Late pair condemns subpar Bassett to Abingdon loss

Northcourt Road, 9th February 2019

A pair of stoppage time goals condemned Royal Wootton Bassett Town a 2-0 loss against Hellenic League Premier Division strugglers Abingdon United.

Abingdon United struck twice from decisive counter attacks in the final minute to snatch all three points against Royal Wootton Bassett Town.

Sam Collier's team have now gone five games without victory in the Hellenic League Premier Division. Though they remain sixth, the five teams immediately below them can all leapfrog Bassett given the games in hand they possess, including local rivals Shrivenham who sit level on points with Bassett while holding three games in hand.

While Bassett, just minutes from claiming a share of the spoils, will be frustrated with the timing of the goals that condemned them to defeat against Abingdon, their substandard performance throughout the contest did not merit them taking anything from the match.

In a scrappy opening half, both teams failed to convert penalties, with TJ Bohane seeing his spot kick saved.

In the second period, neither side appeared as though they would break the deadlock, until Lester Davies rounded off a counter in the 90th minute.

Bassett were then stung in similar style four minutes into added time when Callum Harvey sealed an important victory for Abingdon in their battle against the drop.

Youth Section Round-up – Sunday 10th February 2019

Samuel and Jacob Davidson helped fire Royal Wootton Bassett Town Under 15 Yellow to a crushing 9-1 win against Malmesbury Youth Falcons that took them to the top of North Wilts League Division Three. The former fired a hat-trick and the latter a brace in their convincing victory, with further goals being provided by Samuel Case, Tristan McKay and Sebastian Turner. Bassett have just one more game to play and are top of Division Three, three points clear of Fairford and Lechlade Revenants who have three games in hand. Whether Bassett can secure a top two finish will ultimately depend on them winning their final game and hoping current third place side Highworth Town Juniors C, who are also three points back, dropping points in their final four matches. Whatever happens, it has been an impressive campaign for the team after they recorded only one point in 2017-2018.

Meanwhile, the Under 18 and 16 Blues recorded important wins as they continue to chase North Wilts League Division One titles. The Under 18 Blues struck five without reply against Brinkworth Cats, that increased their lead at the top to six points. Brinkworth are now seven behind, with Malmesbury Victoria Youth DT a further point back with two games in hand.

A 5-1 victory at home against Shrivenham saw the Under 16 Blues narrow the gap with current leaders Cirencester Town Centurions to five points. And Bassett still possess two games in hand, meaning they can leapfrog Cirencester should they triumph in those fixtures. They are due to face the Centurions in consecutive weeks in mid-March.

Elsewhere, Bassett's Under 15 Blues fell to a 5-2 defeat against Swindon Supermarine J in their Wiltshire County Cup semi-final. Bassett trailed 2-0 at half time and, despite getting goals back through Rhys Farrow and Kevin Prouse from the penalty spot, they were unable to claw back the deficit. While no doubt disappointed about missing out on the County Cup final, there's still plenty for the team to play for in what has been an excellent season. The Blues currently sit second in North Wilts League Division One, with a five point lead over third place Supermarine. And they have the chance to reach the North Wilts League Cup final, with a semi-final tie against Castle Combe Colts set for the end of March.

In other league action, the Under 14 Yellows were unable to build on their win last time out as they were beaten 4-1 at home by Division Three leaders Wroughton Youth White. The Under 12 Blues also suffered defeat against the team currently topping the table in Division Two, narrowly losing 2-0 against Stratton Juniors Bears. It was a day to forget for the Under 16 Yellows, who lost 10-1 at home against Cirencester Town.

Today's Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Binfield. Once again it seems a long time since we were last here for a First Team game, the Wantage Town game was four weeks ago now, slightly shorter than the 43 days that elapsed between the Brimscombe and Wantage games but still a ridiculous length of time in this most disjointed of seasons. More on this in a moment.

A warm welcome to all the players, management, officials and spectators from Binfield who have made the journey along the M4 for this league game. In the last programme I had noted that our record against Wantage was atrocious. Well the only league record against sides in the Premier Division that is worse than the Wantage one is our record against today's visitors Binfield! The two sides have met in the league on thirteen occasions previously and of those thirteen games Binfield have won on ten occasions. We have won just twice with one game being drawn. Hopefully today we can do something to address that poor record. When the two sides met back in November it finished 3-2 to Binfield. Binfield went ahead eight minutes before the interval as Jemel Johnson used his pace to get in behind our defence and coolly slotted past an onrushing Charlie McCready from the edge of the box. We were able to restore parity on the stroke of half time as Matt Bennett, scored his fourth goal in three games. Both teams showed attacking intent after the restart, aided by a pitch slickened by the torrential rain that made life hard for defenders. It was Binfield who went back in front on 68 minutes when Gary Smith pounced. Then, ten minutes later James Knight doubled Binfield's advantage. That goal should have put the result beyond doubt, but we grabbed a lifeline when TJ Bohane found the net for the twelfth time this season. We pushed hard for the equaliser but the Binfield defence held firm to take the three points. I watched Binfield a couple of weeks ago when they played Virginia Water in what was a one-sided encounter despite the final 1-1 score line and have given Sam a few insights, including that their recent signing Stephen Peacock looked a handful against Virginia Water. They certainly had a lot of pace going forward and in Ian Davies they have a striker who knows where the net is, although he had a bit of a personal nightmare against Virginia Water.

Fixtures

After the positive visit of League Chairman Bob Dalling, which gave hope that the League were listening to our concerns regarding fixture scheduling, the Club has finally received a written response from the League to our concerns and our constructive suggestions to the fixture scheduling. Unfortunately, the hope given by Bob's visit has been dashed as the email from the League CEO Brian King noted that "myself, the UHL Executive and Officers are happy with the progress made this season and cannot see any reason why we should consider any radical changes for season 2020-2021 without being presented with irrefutable evidence of the need so to do so". He then perversely goes on to justify the level of games played by ourselves based on cup games each club has played. Nowhere in the analysis in the response did it address our main concerns about the long sequences of home or away games nor playing the same opponents twice in short order. If the League CEO doesn't see anything wrong with us having the same two opponents to play twice in our last 7 league games, us having played the same opponents on numerous occasions so quickly at the start of the season or Shrivensham having 9 of their last 10 games away from home or there being such a large disparity in the number of league games played by each team it is pointless writing to them again.

In an alternative approach in today's programme we publish what we believe is a format for a fixture list and planning we think that clubs would prefer. It is nowhere near perfect, but we believe it is better than what has been served up this season. It has close to a symmetrical format (would be symmetrical but for ensuring bank holiday games are reversed in the Christmas week), the maximum run of home or away league games is two and it also has the shorter distance games generally in midweek. Hopefully the Club's Committee will now look to share our ideas and thoughts with other clubs to try and get support from other clubs for a more balanced fixture list next season. Have a look and see what you think but remember that the constitution may look very different at the start of the new season as the FA look to balance clubs across the National League System. It is only meant to be an example of what can be done with getting a more balanced fixture list and has made some assumptions about promotions and relegations which may prove to be very wrong come the end of the season. Bassett News

Wantage and Abingdon

With just two games scheduled in January it has been a quiet month. The last home encounter against Wantage Town saw us lose narrowly to the title favourites in controversial fashion with Matty Bennett being sent-off on the stroke of half-time. Despite the video evidence provided by Your Support Swindon the FA unfortunately did not overturn the sending off decision and hence Matty was suspended as a result of the decision. A clear slip on the wet surface and a harsh decision in the first place upheld. Not sure the appeal hearing would have been that way if this had been a Premiership game. A late winner from former player Steve Robertson, who once again came back to haunt us at the Gerard Buxton Ground gave Wantage the 2-1 win.

Then last Saturday we visited lowly Abingdon United and, just like had happened at Ardley in our previous away game, we let in two late goals to go down to a 2-0 defeat. The conceding of late goals, particularly away from home, has been a real bad habit this season and hopefully something Sam can eradicate between now and the end of the season and certainly ahead of next season.

Development Side

The Development side have played just one game since the last programme, losing narrowly to Corsham Town Reserves. With a team strengthened by the inclusion of Steve Yeardley, Tony Joyce and Mani Roper, we lost 3-2 to a side who have yet to suffer defeat at home this season. We went close to getting the equaliser, but it was not to be in an entertaining game in which former Bassett player Dan Lardner starred for Corsham. Unfortunately, last week's home game against Malmesbury Vics Dev was postponed due to the loss of electricity to the site and in all likelihood will now be re-arranged for midweek.

Ladies Side

The Ladies continue to march on at the top of the South West Women's League Central Division. Sunday's 5-0 win over AEK Boco to move eight points clear at the top of the table. The scorers for Bassett were Emily Arrell (2), Holly Baker, Laura Jefferies and Hollie Timbrell. The clean sheet was Bassett's fifth in a row and seventh in their last ten games.

Sunday Side

The Sunday side are also top of their division after two thumping wins over Woodlands edge in their last two fixtures. This Sunday sees the big one when they take on second in the table Greyhound in a game that could go a long way to deciding the title. Having beaten them once already in the Wiltshire Senior Cup Danny groom's side will go into the big match in a confident mood.

FA Cup Draw

One thing I have done for a number of seasons now is track our side of the FA Cup draw all the way to Wembley and the final. Now this season Sam has got a lot to answer or more accurately that referee at Lydney. V A BLOODY R

For years the debate around technology raged. Should football have it? Should it not? Will it help? Will it take away the spontaneity and disrupt the flow of the game? The answers still aren't all that clear. In last year's Russian World Cup there were some decisions where its use made absolute sense. There were other times that left everyone scratching their heads. Essentially it is used in four scenarios. Goals and whether there was a violation in the build-up like an offside or foul. The next is for penalty decisions – general fouls aren't reviewable unless it is a direct red card. And the final option is for cases of mistaken identity when yellow or red cards are issued.

The system is something everyone is clearly getting used to – referees, players and fans. That is a big part of the problem. Having held off for so long, it's like to football powers were so desperate to use it that the process has been completely rushed. Supporters inside the stadium and at home watching on TV don't fully know what is happening. In cricket and rugby, we at least hear the conversation between the officials. In American Football, decisions are literally announced to the crowd. But football too often treats its fans - customers - like a school child with a box of matches. The lack of transparency that masks many areas of the game is the same here. Eventually showing a replay doesn't really cut it. Clips should be shown inside stadiums and we should hear the officials arrive at their verdict. Instead fans in the ground wait for a man with his finger in his ear to make an arm signal.

VAR is not something Non-League clubs are going to be worrying about any time soon, if ever. Apart from when it comes to the FA Cup. The system was introduced during last year's competition. Let's be clear. If correct decisions are being reached because of it, then all well and good. But surely there has to be a level playing field. The fact is, not all grounds have it. Take the other weekend, for example. Championship side Sheffield Wednesday were awarded a penalty at Chelsea. VAR was in operation; the decision was looked at and the Chelsea defender clearly won the ball. Penalty overturned and on we go – although Wednesday would have felt they should instead have been awarded a corner rather than the drop ball that restarted the game. Last Monday night, Barnet had Brentford on the ropes. Having fallen behind, Darren Currie's side swung the tie back their way with two quick goals from Shaq Coulthirst. But just seven minutes later, Brentford were thrown a lifeline. Referee Andy Madley adjudged David Tutonda to have fouled Ollie Watkins in the box. Replays clearly show there was no contact. It's not even up for debate. Watkins, probably expecting contact, went down untouched. He's since apologised. Despite the game being shown live on BT Sport and replays within seconds showing a clear angle, there was nothing that could be done because VAR was having the night off. Brentford scored, went on to take the lead before Dan Sparkes' wonderful free-kick made it 3-3 and booked a replay. It's all Sliding Doors, but who's to say if VAR had been deployed that Barnet wouldn't have gone on to win the game 2-1 and proceed to the fifth round, banking £180,000 while they're at it?

There has to be parity across the competition to keeps its integrity. VAR should only come into operation from a certain stage, say, the quarter-finals. Where it is likely most clubs will be in the Premier League and able to cope with what is needed or arrangements can be made. It can't be one set of rules for the fortunate big boys and another for the so-called minnows.

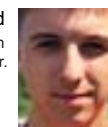

Binfield is a village in Berkshire, England, with a population of around 9,000. The village lies 2 miles (3.2 km) north-west of Bracknell, 3 miles (4.8 km) north-east of Wokingham and 8 miles (13 km) south east of Reading.

Interesting Facts

According to Wikipedia the name Binfield is derived from the Old English beonet + feld and means "open land where bent-grass grows".

Both Henry VIII and Queen Elizabeth I have stayed at the Stag & Hounds pub in Binfield when it was a hunting lodge.

Binfield is the home to The Bowmen Of Warfield archery club who have their own field on Hill Farm lane.

Bricks from the Binfield Brick and Tile works were allegedly partly used to create the world-famous Royal Albert Hall.

Famous Residents

The parents of Alexander Pope, the 18th century English poet lived in Binfield at the start of the 18th century.

The Sultan of Brunei owns Binfield Manor, where he is understood to stay during the polo season which runs from October to December. Wonder if he has taken in a game at Stubbs Lane?

Nearest Railway Station

The nearest railway station to Binfield's ground is in Bracknell four miles away.

Nearest Pubs to Ground

Binfield has three pubs, The Victoria Arms, the Jack O'Newbury and the aforementioned Stag and Hounds. According to the guys from Windsor, who being fairly local will know about these things, the pub to go to is the Jack O'Newbury (pictured below), which is reported to be a decent walk away. It is a real ale pub with a real fire, classic pub food, a skittle alley and a lawned garden. However, the Football in Bracknell guys recommend the Victoria Arms so it looks like you could be spoiled for choice when visiting Binfield.

Things to Do in Binfield

If you are a nature buff then the place to visit is Dinton Pastures Country Park near Wokingham which has no less than seven lakes, two rivers and lovely meadows to be enjoyed. The place offers a huge range of open air, adventurous and educational events for families, adults and young people. Enjoy some quality time with your family of all ages, from circus skills workshop, music and car festivals and open air cinema to spooky night paddles on black swan lake.

A little further afield towards Reading is the museum of Berkshire Aviation. Berkshire's dynamic contribution to aviation history is graphically re-captured at the museum. Run as a charitable trust, the museum is at the historic site of Woodley Airfield, near Reading, U.K. - once the centre of a thriving aircraft industry. Miles and Handley Page aircraft built at Woodley are being re-constructed and exhibited along with fascinating pictorial records and priceless archives.

Again a short trip in the car will take you to Legoland Windsor, the only Legoland park in the United Kingdom and the largest Legoland park in the world in terms of area. Legoland Windsor was built on the site of the former Windsor Safari Park.

If horse racing is your interest then you are spoiled for choice with Ascot, Windsor and also Sandown Park not that far away.

Anyone needing to go shopping will need to venture into Bracknell, with the Lexicon shopping centre probably the place to go.

Controversial call costs Bassett dear

Royal Wootton Bassett Town 1 Wantage Town 2

For the second time this season, Royal Wootton Bassett Town took the lead against Wantage Town, only to see the Alfredians claim the points as Bassett failed to finish the fixture with their full contingent of eleven players on the pitch.

However, whereas the wounds were self-inflicted in their 3-2 loss in Oxfordshire when they were reduced to nine men, on this occasion Bassett were the victims of a controversial decision to send Matt Bennett off on the stroke of half time.

After attempting to latch onto a Brad Pagliaroli pass, Bennett started to slow as he realised he would be unable to beat Wantage 'keeper Curtis Meare to the ball. At that moment, however, the forward slipped on the slick surface and his momentum carried him into the 'keeper, who had gone to ground.

It was clearly an unfortunate, accidental coming together. Bizarrely though, referee Oliver Cross felt otherwise and immediately brandished a straight red card.

The man in the middle had already drew Bassett's ire for an inconsistent showing throughout the first half. He had earlier booked TJ Bohane for a firm challenge, despite letting Kaylem Patterson off scot-free for a foul of similar strength minute before. Carl Evans was also cautioned for a soft, inadvertent foul.

Yet for all that frustration with the officials, Bassett manager Sam Collier would no doubt have been pleased about his side's solid first half display that had seen them take the lead.

There had been a pair of let-offs as Patterson twice wasted opportunities when presented with just Gary Aulsberry to beat. But on both occasions, the first coming when Ben Cook was allowed to run at the Bassett defence and the second after the forward had shown quick feet on the edge of the area to beat Mark James, Patterson shot straight at the 'keeper.

Aside from that though, Wantage appeared rather toothless in attack.

Chances were also at a premium at the other end. However, when one arrived on 28 minutes, Pagliaroli made no mistake. Josh Shama's perfectly timed tackle at the halfway line allowed Bassett to break, and the ball was worked quickly into the feet of Nick Stanley on the edge of the area. He then slipped a clever reverse pass to an overlapping Pagliaroli, and the forward bent an arcing shot into the top left corner that left Meare no chance.

The way the game had unfolded, Bassett would have been confident of defending that lead after half time. But Bennett's harsh dismissal made that task all the harder.

Forced into playing with just one-man up front, Bassett came under heavy pressure from the restart.

Wantage initially failed to make that pressure pay though as Aulsberry remained largely untroubled. The best the visitors could muster in the second half's early exchanges was when Steve Robertson steered a shot from an acute angle into the side netting.

Bassett's resistance was eventually broken on 66 minutes though. Left back Mark Flanagan steered in a cross from the left, which Aulsberry attempted to punch clear. Cook was on hand to pick up the pieces though, and steered the rebound in from fifteen yards with a composed finish.

Six minutes later the visitors were awarded a penalty, again in controversial fashion as Tony Joyce was harshly penalised for a handball when Patterson sought to tee himself up for a shot. Fortunately for the hosts, substitute Ryan Markham dragged his rushed spot kick wide of the left post.

Bassett then fashioned a chance for themselves. Stanley delivered a free kick from the left wing, which Jon Beeden connected with at the far post, but Mare was able to beat his header away at point blank range.

The game's decisive goal would arrive with eight minutes remaining. And it came from Steve Robertson - a source who has come to haunt his former club since departing for Wantage before the start of last season.

Scorer of five against Bassett in three meetings in 2017-18 and the winner in this season's reverse fixture in October, Robertson again found the net, guiding home Jack Dunmall's low ball after Connor Mattimore's bursting run down the left had opened up the home defence.

Man of the Match: Nick Stanley – the forward worked hard for the entire ninety minutes and continued to give Wantage something to think about in the second half even when operating up front on his own.

First half blitz sends Bassett into seventh heaven

Royal Wootton Bassett Town returned to winning ways in the Hellenic League Premier Division in remarkable fashion, recording a 7-3 victory over seventh place Binfield, with six of those goals being racked up before half time.

There'll be few games like this one at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground in years to come, that's for sure. A stunning, remarkable, mindboggling evening saw Royal Wootton Bassett Town score six first half goals - including three in the opening ten minutes of the game - en route to an amazing 7-3 victory over Binfield, who had come into the game on a seven game unbeaten streak.

Both sides had decent defensive records prior to kick off, while Rich Hunter's team had, if anything, been struggling for goals in the league despite their respectable mid-table position. With Binfield entering the game in seventh place, just five points above Bassett, a close game was what both managers would undoubtedly have been expecting.

Instead what they got was a goalfest which defied belief. Lewis Waldon, who has proven to be an outstanding discovery, got the party started in the game's opening minute. Racing onto Gio Wrona's hook over the top, which defender Jack Thompson-Wheeler failed to head clear, the forward fired in a superb half volley from twenty yards out that Henry Craven could do little about.

Within minutes the Binfield 'keeper had plucked the ball from the back of his net a further two times. Rory Sproule got both of them. He first beat Craven at his near post from a tight angle after latching onto Steve Yearley's long ball forward and cutting inside. Second later, Waldon beat the offside trap before squaring to his strike partner, who had a simple tap in to extend the lead further.

After such a frenetic start there was finally a brief period of respite. But it didn't last long. Midway through the half, Jonny Aitkenhead's ball over the top caused a horrendous mix up between Craven and Gary Smith, which Waldon seized to make it 4-0 before Harvey Scholes got in on the act, producing a neat finish on the turn from Bradley Clark's square pass to make it five seconds later.

While it had been one-way traffic, it was as though every Bassett shot was finding the back of the net. And though Brad Pagliaroli did pull one back for the visitors, scoring with a powerful left-footed drive, Waldon made sure his side went into the break with a five goal advantage as he completed a hugely deserved hat-trick, heading in at the near post from a Wrona corner on the stroke of half time.

The opening period must have left both managers as shellshocked as one another. Every Bassett touched had turned to gold in as good as 45 minutes of football as they'll ever put together, while for Binfield it was a nightmare of epic proportions. Their evening got worse on the hour when Scholes slotted home his second, finishing neatly after latching onto a lofted Kai Robinson through ball.

Late goals from Luke Hayden, who finished coolly after beating the offside trap, and Sean Moore, who fired in from the edge of the area after Dan Lawrence was only able to punch away a cross, did restore some level of pride for the visitors, making sure they at least had the final say, while punishing Bassett for having taken their foot off the pedal. From such a commanding position, you couldn't really blame them for easing up a little though, especially given the packed December schedule that lies ahead of them. The trick is now to take momentum from what must rank as one of the best victories for the club in many a year, and build upon it. First though, there's a need to savour a special, special evening.

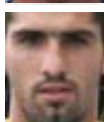

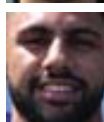

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

Our Visitors History

Binfield • Club History



Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt – a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the member- ship, with over 20 teams playing every weekend – this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013. We're also in our fourth season of a partnership scheme with Reading FC where some of our younger players have the opportunity to train with Reading. In 2003 we added an Allied Counties Youth team which is now providing a steady stream of talented young players ready for Senior football for the Reserves and 1st Team. Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team and Veterans. We won the Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHSport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup – and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the Hellenic Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

Seasons 2017/18 saw great progress at the club. With the successful building of new dressing rooms, disabled access paths and fencing together with a clubhouse refurbishment . On the pitch the 1st team finished 7th in the Premier Division and won the Floodlit cup with a 2-1 win over all conquering Thatcham Town, whilst the reserves finished 4th in the Suburban Premier and the Youth team won the Allied Counties South Division.

Ultimately the step up to the next tier of English non league football is our aim.

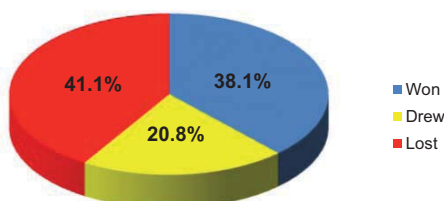

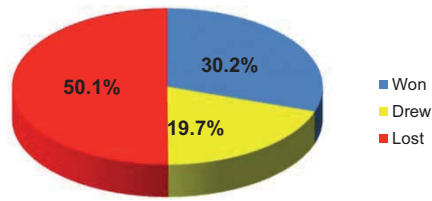

After the positive visit of the League Chairman, which gave hope that the League were listening to our concerns regarding fixture scheduling, the club has now finally received a written response from the League to our various letters and our constructive suggestions to the fixture scheduling.

Unfortunately, the hope given by Bob's visit has been dashed somewhat as the email from the League CEO Brian King noted that "myself, the UHL Executive and Officers are happy with the progress made this season and cannot see any reason why we should consider any radical changes for season 2020-2021 without being presented with irrefutable evidence of the need so to do so". He then used the number of cup games to justify the level of games played by each club. Nowhere in the analysis supporting the response did it address our concerns about the long sequences of home or away games nor playing the same opponents twice in short order. If the League CEO doesn't see anything wrong with us playing the same three teams twice in our opening eight fixtures, having the same two opponents to play twice in our last seven league games, or Shrivensham having nine of their last ten games away from home, Windsor having 11 of their last 14 games at home or there being such a large disparity in the number of league games played by each team at the turn of the year, it is pointless writing to them again.

In an alternative approach to trying to get traction on this matter, in today's programme we publish what we believe is a format for a fixture list and planning we think that clubs would prefer. It is nowhere near perfect, but we believe it is better than what has been served up this season.

What we have produced is set of fixtures for next season to prove the concept that you can design something to deal with the points we as a club have been raising but seem to be getting ignored by the League as being all too difficult. It took just over 2 days in total to bring together, was done without using the Advanced Scheduler in FA Full-Time because we obviously do not have access to that, and the use of Full-Time could and would certainly improve it.

We had to make some assumptions about the constitution for next season which are bound to be wrong, but this is just to help with the illustration. We assumed:

- Constitution back up to 20 teams;
- Brackley Town Saints promoted (even if just to wind-up the Wantage contingent);
- No team relegated from Step 4 to Hellenic on basis the FA will be scrabbling for teams again;
- Despite their desire to move back to the Spartan South Midland League, Holmer Green are left in the Hellenic for now;
- Longlevens relegated;
- Easington Sports, Burnham and Cheltenham Saracens are promoted at the end of this season: and
- Perhaps, most controversially, the Supplementary Cup is killed for Premier Division teams (enough cups already for Premier sides with the FAC, FAV, County Cup, League Cup and Floodlit Cup).

The fixture list we have produced, which is shown on the next few pages, specifically:

- Allows fully for ground share between Windsor and Virginia Water;
- Produces an almost symmetrical programme (would be symmetrical but for allowing the reverse of the Bank Holiday fixtures to fall in Christmas week);
- Midweek games generally the shorter distance matches giving reduced midweek travel (Easington not brilliant but not helped by their geographic positioning);
- No team plays more than 2 consecutive home or away fixtures in initial draft of fixture programme anywhere in the season (only thing that would change this would be postponed games re-scheduling and then cup fixtures could give longer runs);
- Full set of fixtures scheduled on one of the early FA Cup dates with then plenty of midweek dates for re-arranging where FA Cup gets in the way, allowing catch-up so teams playing the same number of games throughout the season (**like they do in the EPL and EFL**); and
- After Sam's rant on Your Sport Swindon, no games on Boxing Day **unless** both clubs agree to bring forward the game on the Saturday between Christmas and New Year to Boxing Day.

Have a look and see what you think. Hopefully the excellent Football in Bracknell team will be here today covering the game and give their thoughts on the matter as we know they were unhappy at the start of the season with the fixture scheduling.

Fixtures - Special Feature

Some of you will be aware that we as a club have been very unhappy with the fixture scheduling this season in the UHLSport Hellenic League ("the League"). Whenever we visit other clubs it seems to always be the main topic of conversation with other club committees at half time or before the matches. The programme for Windsor's home game on Tuesday night against our visitors today Binfield described it as "terribly lop-sided", with them having 11 of their final 14 games at home. We have written to the League on at least 3 occasions this season and also made representations to League Chairman Bob Dalling when he visited us at the beginning of November for the Abingdon United game to discuss our concerns.

The specific points we have raised with the League over the season have included:

- The high number of home games scheduled in a short space of time. With reference to playing 5 consecutive games at home in a short space of time, we noted that this places undue pressure on unpaid volunteers who have to ensure the fixtures take place and all required matters are dealt with (e.g. production of programmes, hospitality etc);
- There are also cash flow implications from long sequences of home or away games. Whilst having those 5 games of gate receipts at a time when crowds are normally at their best, it is obviously good news, there will also be five lots of officials to pay in a short space of time. By playing so many home games at the start of the season, by definition we would then have long spells without a home game in the winter months when cash flows are at their most stretched (and this proved to be correct as the RWBSA particularly suffered with less bar activity over the normally lucrative Christmas period). With hindsight the heavy scheduling at the start of the season has also meant we have had two free Saturdays in both January and February when no fixtures have been scheduled for us, which makes all those midweek games at the start of the season all the more galling.
- The fact that in our first eight league fixtures we played the same three teams twice. We were not the only team impacted by this poor planning. Playing a side twice in a short space of time is not clever in our view. The reasons why we do not consider this to be intelligent fixture scheduling are:
 - Were an unsavoury incident to take place in the first fixture between two sides (thankfully to date there have been no such incidents), playing the two games so close to each other runs the risk of that incident spilling over into the next game. Time is a great healer for allowing matters to calm down;
 - Teams by definition change their personnel quite heavily over a season and playing the same side twice in such a short space of time has the potential to distort the competition. Based on previous seasons other clubs would certainly have been better off playing us in the second half of the season!
- Our pitch is probably one of the best maintained in the League and they gave us a financial reward for being the only club in the League last season not to call a game off. It seems irrational to then give us so many home games in August and September when all pitches are usually in good condition and not subject to the impact of the wet and cold weather.
- The leagues planning was impacting on other leagues, specifically for us the Wiltshire Country League, with home fixtures being scheduled at short notice, usurping games scheduled in those other leagues with just five days' notice. The Hellenic should be co-operating with leagues like the Wiltshire County League so as to encourage sides from that league and the other Step 7 leagues to move up through the National League System to the Hellenic. Given the shortage of numbers in the Step 6 Hellenic divisions we would have thought they would want to encourage good relations with the Step 7 leagues rather than forcing them to change their fixtures at five days' notice without any second thought on the matter. Other well-run leagues, like the Western League, do co-operate with their feeder leagues and the Hellenic should look to be more co-operative and understanding.

When our original letter, amongst others, seemed to be one of the reasons for the "UHLSPORT Hellenic League Fixtures - What the Hell is Happening?" Press Release issued by the League in October, which interestingly confirmed, using the League's own metrics, that we were way ahead of where the League said we should be in terms of games played, we wrote to the League again with some suggestions as to how they could use the Advanced Fixture Scheduler in FA Full-Time to improve matters next season. We then had what we thought was a positive meeting with League Chairman Bob Dalling.

A frustrating afternoon for the top two as they both saw their games postponed. The key match between Football ID and Kintbury Rangers, which was set to be the featured game in today's round-up, was postponed due to the pitch and the match between Wroughton and Devizes Town Res was postponed with Devizes losing their manager in the week and a number of players also departing. In the games that did go ahead, two sides who met last week met again in the reverse fixture. The previous Saturday Shrewton United had won 1-0 against Westbury United Res, a Dan Burton goal being the difference between the sides in a tight affair. Shrewton went into the game looking to close the gap on the top two but were without a number of their normal starting eleven. Once again it was a close affair with visitors Shrewton generally on top in the opening stages of the game, creating three or four good chances in the opening 20 minutes. The best chance fell to last week's goal scorer Burton but he blasted wide from inside the area. Neither side was able to find the net in the opening half and it remained goalless at the break. The deadlock was finally broken early in the second half. Following some great work from Ronan Clancy, who ended a powerful run into the box, with a neat cut back to Jaden Hier, who calmly slotted into the net from the edge of the area. Shrewton then had Jake Watson sent off and despite the one man disadvantage they dug deep to hold out and deny the home side Westbury an equaliser to repeat last week's 1-0 win and close the gap to second placed Wroughton to just two points.

Fourth placed Melksham Town Res were another side looking to keep in touch with the top two. They travelled to play a Purton side who were looking to build on last week's great win over Wroughton. When they met back in September Melksham won 2-0 but they were well and truly beaten on a wet afternoon at the Red House going down 5-0 to a Purton side who have now beaten two of the top four sides in a fortnight. William Backhouse led the way for Purton with two goals, taking him into double figures for the season, another playing moving onto the ten-goal mark was Jack Duckers and goals from Mark Chatwin and Callum Hall completed the scoring for Purton. Fifth placed Trowbridge Town, with just one defeat in their previous seven, went into their game with Malmesbury Victoria Development in good form but faced a tough test against a side who themselves had lost just once in their previous five matches. Leading scorer Joshua Hard put Trowbridge in front early on with his 18th of the season and it remained 1-0 at the break. Malmesbury Victoria Development stepped it up after the break and were rewarded when Sam Jenner scored the equaliser with his first of the season to give them a share of the points. Despite the dropped points Trowbridge remain in fifth spot on goal difference and Malmesbury remain in 14th place.

Having arrived at the Football ID ground to discover their game against Kintbury game had been postponed a short diversion was made to the Southbank ground in Corsham. Corsham Town Res had defeated Royal Wootton Bassett Town at their place on the opening day of the season. When the two sides met again on Saturday Corsham were looking to defend an unbeaten home record which had seen them go nine games unbeaten at the Southbank. They suffered an early setback when Nick Mason put Royal Wootton Bassett Town in front on two minutes when a corner somehow eluded the Corsham defence and found Mason at the far post who slotted it home. Zac Hillier went close on 20 minutes when he slid in to meet a cross only to see it go agonisingly over the bar. He was not to be denied a minute later however when he met a superb cross from Ross Lye to slide in to net the equaliser. Steve Yeardeley restored Royal Wootton Bassett Town's lead just after the half hour mark when he scored following a neat passing interchange with Mani Roper. Corsham restored parity again eight minutes from the break when the Bassett keeper Ross Milloy brought down a Corsham player in the box. The keeper nearly made amends when he guessed which way Ross Lye's penalty was going but the penalty was hit without enough power that he was unable to keep it out. It was Corsham who came out of the blocks quicker after the break and within two minutes of the restart they were ahead for the first time in the match when Lye headed in unmarked on a corner for his second of the game. Moments later Royal Wootton Bassett came close to levelling matters when a cross-come-shot from Steve Yeardeley came back off the bar. However, it was Corsham who looked the more likely to score again with Dan Lardner causing the visitors defence problems all afternoon. Lardner went close on 70 minutes when he hit the bar with a powerful shot and went close again when he was denied by the Royal Wootton Bassett keeper Milloy. Next it was Corsham keeper Joe King who was called into action as he saved superbly from Yeardeley to deny the visitors an equaliser. Despite the visitors pushing hard for that equaliser in the closing stages Corsham hung on to take all three points and extend that unbeaten home record to ten games.

Ludgershall Sports must dread their trips to Cricklade Leisure Centre. Last season Cricklade Town had smashed eleven goals without reply past Saturday's visitors and the season before it had been nine. It was expected to be a much tighter affair this season as Ludgershall came into the game in their best form of the season having gone unbeaten in their previous five matches. However, once again Cricklade found their shooting boots to score freely against their visitors. Elliot Corp and Bradley Farrell put Cricklade 2-0 at the break and by the time the second half was just 15 minutes old they had increased their tally to six to just one for the visitors in reply. They then took their foot off the gas a bit in the closing stages and allowed the visitors to get another two whilst adding one more of their own to finally run out 7-3 winners. Second half scorers for Cricklade were Elliott Corp with his second of the game and ninth of the season, and both Jonathan Peachey-Score and Jason Tatum bagged a brace.

After seven straight defeats bottom of the table Pewsley Vale Dev looked to end that run and move off the bottom when they took on near neighbours Marlborough Town. With Marlborough only ending their own four game losing streak last week it was expected to be a tight affair but in the end Marlborough Town ran out comfortable 4-0 winners. Aaron Presley scored twice to take his total for the season to 11 and there were first goals of the season for both Nathan Good and Simon Neale to give Marlborough Town the bragging rights over their near neighbours.

Saturday saw them pick up a point in a 1-1 draw with Hemel Hempstead, Nick McCootie with a 55th minute equaliser for Chippenham who had trailed to a 33rd minute goal for the visitors.

At Step 3, the two Wiltshire sides are also both having decent seasons. Salisbury are currently second in the table, four points behind leaders Taunton Town with a game in hand. Saturday's home game with Farnborough was postponed but on Tuesday night they made it through to the final of the Wiltshire Senior Cup with a 6-0 win over Laverstock & Ford at Melksham. Swindon Supermarine are down in 10th spot, five points off the play-off places. Last Saturday they dropped two points when they were held at home by Poole Town in an entertaining game. Conor McDonagh had given Supermarine a half time lead, but they were pegged back by an equaliser six minutes from time to share the points. They were also involved in Wiltshire Senior Cup action on Wednesday night here at the Gerard Buxton Ground when they took on Westbury United. Westbury took the lead but Swindon Supermarine equalised from the penalty spot in the closing minutes to send the game into extra time. Three extra-time goals sealed it for Supermarine and lined up an all Southern League final encounter with Salisbury.

The two Wiltshire sides promoted to Step 4 at the end of last season have both acclimatised to life at the higher level quickly. Melksham town currently sit 10th in the Evostick Southern league Division One South with Highworth Town two places below them. Both are well clear of the relegation positions and again are expected to be looking upwards rather than downwards for the rest of the season. Melksham's game last Saturday fell victim to the weather whilst Highworth lost 3-0 away at league leaders Blackfield & Langley.

At Sept 5, whilst we are still in the upper reaches of the UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division we are vulnerable to being overtaken by a number of sides once they all play their games in hand. We should be safe and a good finish to the season could see us achieve our best ever showing at this level. In the Wessex league, Bemerton Heath Harlequins have slipped down the table and are currently third from bottom following Tuesday's 2-2 draw at Brokenhurst, Gerson Ramos and Dylan Manufor with the Bemerton goals. In the western league, Westbury United have finally lost their unbeaten tag, with Bradford Town defeating them on Boxing Day and then losing also to both Bridgwater Town and leaders Willand Rovers. They remain in second spot six points adrift of Willand and are also vulnerable to Bitton overtaking them if they win at least one of their games in hand. It has still been a good season for Westbury, and they remain in the promotion mix. Bradford Town are down in 8th spot, some 20 points behind Westbury and for them the promotion race looks to now be over. At Step 6 in the Western League Calne Town are the highest placed Wiltshire side, with Corsham Town not far behind. Chippenham Park have struggled at the other end of the table, but results have picked up recently since they signed the two strikers from Cricklade Town. Malmesbury Victoria are still in the promotion mix in Division One West of the UHlsport Hellenic League. They are five points adrift of leaders Cheltenham Saracens having played one more game and will need to avoid dropping too many more points if they are to get into the Premier League next season. In the Wessex Division One, Amesbury look like they will be making a quick return to the Premier Division, but the departure of manager Dave Coker still seems bizarre given how well they have gone this season.

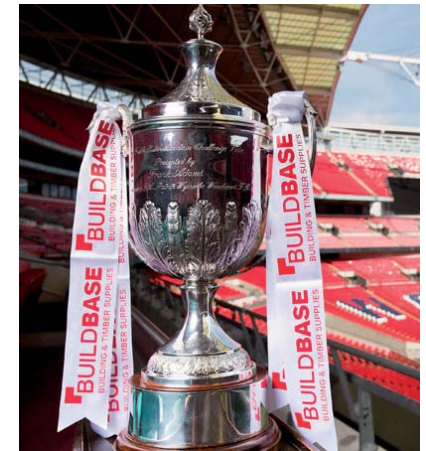

They currently sit second in the Cirencester & District League after a recent run of good results. In the Swindon & District League Ruby Removals lead the way from Stratton Juniors. In the Trowbridge & District League, Hilperton and Heyetsbury are level on top on 27 points but watch out for Holt who are just two points behind with three games in hand in what looks a very interesting title race.

Headline: Two further points in League quest

On a day when most league games in the Swindon area were called off because of waterlogged pitches, Wootton Bassett were able to continue their pursuit of the Division 1 title when they entertained Bemerton. From the start, Wootton Bassett, playing their first game for three weeks, quickly took command of the game and played some good attractive football. Headline: Bassett in fierce competitive game

In a fiercely competitive game at Rylands Way on Saturday, Wootton Bassett just managed to keep their unbeaten record intact, with an equaliser five minutes from time by Vines. On a pitch which played quite superbly considering the amount of rain which has fallen recently, these two title contenders had been locked in battle through a goalless first half. Ferndale who were playing with slope and wind, opened the game very positively and were obviously extremely psyched up for this encounter. Playing their football from the back they made the most of the natural advantages and Rees, in the Bassett goal, had to be alert, coming out quickly to deny the Ferndale forwards more than once. Under this pressure Bassett displayed their defensive qualities, the back four all looking solid. However, it was not all Bassett defence, indeed several times they broke quickly and caused problems for Ferndale. An early blow for Bassett was the substitution of Damon York, with a badly bruised shinbone, replaced by Mick Karn.

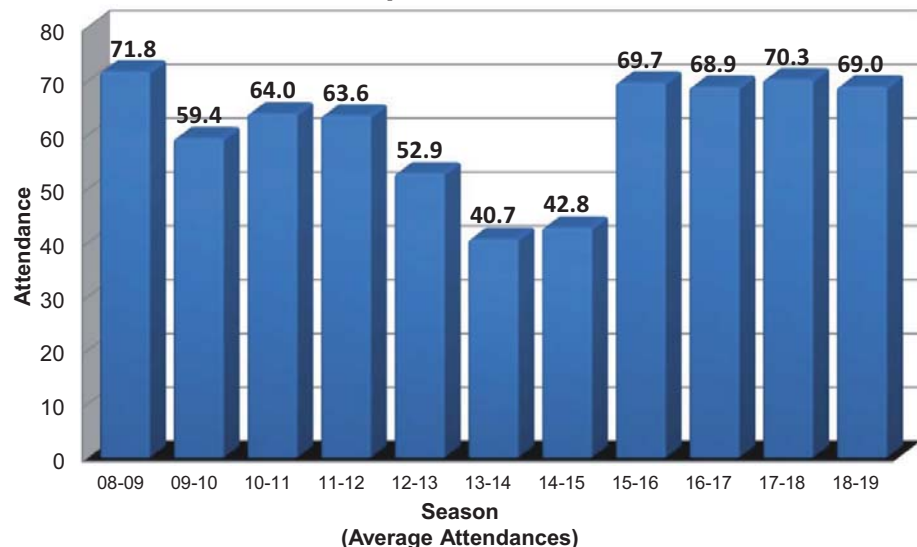

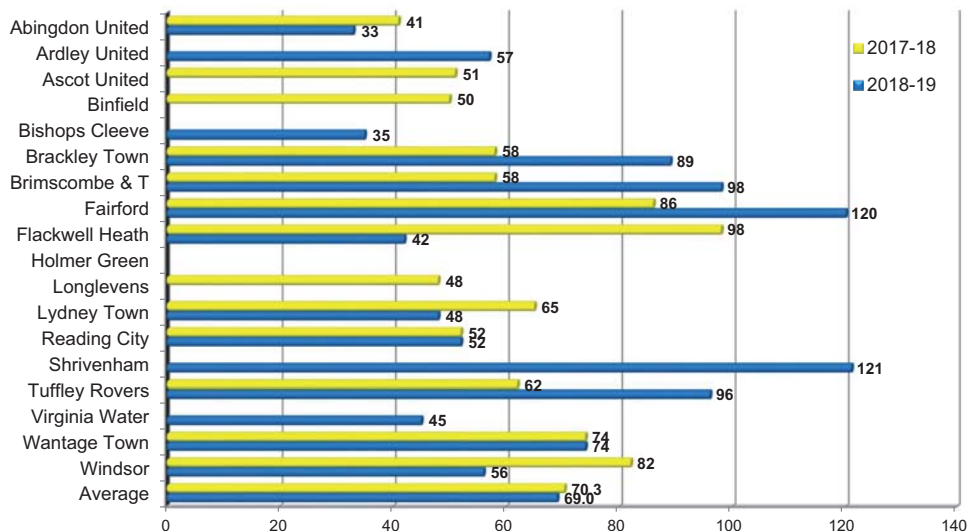

RWBTFC Attendances - Season 2018-19 (and comparison to 2017-18)



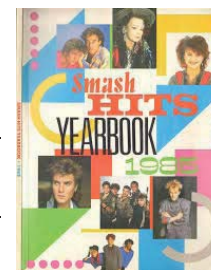
