Bassett News

Tonight's Game

Good evening and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Virginia Water. A warm welcome to Ceri Jones and his side and the officials and spectators who have made the long journey along the M4 for a midweek game. Living in Woking just up the road from Virginia Water it is a journey I am very familiar with and we wish a visitors a pleasant first visit to the Gerard Buxton Ground and a safe journey home. Virginia Water tonight become the fourth side we have met twice already this season in the league in our opening 15 games, with Reading City soon to become the fifth.

The two sides have met just once previously and that was again in midweek last month when our visitors tonight ran out deserved 2-0 winners. We had chances early on in that game to go in front, but we spurned them all and paid the price as we fell to two second half goals. The first was very fortuitous and the second was from our own madness with a silly throw in back to the keeper which never got there. That night Virginia Water worked their socks off denying us space and hopefully Sam has earned the lesson from that game and that we can get back to winning ways tonight.

Brackley Town Saints

A very strong Brackley Town Saints won 3-1 here at the Gerard Buxton Ground, their first ever win over us. We paid the price for a slow start which saw us 2-0 down and despite a penalty from TJ Bohane before half time we could not get a second to get back on level terms and Brackley wrapped it up with a third in the 96th minute. They currently sit seven points clear at the top and with both Wantage Town and Reading City losing their management teams in recent weeks look a good bet now for the title.

Development Side

The new management team have not had the easiest start to their managerial careers with the Development Side. On Saturday they lost 3-0 away at Westbury United Reserves. This followed a narrow 2-0 cup defeat the previous week against Purton and an 8-1 thashing at defending champions Kintbury Rangers. I witnessed the game at Purton and thought the lads were unlucky not to get something out of the match. Josh Bolton had a couple of chances in the first half which, on another day, he would have put away. Trailing 1-0 at the break our lads were the better side in the second half but could not get the elusive equaliser and paid the price late on when they conceded a second. With fellow Development sides from Pewsey Vale and Malmesbury Victoria coming up soon hopefully Steve and Mike will be able to get a result which will bring a bit of confidence back to their young side.

Sunday Side

The Sunday side finally lost their 100% record a week last Sunday when they drew 3-3 away at Croft. On target for Bassett were Ryan Thomas, Jack Duckers and Sam English.

Ladies Team

The Ladies side were without a game last Sunday, but the previous week had run out comfortable 8-1 winners at home to Trowbridge Town. A report on that match is included on the Ladies page of tonight's programme.

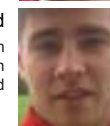

Our Visitors This Season



Virginia Water are in their inaugural season in the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division having finished as champions of Division One East last season. They currently sit in 13th place having won 4 and drawn 4 of the opening 13 league games.

They opened the season with a couple of away 1-1 draws at Flackwell Heath and Shrivenham, Liam Whyte scoring in both games for Virginia Water. The first defeat of the season came at the hands of the current league leaders Brackley Town Saints, Virginia Water going down 2-0 at home under the lights at Windsor. Four days later they secured their first Premier Division win, running out 2-0 winners away at Abingdon United, Josh Hill and Adam McNamara with their goals.

A quick return fixture with Flackwell Heath resulted in disappointment as the visitors left Stag Meadow with all three points following a 3-1 win, Josh Hill with the solitary goal for our visitors tonight.

A useful point from the Stag Meadow derby followed as they held their landlords to a 1-1 draw, Lorenzo Tommaso Di Felice with the goal got Virginia Water. Another impressive draw with Wantage Town followed, Josh Hill and Liam Whyte scoring in the 2-2 draw.

Their first home win of the season coincided with our visit to Stag Meadow. Second half goals from Josh Hill and Adam McNamara ensured we travelled back along the M4 without any points in a 2-0 win.

An early exit from the FA Vase meant the hoped-for contribution to the rent that they pay their landlords was not forthcoming, Malmesbury Victoria winning 3-1 at the Flying Monk, Finn Evered with the consolation goal.

Consecutive 1-0 narrow away defeats at Ascot United and Ardley United followed as Virginia Water hit a bad patch. A 4-1 home defeat to Step 6 side Easington Sports in the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup was followed by heavy league defeats at the hands of an improved Tuffley Rovers (1-6) and Reading City (1-5).

Virginia Water have bounced back with two wins in their last two games, winning 2-1 away at Holmer Green and 3-1 at home to Fairford Town on Saturday. Jake Baker and Josh Guichard scored against Holmer Green, with Baker again, Adam McNamara and Lorenzo Tommaso Di Felice getting the goals against Fairford.

Introduction to the Town

Virginia Water is a commuter town in northern Surrey, home to the Wentworth Estate and the famous Wentworth Club. The estate is situated in the Borough of Runnymede in Surrey, close to where the Magna Carta was signed in 1215. Its name comes from the lake in the nearby Windsor Great Park. Virginia Water is close to the M25, M4 and M3 motorways. Heathrow Airport is seven miles to the north-east.

Interesting Facts

In 2015 Virginia Water was named as one of the most expensive towns outside of London for property in the UK, having an average house price of £1,168,992. This was the first time the average price of a house has reached over £1million in towns outside of London.

The other 'million pound towns' disclosed by researchers at Lloyds Bank were Cobham (also in Surrey) and Beaconsfield (Buckinghamshire).

The Football Club are currently in their second year of a ground share with Windsor and are the only club in the UK with royal patronage. Virginia Water Football Club were formed during the 1919-1920 season and during the 1930's, during the reign of King Edward VIII, gained financial support (patronage) from the crown to the sum of £2 per annum and this was continued after his abdication by King George VI and continued through his reign.

Famous Residents

Sir Bruce Forsyth until his death in 2017, is probably the best known resident of Virginia Water.

The daughter of former Ryder Cup captain Bernard, TV presenter Kirsty Gallacher was born and raised on the Wentworth Estate in Virginia Water.

Other residents have included Sarah Ferguson, Sir Cliff Richard and Sir Elton John, and Swindon's own Diania Dors also once lived there.

Nearest railway station

Whilst Virginia Water has its own train station with the Football Club playing their games at Windsor the nearest station to the ground is either Windsor & Eton Central or Windsor & Eton Riverside – the ground is a 30 minutes walk from both or a short taxi ride (local taxi company: Windsor Cars – 01753 677677).

Nearest Pubs to Ground

The nearest pubs to the ground are the Duke of York or The Prince Albert but the club itself has a very pleasant bar area stocking a good selection of beers. The best pub in town is claimed to be the Windsor & Eton Brewery Pub 'The George Inn'.

Things to Do in Virginia Water

If you are a golfer there is one obvious thing to do and that is play a round of golf at Wentworth but make sure you come with a big wad of money. A round of 18 holes between a Monday and a Friday will set you back somewhere between £130 and £285 depending on which course you want to play. Membership fees in June 2017 had risen to a wapping £13,500.

If that is a tad expensive you could go for a walk around the beautiful lake.

In Windsor the obvious places to go and visit would be the Castle or Windsor Racecourse or the favourite Monday cycle ride destination of the programme editor, the Runnymede Pleasure Grounds (see picture below).

Blunt-edged Bassett punished for lack of killer instinct

Stagg Meadow, 11th September 2018

Virginia Water 2 Royal Wootton Bassett Town 0

It's one of the oldest truths in football: if you fail to take your chances, you'll fail to win the game. And Royal Wootton Bassett Town discovered that to their cost in a 2-0 defeat away against Virginia Water. In fairness, the better, more composed side over the course of the ninety minutes won the game. But had Bassett not passed up a game's worth of great opportunities in the opening quarter of an hour, then it's likely they'd have taken at least something from the match. In the end, however, two second half goals from the hosts – the first from a well-worked short corner routine, the second a gift from a critical error – proved the difference, forcing Sam Collier and his team to return to Wiltshire empty-handed. How the outcome could have been different though.

Thirty seconds in a good move in the left corner involving Brad Pagliaroli and debutant Gabriel Silva opened up space, with Gio Wrona eventually squaring for TJ Bohane, whose stabbed effort from the edge of the box forced an outstretched Matt Jones to tip around the post. Wanting to playing the ball out from the back at every opportunity, the hosts were stuttering in the early stages. And their commitment to that style of play almost proved costly in the second minute when Silva picked the pocket of dithering centre half Mike Chambers. Jones came to the rescue though, blocking the forward's tight angled effort. The danger wasn't averted though, and Silva headed narrowly wide from the resulting corner. A rare foray out from the back then presented the Waters with their first opening as Scott Jackson let loose from range, his low bouncing drive forcing an awkward parry around the post by Charlie McGready.

Bassett were the side firmly on top at this stage though. And on nine minutes Josh Shama acrobatically shot wide after Adam Corcoran had headed down a Bohane cross. A minute later, clever skill from Pagliaroli allowed him to cut inside two defenders and break into the box, but Jones was on hand to repel his effort. Shama then recycled the loose ball into the box, with Bohane heading inches over from twelve yards. It was ultimately a period of play Bassett were left to rue. Virginia Water settled down into a tidy rhythm, playing neat football, while also giving their visitors little time when in possession. It didn't help Bassett that by impatiently trying to rush the ball forward they were prone to carelessly ceding possession back to their hosts. Still, Virginia Water were only really troubling Bassett from set plays. Finn Evered headed straight into the hands of McGready from a Steve Williams corner, before a short corner out to Josh Hill on the edge of the area resulted in a powerful drive being spilt by McGready and headed away off the line by Corcoran. Another training ground routine then resulted in the same defender getting in the way of Jake Baker's hooked attempt. At the other end, Bassett continued to fail to find their range. A slip from Silva meant that he was unable to properly latch onto Iggy Iloit's defence splitting through ball and instead shot straight at Jones before Bohane shot low into the path of the 'keeper after a blocked Shama shot fell to the forward.

Early in the second period Shama tried his luck from distance, but narrowly missed the target. And that would prove to be the last decent attempt at goal Bassett had in the game as their disjointed pattern of play continued to let them down. It meant too much was being asked of their defence, and the danger signs appeared when Scott Jackson saw a deflected strike loop just over, the subsequent corner being headed over by an unmarked Chambers.

With close to seventy minutes on the clock, Virginia Water eventually took the lead. Making a darting run from the edge of the area towards the near post, an unmarked Hill was able to connect with Williams' low delivery from the corner. The midfielder appeared to mishit his first time shot, but that wound up being in his favour as the ball looped into the top left corner. They then almost had an instant second as Adam McNamara's shot flew past the post before McGready's fine one-on-one save with his legs denied Baker. But the visitors ultimately gift-wrapped the decisive second. Taking a throw in halfway between his own goal and the middle of the park, left back Jack Stanley decided to try and find his 'keeper rather than taking the sensible option and going down the line.

It was a good ten yards short of his intended target though, and McGready was lucky that Baker, who raced onto the loose ball, remained on his feet when the two made contact outside the box. That allowed the forward to square inside for his strike partner, and though the Bassett 'keeper did his best to chase play down, McNamara kept his cool and tucked the ball away. There was to be no coming back from that self-inflicted hole. And they were fortunate not to concede again when Hill, racing in front of Stanley, steered over from Joe McBride's low cross into the box.

Man of the Match: Adam Corcoran – was solid in the centre of defence alongside Steve Yeardley, winning the majority of his aerial battles and helping snuff out some dangerous looking counter attacks when Bassett were caught with too many men committed forward.

Player Profile

Matt Bennett - Forward



Fast, skilful and possessing an eye for goal, Bennett is an experienced attacking player who has this season re-joined the club where he began his senior career over a decade and a half ago.

In total, he has spent seven seasons with Bassett previously, split across two spells. And during that period he established himself as a dangerous attacking force, scoring 46 goals in 162 appearances whilst providing countless assists. His excellent performances for the under 18 Floodlit League team earned him a first team call-up in

a March 2003 fixture against Fairford Town. He would make two further appearances prior to the end of the year before becoming a regular in the 2003-04 campaign. That season he made 27 appearances and scored six goals. His first strike came in some style too, hitting Bassett's third in a shock 3-1 victory away against title contenders Didcot Town. His first brace came in a fine 3-0 away win at Shortwood United, while he scored the opening goal in a crucial 2-1 victory at Gloucester United that went a long way towards preserving Bassett's Hellenic League Premier Division status. Bennett continued to feature for the under 18s and hit five goals in their run to the Second Qualifying Round of the FA Youth Cup, including four in a 5-1 stuffing of Bournemouth. He top scored a season later with 10 goals in 31 games during Bassett's ultimately failed attempt to avoid the drop. But he continued to be a shining light in a struggling side, scoring a memorable last minute winner away at Henley Town. He would also be selected to represent Wiltshire at under 18 level for the second consecutive season.

Despite dropping to Division One West, Bennett remained with the team and again topped the scoring chart for Bassett in 2005-06 with 12 goals in 30 matches. In an FA Vase clash with Christchurch his rasping 20-yard strike in the 90th minute forced extra time and a replay. The majority of his goals that year, including his first senior hat-trick away at Ross Town, came in the second half of the season as Bassett came agonisingly close to securing an immediate return to the Hellenic Premier Division. A season later he was joint-top scorer with Steve Yeardley, firing eleven in 33 appearances, his most notable strike being the late equaliser in a 3-3 thriller against Malmesbury Victoria. 2007-08 began well for Bennett as he notched in three of the first four games, scoring before setting up the winner in the FA Cup replay victory over Highworth Town. A frustrating spell in front of goal ensued and after hitting five goals in 18 matches he left to join Shrivenham.

Despite playing only ten games for Shrivy that season, he finished third top scorer with an impressive haul of seven goals in ten games, having formed an impressive partnership up front with TJ Bohane. Bennett joined Highworth for the 2008-09 campaign, hitting eight goals in 30 appearances. His best season followed in 2009-10 when he hit 16 goals for the Worthians, including hat-tricks against Old Woodstock Town and Shrivenham. Bennett then split the 2010-11 season between Cricklade Town, Highworth and FC Sanford. For Cricklade he featured four times scoring once before finishing the season at The Elms with six goals in 23 matches as Dave Webb's team challenged for the title. After the briefest of stints with Devizes Town at the start of 2011-12, he re-joined Highworth and struck six goals in 15 games, scoring once in their 6-0 demolition of Binfield in the Challenge Cup final.

Bennett returned to Bassett in 2012-13, scoring two goals in twenty appearances. He moved back to the Elms a year later before beginning the 2014-15 campaign with Shrivenham where he hit six goals in a brief seven game spell. Two seasons ago Bennett featured eighteen times for Purton in Division One West and proved he still was a force in front of goal at Hellenic League level, scoring fifteen times. Meanwhile, last year he played in the Wiltshire League for Cricklade, firing 21 goals in twenty appearances.

Our History

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Impressive Saints march past Bassett

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's inconsistent form continued as they were well beaten 3-1 at home by early Hellenic League Premier Division leaders Brackley Town Saints. Sam Collier's team were punished for a first half performance in which they failed to match their impressive visitors, and a pair of mistakes in a matter of minutes were duly punished to put Brackley firmly in control of the match. TJ Bohane restored hope for his side with a penalty on the half hour mark to halve the deficit. But Bassett were unable to find a way of unlocking the Brackley defence again, with the Saints effectively slowing down the pace of the game in the second period. And they would go on to finish the scoring deep into injury time. Demonstrating extreme confidence in possession and with players across the pitch making intelligent runs off the ball, it was clear to see from the opening whistle why Brackley currently find themselves in the position they are in. And the threat they posed was evident from as early as the third minute when Brackley, casually passing along their back line, lulled Bassett into a trap, with one ball over the top beating the defence. Ryan Knight found himself in behind a fired a powerful shot that crashed off the crossbar from the edge of the area. The rebound then fell for Charlie Kille, but he narrowly missed the target. The Saints eventually went ahead after twenty minutes. Drawing Bassett out of their shape, a pass was played into the left channel for an unmarked Knight to run onto. Keeper Charlie McCready then hesitated when deciding whether to try and beat the forward to the ball and that impacted upon his positioning when trying to gather Knight's cross. Unable to catch it, he could only tip into the path of James Hammond, who bundled in from close range. Almost immediately the lead was doubled. This time a switch of play caught out both Dale Richards and Brad Pagliaroli, allowing right back Alex Stott to nip in and seize possession before burying a firm drive into the bottom left corner from fifteen yards. It was a deserved lead for the visitors and the home side were in danger of being out of the game before the half time whistle arrived. However, they were handed a lifeline on 32 minutes when Brackley centre half Joe Ward was penalised for a push in the box on Steve Yeardeley while challenging for Pagliaroli's inswinging corner. Bohane then confidently dispatched the spot kick, sending Ali Worby the wrong way Still, Kille almost restored Brackley's two goal advantage shortly before the interval when he latched onto a through ball and found a way beyond Dan Cole and McCready. However, in a crowded penalty area, he was unable to properly get off his shot and the ball was scrambled away.

To their credit, Bassett were much improved after the break. But Brackley continued to control possession and the game's tempo. That resulted in a cagey battle, with neither team able to unlock the other's defence until after the hour mark. A counter for the visitors resulted in James Watts skewing over from the edge of the box before Pagliaroli curled straight into the hands of Worby after good hold up play from Bohane. With quarter of an hour remaining, a Bohane cross wasn't cleared and dropped for Iggy Ilott, but from a tight angle the midfielder could only blaze over. Another Brackley break then resulted in Hammond steering over before Bohane created a further opportunity at the other end for substitute Rob Lincoln. However, after cutting inside onto his right foot, he saw his effort parried at the near post. That would be the last opening Bassett mustered. And, deep into injury time, Kille would well and truly kill off the game, tapping in on the rebound after McCready had kept out Chris Jordan's initial low shot.

Man of the match: TJ Bohane – expertly put away his penalty and was instrumental in creating the few chances Bassett were able to fashion during the game. As usual, the forward held the ball up well and was willing to get stuck in.

In Division One West, Malmesbury Victoria were dominant in their clash with New College as they claimed an 11-0 win at home.

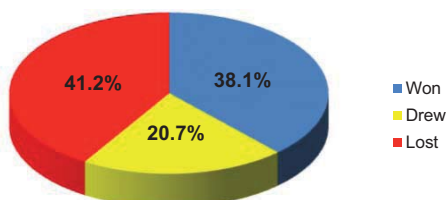

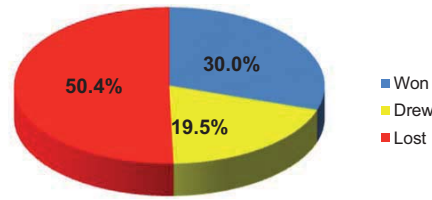

Non-Sale of Wembley

With Shahid Khan withdrawing his interest in purchasing Wembley Stadium last week, many felt it was another door being slammed shut in the face of grassroots football, with the lower levels of the game set to benefit financially had the national stadium been sold to the Jacksonville Jaguars and Fulham owner.

I myself was always sceptical of the sale, mainly because I questioned whether the figures that were being bandied about would actually go back into grassroots football – there were far too many other people in the queue wanting their slice of the pie. But the non-sale has irked people because they saw this as a great opportunity for the FA to actively do something for the grassroots game, and let's face it, something needs to be done because some of the statistics make for grim reading whether it's 67 per cent of pitches deemed not to be of 'adequate' quality or the startling lack of 3G facilities in the UK compared to other European nations.

Those who opposed the sale believe more Football League and Premier League clubs should be helping out, and that we should not need to sell Wembley to inject funds into grassroots. But the FA doesn't have the power to instruct clubs to do that, and this is where the government must step in because they have neglected the game and simply passed the buck to others. They are almost saying: this is your problem, sell you house and all the furniture and be done with it!

The money from the Wembley sale, even if it had come down to the lower levels of the game, would merely have served as a plaster on an open wound.

Measures must be put in place to ensure more money comes down from the Premier League, whether through taxes on a player's wage or a percentage of an agent's fee.

By selling Wembley and giving the grassroots game a chunk of the money, it is only ignoring the continued impact the Premier League should be having on the development of the game in this country. There are success stories of them helping out, but let's not begin to kid ourselves: they aren't doing anywhere near enough.

20th October 2018 – Round up from Sat 27th will be in Abingdon United Programme

Wroughton were looking to put the midweek loss at Devizes Town in the Wiltshire Senior Cup and the defeat against Malmesbury Victoria Development in their last league fixture behind them today, knowing that a win would enable them to climb back into top spot in the Premier Division of the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League with Melksham Town Reserves and Kintbury Rangers, both being involved in First Round Fountain Trophies Cup action. Away at Corsham Town Reserves they found themselves 1-0 down on 20 minutes in a lack lustre first half showing. Despite not being at their best in the first half they did manage to get however back on level terms before the break, Tom Dingle the scorer on 32 minutes. It was a different story after the break as Wroughton came out and put the home side under immense pressure as they sought that second goal which would take them back top of the table. It looked like that they would be sat back on top when they were awarded a penalty, but top scorer spurned the chance, missing the spot kick to leave it honours even and a point apiece.

Shrewton United continued where they left off in midweek with their giant killing over Warminster Town from the Western League by putting ten goals without reply past Devizes Town Res to move back up into the top three. Shrewton dominated throughout and build up a 7-0 half time lead thanks to a Charlie Utterson hat-trick, two from Craig Lewis, taking him to thirteen for the season, and one apiece from Jesse Walters and Charlie Jackson in a clinical first half showing. Shrewton continued to dominate after the break and Jackson scored his second of the game, Utterson took his tally to four and Craig Appleby also got in on the act netting his first of the season.

Two in-form teams met at Cricklade Leisure Centre where Westbury United Reserves were the visitors. Cricklade Town went into the game on the back of six unbeaten games, while visitors Westbury United Reserves had lost just once in their previous eight games, that defeat coming last week against the league leaders at the start of the day, Melksham Town Reserves. Two goals from leading scorer Devan Bryan, taking him to 15 for the season plus one from Tom McCulloch and Billy Sly ensured that Cricklade's unbeaten run continued making it now seven undefeated. They moved above Westbury in the table as a result of the win and with games in hand on the leading sides must fancy their chances of closing the gap at the top if they can continue their current form. The two goals for Westbury were both scored by Derek Wheeler.

At the other end of the table Pewsey Vale Development made the short journey to play Marlborough Town looking to make it two wins on the bounce whilst Marlborough were in search of their second win of the season after going seven games without one. In an archetypal game of two halves, two goals from Harrison Lowe put Pewsey 2-0 up at half time but it was a different story after the break as Marlborough hit three goals though Christopher Deane, Luke Connolly and an Aaron Presley penalty to go 3-2 up. Pewsey however rallied, and Corey Cullen popped up with a last-minute equaliser to ensure a share of the points. Pewsey moved up a place in the table to 12th whilst Marlborough slipped a place to 14th.

The First Round of the Fountain Trophies Cup got under way with some interesting looking ties. Melksham Town Reserves had lost just one game all season in the league and that was against their First Round opponents, Ludgershall Sports at their Astor Crescent Ground last month, the home side winning the league encounter 1-0. This time their visit to the same ground was a more enjoyable experience for Melksham as they gained revenge for that league defeat with a 2-0 win. A defensive error in the box allowed Shaun Bennisson to put them to go 1-0 up and then an own goal from a Ludgershall defender ensured it was Melksham who progress through into the next round.

Purton and Royal Wootton Town Development had also met recently in a league game and in another close encounter, Purton had won that day 2-1. When the two sides met on Saturday in the Fountain Trophies Cup at the Red House it was again a close affair played in a great spirit between two evenly matched sides. The first chance of the game fell to Josh Bolton for the visitors on 20 minutes, but he blasted over from close range. It was the home side Purton who went in front when a shot from striker Chris Avery somehow found its way under the dive of the Bassett keeper to make it 1-0 to the home side. Minutes later Josh Bolton had the chance to equalise, but he spurned the chance firing over again with just Purton keeper Luke Kuczynski to beat. Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development went close again moments later when a header from Ben Paul was superbly saved by Kuczynski to leave it 1-0 at the break. Kuczynski again denied the visitors ten minutes after the restart as he pulled off another great save to prevent a Josh Bolton effort from registering. Whilst the visitors were on top in the second half the home side were still creating chances at the other end and thought they had gone 2-0 up only to see the goal chalked off due to a flag from the referee's assistant. The visitors continued to press for the equaliser, but that man Avery made certain that it was his side who would be in the next round when he fired in a superb solo goal. He made a great turn to give himself room to place a measured shot into bottom corner of the net to make it 2-0 on 85 minutes. There was still time for the visitors to have their best chance of the game when substitute Tyrhus Mifsud fired a shot from 25 yards which finally beat Kuczynski only to come back off the cross-bar leaving the final score 2-0 to Purton.

Last season's league champions Kintbury Rangers kicked off their Fountain Trophies Cup campaign with a trip to Trowbridge Town. Again, the two sides had met in the league last month and once more the match had been decided by a one goal difference that day, Kintbury winning 3-2. In the cup match on Saturday two first half goals from Tom Mahoney and Shaun Thorp put Kintbury 2-0 up at the break and in command. However, a strong second half performance saw Jordan Gullis pull one back for Trowbridge who pushed hard for the equaliser but a goal from Chris Cox right at the death ensured it is Kintbury who join Purton and Melksham Town Reserves in the Second Round. The game between Football ID and Malmesbury Victoria Development was postponed.

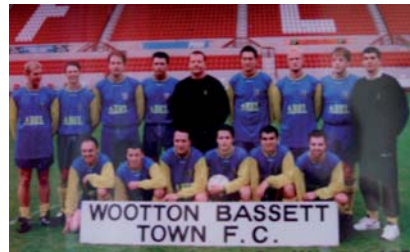
Diary of Wiltshire League Division One Title Winning Season - Wootton Bassett Town 1987-88

Headline: Fine display from Bassett Town

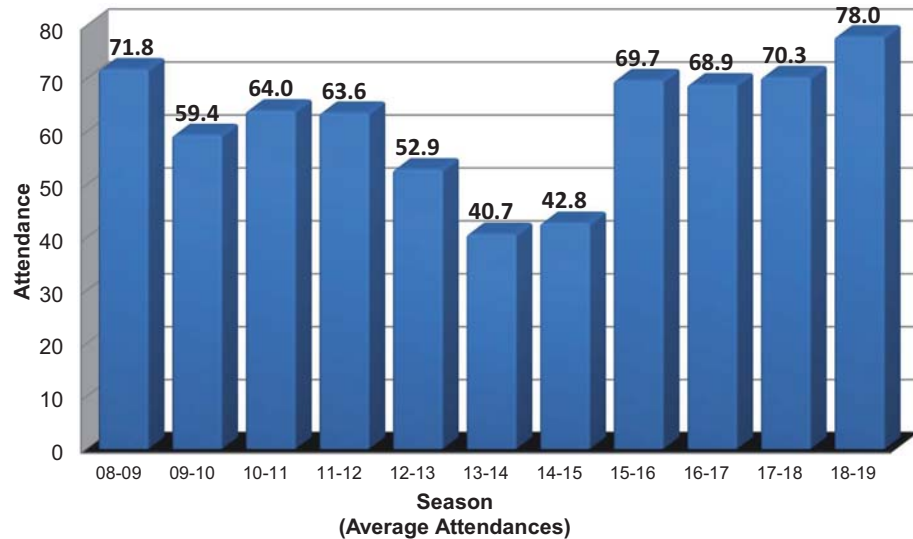
A fine all-round display from Wootton Bassett saw them come away 4-0 winners from Pinehurst. Bassett always looked comfortable and in control in this top versus bottom clash, Pinehurst's young players offering plenty of running but little guile. Bassett took control straight from the off. Early chances were created for Frost and Damon York (signed from Pinehurst in the close season) but neither were taken. The opening goal came after 15 minutes, Ackrill, who was still up front following a corner, met York's deep cross beautifully to head home. Five minutes later Bassett had to rearrange the midfield when Vines limped off with a hamstring strain to be replaced by McKay. The change didn't seem to bother Bassett and they got the second after 35 minutes. John's long ball from the back eluded the Pinehurst defence, Walker latching on to it to fire home.

The opening 10 minutes of the second half saw Pinehurst have their best spell when Carney, the only player to cause Bassett any problems, shot narrowly wide. Bassett gradually regained control and increased their lead after 65 minutes, Hanrahan tapping home from six yards. 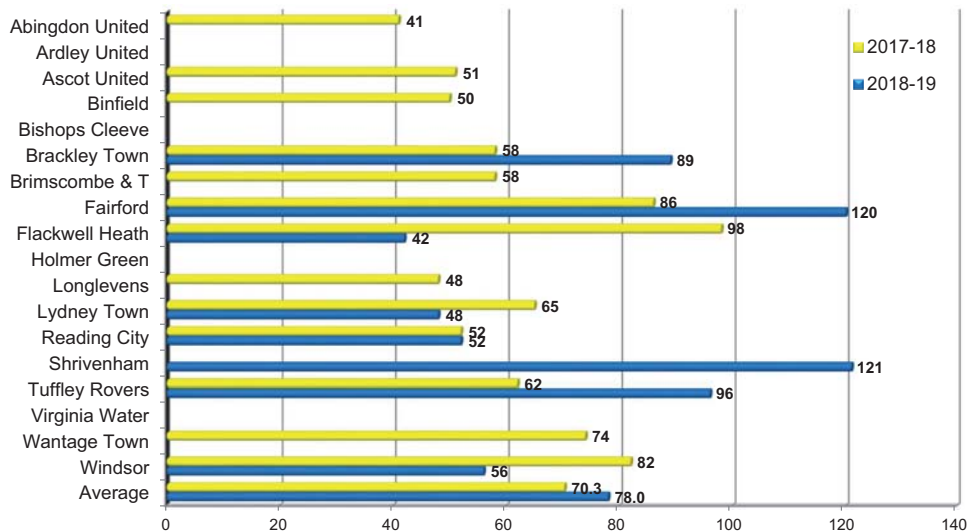


Attendances

RWBTFC Attendances - Season 2018-19 (and comparison to 2017-18)



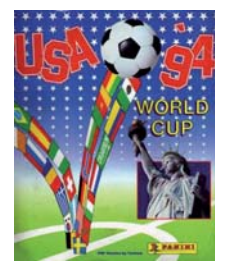
