## Today's Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League fixture against Windsor in the second leg of the battle of the Royalists. A warm welcome to the players, management and supporters from Windsor who have made the journey down the M4 for today's game. A big thank you also to Windsor for the excellent hospitality you gave us a fortnight ago for the first leg of this encounter between two sides with royal connections. Hopefully we will be able to reciprocate that hospitality here today.

When I was told we would be playing Windsor again today, so soon after the first encounter, I thought there must have been some cup at stake but sadly no. I then thought about writing to Prince William as President of the FA to see if he would donate one and we could name it the Royalists Cup for the game between the town his grandmother bestowed with the Royal name and her home town, but in the end thought it was probably not appropriate. More on the scheduling of this game in a moment.

If this game is anything like the first encounter between the two sides fourteen days ago you spectators are in for a treat. Leading 3-0, somehow given we had been under the cosh for large periods of the first half, Windsor then came back at us to score four times to take all three points in a tremendous second half performance. Those four goals included two stunning strikes, in particular the winning goal, all of which can be seen on Windsor's excellent website for anyone who didn't make the trip for the first leg.

Windsor have made a good start to the season and currently sit in 5<sup>th</sup> place in the table with ten points from their opening five games. The only league defeat came in their opening game when they lost 3-1 away at Brimscombe & Thrupp, never an easy place to go. They then knocked our noisy Southern League neighbours Highworth out of the FA Cup and have been unbeaten in the league since that opening day defeat beating Shrivenham (twice), ourselves in that tremendous first encounter and drawing with tenants Virginia Water last Monday in the Bank Holiday game. They have lost one more game this season, going out of the FA Cup at the hands of Southern League Cirencester Town. As we saw in that first game they are a talented side with lots of pace and still have the prospect of the return from injury of the former professional Barry Hayles to bolster their title chasing effort. Our Fulham fanatical supporting former Chairman Paul Harrison will hopefully be with us today on the chance that one of his all-time Fulham heroes will be here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground.

The scheduling of the game today has left a lot to be desired and caused a lot of frustration at the club. It means we will have played two teams twice in our first seven games. If we hadn't drawn our FA Cup game, it would have been three teams twice in our first eight games. With the Bishop's Cleeve match now moved back to November the statistics now show it will be six teams twice in our first 20 games. I understand we have expressed our frustration with this scheduling to the league and hopefully account will be taken of our constructive comments.

## Lydney Town and Shrivenham

The first game in the FA Cup Preliminary Round was I understand a cagey affair with fellow UHlsport Hellenic League side Lydney Town, with the defences generally on top. With so much at stake in terms of the prize money, which is massive to both clubs, it is perhaps not surprising that both sides didn't take too many risks going forward. Whilst I understand we didn't create the usual number of chances Sam must have taken some consolation from the clean sheet having shipped so many goals in recent games. We are still in the competition and will look to do our very best win the replay where the reward is a trip to Lymington Town of the Wessex League in the First Qualifying Round. As well as the prize money a win in the replay means a day out at the seaside for everyone!

Everybody left Saturday thinking that replay would be on the Tuesday just gone. That was the date agreed with Lydney Town and also with the FA at Wembley. When the original draws for the first two rounds came out at the beginning of July they contained a footnote which stated, "any replay involving a Club that is involved in a fixture scheduled on Bank Holiday Monday should be played in week

commencing Monday 3 September, unless it is mutually agreed between both Clubs to play on an earlier date". The two clubs did mutually agree to an earlier date and confirmed this with the FA, and the date was still shown as being the replay date on the FA website on the Sunday following the first game and in the fixtures in the Non-League Paper published that day. Shrivvenham had been advised that our scheduled league game on Bank Holiday Monday would be postponed in accordance with FA rules and Lydney had told Tuffley Rovers the same. With two registered goalkeepers away on the Bank Holiday, given the understanding that we were playing Tuesday instead of Monday, our third and final registered keeper changed his shift at work to be able to play in the FA Cup game on the Tuesday. Then around Sunday lunchtime we were advised that the Hellenic League were insisting that the two games on the Monday had to take place even if we to play the cup replay on the Tuesday. Faced with either playing two big games in two days or putting out the Development Side against Shrivvenham we had no choice but to agree with Lydney and the FA to move the cup replay back a week. The knock-on effect was that we were then left without a keeper for our local derby game on the Monday against Shrivvenham with Alex Bowers understandably unable to change his work shift again. Hence the reason why those attending witnessed manager Sam Collier donning the gloves. We lost the game 1-0 to a hotly disputed penalty (watch Your Sport Swindon and see if you think it is a penalty) having had two of our own denied. Whilst no blame can be laid at Sam's door in terms of his goalkeeping performance as he had a good game (although Hoppo needs to work on his kicking) it is very unsatisfactory at Step 5 level to have to have your manager, an outfield player, go in goal. It is irrelevant now as to whether the replay date was agreed between the clubs and the FA before the Hellenic League confirmed the Bank Holiday fixtures We will hopefully have learnt a lesson to make sure we also involve the Hellenic League when agreeing replay dates in outside competitions. Apologies to any spectators who missed the Shrivvenham game as a result of all this confusion. We received quite a few queries on social media as to what was going on, as did Lydney, which we responded to but I guess there may be some we didn't get the message to.

## Ladies Team

Our Ladies side, who finished runners-up last season have now completed their pre-season preparation and will open their season in a week's time in the FA Cup. A season preview prepared by the enthusiastic management team from the Ladies side is included in the programme today along with their fixtures which were published during the week. Please note that there are also now updated Pen Pics of the Ladies side along similar lines to our First Team now on the Club's website.

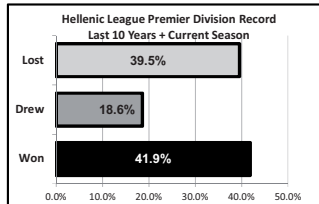
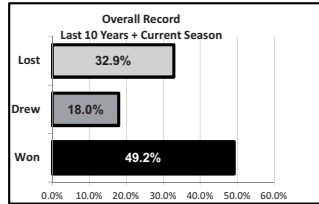

## Ladies aim high ahead of new campaign

Having finished as South West Women's League Eastern Division and Wiltshire County Cup runners-up last time out, there's little margin of error for Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies if they are to match or better their 2017-18 campaign.

For Jonny House and James Goddard, who this season replace Becky Gammon in charge of the team, the bar has certainly been set high. But Bassett's new joint-managers do not lack confidence, setting promotion as the primary aim for their team this season. The pair have certainly hit the ground running since their appointment too and have overseen a successful pre-season campaign.

The majority of last year's squad have been retained, and it also has been strengthened. Experience has been added in the form of 'keeper Abi Footner from league rivals FC Chippenham and forward Zoe Shellard, who arrives from Melksham Town. Meanwhile, the side has received an infusion of youth, most notably in the form of forward Lauren Kayll, who has been prolific in friendly action. Bassett's series of warm-up matches have tested the squad, pitting them against higher level opposition on a couple of occasions. After defeating former league rivals St Nicholas Reserves 9-0, Bassett travelled to Southern Women's League Premier Division outfit Winchester City Flyers and gave a good account of themselves in a 3-1 loss. They then followed that with an impressive 3-2 triumph against Forest Green Rovers, who ply their trade a league above Bassett in the South West Women's League Premier Division. Pre-season was then completed with a 7-0 victory against the Development team of Cardiff Met (whose senior side qualified for the UEFA Women's Champions League). Commenting prior to that final fixture, House and Goddard were effusive about their squad's efforts.

"We have made some great additions and they have all gelled very nicely with the quality players that are re-signing with the club for this season," House said. "Each member of the squad has applied themselves very well and there is competition for places throughout."

Goddard noted: "The quality and level of attitude from the players so far has been outstanding. The intensity levels we have demanded have been surpassed by all the ladies, including the new signings that have been made. We would both like to thank all the players for how well they have adapted to our new ideas." Pre-season has also sharpened the duo's belief that the team can improve on their debut season in the South West Women's League. The division will now feature eleven sides, with six, including Bassett, based in Wiltshire. And the number of local derbies is set to add an extra edge to what should be another exciting campaign. But the management team are bullish about their chances. "The season will be long and testing," House admitted. "But hopefully we will have reason to celebrate once we play our final game." Goddard added: "We are hoping for another season of success for the club and your support, as always, would be much appreciated!"

The start to Bassett's league campaign will be delayed by cup commitments. They will visit either Warsash Wasps or Bournemouth Sports in the SSE Women's FA Cup first qualifying round on Sunday 9th September before hosting Salisbury in the opening round of the Wiltshire County Cup a week later. The Ladies are then due to host newly promoted Laverstock and Ford in the league, though that game will need to be re-arranged should Bassett advance in the Women's FA Cup.





# From the Sunday Team

## Sunday side set for Division One challenge

After romping to the Swindon Sunday League Division Two title in their inaugural season, Royal Wootton Bassett Town's Sunday team are set to enjoy the challenge of Division One football in 2018-19. The team, managed by Danny Groom and featuring numerous players who have played for the club's youth and senior sections previously, lost just once in the league last season while drawing just two games, and finished with an incredible goal difference of +120. To add to their league crown, they also claimed the Swindon Sunday League Division Two Sportsmanship Prize, proving that they won by playing the game the right way.

# Our Visitors This Season

The big news in the summer was the departure from and then reappearance in the Windsor dugout of experienced manager Mick Woodham. The news was broken by the **Windsor Ascot & Eton Express** which provides great coverage of both UHlsport Hellenic League sides Windsor and Ascot.

On 9<sup>th</sup> July under the headline "Woodham no longer prepared to stand for 'mid-table mediocrity' at Windsor FC" the article from Daniel Darlington ran as follows:

*Mick Woodham has stood down as Windsor boss claiming he is unwilling to accept another season of mid-table mediocrity. Woodham, who has been at the club since September 2012- when he took over from previous boss Kevin Scott – doesn't feel enough is being done to give him a playing budget that would allow him to compete for promotion. He was hoping to build on last season's run to the quarter finals of the FA Vase by pushing for promotion from the Hellenic Premier Division this season but doesn't feel they'll be in a position to do that any time soon. ... "To commit to another 40 weeks season of mid-table mediocrity is not what I'm there for," said Woodham. "I desperately want the club to move on and it's a wide-open league this year. There's a real opportunity to push on and get promotion but its apparent that isn't going to happen."*

In the same article Chairman Kevin Stott admitted Woodham's decision to stand down had taken him by surprise and had responded,

*"I don't know where this 'lack of ambition claim' comes from," he said. "I can criticise myself for lots of things, but I've always believed we can achieve things. I don't see where the obstacles are. I thought we were pretty much on the same page. We'd been working on a strategy for the new season, one which would maximise our chances of success."*

Nine days later the same paper and journalist ran an article under the headline "Woodham makes surprise return as manager of Windsor". Woodham had changed his mind after further talks with chairman Stott and admitted that he could have handled the situation better but lessons had been learned. In the article Woodham noted that *"I wear my heart on my sleeve"* and that *"I allowed my emotions to spill over"*.

In a subsequent article for the Windsor Ascot & Eton Express chairman Stott clarified the reasons behind Woodham's return to the club. In the article Stott noted that

*"I received a message from Micky while I was on holiday last week offering his sincere apologies for the comments he had made in the local press and the way he had handled his resignation. On reflection he felt he had made a big mistake in resigning and wanted to meet on my return to discuss whether it would be possible to find a way to be reinstated as manager. As a group we agreed it would be in the best interests of the club if Micky were to be reinstated."*

Sometimes when things like this happen the response from the manager and players can result in a positive uptick in results and judging by the start Windsor have made in the league this season that appears to be the case here. With just one defeat in their opening 5 league games Windsor have made a solid start to the new season and look as if they will be one of the sides challenging at the top end of the table.

# Visitors - Tourist Information

## Introduction to the Town

Windsor is a historic market town in the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead in Berkshire. It is widely known as the site of Windsor Castle (pictured below), one of the official residences of the British Royal Family. The name Windsor originates from old English Windles-ore or winch by the riverside.



## Interesting Facts

Windsor Castle is the oldest and largest inhabited castle in the world and has been the family home of British kings and queens for almost 1,000 years.

The Great Fire at Windsor started on 20 November 1992. The fire damaged or destroyed 20% of the Castle area. The castle was fully repaired within the next few years at a cost of £36.5 million, or less than half Paul Pogba's transfer fee, and the massive cost has probably been repaid a few times over from tourism unlike the Pogba transfer fee.

Windsor's home ground at Stag Meadow, was granted to the original football club by King George V in 1911.

Earlier this year the homeless of Windsor were cleared away for the Royal Wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle. People sleeping rough near Windsor Castle had their sleeping bags removed ahead of the wedding. They were told that their belongings, including books, magazines and bedding, would be kept in storage until the following Monday, as part of added security measures. The police said that the rough sleepers involved voluntarily handed over their belongings, in a scheme organised by the Windsor Homeless Project.

## Famous Residents

Windsor obviously has the most famous resident of them all with the Queen of England living in Windsor Castle.

As well as the Queen and her hubby Phillip, other famous residents of Windsor over the years have included the comedian Billy Connolly, actor Michael Caine, comedian Freddie Starr and pop singer Natalie Imbruglia. Chelsea and England footballer Peter Osgood was born and resided for many years in Windsor. Football commentator Barry Davies lives in nearby Datchet and has been president of the Windsor football club.

## Nearest railway station

The nearest station to the ground is either Windsor & Eton Central or Windsor & Eton Riverside – the ground is a 30 minutes walk from both or a short taxi ride (local taxi company: Windsor Cars – 01753 677677).

## Nearest Pubs to Ground

The nearest pubs to the ground are the Duke of York or The Prince Albert but the club itself has a very pleasant bar area stocking a good selection of beers. The best pub in town is claimed to be the Windsor & Eton Brewery Pub 'The George Inn'.

## Things to Do in Windsor

In Windsor the obvious places to go and visit would be the Castle or Windsor Racecourse.

Near the town is Legoland Windsor, the only Legoland park in the United Kingdom and the largest Legoland park in the world in terms of area. Legoland Windsor was built on the site of the former Windsor Safari Park.



Another place to visit, and a favourite Monday cycle ride destination of the programme editor, is the Runnymede Pleasure Grounds which has a nice café right next to the River Thames and its scenic tow path. Various boat trips operate on the River Thames, with connections to Maidenhead and Staines-upon-Thames.

# Player Profile

## Bradley Pagliaroli (forward)



Pagliaroli is an exciting attacking player who joins Bassett this season from Letcombe.

Possessing good pace, a sublime touch and skill and capable of finishing with either foot, he has established himself over the past couple of seasons as a threatening forward in the Hellenic League.

He is more than capable of playing through the middle, though is arguably most dangerous when cutting in from out wide on the right onto his favoured left foot. And he has done that to superb effect so far during his time with Bassett, leading the scoring charts early in the season while producing some stunning goals.

Pagliaroli scored a brace on his debut against Tuffley before conjuring, seemingly out of nothing, what proved to be an outstanding winning goal from outside the area in the Emirates FA Cup victory against Leighton Town. That was followed by another pair away against Windsor, both finished in confident fashion, before firing another strike from outside the box in the 3-3 draw away at Fairford Town.

Previously, Pagliaroli featured for Wantage Town in 2014-15, splitting time between their Southern League and Hellenic League Division One West sides. He then made his Hellenic League Premier Division debut with Thatcham Town a season later, scoring four times in seventeen appearances, twelve of which came from the bench. After a brief return spell in the Southern League with Wantage, Pagliaroli joined Binfield in 2016-17, where he spent the best part of a season and a half.

Thirteen games in 2016-17 yielded three goals before he really made a name for himself last season. Beginning the campaign with the Moles, the forward scored eleven times in 32 appearances before moving to Letcombe, where he netted twice in three games.

Pagliaroli has also featured for Kintbury Rangers in the North Berks League, scoring six times in seven games for them in 2016-17.

# Our History

## Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

## Profligate Bassett pay the penalty in derby defeat

Royal Wootton Bassett Town had more than enough chances to get at least something out of their Bank Holiday derby encounter against Shrivvenham. But the woodwork, fine glovework from former 'keeper Dan Lawrence, stubborn defending and a lack of sharpness in attack conspired to condemn Sam Collier's men to a 1-0 defeat. The closely fought contest with Gareth Davies' previously winless side was ultimately decided by a controversial penalty, confidently put away by Josh Morse, with twenty minutes remaining. Bassett can feel hard done by for the decision to award the spot kick was a harsh one, Harrison Gough being penalised for a handball after Jamie Pricor's powerful shot struck the defender at point blank range. That followed two penalty appeals in the first half for the home side which weren't given. However, laying the blame for the loss on the match officials would be to distract from Bassett's failings in front of goal on a frustrating afternoon. The opening period was an even affair, with neither side able to get on top for any lengthy spell. The visitors though did look the more fluid of the two teams, their tactics being to catch Bassett on the break and try and utilise the pace of forward Lewis Waldon and right winger Dan Drewett. And it was a counter that brought their opening opportunity after eight minutes, but Drewett struck a curling shot from the edge of the area that was comfortable for a diving Collier, who was playing in goal given Kurtis Sharkey and Alex Bowers were both unavailable. At the other end, Brad Pagliaroli forced Lawrence to parry away at his near post before a Dale Richards delivery dropped perfectly for TJ Bohane, but his powerful drive from twelve yards was blocked, with Bassett insisting it had come off a hand. The remainder of the period produced only half chances, Morse and Lewis Waldon seeing low strikes deflected wide, while Bohane glanced a header from a Pagliaroli corner over the bar. In the final stages of the half, Bassett should really have been awarded a penalty too as an attempted cross from Josh Shama was clearly handled by Matt Horsell with his hands above his head. Yet neither referee Oliver Cross nor his assistant Gordon Varley spotted the infringement.

While the game continued to be evenly matched following the restart, Bassett were the side carving out the lion's share of the opportunities. Yet they were unable to capitalise. On 53 minutes, Rob Lincoln was set free in the left channel after good build up play from Bohane and Pagliaroli, but rather than shoot from what admittedly would have been a tight angle after bearing down on goal, he sought to play a square pass to a teammate that lacked the required precision. Two minutes later, Danny Lachacz steered in a free kick from the left wing, which Bohane rose highest to meet with a back-post header. However, Lawrence did brilliantly to get down low at his near post and parry away. A fizzing effort from Pagliaroli then whistled past the post, before Bohane curled narrowly over. His shot was deemed to have taken a deflection, and the corner that followed was only half-cleared. Dan Cole recycled a cross into the box, which Lawrence failed to claim. And the ball dropped invitingly for Shama, whose snap shot from twelve yards crashed off the bar. Those misses ultimately proved costly. Shrivvenham continued to have success when catching their hosts with too many men committed forward. And it didn't help Bassett that one ball over the top frequently left centre halves Gough and Steve Yeardeley exposed. One such pass should arguably have resulted in the dismissal of the latter as he dragged Pricor down just outside the box when chasing the forward as the last man. Fortunately, only a yellow card was produced and the free kick that followed was spun harmlessly over the bar by Ryan Stanners. After Bohane had narrowly missed the target at the other end, another dangerous counter was ended in a foul by Gough on Pricor that earned the Bassett youngster a booking. The resulting free kick, taken by Sam Ockwell, then bounced around the box. The ball fell to the feet of Pricor who shot at goal. But, standing a couple of feet away, it struck Gough, with Cross deeming the defender to have handled when in reality he could have done little to get his arm out of the way. Bassett's protests proved in vain, and Morse kept his composure to send Collier the wrong way. The home side appeared unnerved by the goal, and had their manager to thank that Morse didn't add a second two minutes later as Collier tipped over a rising shot from twenty yards. The belated introduction of Gio Wrona and replacement of Lincoln by debutant Cameron Lagan helped inject new life though and soon Bassett were laying siege to the Shrivvenham goal. Bohane's drive from the edge of the area was initially spilled by Lawrence before being hacked clear. Moments later, Lagan saw his snap shot blocked, with the rebound falling for Wrona, whose first time daisy-cutter from 25 yards flew inches wide. Then, with nine minutes remaining, Lagan dragged wide from a promising position following a Bohane cutback. That should have been Bassett's final chance, but the hosts had a let off when Drewett shot straight at Collier when in acres of space. Unable to kill off the game, Shrivvenham were immediately forced onto the back foot. With stoppage time looming, Pagliaroli set to Lagan on the edge, who found an angle to shoot. And he had Lawrence beaten, only to see the post come to the 'keeper's rescue. A clever through ball from Pagliaroli then played in Lagan, but the forward opted to shoot from an angle rather than square inside, and Lawrence was able to guide the ball around the post. Their goal had lived something of a charmed life, but ultimately Shrivvenham were able to hang on for their first win of the season – and their first league victory over Bassett. For Collier and his men, lacking the clinical edge in front of goal that they have frequently shown in the embryonic stages of this campaign - it was a case of what could have been.

**Man of the Match: Danny Lachacz** – the midfielder justified his immediate return to the starting line-up after a three-game absence with another solid performance.

## Cagey cup tie ends in stalemate

A tense 0-0 draw between Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Lydney Town ensured the teams will have to go again in the Emirates FA Cup.

Chances were few and far between as Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Lydney Town played out a 0-0 draw in a tense Emirates FA Cup preliminary round tie. Lydney arguably had the better opportunities, but the visitors' two best chances culminated in a pair of brave defensive blocks from Steve Yeardley and Tony Joyce. As a result, neither Kurtis Sharkey in the Bassett nor his opposite number Richard Thomas were really called into action, meaning a replay is now necessary. Given the teams' scoring records in the early stages of their respective Hellenic League Premier Division campaigns, a goalless draw was arguably something of a surprise. But they largely cancelled each other out.

There was little subtle nor intricate about Lydney's direct style of play. But, given the presence of imposing centre forwards Ross Gabriel and Declan Morley-Lyne and the equally powerful centre half Sam Elliott, who was sent up at almost every set piece opportunity, it meant they were playing to their strengths. And they certainly provided the Bassett defence a test. However, anchored by a mature display from youngster Harrison Gough, they were pretty much able to nullify any threat Lydney posed. At the other end, Bassett lacked some of the sharpness offered by the injured Matt Bennett, while Sam Collier's team, frustratingly, resorted more to knocking long balls forward, a tactic that made life easier for the visitors. But credit should still be given to Lydney's obdurate defence, who silenced Bassett's front trio of TJ Bohane, Brad Pagliaroli and Josh Shama.

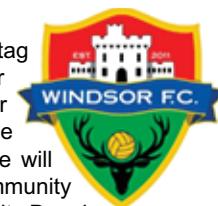
The best two openings of the first half fell to Morley-Lyne. On twenty minutes, the visitors were presented with a free kick right on the edge of the area following a needless push from Steve Yeardley on Gabriel. Well within the the set-piece specialist's range, Morley-Lyne went for power over placement and leathered a powerful drive narrowly over. Five minutes later, a well-worked move on the edge of the box saw Liam Sheppard clip a through into the path of the unmarked forward, but his shot from twelve yards was met with an outstanding block from Yeardley. Bassett's best chance to open the deadlock followed shortly after that let-off. Controlling Dale Richards' cross-field ball, Pagliaroli was able to beat left back Danny Morgan to the byline, from where he played a low delivery across the face of goal. Kai Robinson was at the far post to cut back into the danger area, where a lurking Gio Wrona was just beaten to the punch. Robinson was then involved at the opposite end of the pitch as his clumsy shove on Matt Board as the midfielder was going away from goal appeared to have taken place just inside the box. Much to his relief, referee Graham Pearce gave only a free kick, which fortunately came to nothing. As half time neared, half chances fell their way to Robinson, who swept a low tight angle shot into the hands of Thomas, and Lydney's Gabriel, who could only direct a snap header over after Morley-Lyne had redirected an Elliott free kick across goal.

All in all during the opening period, neither side had demonstrated that extra quality required to gain separation. And that was even more evident in the second half. Defensively, Bassett were more robust, making sure that to limit the number of set piece opportunities for the visitors. Going forward, they only mustered a single chance. That fell to Pagliaroli on the hour, but his low effort from twenty yards was met with a comfortable diving save by Thomas. For Lydney, ex-Bassett man Lewis Thompson rushed a shot and skewed wide after he had latched onto a ball in behind from Sheppard. A long-range strike from Board was then deflected wide. Indeed, their most telling opening came with the final kick of the game. Countering after a Bassett free kick came to nothing, the visitors found themselves two-on-one. Broad proceeded to steer a pass to an unmarked Sam Wines, who dwelled a second too long on the ball, as the evergreen Joyce was able to through his body in the way of the firmly struck shot and deflect wide.

**Man of the Match: Harrison Gough** – the youngster had a tough assignment dealing with Lydney's powerful, physical front two, but produced an outstanding, assured display at centre back.

# Our Visitors History

## Windsor FC • Club History



Summer 2011 and it's rather ironic that 100 years of senior football at Stag Meadow should be celebrated by the birth of a brand new club, Windsor FC, which came to be following the sad demise after 118 years of Windsor & Eton FC. During the final death throes of the previous club it became apparent, following several well attended supporters' meetings, that the will was there to continue to host a senior football club in Windsor for the community to embrace and, therefore, on February 4th 2011 WFC Football Community Development Ltd was registered with Companies House with the aim of achieving that objective. Founding Director Kevin Stott and a newly-appointed management committee then set about the long and sometimes arduous task of turning that dream into a reality.

Our founding season turned out to be a very exciting one, eventually finishing as runners-up to worthy Champions Guildford City in the league and we also made it to the semi-finals of the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy so it was close but no silverware to show for it, although that is not entirely true as Ryan O'Toole won the Golden Boot as top scorer in the Premier Division and Hayden Wheelers' efforts in editing our programme led to it being voted best programme in the Premier Division.

Several weeks into season 2012/2013 a major decision to operate without a budget was taken to free up funds for the regeneration plans at the ground and the management team and all but three of the playing squad left immediately. Mick Woodham was appointed as our new manager and had two days to get together a squad before our next league game. Despite some heavy defeats early in his tenure as he built a squad of local youngsters the club never lost faith and Mick eventually put together a squad that was to finish a very creditable 6th in the league as well as another appearance in the semi-finals of the county Senior Trophy competition whilst our Under 18's side made it all the way to the CCL's Grant McLellan Youth Cup Final eventually losing to a very strong Camberley Town side.

Recognition from the league away from football itself was achieved with a Groundsman of the Year award for the CCL and this was added to in August 2013 when our groundsman Lewis Clements won the FA Groundsman of the Year Award for the whole of Step 5 and 6 football nationally, something both he and the club are justifiably proud of whilst also giving some extra publicity to the CCL.

This building process continued in 2013/14, and it was in this season that Mick Woodham guided us to our first ever trophy. A resounding 3-0 victory over Reading Town in the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy Final. The success was repeated the following season when Woodham's young guns defeated a talented Flackwell Heath side 3-2 in the final at Burnham FC's Gore ground.

The football club experimented with a Senior Reserve side for one season before committing to a long-term link up with the Cox Green Academy and the re-focusing on an Under 18 team. The aim to offer a clear path to all youngsters to the Senior First team.

Over the past two seasons this approach has paid huge dividends. In 2017/18 Windsor FC made it through seven rounds of the FA Vase before losing to eventual runners-up Stockton Town in the Quarter Finals.

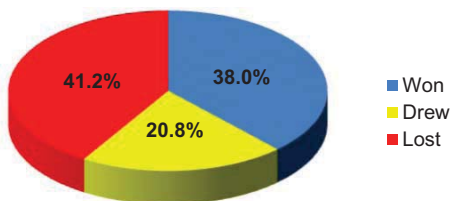

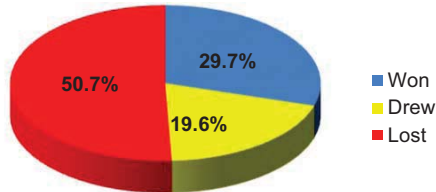

## Give Youth A Chance in Management

Since Jamie Vardy completed his fairy tale journey from Non-League obscurity to being a world famous Premier League winner, more media coverage than ever seems to have been dedicated to emphasising how the lower leagues can unearth hidden gems. This is something that should certainly be celebrated and is testament to the unique footballing culture that we have in this country.

Nevertheless, more significance should be placed on the potential role that Non-League clubs can play in nurturing the next generation of young British managers. In an era where Premier League and Football League clubs appear to be increasingly turning towards foreign coaches, the role the Non-League pyramid can play in providing a learning curve for young British managers has become more important than ever. For this to happen, however, more Non-League clubs must make the brave decision to appoint young, unproven coaches. This is understandably a difficult decision for a club chairman to make but the potential rewards can be great.

One example of a club who have taken such a gamble is Essex Senior League side Leyton Athletic. The Walthamstow based club, who were formally known as Wadham Lodge, gave 24-year-old Jason Ngandu his big break by appointing the former East Thurrock player as their new first-team manager midway through last season following the departure of former boss Marc Farrell. Ngandu, whose playing career was cruelly ended by injury, has grasped his opportunity in the dugout with both hands. After successfully steering the Wad Army away from relegation danger during the last campaign, Ngandu has built a young, hungry squad who are looking to make a real statement of intent in the Essex Senior League this season.

Ngandu featured in a NLP article which focussed on his side's FA Cup victory over Barkingside a couple of weeks ago. What became immediately apparent was his enthusiasm for management and coaching in general. With each game that passes, the young coach will learn first-hand about the rigours of football management, which will stand him in great stead for the future. This is all thanks to the brave decision making of the hierarchy at Leyton Athletic and it would be fantastic to see more and more Non-League clubs following their example.

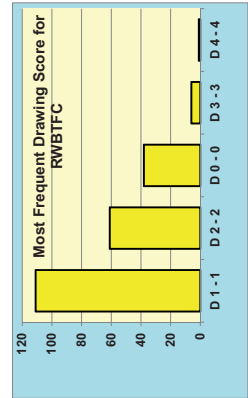
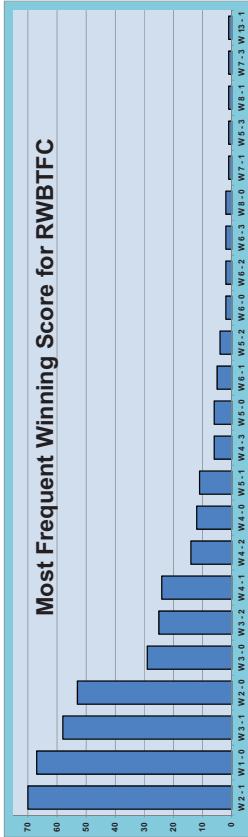

Saturday saw Chippenham Town achieve the result of the season so far when they defeated the previously unbeaten big spending league leaders Billericay Town 2-0 at Hardenhuish. At Step 4, Highworth Town's promising start to the Division One South season came to an abrupt halt as they were soundly beaten 3-0 at home by Cirencester Town. 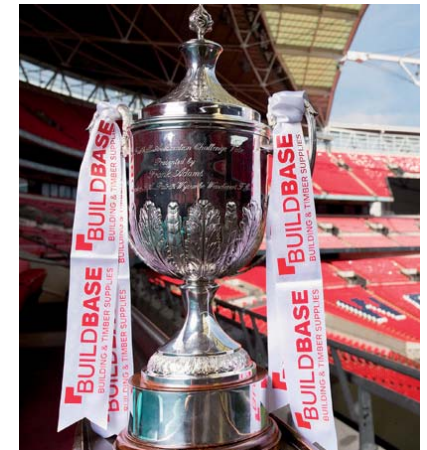

## Diary of Wiltshire League Division One Title Winning Season - Wootton Bassett Town 1987-88

### Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> September 1987 Wootton Bassett Town 2 Old Manor 1

### Headline: Extra time needed to settle Ghia Cup match

Extra time was needed on Saturday to settle a fine Ghia senior cup match between Wootton Bassett and Old Manor, Bassett making it through to the next round by virtue of a Bowden penalty. True to the old saying it was a game of two halves, the first belonging to Bassett and the second to Old Manor. The home supporters must have been pleased to see their side start so positively and take the lead in the 20<sup>th</sup> minute. Hanrahan hustled his way through and passed to an unmarked Frost whose shot from the edge of the box went in off the post.

Bassett remained in control and should have added to the lead, Vines twice heading wide from good opportunities. However, Old Manor held strong and in the last five minutes of the half gave a taste of what was to come. Harrison clearing twice off the line, and Rees denying Rushton with a marvellous reflex save.

The second half was the reverse of the first, Bassett now being under pressure for large periods. Rees continued to pull off some fine saves, and Ian Johns defended well, but all to no avail the equaliser coming 10 minutes from the end when Scott was allowed time and space to head home. The first period of extra time saw Bassett regain the upper hand and also the lead. After a period of sustained pressure Bassett were awarded a penalty, a sharp-eyed linesman spotting York getting kicked in an off the ball incident. York also had an opportunity to make it certain in the second period but his lob over the keeper was just too high.

### Headline: Well deserved win

Pewsey's visitors on Saturday were Wootton Bassett and both teams are unbeaten in the league. From the start play was even with both keepers in action and after 16 minutes two Pewsey players going for the ball gave it away to a Bassett player, who played it out to the right for Nathan Walker to beat Dave Lewis with a fine shot. Pewsey attacked and gained a corner. Keith Flippance crossed the ball over to Dougie Hodson only to see his shot cleared off the line. Three more corners were taken but Pewsey could not get the ball in the net. Bassett's midfield started winning the ball more and had Pewsey defending from this. David Lewis palmed the ball down to the feet of Nathan Walker who crossed the ball for Bassett's centre forward Frost to score making it 2-0 at half time.

Pewsey started the last half well and had shots from Offer and Garrett saved with Offer shooting wide with just the keeper to beat. The rest of the game was even, with both teams unable to find the net and finishing with Wootton Bassett taking the two points in a well-deserved win.

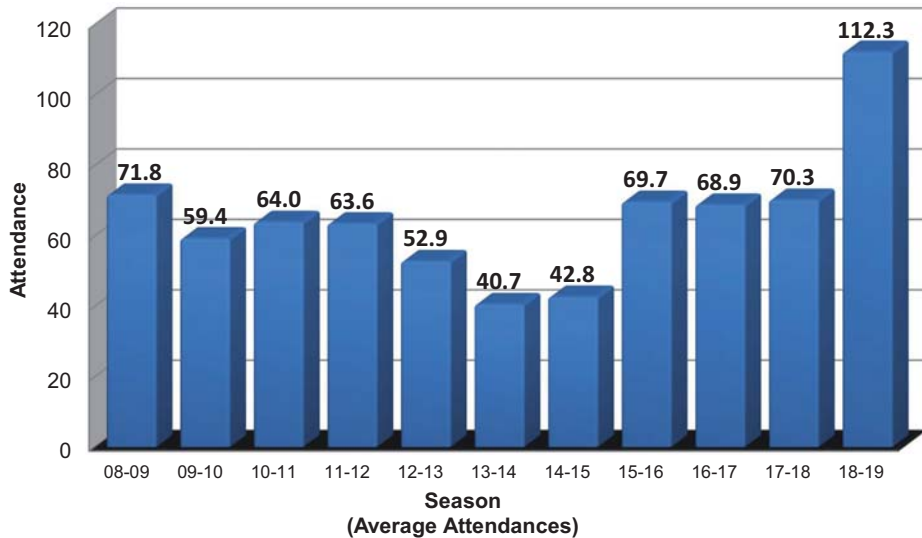

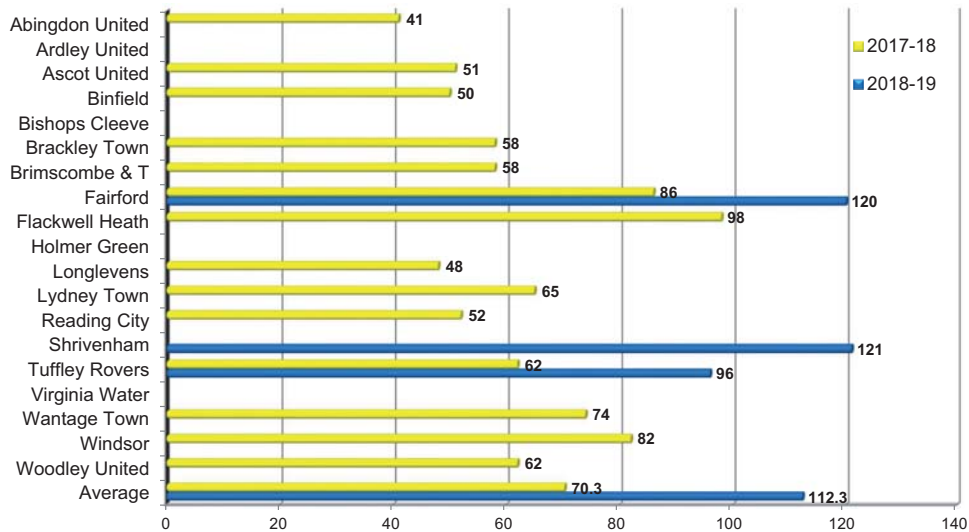

## RWBTFC Attendances - Season 2018-19 (and comparison to 2017-18)



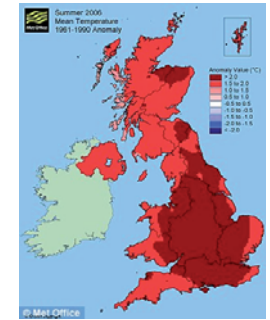
