Today's Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League fixture against Flackwell Heath. A warm welcome to the players, management and supporters from Flackwell who have made the journey down the M4 for today's game.

Flackwell have made their usual good solid start to the season and have lost just once in their opening 8 league fixtures. That defeat came Tuesday night when they lost 2-1 at home to Shrivenham in their third "double-header" of the season so far, yes that's six games against just three sides in their opening eight fixtures. With so many games against the same sides and with five of the opening eight being against teams new to the UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division it is hard to judge how Flackwell will do this season. One thing is certain, however, and that is that our record against Flackwell is abysmal with us having won just once in 17 games and we have also lost our last 8 games against them. Hopefully we can build on recent performances and go a little bit towards improving our record against today's opponents here this afternoon.

Windsor and Lydney Town

What a good win that was last Saturday against a very good Windsor side. Admittedly we rode our luck a little bit in the second half, but a good all-round team performance saw us secure all three points. Charlie McCready looks to be a very good signing making an assured appearance on his debut in goal. It was also good to see both Jon Beeden and Carl Evans back playing in a Bassett shirt and playing so well. Hopefully Sam will be able to field another strong side here today against opponents who have made their usual solid start to the season. The only disappointment from the Windsor game was seeing the crowd had halved from Monday's game against Shrivenham. As someone pointed out both Swindon Town and Swindon Supermarine were at home which does have a big impact on our crowd. It seems we have become their "second club" for a number of Supermarine supporters,

Tuesday night saw us make the journey across the Severn Bridge to play Lydney and in contrast to the first encounter that had been a cagey affair, Tuesday saw a really entertaining game only spoilt by some controversial officiating. It was almost like Groundhog Day and last season's Vase encounter with Horndean when we had a player sent off for handling the ball on the line. From where I stood on Tuesday I am not sure what Dale could have done to avoid the ball hitting him on the arm and some of the Lydney fans close by claimed the ball had already crossed the line anyway. Given the consultation between the referee and the linesman and the fact that the linesman had put his flag across his chest the decision was made by the linesman, although the referee was right next to it but either way we ended up on the wrong side of a controversial penalty award and a sending off. Despite Lydney scoring from the resulting penalty the lads did not give up and fought admirably to pull the two goals back before half-time. Lydney scored some well taken goals in the second half with Ross Gabriel and former Bassett player Lewis Thompson causing us all kinds of problems all night but even when we were 5-2 down we were still in the game and deserved the third goal which gave us renewed hope. Had the referee then awarded us a penalty for what looked a blatant foul on TJ we would have been just one behind and who knows? In the end it was disappointing but none of the Bassett fans who made the journey down the M4 could say that the lads didn't battle from start to finish and they all did the club proud. For the neutral it must have been a great game of football to watch and the game was played in front of an impressive 167 spectators. Well done to Lydney and best wishes to them at Lymington today.

The Development side won their first game of the season last Saturday, coming away from Pewsey Vale Development with a 5-2 result. This followed the midweek draw with an in-form Football ID side after three single goal defeats in the opening three fixtures to the season. 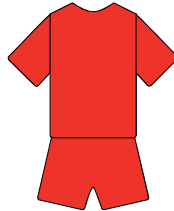
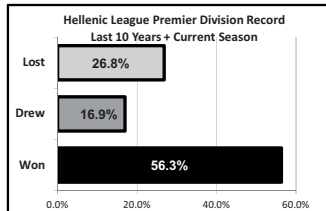
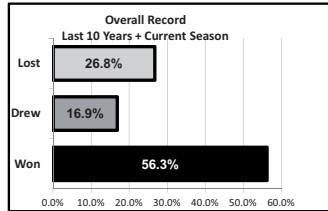

Ladies aim high ahead of new campaign

Having finished as South West Women's League Eastern Division and Wiltshire County Cup runners-up last time out, there's little margin of error for Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies if they are to match or better their 2017-18 campaign.

For Jonny House and James Goddard, who this season replace Becky Gammon in charge of the team, the bar has certainly been set high. But Bassett's new joint-managers do not lack confidence, setting promotion as the primary aim for their team this season. The pair have certainly hit the ground running since their appointment too and have overseen a successful pre-season campaign.

The majority of last year's squad have been retained, and it also has been strengthened. Experience has been added in the form of 'keeper Abi Footner from league rivals FC Chippenham and forward Zoe Shellard, who arrives from Melksham Town. Meanwhile, the side has received an infusion of youth, most notably in the form of forward Lauren Kayll, who has been prolific in friendly action. Bassett's series of warm-up matches have tested the squad, pitting them against higher level opposition on a couple of occasions. After defeating former league rivals St Nicholas Reserves 9-0, Bassett travelled to Southern Women's League Premier Division outfit Winchester City Flyers and gave a good account of themselves in a 3-1 loss. They then followed that with an impressive 3-2 triumph against Forest Green Rovers, who ply their trade a league above Bassett in the South West Women's League Premier Division. Pre-season was then completed with a 7-0 victory against the Development team of Cardiff Met (whose senior side qualified for the UEFA Women's Champions League). Commenting prior to that final fixture, House and Goddard were effusive about their squad's efforts.

"We have made some great additions and they have all gelled very nicely with the quality players that are re-signing with the club for this season," House said. "Each member of the squad has applied themselves very well and there is competition for places throughout."

Goddard noted: "The quality and level of attitude from the players so far has been outstanding. The intensity levels we have demanded have been surpassed by all the ladies, including the new signings that have been made. We would both like to thank all the players for how well they have adapted to our new ideas." Pre-season has also sharpened the duo's belief that the team can improve on their debut season in the South West Women's League. The division will now feature eleven sides, with six, including Bassett, based in Wiltshire. And the number of local derbies is set to add an extra edge to what should be another exciting campaign. But the management team are bullish about their chances. "The season will be long and testing," House admitted. "But hopefully we will have reason to celebrate once we play our final game." Goddard added: "We are hoping for another season of success for the club and your support, as always, would be much appreciated!"

The start to Bassett's league campaign will be delayed by cup commitments. They will visit Warsash Wasps in the SSE Women's FA Cup first qualifying round tomorrow, Sunday 9th September before hosting Salisbury in the opening round of the Wiltshire County Cup a week later. The Ladies are then due to host newly promoted Laverstock and Ford in the league, though that game will need to be re-arranged should Bassett advance in the Women's FA Cup.

This was followed with a 1-1 home draw against newly promoted Virginia Water, Charlie Malin with their goal in this one.

An early exit in the FA Cup when North Greenford United of the Spartan South Midlands League put paid to a lucrative cup run this season, 2-0 the final score.

The first win of the season came in a midweek trip to Shrevenham but Flackwell left it very late, Dean Allen scoring the winner in injury time against a 10-man Shrevenham side who had lost goalkeeper Harrison Ellis early on to a red card. The second win of the season for Flackwell was secured the following Saturday when two goals from Muhamadou Ceesay gave them an excellent 2-0 home win over Brimscombe & Thrupp.

As well as playing Shrevenham twice already in the league, this was not in fact the first or last league double header they have played already in the ridiculous scheduling this season. Introduction to the Village

Flackwell Heath is a village in the civil parish of Chepping Wycombe on the outskirts of High Wycombe, Buckinghamshire. With an elevation of about 150 metres (490 ft), in the Chiltern Hills. It has a population of around 6000. The name 'Flackwell' is of unknown origin but may describe the source of a stream which once started in this area. The heath was once covered with cherry orchards, "a place of annual resort and festivity during the cherry season" with many cherry pickers travelling from London for the annual event.

Interesting Facts

What is known as Flackwell Heath today was in fact, four villages, Flackwell Heath, Northern Woods (or North-End Woods), Heath End and Sedgemore. The original existence of these villages probably came about as a result of people crossing the Chilterns' spur from one valley to the other, either for work in the mills of the Wye valley or delivering goods to the Spade Oak wharf for shipment by boat along the Thames. Over the years, particularly since the Second World War, there has been a significant in filling between the villages and the whole area is now known by the one name of Flackwell Heath.

The original villagers were predominantly farm labourers with some bargemen and mill workers but in the late 19th century this changed to favour the industrial mill workers, plus the emergence of furniture workers as the industry for which High Wycombe is best known became established. Nowadays its inhabitants are commuters, wishing to live in the proximity of, but separate from, High Wycombe, and generally working either in London or the Thames Valley areas.

There is only one listed building, a former farmhouse dating from the 17th century. Other significant features of the village include the water tower and the war memorial. Since July 2005 there has been a new landmark in the village, a wind turbine, on the playing field of Carrington Junior School. The turbine generates around a third of the school's energy.

Famous Residents

Singer-songwriter and composer of classical music Ed Welch has been a resident of Flackwell Heath. He is best known for TV

theme tunes including Blockbusters and the new version of Thomas the Tank Engine.

Other residents include British paralympian Matt Sealy, who represented Team GB at wheelchair basketball.

Nearest railway station

The nearest station to the ground is Bourne End railway station, which is 2.5 miles away. Bourne End is on the Marlow Branch Line between Maidenhead and Marlow. The stations at High Wycombe (4.4 miles), Marlow (4.2 miles) and Beaconsfield (4.4 miles) are also not too far away.

Nearest Pubs to Ground

There are four remaining pubs in Flackwell Heath, The Cherry Tree (found in the heart of the village), The Green Dragon (located in the south of the village, on the corner between Blind Lane and Green Dragon Road), The Three Horseshoes on Common Road, close to the Golf Club) and The Stag (pictured below which is at the end of the village on Heath End Road) and the closest to the football ground. All four are found all in the space of just over a mile.



Things to Do in Flackwell Heath

Other than the football ground and the four pubs it appears there is not a lot else to do in Flackwell Heath. That said there is, however, a good fish and chip shop just up the road from the ground and if making a day out it might be worth a pub crawl around the four pubs, some food from the chip shop and then take in the game.

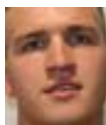

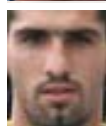

Player Profile

Tony Joyce – Defender



Joyce is a vastly experienced campaigner who joined the club from Highworth Town, where he played for the best part of a decade, midway through last season. Comfortable on the ball and possessing great technique and a strong footballing brain, Joyce is capable of playing in midfield and at full back.

Joyce initially made his breakthrough with Swindon Supermarine, helping them to the Hellenic League Premier Division title in 2000-01, before making the move to neighbours Highworth early the following season. He was a key member of the Worthians' side before switching back to Supermarine for the 2004-05 campaign, where he scored twice in 45 appearances as Marine successfully battled against the drop in the Southern League.

He returned to Hellenic League football with Carterton a season later, scoring five times in 35 games for the Oxfordshire side as they secured a seventh-place finish in the Premier Division.

The 2006-07 season started with Joyce in fine goalscoring form for Carterton with a handful of goals in his first nine appearances of the campaign. He would transfer back to The Elms in December though, adding another three goals before season's end. The midfielder was then Highworth's second leading appearance maker a year later, contributing eight goals - enough to make him third top scorer as his team wound up sixth.

Joyce's goal tally slipped in 2008-09, but he quickly returned to scoring form, grabbing eight in each of the next two seasons as he remained an integral member of the Worthians' team under boss Dave Webb. Four goals followed in 2009-10, including a strike in Highworth's 6-0 Hellenic League Challenge Cup final victory against Binfield.

After manager Webb's departure, Joyce moved to Premier Division rivals Wantage Town in the summer of 2012. He appeared 43 times for the Alredians in 2012-13, helping them to a runners-up finish before moving back to Highworth the following year.

Despite his advancing years, Joyce continued to rack up the appearances. Predominantly appearing at full back, he was Highworth's joint-leading outfield appearance maker in 2014-15, playing fifty times in all, while being an integral member of the Worthians side who reached the semi-finals of the FA Vase and triumphed in the Wiltshire Senior Cup.

Joyce then racked up more than seventy further appearances for Highworth in 2016-17 and 2017-18, the majority of which were starts, before making the switch to Bassett.

He fitted into his new team seamlessly and proved to be a helpful presence for the young players in the squad. Making his debut in a County Cup victory against Trowbridge Town, Joyce went on to play nineteen times, with only two of those appearances coming from the bench.

Our History

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's FA competition history is littered with games where, come full time, you are pondering the question "if only". And their 2018-19 Emirates FA Cup preliminary round replay against Lydney Town can be added to that lengthy list.

Bassett succumbed to a 5-3 defeat in a game that was the complete opposite to the stultifying 0-0 draw played out ten days ago. Ultimately it was sloppy defending in critical moments, first class finishing from the hosts and abysmal officiating that conspired against Bassett. But, having played the best part of an hour with ten men - and clawed back a two-goal deficit before the break while playing with that numerical disadvantage - the question will linger as to what the outcome could have been had Dale Richards not received his marching orders. The defender was deemed guilty of a handball on the line when Sam Elliott's powerful header from a Dan Morgan corner had squirmed out of the hands of Alex Bowers and caught Richards, stationed directly next to his 'keeper after covering the post, on the arm. It was eerily reminiscent of what transpired in the FA Vase at Hordean last season - a harsh red card for a handball that was clearly not deliberate. Surely it should have crossed the referee's mind that no player would purposefully seek to handle in that situation when his team were already a goal down? Alas, the decision was made, Richards marched off for an early shower, and Ross Gabriel swept home the penalty. That added to Dave Jenkins' earlier goal, which the Lydney midfielder cleverly flicked in at the near post from Liam Sheppard's low cross, the hosts clinically capitalising on a wayward ball forward from Steve Yeardley. It could even have been Lydney's third, but the crossbar had denied Lewis Thompson when he fired on the turn from close range having been gifted too much room in the box. After netting from the spot, Gabriel was then denied by a stunning, acrobatic save from Bowers as he got in front of his marker and headed towards goal from twelve yards.

That they trailed by two goals was something of a relief for Bassett. Still, a man down as well, the situation should have been terminal for their hopes. But, courageously, Sam Collier's team fought back. There was concern they would be reduced to nine men though when, just after the half hour mark, TJ Bohane reacted somewhat over-zealously after being the victim of a heavy challenge. The hosts were baying for red, yet the referee - who had long lost control of the game - produced only a caution. Less than thirty seconds later, Bohane scored, rising highest at the far post to redirect Gio Wrona's free kick into the top left corner with a stooping header. Then, four minutes before the break, Bassett pulled themselves level. Lydney were guilty of failing to clear their line, and the ball broke for Rob Lincoln, who powered his way to the byline before cutting back for Josh Shama to sweep in from ten yards. Lincoln had been causing all kinds of problems for right back Keelan Hamblett, while Shama's pace was also proving tricky for the home side to cope with on the opposite wing. And early in the second period it was Bassett who were on top. They had the chance to take the lead on 51 minutes too when Tony Joyce swung in a cross from deep, which Lincoln met at the far post only for Richard Thomas to awkwardly tip over. However, the game turned decisively around the hour mark as Bassett twice served up gifts to the hosts when looking to play out from the back. First, Hamblett seized on an Iggy Illot pass intended for Lincoln. Racing down the right side, he swung in a cross which Gabriel, playing with his back to goal, expertly hooked into the top left corner. Four minutes later, Bassett again opted not to clear their lines. This time Thompson was the beneficiary, and he cut inside before thrashing a low twenty-yard drive into the bottom corner. Lydney began asserting themselves and continued to be ever-dangerous from set pieces, with an unmarked Thompson somehow failing to find the target when he met a Morgan free kick delivery. Ultimately their fifth would arrive from open play. Patient play in the left corner eventually opened up room for substitute Pete Macklin to cross, and he picked out the deadly Gabriel, who headed home at the far post for his hat-trick. Ten minutes remained for Bassett to try and launch another unlikely comeback. Try as they might, they failed to pull it off. They got one back with six minutes to go when Wrona collected a square pass from Lincoln on the edge of the area and thumped an effort that Thomas was unable to keep out. A couple of minutes later the visitors should have had the chance to cut the deficit back down to one when Bohane was clearly hauled down in the box. Despite taking place directly in front of him, the referee was unmoved, with his perfectly placed assistant also unwilling to correct an error that was clear for all to see. With time running out, you can only speculate what would have transpired had Bassett played out the dying stages trailing just by a single goal (assuming the penalty had been scored). As Bassett have experienced plenty of times before though, being left to ask "if only" at full time is a sure sign of a painful, frustrating, agonising defeat.

Man of the match: Gio Wrona - provided the assist for Bassett's first with a fine free kick delivery and scored to offer a glimmer of hope towards the end. He also put in an excellent shift in the heart of midfield, particularly after his team had been reduced to ten men and the reshuffle of the formation more or less left him alone in the middle of the park.

Royal Revenge

It took a herculean defensive effort in the second half and, at times, it certainly was not pretty. But Royal Wootton Bassett Town dug deep to preserve a 2-1 victory over Windsor, helping avenge a 4-3 loss in Berkshire just a fortnight ago. As with the opening encounter, Sam Collier's side found themselves 2-0 in front at the break, a lead that was richly deserved courtesy of a professional performance during the opening 45 minutes.

The visitors quickly grabbed a goal following the restart though and had Bassett pinned deep for the majority of the period. Yet they were unable to find their way past debutant 'keeper Charlie McCready again as the Bassett backline did what they had to make sure that another two-goal advantage did not go to waste.

Bassett led from the game's tenth minute, their early positive play being duly rewarded. Coming off his line to try and punch away a Tony Joyce free kick, visiting 'keeper Hugo Sobte instead flattened TJ Bohane. The shotstopper almost made immediate amends, diving low to his left to keep out Bohane's spot kick. But the loose ball was seized upon by Steve Yeardley, and he teed up Josh Shama to recycle a cross into the danger area which Bohane coolly headed home.

That early goal certainly gave Bassett a boost, and within four minutes Brad Pagliaroli burst beyond right back Daniel Taylor. Doing well to keep the ball in play, he cut back to Bohane from the byline, but the pass was slightly behind the Bassett forward, who could only slice wide. Bohane was continuing to cause problems, and his knock down on the edge of the area set up Shama to cross to an unmarked Gio Wrona, who glanced his header wide from fifteen yards.

Windsor, playing tidy football, finally managed to eke out a chance on the half hour mark. It came from a free kick, awarded for a harsh handball against Shama in a dangerous position, but Matt Woods was unable to locate the target and blasted over.

Bassett then punished Windsor, crafting a superb second goal from captain Wrona. Pagliaroli was picked out by a diagonal ball out from the back and set out on a bustling run that saw him twist his way past two defenders. When reaching the area, he squared for Wrona, who shuffled the ball onto his right foot before curling a beautiful arcing effort into the top right corner.

Letting a three-goal lead slip against Windsor was still fresh in the memory for the hosts and so they knew such an advantage was not a comfortable one. And they were reminded twice before the break of the threat the Royalists posed. Firstly, the dangerous Dan Roberts headed over from close range at the far post after drifting free of his marker to meet Woods' cross. Then, after Roberts had seen an effort block, the loose ball squirmed free to Jeevan Panesar, who unleashed a stunning, swerving drive from beyond thirty yards that clattered the left post and bounced out for a corner off the back of McCready.

Harsh words must have been said in the visitors dressing room at half time as they were fast out of the blocks after the resumption. Within two minutes an open Malachi Thomas rushed a shot straight at McCready after Usman Lalustani's cross had evaded Carl Evans. Moments later, Roberts' powerful drive from the edge of the area was repelled by McCready before Yeardley blocked the follow up. Bassett's resistance eventually slipped through with 51 minutes on the clock. Failing to clear after McCready denied Woods, Thomas was on hand to punish Bassett, drilling into the bottom right corner from twelve yards.

They almost grabbed an equaliser before the hour too. After breaking from a Bassett free kick, Roberts found himself with room to shoot just outside the box and he produced a dipping strike that rattled the crossbar. The rebound fell to Matt Stockill following a rushed clearance, and his rasping strike was initially spilled by McCready before the 'keeper eventually smothered. Windsor continued to have Bassett pinned deep for the vast majority of the thirty minutes that remained. But despite their domination in terms of both territory and possession they failed to trouble McCready again. It was nail-biting stuff at times, with Bassett frequently affording dangermen Panesar and Roberts too much time and space. However, the hosts dug as deep as they could, throwing bodies in the way of the ball and clearing their lines to wind down the clock and allow themselves vital time to recover. They did have a couple of opportunities to kill the game off too but lacked a clinical edge on the counter.

With quarter of an hour to go, Pagliaroli raced onto a Bohane flick, but, cutting inside onto his less-favoured right foot, failed to find the target. Another break then saw Pagliaroli attempt to cut back for either Bohane or Sam Packer, but his pass was just out of their reach. Ultimately though a third goal was not required, while Windsor would be denied their comeback.

Man of the match: Tony Joyce – dealt well with the threat posed by Malachi Thomas and left back Josh Masters, who was playing in a very advanced position. The veteran full back was calm and sensible in possession, positioned himself well and played his part in Bassett's first goal with his dangerous delivery into the box that helped earn the penalty.

Our Visitors History

Flackwell Heath • Club History

Flackwell Heath FC was founded in 1907 and the club joined the High Wycombe and District League for its inaugural season. The Heathens proved to be a major force in local football, having won twelve Wycombe League championship titles and fourteen High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup finals.



In the 1950's Flackwell joined the Great Western Combination League and won this league twice before returning to the Wycombe League. In 1956 the club moved to its current home, the new ground being donated by the Wilks family.

Through the 60s and 70's the club continued their success on and off field and the new clubhouse was built in 1974 as the first stage of their rise into senior football. In 1975 The Heathens won the Berks and Bucks Intermediate Cup and the Reading Senior Cup. In 1977 the club achieved Senior status and moved up into the Hellenic League Division One. Promotion to the Premier Division was achieved at the first attempt. After five seasons in this league, during which time floodlights were installed at Wilks Park, Flackwell were elected into the Athenian League. In 1984 they joined the expanding Isthmian League. The clubs first season in this competition saw them playing in Division Two (North) and against some tough opposition they finished in a respectable eighth position. The following season Flackwell was switched to Division Two (South) where life turned out to be even tougher. At the end of season 1990-91, after finishing below mid-table, The Heathens found themselves placed in the newly formed Ryman League Division Three.

At this stage the club installed a 150 seater stand to stay in senior football, and new home changing rooms were built to comply with new ground gradings. For the next 10 years the club carried out further ground improvements and they established themselves in senior football.

In 2002/03 for the first time in their history Flackwell reached the 4th qualifying round of the FA Cup losing 4-1 at home against Crawley and finished third in the newly formed Ryman League Division Two, the highest position achieved to date.

In 2003/04 Flackwell won The High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup for the twelfth time. In season 2004/05 The Heathens reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup for the second time in three years, this time losing 3-0 at Ryman Premier Division Billericay Town and were runners-up in the Ryman League Associate Members Cup, losing 2-1 after extra time to Division Two champions Ilford on their own ground. The Veterans team won the FA Umbro Sunday Cup, lead by Byron Walton a feat which was repeated in 2006 and 2007. After winning the National final the lads went to The Bernabeu Stadium and played against Real Madrid veterans for the European Cup and lost by 3-1.

Flackwell finished fourth in Ryman League Division Two in 2005/06, narrowly missing out on promotion. After the end of 2006/07 the FA reorganised the non-league pyramid and we were due to be relegated into the South Midlands Spartan League until Barking and East Ham United went out of business and we were given the opportunity to take their place in the Ryman Division One (North). Unfortunately we finished bottom of the league and were relegated into the Hellenic Premier Division for season 2008/09.

In 2007/08 season we held our centenary game against Wycombe Wanderers with a crowd of 1300 watching Peter Taylors' first game in charge at Wycombe.

In our first season in the Hellenic League we finished in 9th position and lost 2-1 to Chalfont Wasps in the final of the High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup at Adams Park. In 2010/11 we got to two cup finals but both were lost on penalty shoot-outs, The Berks & Bucks Trophy to Newport Pagnell and the Reading Senior Cup to Newbury Town.

The 2014/15 season saw us gain promotion into the Southern League Division 1. However, a late move by the Southern League of us from the Central Division into the South West Division meant FHFC were unable to accept promotion and we stayed in the Hellenic League Premier Division for season 2015-16. 2014-15 also saw us with places in the final of the Berks & Bucks Trophy (losing to Windsor FC) and the High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup (winning against Penn & Tylers Green FC). Earlier that season we reached the fourth qualifying round of the FA Cup losing to Conference side Weston Supermare 4-1. For the first time in club history we also reached the last sixteen of the FA Vase losing 3-2 to Shaw Lane Aquaforce. 2015/16 season under the continued management of Graham Malcolm assisted by Paul Shone saw us finish 3rd in the Hellenic League also winning 3 cup finals – the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy (against Newport Pagnell FC), the UHlsport Challenge Cup (against Brackley Town Saints) and the Wycombe Senior Cup (against Pitstone and Ivinghoe FC).

At the end of the season the manager Graham Malcolm resigned to pursue a life in Spain and his assistant Paul Shone was appointed the new manager to take the team through to the new season.

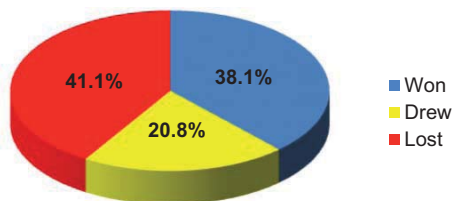

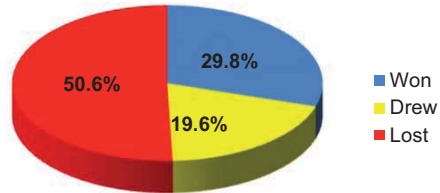

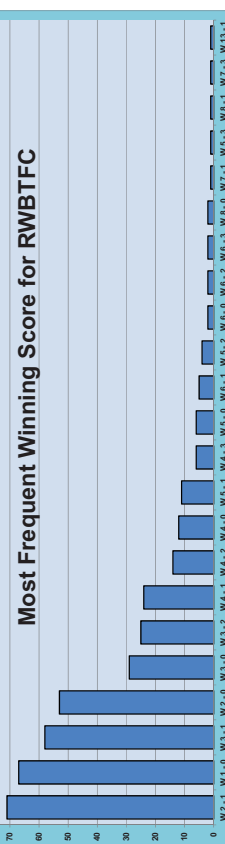

Despite falling a goal behind after Alex Wall found a way past Will Henry midway through the opening half, Chippenham fought back to put four goals past Concord in the concluding 45 minutes. Curtis McDonald bagged a brace, while Dean Evans and Nat Jarvis were also on target for Mark Collier's men. The win lifted Chippenham up into 12th place, just two points off the play-off spots.

In the Southern League Premier Division, Swindon Supermarine lost their second league game of the season as an early goal for Hendon saw them take all three points. Supermarine bounced back in midweek with a comfortable 3-0 FA Cup replay win over AFC Dunstable. Meanwhile Melksham Town remain unbeaten after their opening four games picking up a useful away point against a Winchester City side who went into the game with a 100% record. Another Wiltshire side crossing the water to the Isle of Wight were Pewsey Vale. Not such a happy ending for them though as they lost 4-3 at East Cowes Vics. There were defeats for the other two Wiltshire sides, Calne losing by the odd goal in a 9-goal thriller at home to Fawley whilst Amesbury went down 5-0 away to Hamworthy United.

Three of the four district leagues involving Wiltshire sides got under way on Saturday with Sherston and Minety both having good opening day wins in the Cirencester & District League. In the Swindon & District League Lower Stratton had a 6-3 win over Swindon Supermarine and Bakers Arms defeated Ashton Keynes 3-1. In the Trowbridge & District League Heytesbury were 3-0 winners over Warminster Town Res whilst champions Freshford were held 1-1 by Trowbridge Town Res.

Wiltshire County League Division One Winners 1987/88

Wootton Bassett Town, under the guidance of Mick Woolford, secured promotion out of the Wiltshire League as they lifted the County League Division One title following a marvellous 1987/88 campaign. Holding over a lengthy unbeaten streak from the season before – which saw Bassett finish fourth – Woolford’s side picked up from where they left off, scoring 13 goals in their opening three matches and conceding just one in reply. Dunbar Wills were the first to be put to the sword as they were defeated 4-1 at Rylands Way. A 2-0 victory away to Chippenham Town Reserves followed before newly promoted Laverstock & Ford were shown no favours, being beaten 7-0, thanks mainly to the deadly duo of Damien York and Roger Frost, who bagged five between them that afternoon.

Bassett then dropped their first points of the season in a 2-2 at Calne Town courtesy of a late equaliser from the hosts. However, it was back to winning ways against much fancied Amesbury, Andy Bowden’s penalty being the only goal of the game. An away draw at recently promoted Aldbourne Park immediately followed though. Despite retaining their unbeaten record, September had been a disappointing month for the side, but October began with a promising 2-0 away win against Pewsey Vale before a come from behind victory against Old Manor by the odd goal in five. York and Frost again grabbed all the goals in a 3-1 home win against Sanford a week later before Plessey Sports held the side to a 2-2 draw, with the unstoppable pair scoring two late goals to avert defeat.

A 2-1 win at Corsham then put Bassett three points clear at the top before a 4-0 thumping of Pinehurst, a game which was conspicuous for the lack of goals from the side’s deadly duo; instead a Steve Ackrill brace and further strikes from Terry Hanrahan and Nathan Walker sealed the win. Cup commitments meant Bassett would only play one league contest in December, that being a 4-0 home win over Corsham, in which York further added to his already impressive goals tally with a brace. Bassett were further frustrated by the inclement weather, which meant they restarted their title challenge late in January with a trip to reigning champions Bemerton. Goals from Frost and Paul Harrison secured a 2-0 win to put Bassett into second with an astonishing nine games in hand over leader Old Manor with just three points separating the two sides.

With such a cushion, it appeared as though the foot was taken off the gas slightly: two weeks in a row Bassett were saved by late equalisers, firstly at home to Ferndale and then at Old Manor. Confidence was restored though thanks to their semi final win in the Wilts Senior Cup as Bassett went on to thrash Calne 6-0 in their return to league action as York and Harrison both netted twice. This extended the unbeaten streak to 30 games, but defeated in the Ghia Senior Cup to Sanford meant it went no further. Still, a fresh streak was started with a 2-0 home win against Oldacre before a 4-1 victory against Laverstock moved Bassett back into second. Defeat in the league was finally experienced on the 23rd March away to Ferndale, who netted an 87th minute winner to take the game by the odd goal in five. A second consecutive loss – this time by a single goal at Bemerton – quickly followed, followed by a draw with Dunbar Wills and a 2-1 home defeat to Chippenham provoked fears that the title could be thrown away. Yet Bassett were still just three points off the top with seven games left and both Bemerton and Old Manor having completed their fixtures.

A Darren Jell hat-trick propelled Bassett to a 4-1 victory at home to Plessey Sports to kick start their stuttering campaign before top spot was regained despite a disappointing goalless draw with Pewsey. However, a 2-0 defeat to Sanford made things interesting once more, leaving Bassett and Ferndale level pegging with both sides having four games left. However, Bassett were to finish with a flourish, winning their final four games to seal the title. A last minute Ian Johns winner began the streak as Oldacre were beaten 2-1 before Aldbourne were comfortably dispatched 3-0 at Rylands Way. The championship was secured in the penultimate game – a 2-0 win at Amesbury – thanks to Ferndale’s surprising draw with Aldbourne. The league campaign then finished in style with a 7-1 home win against Pinehurst, who had held a 1-0 lead at the break. Sadly though, it was not to be the double as Hellenic League Purton secured a 1-0 victory. Yet, it was a historic season nonetheless, for it sealed Bassett’s ascent to the highest level of the non-league pyramid the club had so far achieved.



1987-88 Revisited

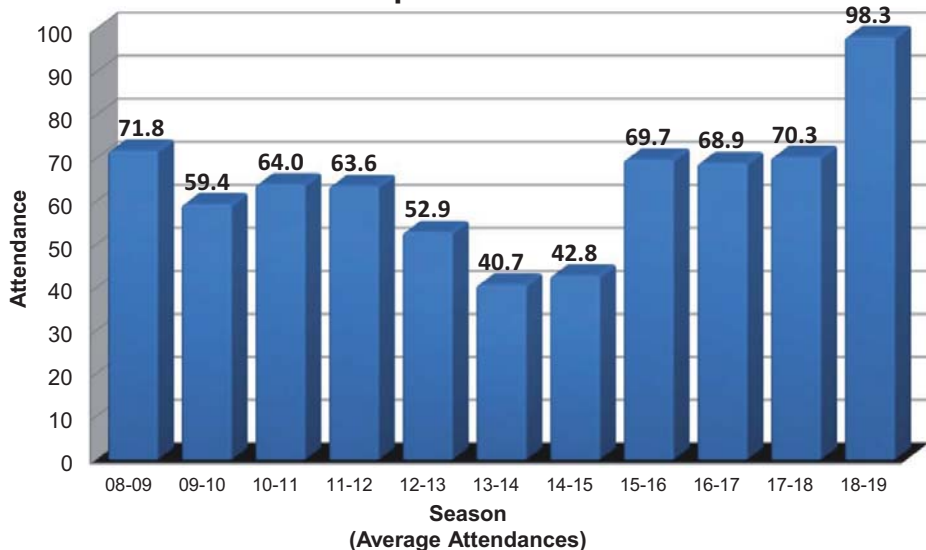

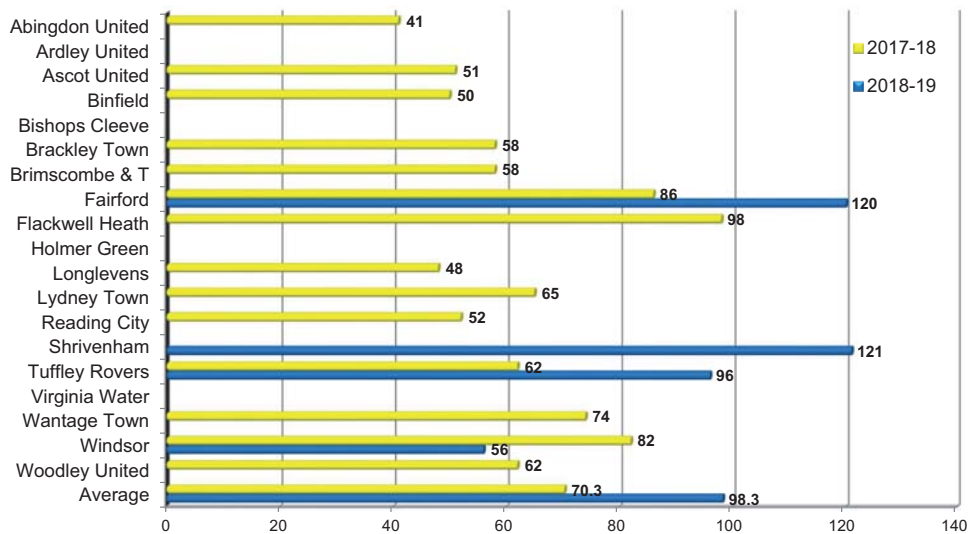

RWBTFC Attendances - Season 2018-19 (and comparison to 2017-18)



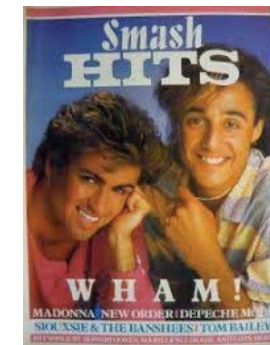
