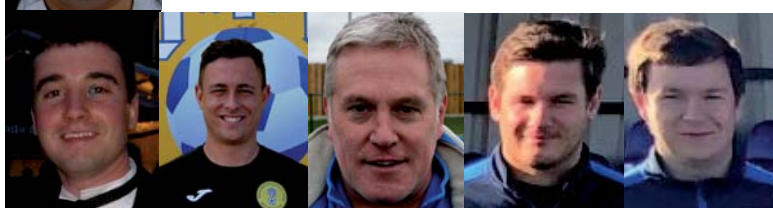

I am currently collating a nationwide archive that hopefully will include EVERY club, from the professional game to the very lowest of grass roots (who issue programmes), regardless of status or step level. My main motivation is simply "posterity" as it fuels my desire to record every single club, but I have raised the bar even higher as it also includes the associations of Scotland & Wales too and at the last count my archive numbered 30,000 programmes with a further 3,000 awaiting cataloguing and filing.

The purposes of the archive are many, but a few priorities are to record the personnel, erstwhile volunteers, players & fans that usually get a mention in the match programme, as well as the histories and achievements to factor in the "posterity" element. My archive is run on a simple A to Z format which places big premier league heavyweights alongside small village teams which in my opinion is both

novel and unique, plus defunct clubs that are sadly no longer with us as they have their tale to tell also - the humble match programme being both a snapshot in time and a mouthpiece for the club.

Clubs outside the league and village clubs are usually represented by willing volunteers and its one of the many ambitions of mine to have these individuals represented for the knowledge they impart and for the sterling jobs they do to keep the nationwide flag flying for football, without doubt they are the life blood of the game.

Non-league football (amateur in old money) shares camaraderie that is second to none and so "tradition" and its close cousin, "nostalgia" is well catered for and gives the chance for true supporters like me, a caveat to be able to put something back from the pleasure we have taken out - hence my archive.



I was a season ticket holder at Bury FC for many years but now prefer the genteel friendliness of non-league, where knowledgeable fair-minded supporters relate bygone anecdotes.

Good luck to everyone at Royal Wootton Bassett FC, you are a credit to your club and to football in general.

Bassett News

Welcome to Ascot United

A warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Ascot United for this UHlsport Hellenic League fixture. We hope all those from Ascot enjoy their short stay with us this afternoon and we wish them a safe journey home back down the M4. This is Ascot's penultimate league fixture of the season and they are scheduled to be the first team to complete their fixtures this season when they play Flackwell Heath on Tuesday 2nd April. Whilst they will have completed their league fixtures they are still in the Floodlit Cup and have reached the final of the Bluefin Insurance Cup where they will play local rivals Windsor. With that cup final scheduled for the Bank Holiday in May I suspect Ascot will be looking to play a few friendlies between that final league game and the cup final to keep their players fitness and sharpness levels up.

Ascot have had a really good season and until recently looked to be in the mix for the promotion place from the UHlsport Hellenic League. A run of draws and defeats in January and February has seen them fall behind the top four and the cups are now the best bet for silverware this season. The two sides met a couple of weeks ago (see elsewhere in today's programme for our match report and that also prepared by Ascot) and it was a tight game that could have gone either way. We got in front through a great finish by Nick Stanley but Ascot then put us under a lot of pressure which saw them equalise. Whilst they had most of the play in the second half we could have pinched it right at the end which would have been a little unjust on the home side, but we have been the other side of such an outcome many times this season so wouldn't have felt too guilty about it!

Binfield Game

A good organised performance saw us pick up a win in our last home game here at the Gerard Buxton Ground against Binfield. This was another tight contest that could have gone either way and in the end we won it with another well taken Nick Stanley goal from Josh Shama's cross. Again, the match report from that game is included later in the programme.

Brimscombe & Thrupp

I understand we pushed the current league leaders Brimscombe & Thrupp all the way last week but once again we were defeated by a couple of late goals, something that has been a real achilles' heel this season. I am sure it is something Sam will look to work on in pre-season ahead of the start of next season's programme as we have lost so many points in the closing stages of games this season. The title race is now between Brimscombe and Wantage Town with the two sides scheduled to meet at Brimscombe today for a game which will go a long way to deciding the league title.

Development Side

The Development Side have lost their last two games, losing 2-0 at home to Shrewton United and then 4-0 to Melksham Town Reserves. With a shortage of available players due to Under 18 games I understand we have had to call a couple up from the veteran's team to ensure we have been able to field a full side in recent fixtures, all of whom have done well. Perhaps that first Team call up is still a possibility Nick Warren? With no First Team game scheduled for their final three games of the season and the Under 18 County Cup Final having been played should make it easier for the closing weeks of the season.

Ladies Team

Well done to the Ladies side on lifting the Wiltshire County Cup last Sunday with an impressive performance in the final against a side who they had lost to in the league this season. It was a tight close contest for the opening 25 minutes but once Bassett went in front there was only going to be one winner, but few would have predicted the 9-0 score line, particularly after the opening exchanges. The front two for Bassett totally dominated the Spitfires defence whilst the centre-half pairing at the other end did a superb job in ensuring that Spitfires only mustered a few half chances. In between the front and back lines Bassett played some really nice football and did the club proud. Well done Ladies and how for the League and Cup double.

Bassett News

Next Year's Hellenic League Divisions

If the renowned prophet Wazzafan from the Tony Kempster Forum is correct with his predictions for next season it is looking good for the UHlsport Hellenic League next season. The Premier Division will be back up to 20 teams, as will Division One West and Division One East would have 18 teams. He is predicting an influx of teams from the Hereford area, including a welcome return to former opponents Pegasus Juniors, which was talked about happening at the end of last season. In addition, he is assuming there will be new Development sides in the West Division from Highworth Town and Wantage (assuming their First Team are promoted) which in my view is sensible given the facilities that these clubs have, and the two-step gap would apply. Whilst he is not always correct he does seem to have his finger on the pulse and have contacts around the country who feed him information so it will be interesting to see how accurate he is with his predictions. He is also predicting that Holmer Green will move back to the Spartan South Midland League, something that I know will please them as this would reduce their travelling. So, their forthcoming visit to the Gerard Buxton Ground could be the one and only time they visit us. Whilst Wazzafan is not always correct with his predictions he does seem to have his finger on the pulse and have contacts around the country who feed him information so it will be interesting to see how accurate he is with his predictions. Generally, though his suggestions are often better than what we end up with, so lets see how things develop in the summer.

Location, Location, Location

Today's opponents are scheduled to play local neighbours Windsor in the final of the Bluefin Insurance Cup on the 6th of May, Bank Holiday Monday. The League had made the decision to hold the final at Ardley for perfectly valid reasons before the finalists were known but with the two sides, who are just six miles apart now known, you have to question whether the League are missing a trick by not now rescheduling this to, say, Binfield or Burnham. After the fixtures this season have caused so much angst with clubs, including ourselves, the League would generate a lot of goodwill with two of its member clubs, if not the majority of its clubs seeing such a move, if it were now to reverse its final location decision and move it to a ground closer to the two finalists. There should be no loss of face from making such a move but at the time of writing these notes they do appear to be sticking by Ardley as the venue for the final. Earlier in the week Windsor announced they would be providing free transport to their fans with a supporter's coach which is a nice gesture.

Under 16 and 18 Blues set for County Cup finals this weekend

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's Under 18 and 16 Blue teams aim to replicate the success of the Ladies side this Sunday as they vie for County Cup titles of their own. The Under 16 Blues aim to repeat their County Cup success from last season when they take on Chippenham Town Youth (10.30am kick off), while the elder of the two sides take on Chippenham Town for the Wiltshire Youth Cup crown (2pm kick off). Both games take place at Westbury United's Meadow Lane ground.

Next Up

Our next home game is next Saturday when Holmer Green make their first ever visit to our ground, and possibly their last, if they are scheduled to return to the Spartan South Midland League. The first meeting between the two clubs was a close affair and just as it looked like we would be returning with all three points we conceded an injury time equaliser to share the points (as noted above the story of our season in 2018-19). Hopefully we can beat them this time, especially as they have now gone above us in the table. The final First Team home game of the season, also our last game of the season, is then the following week. The Dev Team will have two league games to play at home against Marlborough Town on Saturday 13th April and home to Kintbury Rangers on Saturday 27th April.

The First Team will now with back-to-back games against Longlevens in the space of 4 days. With the prolific Brad Martin having re-signed for Longlevens it means he will have played against us twice at the start of the season when playing for Bishops Cleeve and now twice at the end of the season for Longlevens. Hopefully, we can prevent him adding to the two goals he scored in the first meeting with Bishops Cleeve back in August. With Longlevens seeking to avoid relegation these are two big games. Enjoy the game and see you in the bar afterwards. *Mark*

OWN AFC

A GROUP of people each paying £49 to own a Non-League football club and make every decision? For now, you'll have to file the majority of us under sceptical.

Among the promises on the OWN AFC website, once the decision of which club to takeover has been voted on, subscribers can expect to: Make new signings, hire and fire staff, negotiate contracts, set admission prices, full financial control, select the squad, plan training sessions and make history. Owners will call the shots via an app on their mobile phones.

The NLP understands Northern Premier League Premier Division club Hednesford Town – who are up for sale and debt free – are the target with OWN AFC founder Stuart Harvey having already attended games and met officials.

In an interview with BBC Sport, Harvey explains his vision of allowing people to live out their dream of owning a football club and taking the game back to the people. "It replaces the boardroom nonsense we see at many clubs with the people that matter," he says.

There's nothing wrong with that and a glance across English football's landscape shows there is a lot to be desired when it comes to some of the ownership of clubs in this county. The eagle-eyed will point out that an online community taking on a team is essentially an updated version of MyFootballClub, who took over Ebbsfleet United in 2008. Again the promise was the chance to live out the real life version of Football Manager. Membership numbers topped 27,000, initially it saved Fleet and there was an FA Trophy win at Wembley. But, with no vote on the actual picking of Liam Daish's team – the big selling point – and perhaps the lack of a star name club, renewals dwindled. Eventually the Kent club were running on empty, bargaining with clubs who had sell-on fees with players, like Stevenage with Michael Bostwick, to bring in quick revenue before they eventually dropped out of Non-League's top flight in 2013 on the brink of non-existence before being taken over again.

Harvey says it is, "... giving people a second club to grow to love – for the football fan who is out priced in the modern game."

If it is Hednesford, what about their fans? Suddenly the big decisions, all the decisions, are being decided by a majority vote by people who have probably never heard of the Pitmen, despite their illustrious Non-League past. How much they pay to watch their team, who signs, who doesn't, and, potentially, who plays can be signed off at the click of a button by somebody on the other side of the world waiting in the queue at McDonalds for a burger.

While those who follow football from the top, where anything outside of the Manchester Uniteds, Liverpools, Real Madrids and Barcelonas barely exists, Non-League football maybe does seem a bit inconsequential and somehow less important. But it matters. These clubs are part of people's lives. Football at this level isn't a joke. They may be fewer in numbers, but to supporters those three points on a Saturday mean just as much in the Evo-Stik Premier as they do in the Premier League. For players, what happens on and off the pitch can impact the rest of their career. It's a responsibility that will hopefully be impressed on any owners should it go through.

Running a football club through a mobile phone isn't as straightforward as it sounds. There are rules and regulations to be adhered to and if it goes the same way as MyFC, what's to hold the interest long-term. Any takeover will have to be passed off by the authorities and you'd hope robust questions are asked and business plans are poured over.

A football club as a plaything will make many people uncomfortable. Maybe it will work and others will follow. As the headline on OWN AFC's website asks, 'Do you have what it takes to run a real football club?' Time will certainly tell.

RWBTFC editors view on this – Stuart Harvey and his fellow OWN AFC subscribers should stick to their Play Stations and the mass debating forums that exist on the internet where they can do no harm.

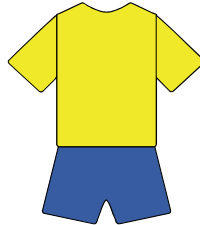
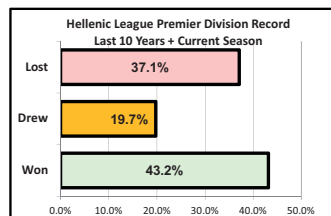
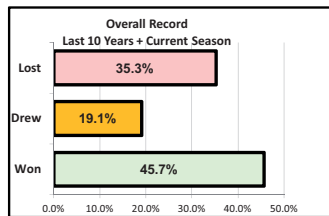

Dominant Bassett claim County Women's Cup crown

Royal Wootton Bassett Town overpowered Swindon Spitfires, winning a one-sided Wiltshire County Women's Cup final 9-0 as both Emily Arrell and Hayley Huckin scored hat-tricks.

Once they found the opener on 29 minutes, there was to be no holding back Bassett as they raced into a 5-0 half time lead. That was transformed into an 8-0 advantage early in the second period, before a last minute penalty completed the scoring.

The opening exchanges were relatively even. Arrell shot narrowly past the post with the opening chance of the game before Spitfires' Sophie Mitchell blazed a long range effort just over the bar. Debbie Rose then hit the post for Spitfires as she connected with a corner, while Arrell and Huckin both missed the target at the other end. Eventually, however, Huckin found her range, steering a first time shot from an Arrell cross into the back of the net. And that was the cue for the floodgates to open.

A second quickly followed when Lauren Kayll reacted first to a loose ball in the box following a dangerous free kick and slotted home. Huckin's second of the game made it 3-0. Advantage was played following a late challenge on the halfway line, and the Bassett forward made the most of it when one-on-one with Spitfires' keeper Sian Barber. Arrell then rounded Barber to get her name on the scoresheet, while Huckin completed a first half hat-trick just before the interval.

The goals continued to flow after the restart with Kayll and Arrell finding the net within the opening three minutes. Shortly after, Arrell had her hat-trick, tapping in after the Spitfires stopper had come out off her line to try and win the ball. By this point, Bassett were in cruise control, and it was more a question of how many goals they were going to score. To their credit, Spitfires held out for the remainder of the half, until they conceded an unfortunate penalty in the last minute, which Maddy Elliott converted.

For Bassett, it's a first ever County Women's Cup title, having lost in the final on two previous occasions, including last year. They also completed the first part of a potential league and cup double. And, with three crucial games to go, it's the South West Women's Football League Eastern Division title that they now turn their attentions to.

Introduction to the Town

Ascot is a small town in East Berkshire, 6 miles (9.7 km) south of Windsor, 4 miles (6.4 km) east of Bracknell and 25 miles (40 km) west of London.

Interesting Facts

Whilst we now have Royal in the town name, Ascot has its own Royal Ascot week. Royal Ascot is without doubt the world's most famous race meeting, steeped in history dating back to 1711. The royal family attend the meeting, arriving each day in a horse-drawn carriage. It is a major event in the British social calendar. The racecourse is still owned by the crown.

Famous Residents

The current most famous resident is probably radio and television presenter Chris Evans.

In the world of music, Marti Pellow, singer of Wet Wet Wet lives in Ascot whilst John Lennon and Ringo Starr of The Beatles, at one time lived at Tittenhurst Park, Ascot. Sarah Harding, singer with Girls Aloud, was born in Ascot.

Nearest Railway Station

Ascot has its own railway station in the town. The football ground, although a little distance from the railway station, can be accessed on foot from the station as our own match day reporter will testify when his father has not been around to give him a lift to the ground.

Nearest Pubs to Ground

You are spoiled for choice in terms of quality pubs in and around Ascot, although a drink in the football clubhouse would be the most recommended option. In terms of other pubs, a particular favourite of our programme editor is the Belverdere Arms in nearby Sunninghill which is to the east of the town on the way to Virginia Water and is really good for food.



The 400 year-old Thatched Cottage to the north-east of the ground also has a good reputation for its food. Both are a little out of town so will need a car to visit.

In Ascot itself the pubs which are recommended by Trip Adviser are Bar One, Rocksalt Ascot and Stag in the main High Street. If you want a swift one before making the walk to the ground from the railway station Jagz in Station Hill is the place to go. Those from these parts who have been weened on Arkells then the pub to visit is the Duke of Edinburgh. Along with a variety of real ales from Arkell's, the pub offers premium lagers, ciders, spirits and an abundance of wines from around the world.

Things to Do in Ascot

The most obvious thing to do when visiting Ascot is attend the races. You can't fail to miss the impressive looking grandstand of the racecourse as you drive through the town on the way to the football ground.



Just six miles up the road is Windsor with all the attractions that Windsor has to offer including Legoland Windsor, the only Legoland park in the United Kingdom and the largest Legoland park in the world in terms of area. Legoland Windsor was built on the site of the former Windsor Safari Park.

Anyone needing to go shopping will need to venture into Bracknell, with the Lexicon shopping centre probably the place to go.

For any golfers amongst you the one obvious thing to do is to play a round of golf at Wentworth but make sure you come with a big wad of money. A round of 18 holes between a Monday and a Friday will set you back somewhere between £130 and £285 depending on which course you want to play. Membership fees in June 2017 had risen to a whopping £13,500. If that is a tad expensive you could go for a walk around the beautiful lake in Virginia Water.

Hat-Trick Hero Green Carries Bassett Past the Winning Post

Rylands Way, 12th April 2011

This time last week, Wootton Bassett Town were fighting for their Hellenic Premier Division lives. Now though they are sitting comfortably in 14th place as an Alex Green hat-trick paved the way for a come from behind 3-2 victory against Ascot United, meaning Dave Turners side have taken seven points from nine.

Green struck the winner with virtually the last kick of the game, lobbing an advancing Chris Grace from fifteen yards with a weighted effort after a perfectly placed through ball from youngster Adam Topping, who once again impressed off the bench. Although somewhat inconsistent during the year, the former Shrivensham front man gave a clinic in assured finishing, with all three of his goals being expertly taken. He would no doubt have applauded Ian Brooks opener for the visitors ten minutes in though. A looping cross from the left was not dealt with properly as Ethan Delaney, having missed a one-on-one opportunity at the other end moments earlier, failed to clear his lines. Brooks, ready to pounce on the edge of the area, then struck a searing volley, demonstrating perfect technique, into the top left corner past a despairing Stewart Thompson. The scores were then levelled midway through the period. Emphasising how far they have come this season, Bassett patiently built an attack, and after a neat set from Sam Collier, Richie Carter provided an inch perfect pass into the feet of Green from near halfway. Controlled brilliantly, the forward turned his marker on the edge of the box and with his next touch tucked the ball past Grace into the bottom right corner. Parity would last all of two minutes though. Brooks was again involved, this time acting as provider. His whipped in corner, placed dangerously underneath the crossbar, was fumbled by Thompson and Jessie Wilson was quickest to react, sweeping home the loose ball from close range. With quarter of an hour to go before the break, a jinking run from Delaney opened up the Ascot defence, and after his low cross was sliced, Green should really have equalised again. But he would make his only mistake of the match, somehow snatching at the ball and hacking it wide from eight yards. Moments before the half time whistle, Ascot were unfortunate not to have a third when their leading scorer Jon Bennett muscled his way past three defenders before shooting low from ten yards, but Thompson was able to redeem himself for his earlier error and made an assured save on the dive.

It would be all Bassett following the restart, the visitors no doubt with one eye on their Floodlit Cup semi final encounter with Abingdon on Thursday. However, their second half defensive performance left a lot to be desired as Bassett controlled play and opened their visitors up with ease. The shrewd introduction of forward Topping for veteran defender Mark McMeeking tilted the games balance firmly in favour of the hosts. But it took them time to get back on level terms once again as both Matt Bown and Delaney came agonisingly close. Then, with eighteen minutes left, experts hold up play for Collier and a weighted ball into the right channel set Green, having beaten the offside trap, loose. And after bearing down on goal, he coolly slotted beneath Grace at his near post. Pressure continued to be applied, but Ascot appeared as though they were set to see it off and make the long journey home with a point in the bag. Indeed, Bassetts luck seemed to have deserted them when a dangerous low Delaney cross, needing just a touch to guide it home, sailed across the face of goal and out of play. But from nothing, Turners troops found a winner with seconds remaining. Jon Beedens clearance out of defence was controlled fantastically by Topping, and after holding off his marker he clipped the ball in for Green, having again breached a shaky offside trap, to provide the finishing touch. It was no less than Bassett deserved, and will give them extra confidence ahead of Saturdays visit of title chasers Wantage Town. Victory would severely dent the Alfredians title chances and mean Bassett would join the company of Slimbridge and Highworth Town as the only teams to do the league double over them this season.

Scoops Man of the Match: Alex Green, in an impressive team display, Jon Beeden, Matt Bown and Matt Boucher all stood out, but Green topped the lot, producing three quality finishes to seal three well earned points.

Scoop Rating: 8/10, chances for the visitors were few and far between, especially in the second period, which Bassett controlled. Although the two goals conceded came in disappointing fashion, those isolated incidents aside, this was a great performance. The team again showed their character to twice come from behind before going on to win and deservedly shot up the table as a result.

Our History

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated six miles from Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although losing both. The club folded for a period pre-World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when it began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by a local dignitary for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County League with limited success until 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. The club finally won the Wiltshire Senior Cup in 1998-99 and repeated this achievement in 2000-01. The club have had three spells in the Hellenic Premier and gained promotion back in 2012-13.

Since the onset of the new millennium the club has expanded significantly, with the establishment of a thriving Youth Section, Ladies Section, Veterans team and Sunday side. The club now operates 27 teams from under 7s upwards. All play their games at the relocated Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which opened in the summer of 2015. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town FC was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established with Dutch amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande.

Season 2018-19 sees Sam Collier in charge of the First Team.

Moments of quality at opposite ends earn a share of the spoils

Royal Wootton Bassett Town picked up a valuable point on their travels, holding fifth place Ascot United to a 1-1 draw. Moments of excellence at both ends of the pitch contributed to that result, with Nick Stanley scoring with a fine volley to give Bassett the lead before 'keeper Gary Aulsberry pulled off a stunning save with twenty minutes remaining to preserve parity.

Chances were at something of a premium in the opening period. Still, when the visitors went ahead their goal arrived somewhat against the run of play. It was brilliantly taken though, the in-form Nick Stanley striking a sweet volley past the 'keeper from the edge of the box after the hosts failed to clear an attack.

Bassett held the lead going into the break but were pegged back on the hour mark. Half time substitution Luqman Kassim brought Ascot level, finishing well when one-on-one with Aulsberry after the Bassett defence had stopped playing.

At the other end, Brad Pagliaroli came close to restoring Bassett's advantage as he hit the post with a volleyed drive from the edge of the box.

Ascot held the upper hand though as the game drew closer to its conclusion. And they thought they had grabbed a second when Lamin Sankoh struck a stunning long-range shot that appeared destined for the top corner, only for Aulsberry to somehow claw the ball away.

Callum Carlisle then headed narrowly wide from a corner before Kassim forced a solid save from Aulsberry following a swift counter.

But, after Bassett saw penalty appears for a handball turned down, the final chance of the match fell to the visitors as, catching Ascot on the break, they found themselves in a two-on-one situation with Danny Lachacz and Stanley bearing down on goal. The opportunity fell to the former, but he fired over.

Home View

Ascot United threw the kitchen sink at Royal Wootton Bassett on Saturday but it wasn't enough to win their final home league game of the season. Bassett had taken a one-nil lead into the interval, but substitute Luqman Kassim changed the game after his introduction to bag the all-important equaliser.

The hosts were presented with their team of the month award for December at half-time, and in true team-of-the-month style, had not won a league match since beating Longlevens just before the new year. Indeed, the omens looked ominous again at half time as the visitors had weathered the home side's pressure, scored, and looked increasingly threatening.

Before that, Gary Aulsberry had palmed Callum Carlisle's looping header away at full stretch to keep Ascot out, before scrambling across his line to smother Dan Price's deflected effort on the half hour after Usman Lalustani had cut back onto his right and crossed. However, from Aulsberry's long clearance, Nick Stanley capitalised on a weak defensive header to plant a left-footed volley past debutant 'keeper Joe Whiter and into the bottom right. Brad Pagliaroli then wriggled clear to cross for Elias Youcliff, who headed straight at Whiter, before the same Bassett players reversed roles when Pagliaroli's shot was smothered by Whiter after Youcliffe had turned provider.

In the second half, The Yellamen mounted wave after wave of attack. Sheridan Campbell shot over after 58 minutes, but moments later he was on hand to flick on Geoff Kibaki's cross, and Kassim nipped in to stab the ball over Aulsberry and in off the underside of the bar. Bassett would fire a couple of warning shots of their own – Stanley lobbing onto the roof of the net and Pagliaroli thumping the left-hand post, but from then on it was all Ascot.

Lamin Sankoh's long-range strike was brilliantly tipped wide by Aulsberry after 72 minutes, man-of-the-match Carlisle went close with two headers and Price came within inches of scoring, but the visitors continued to thwart the hosts. Jonny Denton then wasted a chance with a late free-kick over the crossbar, before Kassim surged forwards and forced Aulsberry into yet another save – this time with his feet in added time.

There was still time for Aulsberry to deny Kassim once again, before Bassett almost landed the ultimate sucker punch in the fourth minute of stoppage time only for Dan Lachacz to fire over after substitute Ben Paul had threaded him in.

Stanley heads Bassett back to winning ways

Nick Stanley's late goal delivered a 1-0 victory for Royal Wootton Bassett Town against Binfield in an intriguing encounter.

Nick Stanley's 84th minute header ended Royal Wootton Bassett Town run of five games without a victory as his side edged Binfield 1-0 in an engaging, close-fought encounter at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground.

The forward, hard-working as ever as Bassett's lone striker for the afternoon, guided home Josh Shama's perfectly weighted left-wing cross to seal the points and bring a welcome end to a disappointing run of games that had seen Sam Collier's team lose ground to the sides playing catch up below them in the table.

It was a game that seemed destined to be decided by just a single goal following a first half that saw neither team create an opportunity of note.

Arguably the best chance fell to Bassett midfielder Gio Wrona when he brought an awkward save out of David Lyons with a snap shot from the edge of the area in the eleventh minute, though the ball was struck straight at the 'keeper.

Aside from that, while both teams played some attractive football and sought to get forward, the defences were largely on top.

Play opened up more following the restart.

In the second half's first minute, Elias Youssef, hugely impressive for the hosts on his debut, drove forward from the centre of midfield and had the Binfield defence on their heels before seeing his shot from the edge of the area blocked.

Two minutes later, Wrona played a neat one-two with Brad Pagliaroli on the left side of the area and, space having opened up, stabbed a low shot at goal, which bounced off the base of the left post.

Binfield subsequently enjoyed a period of play in which they asked more questions of the Bassett back line. And on 67 minutes they appeared to have breached the hosts' defence when James Knight's through ball got them turned. Play was eventually worked to an unmarked Carlo Santoro ten yards from goal, but the winger dwelled too long on the ball and his eventual shot was weak and bounced wide off the legs of Carl Evans.

The visitors ultimately paid the price for Santoro failing to convert.

With ten minutes to go Bassett almost found the opener when Stanley fed Pagliaroli, whose cutback from the byline was guided narrowly over by an onrushing Youssef.

But they had their goal four minutes later, and it came from a well-worked move. Wrona spread play out to Shama on the left-wing and, after David Stroud's overlapping run provided him with space to cut back onto his right foot, the substitute floated a ball to the far post where a wide open Stanley was on hand to calmly head beyond Lyons.

Binfield, who had earlier brought on Jemel Johnson and Stephen Peacock in an attempt to liven things up and themselves break the deadlock, had no response.

In attack and midfield Bassett had been solid throughout the game. But their defensive display had been equally impressive too.

Marshaled by a strong showing from Evans and fellow centre back Adam Corcoran, with full backs Stroud and Dan Cole providing reliable cover, they ensured Gary Aulsberry was not forced to make a save.

And with a clean sheet in hand, one goal was all that was required to return to winning ways.

Our Visitors History

Ascot United • Club History

Ascot United as we know it, was founded in 1965 by a men's team who played their games at Sunninghill with "after match meetings" in The Wells in Cheapside village (now Mikado's). Teams playing as long ago as 1928 under the name Ascot United but nothing to link them directly to the current club. In 1965, the club had gained permission from the Ascot Racecourse Trustees to convert the land east of coach park 10 into a football pitch. A wooden clubhouse was built and this team went on to win many prestigious trophies in the years that followed.



Various youth teams represented Ascot United over the years up to 1988, and 1992 the East Berks 7-a-side Association was formed by our then Chairman Keith Wicks introducing small-sided junior games and having disbanded in 1980 the men's team also reformed. The club continued to grow, entering into partnership with Charters School and being awarded FA Charter Standard status in 2004. The men's senior team enjoyed early success through the East Berks League gaining continued promotions to the Senior division and winning various Cups including the Fielden Charity Cup in 1996/7. 2001 saw the 1st team join the Reading Senior League and winning the Evening Post Senior Cup at the Madejski Stadium in 2006. Promotion to the Hellenic League soon followed in 2007, followed by promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division in 2009. The club today has grown to become one of the largest Community football clubs in the UK with over 1000 registered players and over 70 teams playing every weekend embracing all ages and abilities from 5 year olds through to Vets. A new clubhouse opened in September 2010, together with an improved main pitch, floodlights and a stand.

The club has enjoyed much success at all levels particularly in the Ladies and Girls Section where they are regularly winners of leagues and county Cups. Last season, our senior Ladies won promotion to the Premier Division of the Southern Region Women's Football League. In 2015, the Under 16 Youth team finally won a Boys' County Cup, and in 2016 both of our Under 15 Boys' sides ended the season with cup victories.

The past decade has been hugely successful for our first team; our debut in the FA Cup in 2011 attracted 1,149 people to the Racecourse on a Friday evening where the famous trophy itself was on display and the match was streamed live on Facebook. Between 2012-13 and 2015-16 we reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase twice, enjoyed two top-three finishes in the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division, and won both the Bluefin Sport Challenge Cup and Perpetua Press Floodlit Cup. More recently, our players' development under outgoing manager Neil Richards took the spotlight, as a host of Yellamen have enjoyed success with other local sides and many of our talented development players stepped up into the first team and subsequently finished the 2017-18 season in style. This season promises to be another exciting chapter in our history under new manager Jamie Tompkins. Tompkins is a well-respected coach, underlined by his term as Football Development manager at Brentford FC and as a vital assistant to Richards last season. Tompkins' promotion also enables Richards to move 'back upstairs' as Director of Football for Ascot United, overseeing player development throughout the club and creating a sustainable pathway for Ascot Youth players to move into Senior football.

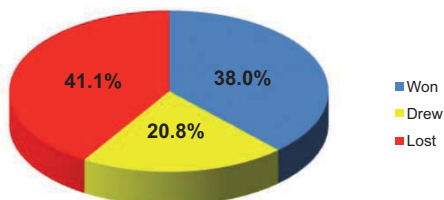

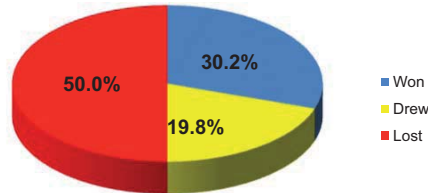

From The development Side

16th March 2019

Four games survived the wet weather this week including the game involving the league leaders Wroughton. Ten wins in their last eleven league games had put Wroughton in the driving seat at the top of the table and today they took on a Football ID side who had ended their tough run of defeats last week with an excellent draw at Purton, the last side to defeat Wroughton. On a really windy day which made football very difficult Wroughton started the first half playing against the wind against the young Football ID side. They almost went in front in the very first minute when Tyler Wilkinson fired in a shot which came back off the post. The first chance that came Football ID's way fell to Kyle Pogue-Elms on seven minutes but the tall striker fired straight at Wroughton keeper Callum Wilkinson. A couple of minutes after this chance a powerful run down the left flank from Aaron Maximen set up Reigan Cook for Wroughton but Cook fired over. The next half chance came Football ID's way and once again it was Kyle Pogue-Elms who was causing the trouble to the leaders. His powerful run down the right looked like it might lead to a shot on goal, but he was eventually outnumbered and dispossessed by the Wroughton defence and the chance was lost. Despite playing against the wind though it was the league leaders who were creating the better chances. Reigan Cook fired straight at the keeper Ben Drewett when the ball fell to him on 28 minutes and Tom Dingle then headed over from a corner a minute later. Wroughton were forced into an early substitution and pacey substitute Jordan Lea almost made an immediate impact when an overhead kick went close to breaking the deadlock. Just when it looked like the well organised Football ID side would make it to the break on level terms their defence was finally unlocked three minutes before the interval. A subtle chip over the back four from Jamie McLaughlin put Reigan Cook clear and he fired into the net to make it 1-0 to Wroughton. Whilst physically a lot stronger Wroughton had struggled to break down the well organised Football ID side and led by that solitary goal at the break. With the wind behind them the expectation was that Wroughton would step up a gear after the break but the early exchanges in the second period saw Football ID going in search of an equaliser without creating any real clear-cut chances. Once again Pogue-Elms was involved in a lot of the good Football ID work. The first real chance of the second half came on 55 minutes. Last week Craig Bowden had fired in a free kick from range at Cricklade and when Wroughton were awarded a kick in a similar position to the strike last week expectation was that Bowden would repeat his goal from last week. However, whilst his shot was on target it was well saved by Ben Drewett in the Football ID goal. Wroughton went close again on 62 minutes when Jordan Lea went close from a corner, but it remained 1-0. Not for long though. From another Wroughton attack, Football ID keeper Drewett pulled off another good save but failed to hold onto the ball and was disposed by Tom Dingle who put the ball across, a clever dummy from Jamie McLaughlin allowed the ball to make its way to Wroughton's star man on the day Aaron Maximen who controlled the ball with a deft touch before coolly placing the ball into the corner of the net to make it 2-0 to Wroughton. Wroughton were now in the ascendancy and went close to extending their lead further when a cross from Reigan Cook nearly found Tom Dingle. Football ID keeper Drewett was again called into action ten minutes from time when Maximen fired in a powerful shot from 25 yards out which was well saved at full stretch by the keeper diving to his left. From the resulting corner Wroughton again nearly found the net but the ball was this time cleared off the line by a defender. Tom Dingle who, like Maximen had been lively all afternoon, once again went close for Wroughton but his effort was deflected wide for a corner. Whilst it was Wroughton creating the better chances Football ID always looked dangerous on the break and Ashley Alchin had a shot which went just wide but Wroughton keeper Wilkinson would have had it covered had it been on target. Wroughton immediately went down the other end of the pitch and Dingle set up Tyler Wilkinson, but he fired straight at keeper Drewett. Wroughton were not to be denied though as the best goal of the game was reserved for the last one of the day. Wroughton's man of the match Maximen went on a mazy solo run from 35 yards out which saw him beat five Football ID defenders and the keeper before deftly putting the ball into the net to make it 3-0 to the league leaders and seal the points. In the closing stages Football ID keeper Drewett was forced into another great save tipping over a powerful strike and in the end it was a comfortable win for the leaders although Football ID had made them work really hard for ninety minutes for those three points.

Fourth placed Shrewton United visited Marlborough Town looking to close the gap on the top three. When the sides met back in November a Tyren Harrington hat-trick helped Shrewton to a 5-1 win but Marlborough had improved of late with just two defeats in their previous six games. Once again the wind and a heavy pitch made it difficult for both sides. The first half saw Shrewton playing with the wind behind their backs and went close to breaking the deadlock when a Craig Appleby overhead kick from a corner went narrowly wide. They did manage to edge in front when Ronan Clancy broke into the area and neatly slotted home into the Marlborough net for his second of the season. Not long after it became three for the season when he scored his second of the game, this time getting onto a loose ball and smashing it into the roof of the net to make it 2-0 at the break. With the wind behind them Marlborough quickly got themselves back into the game when Josh Connolly scored from a set piece to make it 2-1. Despite having the wind behind them Marlborough failed to capitalise on the conditions and it was Shrewton who went closest to score again when Charlie Jackson broke through the middle but saw his shot deflected wide for a corner. Shrewton then thought they had scored a third when Craig Appleby slotted the ball into the net after a shot from William Harries had fallen to him, but the goal was disallowed for offside and the game finished 2-1 to the visitors to keep them in touch with the top three.

After a couple of wins Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development had lost at home to Shrewton last week and were looking to return to winning ways at home to Melksham Town Reserves today. Melksham went into the game on the back of three wins in their last four and having won 2-1 in the first meeting of the two sides back in January. The wind once again played havoc at the very open Gerard Buxton Ground but despite playing against the wind it was Melksham who led 1-0 at the break. Three unanswered second half goals secured a comfortable 4-0 win for the visitors who completed the double over their opponents in the process. On target for Melksham were Kieron Pearce, Adam Mitchell, Kurt Hammonds and a spectacular strike from the half-way line from Owen Bartley with a little help from that wind.

Purton have put a little run together that had seen them go six games unbeaten. Today they hosted bottom of the table Pewsey Vale Development, a side who have saved their best form for the cup. When the sides met at Pewsey back in October it finished 2-0 to Purton and Purton completed the double over their opponents with a 6-0 win. Leading scorer William Backhouse led the way bagging a brace taking him to 15 for the season, the other goals coming from Daren Regis, Jack Duckers, Joe Dorey and Nathan Marland. The win lifted Purton a place in the table up into sixth spot, just three points behind Corsham Town Reserves in fifth spot and with two games in hand.

From The development Side

9th March 2019

The top match of the day was in the Fountain Trophies Cup where cup holders Melksham Town took on reigning league champions Kintbury Rangers for a place in the semi-finals. On a windy day that made football difficult, Kintbury Rangers adapted better to the conditions and it is they who progress through to the last four where they are joined by Pewsey Vale Development, Shrewton and either Wroughton or Purton who meet in the final quarter final tie to be played. The league's leading scorer Shaun Thorp set them on their way midway through the first half when he curled shot in with his left foot from 25 yards for what turned out to be the only goal of the first half. Within ten minutes of the restart Melksham were back on level terms, Billy Gleed with his fourth of the season. Kintbury went back in front when Tom Mahoney fired in a great shot which hit the post but flew into the top of the net off the post for another good goal. Mahoney was then involved in the move that finally sealed matters for Kintbury when he broke down the right, cut inside a Melksham defender and fired in a shot which was deflected, the ball falling to Fabio Pinto who fired in the rebound to ensure that it is Kintbury who progress to the next round, 3-1 the final score to Kintbury.

The top league match of the day saw leaders Wroughton travel to take on Cricklade Town at Cricklade Leisure Centre. When the two sides met at the Weir Field back in October Wroughton had narrowly edged it in a very tight affair on a freezing cold day, eventually winning 2-1. Another close game was expected in the return fixture and so it proved. In this game not only did the players have to contend with the wind but also a heavy pitch which made it tricky for the players. It was Aaron Maximen who struck first for the leaders Wroughton with a cool finish from a Regan Cook free kick to make it 1-0 to Wroughton. Jonathan Peachey-Score then put Cricklade back on level terms before Wroughton went back in front with another set piece goal. This time the scorer was veteran Craig Bowden who fired powerfully into the net from a free kick. Tom Dingle then gave Wroughton a two-goal cushion when he netted Wroughton's third for his ninth goal of the season and that turned out to be the final goal action as Wroughton ran out 3-1 winners to open up a three-point lead over Kintbury at the top of the table.

Pewsey Vale were looking to take their cup form which had seen them make it through to the semi-finals into the league matches when they hosted Corsham Town Reserves this afternoon. When the sides met at Corsham at the start of the season it had finished 2-0 to Corsham and with Corsham riding high in 5th spot in the table and in good form it was a tough ask for Pewsey, but they again rose to the occasion this time holding an in-form Corsham side to a goalless draw. Despite the excellent result Pewsey remain at the bottom of the table but moved to within a point of Devizes Town Reserves in the battle to avoid relegation.

Shrewton United were looking to return to winning ways after consecutive defeats at the hands of the top two sides when they took on Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development who themselves were looking to make it three wins on the bounce. The vast expanse of the Gerard Buxton Ground has traditionally not been a happy hunting ground for Shrewton, and they played the first half playing against the wind. Despite the home side having the advantage provided by the wind they failed to register a shot on the Shrewton goal and it was actually the visitors who created a couple of chances, Ronan Clancy shooting narrowly wide and Dominic Jackson going on a long run before eventually being tackled by the Bassett defence. With the wind behind them in the second half Shrewton took full advantage. Charlie Utterson went close to breaking the deadlock when he was put through one-on-one against the Bassett keeper Adam House but his subtle dink over the keeper also went just over the bar. House then pulled off a great save to prevent his side going behind after good link up play between Utterson and Dan Burton had set up Burton for the shot which House saved with his foot. A couple of substitutions by were made by Shrewton and they quickly paid off for the visitors. Moments after coming on Ben Jenks scored his fourth of the season firing in off the post. Shrewton continued to press for a second and were duly rewarded when Utterson set up the other substitute Craig Appleby who beat keeper House with a powerful near post shot. In the dying moments Utterson also thought he had got on the score sheet as well but his which went into the net after his initial shot had been blocked didn't count as the referee had blown for full-time leaving the final score at 2-0 to Shrewton. Shrewton stay fourth but moved to within two points of Melksham with a game in hand but are set to be the biggest losers when the table is adjusted for the withdrawal of Westbury having beaten them twice this season.

After a great start to the season Football ID have slipped down the table of late and going into their meeting with Purton had lost eight games in a row. They faced another tough test against a Purton side who were unbeaten in five, four of which had been won. However, with five minutes remaining Purton looked like that unbeaten run was coming to an end as they trailed 2-0 to the young Football ID side, with Purton's top scorer Will Backhouse having missed a penalty ten minutes from time. However, Sam English pulled one back before Chris Avery scored from a second penalty to equalise in the final minute of the match, ensuring the points were shared and that unbeaten run was now six.

The big battle at the bottom end of the table was at Devizes where Malmesbury Victoria Development were the visitors for the first meeting of the season between the two sides this season. Both matches last season had been tight affairs with Devizes winning 1-0 at home and the sides drawing 1-1 at Malmesbury but on this occasion Malmesbury recorded a comfortable win to ease the pressure on them at the bottom end of the table. Joe Tranter and Gareth Jones both bagging a brace in Malmesbury's 4-1 win, James Dunford with the consolation goal for Devizes.

The game between Trowbridge Town and Marlborough Town was postponed due to a waterlogged pitch.

In the National League South, Chippenham Town were held to a 0-0 draw on Saturday at Hardenhuish by the team who sit just above them in the league table, St Albans City. The draw left Chippenham in 11th spot and with seven games to go a respectable mid-table finish in their second season at Step 2 is likely.

At Step 3, Salisbury remain in the promotion picture, sitting in fourth place in the table. They dropped a place in the table following a 2-0 defeat on Saturday away at Tiverton Town. Swindon Supermarine picked up three useful points with an excellent 4-0 home win over Beaconsfield Town in a clinical performance. Supermarine were set on their way by Ryan Campbell's first of a brace after 14 minutes, with the same player doubling the hosts' tally four minutes later through an excellent half-volley. Lee Spalding's side continued their total domination into the second half as Conor McDonagh squeezed the ball home from a tight angle to push the lead to three. Stuart Fleetwood tapped home Marine's fourth with seven minutes to play as the Webbwood Stadium side recorded their first win in four games.

The two Wiltshire sides promoted to Step 4 at the end of last season met at the InfiLED Stadium on Saturday and in an exciting game Melksham edged it by the odd goal in five. The loss further extended Highworth's recent poor record as, apart from the narrow 1-0 win over Paulton Rovers, they have been beaten in six of their previous seven games. As blustery conditions took hold all across the county, Melksham raced into a 2-0 lead in the first-half courtesy of goals from Neikell Plummer and Mark Cooper. Callum Parsons pulled one back for Highworth early in the second, however, Cooper restored the two-goal cushion for Melksham. Jordan Young made it two goals in two games for Highworth late on, but Highworth were unable to salvage a point.

At Sept 5, whilst were going down to two late goals at the league leaders Brimscombe & Thrupp, Westbury were also losing in the Western league Premier Division, losing 3-1 at promotion rivals Bitton. With Westbury becoming the first team to lose to Shortwood United this season a fortnight ago they have suffered a bit of an adverse reaction since their loss here at the Gerard Buxton Ground in the Wiltshire Senior Cup and will need to start winning again quickly if they are to get their promotion chances back on track. Bradford Town picked up a useful point at home against Buckland Athletic, the side just above them in the table. Bemerton Heath Harlequins in the Wessex Premier Division were another side to draw on Saturday, their point came in a 1-1 draw at home to Team Solent.

At Step 6 Malmesbury Victoria kept their push for promotion to the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division on track with a hard fought 1-0 home win over Kidlington Development ahead of Wednesday's big game away at Cheltenham Saracens. Wednesday saw Malmesbury edge a thriller by the odd goal in five to move into second place in the table. Elsewhere in the Hellenic, New College's tough season continued with a 4-0 home defeat at the hands of Newent Town whilst Pewsey Vale picked up a point in a home 1-1 draw against Almondsbury. In the Wessex League Amesbury continue to head the table following a 1-1 draw away at bottom side Totton & Eling, where no doubt the wind played a big part in the affairs in a game Amesbury would have been expected to win. Elsewhere in the Wessex League, Laverstock & Ford narrowly lost 3-2 away at Newport IOW. In the Western League only Calne Town and Devizes Town of the Wiltshire sides had a game on Saturday, and both suffered defeats. Calne Town lost 1-0 at home to Keynsham, whilst Devizes Town were heavily defeated away at Lydeard, going down 6-1. On Tuesday Chippenham Park were involved in a possible relegation battle at the bottom of the table against the only side below them in the table, Bristol Telephones. It is as you are as the two sides fought out a 1-1 draw and hopefully Chippenham will pick up enough points to avoid the threat of theoretical relegation, although with the shortage of sides at Step 6 a reprieve would always be a possibility in any event.

In the leagues outside the National League System it is good to see local club Minety back on an upward trajectory. They currently sit third in the Cirencester & District League. Diary of Wiltshire League Division One Title Winning Season - Wootton Bassett Town 1987-88

Taken from scrapbook of match reports from newspapers (mainly Wilts & Gloucestershire Standard) maintained by Paul Harrison.

Saturday 13th February 1988

Old Manor 1 Wootton Bassett Town 1

Headline: Bassett's away draw against league leaders

Wootton Bassett travelled to Salisbury on Saturday to take on the current league leaders Old Manor. On a very heavy pitch Bassett had the advantage of a strong swirling wind at their back in the first half. The early exchanges quickly highlighted the speed the ball spun off the muddy pitch making it very difficult for good football.

Bassett however began to dominate for long periods and had a number of chances to take the lead, the best of these falling to McKay, after good work by Hanrahan, but his half-hit shot was smothered by the keeper.

Old Manor broke away rarely, but on one occasion, goalkeeper Rees did remarkably well to save a goal-bound attempt with his legs.

The first half finished level but Bassett centre-half Bowden hobbled off nursing a badly gashed leg.

From the restart Old Manor surged forward and caught Bassett desperately covering for the injured Bowden. Following good work from Tutton the ball found its way to Rushton who struck the ball superbly to put his side ahead.

Bassett brought on substitute Haines for skipper Bowden and a reshuffle in the side saw them recover from the early setback and make a concerted effort to recover the points.

Paul Harrison came close on a number of occasions but Old Manor defended desperately to clear their lines. However, Bassett would not be thwarted and with only five minutes remaining Hanrahan jinked past three defenders to lay a superb ball into the six-yard box.

For once the ball broke Bassett's way and Harrison struck a superb goal into the Old Manor net.

When the referee blew the final whistle, everyone involved in the match, officials and players, must have been satisfied to have served up such an open enterprising match with 100% commitment from all concerned.

Next week Bassett face Bromham in the semi-final of the Wiltshire Senior Cup to be played at Calne Town's ground, kick-off 2pm.

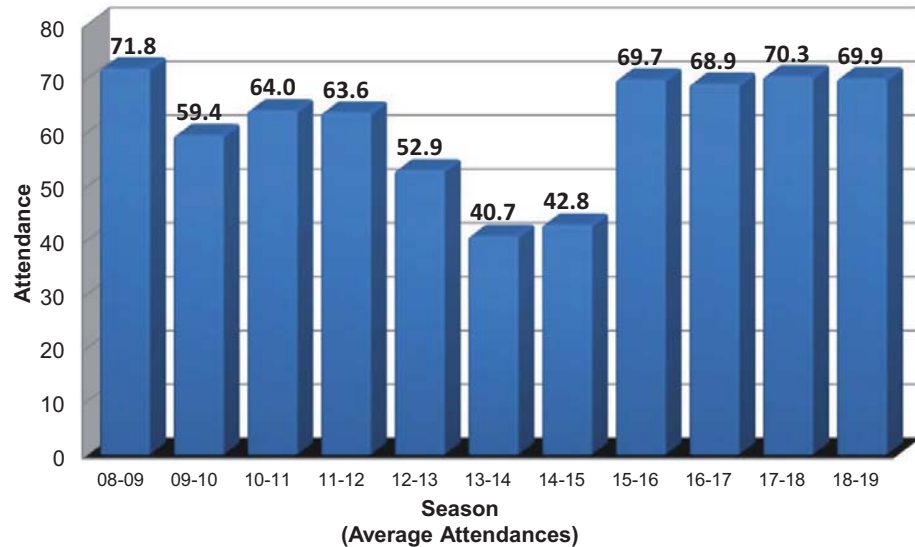

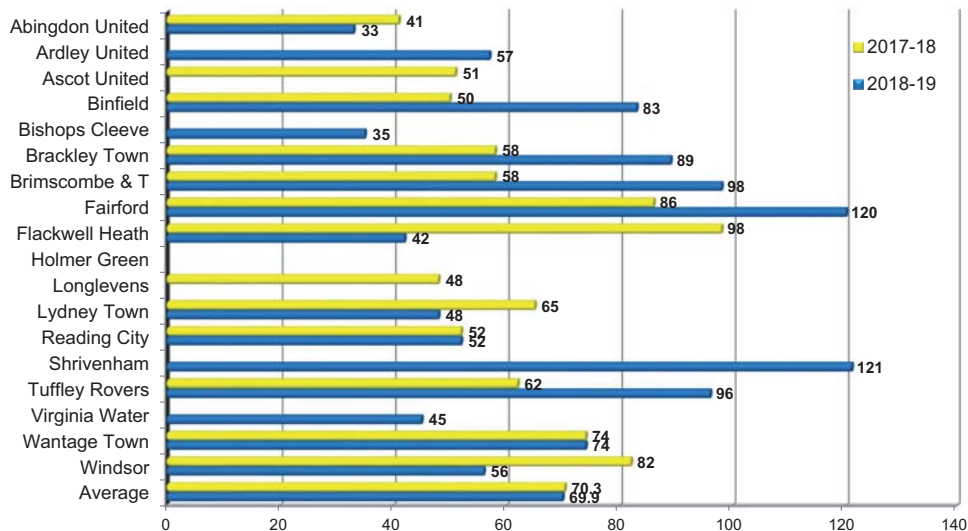

RWBTFC Attendances - Season 2018-19 (and comparison to 2017-18)



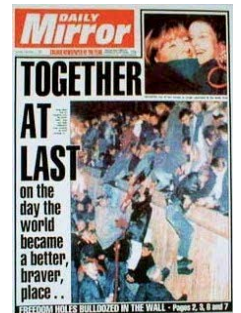
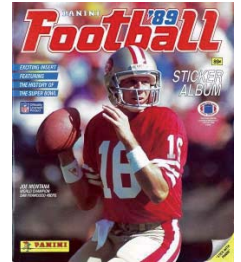
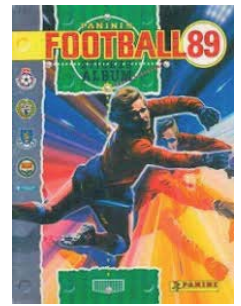
