Bassett News

Today's Game

Welcome to our 18th game of the season and our 9th home game as we entertain Reading City (formerly Highmoor Ibis) here at the Gerard Buxton Ground. A warm welcome to our visitors from Reading who have made the journey down the M4 for today's encounter. We hope they enjoy their brief visit to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground and we wish them a safe journey back down the motorway.

Reading City have made a good start to the season and currently occupy 6th place in the table although they come into today's game on the back of three defeats in a row and will no doubt be keen to return to winning ways here this afternoon. They will be spearheaded by the prolific Mitchell Parker who has already scored over half of his sides 25 league goals this season. We have played our visitors 10 times previously with our visitors having the better of things, winning 5 games to 3 for Bassett, 2 games having been drawn. That said our recent record has been reasonable with our 3 wins coming in the last couple of seasons. Hopefully we can put our own disappointing run of 3 games without a win behind us here today but as ever a tough game is in prospect.

After three Saturdays away from home, and a welcome rest from midweek games, today is now the first of 5 consecutive home fixtures here at the Gerard Buxton Ground. This includes a couple of midweek fixtures, one in the Wiltshire Senior Cup against a Westbury United side who possess a 100% record in the Western League Premier Division and another second league encounter for the season, this time against Virginia Water. We also now have a league home game next Saturday when we meet Brackley Town Saints again, making it 6 teams we will meet twice in our first 17 league games. As a result of the Brackley Town Saints game being brought forward, subject to no home games being inserted, we will now go from 1 December to 19 January with no First Team home game scheduled and five consecutive away games. At the time of writing these notes we still await written feedback to our constructive comments to the league about this season's fixture scheduling.

Thought for The Day

Just because the likes of Jose Mourinho, Arsene Wenger and even the new managers like Fat Frank at Derby moan about referees all the time, it does not mean we as a club also need to blame the referees every time things do not go our way. Personally, I would like our whole approach, both on and off the field, to be a bit savvier and for us to adopt the Brian Clough approach to referees. His view was that referees have a tough job to do and he didn't want his sides to make it any tougher. His teams did not argue or shout at referees and if the players did they found themselves heavily fined by the manager. Mr Clough won a few trophies along the way, his achievements with Derby and Forest, two struggling provincial clubs with little prior history of success, are rated amongst the greatest in football history. All of us should think about their own experiences at work. Anyone recall performing better in their work if they were constantly being shouted at (and I include the RAF and Army guys and gals in that question)? Or perform better after being given bad feedback assessments by a specific boss every time they finished a piece of work? I am not sure why we should think referees are any different. Furthermore, anyone ever recall a game where a referee changed a decision after being shouted at? I am getting on a bit now and, despite shouting a few times over the years, can't come up with a single example from my own playing, managing or spectating experiences. I guess with age comes wisdom. The only thing that I can recall is what usually happens is you get a yellow card for the dissent and you have to pay a fine to the FA.

I am not sure what the FA's 'Respect handshake protocol' between the officials and players before the game is specifically meant to achieve, and that is after reading the page on the FA's own Respect Guide a few times over to try and clarify the point. In my view it should mean that the player who shakes the officials' hands is making a contract to accept all of their decisions in a sporting manner, even if he thinks they are wrong at the time. If that is what it is supposed to mean it is not working in the Premier League and, possibly as a consequence of how the big guys behave, it is also not working in local football and the pre-game handshake appears to me to have now become just a pre-match ritual that teams do because they have been told to do it. So, going back to Mr Clough, perhaps if we adopt the Brian Clough approach to referees we might win a few more games and be as successful as his sides? How about we all, and I include myself in this, give it a try to see what happens, starting today?

Bassett News

Brackley Town Saints, Tuffley Rovers and Wantage Town

Three games on the road and no wins to show for it. A useful point away at Brackley Town Saints in the league was followed by a disappointing Bluefin Insurance Cup defeat at a much improved Tuffley Rovers side who we defeated 6-1 on the opening day of the season but lost 4-0 to in the cup game. This was followed by a 3-2 defeat at title favourites Wantage Town after leading 2-0 and then pressing the self-destruct button as we did at Highworth last season. Stuart's match report later in the programme sums up well what happened and hopefully lessons can be learnt.

Development Side

We have made a change in their Development team management structure. Further to the club's intended ethos for the Wiltshire League Development side, Steve Chadwick and Mike Brewer will take over from Paul Gerrish and head up a new 'coaching-based' management team for the remainder of the season. Steve, currently working towards his UEFA B Coaching Licence, joined Bassett last season as Head of Youth Coaching and has assisted with training for the Development team too. Mike, meanwhile, was a member of Rich Hunter's first team coaching staff between 2016 and January 2018. The club would like to express their sincere thanks to Paul for his efforts with the Development team over the past season and a half. Having been involved with the club's youth section and then been in charge of the Under 18 Floodlit League team for two years, Paul stepped up to take over the Development team at the start of last season. Utilising a young squad, many of who had played for him in the Under 18s, he guided the team to a creditable tenth place finish. So far this season, the Development side have recorded two wins and a draw from their opening nine games. The club is also pleased that Paul will remain at the club and are in discussions with him regarding a new role. Paul's last game in charge last Saturday saw the Development side win 5-2 at home against Devizes Town Reserves.

Sunday Side – The Dog Beats the Dog

The Sunday side recorded a superb 4-3 victory against last season's runners-up Greyhound in the Wiltshire Sunday Cup first round last Sunday. Lewis Petrie's brace and further goals from Danny Hale and Jack Duckers put Bassett in what appeared to be a commanding position at half time as they led 4-0. However, Greyhound launched an impressive comeback in the second half, pulling to within a goal. But sterling defensive work by keeper Dave "Mad Dog" Groom and his defence ensured Bassett held on to win by the odd goal in seven against the "Dog" and book their place in the next round.

Ladies Team

Our Ladies lost their first league game of the season when they went down 2-1 at home to local rivals Swindon Spitfires. In an evenly-matched contest, Bassett were ultimately left to rue a handful of missed opportunities that proved the difference between defeat and at least a share of the spoils. Bassett struck first with the only goal of the opening period. And it was a cracker. A good passage of play saw the ball wind up in possession of midfielder Amber Egerton and she fired into the top corner, leaving the Spitfires 'keeper no chance. Early in the second half, both teams found the woodwork, with the hosts finding the bar and the visitors seeing an effort tipped onto the post. Spitfires would take full advantage of the resulting corner, with Lani Dickinson heading home. Bassett responded well to the equaliser, putting Spitfires under a great deal of pressure. Yet that came to nothing. In contrast, Spitfires proved more composed in front of goal, and Dickinson scored her second and what proved to be the winner, finding the top corner of the net after 'keeper Abi Footner had saved her first attempt. The Ladies will look to bounce back tomorrow when they meet Swindon Town Development here at the GBSG.

Next Up at The Gerard Buxton Ground

Other than the Ladies game the next game here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground is this coming Tuesday when an in-form Westbury United side visit in the Wiltshire Senior Cup. Having lost heavily to them in a pre-season friendly on the AstroTurf I am sure Sam and the lads will be keen to put in an improved performance and extend our interest in this prestigious competition. So please come along and give them your support.

Our Visitors History

Reading City • Club History

Reading City Football Club's formation came as part of Highmoor AFC's 50 year celebration in 2018.

Club secretary, Chris Gallimore took over the role in 1990 and recruited the now Chairman, Martin Law, to become first team manager in 1992 and between them they assembled a strong squad of players and success was to follow.

The club thrived, with regular promotions, league and cup doubles, being the first club to win the current Thames Valley Premier League unbeaten. The Reserves are still the only reserve side to win the same Reading Step 7 League.

After winning the league promotion to the UHlsport Hellenic League in 2012 meant moving and playing at Palmer Park, the current location was secured in 2016 and in 2018 after 50 years it was decided to change the name to Reading City.

This decision was not taken lightly however the community of Reading has yearned for a semi-professional club behind Reading FC to represent Reading and give local players the opportunity to play for a Reading based team as Reading.

The pathway for the club begins with the Sunday morning development centre for 4-6 year olds through to Under 16's, with us having representation at every year group amounting to some 26 teams.

This pathway will over the coming years become the life blood of the club. The highly qualified FA coaches will deliver the club's philosophy and structure meaning every player at any age group will play the Reading City FC way. The future is bright and we hope to give the community of Reading a great opportunity.

Our Visitors This Season



After a disappointing season by their own standards last season, the former Highmoor Ibis club have re-branded themselves as Reading City, assembled a strong looking squad, and have made a good start to the season. They currently sit in 6th place in the table with games in hand over most of the teams above them in the table.

They started the season with a 5-1 hammering of newly promoted Shrivenham at their own ground followed by a 4-0 home win over Abingdon United to head the early league tables. They did, however, make an early exit from the FA Cup, losing 2-1 at Chipping Sodbury Town in a replay after initially holding their Western League opponents to a 1-1 draw.

Back in the league they carried on where they had left off with a 3-1 home win over Fairford Town and an away win at an improved Tuffley Rovers to make it four wins from the opening four league games. The good run in the league finally came to an end when they surprisingly lost 3-0 away to another newly promoted side, Ardley United.

As with the FA Cup, interest in the FA Vase was short lived as they went out in the first game, losing 3-2 away at Southall from the Combined Counties League.

Their best result of the season came under the lights at Binfield as they returned to Reading with all three points following a 5-2 win with Mitchell Parker the star of the show, hitting four goals in this excellent away win against one of the better sides in the league.

After such a great result they were brought back down to earth as Ardley United did an early "double" over Reading, winning 4-1 at Scours Lane. Reading bounced back immediately with another good performance returning from the long journey to Lydney, never an easy place to visit, with all three points following a 3-0 win.

The inconsistent form and the poor cup form this season returned when Reading lost twice to former manager Marcus Richardson's Flackwell Heath side in both the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup and the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup. This bad run then continued into their last league game when they lost 3-1 at home to a strong Brimscombe & Thrupp side meaning they come into today's game on the back of three straight defeats and will no doubt be keen to get back to winning ways here at the Gerard Buxton Ground.

Their dangerman today will be last season's top scorer Mitchell Parker, who has already scored 13 of Reading City's 25 league goals to date.

Visitors - Tourist Information

Introduction to Reading

Reading is a large, historically important minster town in Berkshire, of which it is now the county town. It is in the Thames Valley at the confluence of the River Thames and River Kennet, and on both the Great Western Main Line railway and the M4 motorway. Reading is 70 miles (110 km) east of Bristol, 24 miles (39 km) south of Oxford, 37 miles (60 km) west of London, 14 miles (23 km) north of Basingstoke, 12 miles (19 km) south-west of Maidenhead and 15 miles (24 km) east of Newbury as the crow flies.

Interesting Facts About Reading

Despite our opponents club name, Reading is the largest town without city status in the UK.

One reason for the building of the Royal Berkshire Hospital in the town was the large number of serious injuries occurring during the construction of the Great Western Railway. The first patient treated at the Royal Berks was George Earley, a railway worker aged 15. He was treated for a severe compound fracture of the upper arm which required amputation at the shoulder.

Reading was home to the first ever Little Chef restaurant opened in 1958 in Oxford Road.

Huntley & Palmers biscuit factory provided ordinary and specially made emergency biscuits to the ill-fated British Antarctic Expedition to the South Pole, led by Captain Scott in 1911.

Reading University was the only university in the UK to be awarded a charter between the two world wars.

Reading FC hold the record for the number of points gained in a professional league season in England with 106 points in the 2005–06 Football League Championship campaign.

Famous Residents

A little known fact is that Ayrton Senna lived with friends in a rented detached house in Reading, for a couple of years during the early part of his career in the 1980s. In honour of his time in Tilehurst, Ayrton Senna Road, off City Road, and a children's play area were named after the racing legend. The road ironically has speed humps to slow drivers down.

Given the size of Reading the list of famous residents and ex-residents is a long one.

Lawrie Sanchez, the former Wimbledon football player, who was at Loughborough University at the same time as the Programme Editor was from Reading. Other famous sportsmen from the town include Matthew Syed the former table tennis player and now sports journalist for the Times, cricketer Peter May and former Nottingham Forest and Manchester United midfielder player Neil Webb.

Non-sporting residents have included Mike Oldfield (he of Tubular Bells fame), Michael Foot the left wing politician and alleged Russian Spy, if you believe the Daily Mail, , the Paddington Bear author Michael Bond and author Jane Austen, who went to school in Reading.

Nearest Railway Station

The nearest railway stations to the ground are actually Tilehurst and Reading West railway stations, but if coming from Swindon by train then it is probably best to get to Reading main line station and then catch a taxi or bus to the ground. Reading station is on the main line to the West Country out of Paddington, but also has train services going both north and south of the country.

Nearest Pubs to Ground

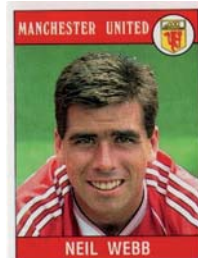
Given the location of the ground away from the main roads the recommendation is to have a drink actually at the ground, supporting our visitors.

Things to Do in Reading

The main football team in the town play in the Championship at the . Madejski Stadium and I had a recent enjoyable evening there watching QPR win 1-0. With an excellent 'park and ride' service from Earley this is always an easy ground to get to.

The main entertainment venue in the town is the Hexagon, where there are often concerts involving big name bands. The Hexagon is also the place for shopping. A somewhat more intimate venue is Sub89 where the Programme Editor has had enjoyable evenings watching The Stranglers, Buzzcocks and the Undertones in recent times..

Reading is also the site of the annual Reading Festival which takes place right next door to today's visitor's ground which is utilised during the Festival. Reading Festival is the number one UK music festival taking place over August bank holiday weekend.

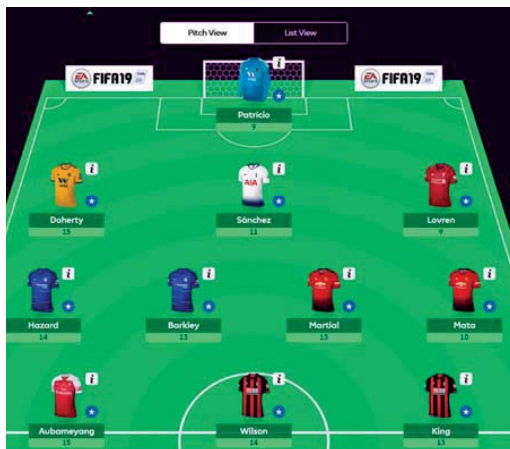

And their afternoon appeared to go from bad to worse when McCready – by a quirk of fate, Hungerford's hero during the shootout on Tuesday - extended himself brilliantly to tip Chris Jackson's low penalty onto the post following a push on Robertson.

But their route back into the game proved to be just around the corner. And it was one Bassett provided to them.

Corcoran's sending off came just moments after Diaz-Benitez had picked up his first caution too, as the defender slid in late with a heavy challenge on Mark Flanagan. That set the tone for a niggly final portion of the first half which saw further yellows dished out to Steve Yeardley for Bassett as well as Wright and Jack Dunmall for Wantage. Yet it was Bassett who lost their cool most.

They would be quickly punished after play resumed.

Using the additional space afforded to them well, Wantage worked the ball from right to left and Dunmall played a cutback to an unmarked Wright, whose slightly deflected low strike from the edge of the area found its way past McCready.

The Bassett stopper then made two fine saves to preserve his team's lead, batting away a Jim Glover header at the far post before blocking Dunmall's effort from close range.

It was all hands to the pumps for Bassett, though they did manage one counter from which Bennett surged forward before firing a firm strike at Meare from the edge of the box.

The visitors' task soon became that much harder when a heavy touch took the ball away from Diaz-Benitez and he was late sliding in on Glover. And within a matter of minutes Bassett's lead had vanished. Flanagan played a short corner to Dan Comer, who teased in a cross from the right wing, which Beeden got his head to, only to divert it into his own net.

Bassett did receive something of a lifeline when substitute Ryan Markham received a laughable red card for a trip on Gio Wrona that merited nothing more than a yellow (if that).

Yet, with Wantage having made virtually all the second half running, shifting from a defensive outlook to an attacking one was always going to be hard for Bassett.

Another McCready save, this time tipping over from an unmarked Kaylem Patterson, preserved parity before Robertson blasted into the side netting from an angle.

But a winner had long appeared on the cards, and it duly arrived when Robertson received a pass inside from Flanagan on the left, turned on a sixpence and arrowed a strike into the top right corner.

There should still have been nine minutes left to play, but only five of those would be completed before a premature end to the game was called. Yet it is questionable as to whether Collier's side would have been able to make anything of them.

Either way, Bassett had been the instigators of their own demise, and the blame for passing up an outstanding opportunity to claim what would have been three significant points is theirs and theirs alone.

Man of the Match: Charlie McCready – for the second time in a week, the talented young 'keeper served to frustrate Wantage, pulling off a superb penalty save in the opening period. He made a handful of other fine stops too, but in the end was powerless to keep out the Alfredians' three second half goals.

Lack of discipline comes back to bite Bassett again

The game may have ended in farcical circumstances as the full-time whistle was sounded a full four minutes early. But the story of Royal Wootton Bassett Town's 3-2 defeat away against Wantage Town was Bassett's loss of discipline, which cost them the game.

Sam Collier's team found themselves in a commanding position early on as stunning strikes from Kieran Diaz-Benitez and TJ Bohane gave them a 2-0 lead after just 22 minutes.

However, that was overturned as Bassett were reduced to nine men courtesy of red cards for Adam Corcoran and Kieran Diaz-Benitez. And, as doggedly as they may have defended, it was little surprise that they ultimately caved into the pressure Wantage put them under to lose by the odd goal in five.

While Bassett remain in the top half of the Hellenic League Premier Division, this was the latest instalment of a frustrating spell that has seen them throw away far too many points. Again, it was a situation entirely of their own making.

The turning point of the game would come five minutes before half time when Corcoran received his marching orders. Awaiting delivery of a free kick from a position deep in Wantage territory, he became embroiled in a tangle off the ball with Brad Cox and sent the home defender tumbling to the floor.

With his team two goals to the good away from home against one of the favourites for the title, it was inexcusable. And costly.

Callum Wright halved Wantage's arrears within a minute of the restart and proceeded to pin Bassett deep in their own half. The visitors defended doggedly though and resisted their opponents' advances well.

But their task was made even tougher just after the hour when Diaz-Benitez picked up a second yellow for a late tackle.

Playing two men short, Bassett soon conceded an equaliser – albeit in unfortunate fashion. Wantage themselves were reduced to ten men with quarter of an remaining. But, with Bassett having been forced to shift to an ultra-defensive setup, there was only ever really going to be one winner. And that was the home side, who struck the decisive blow in the 81st minute through Steve Robertson.






























Collier's team flew out the blocks, going ahead in the third minute. McCready's ball forward caught out centre half Cox, allowing the dangerous Josh Shama to pick up possession on the left and drive forward. After cutting inside, he squared to Diaz-Benitez who curled a wonderful left-footed effort into the top corner, leaving Curtis Meare no chance.

After McCready was alert to block a Robertson shot with his feet, Bassett came within inches of doubling their advantage after only nine minutes. However, latching onto Jon Beeden's ball over the top of the defence, Matt Bennett lifted his attempted lob over an onrushing Meare but the wrong side of the post.

That miss appeared to matter little though as Bohane fired Bassett two goals in front with a piledriver of a free kick from close to thirty yards that screamed its way into the top corner.

Wantage, just three days removed from an exhaustive, admirable effort that saw them take National League South Hungerford Town to penalties in an FA Cup replay, were on the rack.

Our History

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

Bassett frustrate Saints to collect valuable point

While it took a strong defensive effort to get over the line, Royal Wootton Bassett Town stretched their unbeaten record against Brackley Town Saints to seven games as they claimed a 1-1 draw away in Northamptonshire.

Defender Mark James had given Bassett the lead eight minutes before half time, steering in after a corner fell to him in the box.

But Brackley, as is typically the case when playing against them, enjoyed a great deal of possession and also created a number of chances in the opening half. However, with Bassett diligently keeping their shape, 'keeper Charlie McCreedy was only called into action on a couple of occasions before the break, the majority of opportunities the hosts fashioned resulting in shots missing the target.

They eventually made their pressure tell five minutes after the restart as James Watts found the net.

Yet though the remainder of the game followed a similar pattern to that in the first half, Brackley were only able to register one more shot on target, coming via the boot of George Ball.

That meant Bassett were able to secure a valuable, deserved point on their travels against a dangerous, youthful Saints team who have enjoyed a fine start to their season.

In fact, Bassett are only the third team to have avoided defeat in the early stages of the campaign against Brackley, who, given the fact they have a settled, quality squad that has now played together for a number of years, are justifiably viewed by many as a dark horse in the race for the top spots in the Hellenic League Premier Division.

Late barrage brings heavy cup defeat

Three late goals condemned Royal Wootton Bassett Town to a heavy 4-0 loss against Tuffley Rovers in the opening round of the Bluefin Sports Challenge Cup.

Against a Rovers side who were much-improved from the outfit Bassett thrashed 6-1 on the opening day of the league campaign, Sam Collier's team put in a disappointing performance, though credit must go to Tuffley who defended well and did not allow their visitors to get into any sort of rhythm.

Tuffley went in front after just ten minutes. The goal came somewhat against the run of play, but was well taken as Dominik Kent latched onto Lee Smith's pass and produced a composed finish to slot beyond Connor Thompson in the Bassett goal.

Chances were evenly distributed for the remainder of the half. For Bassett, TJ Bohane volleyed narrowly over from the edge of the area and Iggy Ilott fired over from a good position following good work from Tony Joyce and Brad Pagliaroli. It was something of a scrappy finish from the former Fairford man Smith, whose shot looped in off Thompson after Bassett failed to clear but was symptomatic of the veteran forward's poacher's instincts.

Five minutes later, Ashley Bird beat an onrushing Thompson to reach a pass played in over the top and, after deftly knocking the ball over the 'keeper, he nodded into an empty net.

Brett James then completed the rout, stealing possession off Joyce, who had been played a hospital pass, before steering beyond Thompson.

Storming comeback seals win

A sensational second half performance from Royal Wootton Bassett Town blew away Lydney Town as Sam Collier's side recovered from being 2-0 down after less than twenty minutes to triumph by the odd goal in five on another dramatic evening of football involving these two teams.

On a blustery night, all five goals were scored at the same end. However, it was ultimately the hosts who took better advantage of having the wind behind their backs.

They looked in store for a long evening at first though. After only eight minutes Sam Elliott gave Lydney the lead, as his header, while unmarked, crept in with 'keeper Charlie McGready thinking the ball was headed the other side of the post. The visitors then doubled their advantage when Bassett failed to deal with another free kick and Sam Wines nodded in from Lewis Halford's cross.

That was shortly followed by TJ Bohane heading narrowly over. Despite that miss, you could sense that a third was on its way for Bassett.

And that duly arrived through Pagliaroli, who produced another fine strike from the outer limit of the penalty area with seven minutes remaining.

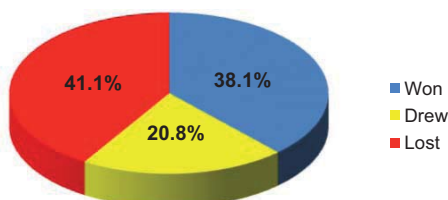

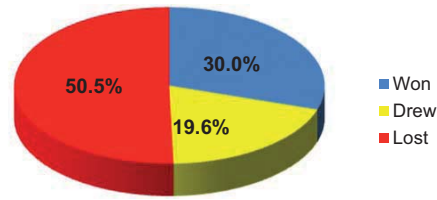

Fairford Town battle back from three-goal deficit in Hellenic League

FAIRFORD Town manager Jody Bevan praised his side's character and determination after they reversed a 3-0 deficit to win 5-4 at Ardley United on Saturday, lifting them off the foot of the Hellenic Premier Division table.

Greg Hackett's early brace coupled with Tobias London's strike on 21 minutes granted the hosts a comfortable three-goal advantage with barely half an hour played.

Connor Thompson then struck for Fairford before Bevan's half-time team talk inspired Mason Thompson to a second-half hat-trick before Jordan Moore levelled the game at four apiece.

Fairford's John Thomas wasn't happy with a point, though, as his goal fired Bevan's troops into a deserved – if unlikely – lead.

Bevan said: "It was an absolutely crazy match, you never knew which way it was going to go.

"We were 3-0 down after half an hour, so it's one hell of a result for ourselves.

"We were wobbling, they looked like they could score at any moment – and they had chances to score more goals.

"At that period, we stopped playing and started doing silly things. We got a goal back just before half-time and that was crucial, it allowed me to get into the lads and get some belief back in the squad.

"We created plenty of chance ourselves in the first half, but we just weren't taking them.

"We got a goal early in the second half, then it became crazy."

The performance underlined Bevan's belief in his squad, admitting that he doesn't rate his side worthy of being in the bottom positions in the league table.

While conceding four goals will naturally raise questions in the defence, Bevan insists his side must make the most of winning a nine-goal thriller.

"All round it was a great team performance in the second half," said Bevan.

"I never thought we were a table worthy of being bottom of the table. We've got quality all round and we saw that on Saturday.

"It's not particularly good for my heart being goals behind early doors.

"But full credit to the lads today, they put a real shift in and deserve the win. They showed real character.

"When we were losing games, confidence does drop. But that's changed now."

Elsewhere in the Hellenic Premier Division, Shrivenham's leagues woes continued as they lost 3-2 at Holmer Green, Sean McKeown and Josh Morse netting for Gareth Davies' side.

Royal Wootton Bassett were also on the wrong end of a five-goal contest – losing 3-2 at Wantage Town as Kieran Diaz-Benitez and TJ Bohane on target.

In Division One West, Malmesbury Victoria lost 3-1 at home to Thornbury, with Shane Bumphrey on target for the hosts, while New College Swindon were thrashed 10-0 at home against Pewsey Vale.

Respect

This week's NLP programme column below, written by **Nathan French**, the FA's National Respect Project Manager. It's from a segment within the NLP edition called 'Football Matters', which if you're not aware is a running series we have with various figures from within the FA's operating structure.

A LOT has been said over the years about disrespect in grassroots football – now it's about changing the tone of voice to focus on the importance of Respect in the game. Respect is a positive action. Yes, there are heightened incidents which can grab the headlines but there is a lot of good work going on every week across the country. We need to make it socially unacceptable to behave badly on the touchline, whether it's coaches or parents.

Having previously been involved with Respect from a County FA's point of view – I worked for the Suffolk FA – and also as chairman of a youth league for three years, I had my own take on what works well locally. But I was keen to get an understanding about what 'good' looks like across the country and appreciate it's going to be different in different places. So my first year was very much that. We did a lot of research to understand what has worked well over the last eight years but also really look forward to see where we need to position Respect strategically in order to make the greatest impact.

Grassroots football covers such a vast area, so the questions were: where do we need to focus our resources time and money? What is most needed? Over the last few months we've really started to execute our three-year strategy for Respect. The key focus is mini soccer and youth football – U7s right up to U16s. With the Respect campaign being nearly ten years old, we've naturally got a whole new group of parents, coaches, volunteers and players have emerged. Ensuring the environment is right for those players, and that it is created by those parents, coaches and volunteers, is really important. A big point from the research was getting the off pitch right as much as on the pitch. We often talk about the match environment in isolation. Actually a lot of incidents can happen from social media, or from the way the changing rooms were left last time the two teams played, or it could even be the way you are welcomed when you arrive at the ground. That can go a long way to setting the tone for the rest of the day and the game ahead. So it's looking at how coaches, parents and volunteers from both teams can work together – rather than against each other – to create that environment because, ultimately, everyone is looking for a fantastic experience. It links in to our 'We only do Positive' campaign. We know 90 per cent children play better with positivity. That stat isn't necessarily surprising but it's important people see that encouragement and a positive environment is so important. If you flip it, we know one negative experience can have a big effect on a child for lasting period of time. It's adults creating the environment so players will enjoy the game more. This is not about being positive for positives sake. It's about focusing on the good things players have done.

In grass-roots football there will always be mixed abilities. Let's help players love the game. Everyone develops better when they are having fun. The FA Youth Review was implemented in 2011 and really focused on making the game child friendly with 5v5, 7v7, 9v9 and more appropriate goal sizes. That's been embraced but now it's about building on that and topping up all the good work that has been done. We're well aware people can drop out of the game from 14+ – so this is about giving them a really good experience so they want to keep playing. The challenge with Respect is how we bring longevity to it. We don't just want it to be a one-off campaign. That adds value but we want to make it consistent in the game each week in all areas. We've got Play Your Part code of conducts which helps implement the values whatever your role is. It gives clubs a real focus to help their volunteers but, also, if there is disrespect, how to deal with it.

Each month we have activations which focus on different ways of changing behaviour. So in the winter months we're looking to pilot Positivi-tea. It's a simple idea of people holding a cup of tea that is labelled with positive messages. The science behind it is people are less likely to shout something abusive or negative if they're holding something that's labelled with good messages. In January we're going to be launching 21 Days of Positive – that's how long it takes to break or form a new habit. We want to empower coaches and parents to engage with their children in the right way.

10th October 2018

The big game of the day was at the Weir Field between second in the table Wroughton and fourth placed Shrewton United who, after a great start to the season, went into the game on the back of two defeats against the other two sides in the top four. Corsham Town Reserves dropped a couple of places as they were held to a 0-0 by visitors Marlborough Town as both sides failed to score for the second week running.

The final game of the day saw Royal Wootton Bassett Town secure their second win of the season as they defeated Devizes Town Reserves 5-2 at the Gerard Buxton Ground. Leading scorer Josh Bolton got them on the way as he chased down a lost cause and took the ball off the Devizes keeper to make it 1-0. Bolton scored a second with a powerful shot, with further goals coming from Tyrhys Misfud, Nick Mason and a good team goal finished off by Jack Sanderson to put Bassett 5-0 up. Devizes did not give up and were rewarded with two late goals from Angus Webster and Richard Tandy.

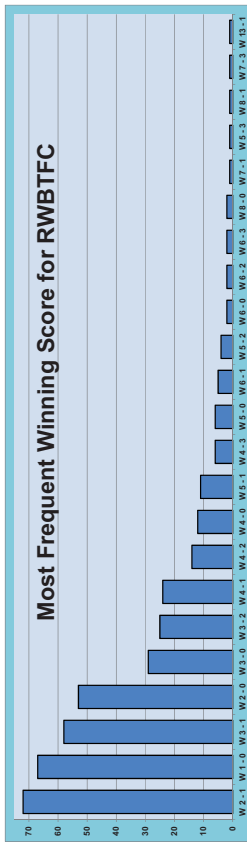

Player Profile

Kieran Diaz-Benitez - Defender



Diaz-Benitez is an athletic full back who re-joins the club this season on a dual-signing basis with Swindon Supermarine. He initially featured for Bassett last season, playing twenty-one times before moving to Supermarine and assisting with their successful promotion campaign.

Joining Bassett from Cirencester Town, he immediately made a starting full back berth his own. Following his debut away against Flackwell Heath, Diaz-Benitez would feature in nineteen consecutive fixtures and was hugely impressive.

While not contributing any goals, he was responsible for numerous assists, while being extremely reliable when executing his defensive duties. Diaz-Benitez twice earned man of the match, in a 3-0 away triumph against Highmoor Ibis and in the 2-1 home FA Vase victory against Ampthill Town. After signing for Supermarine, he would return to feature for Bassett for one more appearance in the Wiltshire Senior Cup third round loss against Highworth Town.

As a youngster, the defender was with Oxford United before being released by the Us in April 2016. He began the 2016-17 season with Purton, and his eight appearances for the Red House outfit quickly earned the attentions of the Southern League Premier Division Centurions.

Diaz-Benitez made his Cirencester debut in a Red Insure Cup tie away against Banbury United, and his adventurous play stood out in a game which his side lost on penalties. His performance in that game was enough to merit an immediate starting spot in the league, and, in a season in which Cirencester would be relegated, the defender was a bright spot for them, appearing 29 times, with only five coming as a substitute. Diaz-Benitez also found the net once, scoring the opening goal in a 2-0 home victory against Dunstable Town.

He began the 2017-18 campaign with Cirencester, though found himself starting the campaign from the bench. After four appearances – including a lone start in an FA Cup tie against Aylesbury – he switched to Bassett.

Comfortable on the ball, athletic and keen to get forward, he has also previously been on the books at Bristol Rovers.

Chippenham Town had to wait until midweek for their FA Cup match after the two sides they would potentially meet drew their first game and had to replay on Sunday. The winners were Hendon who Chippenham met at Hendon on Wednesday evening. By the time you read these notes you will know if they have been successful in gaining a place in the next round where they would meet Maidenhead United at home. With all the other sides playing in the FA Cup they were left without a fixture in National League South. At the time of writing these notes they currently sit in the top half of the table in 10th place after a good start to the season. With six wins from their opening 11 games they are only outside the play-off zone on goal difference.

Of the two Wiltshire sides promoted to Step 3 last season, it is Salisbury who have made the better start. A brace from Jon Davies helped Melksham Town to a 3-2 home win over Cinderford Town. Melksham went in front on 38 minutes after great work by Davies left Neikell Plummer with an easy tap-in. Melksham doubled their lead on the hour when Andy Sandell, on loan from Chippenham Town, sent Davies clean through and he made no mistake. Cinderford reduced the deficit through a Nick Grimes' header from a corner. Melksham restored their two goal advantage from the penalty spot, Davies being fouled in the box and picking himself up to despatch the penalty. Cinderford pulled one back a minute from time but Melksham held out to take all three points.

At Step 5 whilst we were pressing the self-destruct button again against Wantage Town, our Wiltshire Senior Cup opponents this coming Tuesday, Westbury United, maintained their 100 record in the Toolstation Western league Premier Division with a 1-0 away win at Plymouth Parkway. Callum Demkiv scored the all important goal as Westbury made it 8 wins from 8 in the league. In the Sydenhams Wessex League Bemerton Heath Harlequins, who have had a tough start to the season, picked up a useful point at home to Bournemouth, a side 12 places above them in the table.

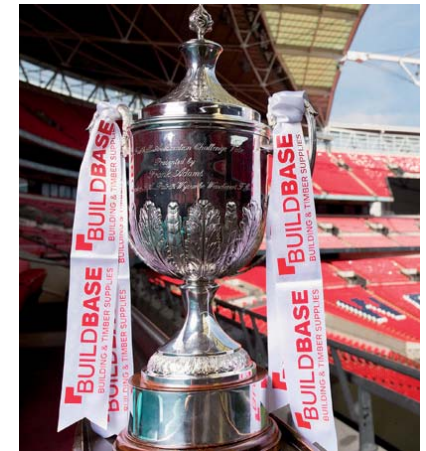

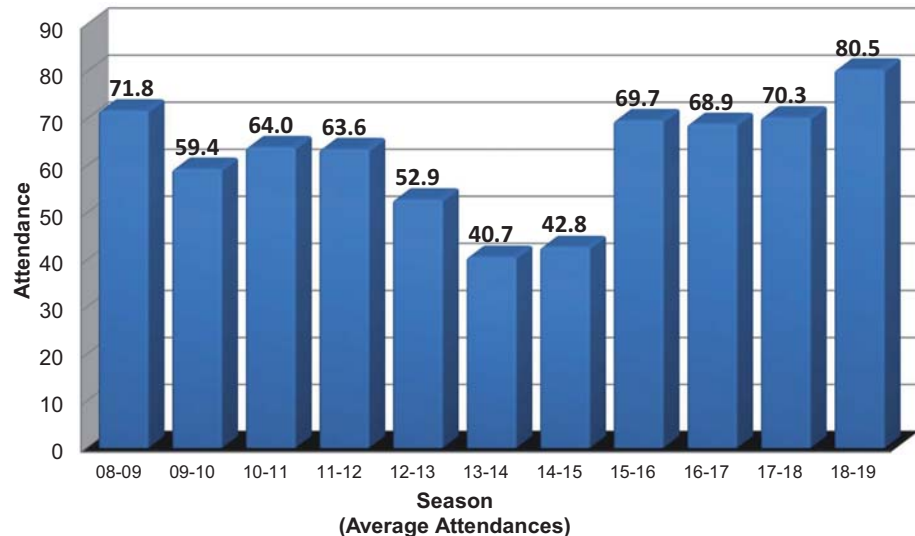

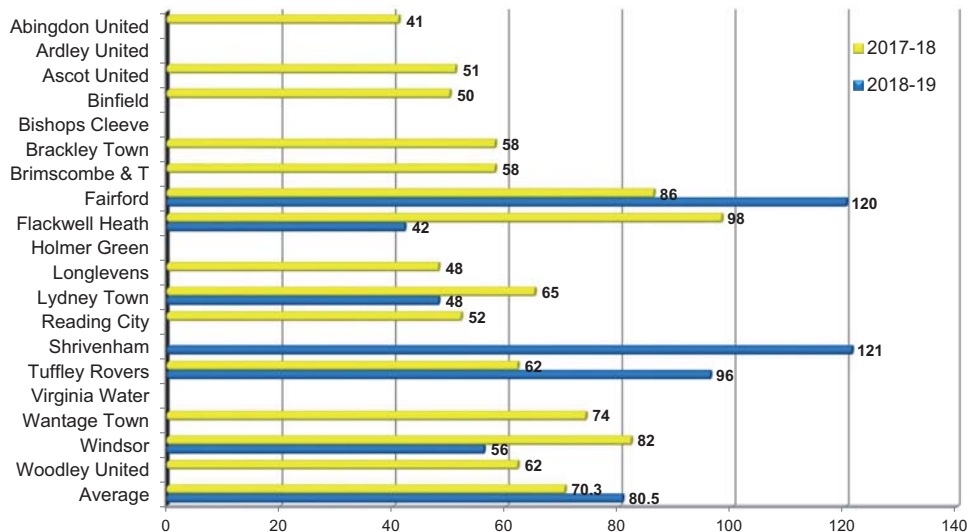

RWBTFC Attendances - Season 2018-19 (and comparison to 2017-18)



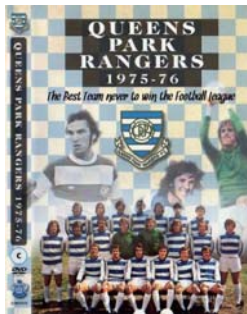
