Bassett News

Tonight's Game

Good evening and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Ground for our second home fixture of the UHlsport Hellenic League 2018-19 Season. A warm welcome to our visitors from Fairford who have made the short journey for this evening's encounter. With former Bassett players Ben Mitchell, Ben Lodge, Dan Bailey, Nathan Hawkins, Matty Boucher and Mason Thompson in their ranks there will be a few familiar faces making a return to the Gerard Buxton Ground here tonight. Between them Dan and Nathan made 260 appearances for Royal Wootton Bassett Town and always gave 100% for this club so I hope everyone from the club gives them a warm welcome on their return in opposition colours.

Last season Fairford finished in 18th place and in a relegation position but were reprieved from relegation with the various changes that took place as part of the re-organisation of the National League System that were referred to in the last programme. Jody Bevan's side will be looking to make sure they finish well clear of the relegation positions this season and he has made some astute signings in the summer as Fairford look to build on their first season back in the top flight of the Hellenic League. Last Saturday they kicked off their season with a tough looking fixture against everyone's title favourites Wantage Town and with 10 minutes to go were leading 2-0 despite having played much of the match with 10 men following an early sending off. Playing one man short in such hot conditions and against quality opposition finally took its toll as Wantage scored three times, including the winner in the last minute from former Bassett player Steve Robertson, his second of the game. In fact, all three Wantage goals came from former Bassett players as Chris Jackson, who played for us last season scored the first Wantage goal. I am also led to believe that Robbo's first goal was somewhat controversial. Fairford will be looking to bounce back from that last-minute heartbreak here tonight, local derbies are always close encounters, so we know we are in for a tough game here tonight.

Tuffley Game

Whilst Fairford were playing Wantage our league season kicked off in style with an impressive performance and result with the 6-1 win over a young and skilful Tuffley Rovers side. TJ Bohane did what TJ Bohane does by firing a fine hat-trick but there were also impressive league debuts from Danny Lachacz, Bradley Pagliaroli, Rob Lincoln, Iggy Ilott, Jack Stanley and Josh Shama in a Bassett shirt. In fact, the whole side put in one of the best opening performances from a Bassett team in many a season. We certainly have something we haven't had for a long time in this team and that is pace and with more to come with Matty Bennett, who missed Saturday's game due to holiday we could be in for an exciting season, there is a long, long way to go but a very encouraging start none the less. It was also very pleasing to see that the crowd was up by 35 on last season's attendance for the same game. Another pleasing factor about the crowd was seeing so many of the Youth Section managers present at the game. Hopefully all those who were there on Saturday enjoyed the game and will return tonight and keep coming along. Sam has been instrumental in trying to instil a more professional approach across the whole match day experience, including wanting the teams announced. Another star performance on the day was from Club Secretary Ian Thomas, the man on the mic announcing the teams as they came out, and we could be having a 7-day notice of approach from Swindon Town or Swindon Speedway for our announcer if he keeps performing to that standard every week.

FA Cup

This coming Saturday, 11th August sees us travel to Bedfordshire to take on Leighton Town from the Spartan South Midland League in the FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round. It marks the second year in a row that we will take on Spartan South Midlands League Premier Division opponents in the competition, but we will be hoping for a better outcome than in last year's tie at the same stage against Crawley Green. Leighton, who finished fourth in the league last season, while also reaching the quarter finals of the FA Vase, will be extremely difficult opponents to overcome. They were eliminated by our opponents last Saturday Tuffley Rovers in the FA Cup Preliminary Round last season but saw off Hellenic League opposition in the form of Brimscombe and Thrupp early in their

HELLENIC LEAGUE: Bassett hit Tuffley for six

ROYAL Wootton Bassett Town boss Sam Collier insists his side's feet remain firmly on the ground, despite going top of the Hellenic League Premier Division after beating Tuffley Rovers 6-1. A hat-trick for TJ Bohane was complimented by Bradley Pagliaroli's brace and Stephen Yeardeley's early strike as Bassett made the perfect start to the new campaign.

While scoring six on the opening day delighted Collier, the Bassett boss – who was announced as the club's new permanent manager during the summer – said his men must re-focus quickly ahead of Tuesday night's home game against Fairford Town. He said: "It's very pleasing to get off the mark with a win, I would've certainly taken that at the start.

"But our feet are very firmly on the ground. We know it's only one game and we will have to re-focus quickly."

Collier's arrival at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground saw a complete overhaul of the Bassett squad, with only three players from last season remaining. Bonding as a group both on and off the pitch appears to be of no problem to Collier, who confirmed team changes will be made throughout the season to ensure fresh legs at kick-off.

"It's a magnificent start for us. We are a new side – only three players have stayed on from last season and some have signed up in the last 48 hours," said Collier.

"Because of that, it was massively pleasing to score six. It takes the monkey off our back, in a way.

"We've got another huge task ahead of us on Tuesday though.

"Twenty lads are signed on and we will make changes for Tuesday's game. The games come thick and fast and the pitches are quite hard at the moment. It's tiring stuff – especially when you factor the heat in.

"Changes are important when planning ahead – injuries, unavailability and other commitments can suddenly reduce a squad."

The new Bassett boss is also boosted by the support received from assistant boss Drew Youngsam and head coach Rob Hopkins. The trio complement each other, according to Collier – who admits he's relieved to have finally started Bassett's league campaign following a lengthy pre-season. He said: "Drew and Rob are brilliant. They bring a different dynamic to what I bring so we bounce off of each other.

"We're all pitching in from myself to the kit men. At the moment things are going well, but we are aware things can change very quickly."

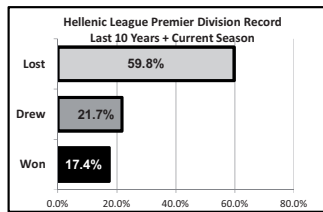
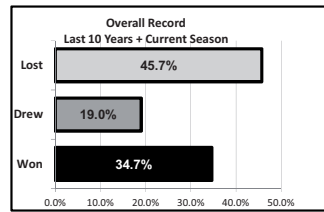

HELLENIC: Bevan eyes improvement at Fairford

JODY Bevan wants to see improvement in his Fairford Town side as they approach tomorrow's season opener with Wantage Town.

Last season Fairford claimed 18th spot following a disappointing year at Cinder Lane.

However, with some renewed impetus and some fresh faces at the club, Bevan says he is looking forward to the challenge ahead and that he is happy with the depth available to him.

"It's been a very positive pre-season for us, there are a lot of new players who have come in and they have settled in very well," said Bevan.

"Although we have been back in for six weeks, we haven't had the chance to get everyone together all at the same time with players going on holiday.

"I think everyone is in the same boat at this level so we are in reasonable shape.

"I've been trying to finalise the numbers, I have a squad of about 25 players who have all signed on with us.

"A few aren't available on Saturday but it is a good group with a good blend between youth and experience. "I'm hoping to have a smoother season, it's all about improvement. I've not set my sights on a particular position I want to finish, we just want to be better than last year.

"Pre-season has been miles better than last year so that is a tick off the list, I think we are on the right track and we will be going into every game trying to win it if we can."

Bevan's troops welcome Wantage to Cinder Lane in their first game of the Hellenic League Premier Division and the Fairford boss thinks his side could be in for a tough afternoon.

"Everyone around the Hellenic League acknowledge that Wantage are going to be there or there about at the end of the season," added Bevan who is hoping he won't be called onto the pitch again this season.

"Outside the three teams who got promoted last year, they were by far the most consistent.

"They're going to be a very tough test for us to start the season.

"In many ways I am hoping Saturday might be a good time to play them because it is the first game and everyone is equal to begin with.

"I've got a new pair of boots but I'm hoping they are only for the sidelines."

Pre-season games have included games against real tough opposition. There were 5-2 wins in their two pening fixtures away to Faringdon Town and Newent Town. This was followed by two games against Southern League opposition which saw Fairford lose 6-0 to Cirencester Town and 2-0 to Swindon Supermarine. These two defeats was followed by a 2-2 draw away at Frampton. Fairford wrapped up their pre-season activity with an impressive 5-1 win at home against Shortwood United. On Saturday in their league opener against title favourites Wantage they were leading 2-0 but went down 3-2 to a series of late goals including a very controversial second for Wantage. Fairford also had a man sent off early on and had to play most of the game with 10 men on a scorching hot afternoon.

Introduction to Fairford

Fairford is a small town in Gloucestershire. The town lies in the Cotswold hills on the River Coln, 6 miles (9.7 km) east of Cirencester, 4 miles (6.4 km) west of Lechlade and 9 miles (14 km) north of Swindon.

Fairford town originated as a river-crossing settlement on the River Coln, the ancient market town is dominated by the beautifully proportioned Late Perpendicular 'wool' church of St Mary with its pinnacled tower, magnificent stained medieval stained glass and a wealth of carvings in both wood and stone. The stained and painted glass in the windows ranks among the finest in England.

In 1944 the airforce base at Fairford was hastily constructed to provide a base for British and American troop-carriers gathering for the Normandy invasions. After the Second World War Fairford continued to provide a base for the American Airforce.

Interesting Facts

Concorde had its maiden flight from RAF Fairford.

In the first Gulf War of 1991 B52s were launched from Fairford and more recently Faiford was a base for the USAF in the 2003 Iraq War.

For three days every year RAF Fairford hosts the world's largest military air show – the Royal International Air Tattoo.

The 15th century church of St Mary has a set of 28 stained glass windows which is the only complete medieval glazing scheme to survive in England. The glass is of excellent quality and the work of the royal glazier, Barard Fowler, who also designed the windows for Kings College Cambridge.

Famous Residents

The most famous ex-resident of Fairford was John Keble (not to be confused with the drummer from Spandau Ballet) who was a poet and a leading member of the English church in the 19th century. He was one of the leaders of the Oxford Movement and Keble College, Oxford, was named after him.

A more recent famous resident is impressionist and comedian Rory Bremner

who is well known for his work on Mock the Week as a panellist and the award-winning show Rory Bremner...Who Else?

Nearest railway station

Nearest Railway stations are Swindon and Kemble which are both just over 14 miles awat but not served well by public transport. Generally car is the recommended mode to transport to get to the ground.

Nearest Pubs to Ground

The nearest pub to the ground is the Railway Inn on London Road whilst The Eight Bells (pictured below) is just a little further up the road.



Things to Do in Fairford

The one obvious thing to do in Fairford is visit the International Air Tattoo which takes place in July each year.

Just up the road from Fairford is the beautiful Cotswold Water Park – an area of 40 square miles, with more than 150 lakes set across the countryside of Wiltshire, Gloucestershire and West Oxfordshire. With more than 150 lakes spread over those forty square miles, there is something for everyone – from angling to archery, watersports to walking, birdwatching to biking, to name just a few things you can do

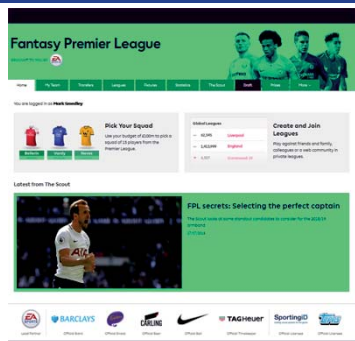
If there is a need to go shopping then I would highly recommend giving the Swindon Designer Outlet a miss (which is just 14 miles up the road) and head in the other direction to Cirencester where you will find a series of beautiful shops and cafes, although if you get there at the wrong time it can often be difficult to find a parking space.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Fairford Town have met on 22 occasions previously with Fairford having the better of things having won 10 times to just 7 for Bassett, 5 games have been drawn.

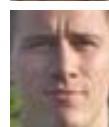

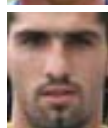

Dale Richards (Defender)



A product of Bassett's youth system, Richards finished as Bassett's second top scorer in season 2016-17 as he enjoyed a fine season primarily spent playing in an attacking midfielder role.

He initially broke into the club's first team as a defender and made the left back spot his on during his 2014-15 debut campaign. That year, he made 45 appearances, scoring twice. His first, a header away against Brimscombe and Thrupp, levelled the scores in a game Bassett went on to win, while his second helped put his team two goals to the good against Oxford City Nomads.

Richards continued at left back three seasons ago, scoring once – a goal in a draw away at Brackley Town Saints – in 35 games.

Combining athleticism, strength in the air, and a fine left foot, Richards has always enjoyed getting forward. And his shift to a more advanced position came in season 2016-17, with his conversion being a successful one. He scored his first of that season in a fine 3-1 away win at Thatcham Town before scoring in three straight games against Lydney Town, Oxford City Nomads and Burnham. Away at Ascot United, his well taken strike restored parity in a game which Bassett went on to win 3-1, while he also netted the opener in a hard-fought 2-0 win at Highmoor Ibis. Last season due to a time spent travelling he missed a few games but still made 29 appearances, scoring twice, again featuring both at the back and up front at times.

Richards joined the club as an 11-year-old, featuring in a successful youth side, which won a number of North Wilts League and Cup titles.

His development was further enhanced while at Cirencester Academy, with that experience helping turn him into a player who showed no fear in his first exposure to adult football despite being just 18 years old.

Our History

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

Super six seals perfect start

Royal Wootton Bassett Town began their 2018-19 Hellenic League Premier Division campaign in superb fashion, recording a 6-1 victory over Tuffley Rovers.

Gerard Buxton Ground, 4th August 2018

Royal Wootton Bassett Town would rarely have enjoyed such a dream start to their season before. An attacking masterclass from Sam Collier's side tore Tuffley Rovers apart, as Bassett triumphed 6-1 on the opening day of the 2018-19 Hellenic League Premier Division campaign. They notched four goals in a dominant first half display to set them well on their way and, come full time, debutants TJ Bohane and Brad Pagliaroli had both demonstrated their class in front of goal, the former scoring a hat-trick and the latter bagging a brace.

It had been a more familiar face to the Bassett faithful who got the rout going with the season just ten minutes old though. After Rob Lincoln's powerfully struck effort had forced a fingertip save from Luke Merchant, the resulting corner was taken short, catching out the Tuffley defence, and Steve Yeardley stooped to head home at the far post from Gio Wrona's delivery. It was the club stalwart's 76th goal in Bassett colours – not a bad return for a player, approaching 500 appearances, who has played for the majority of his career in defence. Six minutes later, however, his day was over after an injury sustained from an accidental clash of when challenging for the ball following a subsequent corner forced him off. The extended break in play initially saw Collier's team fall off the pace. And Tuffley came close to equalising when Warren Mann's hanging cross into the box wasn't dealt with, a blocked shot eventually sparing Bassett's blushes.

It didn't take long though for the home side to reassert themselves, and the lead was doubled on the half hour mark. Bohane met Daniel Lachacz' lofted with a deft touch around the corner that set free Josh Shama. The dangerous winger then breezed past left back Alex O'Leary before squaring back inside for Bohane on the edge of the area. The forward's initial attempt was blocked, but a sliced clearance fell back into Bohane's path and he made no mistake when one-on-one with Merchant. That goal seemed to be the death knell for Tuffley's hopes as confidence appeared to drain from their young side, who had started the game brightly. Shama almost made it three eight minutes before half time as he latched onto Pagliaroli's through ball, but his weighted tight angle shot found the inside of the post. Four minutes later Pagliaroli scored the goal of the afternoon. Receiving a Wrona pass on the right, he cut inside, taking on his man before arrowing a precise left foot drive into the bottom left corner from the edge of the box. A fourth quickly followed, with Shama again serving as creator. After another surging run down the wing he squared for Wrona, whose effort was blocked. However, the loose ball fell perfectly for Bohane who tapped home.

Having scored at least thirty goals in each of the past two seasons with Bracknell Town, Bohane made sure he is well on the way to achieving that figure again, completing his hat trick five minutes into the second half. After winning a header just inside the box, he was cluttered into by Merchant, leaving referee Lennon Davis no option but to point to the spot. And from twelve yards, Bohane was not to be denied as he coolly sent the 'keeper the wrong way. Comfortably ahead with the points in the bag, Bassett started to take their foot off the gas. But they still had enough in the tank to grab a sixth. Bohane steered a ball in behind the Tuffley defence that substitute Jason Milhench raced onto, and after cutting in from the right he rolled a pass across the six-yard box which Pagliaroli steered in from close range.

It was not to be a wholly perfect afternoon for Bassett though as Tuffley grabbed a goal back immediately. A clever Mann through ball resulted in a defensive mix-up, which Ryan Dobbins took full advantage of, rounding Alex Bowers before calmly stroking into an open goal. The visitors came close twice late on too, Dobbins heading over from Paul Carter's cross while unmarked before Carter sent a fizzing low drive from 25 yards narrowly wide. But that was the extent of the threat Tuffley were able to muster, with Bassett already having inflicted significant damage. The old adage states that you should start as you mean to go on. Sam Collier's side certainly laid down an impressive marker with this victory.

Man of the Match: Daniel Lachacz – strong in the tackle and calm when in possession, the combative midfielder helped Bassett dominate the middle of the park and didn't put a foot wrong on an impressive afternoon.

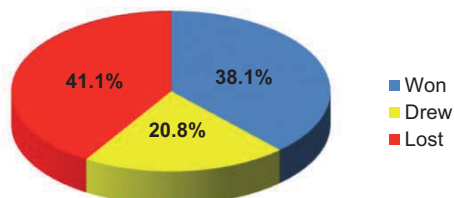

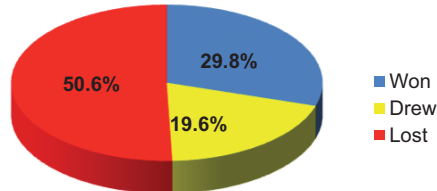

You Really Can Make A Difference

Midway through last season, predominantly at Steps 3 and 4 but no doubt also further down the pyramid, there were a number of clubs who suffered crippling point(s) deductions. In such cases, the crimes are often varied but last season the repeated offence tended to be that of 'player registrations' or rather, the errors made when 'registering' players.

Shaw Lane, Halesowen Town, Sutton Coldfield and Frickley Athletic were just a number of clubs to suffer for breaching the rules, while Cleethorpes Town's promotion chances in Evo-stick South was derailed in the blink of an eye when they were docked a whopping 12 points for fielding the ineligible Richard Walton, whose re-registering from Lincoln City wasn't completed properly.

In all cases, I can safely say that no club would have been trying to pull a fast one. We are talking honest mistakes here, but we are talking honest mistakes by people – club secretaries, club chairmen, or Maureen who does a few hours behind the bar – who have full-time careers elsewhere and so are not equipped to deal with the robust rules and regulations that leagues and football's governing body demand of club administrators. There is an immense amount of work that goes into the process of signing a player and one false step can be damaging for clubs, not to mention utterly heart-breaking.

This is why I champion the cause for more volunteers to get involved with their local club. Whether you are an accountant, a builder, a barmaid, a plumber, a doctor or a driving instructor – a football club unites the masses and there will be something you can do to help this season.

I'm not blind, lifestyles have changed, and time has become ever more precious. People, in all walks of employment, do not have the luxury of clocking off and then switching off. And, it is entirely your right to watch a game of football at the club you love and then disconnect yourself from it until the following Saturday. But I believe there are a lot of people out there who want to get involved but feel they can't because a club's 'perceived' insular nature prevents them from having the confidence to put their hands up.

The difference you can make is remarkable. Injections of cash only go so far and are often swallowed up by overheads within weeks. But volunteers can last a lifetime. If you want to get involved in your club, please do so and don't be afraid to offer a hand. Too many clubs are relying on the same old faces and those same old faces can't keep doing the heavy lifting forever.

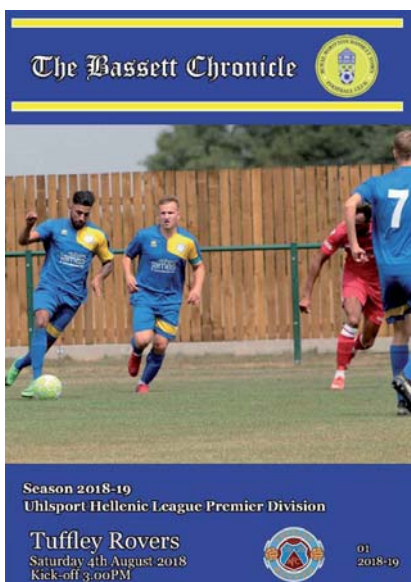

Diary of Wiltshire League Division One Title Winning Season - Wootton Bassett Town 1987-88

Saturday 29th August 1987 Laverstock and Ford 0 Wootton Bassett Town 7

Headline: Following success

Wootton Bassett followed their midweek success against Chippenham with a resounding 7-0 victory against Laverstock and Ford on Bank Holiday Saturday. Bassett took full advantage of a newly promoted and inexperienced home team although they did take time to settle down and find their rhythm. Tony Vines opened the visitor's account in the 20th minute with a well taken header from a corner. The goal proved to be the spur Bassett needed and three more were added before the interval, two from Damon York and one from Frost.

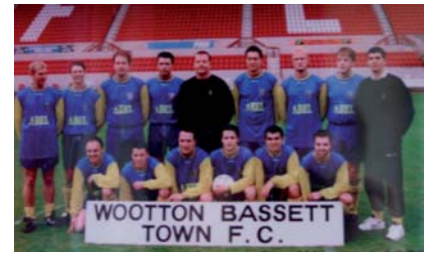
The second half saw the side push on relentlessly though at one stage it seemed as though they might be unable to add to their first half flurry. However, Frost added the fifth from a corner, York got their sixth and his hat-trick after being given the simplest of chances by brother Peter. The final nail in Laverstock and Ford's coffin was banged home by Harrison, who bustled his way through a demoralised defence and fired a left foot shot across the keeper and into the net.

Wednesday 2nd September 1987 Calne Town Reserves 2 Wootton Bassett Town 2

Headline: Visitors force the draw

A disappointing start to the game for Bassett who went behind to a 14th minute goal, but then fought back with a goal by Frost after a good through ball from York. Bassett finished the first half ahead when Hanrahan completed a good move shortly before the 45 minutes were up.

In the second half Bassett missed an early chance by York and the game continued to be well contested by both sides, Bassett missing another opportunity to futher their lead when frost was put through with a chance. Calne forced the draw with seconds on the clock by a speculative shot after a half clearance from Calne Corner. Bassett can reflect on this top of table clash as a game where they dropped a point, but still remained on top of Division 1.
