Youth Section Round-up

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's Under 18 Blue and Yellow sides met in a North Wilts League Division One clash last Sunday, with the Bassett derby having added spice given both sides entered the game unbeaten. And it would be the Blues who came out on top, triumphing 3-0 in what was designated as an away game for them. Liam Bint, Bailey Gallagher and Harrison Gough found the net to secure their victory. Three other Bassett youth teams were victorious this weekend. The Under 14 Blues bounced back from their first defeat of the campaign last weekend by defeating Malmesbury Youth Warriors 4-1. Charlie Hudson led the way with a brace, while Roan Castle and Joseph Rouse netted their first goals of the season. Recording their second win in a row were the Under 16 Blues, who saw off Highworth Town Juniors T 7-1, while the Under 15 Yellows thrashed Malmesbury Youth Falcons 11-0. 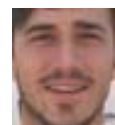
Sam Bridges Defence

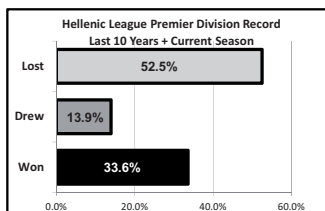
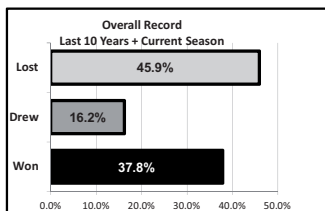

Our Visitors This Season

Brackley Town Saints have enjoyed a tremendous start to the 2018-19 Season and currently sit top of the table after their opening twelve league games. Nine have been won, one drawn and just two defeats. Those opening twelve fixtures have seen them play four of the sides promoted last season, one of whom, Holmer Green, they have played twice. One of those two defeats came at the hands of Holmer Green, the other defeat coming away at Binfield.

Brackley's start to the season was delayed a couple of days when Lydney Town failed to reach St James Park when their mini-bus broke down on the opening day of the season. The following Tuesday they finally got their season underway with a winning start when they defeated Holmer Green 3-1 on their own ground thanks to goals from James Hammond, Ryan Knight and Alex Stott.

Next up the Extra Preliminary Round of the FA Cup where a solitary goal from Alex Stott saw them defeat London Colney from the Spartan South Midland League. A long midweek trip to Windsor to play Virginia Water followed and goals from Alex Stott and Ryan Knight ensured their great start to the season continued.

A five-goal game at home against Longlevens saw Brackley edge it by the odd goal to maintain their 100% record, Harry Brock, Chris Jordan and an own goal doing the damage for the home side. The first defeat of the season came in a quick return match against Holmer Green, who gained revenge for the earlier home defat by scoring the only goal of the game at Brackley.

Two tight games with Hadley in the Preliminary Round of the FA Cup as the sides drew 0-0 in the first encounter requiring a replay to settle matters. It was again tight in the re-match but a solitary goal for Hadley sent Brackley tumbling out of the FA Cup for another season.

Back in league action they quickly put the two defeats behind them as they firstly defeated Tuffley Rovers, Ryan Knight and Charlie Killie scoring the two goals in the 2-1 win. This was followed by probably their best result of the season, a 3-2 away win at Brimscombe & Thrupp, never an easy place to visit. Two more goals for Ryan Knight in this one, Dean March with the other goal.

They could not take that great form into their next game when a visit to Binfield, another tough away game for teams in this division, saw them go down 3-1 to Roger Herridge's side, Lewis Baldwin with the consolation goal.

Another defeat followed as they crashed out of the FA Vase going down 1-0 at home against Crawly Green, another side from the Spartan South Midland League. They did manage to progress in their next cup fixture in the Hertfordshire County Cup, winning 3-1 at home against Wellingborough Town thanks to goals from Lewis Baldwin, James Hammond and Owen James.

Next up was the first fixture against us where a second half equaliser from James Watts ensured a share of the points after Mark James had given us a 1-0 half time lead. Next up was the First Round of the Bluefin Challenge Cup and at the end of ninety minutes the two sides could not be separated after sharing six goals, Oliver Goddard, Charlie Killie and James Watts with the Brackley goals. The only side to score in extra time were Bishops Cleeve to send Brackley into the Supplementary Cup where they may end up playing ourselves following our defeat to Tuffley.

The last four league fixtures coming into today's game have all been won. Goals from James Hammond, Alex Stott and James Watts gave Brackley a 3-0 home win over neighbours Ardley United. Alex Stott was again amongst the goals in a trip to Flackwell Heath, bagging a brace in a 3-1 win, Ryan Knight coming off the substitute bench to net in injury time.

A long midweek trip to the outskirts of Swindon to meet Shrivenham proved a fruitful trip as two goals from Charlie Killie secured all three points. The winning run continued last Saturday as two goals from Ryan Knight and one a piece for James Hammond and Charlie Killie gave Brackley a 4-1 home success over a much improved Tuffley Rovers side.

Ryan Knight leads the Brackley scoring chart with eight goals so far this season.

Introduction to Brackley

Brackley is a town in Northamptonshire, England, 22 miles (35 km) from Oxford and 20 miles (32 km) from Northampton. Historically a market town based on the wool and lace trade, it was built on the intersecting trade routes between London, Birmingham and the Midlands and Cambridge and Oxford.

Interesting Facts About Brackley

Brackley is home to the Mercedes AMG Petronas Formula 1 Team.

The Brackley Morris Men are one of only seven 'traditional Cotswold' sides remaining in England, and the only one to survive in Northamptonshire.

In 2013–14 Brackley Town FC reached the FA Cup Second Round having beaten League One side Gillingham 1–0 in a First Round replay following a 1–1 draw.

Famous Residents

The late actor Robert Addie, who came to prominence playing the role of Sir Guy of Gisbourne in the 1980's TV drama series Robin of Sherwood, is an alumnus of Magdalen College School in Brackley.

Cricketer Eddie Davis, who made over 100 first class appearances for Northamptonshire between 1947 and 1956 was born in Brackley.

British racing driver Anthony Davidson who is currently part of the Toyota Hybrid racing team in the FIA World Endurance Championship, and who has raced in Formula 1, lives in Brackley.

Nearest Railway Station

The nearest railway station is Kings Sutton, about 6 miles (10 km) west of the town. Brackley had two railway stations of its own that were closed in the 1960s.

Nearest Pubs to Ground

The nearest pubs to the ground is the Plough which is on the High Street and seems to have a good food menu.



Things to Do in Brackley

There are quite a lot of interesting activities that take place in and around Brackley. Having personally experienced driving a Russian tank on a team away day in Hungary a few years back the one activity that would probably be the top of my list would be a trip to "Tanks A Lot". Apparently, this is a 100-acre venue with over 100 tanks and military vehicles and your chance to drive rather than look. Private car crushes are also available any time! The Full Monty driving day on last Saturday of most months. It is situated in Helmdon, just over 3.5 miles from Brackley.

In Brackley itself, hidden in the cellars under the town's Waitrose store is Brackley Antique Cellar. In here is 200 dealers, selling every type of antique and collectable. The cellar has appeared many times on BBC Bargain Hunt, and Antique Road Trip. There are over 100 cabinets selling watches, rings, china, Military, coins and stamps. The place also has a cafe selling fresh rolls, cakes, tea and coffee.

Anyone who fancies a game of football with a bit of a twist before the main match then a trip to Hinton-in-the Hedges Airfield would be in order for a game of Zorb football. Reckon that this would make an interesting training session for the lads.

The place the chairman is most likely to go is Silverstone, six miles up the road, and to the Porsche Experience Centre. Located next to Hangar Straight, the centre is on the site of the WRC Rally of Great Britain Special Stage used in the late 1990s. The specially designed track incorporates six elements; Handling Circuit, The Straights, Kick Plate, Ice Hill, Low Friction and Off-Road circuits. This environment enables visitors to be guided through a variety of different situations in wet and dry conditions, as well as simulating ice and snow driving with the use of specially constructed surfaces. The driving experiences are designed to focus on a particular type of driving, model of Porsche or driving environment. Whether you are hoping to attain new skills, polish up some old ones or just have a great time driving, the centre can help find the right experience for you.

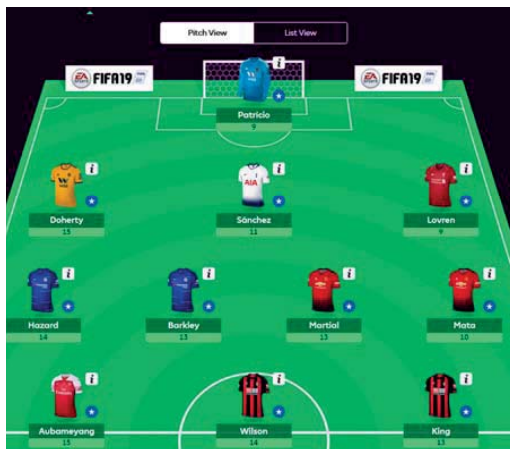

Charlie McCready - Goalkeeper



McCready is a talented young goalkeeper who is currently dual-signed with National League South side Hungerford Town. An excellent shotstopper with good distribution and communication skills, he is expected to earn significant first team experience while with Bassett.

The 'keeper made his Bassett debut in a 2-1 home win against Windsor, pulling off a string of fine second half saves in the face of a second half onslaught from the visitors to preserve victory.

McCready has since made the number one jersey his own and has been hugely impressive, most notably in a man of the match performance away against Wantage Town when, despite conceding three times, he saved a penalty and dealt well with a number of other efforts to keep his team – reduced to nine men – in the game.

He followed that up with another great display in a 3-1 home win against Reading City, being denied his first clean sheet only by virtue of a late penalty.

McCready has also made a pair of appearances for Hungerford in the Emirates FA Cup this season, and was crucial in securing his team's passage through when they faced Wantage in the second qualifying round. In the re-arranged initial tie, he was between the sticks as the Crusaders drew 1-1. Then, in the replay at Wantage, he pulled off a crucial save in the penalty shootout to ensure Hungerford advanced.

The 'keeper spent last season with Letcombe in Hellenic League Division One West. Their joint-leading appearance maker, he played thirty times, keeping six clean sheet, and picked up their Players' Player of the Year award. McCready helped Letcombe secure a seventh place finish – their best placing since the 2009-10 campaign.

Our History

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

Sensing a let off, Reading sought to exert pressure on Bassett. But, with the home side disciplined and sticking to their shape, they continued to lack the necessary end product.

Half chances for Harry Grant and Charlie Allen both ended up off target. Reading finally registered another shot on target shortly after the hour when Gerrard tried again from range, but McCready was able to parry away another powerful attempt.

Bassett continued to create opportunities too, though Bohane and Bennett both snatched at shots from advantageous positions and failed to trouble Cavanagh.

With twenty minutes remaining, Reading finally used the wind to their advantage and breached the Bassett defence as Jack Powell set Parker loose, but the forward, attempting to lift his strike over an advancing McCready, sent his effort the wrong side of the post.

Parker, recently called up for an English non-league representative team to play in the Falkland Islands, was proving most troublesome for the visitors, but was having a frustrating day, steering over from a free kick while curling over after demonstrating quick feet to fashion space on the edge of the box.

Then, with two minutes of normal time remaining, Bassett ensured any goal the visitors did muster would be a mere consolation. It was a fantastic move that brought the goal too, beginning with McCready rolling the ball out to right back Cole. Working down the right wing, play was worked to Iggy Ilott who slipped through Lincoln. An excellent turn from the winger got him clear of his man and it appeared as though he would get the goal his performance merited. However Cavanagh kept out his low drive, but could not do enough to prevent Pagliaroli slotting home the rebound.

Despite the outcome of the game now being beyond doubt, Reading – to their credit – continued to try and push forward. They appeared on course to fail to get on the scoresheet though as McCready pulled off a pair of fantastic saves to tip a curling Powell effort and another Parker free kick that was destined for the top corner around the post.

However, they were eventually able to grab a consolation as Allen earned a soft penalty and Parker sent McCready the wrong way.

But it was far too little, far too late, with Bassett having wrapped up a fully deserved and impressive win.

Man of the Match: Dale Richards – aside from the booking he picked up late in the second half, Richards did not put a foot wrong all afternoon at left back. Sound defensively and adroit in possession, he stood out most among a whole team of players whose performances merited at least seven out of ten.

Clinical Bassett cut down City

Royal Wootton Bassett Town got back to winning ways with an impressive 3-1 home victory against Reading City.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town 3 Reading City 1

A clinical attacking performance and robust defensive display secured an impressive 3-1 victory for Royal Wootton Bassett Town against much-fancied Reading City.

Powered by outstanding first half goals from Brad Pagliaroli and Matt Bennett, Bassett snuffed out the attacking threat their visitors posed despite playing against a stiff wind in the second period. Pagliaroli then secured the points with his second before Mitch Parker grabbed a late consolation for Reading from the spot.

That goal conceded was the only blot on Bassett's copybook on a day when Sam Collier's team put in a shift from front to back. No player shirked their responsibilities and not one can be described as having had a disappointing game.

After the frustration of last week's defeat at Wantage Town, Bassett knew they had another stern test on their hands given Reading's strong start to the season and the firepower they possessed.

That was on show early on too as Parker curled a free kick from the left edge of the area onto the post in only the fifth minute of a game, whose start was delayed courtesy of the opposition being caught up in heavy traffic.

Bassett eventually made the decisive first breakthrough in what had developed into a midfield battle on the half hour mark. After TJ Bohane had flicked on a Dan Cole throw, the visiting defence failed to clear and the ball dropped perfectly for Pagliaroli, who fired a perfectly executed half volley into the top right hand corner.

The response from Reading was almost immediate as a give-and-go with John Dennis on the edge of the area opened up space in the box for Ben Cook. He drew Charlie McCready off his line and was able to steer a cute shot around the 'keeper, but Dan Cole was perfectly placed to head clear off the line. Left back Rob Gerrard then placed a firmly struck shot from distance narrowly over.

But while Reading were misfiring narrowly, Bassett were in a groove offensively and doubled their advantage four minutes before the break. Pagliaroli played a perfectly weighted pass in behind the visitors' defence and, showing great desire, Matt Bennett shrugged off centre half Alfie Grant to be the first to the ball and arrowed a precise first time left-footed strike into the bottom corner.

It could well have been three prior to half time too, but, rather than squaring for either Bennett or Rob Lincoln who were both in space, Pagliaroli dragged a shot from a tight angle across goal after Steve Yeardeley had initiated a counter attack.

Still, it was a superb position to be in at the break. However, playing against the wind in the second half, there was going to be plenty of hard work to do in order to guarantee the points.

Bassett's job could well have been made easier three minutes after the restart though. Winning another header, this time to flick on a Dale Richards free kick, Bohane teed up an unmarked Mark James at the far post. But his first shot was repelled by Ed Cavanagh in the Reading goal, before Bennett's follow up and another James attempt at goal were brilliantly blocked on the line by Matt Hancock.

Our Visitors History

Brackley Town • Club History



Brackley Town FC was formed in 1890 and were initially a prominent side in the area, but fell away, with most of the period before World War II being spent in the Oxfordshire Senior Football League, before a switch to the North Bucks and District League in the post war years. In 1968 they took a step down the ladder by joining the Banbury & District League. In 1974 they moved back to the North Bucks League and also moved to their current St James Park ground in Churchill Way. A small clubhouse and changing rooms were built and by 1977 the club had stepped up to the Hellenic League.

They stayed in Division One until 1983 when they switched to the United Counties League, where they won the Division One title at the first attempt. Although they were Premier Division runners-up in 1988–89 their time in the division was generally spent near the foot of the table, with three consecutive last-place finishes between 1992 and 1994. In 1994 the club moved back to the Hellenic League. After a mediocre first season, Phil Lines took over as manager and led them to the Premier Division title in 1997 and with it promotion to the Southern League. However, they only managed two seasons at that level during which, with finances at full stretch, the club was forced into liquidation in February 1999 with debts of over £100,000. The club was saved from extinction but demoted back into the Hellenic League.

Despite a speedy turnover of managers they consistently finished in the Hellenic League's top 10 and were promoted back to the Southern League after winning the title in 2004. Phil Lines returned in February 2006 and guided the club to a third place finish, culminating in defeat in the last few minutes of the play-off final for promotion to the Southern League Premier Division. In 2006–07, Brackley finished top of the Southern League Division One Midlands. In the 2007–08 season, they competed in the Southern League Premier Division. Manager Phil Lines, however, became director of football, and Roger Ashby became the new manager for the new season. Ashby was soon sacked by the club replaced by former player David Oldfield in a player/manager role. Oldfield departed Brackley Town at the end of the season to join Peterborough United, after which Phil Lines came back as manager. During the 2006–07 season, Brackley reached the fourth qualifying round of the FA Cup (the round immediately prior to the first round proper), up until then their best achievement in that competition, but were knocked out at that stage by Havant & Waterlooville. Two seasons later Brackley surpassed this by beating Hampton & Richmond Borough in the fourth qualifying round to reach the first round proper for the first time. They went on to lose 2–1 to Eastwood Town at Coronation Park. Phil Lines handed in his resignation in April 2009 after a run of bad results ended Town's chances of a play-off place. Midfielder Jon Brady was given the caretaker's job while the job was advertised. Eventually, Brady was appointed as permanent manager for the 2009–10 season. The club finished in 5th place, their highest ever finish in the non league pyramid, but lost in the play-off semi-final to Nuneaton Town.

The 2011–12 season saw Brackley reach the Football Conference after winning the Southern League Premier Division title by 8 points. Brackley went top of the table after 20 games and never relinquished their top position for the remainder of the season. On top of the league title the club retained the Northamptonshire Hillier Senior Cup, beating Conference North club Corby Town in the final at Nene Park. They completed a treble by also claiming the Maunsell Cup for the first time in their history after they defeated Northampton Town 1–0 in a game played during pre-season. The club retained the Maunsell Cup in July 2012, beating a youthful Peterborough United side 3–0 at St James Park. The club has also added the Southern League Champions Cup to their trophy cabinet in 2012–13 season, beating Clevedon Town 2–1.

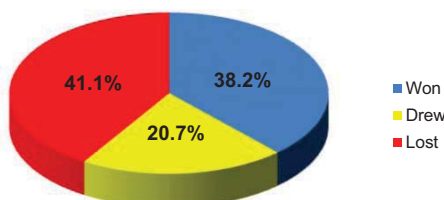

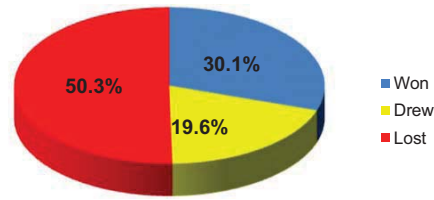

Three Lions

There have been three notable wins for England over the past week, with cause for celebration for Gareth Southgate's senior side and Under-21 boss Aidy Boothroyd, while not forgetting the work of Paul Fairclough is raising the nationwide profile of the England C team.

For England C it was a performance that belied the three days' preparation the team had for their test against Estonia Under-23s, with Alfie Pavey's conversion from the penalty spot guiding the Three Lions to a 1-0 victory at Brisbane Road.

It was a match that saw the visitors fail to register a shot on target and England C uphold the strictest level of discipline, picking up no yellow or red cards.

The NLP's reporter rated each player at seven or higher, reserving special praise for AFC Fylde's James Hardy, but there was one disappointment from the evening which stood out.

Just 635 fans attended the match which was well promoted by host club Leyton Orient, who had on-form centre-back Marvin Ekpiteta play the full 90 minutes on his home patch.

Fairclough won't be fazed by that factor, after months of scouting across the country culminated in a win and a clean sheet.

"We pick players who have technical ability and we want them to go and express themselves," Fairclough told The NLP. "I'm extremely happy with the performance considering the short time we get with them.

"They were very quiet around the dinner table when they arrived because there was 12 new caps, but by last night they were chatting away with each other and really bonding.

"It was a good team performance, playing the game, in the main, how I want them to play and more importantly the way they want to play.

"There are certain restrictions at club level and I fully understand that, I've been there and know what it's like having to play for three points. Here we can afford to give them a bit of poetic license where they can go and express themselves and I like to think they did that."

For the England senior side, a 3-2 win owed much to a courageous first-half performance that shunned Spain away from their prowess moving the ball.

It was Spain's first defeat at home in 15 years as they failed to claw back a 3-0 deficit in the second-half despite a goal from Paco Alcacer spicing things up with 30 minutes to play.

There are few lessons more pertinent in football than when a team with 26 per cent possession downs comes out the victor, and yet England played very attractive football for the match and made their small margin of possession count – just watch the build-up that allowed Raheem Sterling to end his Three Lions goal-drought.

While the Under-21 side secured their place at next summer's European Championship with a 2-0 win over the Old Enemy Scotland, under the coaching of Boothroyd. Goals from Reiss Nelson and Kieron Dowell earning the victory over the Scots and booking England's shot at silverware in Italy in 2019.

With the Wiltshire Senior Cup reducing the number of league fixtures for this weekend to four there were still a number of key games affecting both the top and bottom of the table, with both Kintbury Rangers and Melksham Town Res knowing that a win might take them top of the table.

For Kintbury to go top they needed to win and hope that Melksham dropped points at Westbury. Kintbury did what they themselves needed to do by smashing eight goals past Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development at the Recreation Ground. A clinical first half performance saw Kintbury score five times before the break, Fabio Pinto led the way with a brace, with Charlie Allsop, Shaun Thorp and George Smith also netting. Royal Wootton Bassett managed one in response through Calum Courtney to make it 5-1 at the break. Kintbury took their foot off the gas a little bit in the second half but still managed to score three more with Charlie Allsop, Shaun Thorp and George Smith all getting their second of the game. As a result, Shaun Thorp moved onto 15 goals at the top of the goal scoring chart for the league.

Melksham Town Reserves had a tough looking fixture against a Westbury United Reserves side who had gone unbeaten in their previous seven games, the last three which had all been won. In a highly competitive game the only goal of the game came in the first half courtesy of Melksham's Leigh Rogers, ten days after firing a hat-trick against Trowbridge in Melksham's last game he scored the goal which sent Melksham to the top of the table. So, despite their impressive win, Kintbury had to settle for second spot, one point behind but with a game in hand.

Shrewton United, who had received the news in the week that manager Scott Young was stepping down after four years at the helm, went into their match against Trowbridge Town with caretaker manager Joe Sheldrake in charge. He got off to a winning start as Shrewton ended their recent disappointing run as goals from Craig Lewis and Charlie Uttersen secured a 2-1 win, Jordan Cullis with the Trowbridge Town goal. Shrewton remain in fourth place but the win lifted them to within two points of previous leaders Wroughton in third place.

At the other end of the table both Devizes Town Res and Pewsey Vale Development went into their game on the back of seven games without a win. Games between the two sides are usually tight affairs, last seasons two matches between the sides had seen just one goal scored and when the two met a few weeks back it had again finished 0-0, so another tight game was expected and so it proved. 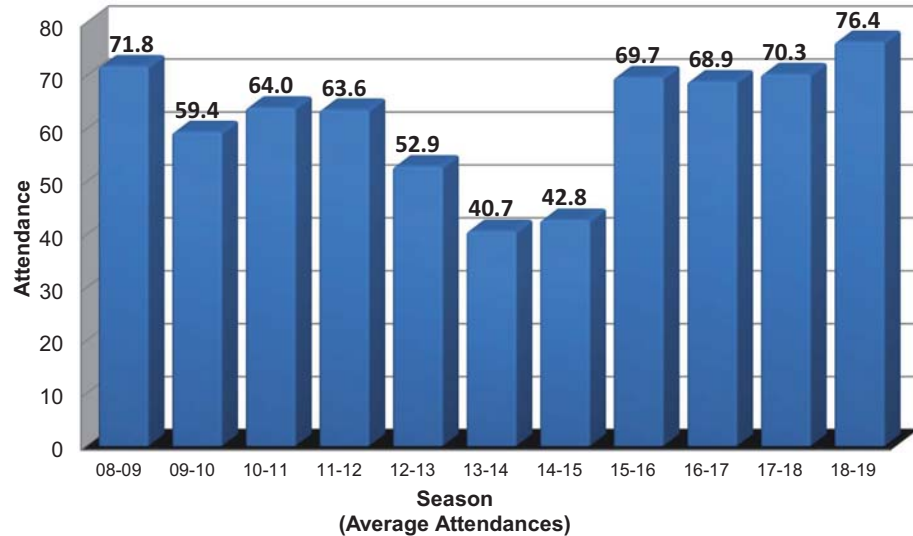

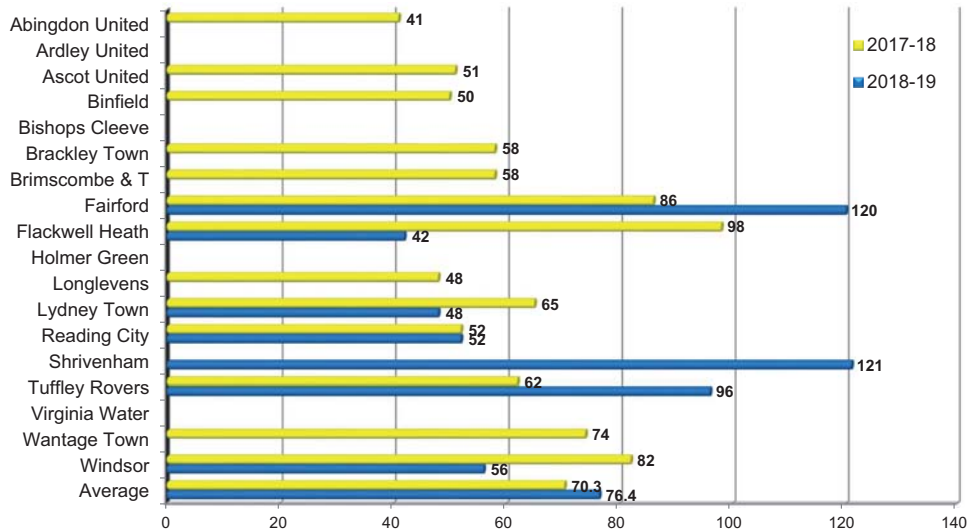

RWBTFC Attendances - Season 2018-19 (and comparison to 2017-18)



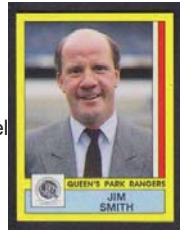
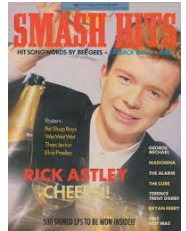
