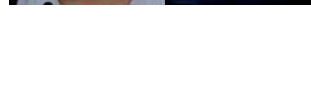

## Late double downs Bassett

2019 belatedly began with defeat for Royal Wootton Bassett Town as they conceded twice late on in a loss against Ardley United.

When the teams met in Wiltshire earlier in the season, it took spirited rearguard action in the final minutes to preserve victory.

But this time, Bassett were unable to keep Ardley out. First Troy Bryan and then Jordan Thomas found the net as they provided two good finishes to round off swift counter attacks from the hosts.

Sam Collier's team will feel slightly disappointed with the result as they arguably had the better of the play for the majority of the second half. But, on what has historically been an unhappy hunting ground for Bassett, they were unable to convert that pressure into a decisive goal.

That had followed a scrappy first half in which neither side was able to demonstrate much quality, the bobbly pitch at the Nolan Oils Ground proving difficult for both teams to adjust to.

## Under 15 Blues book County Cup semi final spot

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Under 15 Blue advanced to the semi finals of the Wiltshire County Cup with a hard-fought 5-2 victory away against Castle Combe Colts.

In a preview of their North Wilts League Cup semi final clash, Bassett dealt excellently with the difficult conditions. Leading 3-2 at the interval despite playing against the wind in the opening period, Bassett scored twice more in the second half to make it through to the final four. Leading scorer Kevin Prouse took his tally for the season to 25 with a hat-trick, while Harry Farrow and Jack Osbaldeston also found the net.

On their return to league action, the Under 16 Blues kept up the pressure on North Wilts League Division One leaders Cirencester Town Centurions with a convincing 7-2 victory away against Ferndale Rodbourne YCFC. Luca Robinson struck twice, with Michael Friend, Jack Langcaster, Jed Phillips, Thomas Pitt and Daniel Warre also on target. Bassett trail the leaders by five points while holding two games in hand.

A Callum Flay goal earned the Under 16 Yellows a vital point away against Fairford and Lechlade that keeps his side in the hunt for a top two finish in Division Two.

Elsewhere, there were four narrow defeats for Bassett teams.

Facing Robins for the second week in a row, the Under 13 Yellows suffered the same result as in the initial meeting, losing 2-1.

The Under 12 Blues were beaten by the same score in their home contest against Malmesbury Youth. Thomas Nicholls was on target for Bassett.

The Under 13 Blues fell to defeat by the odd goal as well, losing a thriller 5-4 at home against Bradford Town Youth Mustangs.

Meanwhile, the Under 14 Yellows put up a good fight against Croft Junior Blue before eventually succumbing to a 3-1 loss.

## Today's Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Wantage Town. It seems a long time since we were last here for a First Team game probably because it has been a long time – 43 days to be precise. So it is belated Happy New Year to all our supporters, players and club helpers and I hope everyone had a wonderful Christmas and enjoyed the New Year celebrations.

A warm welcome to all the players, management, officials and spectators from Wantage Town who have made the journey for this league game. A special warm welcome back to former players Curtis Meare, Dan Comer, Matt Cheetham, Steve Robertson, Jon Davoille and Callum Wright and also to former manager Paul Braithwaite. When the two sides met back in October we were leading 2-0 only to press the self-destruct button when Adam Corcoran and Kieron Diaz-Benetiz both got themselves sent off and we ending up going down 3-2. Hopefully we can learn from that experience and take three points off one of the sides who still remain amongst the promotion favourites. Our record against today's opponents is atrocious, with just 4 wins in our previous 23 meetings, the other 19 games all being lost. Only our record against Binfield of the current teams in the Premier Division is worse. Furthermore, we have lost the last 8 meetings between the two sides. Hopefully today will be the day when we start to improve that poor record against Wantage, although will be tough as, after a bit of a blip by their own high standards, Wantage come into today's game on the back of six straight wins.

## Long Road Trip

Since the last programme against Brimscombe & Thrupp we have had 5 games in a row away from home which has seen us win at Tuffley Rovers, draw at Flackwell Heath but lose at Windsor in the Floodlit Cup and at Shrivenham and Ardley United in the league. Today's programme plays catch up with match reports including the Brimscombe & Thrupp match and the five away fixtures. After the Windsor defeat we now have only the league to concentrate on and Sam will be looking to get maximum points from the remaining nine league fixtures as he and the side look to achieve our highest ever finish at this level.

## Development Side

The Development side had an excellent result just before Christmas when they ended Trowbridge Town's unbeaten run with a 3-2 home win. They have subsequently played two more games losing narrowly 2-1 to Melksham Town Reserves (their sixth defeat of the season by just one goal) and then last Saturday against Westbury United Reserves in an entertaining game that could have gone either way. Again today's programme plays catch-up with the action for the Development side in the Wiltshire Senior League.

## Ladies Side

Since the last home programme, the Ladies side have had four fixtures, all of which have been won, including one which was awarded to us when the opposition could not raise a side. The Ladies remain at the top the table following last Sunday's 4-0 away win at Swindon Spitfires. Having suffered their only league loss of the season against Spitfires when the teams met back in October, Bassett were both anxious to avenge that defeat and also wary of the potential threat Spitfires posed. But a strong display that silenced the Spitfires' attack and put their hosts' defence under constant pressure ensured that Bassett's win would be a rather routine one. Emily Arrell in particular proved too hot for the Spitfires defence to handle. She struck twice in quick succession early on. Her first came following great pressing from Lauren Usher and Lauren Kayll, the ball breaking for Arrell who rounded the 'keeper and tapped in. Shortly after the restart, she found herself in possession on the edge of the area, took a touch to beat her marker and placed a precise shot into the back of the net. The third eventually arrived as Spitfires were unable to clear from a Holly Baker cross and Arrell nipped in with a poacher's finish to complete her hat trick. She continued to cause all kinds of problems for the Spitfires backline. A cross of hers forced another fine save before she teed up Huckin who could only find the post. Huckin would join her strike partner on the scoresheet though. Racing onto a through ball, the pacy forward went on a surging run from the halfway line, surging past the last defender before slotting past the 'keeper. Frampton Rangers' victory against third place Cheltenham Town Development means Bassett remain two points clear at the top of the table. While that keeps up the pressure from their closest challengers, the result does mean Bassett are a step

It was not a happy return to action in the new year for Royal Wootton Bassett Town in the Hellenic League Premier Division as they fell to a 2-0 defeat away at Ardley United.

The match was the first for Sam Collier's side in 2019, having had an extended break since December 29.

## Truro City – Football’s Coming Home

FOOTBALL’S Coming Home at last for supporters in the south-west after Truro City announced this week they are to make a welcome return to Cornwall and play the remainder of their home games back at their Treyew Road home.

The White Tigers were forced out of their home ground back in August with supermarket giant Lidl planning to build a store on the site.

But now those plans have been shelved, the National League South club have been given the green light to return home and resume as the only senior football club in Cornwall.

Truro had been playing their home games at Torquay United’s Plainmoor ground, meaning a gruelling 180-mile round trip for Tigers supporters.

Naturally, that move badly hit fan attendance figures with the White Tigers averaging fewer than 200 fans per game because of the two-hour trip to south Devon.

Their lowest recorded attendance was just 86 for their game against Hemel Hempstead Town in October, while just 52 ‘home supporters’ made the trip on New Year’s Day against their landlords with 2,760 ‘away’ fans making up an attendance figure of 2,812.

In a statement, the club said: “We are pleased to confirm that Truro City Football Club will be playing the remainder of this season’s home Vanarama National League South and Buildbase FA Trophy matches at Treyew Road.

“The move back has been necessitated for a number of reasons, including the late withdrawal of Helical from the retail development project.

“It understood that the ground’s owners, JLL, are still in talks with Lidl and there is still a strong possibility that the development will still go ahead sometime in the future.”

Now, at least with their own roof above their heads, Truro City can look to the future and a proposed move to the new 10,000-seater Stadium for Cornwall, which they would share with the Cornish Pirates rugby club.

Work on that development has yet to begin with Helical, the firm which bought Treyew Road, still in discussions about settling Truro City’s £2 million contribution towards the £12m project.

At the time of writing this, Truro were due to kick off their first next Vanarama National League South home match at their new permanent home against south-west rivals Weston-super-mare on Saturday January 19.

The club added: “We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible supporting the team at Treyew Road between now and the end of the season.”

If the Stadium of Cornwall really is, as promised, to become a future hotbed of senior football in the south-west, then it’s important that White Tigers fans embrace the present.

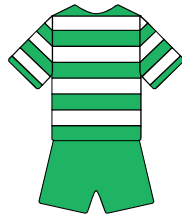
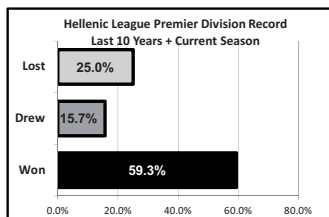
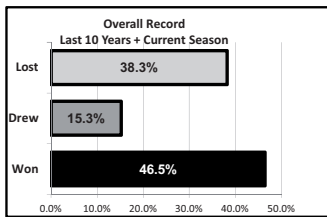

# Visitors - Tourist Information

## Introduction to the Town

Wantage is a historic market town and civil parish in the ceremonial county of Oxfordshire, England. Historically part of Berkshire, it has been administered as part of the Vale of White Horse district of Oxfordshire since 1974. The town is on Letcombe Brook, about 8 miles (13 km) south-west of Abingdon, 24 miles (39 km) north-west of Reading, 15 miles (24 km) south-west of Oxford and 14 miles (23 km) north north-west of Newbury.

## Interesting Facts

King Alfred the Great was born in Wantage in 849. He was one of only two kings to be given the epithet "The Great", the other being King Canute. His father was king of Wessex, but by the end of Alfred's reign his coins referred to him as 'King of the English'. He fought the Vikings and then made peace so that English and Vikings settled down to live together (as currently been shown on the excellent Vikings on Amazon Prime). He encouraged people to learn and he tried to govern well and fairly.

## Famous Residents

As well as Alfred there are other famous former and current residents.

John Betjeman, Poet Laureate from 1972 to 1984, lived in Wantage and his book Archie and the Strict Baptists is based in the town.

Lester Piggott was born in Wantage to a family that could trace its roots as jockeys and trainers back to the 18th century.

Hugh Johns, former ITV football commentator, was also born in Wantage.

Racehorse owner Henrietta Knight trains horses at her farm at Lockinge near Wantage. She has trained more than 100 point-to-point winners during her career. The most well-known of these is Best Mate who was first past the post at the Cheltenham Gold Cup on three occasions. She is married to retired champion jockey Terry Biddlecombe.

## Nearest Railway Station

The nearest railway station to Wantage is Didcot, 8 miles to the East. There are taxis and buses which can take you to Wantage.

## Nearest Pubs to Ground

The nearest pub to the ground is the popular Royal Oak. The Royal Oak won an award from CAMRA for "25 Years in the Good Beer Guide". The pub is a traditional town pub located 5 minutes walk from the town's market place. Here you will find the ideal combination of a superb range of perfectly kept ales and an extremely friendly environment.



The Royal Oak is primarily a real ale pub and offers up to a dozen mainly local real ales and up to 33 ciders. Always on offer are beers from West Berks brewery and Wadworth. Two of the regular beers, Dr Hexter's Wedding ale & Dr Hexter's Healer, were originally brewed specifically for Paul by West Berks Brewery. Dr Hexter's Healer is now available nationally.

## Things to Do in Wantage

For the artistic amongst you the place to visit is The Funky Teapot. The Funky Teapot is a paint your own pottery studio. Friendly staff there have a reputation of helping children and adults alike create unique gifts and keepsakes from a selection of 100's of pottery shapes.

For the petrol heads amongst you just 3 miles up the road at Grove is the Williams Conference Centre, home to the largest private collection of Formula One cars in the world. Housing more than 40 of the team's seminal race cars, the collection charts the team's 40 years of motor racing history.



Insight tour experiences are available and include an expert tour guide providing commentary on the Williams teams illustrious history and a glimpse into some of the remarkable technology behind the teams history. There is also an opportunity to purchase Williams team merchandise from our onsite shop. Unfortunately the tours do not access the Formula One factory. The one big drawback is the cost as, like most things associated with Formula 1 it does not come cheap, as a ticket will set you back £60.

## Dad's Army fight back to deliver deserved point

Wilks Park, 29th December 2018

### Flackwell Heath 3 Royal Wootton Bassett Town 3

Fielding a starting eleven that contained just three players aged younger than thirty, Flackwell Heath and their contingent of speedy attacking players were arguably not the side Sam Collier wanted his Royal Wootton Bassett Town team to be facing. But thanks to an outstanding team performance from his assembled old guard, Bassett were able to claim a point in a dramatic 3-3 draw thanks to TJ Bohane's stoppage time equaliser. A point was the least that they deserved too. Despite conceding three goals, the visitors defended diligently, ceding few chances until home boss Marcus Richardson introduced Adam Thomas and Sodike Anyadike-Thompson to the fray and went with three men in attack. In midfield, Bassett's makeshift trio of Bohane, Nick Stanley and Gio Wrona battled throughout and, for a large part of the game, controlled proceedings. Meanwhile, up front the manager and Glenn Armstrong stood out with their selfless hold-up play and Flackwell found Matt Bennett's pace hard to contain. It was a superb all-round team performance, with the result ensuring the tired legs and sore joints come full time (which will no doubt linger for the next day or two for many in the side) were not in vain. Bassett's desire was obvious from the first whistle as they arguably made the better start. It was Bennett's raw speed that created the first chance of the game too when he burst down the right side, his low delivery deflecting into the path of Collier whose shot was blocked. A brief scare was survived when Josh Baines' towering free kick was struck over by an unmarked Josh Samuels at the left post. But that would be the last time Flackwell would threaten until they were gifted their first equaliser. In the meantime, Bassett went ahead with a well-worked goal and looked more than good value for their lead. The goal arrived on 21 minutes. Armstrong received a ball in from right back Tony Joyce on the edge of the area and rolled a clever reverse pass through to Stanley, who arrowed a precise, low effort into the bottom right corner. Ten minutes later, Armstrong came close to doubling the lead, steering wide from eighteen yards after Joyce picked him out with another pinpoint pass. But, just as the visitors appeared to be headed into half time a goal to the good, one ball over the top did for them in the 43rd minute. Playing in a deeper role than accustomed to at left back, Mani Roper was caught in two minds as to whether challenge for 'keeper Aaron Watkins' clearance. And, after failing to connect with a header, that left Samuels a free run at goal and he eventually picked out the bottom corner after cutting inside Steve Yeardley, who was attempting a last-ditch tackle. There was one last opportunity before the interval. And it almost ended in Bennett restoring Bassett's advantage, but he fired narrowly over following a Collier set back.

The flying forward would more than make up for passing up that opportunity just thirty seconds after the restart though. After Wrona swung in a sublime cross from the left wing, Collier feigned a clever dummy to freeze centre half Josh Edwards. And that allowed the ball to drop perfectly for an unmarked Bennett, and he thrashed an unstoppable half volley beyond Watkins. Going behind for a second time forced Flackwell into a rethink. And the double substitution, introducing Anyadike-Thompson and Thomas, eventually proved an inspired choice, their fresh, fast-twitching legs proving problematic for a Bassett side whose legs tired all over the pitch. Its impact was not immediate, however, the best opening Flackwell fashioned in the opening stages of the second period coming when Leius Sinclair's long range drive forced a parry from Kevin Sawyer. Two gilt-edged chances fell Bennett's way as Bassett came close to extending their lead. On the hour, Stanley jumped on an underhit pass and threaded a through ball to the forward, who snatched at a shot taken too early. An acrobatic twelve-yard effort from Stanley's hooked cross then deflected narrowly over. Ultimately though, the game became stretched and that played into the hosts' favour. Bassett thought they had survived a scare in the 68th minute when Sawyer produced an outstanding stop to claw a Thomas shot from a matter of yards around the post before Yeardley cleared off the line from Anyadike-Thompson after the resulting corner was not cleared. But within a couple of minutes Flackwell had the ball in the net, their second equaliser coming in some style. James Mansfield passed into the feet of Thomas, who, with his back to goal and from a tight angle, flicked the ball up before guiding a controlled overhead kick into the opposite corner. Both teams subsequently spurned one-on-one opportunities created by long punts forward from the two respective 'keepers. Sinclair blazed over for Flackwell after outpacing the Bassett defence before Bennett was denied by a brilliant diving save from Watkins when he had burst through. But, with time winding down, Flackwell scored what they thought would be the winner. Thomas had been denied moments earlier by a superb saving tackle from Jon Beeden. But from the corner that followed, he guided a low header in at the near post. Desperate to salvage something from the game, Bassett threw everything forward. Stanley steered a free kick into the hands of Watkins, Bohane saw a snap shot from twelve yards blocked following good work on the edge of the box from Wrona and Yeardley, before Sawyer came forward for a last minute corner. Yet the ball just wouldn't find a way in. That was until Armstrong controlled Roper's clipped ball in the left channel and set Bohane loose with a neat backheel. And the prolific forward made no mistake, keeping his composure to slot in beneath Watkins and claim a fantastic, hard-fought point in the most dramatic fashion. The thirty-plus contingent will probably feel the effects of this one for the next few days. But those aches and pains will certainly be worth it following a terrific effort.

**Man of the match: Jon Beeden** – one of Bassett's youngest players on the pitch at age 27, Beeden was a towering presence at centre back, winning everything in the air and helping keep Flackwell's fleet-of-foot forwards largely in check.

They also had a couple of dangerous crosses that came to nothing as the Bassett defense started off where they had left off against Hook Norton. Bassett themselves had their first attack of note in the 8<sup>th</sup> minute but again nothing came of it. Bassett were forced into an early change when Paul Patel suffered a damaged shoulder in the 13<sup>th</sup> minute following an ugly challenge from Wantage striker Chris Roche. To the astonishment of the Bassett contingent the referee took no action against the Wantage player for what had been a vicious attack on the Bassett defender. Patel's game was ended by that incident and he was replaced by Stu Hemsley who was returning to the first team having missed a couple of games. Both teams created chances in an even first half. As the half wore on Bassett started to gain initiative, earning a number of corner kicks which unfortunately came to nothing. Bassett continued to attack as the half drew to a close but numerous through balls and crosses were wasted. Mark Simpkins had the best chance for Bassett in the first half when a minute into injury time his shot was well saved after he dribbled past two defenders following good work by Rob Day. Bassett went into the break with the score deadlocked but looking the team who were most likely to score.

Bassett started off the second half where they had left off and took the lead in the 51<sup>st</sup> minute when a great Steve Hale kick put Danny Clayton into the clear and Clayton fired home from inside the Wantage area. A minute later Wantage had Chris Roche, the same player who had fouled Paul Patel, booked for a foul on Stu Hemsley – Patel's replacement. Allan Pluckrose had a good chance in the 67<sup>th</sup> minute when he headed just over from a Mark Simpkins free kick. Bassett made their second substitution five minutes later bringing Ben Gascoyne on for Rob Day. Danny Clayton had another good chance for Bassett when his shot was again saved by the Wantage keeper, the busiest player on the pitch, following good work by Ben Gascoyne; three minutes later Nick Tooley hit over after taking the ball around four players. Wantage had another player booked a couple of minutes later for starting a mini scuffle with Bassett's Mark Vaughan, Wantage then made a double substitution to try and salvage a goal. They nearly got one when Steve Hale parried a good shot and the rebound was blocked and cleared to safety. Bassett made their final change in the 83<sup>rd</sup> minute when Dave Jones was brought on for Mark Simpkins. Wantage had a last chance effort a minute from time, but thankfully nothing came of it much to the relief of the Bassett followers as anything less than three points would have been a travesty. Bassett had gained three vital points just before Christmas and will be looking to make it six points from two games when they travel to Shortwood United on December 28<sup>th</sup>.

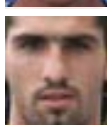

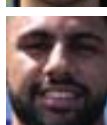

## No festive cheer as Bassett suffer derby disappointment

Royal Wootton Bassett Town were beaten by Shrivenham for the second time this season as Sam Collier's side fell to a 2-0 Boxing Day defeat.

Boxing Day derby defeats have become all too familiar for Royal Wootton Bassett Town in recent seasons, having suffered three straight festive losses against Highworth Town. With the Worthians' promotion to the Southern League, a new Christmas opponent was on the cards. But that change failed to yield a corresponding reversal in Bassett's fortunes as they were beaten 2-0 by Shrivenham.

Goals either side of half time proved Bassett's undoing as, in an eery reminder of their August Bank Holiday defeat against the same side, Sam Collier's team were guilty of failing to take their changes. Shrivenham, meanwhile, capitalised on theirs as they recorded a deserved victory. And there was even time to rub salt into Bassett's wounds when 'keeper Mike Alexander preserved a clean sheet by keeping out a TJ Bohane penalty.

All in all, it was an afternoon to forget for the visitors, though they did come closest to striking first as early openings for Rob Lincoln and Gio Wrona both brought shots that failed to find the target.

As in the opening fixture between the sides, Shrivenham proved dangerous from set pieces, and it took an excellent save from Ross Milloy - drafted in from the Development team to play between the sticks - to keep out a Sam Ockwell free kick on the quarter hour mark.

Eventually the hosts took the lead when, in the 33rd minute, Bassett failed to clear properly from another free kick, with the rebound dropping for Tom Ballard whose deflected effort flew in over Milloy.

Bassett did have an excellent chance to draw level almost immediately, but Bohane, on his weaker right foot, skewed wide from close range. Milloy was then brought into action again on the stroke of half time to tip over from Ballard.

Having gone into the break ahead, Shrivenham came out in the mood to extend their lead following the interval and were close to doing just that with only a minute elapsed when Ockwell sent a powerful drive narrowly over.

The Shrivenham captain would be the one to strike the decisive second with twenty minutes to go, firing in a free kick that Milloy was unable to keep out.

That should have spelled the end of the game as a contest, with Shrivenham continuing to apply pressure only for Milloy to deny Martin Hall and Ockwell again.

But Bassett earned a surprising opportunity to claw themselves back into proceedings when Tom Phillips was upended in the box on eighty minutes. However, Alexander guessed correctly, diving low to his left to parry away Bohane's spot kick.

Further insult was almost added to injury when Antonio Gerrish opened up from range, but Milloy did brilliantly to repel his effort and ensure the damage was limited.

# Our History

## Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

But the best opportunity they could muster came early on in the second period and fell to Brett James, who shot narrowly wide after his progress had been slowed by the churning mud. The result means Bassett are now six games unbeaten in the league as they try and keep pace with the sides above them and maintain the small advantage they hold over the chasing pack, the members of which all have multiple games in hand.

## Super Sawyer helps preserve point

Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Brimscombe and Thrupp played out a 1-1 draw in an edgy Friday night encounter at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground.

## Royal Wootton Bassett Town 1 Brimscombe & Thrupp 1

Royal Wootton Bassett Town were indebted to the heroics of veteran 'keeper Kevin Sawyer as they held Brimscombe and Thrupp to a 1-1 draw in a gritty Friday night encounter at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground. What the contest lacked in quality, it made up for in drama, particularly in a first half that the visitors dominated. Yet, Brimscombe were only able to establish a 1-0 advantage, the performance of Sawyer being the key reason why as he saved a penalty and pulled off two further quality saves. It was a game full of controversy too, as Brimscombe felt that their tormentor should not even have been on the pitch after his angry reaction to the decision to award the Lilywhites their first penalty. However, it was clear – not least from the reaction of the Brimscombe forward – that Ollie Pitt had taken an obvious, calculated dive when seeking to latch onto Harrison Reeves' defence splitting through ball. The referee had been duped though and deemed that Sawyer had brought Pitt down before producing a yellow card for the 'keeper in light of his lengthy, angry – and fully justified - protest. He restored a sufficient degree of calm before brilliantly repelling Ash Caldwell's effort from the spot though, ensuring that parity was preserved.

Brimscombe could well have already been ahead, but Pitt had struck the post after beating the offside trap on eleven minutes while the resulting corner eventually led to Sam Blackie heading over while unmarked from just ten yards. Even after the missed spot kick, Brimscombe remained on top, with the home defence unable to contain the superb movement of Blackie and Pitt (even though it is difficult to praise the latter given his shameful histrionics). On 37 minutes, Pitt whipped in a free kick from the left edge of the box that Sawyer did well to tip around the near post. After his defence failed to clear the subsequent corner, a low cross was swung into the box that Blackie swept towards goal, only to see his effort parried to safety. Yet Brimscombe eventually found themselves a goal to the good going into the interval. And their lead came virtue of a penalty after Blackie was scythed down by Steve Yeardley just inside the penalty area. This time Caldwell just had enough on his spot kick to beat Sawyer, even though the 'keeper did guess correctly, as he picked out the bottom left corner.

For all their dominance of the first half, however, Brimscombe emerged rather muted after the restart. Admittedly, they weren't ceding chances to the home side. But they appeared to suffer from a degree of complacency that ultimately proved the difference between them taking all three points back to Gloucestershire and just the single point that they ended up earning. And Bassett took full advantage, equalising with twenty-five minutes remaining. The visitors were unable to successfully clear from a free kick, and Brad Pagliaroli was able to slip a pass to Gio Wrona in the left corner. From there, Wrona floated in a left-footed cross that Brimscombe 'keeper Ash Gale sought to come for. He was nowhere close to beating TJ Bohane to the ball though, and the Bassett forward, rising highest, flicked in a deft header. That seemed to rattle Brimscombe, and the game's closing stages were rather ugly with both teams racking up cautions. There were the odd moments when a further goal appeared possible. With eleven minutes remaining, Reeves whipped in a cross from the right that deflected off Carl Evans and dropped for an unmarked Pitt, who headed over. Reeves was then denied by the feet of Sawyer after Pitt's clever set back from a low Jake Parrott delivery.

But it was to be Bassett who had the best chance to snatch victory. In the final minute, great hold up play from Mani Roper eventually resulted in Pagliaroli slipping through a pass for Matt Bennett, who seemingly had just Gale to beat. But the forward dwelled on the ball for a half second too long before pulling the trigger, allowing time for his tight-angled effort to be blocked. Neither side was therefore able to claim a victory. And the result arguably did little to help either team. That frustration potentially was the root of some of the disappointing scenes that followed the final whistle. But, if anything, the hosts will feel this was a point earned, compared to Brimscombe who will no doubt believe it was a case of two points dropped. And it was Sawyer's fantastic glove work that proved vital.

# Our Visitors History

## Wantage Town • Club History

Wantage Town FC (aka The Fred's or Alfredian's) have been affiliated to the Berks & Bucks FA since 1892.

They played in the Swindon & District, North Berks and Reading & District Leagues, achieving success in 1903-04 in the Swindon Advertiser Cup, which they repeated in 1907-08 as well as becoming the League Champions.



After the 1st World War, the Fred's briefly played in the North Berks League, winning the North Berks Cup in 1920 and 1921 and the Championship in 1921-22. After a brief period playing in the Reading & District League with no success they then re-entered the Swindon & District League, winning the title in 1933-34.

The Fifties was the most successful period for the Club, winning the League in 1952-53 (without losing a game) and again in 1955-56, while in 1954-55, the Fred's won no fewer than five cup competitions, including the Berks & Bucks Intermediate Cup. Since joining the Hellenic League in 1956, the Fred's have spent most of their seasons in the Premier Division, winning promotion from Division 1 on six occasions - as runners-up in 1969-70, 1987-88, 1991-92 (where they set a club record of 32 games unbeaten) and 1995-96, and as Champions in 1980-81 and

Season 2003/2004 was one of the Fred's most successful. The First Team won Division One East to regain its position in the Premier Division of the Hellenic, and the Reserves finished top of their league, also winning promotion. In 2010-11, the Fred's won the Premier division title, but despite great effort on the part of the Club management, they were not promoted to the Southern League due to ground grading criteria not being achieved. In the 2012-2013 season, the club achieved the Southern League Ground grading, but finished runners-up to a very strong Marlow side, and again missed out on promotion.



In 2013-14, the Freds won the UHlsport Hellenic Premier League title again, and this time with the appropriate ground grading in place, saw promotion to Division One (South and West) of the Southern League. The Freds remained in the Southern League for 3 years, before seeing relegation back to the UHlsport Hellenic Premier League at the end of the 2016-17, at the same time as the Reserves saw relegation to the 2nd Division of the Hellenic League.

2017-18 saw the club almost make an immediate return to the Southern League but drew the final two league games and had to settle for fourth place, three points off promotion. However success was achieved in the Reading Invitation Senior Cup, beating Highmoor Ibis 5-3 in the final at the Madejski Stadium to win the cup for the first time since 1982-83.

Throughout the years the Club has worked to upgrade the facilities at Alfredian Park. In the past seven-teen years the main pitch has been renewed and a training pitch has been established. Two new and additional pitches have been formed, enabling five full sized pitches (including the adjacent School pitches) to be used by the growing number of teams supported by the Club (the Club supports teams, both boys and girls, from U7s upwards, and since 2016-2017, also a Ladies team). The Club has recently been granted planning permission for the installation of a 3G pitch, which shows the continued investment in the facilities.

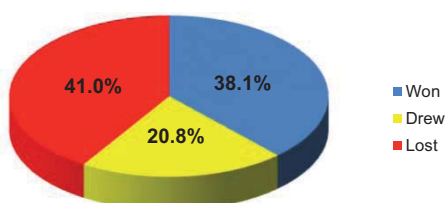

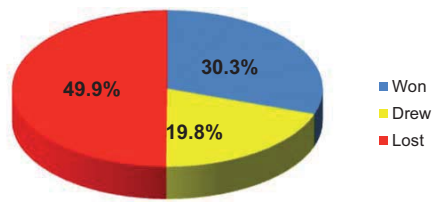

## 12th January 2019

It was something of a day of minor shocks as three of the top four sides all dropped points. The biggest shock of the day came at league leaders and defending champions Kintbury Rangers where Malmesbury Victoria Development carried on their recent good form to come away from Kintbury with a point. In a first half that saw Malmesbury much the better side, they belied their lowly league position to lead 1-0 at the break courtesy of a Lewis King goal. To make matters worse for the leaders the division's leading scorer Shaun Thorp was sent off in the first half leaving Kintbury up against it. A much improved second half performance saw them draw level and then go in front courtesy of two goals from George Smith, the second coming five minutes from time from the penalty spot taking him to twelve for the season. Just as it looked they had won the game up popped Gareth Jones for Malmesbury Victoria Development to restore parity when he followed up an initial shot that was saved to tuck the ball away. Despite the dropped points Kintbury remain top and Malmesbury, who stretched their unbeaten run to four games, remain third from bottom but closed the gap to Marlborough Town to a single point with two games in hand.

There were no shocks at second in the table Wroughton who were 3-0 winners at the Weir Field over visitors Marlborough Town. Against a well organised Marlborough Town side Wroughton went in front on 20 minutes through a long-range effort from Tom Dingle taking him to six for the season. It remained a tight affair and it took until the 70th minute for Wroughton to extend their lead, Riegan Cook getting the important second goal. Wroughton made sure of all three points when Aaron Maximen headed in from a Craig Bowden cross to make it 3-0. The win lifted Wroughton to within a point of the leaders with both sides having now played 17 games.

Third placed Shrewton United, who had announced a series of signings to strengthen their squad ahead of the game today, put in a sub-standard performance by their own high standards and went down 3-1 at home to an impressive Cricklade Town side on the day. Shrewton were undone by three set-pieces with Elliott Corp bagging a brace for visitors Cricklade and Sam Broadbank with the other goal. The consolation for an out of sorts Shrewton came from Dominic Jackson, with his seventh of the season. Another of the top sides to drop points were Melksham Town Reserves, but there was little surprise element here as they were playing in-form Trowbridge Town who sat just below them in the table having won five of their previous six games. In a game that was played in a good spirit with Melksham's squad including a number of players from their successful Under 18 side, the game saw the two defences prevail as it finished honours even with no goals and the points shared. As a result, both sides remain in the positions in the table that they occupied at the start of the day.

A stunning strike from the edge of the box from Matty Mead on 70 minutes put Westbury back in front and the strong and fast Saul Johnson then finally secured the three points with his second of the game to make it 4-2 to Westbury and give David Jenkins a winning start to his Westbury managerial career.

A hat-trick from leading scorer David Cotter, taking him to 11 for the season, plus a Lewis Pickernell goal was enough to secure Ludgershall Sports the three points in an entertaining local derby against Pewsey Vale Development. Ludgershall led 2-0 at the break and were 3-1 up shortly after half-time but visitors Pewsey fired in two goals of their own to level matters up at 3-3. Both sides then pushed for the winner and it was the home side who were rewarded late on when Cotter completed his hat-trick to make the final score 4-3 to Ludgershall. Jacob Garrett, Corey Cullen and Joe Gentleman with the Pewsey goals who had pushed their neighbours all the way. Devizes Town Reserves have been going through a tough run of late with just one win in fourteen games, but they were rewarded for a good performance to start their New Year fixtures with a 2-0 away win over a good Football ID side. A goal from Mostafa Abdelraham and a Ben Perrett penalty settled matters in Devizes favour in another close game that saw youngster Isaac Wain make his debut for Devizes. A solitary strike from Corsham Town Reserves Ben Selman was all that separated Purton and Corsham at the Red House. The win ensured that Corsham remained in sixth spot in the table a point ahead of Cricklade Town but having played three games more.

# From The development Side

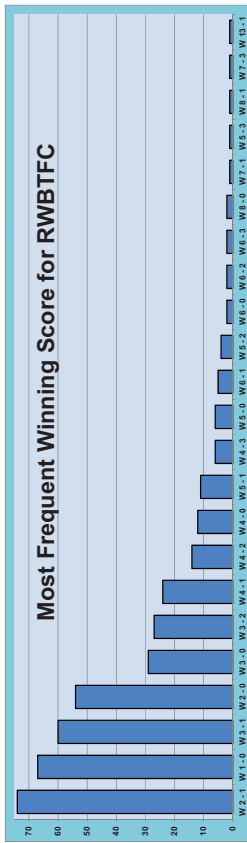

Chippenham Town had a great result on Saturday defeating Billericay Town for the second time this season. The Bluebirds defeated Billericay 2-0 at home in August, and Dean Brennan's side were downed again as Nat Jarvis and Carnell Chambers netted either side of half-time. Chippenham are now 12th in the table, four points short of the play-off frame – though seventh placed Welling do have a game in hand.

A big shock in the Wessex Division 1 was the departure of manager Dave Coker from Amesbury Town by "mutual agreement" with his side sat top of the table. Without Coker at the helm they continued their winning ways on Saturday with a 5-2 home success over bottom of the table Andover Town. Elsewhere Laverstock & Ford lost 3-0 at home to Petersfield Town and Downton drew 1-1 at New Milton Town. 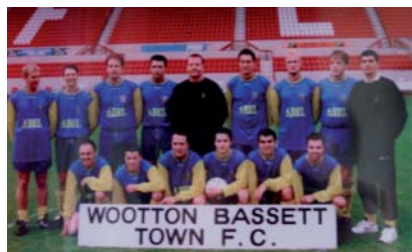

## Diary of Wiltshire League Division One Title Winning Season - Wootton Bassett Town 1987-88

Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> January 1988  
**Supermarine 0 Wootton Bassett Town 1**

### Headline: Competitive Spirit Leads To A Hard Match

Wootton Bassett doggedly fought their way through to the Wiltshire Senior Cup semi-final by defeating Supermarine 1-0 in this quarter final replay. Supermarine can class themselves a little unlucky because for most of the game they held the territorial advantage, but despite this it was Bassett who created the clearer of the chances and the score could easily been 2 or 3. Right from the off, Supermarine pushed forward with great purpose and Bassett were for the most part pinned in their own half. Some solid defending by the Bassett back four limited Supermarine to long range efforts and slowly Bassett began to get into the game. With the midfield becoming more determined and winning more of the ball the front three began to get some good service and support. When York switched flanks to the right halfway through the half Bassett had assumed control and proceeded to have their best period of the game. After 25 minutes Harrison released York down that right flank. He made his way into the penalty area before unleashing a firm drive which had Spackman beaten but also beat the far post. Five minutes later it was York again tormenting Humphreys on the right and his hard and low cross was bundled in by Hanrahan with Spackman in close attention, to give Bassett the lead. Bassett stayed in control until half time, York continuing to cause problems, but could not add to their lead.

The second half saw Supermarine once more come out in determined mood and take the game to Bassett, who perhaps gave ground to them too easily. Once again, the back four proved solid and for the most part only allowed Supermarine half chances. Their best chance came with 20 minutes remaining when Shearan's header was rather fortunately tipped over by Rees, although there were also a number of goalmouth scrambles when Bassett had their supporters' nerves on edge. Unfortunately, the competitive nature of the game spilled over into a number of minor brawls the result of which saw Supermarine Hughes enter the referee's book. Despite conceding territorial advantage Bassett always looked dangerous on the break and should have wrapped the game up with 15 minutes remaining when York failed to score with only Spackman to beat. Indeed, it was York, the player, of the first half, who was to miss another golden chance with 2 minutes left. The victory sees Bassett go through to the semi-final against Bromham, the other semi-finalists being Ferndale and Purton. It's cup action again next week for Bassett when they face another quarter final tie, this time in the Ghia Senior Cup, away against Sanford.

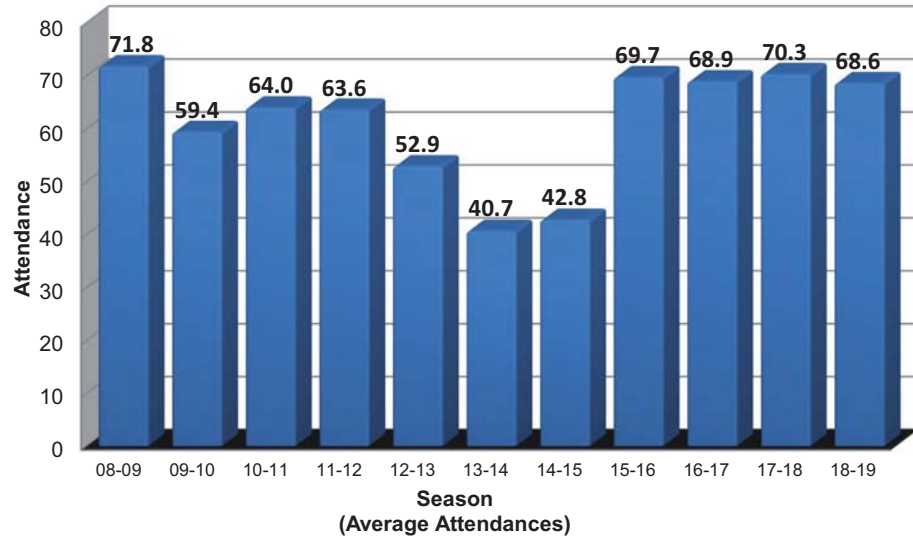

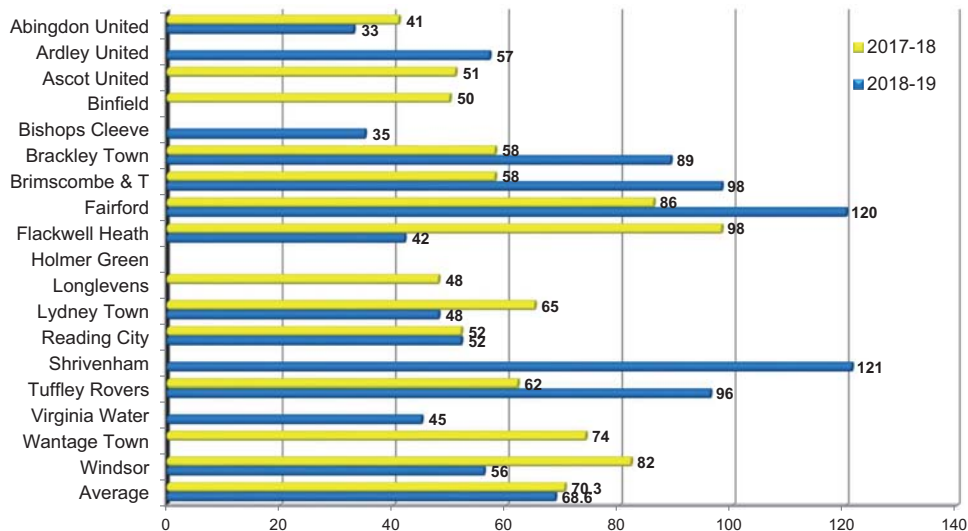
