The arrival of Hashtag United in Step Six this season has potentially heralded the start of a footballing revolution.

The North London club, who are in their inaugural season in Non-League, were founded by Youtube blogger Spencer Owen and boast a social media following which rivals many of the top teams around the globe.

With over 400,000 subscribers on Youtube, more than European giants Tottenham Hotspur, Atletico Madrid and Inter Milan, Hashtag are promoting a unique way of following a football team. The club post regular behind the scenes clips onto social media throughout the week, while each match is documented through a stylish video, featuring highlights, footage from inside the changing rooms and interviews with players and coaches.

When it comes to the footballing side of things, the team have also shown that they are anything but a group of fame hungry prima donnas.

Managed by former East Thurrock boss Jay Devereux, Hashtag have spent much of the season near the top of the Thurlow Nunn Division One South table and are targeting an instant promotion this summer.

There is no doubt that the club divides opinion within the footballing community and in many respects they represent a far cry from the humble traditions of Non-League.

However, ultimately if Hashtag are inspiring people on the other side of the world to wake up in the middle of the night and follow the Thurlow Nunn league, then we believe their presence in the pyramid provides a brilliant exposure for British Non-League football!

Bassett News

Tonight's Game

Good evening and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Ground for this 23rd UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture of the season against Brimscombe & Thrupp. A warm welcome to all the players, management, officials and spectators who have made the journey for this Friday night game. Both teams have agreed to move the game - originally scheduled for Saturday 8th December - forward by a day. If Steve Yeardeley plays tonight it could be a very special day, more on this in a moment.

Brimscombe currently occupy third spot in the table and are hot on the heels of leaders Brackley Town Saints. We are positioned just behind our Gloucestershire opponents, and will be looking to narrow the gap given the three extra games we have played so far. Historically, Bassett have enjoyed a fair amount of success against the Lilywhites, despite never having finished above them in the league. In fourteen league encounters over the past seven seasons, Bassett have won seven compared to Brimscombe's five triumphs with two matches having ended all square. Further details of these games are contained elsewhere in tonight's programme including the full Bassett line up in each fixture.

Games between the teams are typically tight encounters too: in those league meetings, Bassett have scored eighteen times to Brimscombe's seventeen, and the average 2.5 goals per game that the contests have produced is low when compared with Bassett's records against other rivals. Last season's fixtures did serve to increase that average, however, with Brimscombe completing a rather comfortable league double, triumphing 3-0 in Gloucestershire before prevailing 3-1 in the return match in Wiltshire. Bassett will therefore be hoping to avenge those losses and with Bassett games this season averaging over 4 goals a game expect to be entertained with more goals tonight. We are the top scorers in the division but also have the 3rd worst defensive record in the league. Our home record this season is impressive with nine league wins, one draw once and two defeats. We will need to be at our best though considering Brimscombe possess the second-best away record in the league, recording 23 out of a possible 33 points that have been available to them.

Bishops Cleeve - Home

Last time here at the Gerard Buxton Ground we were involved in another entertaining game that saw us share six goals with Bishops Cleeve. Having come back from 2-0 down to lead as the game went into the final minute of the match it was disappointing to drop two points in the end against a very good side. An unfortunate slip when the ball broke after we had been on the attack saw Bishops Cleeve equalise. If you had asked Sam before the game, I am sure he would have said he would be happy with a point but even so it was disappointing to concede so late on once again. Brad Pagliaroli and TJ Bohane continued their recent good goal scoring form with one apiece, but the best goal of the night in front of a sparse crowd that had braved the cold night to catch the game was scored by Rob Lincoln. Crowds have taken a big dip of late and it is hard to explain why given our good home form and the fact that we certainly guarantee goals and entertainment in our games this season, perhaps with tonight being our 16th First Team home game of the season perhaps it is another consequence of this season's fixture scheduling, with just two many home games coming in a short space of time.

Holmer Green - Away

A first ever trip to Holmer Green saw us once again go behind early on, this time in the first minute of the match against another physical side who liked to get the ball forward quickly. Once we had gathered our composure, we got back into the game with a well taken goal from Nick Stanley and then went in front through an even better goal scored by Brad Pagliaroli. Second half saw us dominate proceedings and we could and should have won comfortably. Tony Joyce nearly scored what would have been the team goal of the season after being set up with a neat back flick from Nick Stanley but his shot went just agonisingly past the post. Once again we conceded another late goal, this time in injury time as Charlie came out to punch the ball but was beaten to it by the Holmer Green forward and the ball looped into our net. Another two points dropped at the death against a decent side, particularly on their own ground, but given we were missing so many of our key players at the end of the day this was a good point secured. Talking to the Holmer Green officials at half time did not want to come into the Hellenic, being happy in the Spartan South Midland League, and are very unhappy with the travelling this season. It will be interesting to see if this turns out to be our one and only league encounter against them at Holmer Green as I suspect they will be requesting a return to the Spartan South Midland League come the end of the season.

Steve Yeardley - 500 Games

Steve Yeardley: 500 appearances – views from the dugout

Loyalty is a quality that, unfortunately, seems to be on the decline in football. At all levels of the game nowadays – whether professional or not, exceptionally rare are the players who you associate with just one club. The reasons for that lamentable shift are many, and certainly are not all down to the player. In the professional sphere, the managerial merry-go-round means that a change in the man in charge in the dugout is frequently matched by a clear out and desire of the new boss to bring in their own players. Financial pressures that clubs have increasingly come to face also mean that contract lengths and job security have become ever shorter.

In the non-league game, changes in playing personnel are often more dramatic when a manager moves on (as Royal Wootton Bassett Town know too well from experience over the course of the past decade). While frustrating, it is to an extent understandable that players wish to follow their boss to his new side. But the turmoil it can create can be incredibly difficult to overcome. The rise of 'academy' sides has had an effect too given that such teams are usually separate from existing 'traditional' clubs. The route from youth football through to senior football with the same club is therefore now the exception. More disappointing, however – and increasingly frustrating – are those players whose heads get turned by the offer of a few quid more down the road. That's why when a player make his 500th appearance for a club, it is a milestone that deserves a huge amount of attention.

As the consummate team player he has been since making his debut in a November 2002 Hellenic League Supplementary Cup tie against Clanfield, Steve Yeardley is not the type of individual to want to hog the spotlight. But it's a position that he fully deserves when reaching that landmark. It's beyond doubt that, already, he has featured more than anyone else in a Bassett shirt during the club's history, stretching back to 1882. And over the course of fourteen seasons he has experienced almost everything you can imagine on the field of play from routine league victories and superb triumphs through to narrow defeats and thorough thrashings. Over that time, Bassett have had seasons where they have bravely battled the drop, suffered an agonising relegation, came up painstakingly short in a promotion bid, secured a return to the Hellenic League Premier Division and made history in national cup competitions. Everything bar winning a trophy (so far). Throughout those highs and lows, Yeardley's loyalty has been unwavering, the level of commitment and effort he has been put in to his performances unquestionable. Unsurprisingly, all of the managers and coaches he has played for – seven with Bassett as well as Dave Webb during three seasons with Highworth Town – speak highly of these qualities. In anticipation of Yeardley reaching the 500 mark, the club has taken the time to contact as many of the managers and coaches he has played to obtain their thoughts on his contributions and qualities. And their contributions are below:

Pete Yeardley (manager, 2002-04 - handed his son his first team debut in November 2002)

He moans like his mother, plays football like his sister, but thankfully gets his looks from his father 😊

Due to a nonexistent WBTFC youth section at the time, Dip spent all his formative days playing for Brunel Boys (mostly as a striker!). He made his introduction into senior football at the age of 16 as part of a talented group of youngsters signed on by Mike Byrne and myself during our spell as reserve and first team managers, which commenced in the year 2000. Because of his diminutive stature in those days he invariably often found himself on the bench but the experience gained proved invaluable and helped to develop the character he is today.

He will readily agree that the dominant players at that time – Paul Davis, Stuart Lamont and Mark Vaughan - were a great influence, and in those days not shy to tell him when he made a mistake (you can see that trait in his own game today)!! His great strengths, honed from years on the junior tennis circuit travelling around the UK, were his single-mindedness, determination and self-confidence. As a coach he understands the game, and therefore as a manager he quickly became very valuable, as you could trust him to fulfill numerous roles on the pitch.

Steve Heardley - 500 Games



His dedication and commitment to the club can best be personified by one night in mid-March 2004. Dip at that time was at university in Bath and had been pestering me week in week out for tickets to watch Man Utd in a Champions League match. I managed to obtain four tickets for himself and some mates, so they booked train journeys and a hotel for the match. Then as this league is prone to do, an away fixture was scheduled at the last minute against North Leigh away. Not normally a problem, but for some obscure reason most of our armed forces players were away playing war games (sharpening pencils more like!). This meant with only eleven fit players available, I had to summon Dip back to go on the bench along with Mike Byrne. As I knew he would, Dip forfeited his ticket and travelled back to Bassett by train to travel with the first team to North Leigh as a substitute - I don't think to this day he has ever forgiven me for not bringing him on until very late on ☺

Look though the records and you will always find Dip near the top of the appearance statistics. I know the great personal sacrifices and sometimes the extreme pain he has endured so that he can commit to the club that is close to his heart. That personifies his nature...The club comes first!

Mike Byrne (assistant manager, 2002-04)

Steve came into the side from the reserves during my time as coach with Pete Yeardeley. Immediately he showed his maturity to play at that level and had tremendous enthusiasm. He played in a variety of positions and did himself proud in all of them. He was very reliable and consistent from the start.

I think being a player and coach in another sport (tennis) meant he was very aware of the work we were trying to do and accepted instructions very well. He had leadership skills from the start. Not taking any flak from the rest of the lads, he showed awesome competitiveness and standards which has continued through his Bassett career.

His 500 games is a fantastic achievement in any setting, but particularly in local football where the grass can be greener up the road quite often. Loyalty is a very undervalued trait and I hope the celebration for this magnificent achievement is fitting for the event.

Paul Burke (manager, 2005-08)

Firstly I'd like to congratulate a fantastic player, a club legend and someone I feel proud to call a friend on his 500th appearance for RWBTFC. When Bryan Wood and I took over as the first team management team, it was a very easy choice to make him captain as, even though he was still very young, he was experienced in terms of appearances.

He wanted the club to succeed and although he was a moaner at times, he led by example on the pitch and never asked a teammate to do anything he wasn't prepared to do himself. We had lots of younger players who we thought needed a captain with those qualities.

There were lots of fantastic performances that I remember, but the FA Cup tie against Bracknell Town, when he was the scorer of both our goals in our 2-1 victory, was my best memory in football. There was also his performance when our goalie Jon Haines got injured in the FA Vase at home against Christchurch and he went in goal, making several good saves to take us to a replay.

Those above were special. But who plays a Wiltshire Senior Cup tie at Calne Town that goes to extra time and penalties the day after returning from running the New York Marathon without having dedication, commitment and a love for the club he was playing for. We had many great nights after our games and even the night when the defeat at Trowbridge Town cost us promotion, to see the pain on Steve's face which was so evident showed me that the love he has for the club has always been there.

Well done mate on a record-breaking 500th appearance.

Knowing dip as a mate before managing him, you always knew the type of person he was in terms of enjoying life in general. But when he tried several times to encourage myself and Chris Green to come to Bassett, you knew he was driven for the club to do well and succeed. Always talking about the club, never himself or other players, he just showed that inside he was yellow and blue.

When finally we were able to step in after the previous manager had left, we had to find fourteen new players in a short period. Steve himself was instrumental in helping to rebuild the side, always on the phone or supporting the manager in any way he could. Eventually we had enough players to field a side.

In the first game of the season away against Binfield we got battered though. As much as the frustration was clear on Steve's face, he stuck by the group like any loyal captain would. And as the season went on the team grew and Dip was a huge part of that, leading us to the final 16 league games where we went lost only three games and had a ten-match unbeaten run.

The key word being loyal, he has certainly shown that over the years to all his managers. He even played a large part of my second season in charge with a fracture to his foot. Every game the pain was clear for all to see, and I was asked the question many times "Paul should Dip be playing?" My answer was always the same: you try telling him he can't play!

I think all the managers will agree he can be an awkward player to manage at times, but he is a great person off the pitch. But, again, this is purely down to him wanting the best for the club by giving his all.

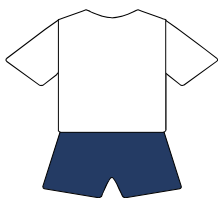
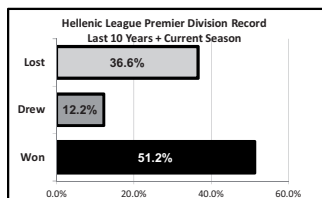
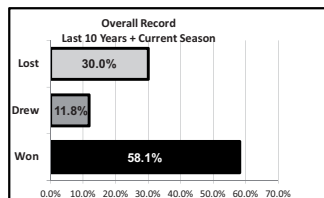

Brimscombe & Thrupp • Club History



Brimscombe A.F.C. was founded in 1886 – the same year as the Gloucestershire Football Association!

The G.F.A. friendlies were played until the competitive league was formed in 1890. In 1902 the Stroud League was founded and Brimscombe were its first winners. Just after the First World War the Northern Senior League appeared. Its first season was 1922 and once again Brimscombe were the very first champions. Football was interrupted during the Second World War (1939–1945) but the game continued at 'The Meadow' where matches between the Army, Navy, Air Force and a team called 'Brimscombe Wanderers' took place.

When the Gloucestershire County League was first formed in 1968/9, Brimscombe – affectionately known as "The Lilywhites", were again founder members, along with other local sides Forest Green Rovers and Stonehouse Town. In 1973/4 The Lilywhites, amid some controversy, found themselves back in the Senior League, just failing by one vote to secure a place in the Hellenic League.

It was at this time the Club experienced a difficult period and in the late 1970's Brimscombe and Thrupp amalgamated to secure both Club's futures. The Club hit a purple patch in the 1980's and won the Senior League Division One and Two and the County Cup all in the space of three seasons, eventually being promoted back to the County League and finishing 4th in 1987. There then followed many years of varying fortunes for the club including relegation to the lower leagues. However, in 2008 there were major changes to the Club Committee and the Football Management which immediately brought a successful period for the club.

In season 2008/9 the First Eleven managed by Phil Baker were Runners-up to Longlevens and were promoted once again into the County League for the third time in its history.

In 2011 Brimscombe & Thrupp F.C. won the Gloucestershire County League for the first time and gained promotion to the Hellenic League under Phil Baker. Since promotion major redevelopments of the ground have taken place including an extension to the clubhouse and the installation of floodlights.

Season 2012/13 saw Brimscombe & Thrupp F.C. win the UHlsport Hellenic League Division 1 West and gain acceptance into the Premier League. More ground improvements were undertaken which included a new 100 standing/100 seating stand and further walkways around the pitch.

Season 2013/14 saw Brimscombe and Thrupp F.C. playing in the highest league in the clubs history, the ground improvements were complete with the new stand finished and other improvements made. The club experienced its first ever F.A. Vase football and were quite successful reaching the first round proper. The season was also made memorable with the First XI winning three cup finals – those being the Stroud & District Charity Cup, the Hellenic League Flying Press Floodlit Cup and the Hellenic League Supplementary Cup.

Season 2014/15 was another historic occasion with the side playing in the F.A. Cup for the first time in its history.

The club continued to go from strength to strength during season 2015/16 and saw the team end in fifth position, its highest league finish in its history. The upgrade of the club continues with works being carried out as required by Step 5 football.

2016/17 was another great season for the club when we appeared in three cup semi finals and saw the club have their best FA cup to date, eventually losing in the third qualifying round at Weymouth.

Season 2017/18 saw Brimscombe and Thrupp win the GFA Trophy for the first time in its history and finish sixth place in the League.

Player Profile

Steve Yeardley – Defence or Midfield



A Bassett stalwart – and without doubt the leading appearance maker in the club's history, Yeardley is in his fourteenth season with the club, split across two spells. He has played in every position on the pitch, including goalkeeper, for Bassett, though is most comfortable in the heart of defence or midfield. Yeardley made his debut with Bassett back in the 2002-03 season as a 17-year-old in a 2-0 Hellenic League Supplementary Cup victory against Clanfield. He would go on to make 23 further appearances that year, only a few of which came from the bench. Establishing himself as a regular at full back, he played 42 times a year later. Yeardley then grabbed his first goal for the club in 2004-05, hitting a dramatic late winner away against Milton United in January before adding three more before the end of the campaign. That season, in which Bassett were relegated from the Hellenic League Premier Division he exceeded the century mark for appearances, playing 46 times in total. New manager Paul Burke appointed Yeardley as captain ahead of the 2005-06 campaign. Featuring largely in defence, he helped pilot Bassett to a fifth-place finish in their first season in Division One West, only narrowly falling short of an immediate return to the Hellenic Premier, while he scored five goals in 36 games along the way. Yeardley would also feature in goal, helping preserve a draw in an eventful FA Vase clash with Christchurch after an injury to John Haines. Yeardley's efforts that season saw him win both Manager's and Players' Player of the Year awards. His goalscoring prowess continued to flourish in 2006-07 when he featured 39 times and finished joint top scorer with Matt Bennett on eleven goals, Yeardley's haul including two in the FA Vase and a pair of penalties in a 3-0 away win at Purton. He also produced a man of the match display in a Wiltshire Senior Cup tie against Calne Town that went to penalties just days after having completed the New York Marathon. In 2007-08 Yeardley was Bassett's leading appearance maker, playing 40 times and scoring six goals. In what was an otherwise underwhelming campaign, Burke's team did enjoy a fantastic run to the FA Cup First Qualifying round that year, and his captain was a significant reason for that, scoring a brace in the shock 2-1 victory against then-Southern League Bracknell Town at Rylands Way. The consistently high level of his performances regularly led to interest from elsewhere. But, despite a change in manager in the summer of 2008, Yeardley continued to resist those overtures in order to remain with Bassett for Dave Turner's first year at the helm. Employed largely in midfield, Yeardley once again had a fine season in front of goal, finishing joint-second top scorer with twelve goals in 39 games. That included another two goals in the FA Vase in wins against Buckingham Athletic and Henley Town.

After again narrowly missing out on promotion with Bassett, who finished fourth, the lure of Hellenic League Premier Division football was too much to turn down and Yeardley moved across to Highworth Town in the summer of 2009. In his first season with the Worthians he quickly established himself as one of the first names on manager Dave Webb's team sheet, featuring 39 times and scoring seven goals. He was again a crucial part of the side that went close to winning the title a year later. Yeardley led the Worthians in appearances with 51 in all competitions – only two of which came from the bench – and grabbed three goals. Though Highworth's title challenge faltered in 2011-12, they would go on to win the Hellenic League Challenge Cup, with Yeardley grabbing a goal in a 6-0 demolition of Binfield in the final. In total that season he appeared 46 times – a number of those spent wearing the captain's armband – and grabbed a pair of goals. With Webb moving onto Swindon Supermarine that summer, Yeardley returned to Rylands Way in 2012 and skippered the side to promotion from Division One West in his first season back. He made the second most appearances out of any player, playing 37 times and scoring eight goals. Half of those strikes came in the first month of the season. Yeardley netted Bassett's first goal of the campaign at Malmesbury before sealing victory against Calne in the FA Cup following a man of the match performance. He grabbed another FA Cup goal in the first qualifying round win against Highworth, netting the equaliser as Bassett advanced further than ever before in the competition. His final goal of the season came on Boxing Day at Purton after just 17 seconds. Yeardley kept the captain's armband in Jeff Roberts' lone season at the helm. Featuring primarily at full back, he failed to improve on the 46 goals he had scored in Bassett colours to that point. In 2014-15, Paul Braithwaite's first year in charge, Yeardley split time almost evenly between centre midfield and full back. He also returned to goalscoring ways to take him beyond the half century mark. That season he netted ten times, including a brace in a doomed comeback attempt against Ascot United and a match winning penalty in the County Cup against Wroughton. That haul came in 40 total appearances. A season later, a foot injury that had been limiting Yeardley since the previous campaign, restricted him to 22 appearances. However, that was more than enough to take him beyond 400 games for Bassett. And he marked that occasion in style, coming on as a substitute against Oxford City Nomads and scoring a trademark penalty in a convincing 3-0 triumph. Overall he struck five times in 2015-16 season. He even made three appearances in goal, donning the gloves twice after sending offs for Curtis Meare and once after the 'keeper suffered an injury. Two years ago, Yeardley relinquished the captain's armband, but continued to play at a high standard. In all, he played 36 times, primarily in defence, and scored seven goals. He bagged the winner in a five goal Wiltshire Senior Cup thriller against Purton, before netting a brace in the final game of the season against Oxford City Nomads to secure a come from behind 3-2 victory. He remained a key part of the team last season, featuring 38 times and adding another seven goals to his total – including a late penalty to secured victory in the FA Vase against Amptihill Town. After twenty games and two more goals so far this year, he now stands on the verge of his 500th appearance for Bassett – a phenomenal achievement. And in that time, he has scored 77 times – an outstanding return for somebody who has spent a large part of his career in defence, while featuring alongside more than 300 different teammates (306 is the best estimate).

How important that save proved to be.

Holmer Green's late forays forward appeared as though they would be for nothing as Workman was twice denied by important blocks when presented with space to shoot.

Those breaks were fortunate for Bassett.

Yet, they switched off in injury time as substitute Luca Perrin delivered a ball into the box from deep on the left, and he picked out an unmarked Munday, who flicked a header over McCready, the Bassett 'keeper having been a half second late in deciding to come off his line.

Our History

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

Late lapse denies Bassett at the death

For the second game in a row, a late goal denied Royal Wootton Bassett Town all three points as they drew 2-2 away against Holmer Green.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town conceded in the first and ninetieth minutes as lapses in concentration at those two points in the game meant they were held to a 2-2 draw away against Holmer Green.

Both goals for the hosts came from long balls over the top beating the Bassett defence, meaning it was another case of cheaply conceded goals resulting in Sam Collier's team dropping points.

And, after impressive strikes from Nick Stanley and Brad Pagliaroli in the final minutes of the opening period, Bassett appeared in control for most of the second half. But they were unable to capitalise on a number of good chances to seal what would have been only their second away win of the season.

A point is certainly no bad outcome, particularly from a match against a Holmer Green side who have been strong when on home turf. Yet, you still get the nagging feeling that, given the position they were in with just moments remaining, that in the long run this will be seen as a case of two points lost.

Saying that, however, Bassett appeared as though they were going to be in for a long afternoon when they went behind after less than sixty seconds.

James Britnell flicked on 'keeper Aaron Brown's long clearance out from the back and, with Carl Evans having hesitated as to whether to challenge for the ball or stick with his man, Lewis Workman found himself alone in behind the visitors' back line and lifted a cool effort over the onrushing Charlie McCready.

It was a disappointing goal to let in and did not make things any easier for Bassett who looked nervous in the opening exchanges.

Their hosts' direct style was causing them problems and could have resulted in their advantage being extended. After getting between McCready and Dan Cole, Workman hooked another attempted lob narrowly off target, while the burly Britnell headed just over from a whipped in Workman cross.

A Holmer Green counter attack then saw winger Jonathan Cox skip past McCready before his cutback was headed inches wide of the left post by an unmarked Workman.

Eventually though, Bassett established a foothold in the game and were certainly the better team for the final quarter of an hour of the first half.

Frontmen Stanley and Pagliaroli asked questions of the Holmer Green defence in different ways. And, after initially misfiring when presented with chances to shoot at goal, they both found the net.

Six minutes before the interval, Tony Joyce played a perfectly weighted ball in behind the Holmer Green defence, which Stanley, having beat the offside trap, raced onto, and he lifted a deft lob over Aaron Brown and into the net.

Then, a minute before half time, Pagliaroli blasted Bassett in front. Taking an inside pass from the equally impressive Rob Lincoln, he twisted and turned his way past three defenders on the edge of the box, and thundered a unstoppable drive into the near top corner from what remained a difficult angle.

Goals have been a given when Royal Wootton Bassett Town have taken the field so far this season, with an average of over four per game being scored in their league contests so far. It's just impossible to determine at which end they will come though. And that was the case again as Sam Collier's team shared six goals with Bishop's Cleeve in an eventful 3-3 draw.

The net bulged when the teams met earlier this season, but on that balmy August evening the Cheltenham-based Mitres overwhelmed Bassett to record a lop-sided 5-1 victory. It appeared as though they were on course for another comfortable triumph on this frigid November night too as they raced into a 2-0 advantage after less than half an hour.

But, sparked by a TJ Bohane penalty seven minutes before half time, Bassett turned the contest on its head after the restart and found themselves ahead with ten minutes to go courtesy of an excellent Rob Lincoln finish. However, with just a minute to go Elliot Kennedy scored what proved to be the final goal of the game to seal a point for the visitors.

The result was arguably a fair outcome on another breathless, entertaining night of football. 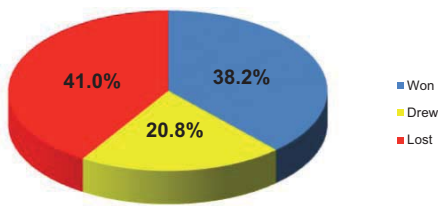

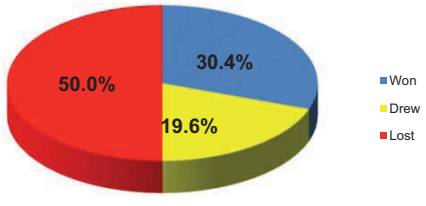

Royal Wootton Bassett Town boss Sam Collier said his side must keep concentrating for 90 minutes after a late goal cost his team all three points in the Hellenic League Premier Division on Saturday.

Bassett led 2-1 at Holmer Green after goals from Nick Stanley and Brad Pagliaroli had cancelled out a first-minute opener for the home side, but a mistake from young keeper Charlie McCready allowed the hosts to rescue a 2-2 draw.

Despite the late error, Collier was full of praise for his goalkeeper, but warned his side they must keep concentrating until the final whistle if they are to close out games successfully.

"He's a 17-year-old lad that, for 89 minutes, was superb. He didn't put a foot wrong. He kicked well, came for crosses, but that kind of thing can happen when you've got young lads in your side," said Collier.

"There have been moments in other games where he's kept us in it, but unfortunately, when you make a mistake in goal, there is nowhere to hide.

"He'll bounce back, as we all will. We've had four games without a defeat now, so I'm relatively happy but disappointed we haven't got the three points.

"We've conceded two last-minute goals in the last two games. That's four points dropped.

"A one-goal lead is extremely dangerous and you can end up hanging on. Holmer didn't look like scoring but it was always going to be a mistake that would cost us."

Collier was left frustrated at the fact his side travelled to Buckinghamshire without 11 members of his first-team squad, something he felt may have cost his team their cutting edge.

"Other than the first five minutes, we defended exactly how we wanted to," said Collier.

"We did have chances and we need to be more clinical. We've scored the most goals in the league, but we could have scored even more.

"Small mistakes are costing us at the moment, but we were the favourites to go down and we're fourth after 22 games.

"If someone had offered me fourth after 22 games at the start of the year, I'd have taken that."

Elsewhere in the Premier Division, Shrivenham roared to a 4-1 win at home to bottom side Longlevens.

Antonio Gerrish struck twice and Tom Ballard and Josh Parsons were also on target.

Fairford Town went down to a 1-0 loss at Lydney Town.

In Division One West, New College claimed a first league win of the season at the 12th time of asking with a 3-1 success at home to fellow strugglers Tytherington Rocks.

Sam Parker scored twice as Malmesbury Victoria claimed a brilliant 4-1 victory at home to leaders Cheltenham Saracens.

Shane Bumphrey and Jamie Packer got the other goals.

It remains that way tonight as they lodged their sixth home draw of the season courtesy of a goal from Ross Lye, his first of the season in a 1-1 draw. Melksham Town Reserves' Jamal Chevolleau took his total for the season to twelve in netting the goal for the visitors. The draw left Melksham in fourth place, two points adrift of Shrewton but with a game in hand. The point for Corsham lifted them one place in the table to seventh spot.

Shock of the day took place at Cricklade Leisure Centre as the young Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development side inflicted a second consecutive defeat on Cricklade Town. Midweek action in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League Premier Division saw Melksham Town Res consolidate in fourth place with a comfortable 6-1 home win over Devizes Town Res to open up a six-point gap on fifth place Cricklade Town. With last season's twin strike force of Callum Demkiv and Rhys Talmarsh both making moves to Western League clubs this season, Melksham Town Reserves have replaced them with another talented striker in Jamal Chevolleau. In Wednesday night's encounter with Devizes Town he fired a hat-trick to take his season's tally to eleven goals and was ably supported up front by the experienced Gary Higdon, a player who has scored over 250 goals for Melksham's First Team and helped himself to a brace against Devizes. A Dylan Hatt goal completed the scoring for Melksham.

Saturday's action saw the big game of the day taking place at Cricklade Leisure Centre where second placed Kintbury Rangers were the visitors. Prior to Saturday Cricklade were one of the two sides Kintbury had not defeated in their time in the Wiltshire Senior League, the other being Wroughton. Both sides went into the game in good form, Cricklade having lost just once in their previous eleven outings and Kintbury just once in eight games. The list of sides who Kintbury have not defeated in the division now just contains one name as they ran out 4-3 winners on a difficult heavy pitch due to recent rain. Goals from Shaun Thorp, Jake Rowe and Charlie Allsop gave Kintbury a 3-1 half time lead. Shaun Thorp added his second of the game to make it four and take his total for the season to 23, but with Kintbury having two players sent off Cricklade were allowed back in the game and scored two further goals to give the score line a much closer look to it that the balance of play on the day would have indicated. The three Cricklade goals were scored by Tom McCulloch with two and Billy Sly. The win ensured that Kintbury kept within three points of the leaders Wroughton with two games in hand.

League leaders Wroughton made the short journey to Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development in confident mood having scored twenty goals in their previous three games, whilst Bassett had lost five of their last six but did win their last home game and had secured a memorable double over Wroughton in the league last season. Missing top strikers Shane Hibbert and Aaron Maximen Wroughton struggled to get their noses in front in the first half as Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development defended well to keep out the leaders in the first forty-five minutes. It was a different story after the break however as once Wroughton got themselves in front the floodgates opened, and they hit five unanswered goals to remain top of the league, three points clear of Kintbury. The goals were shared around the team with one each for Riegan Cook, Tyler Wilkinson, Liam Griffin, Jordan Lea and Kyle Parker.

After hitting 26 goals in October, going into their game with Marlborough Town, third placed Shrewton United had yet to win a game in normal time this month but they put that right with a comfortable 5-1 home win over visitors Marlborough Town to keep in touch with the top two. Tyren Harrington led the way with a hat-trick, taking his total for the season into double figures, Jesse Walters and Ben Jenks with the other Shrewton goals. The consolation goal for a Marlborough side, who had one of their off days after last week's excellent win at Westbury, was Aaron Presley with his seventh of the season.

As we approach the half way mark of the season, two sides who have been going well in the first half and sit in the upper half of the table, Trowbridge Town and Corsham Town Reserves, met at Woodmarsh. Going into the game Trowbridge had won three of their previous four games, whilst Corsham had lost just three of their opening 13 league games, all the defeats having come on the road. Corsham were unable to repeat their good home form on their travels as Trowbridge ran out comfortable 4-1 winners to make it nine points from three league games in November and lift them into fifth place in the table. Two goals for Joshua Hard, taking him to 12 for the season, plus one each for Jake Sainsbury and Alex Pippard did the damage for Trowbridge.

The last two meetings between Westbury United Reserves and Ludgershall had seen Westbury score fifteen times without reply but it was a different story in the latest meeting between the two sides as Ludgershall avenged those two heavy defeats with a 3-1 win. Top scorer David Cotter scored twice, Keifer Roper with the other Ludgershall goal. In the two league fixtures between Football ID and Purton last season it was the away side that won both times. That sequence of results continued as Purton left Chippenham with all three points following a 2-1 win. In a tight contest two goals from Jack Duckers won the game for Purton, Alex Hallett with the Football ID goal. Finally in the Premier Division, the big battle at the wrong end of the table, saw the two Development sides of Pewsey Vale and Malmesbury Victoria meet at Pewsey. Malmesbury came into the game in good form with two wins in last four matches whilst Pewsey were without a win in five and it was the in-form Malmesbury side who were smiling Saturday night as they secured their third win of the season to move off the bottom of the table for the first time this campaign. Two goals for Elliott Drage and one apiece for Harrison Archer and Daryl Herring in Malmesbury's 4-0 win.

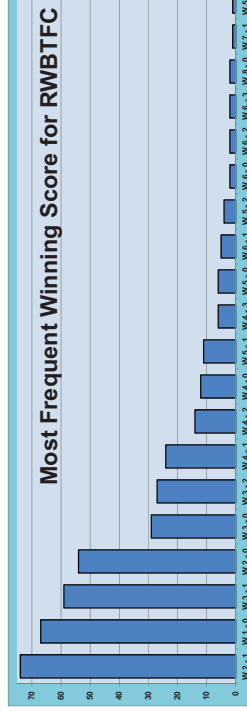

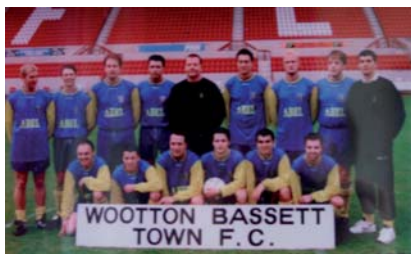

Diary of Wiltshire League Division One Title Winning Season - Wootton Bassett Town 1987-88

Saturday 2nd January 1988

Headline: Lively encounter goes to extra time

The extremely wet and windy conditions on Saturday did nothing to dampen this lively encounter in the quarter final of the Wilts Senior cup. although the pitch was very wet the competition was fierce and thoroughly enjoyed by the large crowd. Supermarine opened the game in lively mood but as Bassett settled to the task they gradually began to take control. Bassett's back four, including new-boy Jon Haines, were playing solidly and snuffed out Supermarine's attacks before danger threatened, releasing the ball to midfield and front men. Bassett should have taken the lead after 20 minutes. Harrison skipped past his man wide on the right and took the ball to the by-line before firing it low and hard into the goalmouth. When it looked easier to score than miss, Hanrahan somehow contrived to miss the ball and Spackman in the Supermarine goal smothered it. Seven minutes later Bassett's appeals for a penalty were turned down after Harrison looked to have been bundled off the ball. Supermarine's best chance of the half came when Rees had to dive smartly to his left to turn away a fierce drive.

The second half opened with Supermarine taking the game to Bassett. Whilst maintaining the pressure and limiting Bassett to the odd breakaway, they failed to create any clear-cut chances, and it was Bassett who opened the scoring in the 60th minute. M.John mad a fine run from right fullback and delivered a good cross which was met by York, who gave Spackman no chance. However, this did not stop the Supermarine pressure and five minutes later they equalised when the ball was finally forced home after McKay had cleared off the line and Rees had pulled off a fine point blank save. Following the equaliser Bassett increased their work rate and started t take the game to Supermarine again. Hanrahan and York both missed good opportunities before frost blew a golden chance to win the game when four yards out, he side footed straight into the arms of Spackman. Supermarine also created further chances and Rees had to be alert when twice smothering the ball with onrushing forwards closing in. And so the game went into extra time but though both sides pushed on relentlessly few clear cut chances were created, the best falling to Supermarine when Fisher's snapshot was turned over the bar by Rees. All in all, a draw was probably a fair result although Bassett had the clearest chances to win it. The replay at Supermarine next week is eagerly awaited. If the teams are still level after that penalties will be needed to decide who will face Bromham in the semi-final.

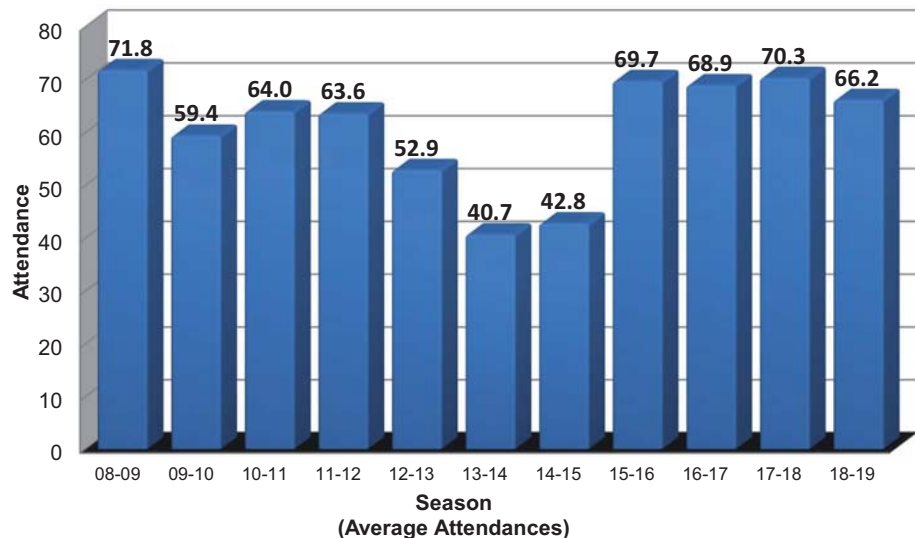

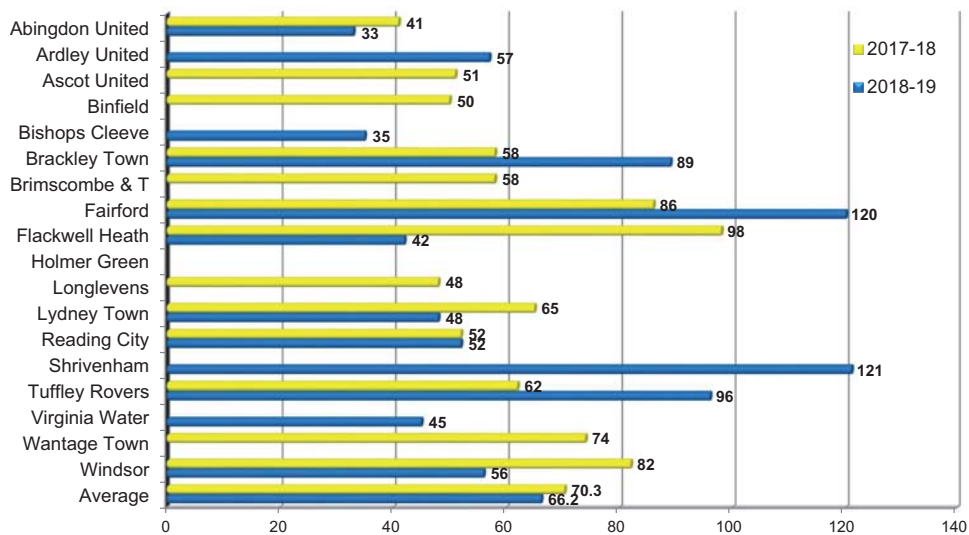
