Bassett News

Today's Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Ardley United. A warm welcome to all the players, management, officials and spectators who have made the journey from Ardley for this afternoon's game.

Ardley are back in the Premiership after asking for relegation at the end of the 2016-17 season and then immediately winning Division One West last season to regain their position in the top flight of Hellenic football. Irrespective of the rights and wrongs of a team that had only once finished outside the top 8 in the previous 9 seasons being allowed to take voluntary relegation, Ardley are back where they belong and have made a reasonable start to life back in the Premier Division.

At the time of writing these notes Ardley currently sit in a mid-table 10th position with 7 wins from their opening 18 league games. A summary of their record this season is included elsewhere in today's programme. I say it every home game but this season more than any it holds true, anyone is capable of beating anyone in this tight UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division this season and we will once again need to be at our best if we are to maintain our good home form this season.

Abingdon United - Home

The last home game here at the Gerard Buxton Ground was a close affair against bottom of the table Abingdon United. In the end we managed to see out the game to secure a 3-2 win and this was a good three points against an Abingdon United side who are much better than their league position suggests. This was illustrated a few days after our game when they went to another of the leading sides, Ascot United, and came away with a point in a 2-2 draw. Two goals from Matty Bennett and a penalty from TJ Bohane ensured that Sam Collier enjoyed a win over one of his former clubs.

Reading – Away

Two days later and we were back in action with a Monday night "midweek" game against Reading City. Before mentioning the match itself, congratulations to Reading City on the improvements they are making at the club. The pitch compared to previous visits was in excellent condition for the time of year, the crowd seemed much larger than in previous visits although, as with the Virginia Water away game, the club have not populated FA Fulltime with the actual crowd number, and the overall feel of the place and game was in no way intimidating, something you would not have been able to say a few seasons back. The re-branding as Reading City certainly seems to have worked well and we unfortunately met them on a night when everything clicked for them on the pitch and we lost 4-3 having been in front at half-time and then led 3-2 with 20 minutes to go. The equaliser from Austin Best for the home side was just a stunning strike from just inside our half that travelled with such pace and seemed to swerve in mid-air that Charlie in goal stood no chance of stopping it. This wonder goal certainly lifted the home side who then went on to bag the winner. Again if we could have taken our chances we could have been out of sight but another away day defeat continued our miserable run on the road which has not seen us win away from home in the calendar year.

Binfield - Away

We remained without an away league win in 2018 after we were defeated 3-2 by Binfield in an entertaining contest played in miserable conditions. For the second time in a week we found ourselves on the short end of a defeat by the odd goal. However, unlike in Monday's 4-3 reverse at the hands of Reading City, against Binfield we never found ourselves in a position where we were ahead. Both Matty Bennett and TJ Bohane continued their recent goalscoring form, but it was not enough in the end to bring what was starting to look like an away day curse to an end.

Lydney - Away

Finally, that tough run of results on the road has come to an end. Often in the face of adversity you come up with a great result and that is actually what Sam and the lads did on Tuesday night. Struggling to raise a side after so many games, with injuries and work commitments massively impacting team selection the lads made the long journey over the Severn Bridge and returned with all three points thanks to goals from Matty Bennett and Brad Pagliaroli in a 2-0 win. It was also our first double of the season. Well done to all.

Arrell at the double as Ladies march on

An Emily Arrell brace and a solid defensive display delivered a fourth successive win in the South West Women's Football League Eastern Division for Royal Wootton Bassett Town as they defeated Almondsbury 2-0.

Historically, games between the two teams have proven to be tight contests. And their latest meeting in Wiltshire was no different. Bassett had the better of the opening exchanges, creating several chances but were unable to convert from them. Almondsbury were demonstrating that they were more than capable opposition too, but were unable to translate that into the creation of opportunities on goal. Eventually Bassett would take the lead, capitalising on a set piece. Lisa Coe whipped in a dangerous corner that resulted in a goalmouth scramble, and - after several ricochets - the ball dropped for Arrell who slotted into the net.

After taking their lead into the break, Bassett were forced onto the back foot early in the second period as Almondsbury knocked on the door. However, a stern rear-guard display helped Bassett keep their visitors at bay. And, after weathering the visitors' storm, the home side scored what proved to be a decisive second. Following a good passage of play in the Bassett midfield, Arrell was set free on goal. Her initial shot was blocked by the Almondsbury 'keeper. But both Arrell and strike partner Hayley Huckin were queuing up for the rebound, and it was the former who would get to the ball first, making no mistake with a cool finish. That goal seemed to knock the wind out of Almondsbury, and Bassett had chances to further extend their advantage before the end. A stunning save kept out at a Laura Jefferies free kick, with a Maddy Elliott shot from the resulting corner being placed narrowly wide. Those missed opportunities were immaterial though, Arrell's brace having secured a vital three points, with the solid display at the other end also securing a first clean sheet since Bassett's opening league game away against Oldland Abbotonians. In a quirk of fixture scheduling, the teams meet again next week in Bristol. And, with current leaders Frampton Rangers without a game, an identical result will see Bassett pull within just a point of them.

Our Visitors This Season



Ardley United are back in the Premier Division after a one-year self-imposed absence having won Division One West last season. They currently sit in 11th place in the table, a good performance on their return but this is after making a disappointing start to the season, which saw them lose their first two games 4-1 at the hands of Binfield and Ascot United. The season started to turn around for them in the FA Cup when they thrashed Shortwood United 7-0 in the Extra Preliminary Round. Deon Gallacher was the star of the show that day as he has fired four goals for Ardley. Whilst they lost their next league game this was against title favourites Wantage Town.

The first league win of the season came at home to Tuffley Rovers when goals from Deon Gallacher and Louis Joyce gave Ardley a 2-1 home win. A quick return game against Ascot United saw the Berkshire side record a double over Ardley, goals from Louis Joyce and Thomas Moore were not enough as they went down 3-2.

An exit from the FA Cup followed as Division One East side Burnham won 4-2 at Ardley to progress to the First Qualifying Round. Ardley's best result of the season to that point then came in the very next game as Reading City left Ardley on the wrong end of a 3-0 score line. This was a Reading City side with their big budget squad before they had started to haemorrhaging players hence the impressive nature of this result.

Whilst the league form was showing signs of improvement, Ardley once again becoming accustomed to life in the Premier Division, they suffered another defeat at the hands of Division One East opponents in an FA competition when Holyport inflicted another 4-1 defeat on Ardley.

The goals continued to fly in the net in the next two fixtures. Whilst Ardley managed to score 4 goals themselves at Brimscombe & Thrupp, never an easy place to visit, they shipped 6 in their own net in a 10-goal thriller. The goals continued to fly in the wrong end in the next game too, Holmer Green hitting 5 without reply as Ardley lost again in the league.

The management clearly worked on the defence after this defeat as Ardley then embarked on their best run of the season which saw them win 4 games on the bounce. First Flackwell Heath were defeated 2-1 in the league before Ardley completed an impressive double over Reading City, again whilst Reading still had their star-studded squad, 4-1 the final score line as Ardley won by 3 clear goals for the second time this season against Reading. A solitary late goal from substitute Deon Gallacher was enough to give Ardley all 3 points at home to Virginia Water. The league form then continued into the League Cup as they defeated Lydney Town 2-0 in the First Round of the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup.

The winning run then came to an end as Ardley lost 3 league games on the bounce conceding another 11 goals in the process as their defensive woes returned. A 3-0 defeat at league leaders Brackley Town Saints was followed by another high scoring thriller, as Ardley lost by the odd goal in 9 against visitors Fairford. A 3-1 defeat at Bishops Cleeve completed the run of defeats.

They returned to winning ways when back in cup action. A 6-1 Floodlit Cup triumph over Cirencester Town Development was followed by a 3-2 home win over Malmesbury Victoria in the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup. They also progressed in the Oxfordshire Senior Cup knocking out Division One East side Chinnor 4-0 on their own ground.

Back in the league they picked up a useful point from their long trip to play Lydney in yet another high scoring game as the two sides shared 6 goals and the points. Flackwell Heath then got their revenge for their earlier league defeat at the hands of Ardley, winning 2-0 in the return game. This was the last time that Ardley have suffered defeat as they have won their last 2 games. An impressive 4-0 away win at Longlevens, 2 goals for Troy Bryan that day, was followed last Saturday by another impressive result when they defeated 2nd placed Brimscombe & Thrupp 4-2, to avenge their earlier league defeat in that 10 goal game. In summary Ardley come here today full off goals but with a defence that also concedes lots as they have currently shipped the most of any side in the division in the league. Expect goals here today.

Danger Men – Leading scorers Gregory Hackett (15 goals), Tobias London (14) and Deon Gallacher (8) will be the three to watch for Ardley this afternoon.

Visitors - Tourist Information

Introduction to the Village

Ardley is a small village in Oxfordshire, England, about 4 miles (6.4 km) northwest of Bicester with a population of less than 1,000 people.

Interesting Facts

The limestone quarry at Ardley has yielded a significant find of dinosaur tracks (ichnites), discovered in 1997 and thought to have been left by *Megalosaurus* (pictured) & possibly *Cetiosaurus*. Some of these are on display in the dinosaur garden at the Oxfordshire Museum.



The village of Ardley borders on the site of the old RAF airfield at Upper Heyford, previously used by both the RAF and USAF. The airfield has appeared in several film and television productions, portraying various fictional military sites. It appeared as a USAF airfield in West Germany for the James Bond film *Octopussy* in 1982 and as the fictional "RAF Baywaters" (intended to evoke RAF Bentwaters) in *The Fourth Protocol*. The infamously long runway scene from *Fast & Furious 6* was also filmed on the disused runway at Upper Heyford. The abandoned airfield also appeared as "RAF Heyford" in the television series *Lewis*, series five episode "Old, Unhappy, Far-Off Things", first broadcast in 2011.

In 2017, Oxfordshire County Council announced that 1 million tonnes of rubbish (the equivalent of about 450 Olympic sized swimming pools filled with rubbish) had been transformed into energy at the Ardley Energy Recovery Facility and helped to divert 95% of Oxfordshire's waste from landfill. Once there, it's converted into electricity, powering 38,000 homes.

Famous Residents

We have not been able to locate any famous residents of Ardley in an extensive search of the internet. The best we have been able to come up with is that the man who built Ardley Football Club to what it is today, Norman Stacey, has a character named after him in the Harry Potter series. Norman Stacey was a

Slytherin student at Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry in the 1993-1994 school year.

Nearest Railway Station

Ardley used to have its own railway station until 1963. Trains of the Chiltern main line pass the site these days but do not stop at Ardley.

The nearest active railway stations are at Heyford and Bicester North, both served by Chiltern Railways and both just over 5 miles from Ardley.

Nearest Pubs to Ground

The nearest pub to the ground is the Fox and Hounds (pictured) which is only about 50m from the ground.

The other pub in the village is the White Lion Inn.

Things to Do in Ardley

Other than a visit to the pub and the football ground you are going to need a car for other activities in and around Ardley.

For those interested in shopping, or looking for somewhere to drop the other half off whilst you go to the football, Bicester Village is probably the place to go. This luxury destination, similar to the Railway Village in Swindon, is home to more than 160 boutiques of world-famous brands, each offering exceptional value with savings of up to 60% on the recommended retail price all year round.

A little further afield, the birthplace and ancestral home of Sir Winston Churchill, Blenheim Palace is around 12 miles from the football ground.

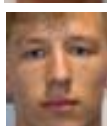

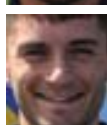

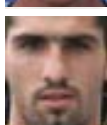

Our History

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenvzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

A Monday night thriller ended in defeat for Royal Wootton Bassett Town as they were beaten 4-3 by Reading City.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town came up on the wrong end of a seven-goal thriller away against Reading City as their miserable form away from home in the Hellenic League Premier Division continued.

Despite twice leading, Bassett wound up losing 4-3 and remain the only team in the division not to have triumphed on their travels so far this season. In fact, Bassett have picked up just two points from seven trips away from the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground this season, with two more tough away days next up on their schedule.

Their trip to Berkshire had started off perfectly. While Matt Carr in the Reading goal pulled off saves from Rob Lincoln and TJ Bohane early on, he could do nothing to deny Carl Evans, who slotted in from close range following a Nick Stanley pass with just over quarter of an hour gone.

That lead was cancelled out in the opening minute of the second period though as Sal Abubakar beat the offside trap and made no mistake.

After Reading had a goal disallowed for offside and Gio Wrona forced a save from Carr, the visitors went ahead as Abubakar produced an outstanding finish to record his second of the game.

That goal had been coming. But Bassett re-grouped and themselves got back on level terms when Matt Bennett found the net following a superb Rob Lincoln pass.

Four minutes later, Carr upended Bohane in the box and the forward made no mistake from the spot to put the visitors back on top.

However, that lead would last only nine minutes. And Austin Best restored parity in sublime style, firing in from all of thirty-five yards.

A grandstand finish, in which both teams chased a winner, was in store.

But, much to Bassett's frustration, it would be Reading who recorded the decisive goal, Adam Cashin-Murray steering in after a cut back from the right with six minutes remaining.

One final chance did fall Bassett's way, but Carr, producing another top drawer save, was equal to Bennett's drive.

Bennett double sees off Abingdon

Hellenic League Premier Division basement dwellers Abingdon United ran Royal Wootton Bassett Town close, but Matt Bennett's second half double secured a 3-2 triumph for Sam Collier's team.

Even with opponents Abingdon United sitting bottom of the Hellenic League Premier Division table, Royal Wootton Bassett Town manager Sam Collier was expecting a tough contest prior to their meeting at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground. And that is exactly what took place as Bassett edged out a narrow 3-2 triumph thanks to Matt Bennett's brace and TJ Bohane's first half penalty.

The result means Collier's team end their month-long homestand with nine points from a possible twelve in the league games they played - a solid haul, with the only blemish coming against current leaders Brackley Town Saints.

To get to that mark proved tough though. Victory against Reading City and Tuesday's triumph by the odd goal in three against Virginia Water required high quality defensive and clinical attacking displays.

The win against Abingdon followed a less complete performance. But Bassett got there in the end to move into a tricky run of three away games on the back of another victory. They had to do it the hard way too, falling behind after only six minutes when Nathan Baker capitalised from a corner that the home side should never have conceded.

Within minutes, Bassett had the opportunity to equalise when Bohane was brought down in the box. However, summing up his team's frustrating opening to the game, the forward blazed over from the spot. Both sides then traded chances, with Josh Shama going close for Bassett when he shot at the 'keeper after having been played through.

Eventually, shortly after the half hour mark, Bassett pulled level. Bohane again drew a foul in the area and, after dusting himself off, this time made no mistake from twelve yards. The equaliser seemed to instil a degree of confidence in Collier's team. And they almost went ahead for the first time on the afternoon shortly before the break when Bennett narrowly missed the target.

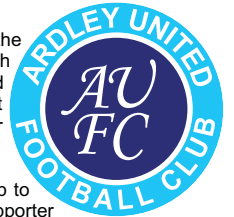
He made no mistake eight minutes after the restart though. Brad Pagliaroli's low drive could only be parried and Bennett was on hand to sweep in. Shortly before the hour mark, Bennett made it 3-1, firing into the bottom corner from the edge of the area. To their credit, the visitors continued to chip away at Bassett despite now trailing by two goals. And Tom Butler pulled one back with twenty minutes remaining to set up a lively finish. Abingdon almost drew level after a ball over the top caught out the Bassett defence, but fortunately Charlie McCready was not tested by the shot.

That would be the last opportunity they would muster, and debutant Mani Roper should have put the result beyond doubt for Bassett in stoppage time. However, he would miss when presented with an open goal. The miss would not matter though, as the referee's whistle immediately followed to signal another triumph that keeps Bassett in fourth and also trimmed the gap between them and the three sides above them, all of whom failed to take maximum points in their weekend fixtures.

Our Visitors History

Ardley United • Club History

Ardley United were formed in 1945 just after the end of the Second World War. In the early years, the club plied its trade in the Lord Jersey FA and played on a pitch which was situated close to the railway line on the Oxford Road. The 1950's and '60's were successful for the club as they won both league titles and cups; most notably the Oxfordshire Junior Shield on three occasions as well as many other trophies.



The acquisition of the current Playing Field site in the mid-60's enabled the club to move into the heart of the village, and a number of volunteers led by life-long supporter Doug Hodges built modest changing rooms. Ardley continued to compete in the Jersey League throughout the 70's and early 80's without much success but this was to change in the mid-80's with the arrival of Norman Stacey as chairman – a position that he graces to this day. In 1988 the club were promoted to the Oxfordshire Senior League and won the Division One title at the first attempt, following this up with the Premier Division title the following season.



Accepting a place in the Hellenic League for the 1993/4 season, Ardley spent six seasons in the 'old' Division One winning it in both 1996/7 and 97/8 as well as winning the Division 1 Cup for a record four consecutive seasons before it was merged with the Premier Division Cup to become the Challenge Cup that we know today.

The manager during these years was ex-Oxford United leading scorer Peter Foley and he was to be the first in a line of managers

to keep Ardley at the forefront who include Paul Spittle, Paul Berry, Dan Still and Kevin Brock among their number.

Major change was to come in the early 2000's as, along with the Ardley Playing Field Committee, Ardley United oversaw the construction of dedicated facilities along with a separate village hall which enabled the club to be independent of community activities. The new clubhouse, which had been awarded the Non-League Paper's Hungerford Cup for most-improved facilities, allowed the club to be promoted to the Hellenic Premier Division and so began the club's most successful years to date. Kevin Brock took the reins for seven seasons which saw Ardley win several cups including the Oxfordshire Senior Cup in 2013/14, a season during which they narrowly lost out on the Premier Division title by just two points. Following Brock's departure, Paul Davis took over as manager for nearly two seasons until the resignation of long-time chairman Norman Stacey in June 2017 for personal reasons.

Ian Feaver took over the role of Chairman and appointed Craig Adey as First Team Manager. A decision to be voluntarily relegated to UHlsport Hellenic League Division One West gave everyone some breathing space to adjust to the new regime. Craig brought with him a talented squad of players and they won the Division title gaining promotion back to the Premier Division at the first time of asking.

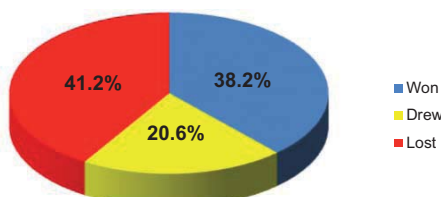

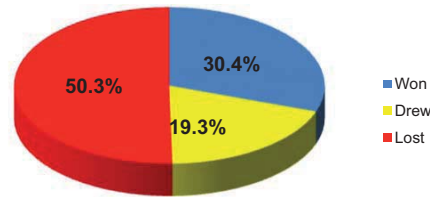

From The development Side

10th November 2018

With their nearest rivals either in cup action or not playing, Wroughton took full advantage to go back top of the league with a comprehensive 6-1 home win over Malmesbury Victoria Development. Going into the game the only league match Wroughton had lost this season had been against the young Malmesbury side at the Flying Monk last month and they certainly avenged that surprise defeat to win comfortably in the return match. The damage was done in the first half in an impressive first forty-five minutes which saw Wroughton lead 5-0 at the break. Tom Price got them on their way with the first goal, Aaron Maximen made it two before Kyle Parker then got in on the act scoring twice. The final goal of the first half was scored by Tom Dingle. Having done the hard work in those first forty-five minutes Wroughton took their foot off the gas in the second half and were only able to add one more goal, fittingly it was another for Kyle Parker to complete a fine hat-trick and take him to seven for the season.

The rest of the league action was at the bottom end of the table. Two sides in much need of a confidence boosting win met at Ludgershall. The home side Ludgershall had gone six games without tasting victory, while visitors Devizes Town Reserves own depressing run without a win stretched to eleven games. That game to an end at Ludgershall as two goals Ben Perrett gave them to a 2-1 win. Fielding a side that included three Under 18's in the starting line up the Devizes team put in one of their best performances of the season to secure their second win of the campaign and close the gap on the two sides above them in the table, Pewsey Vale Development and Marlborough Town, to just two points.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development and Pewsey Vale Development met at the Gerard Buxton Ground. When the two sides had met at Pewsey earlier in the season it had finished 5-2 to Royal Wootton Bassett and they recorded another win by three goals this time hitting three without reply through Bailey Gallagher, Nick Mason and George Staten to take the points and lift themselves above both Pewsey and Marlborough Town in the table. The league game between Melksham Town Reserves and Kintbury Rangers was postponed due to the Melksham side having a number of call-ups to the County Representative squad, whilst the Football ID league game against Corsham Town Reserves was also postponed with Football ID being unable to raise a side.

Five clubs from the league were also involved in the prestigious Wiltshire Senior Cup action this weekend with the action getting under way on a very wet and windy Friday night under the lights at Westbury United. League leaders Shrewton United went into the game with Toolstation Western League (Step 5) side Westbury United looking to cause a second giant killing of the season, having already knocked out Warminster Town from the Western League in the last round. Westbury United are currently unbeaten in the Premier Division of their league having won promotion last season and are looking a good bet for back-to-back promotions. The Western League side went in front on 22 minutes when Ricky Hulbert was brought down in the box and Dan Kovacs coolly put away the resulting penalty. Just moments later it was 2-0 as Callum Demkiv fired in off the underside of the bar following good set up play from Jamie Jordan. Shrewton thought they had pulled one back before half time through Ben Jenks but the goal was disallowed for offside and it remained 2-0 at the break. A couple of substitutions seemed to do the trick for Shrewton as they came out in the second half and got themselves back into the game against their higher league opponents. Dom Jackson netted on 57 minutes with a great finish to reduce the arrears. It got even better for the Wiltshire Senior League side when Zac McNally's free kick beat Westbury keeper Ed Baldy to level the scores and that second giant-killing looked back on. Unfortunately for Shrewton they couldn't retain parity for long, but it took a superb strike from Demkiv, from all of 30 yards, to put the Western League side back in front. Jamie Jordan then added a fourth for Westbury twenty minutes from time and it eventually finished 4-2 to the Western league side. So there was to be no second giant killing but Shrewton had done their club and the league proud with their efforts in pushing one of the top sides in the county all the way.

The other four Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League sides in County Cup action were all playing each other guaranteeing the league two representatives in the last eight with the big guns of Wiltshire football. The two sides who progress to the quarter final stage are local neighbours Purton and Cricklade Town. Purton recorded their second win of the season over Marlborough Town at the Red House, having won 3-2 in the league back in September they went one better in this Wiltshire Senior Cup tie running out 4-2 winners. Jack Duckers was the star of the show smashing a hat-trick to take him to six goals for the season, William Backhouse who scored the fourth for Purton also moved onto six for the season to become joint top scorer for Purton with Duckers. The two Marlborough goals were scored by Aaron Presley, also with his sixth of the season, and Jordan Ball. In the final Wiltshire Senior cup game Cricklade Town travelled to Trowbridge Town. In a tight contest at a wet Woodmarsh the match was decided early on by a solitary goal scored by Tom Hoskins, who scored with an excellent first-time arrowed shot into the net. The home side pressed for the equaliser creating a number of chances but the Cricklade defence held firm to prevent Trowbridge scoring to secure that place in the last eight, joining Westbury United and Purton in the quarter final. The second-round games involving the big guns of Chippenham Town, Salisbury, Melksham Town, Swindon Supermarine, Highworth Town and Melksham Town are scheduled for midweek this coming week, so both Cricklade and Purton will have to wait a few days to find out who their potential opponents could be in that quarter final.

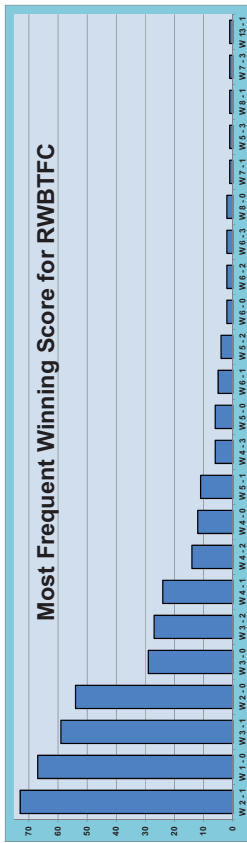

Chippenham Town moved into the play-off places on Saturday night after an excellent 3-2 away win at St Albans. In an entertaining game Chippenham started brightly and took the lead inside a minute, Karnell Chambers latched onto a ball forward and saw his initial shot saved but the ball bounced back into his path and he slotted it home. St Albans got back on level terms five minutes before half time the goal coming from the penalty spot, David Moyo converting the spot kick. Chippenham went back in front 10 minutes after the break through a Nat Jarvis header. Once again St Albans pulled themselves level and once again it was Moyo the scorer, heading into the bottom corner. With six minutes remaining, Nick McCootie won the game for Chippenham when he reacted quickest to a rebound to steer the ball into the net to make it 3-2. With 17 games gone Chippenham occupied the final play-off place joining some of the big names of non-league football in Woking, Welling United and Bath City in those play-off places, although slipped out of the play-off positions following midweek results. On Tuesday night they also progressed to the Quarter Final of the Wiltshire Senior Cup as two second half goals just after the break from Alex Ferguson and Nuno Felix, the latter a stunning strike, saw them overcome Calne Town 2-0.

At Step 3, Salisbury were involved in FA Trophy action and progressed to the next round thanks to a 2-0 home win over Bostik League Premier Division side Merstham. They were also involved in Wiltshire Senior Cup action on Wednesday night travelling to Western League Premier Division side Bradford Town. The two sides could not be separated after 90 minutes, it finishing 1-1 and penalties were needed to decide the winners, with Salisbury winning the spot kick contest 3-1 to progress to the next round.

Swindon Supermarine's disappointing season in the league continued last Saturday when they travelled to Staines Town and returned pointless after a 2-1 defeat, Conor McDonagh side footing into the net to equalise for Marine before Andy Ali scored the winner for Staines. Again Swindon Supermarine were in Wiltshire Senior Cup action on Wednesday night making the short trip to the Elms to take on Highworth Town. Highworth led 1-0 but two late goals in quick succession ensured that another of the giants of Wiltshire football progressed to the last eight which now includes Chippenham Town, Swindon Supermarine, Salisbury, and Melksham Town.

On Saturday Highworth Town's winless run in the Southern League Division One South stretched to a sixth game as they lost 1-0 at home to Cinderford Town. The other Step 4 side Melksham Town were, like Salisbury, in FA Trophy action but unlike the other Wiltshire side they were not able to maintain interest in the national competition losing 2-1 away at Leiston. They made amends for that defeat by maintaining their interest in the Wiltshire Senior Cup on Tuesday night winning 1-0 away at Devizes Town in a closely fought contest with the Western League Division One side.

At Step 5, whilst we were losing narrowly at Binfield, Bemerton Heath Harlequins were without a game and now find themselves bottom of the table. Westbury United were in Wiltshire Senior Cup action defeating Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League side Shrewton United 4-2 on Friday night (see Wiltshire League review for report on this game). Bradford Town slipped up in their quest to make up ground on the leading sides when they lost 4-2 away at Plymouth Parkway

At Step 6 Dave Coker seems to be doing the business at Amesbury as his side returned from New Milton Town with all three points following a 2-0 win which took them top of the table. Laversrock & Ford also had a good win smashing 7 past opponents East Cowes Vics and now sit in 9th place in the table. In the Western League it is Calne who lead the way for Wiltshire in Division One, a 5-1 away win at Welton Rovers moving them up into 2nd place in the table. Corsham Town defeated bottom of the table Bristol Telephones 2-1 and in a good day for Wiltshire sides, Devizes Town also won 1-0 at home to Bishops Lydeard. The only losers were Chippenham Park who went down 3-2 at home to second from bottom Portishead. In the UHlsport Hellenic League, New College's season of woe continued with a 7-0 home thrashing at the hands of league leaders Cheltenham Saracens.

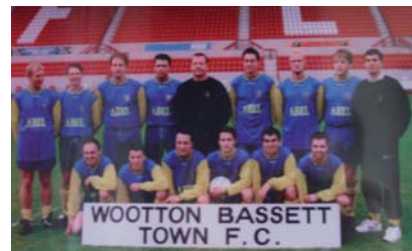

Headline: Bassett overcomes strong opposition

A 35th minute strike from Roger Frost, in this Wilts Senior Cup replay, was enough to see Wootton Bassett overcome a strong Bemerton side and earn a quarter final clash at home to Supermarine on January 2. In a splendid tussle, which was equally as absorbing as last week's game, Bassett always looked on top, though once again Bemerton just would not give up, and pushed hard right to the end. It was a game which started with Bassett winning the early midfield tussles, enabling them to control the pace of the game. The back four looked comfortable and most Bemerton advances were snuffed out before danger loomed. The success of the Bassett midfield allowed the creation of a number of early chances, notably for Damon York, who unfortunately seemed to have left his shooting boots at home. McKay, on the left-hand side of midfield, looked to be back to something like his best after two disappointing performances, and indeed the goal was engineered from that side. York made amends for his earlier misses when following a strong run down the flank, he beat his man and crossed for the onrushing Frost to side foot home. Bemerton's first half efforts had been mainly trusted to set pieces where their height would worry any side, until just before half time, when a rasping drive was well turned over the bar by Twine, deputising for Rees, who has a back injury.

The first 20 minutes saw Bassett still in control but failing to create the clear-cut chances that they did in the first half. Notable chances again fell to York, and also to Hanrahan who chose to shoot, when perhaps a square ball to a better placed Harrison would have produced dividends. Vines came the closest to adding to the lead, but his header was saved on the line. Gradually Bemerton started to come back into the game, and, as last week, threw caution to the wind for the last 15 minutes. However, unlike last week Bassett got extra men behind the ball when required and showed a determination not to surrender the lead. Although there were nervous times for the Bassett supporters, Bemerton throwing the ball forward and into the box at every opportunity, Bassett held firm, and in the end deserved the victory. The one sour note of the day was that Peter York who limped off following a heavy tackle early in the second half, has unfortunately broken his shinbone, although it is not currently known how long he will be side-lined for. Next week it is back to the bread and butter of the league when Bassett entertain Corsham at home.

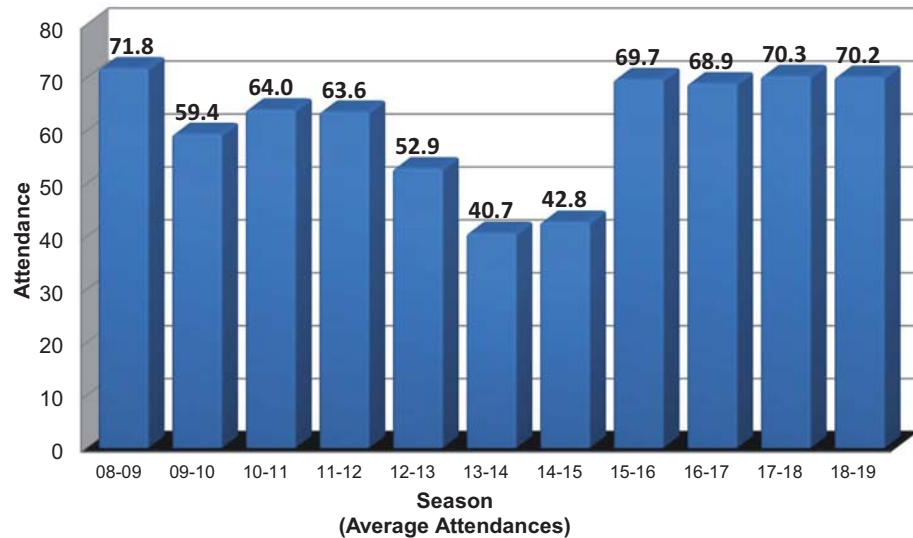

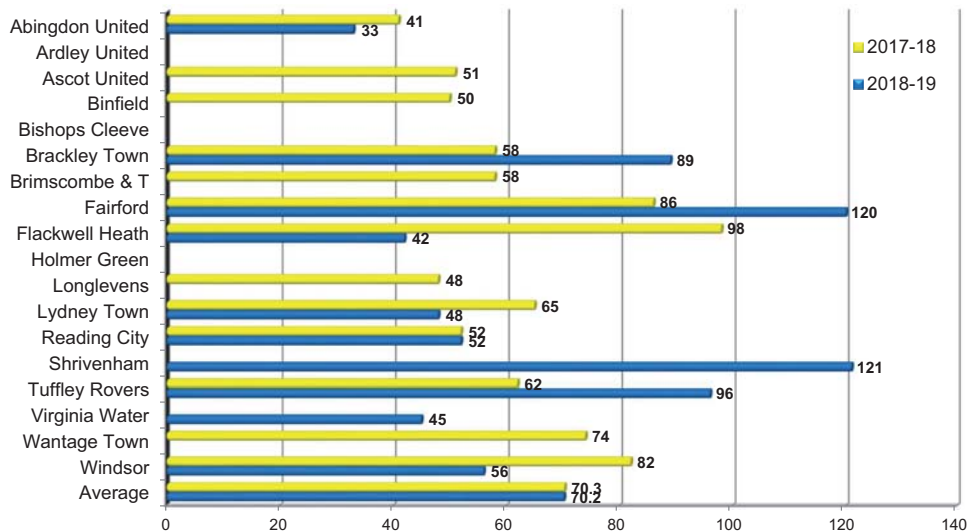
