games left to play. Salisbury themselves are ten points clear of third placed Wimborne Town so they look like joining Taunton at Step 3 next season. Swindon Supermarine are up into fourth spot a point behind Wimborne after their 2-0 home win over Evesham united on Saturday. Goals from Joe Selman and Brad Hooper in the first half ensured all three points went Supermarine's way. Brad Hooper should have had a second late on but he missed when clean through on goal.

At Step 5 Highworth Town continue to push FA Vase semi-finalists Thatcham Town all the way in the title race. With Thatcham engaged in Vase action, Highworth extended their league at the top to five points with Thatcham having two games in hand. With the two sides set to meet next week in midweek a Highworth win would go a long way to wrapping up the title. A draw or win for Thatcham and it would be Thatcham who would become favorites for the title. Not sure Thatcham will be too impressed that the game is scheduled straight after their two tough FA Vase semi-final games and they will certainly need to get the Vase out of their heads pretty quickly before the big league game.

Bradford Town and Melksham Town are still also involved in the Western League title race with Bradford in second spot and Melksham Town in third spot with just two points separating the two Wiltshire sides. On Saturday Melksham Town had an impressive 5-1 away win at Clevedon Town whilst Bradford Town dropped a couple of points when they were held at home by mid-table Hengrove Athletic, 2-2 the score in this one. Another side drawing were Bemerton Heath Harlequins who recovered from their Wiltshire Senior Cup mauling at the hands of Chippenham to come back with a point from their trip to Alresford. The other Wiltshire side Amesbury Town were involved in an 11 goal thriller with Bashley eventually losing 6-5 in a match which would have pleased the neutrals if not the defensive coaching staff of the two clubs.

Reports on the action from the last Saturday in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League is contained elsewhere in the programme.
