Welcome to Codicote

A warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Codicote for this Buildbase FA Vase 2nd Qualifying Round tie. We hope all those from Codicote enjoy their short stay with us today and we wish them a safe journey home back to Hertfordshire. If today's game results in a draw there will be extra-time and penalties rather than a replay, both teams agreeing to this ahead of today's fixture.

Codicote play in Division 1 of the Spartan South Midlands League. As I said in our FA Cup game against Crawley Green, another side from the Spartan South Midland League, when the F.A. Cup and F.A. Vase draws are made the one big desire I always have is that we do not draw someone from our own league and we have had this in both competitions this season. It goes without saying that today's encounter is the first ever meeting between the two sides. Whilst the two sides have not met we have now played two sides from the Spartan South Midlands League. Earlier this season we lost 2-1 at home Premier Division side Crawley Green in the FA Cup. Nathan Gambling scored our consolation goal that day. Our one and only other encounter with sides from the league came back in season 2008-09 when a hat-trick from Shaun Terry inspired us to a 5-3 extra-time win over Buckingham Athletic. The only player still turning out in blue and yellow from that day who might play today is Steve Yeardley who also scored that today, Craig Shand getting the other goal. Codicote have had a tough start to the season and at the time of writing sit second from bottom in the table with just one win from their opening nine league and cup fixtures. The one win came away at Hillingdon Borough. Of these opening nine fixtures, seven have been away from home. Codicote are managed by a familiar face to UHLSORT Hellenic League sides with former Watford, Stoke and Burnley striker Gifton Noel-Williams, who was previously with Burnham, in the hot seat.

Lydney Town - Home

The last home game here at the Gerard Buxton Ground saw us play a strong Lydney Town side for the second time this season and in an excellent all-round team performance we secured our third win in a row and second league win of the season. The goal was decided by a stunning strike from Gio Wrona, if you missed it go on Your Sport Swindon and I am sure you will get the chance to vote for it in September's Goal of the Month competition when it appears on the news site. The team defended really well from back to front on the Tuesday night and desaken off them which bodes well for the season as a whole, as you know they will be a side in the top half of the league. On the subject of the Your Sport Swindon Goal of the Month competition I hope you have all gone on and voted for Sam Packer's late goal away at Highworth Town on Bank Holiday Monday.

Highmoor Ibis - Away

Last Saturday saw us make the trip to Reading to play Highmoor Ibis, never an easy place to visit, not just because the opponents are normally a strong skilful side, but also because the traffic can be a nightmare getting there as I found out getting to the match a minute before kick-off. Well done to Highmoor on the improvements they are making at the ground. The pitch was in the best condition I have seen at the ground and they had spruced up the clubhouse with a new ceiling and I also understand improved the dressing room area. This is great to see especially as we have to now go there twice a season with Woodley United also now in the Premier Division. In a tight first half, we went in front just before half time when Ben Lodge was tripped in the box and Steve Yeardley converted the resulting penalty. Whilst the first half had been a tight affair I thought Highmoor had looked the most dangerous going forward so it was pleasing to go in 1-0 up at the break. The second half was a different story though as we were much the better side creating numerous chances without looking like we would concede at the other end. In the end the introduction of subs Sam Collier and Ryan Withers allowed us to secure all three points as young Ryan set up Sam for the second goal and then created the third for Harvey Scholes with an excellent run and cut-back. Against a physical back-four Ryan did really well and for one so young

Opponents - History

Our earliest records date back to the season 1913/14 when Codicote joined the Hertfordshire County League Eastern division, where we remained until the league was reorganised in 1921 moving Codicote into the North & East division.

In 1923 the league was reduced to a single league and at the end of 1924/25 season the Herts League was disbanded. The league reformed once again but only for one season in 1926/27 before disbanding again. Codicote then joined the North Herts League and remained there until 1993 when the present Chairman Jim Bundy and then Manager took Codicote once again back into the Herts Senior County League.

At the end of 2009 after promotion to the Herts Premier League (03) and winning the Herts Centenary Trophy (06) Jim moved upstairs and handed the reins over, with the aim to progress the side into the Spartan South Midlands League. The Club invested in two ground sharing agreements firstly 2 seasons at Hertford Town and a further 2 seasons at Gosling Sports Park enabling the Club to achieve the facilities required by Step 6 clubs. Subsequent Managers Dan Kenroy (now Bedford Town) and Adam Fisher (now Welwyn Gdn City) just failed in getting the club promoted but in 2011/12 under the management of Liam Errington and Jim Mullen the Club finally saw the team achieve promotion to their current position in the Spartan League.

The club extending the ground share at Gosling and in the Clubs first season in the Spartan South Midlands League they reach the Challenge Cup Final and virtue of their League position gained entry into the Herts Charity Cup and the FA Cup. 2013/14-15 Liam remained in charge once again pushing the Club toward those promotion spots.

In 2014/15 Jim Mullen left the Club and was replaced by Keith Coughlin as joint manager of the 1st Team from Southern League side Arlesey Town and the Club moved the Reserves side from the Herts County League into the Spartan South Midlands League for one season. Liam retired from management at the end of 2015 and the Club has brought in Steve Young , Hendy Manning and Roy Ryall (ex Stotfold) to join Keith.

The club now has full planning permission to move back home in 2016 as we upgrade the facilities to achieve Step 5 Football at Codicote.

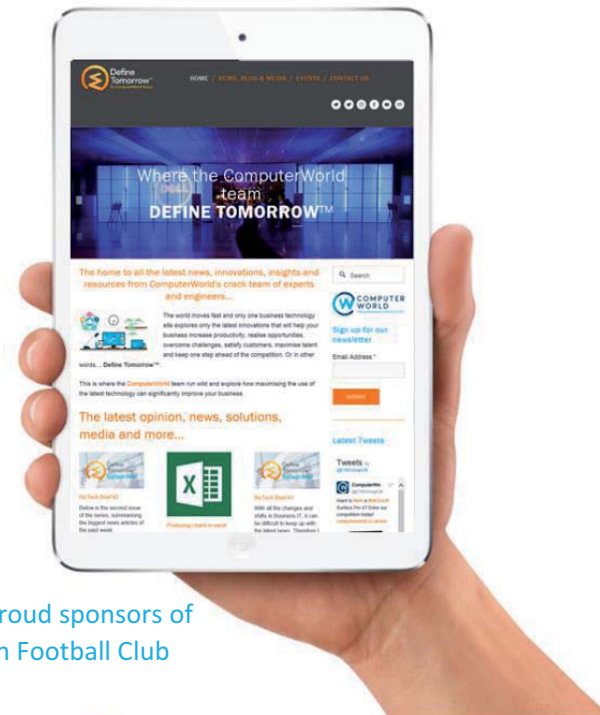

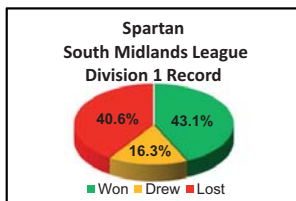
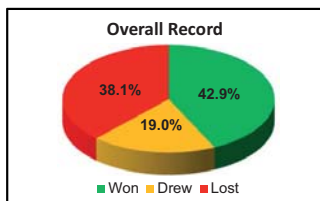

Wessex League Wimborne had a modest record in the competition before then, having never ventured beyond the third round, but they embarked on a spectacular journey that took them all the way from the first round to the Final. A goal down after 14 minutes at Wembley, the Dorset side fought back to win 5-3.

When The Vase Final returned to Wembley, a record 36,232 fans saw Truro City beat AFC Totton 3-1. Whitley Bay, the 2002 winners, achieved a sensational hat-trick of Final victories from 2009 to 2011.

The Northern League's dominance continued for two more seasons, with success for Dunston UTS and Spennymoor Town before Sholing, then Wessex League champions, got their name engraved. North Shields then came from behind to win the first Final to go to extra time since 2001-02.

In 2015-16 Wembley Stadium staged the first Non-League Finals Day, which saw both the Vase and the Trophy decided back-to-back in front of almost 47,000 fans. Morpeth Town came from behind to stun Hereford 4-1 with 45-year-old Chris Swales on the scoresheet to win the Vase with a third different club. Last season the competition was won by South Shields who defeated Cleethorpes 4-0 in the final at Wembley.

The FA Vase effectively replaced The FA Amateur Cup in 1974.

In that year The FA Council had decided to abolish the official distinction between amateur and professional footballers and this meant the end of The Amateur Cup and Amateur Internationals involving England.

In its first season 220 clubs entered, but they did not include those that had dominated in The Amateur Cup. Enfield, Hendon, Dagenham, Skelmersdale United and others at their level were immediately allocated to The FA Trophy.

For the first time in history, small clubs – even village clubs – had the chance of playing in a national final at Wembley.

The first Vase finalists were Hoddesdon Town from the Spartan League and Epsom & Ewell from the Surrey Senior League. The Hertfordshire side edged home 2-1 before a crowd of 9,000.

Even a competition as democratic as The Vase had its elite clubs in the early years. Billericay Town, initially of the Essex Senior League, won it three times in four seasons. Halesowen Town, then in the West Midlands Regional League, appeared in three Finals and were successful in two. They even beat a Southall side that had a young Les Ferdinand leading the attack.

Until the new Wembley opened in 2007 the record attendance for a Vase Final was the 26,489 who saw the drawn 1989 Final between Sudbury Town and Tamworth at the old Wembley. Tamworth won the replay 3-0 at Peterborough and Ian Moores, a former Division One player with Tottenham Hotspur, scored one of the goals.

The 2013-14 Vase competition was the 40th in history. Wembley had hosted 34 Finals, Villa Park and St Andrews two each, Upton Park and White Hart Lane one each. Thirty-two different clubs have got their hands on The Vase, donated by former FA Councillor Frank Adams. Whitley Bay lead the way with four wins.

The 'keeper was particularly impressive in a trial match held against the Royal Air Force, making a string of important saves to ensure of a 1-0 victory for the ESFA squad.

Football seems to run in the blood too, as his sister Chloe currently features for Swindon Town Ladies in the FA Women's Premier League Southern Division, having played last season for Bassett's double-winning Under 16 Girls side as well as the Wiltshire Ladies representative team.



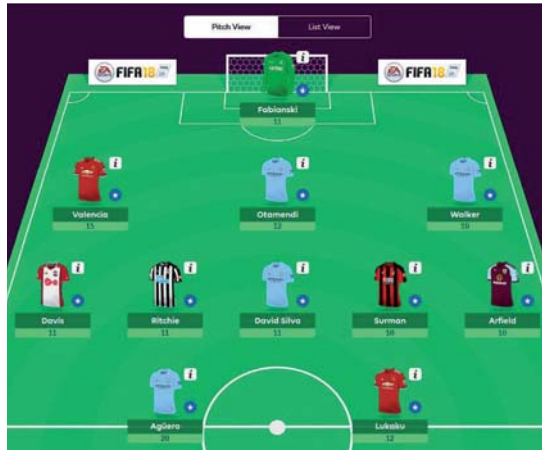

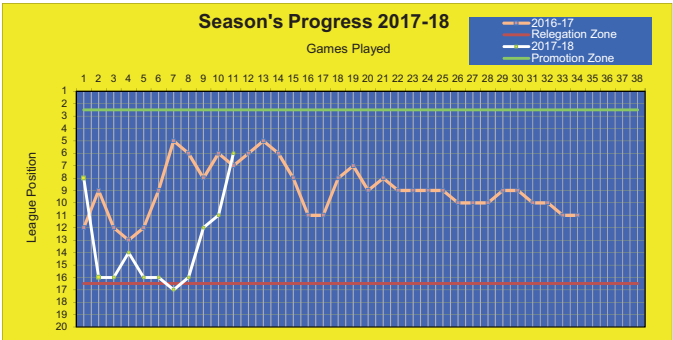

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated in the small market town six miles west of Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established within the town in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in the county of Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the prestigious Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although both ended in defeat. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when the club began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by local dignitary Major Gerard Buxton for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County Senior League with limited success until Season 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. Season 1987-88 also saw the club again reach the final of the Wiltshire Senior Cup but that first win remained elusive. That changed in 1998-99, however, when the Club defeated Pewsey Vale 3-2 in the final at the County Ground and success was again achieved in Season 2000-01 when Shrewton were defeated 2-0 in the final. The First Team, having finished runners-up in Division One West in Season 2012-13, currently play in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League, at Step 5 of the Football Pyramid.

As well as the First Team the Club has always run an adult Development/Reserve team. Since the onset of the new millennium the club has also expanded significantly, with the establishment of a large thriving Youth Section and a very successful Ladies Section. The Ladies side recently did the "double" of being cup winners and securing promotion in the same season. The latest addition to the Club has been the establishment of a Veterans team, so the club now operates 26 teams from under 7s upwards. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established, with three Youth Section teams touring Holland annually since 2001. This has led to a relationship with amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande, who are based near The Hague.

The club now play their games at the fantastic New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, the Club continues to thrive as a key part of the community of Royal Wootton Bassett. Season 2017-18 again sees Rich Hunter in charge of the First Team as the Club looks to better its highest ever position in Non-League football the 11th place finish achieved in Season 2014-15. The Club will again be entering the F.A. Cup and F.A. Vase with the Development side playing in the Wiltshire County League.

In This Week From the Archives...

Messenger's Delivery Not Enough for Bassett

Rylands Way, 24th September 2005

Tom Messenger's first half goal wasn't enough for Bassett as a second half free kick from Lee Beavis earned Malmesbury a point in a local derby that offered little in front of goal.

Bassett started hesitantly and were nearly caught on the break on 13 minutes after Messenger lost possession near midfield allowing Ed Wilkins to get a shot in on goal but his effort was wide of the mark.

Seven minutes later Andrew Waller shot wide from the edge of the area after Steve Yeardley failed to clear from a long throw.

Messenger found the back of the net in the 26th minute. Matty Bennett won the ball at the halfway line after a good tackle and played a crossfield ball towards Steve Bunting. However, Malmesbury defender Jake Fisher was there to cut the ball out but he didn't control the ball allowing Bunting to square the ball into the box and Messenger tapped in from six yards.

Neither side managed to produce much more before the break with both sets of frontmen not getting any good balls to run onto. Bennett did have a half chance two minutes before the break but his shot from a tight angle went wide.

Malmesbury got out off the blocks quickest in the second half and pressurised the Bassett back three.

Andrew Mitchell should have done better from just inside the box after Bassett were caught outnumbered at the back but Mitchell shot wide.

Chris Mills replaced Craig Maclaren in the 50th minute before Beavis equalised for the visitors.

A stupid foul 25 yards out put Malmesbury in good position and as Bassett prepared for the free kick Beavis stepped up with a quick free kick which was helped on into the back of the net by the head of Dwayne Quinn leaving John Haines with no chance.

New signing Mark Edmonds replaced Ben Gascoyne on 66 minutes as Gascoyne, who had a good first half taking on the Malmesbury defence, didn't get into the second half.

Wilkins shot over from 20 yards midway through the second half after once again Bassett failed to clear properly from a corner.

At the other end, Bennett should have done better after a through ball from Bunting set Bennett behind the Malmesbury defence. Bennett's off balance shot rolled just wide of the mark though.

Ben Fitch struck just wide for Malmesbury with quarter of an hour left before Jack Dodd replaced Bunting.

With six minutes to go Beavis nearly was the hero for Malmesbury as he put a glancing header on an Alan Webb cross, luckily for Bassett though the ball shaved the post and went wide with Haines beaten.

Another silly foul on the edge of the box two minutes into injury time gave Malmesbury another opportunity to find a winner but Waller's free kick and follow up were both blocked by the Bassett wall before a cross from the left was met by Fitch whose header looped goalwards only for Haines to pull off a fine save on the back-pedal to save Bassett's blushes.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Tom Messenger – scored a good goal and also solid in the tackle winning the majority of balls he went for.

Scoop Rating: 6/10 – Lacked a killer touch and never troubled Malmesbury's goal, looking panicky at times. Midfield didn't provide enough for Bennett and Moses Greene upfront as most of the balls forward were high ones taking away both striker's main weapon – their ability to take players on.

Kintbury Rangers remain in third place and should have been in county cup action but their tie with Newbury was postponed when their opponents were unable to field a side.

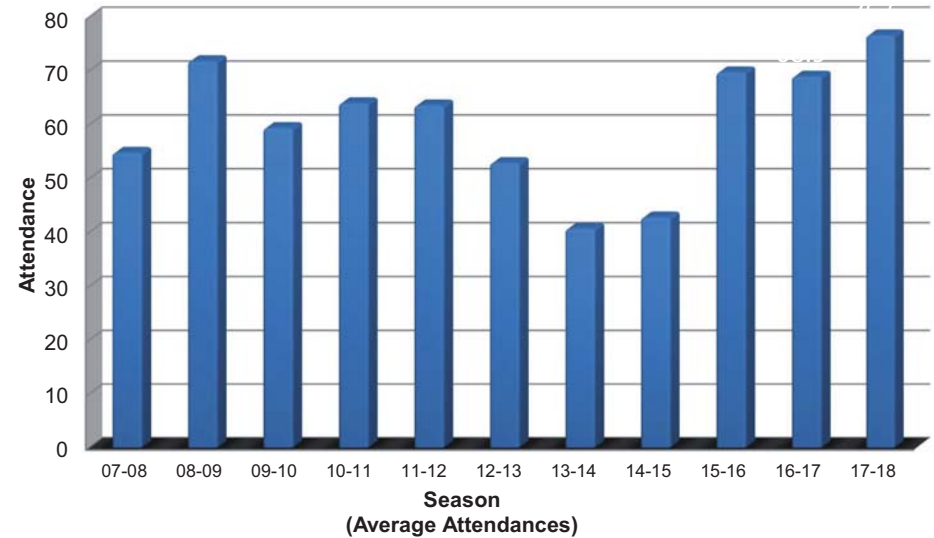

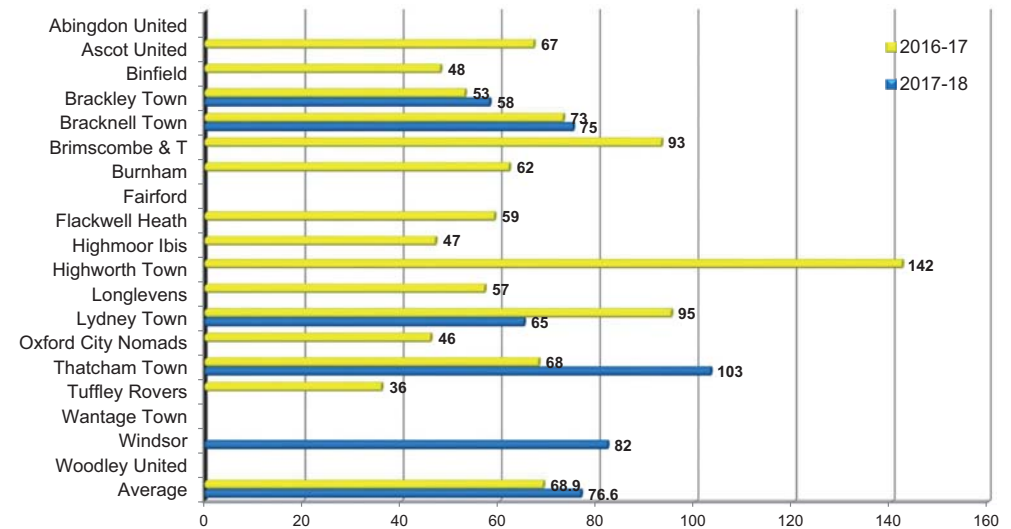


RWBTFC Attendances

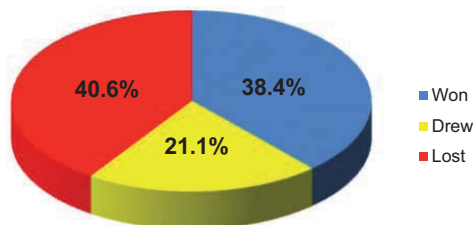

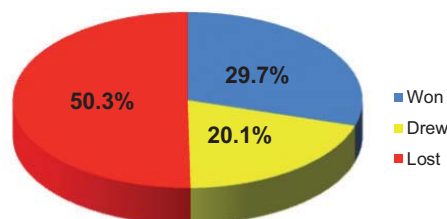

Growing up as a young football-going boy you get used to certain ways of life that you can only learn at football grounds.

It's much better to smell onions than the cut them is something that can be learnt by watching the food bar manager wipe away the tears streaming down their cheeks.

Whether it's the start of the season in August or conclusion of the season in May, always take a jacket – this is Britain after all.

You quickly learn which swear words are light-hearted and which are blacklisted depending on a spectator's humour or vitriol at a match incident.

Now in to my mid-twenties, I've learnt something which never occurred to me as a child despite it starring me plumb in the face: baldness.

Look around at any football ground and you will see many examples of a man's will battling against genetics and aging; I am currently at the stage where I have developed a surprisingly spherical penalty spot at towards the back of my head as if crafted by the ground staff at Wembley.

I am sure we would all like to look like Carlos Valderrama rather than Zinedine Zidane, but vanity in football wilts under 'wow' moments, heart, and a player's humility.

Take a look at Barry Hayles now in the Hellenic Premier Division with Windsor, still going strong at 46 and at his seventh Non-League club this decade.

In my work on The NLP's website any story centered on Hayles is received with more interest and admiration than most others, because of his commitment and the impression he makes.

Oxford City fans will remember striker Lee Steele, a poacher number 10 who would stick the ball in the back of the net from no further out than eight yards.

I remember him as one of the heroes of Leyton Orient's promotion season of 2005/06 who bagged a 90th-minute winner which guaranteed the first promotion since I was 2.

I also remember him for the reasons behind him being sacked by City in 2012 when he posted a homophobic tweet on Twitter.

An incident not in his nature as echoed by then-manager Mike Ford, but nonetheless an inexcusable error made in poor taste that left his employers with no other alternative.

Often, if you're unable to learn from other people you have to learn the hard way yourself and football provides one environment that defines right from wrong.

Football is an environment which in the short term values the detriment of wrong over hero status, and there are consequences. You can't exactly say the same for athletics or cycling.

Steele has since been able to get back into football to work as a fitness coach where his hair has regrown and a stern lesson in conduct learned.

Mistakes are often as serious as the results they cause, that's why I let someone else chop the onions.




