# From the Youth Section

## Agony and ecstasy in County Cup finals

While goals were at a premium, there was plenty of drama in both Wiltshire County Cup finals involving Royal Wootton Bassett Town's youth teams.

And though the Under 18 Blues ultimately wound up collecting runners-up medals, the Under 16 Blues laid their hands on the trophy for the second season in a row.

Both finals were closely fought, with the Youth Cup showpiece involving the Under 18s requiring penalties to determine a winner.

For the Under 16 Blues, Luca Robinson's 77th minute goal ensured extra time was not needed.

He struck, racing onto a clever dink over the top before poking beyond the advancing Chippenham Town Youth 'keeper to seal a 1-0 victory for Bassett.

Defences were largely on top throughout an edgy affair. Bassett did have to take the lead before half time when awarded a penalty, but a fine save from the Chippenham 'keeper preserved parity.

Robinson's late goal means Bassett can continue to dream of a treble. Along with the Under 18 and 15 Blues, they face a North Wilts League Cup semi final next week, and can still overhaul Division One leaders Cirencester Town Centurions if they win their games in hand in the league.

Meanwhile, the Under 18 Blues took holders Chippenham Town all the way. However, after neither side was able to break the deadlock after 120 nerve-wracking minutes of football, Chippenham took the spoils as they triumphed 5-4 on penalties.

Playing against a side top of the Somerset Youth Floodlit League Central Division and containing a number of players who have featured for Chippenham Park in Western League Division One this season, Bassett - North Wilts League Division One leaders - were always going to be underdogs.

But they rose to the occasion, battling bravely and coming close to becoming the first Bassett team to lay their hands on the Youth Cup.

Yet, ultimately they would be thwarted in that aim, losing in the cruellest of circumstances.

Still, with a North Wilts League Cup semi final to come as well as their sights firmly set on the Division One title, there is plenty left for the team to play for.

## North Wilts League

In North Wilts League action, the Under 16 Yellows finished their campaign on a winning note and climbed from sixth to third place in the final Division Two standings.

They defeated FC Chippenham Youth 3-2, claiming victory thanks to goals from Kieren Kirby, Tom Warren and Cameron Wooten.

In Division One, the Under 15 Blues edged closer to wrapping up runners-up spot with a 4-0 triumph away against Lydiard Youth Blue in their penultimate fixture. Harry Farrow, Marcel Lewis, Otis Lewis and Kevin Prouse found the net for Bassett.

The Under 18 Yellows were also victorious. Luke Saunders' brace and a Joe Mitchell secured a 3-1 win against Cirencester Town that takes Bassett into third with two games left.

Elsewhere, the Under 12 Blues slipped to a 3-1 defeat away against Highworth Town Juniors J, the Under 12 Yellows came up just short, losing 5-3 in an eight-goal thriller against Greenmeadow Youth and the Under 14 Blues were seen off 5-0 by Swindon Supermarine.

# Bassett News

## Welcome to Holmer Green

A warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Holmer Green for this UHlsport Hellenic League fixture. We hope all those from Holmer Green enjoy their short stay with us this afternoon and we wish them a safe journey home back down the M4. The first meeting between the two clubs back in November was a close affair and just as it looked like we would be returning with all three points we conceded an injury time equaliser to share the points in a 2-2 draw.

Holmer Green got some great radio airplay from their local radio station following their decision not to travel to Thornbury Town in the Supplementary Cup in January, highlighting the distances involved in the league and the impact scheduling at short notice can have on clubs.

## Ascot Game

# Visitors - Tourist Information

## Introduction to the Village

Holmer Green is a small village in Buckinghamshire, England. It is next to Hazlemere, about 3 miles (5 km) south of Great Missenden. In 2008 the village formally celebrated 800 years of recorded settlement. Holmer Green is named after the manor of Holmer that covered a significant part of the parish of Little Missenden in the Middle Ages.

The Village now has around 4,000 inhabitants.

## Interesting Facts

In the hundred years between 1850 and 1950, the village became well-known locally for its cherry orchards.

In 2016 Holmer Green made the news when five people were injured after a bus hit a house in Holmer Green on the Wycombe Road. Firefighters from High Wycombe and Aylesbury went to the scene, but no-one was trapped. Two men and a woman who were on the bus, and a man and woman who were in the house were treated by ambulance crews.

## Famous Residents

TV presenter Fern Britton is the most famous resident of Holmer Green along with her husband celebrity chef Phil Vickery.



Actor Aaron Taylor-Johnson, who starred in the John Lennon biopic Nowhere Boy and the Kick-Ass films grew up in the village and once controversially described it as "a nothing sort of place". He attended Holmer Green Upper School as did James Corden, who lived in nearby Hazlemere. Other well known alumni of the school include Daniel Hooper aka Swampy, the environmental activist, and former West Ham and Swindon footballer Bobby Barnes.

## Nearest railway station

Holmer Green sits between High Wycombe which has a railway station 4 miles away and

Amersham which has both a railway station and a London Underground station that are just over 5 miles away. The railway stations are on the Chiltern Railways line.

## Nearest Pubs to Ground

The nearest pub to the ground is the Old Oak (pictured) which is a short walk from the ground along Beech Tree Road and then turn right into New Pond Road. An alternative is the Bat & Ball which is a little further along Beech Tree Road. The third pub in the village is the Earl Howe which is situated on Earl Howe Road which you come to if you keep walking down New Pond Road and past the pond itself.



## Things to Do in Holmer Green

For the railway enthusiasts Holmer Green has its own miniature railway, run by the High Wycombe Model Engineering Club.



As well as the model railway, another area of local interest is Penn Wood, a 450-acre woodland on Holmer Green's southern fringe managed by the Woodland Trust.

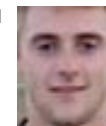

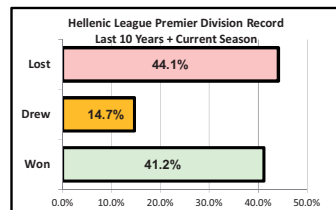
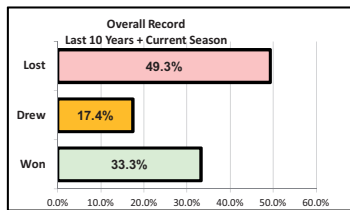

## Late lapse denies Bassett at the death

For the second game in a row, a late goal denied Royal Wootton Bassett Town all three points as they drew 2-2 away against Holmer Green.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town conceded in the first and ninetieth minutes as lapses in concentration at those two points in the game meant they were held to a 2-2 draw away against Holmer Green.

Both goals for the hosts came from long balls over the top beating the Bassett defence, meaning it was another case of cheaply conceded goals resulting in Sam Collier's team dropping points.

And, after impressive strikes from Nick Stanley and Brad Pagliaroli in the final minutes of the opening period, Bassett appeared in control for most of the second half. But they were unable to capitalised on a number of good chances to seal what would have been only their second away win of the season.

A point is certainly no bad outcome, particularly from a match against a Holmer Green side who have been strong when on home turf. Yet, you still get the nagging feeling that, given the position they were in with just moments remaining, that in the long run this will be seen as a case of two points lost.

Saying that, however, Bassett appeared as though they were going to be in for a long afternoon when they went behind after less than sixty seconds.

James Britnell flicked on 'keeper Aaron Brown's long clearance out from the back and, with Carl Evans having hesitated as to whether to challenge for the ball or stick with his man, Lewis Workman found himself alone in behind the visitors' back line and lifted a cool effort over the onrushing Charlie McCready.

It was a disappointing goal to let in and did not make things any easier for Bassett who looked nervous in the opening exchanges.

Their hosts' direct style was causing them problems and could have resulted in their advantage being extended. After getting between McCready and Dan Cole, Workman hooked another attempted lob narrowly off target, while the burly Britnell headed just over from a whipped in Workman cross.

A Holmer Green counter attack then saw winger Jonathan Cox skip past McCready before his cutback was headed inches wide of the left post by an unmarked Workman.

Eventually though, Bassett established a foothold in the game and were certainly the better team for the final quarter of an hour of the first half.

Frontmen Stanley and Pagliaroli asked questions of the Holmer Green defence in different ways. And, after initially misfiring when presented with chances to shoot at goal, they both found the net.

Six minutes before the interval, Tony Joyce played a perfectly weighted ball in behind the Holmer Green defence, which Stanley, having beat the offside trap, raced onto, and he lifted a deft lob over Aaron Brown and into the net.

Then, a minute before half time, Pagliaroli blasted Bassett in front. Taking an inside pass from the equally impressive Rob Lincoln, he twisted and turned his way past three defenders on the edge of the box, and thundered a unstoppable drive into the near top corner from what remained a difficult angle.

When you see crowds of 1,628 at Step 5, eight tiers below the Premier League, as Worksop Town had last weekend for their top-of-the-table clash with Penistone, it is something to be proud of.

We've had several messages from Brazilians wanting to know more about the leagues and if they can buy the paper - Non-League is only getting bigger and better!

# Our History

## Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenvandaele.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.



# Opponents Match Report

## View From The Away Side

Royal Wootton Bassett Town fell to a heavy 4-0 home defeat against Ascot United. This is the match report Ascot prepared for their website.

## Royal Wootton Bassett Town 0 Ascot United 4

Ascot United delivered manager Jamie Tompkins' request for a response to last week's defeat by turning on the style in a resounding four-nil win at Royal Wootton Bassett. Makeshift defender Harry Laffin weighed in with two goals and earned himself the man-of-the match award, although it was a superb all-round display in their penultimate league fixture.

With their defence decimated by a plethora of injury, unavailability and suspension, Ascot pushed Laffin back into defence alongside recalled Development Side regular Ryan Cooper. Indeed, their defence looked ragged early on and afforded Bassett too much space, although chief tormentor Matty Bennett was unable to capitalize from a brace of bright openings.

When they did finally emerge from their slumber, Ascot looked threatening and Kai Walters' honesty when impeded clean through might have otherwise earned his side a penalty after 20 minutes. Luqman Kassim then headed over from George Lock's cross after patient build-up and Walters would see a header comfortably cleared off the line, but Sam Packer's off-balance high-and-wide effort – a difficult chance after Bennett had crossed – reminded the visitors of the threat at the other end.

However, Ascot finished the half strongly and after Price's free kick had fizzed a foot wide two minutes before the break, Jamie Tompkins' men struck on the stroke of half time. This time, Elliott Carey got just enough on Jonny Denton's free kick, and although the ball ended up somewhat fortuitously at Laffin's feet, he punished an unforgivable amount of space afforded to him in the middle of the penalty area by swivelling to hammer home a left-footed effort into the left-hand corner.

After that relatively even first-half, the second half was a one-sided affair with Ascot on the front-foot throughout, and they deservedly added three more goals. Laffin added his second goal six minutes in – a penalty conceded for hand-ball – although at the other end Carey's header would avert danger as substitute Mani Roper swung in a dangerous cross. However, Lamin Sankoh would have a big hand in the visitors' next goal. His 68th minute contribution was a simply sumptuous dance down the left wing – taking out three defenders with quick feet – before cutting the ball back to Price, who rifled low and hard into the net from 12 yards.

The home side might have grabbed a goal only for Packer to glance a header wide of the right-hand post – Gray beaten – but the Yellamen were soon on the attack once again in the move of the match. This time, Sankoh threaded the ball through to Kassim, and after had cut the ball back, Price leathered the ball goal-bound only for 'keeper Kevin Sawyer to produce a stunning double save – including the follow up from Sheridan Campbell – which squirmed away from danger.

Ascot then saw a near-fourth goal cleared off the line with just over ten minutes remaining before Gray stood up well to beat Bennett's angled shot away for Bassett, but it was Ascot who had the last word. Price – who ran Laffin close for man-of-the-match - combined with Kassim, and he raced forwards before cutting back onto his right and firing a deflected effort past Sawyer. Next up for Ascot is a return to Brackley in the floodlit cup on Tuesday, and on today's performance they will expect a better result than their mauling at St James' Park last weekend.

Young, energetic and playing some flowing football, Ascot United proved much too strong for Royal Wootton Bassett Town in the return fixture between the two teams as Sam Collier's team suffered a 4-0 loss, the heaviest home league reverse of the Bassett manager's tenure.

It wasn't until the stroke of half time that the visitors, who Bassett had held to a 1-1 draw in Berkshire at the beginning of the month, went ahead. But they quickly pulled away in the second period, aided by a penalty for handball shortly after the restart.

It was a chastening defeat for Bassett, whose hopes of achieving a first ever top half finish in the Hellenic League Premier Division sustained a heavy blow.

Sam Packer and Josh Shama both had good opportunities to give Bassett the lead in the opening period. But the visitors were not short of chances either, with Dan Price and Elliott Carey narrowly missing the target and the latter also having a header cleared away off the line.

Ascot eventually went in front in the final minute of the half, Carey knocking the ball down for defender Harry Lafin, who fired in on the turn.

Within five minutes of the second half getting underway, the defender had his second as he made no mistake from the spot following a handball.

The rout was then on shortly after the hour. A well-worked team move eventually led to Lamin Sankoh teeing up Price, and he sent a low drive beyond the reach of Kevin Sawyer in the Bassett goal.

After Sawyer did well to keep out a Sankoh effort, Bassett had a rare second half opportunity as Matt Bennett came close.

Ascot then proceeded to break down the other end and grabbed their fourth as Luqman Kassim picked out the far corner from distance.

With three games remaining, Bassett now find themselves in tenth place. As most teams above them possess games in hand, it will take at least two wins from those final trio of fixtures to at least stand a chance of cracking the top nine.

Still, it's been a relatively successful season, though once again a post-Christmas downturn in form has served to undermine a positive start. In fact, in each of their last four campaigns, Bassett have won just nine times in the league in January, February, March and April. Over the course of the past two, they currently have only two victories in those months.



# Our Visitors History

## Holmer Green • Club History

Originally founded in 1908, Holmer played initially in The Chesham and District League. Matches were played at Campbell's Meadow, (now the Rosetti Estate), close to a tennis racket factory. Sometime before 1934 the Club moved to Holmer Green Common and set up headquarters in The Bat and Ball. In 1934 the Club switched to The Wycombe Combination League. The first known trophy to be won by Holmer Green was The Chesham Charity Cup in 1939, the first of 28 Cups and Championships won thus far by the 1st XI. Foremost among these, pre-1975, were the successes in winning the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup in both 1953 and 1965.



The early 70's saw the start of a very successful thirty years in the Club's history. Holmer Green moved to their present ground, Watchet Lane, in 1975 when the new Holmer Green Sports Association pavilion at Watchet Lane was fully ready. Holmer won The Berks & Bucks Intermediate Cup in 1976-77. Senior Status was thus achieved, and since then the Club has striven to play at the highest level possible for a strictly amateur club.

The Club, through current President John Anderson, was heavily involved in the moves that set up The Chiltonian League in 1984. That League embraced clubs from no less than six different counties, before being swallowed up by The Hellenic. Holmer had been very successful in the Chiltonian, and believed that a move to a better run league, where the clubs were encouraged to improve facilities, should be the next step. The Chiltonian, only naturally, were reluctant to lose their "flagship" club and tried to stop the move to the The South Midlands League. Not until August 17th 1995 did Holmer Green finally exhaust the FA's appeal system, successfully, being allowed to switch Leagues.

This move gave Holmer Green the impetus to finally erect a Stand, now called The Don Want Stand in honour of their former long-serving groundsman who still helps out with his time and expertise, on a regular basis. Don was presented with some mementos in November 2014 to mark his 50 years with the Football Club.

Over the following years huge strides were taken which made possible the erection of floodlights, thanks to the fund-raising, grants, and a loan from ex- player Mark Williams. Premier Division status was achieved in 1999 after winning the Senior Division twice in four seasons, being 2nd and 4th in between. A financial crisis arose some 15 or so years ago, after more ground improvements, Mick Bowler came in to help steady the ship, with great financial assistance from former player John Walters. Centenary events started with a visit from a full Wycombe Wanderers team in July 2007 when the ground record of over 800 was recorded.

In 2008 the Senior Club formally merged with Holmer Green Minors FC to become "One Club" and this occasion coincided with the new Club as a whole being named " Club of the Year 2008" by Bucks & Milton Keynes Sports Partnership.

Season 2008-09 was Holmer's 10th successive one in the Premier Division. After an unexpectedly long stay in the Premier Division Holmer Green was demoted to Division One for season 2009-10 due to Ground Grading, despite avoiding the two relegation positions.

Work immediately began to regain the "F" Grading required for Step 5 football to return to Watchet Lane. With Manager Jason Weinrabe, who had twice led the Club to avoid the relegation positions in difficult circumstances, going to work in Australia, the Club promoted Coach Chris Allen to the Manager's job. The 1st XI won the First Division by three points in 2009-10 losing only 3 of 40 games. The coveted "F" Grading was achieved again in 2011. Premier Division status was maintained until and including season 2017-18, when Holmer Green FC was transferred laterally across the FA's Non-League Pyramid to the UHlsport Hellenic League.

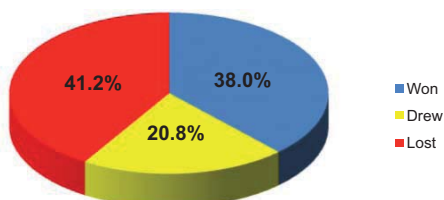

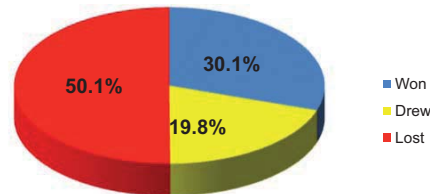

# From The development Side

## 23rd March 2019

There was midweek action under lights this week in the Premier Division of the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League when Malmesbury Victoria Development and Devizes Town Res met at the Flying Monk Ground in a battle at the lower end of the table. Malmesbury Victoria took a huge step towards safety with an impressive 6-0 win over their visitors. Gareth Jones set the Vics on their way when he beat the Devizes keeper having been put clean through for a one-on-one. The visitors Devizes then had a player sent-off and the home side took advantage right on the stroke of half-time. A shot from distance from Jones went close to extending the lead but the ball fell to Josh Hughes who was following up to make it 2-0 at the break. That lead was extended further shortly after the break, Jones scoring his second of the game to make it 3-0 and then Sam Jenner almost immediately made it four for the home side. However, this was Gareth Jones' starring night and the speedy youngster netted twice more to give him four in the game, doubling his goal tally for the season in the process.

League leaders Wroughton were involved in the top match of the day with Trowbridge Town, who had gone seven games unbeaten ahead of their encounter today and the game lived up to expectations as the two sides put on an entertaining show for the crowd. Visitors Trowbridge Town went in front thanks to a goal from Matt Dixon but Craig Bowden then equalised for the league leaders from the penalty spot. Both sides pushed for a winner but in the end had to settle for a share of the points.

Corsham Town have the honour of going all season unbeaten at the Southbank Ground. Their final home game of the season saw them take on Ludgershall Sports and goals from Ed McCormack, Corey Harbour-Burgess and Dan Lardner, with his ninth of the season, secured a comfortable 3-0 win. Corsham remain in fourth place in the table whilst Ludgershall drop a place down to 10<sup>th</sup> with the two sides set to meet again next week.

Another side with an impressive home record were Melksham Town Reserves. Before today's encounter with reigning league champions Kintbury Rangers they had won all ten of their home league fixtures this season. The visit of Kintbury Rangers was expected to be a stern test of that impressive record but that 100% record remains intact tonight after Melksham secured an impressive 2-1 win. Melksham led 1-0 at the break through an Adam Mitchell goal from 35 yards out but the league's leading scorer Shaun Thorp equalised from the penalty spot after the break. However, another goal from Mitchell, who headed in from a Jordan Croad cross, put the home side Melksham back in front and whilst Kintbury created a couple of good chances to get back on level terms they were missed, and Melksham held on for the three points. The loss means that Wroughton now open up a seven-point lead at the top of the table, although Kintbury have two games in hand with the two sides scheduled to meet in the final league game of the season.

Malmesbury Victoria Development were looking to build on that impressive win in midweek when they made the short trip to the Red House to take on Purton. Purton were another side who were on an impressive unbeaten run, having gone seven games unbeaten before today's match and, like Malmesbury, had also won their last match 6-0. It will be Malmesbury who will be celebrating tonight after they brought Purton's fine unbeaten run to an end in this local derby. Gareth Jones carried on from where he left off in midweek, hitting his ninth of the season, Elliott Drage with the other Malmesbury goal. Purton's leading scorer William Backhouse scored for the home side from the penalty spot for his 16<sup>th</sup> of the season. Malmesbury climbed a place to 11<sup>th</sup> in the table as a result of their third win on the bounce, Purton stay 6th.

Cricklade Town travelled to Pewsey looking to avenge their recent cup defeat when they had lost to Pewsey Vale Development in the penalty shoot-out. Having won 5-2 in the league at Cricklade last month they were also hoping to complete a league double over their opponents. However, Cricklade's cause was not helped by having a player sent off in the first half and goals from Harvey Flippance, Ethan Fishlock gave Pewsey a 3-0 win to move within a point of Devizes Town Reserves.

Football ID had given league leaders Wroughton a good game last week and were expected to provide another stern opponent for Shrewton United this afternoon. When the two sides met back in August it had finished 4-0 to Shrewton who come into today's game in good form on the back of two wins and that good run of form continued with a convincing 6-1 win. Dean Smith set them on the way from the penalty spot before Craig Appleby made it 2-0. Charlie Jackson then added a third before Craig Appleby scored his second to make it 4-0 at the break. Football ID pulled one back after the interval before Steven Holvey restored the four goal advantage for the home side. Craig Appleby then scored again to complete his hat-trick and secure that 6-1 win for Shrewton who remain a point behind Corsham in 5th spot.

The final game of the day was at the bottom end of the table today between Marlborough Town and Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development in what was the first meeting between the two sides this season. Both had lost their previous two games and were keen to return to winning form. In a really close contest the points were settled from the penalty spot eight minutes from time after Ryan Withers had been pulled back in the box. Tyrhys Mifsud stepped up to hold his nerve and fire in the resulting penalty to give Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development the three points. The win lifted them up to ninth place in the table, whilst Marlborough dropped a place to 12th.

# Moonraker



This is the penultimate Moonraker of the current season and whilst there is still a month or so of the season to go overall it has been a reasonable season for Wiltshire clubs. In the National League South, Chippenham Town currently occupy 12<sup>th</sup> place and are safe from relegation and should finish in a respectable mid-table position. On Saturday they lost narrowly away at play-off chasing Wealdstone going down to the solitary goal of the game scored by Stefan Brown on 31 minutes.

At Step 3, Salisbury remain in the play-off places but will view the 1-1 home draw against Chesham United as two points dropped rather than a point gained. Salisbury's form has dipped as this was the only point gained from their last two matches and it took a Chris Flood equaliser 13 minutes from time to save Salisbury's blushes against a side nine places below them in the table. Swindon Supermarine went down 2-1 at league leaders Weymouth Town. A controversial penalty decided matters in Weymouth's favour. Supermarine held their own for the vast majority of the first half, but a lapse in concentration from their wide men allowed Weymouth to get in down the left and set up the opening goal for Yemi Obudabe. Supermarine responded through Stuart Fleetwood shortly into the second half, however a debatable handball decision gave Weymouth the chance to respond immediately from the penalty spot and Brandon Goodship made no mistake from the penalty spot.

At Step 4 Melksham Town beat Slimbridge to move closer to the play-off places. Only five minutes into the game they were rewarded as Luke Ballinger opened his account. However, they had to wait until the 54<sup>th</sup> minute before adding to their tally when Neikell Plummer made it 2-0. Ballinger added his second five minutes from time before Slimbridge pulled one back a minute from time to make the final score 3-1 to Melksham. Melksham sit 7<sup>th</sup> in the table, four points off the play-off places. A late header 12 minutes from time from Wayne Turk earned Highworth Town a deserved point after a much improved second half performance against Mangotsfield United who had led through a 24<sup>th</sup> minute goal. Highworth remain in 14<sup>th</sup> place.

At Sept 5, whilst were going down to that heavy defeat against Ascot United, Westbury were also losing in the Western league Premier Division by a similar score at home to promotion chasing Plymouth Parkway to effectively kill off any remaining promotion aspirations for Westbury this season. Bradford Town had a good afternoon though as they won 2-0 away at Clevedon Town to remain in 8<sup>th</sup> spot, three places below Westbury but some 18 points behind their Wiltshire rivals. In the Sydenhams Wessex Premier, Bemerton Heath Harlequins lost again, this time going down 3-0 away at Cowes Sports who moved above them in the table as a result of the win to leave Bemerton second from bottom and facing relegation.

In the Wessex League at Step 6, whilst Bemerton could be relegated to this level next season, it looks like another Wiltshire side in Amesbury would be taking their place. Amesbury remain on course for an immediate return to the Premier Division at the first attempt. On Saturday they smashed New Milton 6-2 to open up a five-point gap at the top of the table and also have a game in hand over their nearest rivals Romsey Town. Laverstock & Ford also had a good home win, defeating Alton 3-0. In the Western League the biggest winners of the day in Division One on Saturday were Corsham Town who hammered bottom side Bristol Telephones 6-1 on their own patch, doing fellow Wiltshire side Chippenham Park a big favour. However, Chippenham Park failed to take advantage of Corsham's work, losing 3-0 away at another team at the bottom end of the table, Portishead Town to remain second from bottom, two points ahead of Bristol Telephones having played one game less. Devizes Town picked up a useful point in a 1-1 home draw with Wells. Calne Town sit just below Corsham in the table after a 3-1 away win at Sherborne Town. In the final game involving Wiltshire sides, Warminster Town had a narrow 1-0 home win over Radstock Town and sit in 8<sup>th</sup> place in the table, a vast improvement on last season which saw them threatened with relegation back to the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League. A 2-1 home win for Corsham on Wednesday night saw them move up to 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the table. See elsewhere in the programme for the Step 7 action in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League.

In the leagues outside the National League System there was a big game in the Trowbridge & District League where league leaders Holt met third placed Hilperton United. It was the visitors Hilperton who were the better side on the day smashing four past the leaders who could score just one of their own. The win allowed Hilperton to move to within four points of the leaders with the two sides set to meet again in April. Heytesbury are also in the title race.

## Diary of Wiltshire League Division One Title Winning Season - Wootton Bassett Town 1987-88

Taken from scrapbook of match reports from newspapers (mainly Wilts & Gloucestershire Standard) maintained by Paul Harrison.

### Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> February 1988 - Wiltshire Senior Cup Semi-Final Wootton Bassett Town 3 Bromham 1

#### Headline: Explosive start to a fine game

This match played at Calne Town's ground, was billed as the David v Goliath fixture. Wootton Bassett, champions elect of the First Division, against Bromham from the 2<sup>nd</sup> Division.

Both teams enjoying a very long successful run of wins and both then expecting to carry it on just one more game to reach the Senior Cup final. As it was, the match got off to an explosive start. Damon York put Wootton Bassett ahead after six minutes, only for the Bromham captain, Ferris, to reply almost immediately from a superbly struck free kick from 20 yards. The equaliser seemed to stir Bassett to increase their work rate and to sharpen their play. 'Jacko' Frost led their front line marvellously well, laying off first time balls to team mates with great accuracy, setting up numerous opportunities to put Bassett in front. From a jinking run from the same player, the ever-industrious Paul Harrison broke free from his midfield marker to meet 'Jacko's' cross to put Bassett ahead in the 15<sup>th</sup> minute. This time, however, Bassett did not allow Bromham the chance to reply and exerted even more pressure in an attempt to go further ahead. It was during this phase that Taylor, in the Bromham goal, made some super saves to keep his side in the match. Steve Ackrill, Wootton Bassett's very talented centre-half, thwarted many of Bromham's attempts to get back into the game. His aerial strength and speed on the 'deck' stood him in good stead on many occasions.

Five minutes before the interval he stole forward into Bromham's area to pivot quickly onto a loose ball to smash Bassett further ahead. Half time: Wootton Bassett 3, Bromham 1.

The second half saw Bromham push forward at every opportunity, putting the Bassett defence under considerable pressure for long periods. Martin Rees, in the Bassett goal, came to their rescue on a number of occasions, whilst at the other end Bassett breaks were denied by stout defending and an increasingly heavy pitch. More goals were, however, not forthcoming for either side and the game ran out to finish as a 3-1 victory for Bassett. Full marks must be awarded to Bromham for such an honest, gutsy performance. Despite being behind for so long, all tackling was sharp yet clean. The referee, who ran the game to his usual high standard, had one booking to make for a mis-timed tackle. For Bassett there were many fine performances, none more so than from skipper of the day Paul Harrison. Bassett can now look forward to the final in April against either Purton, from the Hellenic League, or Ferndale and can feel confident of beating either side on the day.

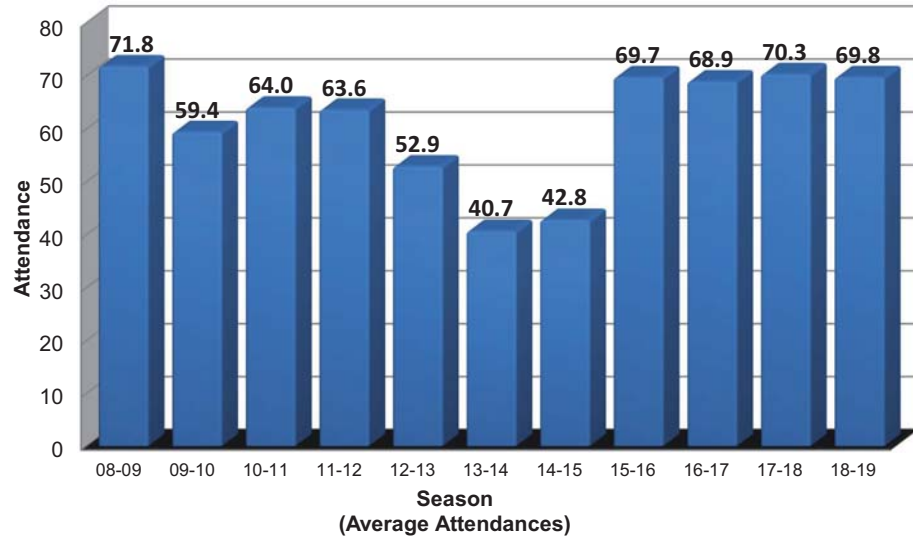

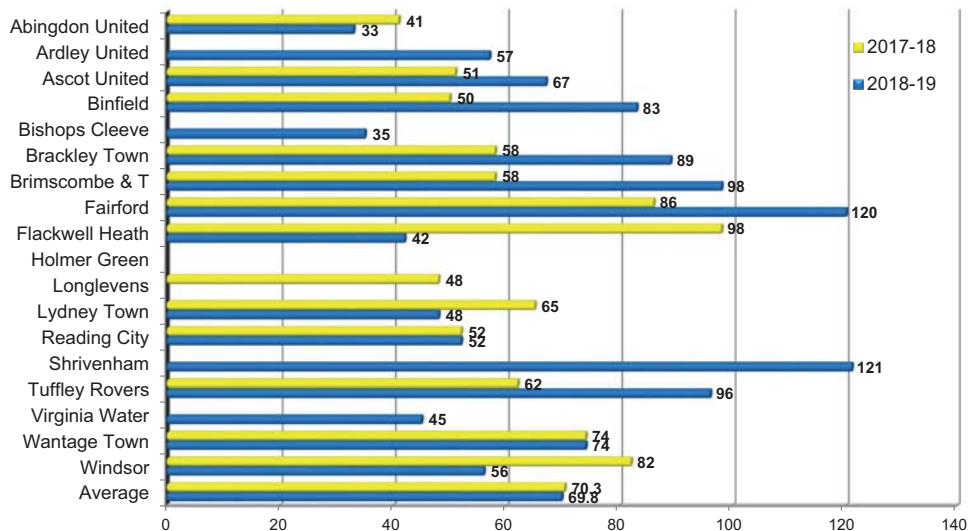
