# Bassett News

## Today's Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Abingdon United. A warm welcome to all the players, management, officials and spectators who have made the journey from Abingdon for this afternoon's game. This is their second visit to the new ground having left with a point after a 1-1 draw here last season. The less said about the meeting at their place last season the better, let's just say it wasn't our best performance of the season and we were lucky not to concede more than the six we did. A warm welcome also to Bob Dalling, the UHlsport Hellenic League Chairman, who is visiting us here today. In the past he has been something of a lucky omen to us, I remember him coming to an FA Vase game at Buckingham in Season 2008-9, when Dave Turner was manager, a game we won 5-3. Hopefully he can be a lucky charm for us again today.

Going back to Abingdon, they are having a tough time of it this season with just three wins from their opening eleven league fixtures and currently sit bottom of the table. However, we should not underestimate our opponents here this afternoon, as we have seen already in this very open UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division this season, any team is capable of beating anyone on the day and we need to make sure we put in the same level of performance we did on Tuesday night against Virginia Water to try and make sure we take three points from the game.

## Virginia Water

On the subject of Virginia Water, what an enjoyable game of football that was on Tuesday night. Two sides trying to play attractive football on a pitch in tip top condition, with a very light touch of frost on the surface meaning the ball travelled at pace helping produce what I thought was a cracking game. The referee also had one of his best games in charge of us and it was refreshing to hear the linesman in the second half quickly explaining some of the decisions to the dugout. Communication goes a long way in taking some of the heat out of these game incidents. Well done lino.

Twice this season Virginia Water have demonstrated what a good, hard working football side they are, and I can see why their manager thought they deserved something out of the game, even though I thought we just about edged it on the night. We created more clear-cut chances than them and the defensive shape we had in the second half to defend the lead was first class, from the front to the back, and we didn't really give them any clear-cut chances in that second half. Charlie McCready was excellent in goal all night, pulling off a couple of great saves before we went in front, and was unlucky with their goal, pulling off a great save only for it to fall straight to the Virginia Water striker to then fire into the net. In the end two very good goals from Steve Yeardley, now just 2 appearances away from breaking the 500 appearances barrier, and TJ Bohane, following a brilliant first time cross from Dale Richards, gave us all three points. Given the amount of games played in the modern era relative to the past, there will not have been anyone else in the clubs' history who has ever made it to 500 First Team appearances and it is a milestone that will probably never be achieved again unless in 15 years' time Harrison Gough is still pulling on a blue and yellow shirt! If Steve plays today and then on Monday, the record will be made on Monday at Reading City's ground. In a way it is a shame that it is an away game, but I am the last person who would be requesting a sixth home game in a row!

## Fixture Scheduling

On the subject of fixture scheduling, the Hellenic League have issued a statement regarding fixture planning, an issue that has caused us great angst this season. The statement is reproduced in full after this editorial but does not really answer two of the main issues we have had this season, the long runs of home or away games and the number of opponents we will have played twice in the first half of the season (currently four and scheduled to be five on Monday and six very soon after). I understand Andy was sending another constructive note to the league to re-iterate our concerns and provide some suggested improvements/ideas for next season. The league did helpfully disclose their metrics for the number of games they are aiming to complete by mid-December and the turn of the year. The league's benchmark is for 55% of "controlled games" (i.e. fixtures managed by the league rather than FA or County cup competitions) being played by mid-December. I note we are currently scheduled to have played 69% of "controlled games" as at 15 December 2018 and also just over 69% of our league fixtures. The second League benchmark is for 65% of controlled games to have been played by the turn of the year. Again,

we are currently scheduled to have played just over 74% of "controlled games" and 75% of our league fixtures by the turn of the year. To me it very much looks like the League's own metrics seem to support our contention that too many games have been crammed into the first few months of the season, and subject to the weather being kind between now and the end of December we are scheduled to have just nine league games in the New Year.

### Football for Cancer

Royal Wootton Bassett Town will be hosting a charity match in aid of Football For Cancer as part of their '10 games, 10 cities, 10 days' challenge on Tuesday 6th November (7.30pm kick off). The game will pit a team comprising of players from Bassett's Development and Under 18 teams against a Football For Cancer Select XI and will be the sixth match in their aim to play ten games in ten days in ten different cities. Football For Cancer was created in 2008, and since then it has grown from a single tournament, to a charity that will be close to raising £1 million for local cancer charities and people. FFC is all about bringing people together to raise awareness and much needed funds for all those affected by cancer through sporting events. They support local families who are going through one of the toughest times in their lives and provide directly to families to try and alleviate the financial burden that coping with cancer can cause. # From The Hellenic League

## **UHLSPORT Hellenic League Fixtures – What the Hell is Happening?**

Please take a few minutes to read and digest the below. It may help your understanding.

### **Historical – The 'head in the sand' approach to winter weather.**

Back in the day a fixture schedule was set out at the beginning of the season. It produced a program of fixtures that were evenly spaced out from early August to the end of April. Of course, it never actually worked out that way due to bad winter weather causing postponements, usually in, but not restricted to, January & February. Those games were slotted in towards the end of the season. This congests the climax of the season period where cups and trophies are being won or lost. This is simply not fair to those successful clubs as they end up playing too many games in a short period. This practice has been in operation for too many years and there is a need for change.

### **Minimising the end of season pile up of games?**

The answer is in planning the fixture program and 'driving' it so that the majority of League controlled games are played earlier in the season. Space is then left in the program, in April, to fulfil those games postponed due to the weather. April is a highly managed fixture schedule month to cope with these and the final stages of the cup competitions. The aim is for 55% of Hellenic controlled games (League & Cup) for Premier and Division One clubs to be played by mid-December (middle of the season). Ideally 65% by the turn of the year will bring us ahead. Where we need to be.

### **So what else affects Fixtures?**

These are in no particular order. The season has to start prior to the round of The FA Cup for our clubs. This season we started on August 4th as the Extra Preliminary Round was August 11th. The FA requires that Step 5 and 6 Leagues are completed before the end of April. This is so that the process for forming the constitutions of Leagues for the following season can start. This fits in well with our plans as it then allows the UHL Cup Finals week to be fixed and take place finishing on Bank Holiday Monday May 6th.

The FA set the constitution of the Leagues. The League Management implements this. The mileages between grounds cannot be magically changed. The distances are what they are. Managing the times for travel is crucial. The League sets a maximum distance of approximately 65 miles between clubs to fix mid-week fixtures. Longer distances are usually played on Saturday afternoons.

This works well provided that weather postponements do not cause over capacity on Saturdays. Some Local Derby games are fixed for Bank Holidays. Although the League was initially allocated 20 clubs in The Premier Division and 14 in each Division One, unfortunately three clubs have withdrawn, through no fault of the League or the FA. Oxford City Nomads, Bicester Town and most recently Carterton. This has reduced the structure to 19 + 13 + 13. Hence in each division there will be a club without a fixture every week. This is not ideal and each week the Fixture Coordinator looks ahead to see where he can pair clubs. Hence there are some later notice fixtures. Please do not forget that fixtures can be set with five days of notice.

The weather forecasts are for wetter winters. Many of our clubs Ground-Share. This is a really important issue for those sharing with clubs that play above the level of the Hellenic League, as the higher-level club, gets priority on the pitch. The Southern League is our biggest 'higher' League. Hence our Fixture Co-Ordinator has to wait until he has these fixtures before starting on ours. This season The Southern League made the decision to delay announcing their fixtures by almost two weeks. It did not matter to them as they start their season later. But it did to us.

### **For the Future**

Later this season there will be a Ground Hop. This is expected to take in up to 14 games over the Easter period. Next season the condensing of the fixture list is likely to be greater with the proposed introduction of play-offs for a second promotion spot to Step 4. There is unlikely to be any extension to the season for this.

### **Take Home Messages**

Fixturing for the League is a complicated task. There is no computer program available to perform this task that includes distance between grounds etc.... The League is attempting to make everything possible to drive the fixture list and keep control. We do understand that traditionalists may think there is a too limited program for after the turn of the year. Adding the weather factor, and Cup Competition later rounds changes all of this. We have a great Fixture Coordinator. We were one of only two Step 5 Leagues that finished on time last season. Please look at your fixture list at least a month in advance and raise subjects with our Fixture Coordinator. Nothing is perfect. There will be some bumps and scrapes along the way. There is no substitute for talking to each other.

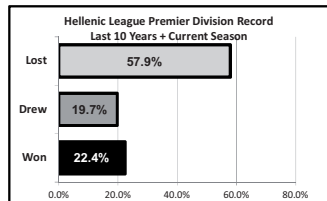
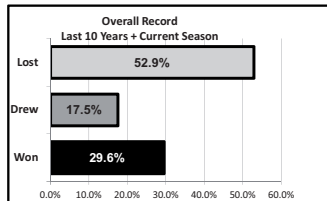

Abingdon-on-Thames is a market town in Oxfordshire, England. It is in the Thames Valley in southern England, 5.5 miles (8.9 km) south of Oxford.

Archaeological digs have shown that this was one of the earliest areas in which our hunter-gatherer ancestors first began to lead more settled lifestyles, attracted by the food and trading opportunities that the confluence of the River Stort, River Ock with the River Thames provided..

There is a market in Abingdon every Monday, which first started in 1556.

The MG motor cars were made in Abingdon for 50 years until the factory closed in 1980. There were 1,155,032 cars manufactured by MG car factory from when it opened until it closed. The headquarters of the MG Car Club are still in the town.

The rock band Radiohead was formed in Abingdon in 1980.

## Famous Residents

Huddersfield Town player Dean Whitehead (formerly with Stoke, Sunderland and Middlesbrough) is from Abingdon.

Swindon Town footballer Matthew Taylor, grew up in the town and attended John Mason School. Another ex-resident was former Wolves manager Sammy Chung who was born in Abingdon.

As noted above the Rock band Radiohead are originally from Abingdon, having formed when attending Abingdon School. Another link to the Music industry is Tom Hingley, lead singer of Oldham band Inspiral Carpets, who was born in Abingdon.

David Mitchell, the comedian from the show "Would I Lie to You" also attended Abingdon School.

Alain Menu, World Touring Car Championship driver, lives in Abingdon and Francis Maude, Conservative Party MP, was born in Abingdon and is another who attended Abingdon School.

## Nearest railway station

Abingdon-on-Thames does not have a railway station, however, there are several stations close-by which link up with regular bus services to Abingdon. Alternatively a taxi could be taken. Radley Station is 3 miles away, Oxford Station 7 miles and Didcot parkway just 8 miles away.

## Nearest Pubs to Ground

The nearest pub to the ground is the Boundary House, although the one not to far away with better reviews is The Spread Eagle, which serves great hot food apparently.

If you want to find out about the history of Abingdon then the place to visit is the Abingdon County Hall Museum. Reopened in July 2012 after a £3 million restoration project. There are a number of new galleries which explain why Abingdon is known as 'the oldest continuously inhabited town in England.' The main gallery tells the story of our town where you can see one of the last MGB Roadsters to come off the Abingdon factory production line, and discover why bun throwing is so significant to the town. Find out more about local people and places in our Abingdon Attic and if you have a head for heights you will enjoy the spectacular views from the roof of the museum. The museum itself is quite small and everything can be viewed in under an hour and there is a restaurant serving drinks, snacks and light lunches.

For lovers of beer then the suggested place to visit is the Loose Cannon brewery for a guided tour and some essential sampling of product.



Another favourite place in the town is the Abbey Gardens. This park in the centre of Abingdon is apparently a delightful place to visit. Quiet and peaceful with expanses of lawn and also beautifully tended flower beds.

Quality signing in the summer. Previously with Swindon Town but unfortunately suffered an injury in his final scholarship year. Should do well at this level.



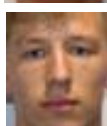
**Danny Lachacz** Defence

Hard working youngster who joined in the summer from Letcombe where he made 22 appearances scoring 4 times last season. Previously with Thatcham Town.



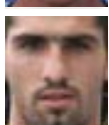
**Rob Lincoln** Forward

# Our History

## Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

## Bohane heads Bassett to victory

Goals from Steve Yeardley and TJ Bohane secured a return to winning ways for Royal Wootton Bassett Town as they defeated Virginia Water 2-1.

TJ Bohane's powerful 54th minute header proved to be the difference as Royal Wootton Bassett Town recorded a narrow 2-1 victory against Virginia Water.

The forward rose highest to connect perfectly with Dale Richards' cross and deliver a header that was not going to be kept out.

And ultimately it would provide three valuable points for Sam Collier's team, who move up to fourth in the Hellenic League Premier Division table.

The game itself was a tight, entertaining affair. Early on both teams cancelled each other out - a far cry from their meeting in Berkshire in September when Bassett flew out of the gates only to spurn a number of fantastic chances on their way to a frustrating 2-0 defeat.

The hosts then took the lead seven minutes before the break. The ever-dangerous Rob Lincoln passed inside for an onrushing Yeardley, and the experienced campaigner - now two games off 500 appearances for Bassett - produced a great finish for his second goal of the season, and 77th overall for the club.

Virginia Water were level two minutes later though. McCready did well to keep out the initial effort following a dangerous corner, but the 'keeper could do little to prevent Adam McNamara firing home the rebound.

With the game finely poised at half time, Bassett would make the decisive break early after the restart as Bohane reached nine goals for the season with his pin-point headed effort.

There were chances to extend the lead too. Lincoln blazed over with an open goal at his mercy before Bohane came within inches of scoring a second header.

Surviving a late scare when the visitors put over a free kick from the edge of the box, Bassett would secure the points - and set up a chance to finish their five game homestand with three wins should they triumph against struggling Abingdon United on Saturday.

## Impressive Saints march past Bassett

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's inconsistent form continued as they were well beaten 3-1 at home by early Hellenic League Premier Division leaders Brackley Town Saints. Sam Collier's team were punished for a first half performance in which they failed to match their impressive visitors, and a pair of mistakes in a matter of minutes were duly punished to put Brackley firmly in control of the match. TJ Bohane restored hope for his side with a penalty on the half hour mark to halve the deficit. But Bassett were unable to find a way of unlocking the Brackley defence again, with the Saints effectively slowing down the pace of the game in the second period. And they would go on to finish the scoring deep into injury time. Demonstrating extreme confidence in possession and with players across the pitch making intelligent runs off the ball, it was clear to see from the opening whistle why Brackley currently find themselves in the position they are in. And the threat they posed was evident from as early as the third minute when Brackley, casually passing along their back line, lulled Bassett into a trap, with one ball over the top beating the defence. Ryan Knight found himself in behind a fired a powerful shot that crashed off the crossbar from the edge of the area. The rebound then fell for Charlie Kille, but he narrowly missed the target. The Saints eventually went ahead after twenty minutes. Drawing Bassett out of their shape, a pass was played into the left channel for an unmarked Knight to run onto. 'Keeper Charlie McCready then hesitated when deciding whether to try and beat the forward to the ball and that impacted upon his positioning when trying to gather Knight's cross. Unable to catch it, he could only tip into the path of James Hammond, who bundled in from close range. Almost immediately the lead was doubled. This time a switch of play caught out both Dale Richards and Brad Pagliaroli, allowing right back Alex Stott to nip in and seize possession before burying a firm drive into the bottom left corner from fifteen yards. It was a deserved lead for the visitors and the home side were in danger of being out of the game before the half time whistle arrived. However, they were handed a lifeline on 32 minutes when Brackley centre half Joe Ward was penalised for a push in the box on Steve Yeardley while challenging for Pagliaroli's inswinging corner. Bohane then confidently dispatched the spot kick, sending Ali Worby the wrong way Still, Kille almost restored Brackley's two goal advantage shortly before the interval when he latched onto a through ball and found a way beyond Dan Cole and McCready. However, in a crowded penalty area, he was unable to properly get off his shot and the ball was scrambled away.

To their credit, Bassett were much improved after the break. But Brackley continued to control possession and the game's tempo. That resulted in a cagey battle, with neither team able to unlock the other's defence until after the hour mark. A counter for the visitors resulted in James Watts skewing over from the edge of the box before Pagliaroli curled straight into the hands of Worby after good hold up play from Bohane. With quarter of an hour remaining, a Bohane cross wasn't cleared and dropped for Iggy Ilott, but from a tight angle the midfielder could only blaze over. Another Brackley break then resulted in Hammond steering over before Bohane created a further opportunity at the other end for substitute Rob Lincoln. However, after cutting inside onto his right foot, he saw his effort parried at the near post. That would be the last opening Bassett mustered. And, deep into injury time, Kille would well and truly kill off the game, tapping in on the rebound after McCready had kept out Chris Jordan's initial low shot.

**Man of the match: TJ Bohane** – expertly put away his penalty and was instrumental in creating the few chances Bassett were able to fashion during the game. As usual, the forward held the ball up well and was willing to get stuck in.

# Our Visitors History

## Abingdon United • Club History

The club was formed in 1946 when a group of ex-service men decided that the town could support two football clubs. The first meeting to form the club was held in the local Anchor Public House on the bank of the River Thames, as there were no club facilities. They joined the North Berks League and within two seasons had won its Charity Shield. The following year 1953/54 they won the league and cup finalists



The club had its sights on higher things and five years later entered the Hellenic League. Since then it has remained in this league and during this time had success in the lower divisions. In 1965/66 they won the Division One Challenge Cup and the following season were the cup finalists.

No further honours came the clubs way until winning promotion in 1976/77 to the Premier Division. After a struggle at this level, relegation back to Division One came after four seasons. With a more ambitious approach, the club bounced back into the Premier League where it has remained ever since. It also won the Division One Cup in the same promotion year. Senior status was achieved in 1985 allowing it to be eligible for the F.A. Vase, County Senior Cup and in 1989 entered the F.A. Cup for the first time.

A Members Room, Function Room, Covered Stand and Floodlighting have been completed in recent years to improve the off pitch facilities. 1996/97 has seen the club complete its 50th season and it's most successful. United won the final of the Berks and Bucks Senior Trophy and also winning the League's Floodlit Cup. The highest ever league position was attained when finishing as Runners Up in the Hellenic Premier Division. The following season again saw success come to Northcourt Road with retaining the County Senior Trophy, Hellenic League Reserve Championship and Allied Counties Youth League winners.

2001 saw the construction of new changing rooms, together with turnstiles, to the Northcourt Road Ground and 2005 saw the construction of a new 150-seater stand and a covered stand. The club clinched promotion to the Southern League in season 2005/06.

In season 2013/14 Abingdon re-joined the Hellenic League in the Premier Division after voluntarily resigning from the Southern League. Relegated to the First Division West the 2015/16 season the club bounced back to the Premier Division last season.

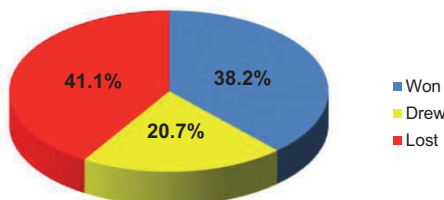

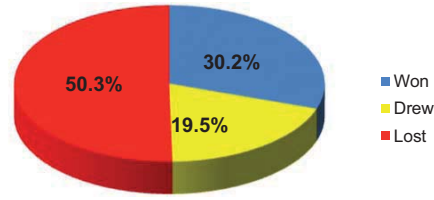

It's that time of the year again where the FA Cup take centre stage – first round proper weekend is upon us and we await to see where this year's FA Cup shocks will be.

After a season where Lincoln City remarkably reached the quarter-final against Arsenal, last year was a bit quieter with no Non-League representation in the third round. Although we still had some good moments to enjoy along the way. I fancy the Non-League flag to be flying high again in 2018-19, though.

It's always struck me how the Sliding Doors effect is brought into even sharper focus when it comes to the FA Cup. The ifs, buts and maybes that populate football chat after every game, can often be the difference between a money-spinning run and sitting at home watching someone else enjoy one instead.

Inevitably, if a club is to have a good run then they will have had the run of the green you need to win close games. And that's the beauty of it.

Despite the best efforts of people to talk down the competition, for Non-League clubs it still feels very much alive.

You watch this season. If (when) the scalp of Football League side is claimed this coming weekend, the victory will soon be followed with words like, magic and romance.

And that's all good. Because that's exactly it is. But a lot of it will be centred on the argument they are ingredients that have gone missing from the competition.

For Non-League clubs I'd argue against that claim. Maybe at the latter stages for the bigger Premier League clubs, but here it's going well, thanks.

It is reason for a club to dream, can launch careers and transform long-term fortunes. Even more so with the welcome doubling of the FA Cup prize money – with the introduction of handing losing clubs some cash in the extra preliminary and preliminary rounds also making a big difference.

The FA Cup is a perfect vessel to put money into the game through results on the pitch.

Personally, I'd like to see some of the pound notes ring-fenced for clubs to use on infrastructure, equipment or ground issues.

But there has to be an appreciation that if a club wins money it is entitled to use how it sees fit. If that means bringing in a new striker to help the season, then that's their right.

Of course, for most Non-League clubs the FA Cup is already over for another year. For many it was finished at the beginning of August.

For others, just making it through a couple of rounds was success enough. I took a trip to Lymington Town for their second round qualifying clash with Torquay United. Although the Wessex League side were well beaten on the day, it was obvious to see what their slice of FA Cup history had brought the club, with an ex-Football League side at home in front of the BBC online cameras. You can be sure the interest it created would have brought in more fans.

The stories are only just being written. And we at The NLP can't wait to cover them.

# From The development Side

27th October 2018

On a freezing cold afternoon, which felt like mid-December rather than October, the big match of the day took place at the Weir Field where Wroughton in fourth place met Cricklade Town who sat just one place below them in the table and came into the game on the back of seven game unbeaten run. With both sides fully committed the opening exchanges were a bit scrappy but the first real piece of quality play of the afternoon brought the first goal after just eight minutes. Following a clever run and lay off from Aaron Maximen, Shane Hibbert curled the ball over the Cricklade keeper Eddie Salisbury from the edge of the box and into the top corner of the net to put Wroughton in front. Hibbert had another good chance on sixteen minutes when the ball was delivered into the box and he headed powerfully towards goal, but it was straight at keeper Salisbury who saved easily. Cricklade's best chance of the half came on twenty minutes when Max Scholefield curled a free kick just over. Four minutes later Wroughton went close to extending their lead but the ball was cleared off the line to leave the score 1-0 at the break. Five minutes after the restart Wroughton were awarded a penalty and up stepped top scorer Hibbert looking to net his eighth of the season. However, his spot kick was well saved by Cricklade keeper Eddie Salisbury, but the ball rebounded to Hibbert whose second attempt was then fired over the bar and Cricklade escaped going further behind. At the other end Cricklade's own top scorer Devan Bryan went close to equalising on fifty-seven minutes as he lobbed Wroughton keeper Kurtis Sharkey only to see the ball go just wide of the post. Wroughton went straight up the other end and Eddie Salisbury once again denied Shane Hibbert from extending Wroughton's lead. However, Wroughton were not to be denied for long as Kyle Parker skilfully placed a shot from the edge of the box into the Cricklade net to make it 2-0 to the home side. Cricklade responded immediately to going further behind when they attacked straight from the restart and top scorer Devan Bryan netted for the sixteenth time this season. With time running out Cricklade pushed for that equaliser and ten minutes from time Max Scholefield fired another free kick just over the Wroughton bar. Moments later Reece Gilliver had a shot which was easily dealt with by Kurtis Sharkey. Then with just over a minute to go some sloppy defending by the Wroughton back line gave Elliott Corp a chance to share the points, but he shot just wide. This was to be the last chance of the game as the Wroughton defence ensured they saw out that final seconds to secure a 2-1 home win and send them up to second place in the table and end that Cricklade unbeaten run after a tight game between two good sides. Cricklade dropped one place in the table to sixth as a result of the defeat.

Elsewhere, the overnight leaders Melksham Town Reserves, who had won their previous five games, came unstuck away at Football ID. The young Football ID side had not won since the first week of September but ended their barren spell with goals from Kyle Pogue Elms and Ethan Gilson-Clarke to secure an excellent 2-0 win. The win lifted Football ID to eighth place in the table, whilst Melksham slipped to third.

Another of the top sides to slip up were defending champions Kintbury Rangers. Like Melksham, Kintbury went into their game at Corsham on the back of five straight wins, and whilst the home side were without a win in three they were defending an unbeaten record at Southbank this season. That record remains in tact as they ran out 2-1 winners thanks to two goals from Liam Ralph, Fabio Pinto to the Kintbury goal.

As a result of the defeats for both Melksham Town Reserves and Kintbury Rangers the new leaders this evening are Shrewton United who ran out comfortable 9-0 winners at home against Malmesbury Victoria Development, this just a week after they smashed ten past Devizes Town Reserves. Two goals for both Charlie Utterson and Alistair Carvel and one apiece for Tyler Pavey, Jesse Walters, Craig Lewis and Dan Burton, the final goal coming courtesy of an own goal.

Trowbridge Town moved to ninth place and within a point of opponents Purton after a solitary goal from Joshua Hard, his eighth of the season, settled matters at the Red House in Trowbridge's favour, ending Trowbridge's five game run without a win and bringing to an end Purton's six game winning run in the process.

Westbury United Reserves moved up into fifth place in the table after a 3-0 home win over Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development thanks to two goals from Rhys Talmarsh and one from top scorer George Bendle, taking his total to eight for the season. Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development slipped into the bottom three as a result of the defeat and results elsewhere. The final game of the day saw Marlborough Town climb out of the bottom three after a solitary goal from Chris Deane settled matters against Devizes Town Reserves, giving Marlborough their second win of the season.

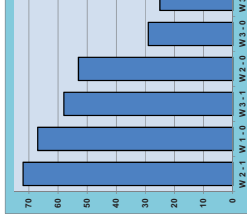

Chippenham Town picked up a useful away point in the National League South on Tuesday night at Oxford City. Nat Jarvis' goal early in the second half put Chippenham in front, but Frankie Musonda restored parity for Oxford city with 15 minutes to play. Chippenham then had to put in a solid rear-guard effort in the closing stages as they were forced to finish the game with just 10 men when Jon Beeden, dual signed with ourselves, limped off after all three substitutes had been made. Chippenham are short on number sahead of the big home game against Woking this Saturday and ahead of the game Marl Collier has re-signed former player and free agent Nuno Felix. Felix enjoyed a spell with the Bluebirds during their Southern League promotion campaign during the 2016/17 season before featuring for Banbury last term. The former Benfica academy member – who is a Portuguese national – will be a welcome arrival to Collier, who is missing almost a dozen players ahead of their National League South tie against Woking.

At Step 3, Salisbury were without a game whilst Swindon Supermarine met Banbury United in a FA Trophy Replay. Unfortunately for Lee Spalding's side they crashed out of the competition, going down 3-0. The first half unfolded without major incident, although only the woodwork prevented Supermarine from breaking the deadlock as Dan Williamson fired a shot against the crossbar. They were undone in the opening exchanges of the second half, though, as Greg Kaziboni pounced to fire Banbury ahead. The home side then doubled their advantage midway through the second half as Kaziboni saw an effort deflected past goalkeeper Kevin Sawyer for his second of the game. The visitors' hopes were then killed off for good with 10 minutes to play as Ricky Johnson netted Banbury's third to wrap up a convincing win.

Step 4 side Melksham Town were in league action on Monday night when they travelled to Portsmouth to play Moneyfields. Trailing by three goals with 10 minutes remaining, Melksham were staring at what would've been their second Division One South loss this season. But returning forward Brad Norris – who took to the field for the first time in 18 months after being hit by a knee injury – came off the bench to bag a quick brace before Dave Thompson scored a rare goal in the dying minutes of injury time to record a 3-3 draw. The point lifted Melksham one place in the table to 9<sup>th</sup>, just below Highworth Town who were without a midweek game.

As well as ourselves, at Step 5 Wessex League side Bemerton Heath Harlequins were also in league action on Tuesday night when Alresford Town were the visitors. Alresford led 1-0 but a goal from substitute Kelvin Robinson secured a point for Bemerton who remain third from bottom. Step 5 Western League side Westbury United's great run of late came to an end at home to Odd Down in the Les Phillips Cup, Westbury going down 3-0 to the Bath based side, having defeated them 4-1 when they met in the league.

In the Western League Division One (Step 6), Chippenham Park were involved in the only league match played, with all the other clubs involved in Les Phillips Cup action. They secured three useful points courtesy of a 1-0 home win over Radstock Town to move above Radstock at the bottom end of the table. In the Les Phillips Cup, Warminster Town's tough run of late continued as they lost 4-2 away at Premier Division side Brislington but Calne Town progressed to the next round with a 2-1 away win at Chard Town.

In the UHlsport Hellenic League two of the three Wiltshire based sides were in Subsidiary Cup action. Two goals from Shane Bumphrey and one apiece for Elliott Drage, Kyle Witt, Jasper Marsh and Josh Hughes gave Malmesbury Victoria a big 6-1 home win over Cirencester Town Development. Pewsey Vale also won, defeating Cheltenham Saracens 3-1, former Royal Wootton Bassett Town players getting all the goals, two for Josh Fowler and one for Lee Smith.

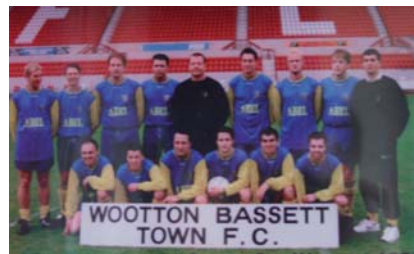

### Headline: Exciting finish leads to a replay

The First Round Wilts Senior Cup game proved to be a thrilling affair. With 15 minutes to go it all but looked over with Wootton Bassett two goals to the good but Bemerton just would not give up and responded with two late goals to take the game into extra time, and consequently on to a replay next week down at Bemerton. Bemerton who have not been going as well as normal in the league, took the game to Bassett right from the word go. Allying their strong running with a well organised offside trap, which was to catch the Bassett front three far too often. They caused Bassett a few problems early on, though Rees was only called upon once, coming off his line quickly to gather a loose ball. In fact, the opening goal, a splendid one after 15 minutes was to come slightly against the run of play. Hanrahan picked the ball up just inside his own half and turned to lay a fine pass over the Bemerton defence to Harrison, who had timed his run from midfield perfectly, leaving him 15 yards clear. He ran on with the ball and calmly placed it to the right of the advancing keeper. The rest of the first half saw the game switching from end to end with several goalmouth incidents, though neither side created any further clear-cut chances.

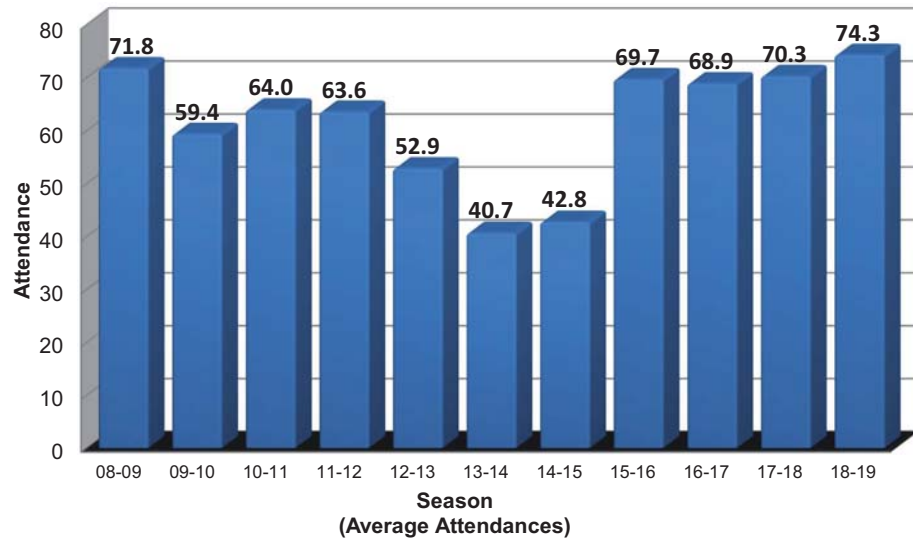
The second half saw no let up in the pace of the game and the physical but fair nature of it. Bemerton again perhaps had more of the play though Bassett always looked dangerous on the counter. The second Bassett goal followed some good work from Vines, who's been having an excellent season in the heart of the midfield. Winning the ball with a solid tackle he played a fine pass inside the full back for Hanrahan, who took it on into the box before firing positively home. This signalled the start of the best period of the game for Bassett and following a number of half chances a quickly taken short corner was crossed in only for an unmarked Frost to head the ball straight into the arms of the keeper. This proved to be the turning point of the game. From the keeper's kick the ball found its way to Bemerton's nippy right winger who settled it under the advancing Rees. Rejuvenated and throwing caution to the wind with only ten minutes left, Bemerton now came forward in numbers. Rees saved Bassett twice, firstly turning a fierce drive over the bar, and then making a marvellous reaction save from the Bemerton centre forward. As happens so often in cup games, the equaliser, five minutes from time, had a portion of luck in it. A fiercely hit shot was going straight at Rees when it hit Harrison and looped up and over the stranded keeper. Bassett tried to respond, York having a shot go just wide, but to no avail the game going into extra time. The additional 30 minutes proved to be just as fiercely contested as the first 90. Bassett created two good chances, Frost firstly shooting tamely at the keeper when clear then York just going wide again, when a square ball to Hanrahan may have been the better option. Both sides also had what seemed justified penalty appeals turned down. The final effort to win the game came from Bemerton when a fierce shot cannoned off the Bassett crossbar. Although Bassett should never have let the two goal lead slip, full marks should go to Bemerton for battling back into the game, and the replay next week is eagerly awaited.



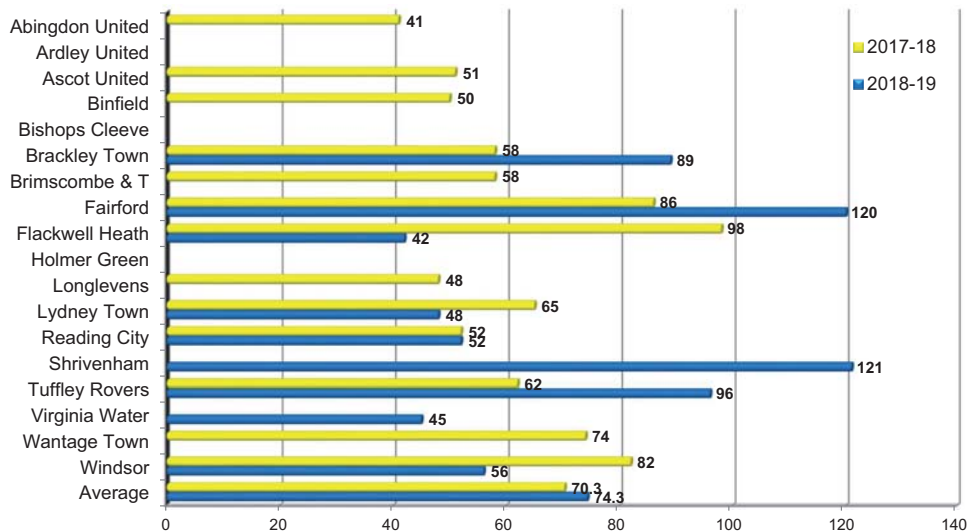


# Attendances

RWBTFC Attendances - Season 2018-19 (and comparison to 2017-18)



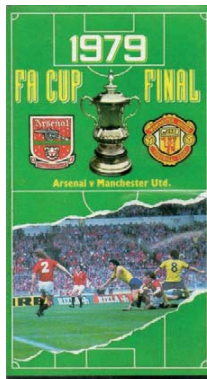
