# From the Youth Section

## Youth sides record cup hat-trick

There was a hat-trick of cup wins for Royal Wootton Bassett Town's youth teams this weekend, with three of six sides involved in knockout action progressing to the next round.

The Under 18 Blues were the biggest winners, thrashing Derry Hill United Pyros 13-0 in the Wiltshire Youth Cup first round. Charlie McCuish led the way with four goals while Tom Phillips also registered a hat-trick. Further goals came from Bailey Gallagher (2), Harvey Coster, Dan Hopper, Joe Price and an own goal.

They will now face New College in the second round in a fortnight, with a North Wilts League Cup quarter final tie against Malmesbury Victoria Youth Development next Sunday.

Also triumphant in the County Cup were the Under 15 Blues, who saw off Lydiard Youth Blue 4-0 to book a third-round place. Lewis Dodson, Marcel Lewis, Kevin Prouse and Rory Ryan got the goals to take Bassett through.

In North Wilts League Cup action, the Under 16 Blues moved a step closer to retaining their cup crown, sealing a semi-final spot with a 5-2 win away against Shrivenham. Daniel Warre was the star of the show, netting all five for Bassett.

Unfortunately, they won't be joined in the last four by Bassett's Yellow team though, as they suffered an agonising 2-1 defeat after extra time against Wanborough Juniors Black. Josh Carey was on target for Bassett.

The Under 18 Yellows were beaten 7-0 by Division Two high-flyers Highworth Town Juniors H in their quarter-final tie. Meanwhile, the Under 14 Blues fell to a 9-0 loss away against Bishops Cannings Fireblades in the County Cup second round.

It wasn't all cup action this weekend.

The Under 14 Yellows moved up in the North Wilts League Division Two table with a comfortable 3-0 triumph at home against basement-dwelling Bradford Town Youth Vipers.

They were the only team to record points though.

The Under 12 Blues put up a great fight away against Swindon Supermarine Giants, who went into the game undefeated in the league. Bassett took the lead in the game courtesy of a Finlay Hyde goal. But, though Edward Greenouff would also find the net, Bassett would end up losing by the odd goal in five.

There was defeat for the Under 15 Yellows in their top of the table clash at home against Fairford and Lechlade Revenants, who were 5-0 winners. They are now level on points with Bassett at the top of Division Three with three games in hand still to play.

Elsewhere, the Under 12 Yellows were beaten 4-0 by FC Calne Cosmos, the Under 13 Blues were defeated by the same score by Fairford and Lechlade Celts and the Under 13 Whites fell to a 6-1 loss against Croft Junior Red.

# Bassett News

## Today's Game

Good evening and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Ground for this 21<sup>st</sup> UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture of the season against Bishops Cleeve. A warm welcome to all the players, management, officials and spectators who have made the journey from Bishops Cleeve for this evening's game.

Bishops Cleeve are back in the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division after 12 seasons in the Southern League having been promoted from the Hellenic back in 2005-06. Our visitors have had the better of things in league meetings between the clubs over the years with Bishops Cleeve having won 11 of the 25 previous league encounters, to just 8 wins for Bassett, with 6 draws. Those 11 wins for Bishops Cleeve include the game earlier this season when, after starting the season with 3 straight wins, we lost 5-1 at their place. I understand from those who went we were well and truly beaten that night by the best side we have played this season so another tough fixture here tonight at the Gerard Buxton Ground as we look to continue our good home form this year.

Bishops Cleeve are currently in 7<sup>th</sup> place in the table 6 points behind us but with 6 games in hand, having played just 14 games to our 20. They have not played the lowest number of games in this strange season for fixture scheduling, that honour goes to Binfield who have played just 12, did not play on Saturday, and do not have a midweek game this week! Had a good laugh when I saw the tweet from their manager Roger Herridge on Saturday about this which ended with "it's ok through as we have 9 games in 28 days in December"! With Lydney having played as many home league games already as Binfield have played in total in the league (and they are home again this Saturday) I would love to be a fly on the wall at the upcoming league meeting with clubs.

## Ardley United - Home

Another tough game on Saturday saw us prevail in the end, although it was mightily close with Ardley putting us under a load of pressure in the final few minutes. As soon as they put the ball into our box for almost the first time in the game they scored, and you have to wonder why they didn't try that earlier rather than the intricate passing game with little end product that they played for the first 80 minutes of the game. They had masses of possession but didn't really trouble our goal until those closing stages. Seeing more and more of it these days with teams with players from academies who seem to have forgotten that the whole idea of the game is to score more goals than the opposition, it is not strictly come dancing where you get points for artistic impression and good technique. We scored two good goals and created more clear-cut chances and defended well again, getting men behind the ball and making it hard for our opponents, although as I say they did not help themselves. In my view a deserved win even if Ardley had the ball for long periods of the game with both goals being finished clinically by Danny Lachacz and TJ Bohane. The win also lifted us into 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the table in what is turning into a good season for the club.

## Brimmscombe & Thrupp - Home

The home game against Brimmscombe & Thrupp initially re-scheduled to Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> December is likely to be moved to Friday 7<sup>th</sup> December. A request has been made to the league by both clubs to move the game to the Friday night but official confirmation of this being accepted on FA Fulltime is still awaited at the time of writing these notes. Hopefully with both clubs being in agreement and the game actually being brought forward, which is likely to make it easier to appoint officials, this will get sanction from the fixture secretary.

## Development Side

After the heavy 5-0 away defeat at Malmesbury Vics Development last Wednesday the Development team will look to get back on track this coming Saturday when they entertain Wroughton here at the Gerard Buxton Ground. It will not be easy though as Wroughton currently top the table and have lost just once in the league all season.

## Ladies Side

The Ladies continued their good start to the season in the South West Women's Eastern Division with a 1-0 away win over Almondsbury on Sunday. Lisa Coe with the only goal of the game and another solid defensive display delivered a 5<sup>th</sup> successive win.

# Our Visitors This Season



After last season's relegation from the Southern league, Bishops Cleeve are looking like they could bounce straight back at the first attempt. Whilst they are currently back in 7<sup>th</sup> place, they have games in hand on all but one of the teams above them in the table, having lost just 4 times in their opening 14 fixtures. They already have more points on the board than they got last season in the Southern League.

They opened the season in high scoring draw against what has now turned out to be one of the leading sides this season, Ascot United. The two sides sharing 6 goals and the points. A 2-0 away win over Brimscombe & Thrupp, who now sit 2<sup>nd</sup> in the table followed. The good form continued in the FA Cup when they defeated Stotfold from the Spartan South Midland League, winning 5-2 to progress to the Preliminary Round. They followed that up with the 5-1 thumping over us, our worst defeat of the season.

The first defeat of the season came away at title favourites Wantage Town, Wantage winning 3-1. A second defeat quickly followed as Brimscombe & Thrupp avenged that earlier defeat with a 1-0 win at Bishops Cleeve.

Back in the FA Cup and it was another 5-2 win as Bishops Cleeve knocked out a second Spartan South Midland side, this time it was North Greenford Town who couldn't handle the Cleeve strike force. A surprise league defeat away at struggling Longlevens followed before they finally exited the FA Cup, Wantage defeating them for the second time this season, former Bassett striker Steve Robertson scoring one of the goals in a 2-0 win for Wantage.

Interest in the FA Vase came to a prompt end as Bishops Cleeve lost 3-1 to Western League side Bitton in their first game in the competition.

A return to league action saw a return to winning ways and also the start of a 10 game unbeaten run which stretched all the way to last Saturday. A narrow 1-0 home win over Windsor was followed by another close game in the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup as Bishops Cleeve saw off current league leaders Brackley Town Saints by the odd goal in 7. A 1-0 away win in the league at Binfield, never an easy place to visit as we well know, was followed by a 5-2 away win at Lydney in the Gloucestershire County Cup. Next up a 3-1 league win over Ardley as they made it 5 straight wins on the bounce.

They maintained interest in the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup with a comfortable 6-2 home win over Kidlington Development before hitting another 6 goals, this time in the league away at Holmer Green, 6-1 the final score. They continued their high scoring form when they visited Lydney for the second time this season, hitting 5 without reply against their fellow Gloucestershire side.

After 8 straight wins which had seem them score 31 goals, they finally dropped some points again in the league, this despite scoring another 3 goals, Virginia Water leaving Bishops Cleeve with a point following a 3-3 draw. Cleeve immediately returned to winning ways with a 3-1 away win at Shrivenham before suffering a shock defeat at home to Fairford on Saturday, Jody Bevan's side inflicting a surprise 3-0 defeat on Cleeve. They will come here tonight no doubt keen to put that result behind them and it is going to certainly be a tough match here tonight if we are to continue our great home form this season which has seen us win 9 times in the league at the Gerard Buxton Ground.

**Danger Men – Former Longlevens striker Bradley Martin (14 goals), Elliott Kennedy (12) and Jack Watts (10) will be the three to watch for Bishops Cleeve this evening.**

# Visitors - Tourist Information

## Introduction to the Village

Bishop's Cleeve is a village in the Borough of Tewkesbury, Gloucestershire, North of Cheltenham. The village lies at the foot of Cleeve Hill, the highest point in the Cotswolds and borders Woodmancote on the East side of the Gloucestershire Warwickshire railway line that splits the two parishes. Bishop's Cleeve has a population of around 11,000 and the village saw rapid growth during the 20th century as a result of the construction of Smiths Aerospace factory near the village after the Second World War.

## Interesting Facts

The Smiths Aerospace factory relocated from West London in 1940 in response to the Government's request to find an alternative base outside London out of the range of most German bombers for its vital aviation instrument operation.

## Famous Residents

Two most famous sportsman to come out of Bishops Cleeve are footballer Peter Goring and motorcycle racer John Draper. Goring was born in Bishops Cleeve, one of six brothers, he went on to play 220 games for Arsenal between 1948 and 1959 scoring over 50 goals. He later went on to manage Forest Green Rovers taking them from the Gloucestershire County League to the Hellenic League. He died in 1994, aged 67 and is buried at St Michaels Church Bishops Cleeve.

Motorcycle racer John Draper was also born in Bishops Cleeve and became the first British rider to win the European Motocross Championship which he achieved in 1955.

The most notorious ex-resident of Bishops Cleeve is the convicted murderer Rosemary West.

## Nearest Railway Station

Whilst Bishops Cleeve has a railway past the village's railway station was closed in 1960.

The nearest active current railway station is Cheltenham Spa, just over 4 miles from the football ground.

## Nearest Pubs to Ground

The nearest pub to the ground is the popular family run pub, the Swallow Inn (pictured).



Other pubs in the village include The Kings Head, The Royal Oak, The Apple Tree and the Rising Sun Hotel.

## Things to Do in Bishops Cleeve

For the railway enthusiasts, harking back to the village's railway past, less than 2 miles away is the Gloucestershire Warwickshire Steam Railway that utilises over 14 miles of the track that used to serve the Bishops Cleeve station as a steam and diesel heritage railway.

The big attraction nearby is obviously the Cheltenham Racecourse, venue for the annual Cheltenham Horse Racing Festival which takes place in March each year. As well as being the "Home of Jump Racing" the course also hosts concerts and comedy nights.

Again just a couple of miles away is Prescott Hill Climb, the home to one of the world's most prestigious motor racing venues. Set in 60 acres of glorious Cotswold countryside, the estate not only provides a beautiful setting for a range of classic car and bike weekends, but also hosts major motor racing championships.

However, the main hub of social activity in the village is the Tithe Barn. Bishop Cleeve's village hall has a wide range of daily activities from Zumba classes to concerts. Check the website at [www.cleevetithebarn.org.uk](http://www.cleevetithebarn.org.uk) for more details.

# Our History

## Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

Two minutes later, Bassett's lead was doubled. Ardley were this time guilty of failing to fully avert danger, allowing Gio Wrona to steal possession deep inside the visitors' territory. He quickly played a pass into the feet of Bohane, who proceeded to play a delightful one-two with Matt Bennett on the edge of the area to open up the defence. And there was only going to be one outcome when Bohane was presented with a one-on-one as he confidently swept beyond Lawrence.

Now two goals behind, Ardley belatedly kicked into gear as they abandoned some of their principles and finally sought to throw balls into the Bassett box. Fierce drives from substitutes Deon Gallagher and Tom Moore flew narrowly off target while Troy Bryan hooked a ball across the face of goal that needed only a touch to divert it in.

The visitors were then given a reprieve though when a Pagliaroli cut back was played just behind Wrona, who was in a perfect position to score.

Minutes later, an acrobatic Bryan effort looped onto the crossbar. But, finally, Ardley got their goal when centre half West – now playing as an emergency centre forward – guided Mikey McKirman's deep cross into the opposite corner.

That set up a frenzied, grandstand finish which tested Bassett's nerves to breaking point. West was denied another headed goal by Collier's goalline block before a Harris free kick caused a scramble around the goalmouth in which McCready pulled off a fine double save.

Then, deep into injury time, Troy Bryan raced onto a long ball out from the back that had sailed in behind the Bassett defence and lifted a delicate effort over the onrushing McCready. The 'keeper was beaten but, much to Bassett's fortune, the post came to the rescue with a covering Joyce able to head behind to avert further danger.

It was a heart-in-mouth moment, but soon Bassett could breathe a sigh of relief.

The points in the bag, Bassett climb a place to third in the Hellenic League Premier Division, a position they can further consolidate when they face chasers Bishop's Cleeve on Tuesday.

## Fast start and fortunate finish deliver another triumph

Danny Lachacz' first minute goal proved vital for Royal Wootton Bassett Town as they survived a late onslaught from Ardley United to prevail 2-1 in their Hellenic League Premier Division encounter.

## Royal Wootton Bassett Town 2 Ardley United 1

Royal Wootton Bassett Town made it consecutive victories as a flying start and late fortune in the face of a ferocious Ardley United onslaught combined to help seal a 2-1 victory for Sam Collier's side.

Danny Lachacz' first minute header gave the hosts the earliest of advantages, and that lead was later extended in the second period courtesy of a well-worked TJ Bohane goal.

But Ardley would go on to halve their deficit with five minutes remaining through Daniel West before unleashing a torrent of pressure on the Bassett goal as the woodwork, goalline blocks and some fantastic saves from Charlie McCready ensured they were unable to find an equaliser.

While certainly not pretty, it was gutsy display from Collier's team that saw them over the line. Throughout the game their visitors saw most of the ball. However, Bassett were disciplined enough to limit the opportunities Ardley were able to create for the vast majority of the contest.

It certainly helped that the Oxfordshire side, though neat and pretty, arguably played far too much football. Yet, they lacked the clinical edge that Bassett possessed when presented with chances that could have changed the game.

That was evident from the off as Bassett took full advantage of Jamie Mundy's needless trip on Brad Pagliaroli in the right corner after less than a minute had elapsed. Pagliaroli whipped the resulting set piece into the box and, by aid of a deflection, the ball looped perfectly into the path of midfielder Lachacz, who guided his header beyond Christian Lawrence from ten yards out.

Bassett could not have dreamt of a better start. But, even while going in front so early, it did not afford them the ability to settle comfortably into the game. That was because Ardley set out their stall to dominate possession and pin Bassett deep. Though for all the play that they had they were unable to really test their hosts in the opening exchanges.

Instead, Bassett found a degree of success when hitting Ardley on the break, with counter attacks leading to chances for both Mani Roper and Bohane that forced Lawrence to turn the ball around the post on the stretch.

Ardley's first opportunity of note came on the half hour mark when a short corner routine caught Bassett out. Their star man, the diminutive Conor Harris then proceeded to get to the byline where he cut a pass back into the path of Tobias London in the six-yard box. However, a combination of pressure from Collier and a poor touch meant the forward was unable to steer in.

The opening period then petered out with only a couple of half chances for either team, the best falling to Bassett when Bohane saw a header from a Tony Joyce cross sail wide after catching a deflection.

Play was very much the same following the restart: Ardley stroking the ball around but failing to penetrate the Bassett defence.

The game began to liven up with twenty-five minutes remaining though when McCready was first called into action. But he did well to block Tom Griffiths' snap shot after a Harris free kick was not properly cleared.

# Our Visitors History

## Bishops Cleeve • Club History



In their long history Bishops Cleeve have led a much more nomadic existence than many clubs, but have now been settled in the impressive Kayte Lane ground since 1997. For many years the club played on a ground in Stoke Road – with facilities rebuilt and reopened in 1971 by the then secretary of the Football Association, Ted Croker. The enforced move to Kayte Lane came about due to the old ground being sold by the landlord.

The club enjoyed a brief period of success in the late 60's – gaining promotion from the Cheltenham League and winning four Championships in their six seasons in the Gloucester Northern Senior League.

After dropping back to the Cheltenham League, Cleeve gained promotion into the Hellenic League in 1983, quickly becoming a force in that division, finishing fourth in their first two seasons in Div. One. This great start was followed up with a third place finish, then winning the Championship and gaining promotion to the Premier Division at the fourth attempt, and winning the 'double' by adding the Gloucester Amateur Cup. A fantastic achievement.

The five seasons in the Premier Division proved to be a struggle for the Club, although the team followed up their Cup success by adding another trophy to their collection, winning the Premier Cup at the first attempt. The return to Division One proved the catalyst for a period of rebuilding, on and off the pitch. The Club needed to enter into a number of ground share agreements to preserve their League status – Forest Green Rovers, Moreton Town, Wollen Sports and Highworth all allowed us to use their grounds. This difficult period galvanised our club members, and the club was kept running by the dedicated efforts of a few stalwarts – notably Cheltenham Town legend, Dave Lewis, whose efforts were recognised by Carling Brewery, awarding him their 'Clubman of the Year' accolade (and a year's supply of beer!)

After approval for the Kayte Lane site was given in 1997, club members started the building of the clubhouse and changing rooms – using materials kindly donated by Smiths Aerospace (now GE Aviation) There followed a great transformation in the team's fortunes, and they duly secured another promotion in 2001 back to the Hellenic Premier Division. In order to take this opportunity the club entered into another ground share at Evesham United! 2003 & 2004 proved to be a landmark period for the club – returning to 'The Lane' after the new Stand and floodlights were approved, achieving FA Charter Standard for Football in the Community, and the completion of the building and facilities.

In 2006 the team gained promotion to the Southern League, joining the Midland Division before being moved to the South & West Division a few seasons later, where the club currently reside. The club has enjoyed mixed fortunes in their Southern League time, generally enjoying mid-table security, with the highlight being season 2011/12 when the club finished with their best ever points haul (in a creditable 11th) and reached the Gloucester Senior Cup final, played at Bristol City's Ashton Gate ground, where we unfortunately succumbed to a Bristol City side featuring two Full Welsh Internationals!

With the departure of Alex Sykes to County rivals Shortwood United, the ex-Cheltenham Town professional John Brough took the helm but left towards the end of the season to join Cinderford Town. 2013/14 saw local lad Stephen Cleal take charge with Derek Lightstone, as his assistant, both had a long history with the club and they forged a close link with our Second and Third teams – as well a community tie to Bishops Cleeve Colts Youth section – the future of the club seemed much more secure on and off the field of play. After surviving relegation in their first season they put together a competitive team finishing 12th in the league and losing 1-0 to Forest Green Rovers in the County FA Senior Cup. 2016/17 saw another first for Steve winning the club's first FA Trophy game.

2017/18 saw the arrival of Matt Jeynes to the management team another who had played for the club in recent years and they later joined by Alex Lumsden Unfortunately a number of players left the club and the season didn't get off to a good start. The team did rally towards the latter part of the Season but were relegated after losing the last game. So after 12 years we now look for a speedy return to Step 4 of the NLS.

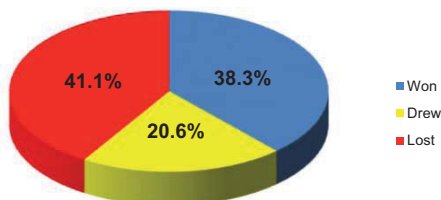

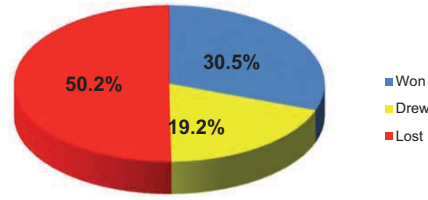

HIGHWORTH Town boss Jeff Roberts said his side's 2-1 win over Bristol Manor Farm was down to a successful change in formation as they collected their first Southern League Division One South win since mid-September, writes JONATHAN LEIGHFIELD. # From The development Side

17<sup>th</sup> November 2018

Following Malmesbury Victoria Development's midweek win over Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development, the other fourteen teams in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League were all in league action this afternoon. The practice of bringing one game forward to assist with the appointing of a full complement of officials on a Saturday has certainly proved a success so far this season. 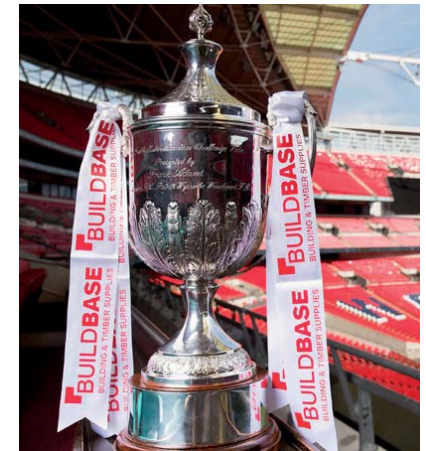

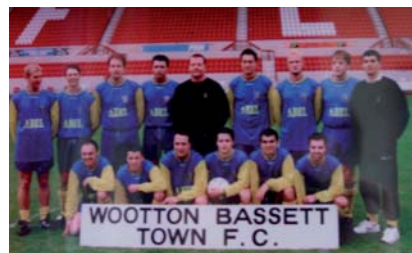

## Diary of Wiltshire League Division One Title Winning Season - Wootton Bassett Town 1987-88

Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> December 1987  
**Wootton Bassett Town 4 Corsham Town 0**

### Headline: Comfortable win over lowly Corsham

In their final game of 1987 Wootton Bassett gave a comfortable, if slightly disappointing display, defeating lowly placed Corsham by four goals to nil. The goal tally could have been much higher had Bassett been fully fired up for this game, but instead there were a few players who were doing just enough and no more. The game opened up with Bassett very much on top. Several early chances were created, perhaps the best falling to Johns, following a lovely one-two with Harrison, when he unfortunately fired tamely into the arms of the keeper. However, it was not until the 20<sup>th</sup> minute that Bassett took the lead from a cleverly worked set piece. They were awarded a free kick just outside the box. York shaped to shoot for goal but instead ran over the ball, Harrison laid the ball by the side of the wall to the on running York who shot home. The goal should have been the signal for Bassett to gain complete control but instead they tended to sit back on the lead. This allowed Corsham, who were fielding a fairly inexperienced side, to come back into the game, and although they only really troubled Rees once, when he had to dive sharply to his left to turn away a shot from a free kick, territorially they held the advantage up until half time. However, when Bassett did break out, they always looked capable of scoring, indeed Frost rapped the Corsham bar following a corner.

The second half saw Bassett much more determined and their midfield started to gain control and pick up all the loose balls. The control was well rewarded Bassett scoring three good goals. After 55 minutes a cross from the right was flicked on by Frost into the path of Hanrahan who shot home from 12 yards. In the 70<sup>th</sup> minute York went on a mazy run which saw him beat 3 players before firing confidently past the keeper. Ten minutes later a lovely ball from McKay released York down the left. His cross just eluded Karn, making his debut, and was headed out by a Corsham defender to a gleeful Harrison, who hit it on the volley and smashed it past the keeper from just inside the box. A fine end then to '87 for Bassett, which sees them riding high at the top of the league, and at the quarter final stages of both cups. Indeed, their next game is on January 2<sup>nd</sup> when they entertain Supermarine in the Wilts Senior Cup, 2.00pm kick-off.

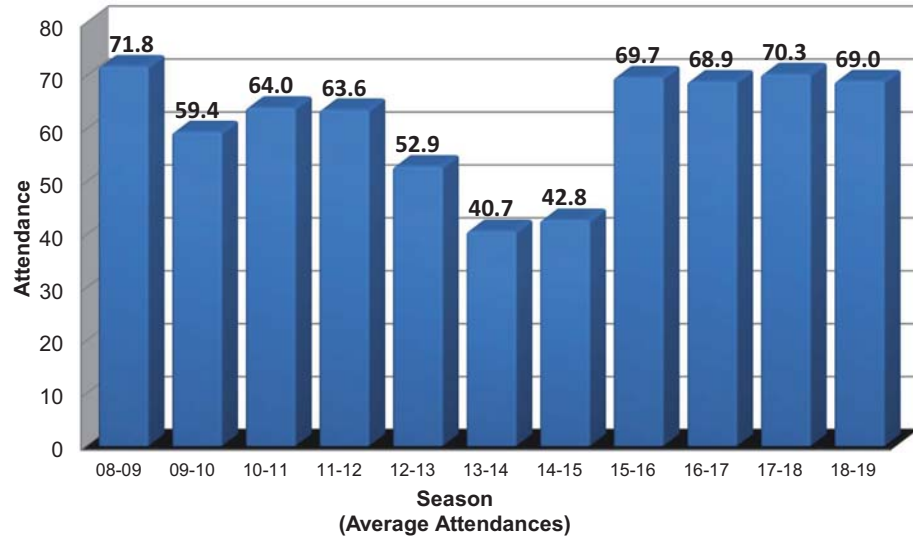

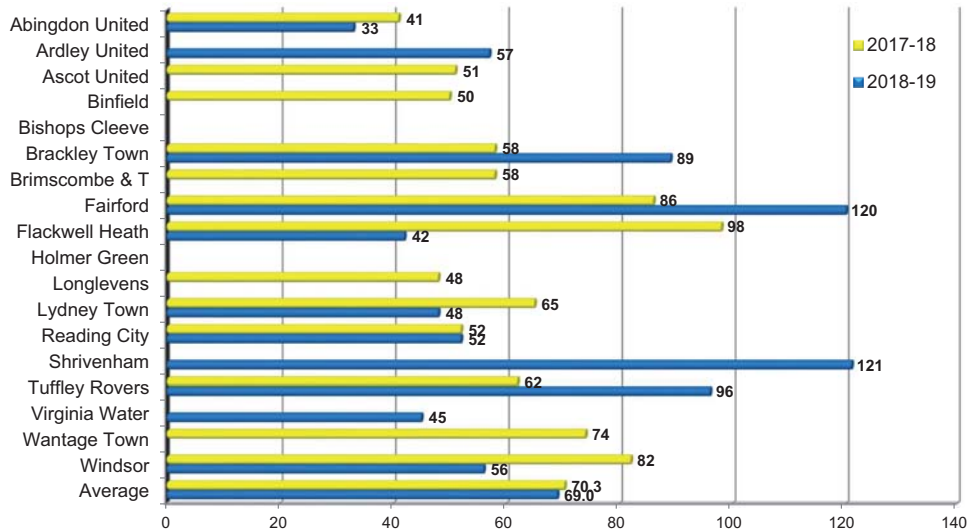
